SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 16 LSU softball team squares off against Campbell, South Alabama and Syracuse as the Tigers head into the home stretch of their 18-game homestand at the Purple & Gold Challenge.
- ▶ LSU won both of its previous meetings against South Alabama during the 2008 season. The Tigers have yet to meet Campbell and Syracuse. The Camels made the NCAA Regionals in 2009.
- ▶ LSU broke open a 2-0 affair with a five-run sixth inning fueled by a Tayl'r Hollis two-run homer coupled with an Erika Sluss two-run single. Dani Hofer punched out 11 and allowed only three hits.
- ▶ The Tigers followed that up with a 1-0 triumph over the Jaguars as Cody Trahan recorded 10 strikeouts and sat down 10 of the last 12 batters she faced. Casey Faille provided the game's lone run with a solo homer in the fifth inning.
- ▶ LSU has spent 65 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers are No. 16 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU has charged back to win 11 of its last 12 games at home highlighted by a current eight-game streak to go along with the Wilson/DeMarini Tiger Classic and Tiger Invitational titles.
- It has been a total team effort for LSU as Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [2x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier, Ashley Langoni, Kirsten Shortridge and Cody Trahan all have garnered All-Tournament Team honors during the last two weeks.
- LSU has outscored its opponents by an impressive 46-7 margin and racked up a .300 team batting average during the eight-game winning streak. The Tigers also are hitting a scorching .372 mark with runners in scoring position.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind division and conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. Georgia joined the Tigers with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 15 of 17 games sparked by a team-best seven multi-hit efforts. She is riding a seven-game hitting streak and her 23 hits rank third in the SEC.
- Shortridge also has racked up a league-best 14 stolen bases and has registered a steal in five of her last seven outings.
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].

- Shortridge batted .426 on a team-high 80 hits last season. Her .426 average was second-highest, while the 80 hits were tied for eighth-most in program history over a single season en route to All-SEC First-Team, NFCA All-South Region First-Team and NFCA All-America Third-Team accolades.
- Rachel Mitchell has compiled hits in six of her last nine games to check in with a .286 batting average. She has drove home six RBIs highlighted by a two-run single against ULM [Feb. 17].
- Mitchell collected 24 of her team-best 38 RBIs over her last 30 games in 2009 sparked by an eight-RBI weekend in the Mississippi State series [March 21-22] which allowed her to sweep SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors [Week of March 23].
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second straight season.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 5-for-49 slump during LSU's first 17 games.
- Santos notched a spot on the SEC All-Freshman squad and earned NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs against SEC opponents in 2009. She finished with a .279 hitting clip to go along with four home runs and 27 RBIs as she started 52 of 53 games at shortstop.
- Anissa Young has cranked a pair of home runs en route to a career-best five RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [Feb. 24]. She also has knocked five RBI doubles during LSU's last 11 games.
- During her two-year career, 25 of Young's 48 RBIs have come on her 11 home runs. The California native also has notched a .341 [45-for-132] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has amassed a .333 batting average to go along with five home runs and 13 RBIs.

- Langoni has knocked hits in seven of her last 10 games and belted a walk-off home run to give the Tigers a 5-4 nine-inning win over Houston [Feb. 28].
- Langoni matched a career-best four RBIs against Virginia [Feb. 21] and picked up LSWA Hitter of the Week accolades [Feb. 23].
- Langoni has produced 31 of her 42 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 23 of her last 36 hits have produced RBIs with 19 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Langoni cranked three homers at the NCAA Tempe Regional to pick up All-Regional Team honors. She teamed with Santos and Young to account for 43.0 percent [92-of-214] of LSU's RBIs last season. The trio also cranked 21 of the team's 31 home runs.
- The sophomore trio currently has eight of nine of the Tigers home runs and 24-of-67 of the team's RBIs in 2010.
- Ashley Applegate has compiled hits in 13 of 17 games en route to a .327 batting average and her six-game hitting streak from Feb. 13-19 matched a career-best.
- Applegate has registered RBIs in five of her last seven games sparked by RBI-singles against Houston and Jacksonville State [Feb. 28] that either tied or gave LSU the lead late in the game.
- Applegate recorded hits in 15 of 26 SEC games and spent most of last season with over a .300 batting average. She represented the Tigers on the SEC Community Service Team.
- Courtney Hollier has made the most of her 14 starts and paces the Tigers with a .417 hitting clip to go along with a homer and six RBIs over LSU's eight-game winning streak.
- Hollier strung together four consecutive multi-hit performances and added RBIs in each game [Feb. 20-26]. She totaled two hits in 32 plate appearances last season.
- Morgan Russell and Lauren Houston have combined for a 5-for-32 clip at the plate. Houston provided the go-ahead single in the sixth inning during a 4-1 win over Jacksonville State [Feb. 27]. The duo has held LSU's opponents to only six stolen bases over the first 17 games of the season.
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 12 of 15 games where she has earned an at-bat. She has drawn eight walks and has been hit-by-a-pitch twice en route to a .400 on-base percentage.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already reached 10 RBIs sparked by four multi-RBI efforts in 2010. She powered home a two-run double in both games against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19 & 20].

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff compiled a SEC-leading 0.91 staff ERA and have already faced seven 2009 NCAA Tournament squads.
- Rachele Fico, Brittany Mack and Cody Trahan represent the Tigers among the SEC's Top 10 in ERA. The trio has picked up multiple wins during LSU's eight-game winning streak.
- Mack is 3-2 with a 0.72 ERA but has been dealt a pair of tough-luck losses to Texas [Feb. 13] and No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] where she has only received one run of support.
- Mack struck out eight batters and allowed only one earned run in both of those starts.
- Mack tossed a complete game gem against Houston [Feb. 27], LSU's first seven-inning shutout since Cody Trahan against Auburn during the 2008 SEC Tournament.
- Mack compiled an 11-4 mark with a 2.36 ERA and racked up 110 strikeouts in 103.2 innings of work. She held opponents to a staff low .197 hitting clip last season.
- Fico, the reigning Louisiana Sports Writers Association [LSWA] Pitcher of the Week, has notched a 4-0 mark with two saves and held opponents to a .112 hitting clip since opening weekend. She also has been touched up for 11 hits and mowed down 37 batters over 28.0 innings of work.
- Trahan has returned to the circle with a vengeance after missing opening weekend. She has a sparkling 3-0 record, sports a SEC-leading 0.30 ERA and has yielded only one run in 23.3 innings.
- Trahan also has compiled an impressive 30 strikeouts against one walk and has posted back-to-back double-digit K's during her last two outings.

seven-inning complete game during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.

- Shortridge totaled a 5-4 record with a 3.21 ERA over 15 appearances in the circle sparked by marquee victories over College World Series participants No. 2 Alabama [March 18] and No. 9 Arizona State [May 16] last season.

- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
