SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 14 LSU softball team hits the road for the first time since opening weekend and embarks on SEC play with a weekend series at South Carolina. LSU is 31-8 (.795) all-time and has won eight of nine series under Yvette Girourd on SEC opening weekend.
- ▶ LSU swept the three-game series against South Carolina as part of senior weekend at Tiger Park last season.
- ▶ The Tigers won a pair of 8-0 decisions during Saturday's doubleheader as Kirsten Shortridge knocked a second inning grand slam in game one, while Ashley Applegate and Anissa Young provided multi-RBI performances in the second game.
- ▶ LSU completed the sweep with a 4-0 triumph. Dani Hofer fired a strike in her lone pitch of 2009 to set the tone and Cody Trahan allowed only one hit in complete game shutout.
- ▶ LSU has spent 66 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 14 and No. 15 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU charged back to win 16 of its 17 games during a 19-day home-stand that featured a trio of tournament titles. The lone setback was against No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20].
- It has been a total team effort for LSU as Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all have garnered All-Tournament Team honors during the last three weekends.
- LSU has outscored its opponents by an impressive 85-11 margin and racked up a .301 team batting average during the 13-game winning streak. The Tigers also are hitting a scorching .345 mark with runners in scoring position.
- LSU has six players that have already registered double-digit RBIs and are an astonishing 54-for-56 as a team in the stolen base department.
- LSU has compiled a .975 fielding percentage to rank second in the SEC. The Tigers have committed only four errors during their 13-game winning streak.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 19 of 22 games highlighted by a team-best nine multi-hit efforts.

- Shortridge is 12-of-27 during her last eight games and her 29 hits rank fourth in the SEC. She also has racked up 20 stolen bases and swiped multiple bases on six occasions.
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- Shortridge batted .426 on a team-high 80 hits last season. Her .426 average was second-highest, while the 80 hits were tied for eighth-most in program history over a single season en route to All-SEC First-Team, NFCA All-South Region First-Team and NFCA All-America Third-Team accolades.
- Rachel Mitchell has compiled hits in five of her last seven games and checks in with a .306 batting average. She drove home seven of her 13 RBIs last weekend en route to MVP honors at the Purple & Gold Challenge.
- Mitchell collected 24 of her team-best 38 RBIs over her last 30 games in 2009 sparked by an eight-RBI weekend in the Mississippi State series [March 21-22] which allowed her to sweep SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors [Week of March 23].
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second straight season.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 8-for-61 slump during LSU's first 22 games.
- Santos notched a spot on the SEC All-Freshman squad and earned NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs against SEC opponents in 2009. She finished with a .279 hitting clip to go along with four home runs and 27 RBIs as she started 52 of 53 games at shortstop.

- Anissa Young has recorded RBIs in three of her last five outings. She has drawn 13 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch seven times to garner a .473 on-base percentage, close to .200 points over her hitting clip.
- Young cranked a pair of home runs and notched a career-best five RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [Feb. 24].
- During her two-year career, 25 of Young's 52 RBI's have come on her 11 home runs. The California native also has notched a .348 [49-for-141] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average to .300 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best six home runs to go along with 16 RBIs.
- Langoni has knocked hits in six of her last eight games and knocked home the tying run against Campbell [March 6].
- Langoni crushed a walk-off home run to give the Tigers a 5-4 nine-inning win over Houston [Feb. 28] after picking up LSUA Hitter of the Week accolades [Feb. 23].
- Langoni has produced 34 of her 45 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 24 of her last 39 hits have produced RBIs with 21 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Langoni cranked three homers at the NCAA Tempe Regional to pick up All-Regional Team honors. She teamed with Santos and Young to account for 43.0 percent [92-of-214] of LSU's RBIs last season. The trio also cranked 21 of the team's 31 home runs.
- The sophomore trio currently has 10 of 14 Tiger home runs and 32-of-103 of the team's RBIs in 2010.
- Ashley Applegate has compiled hits in 15 of 22 games en route to a .300 batting average and her six-game hitting streak from Feb. 13-19 matched a career-best.
- Applegate has registered RBIs in five of her last seven games sparked by RBI-singles against Houston and Jacksonville State [Feb. 28] that either tied or gave LSU the lead late in the game.
- Applegate also has scored a run in six of her last eight games, while drawing a team-best 14 walks.
- Applegate recorded hits in 15 of 26 SEC games and spent most of last season with over a .300 batting average. She represented the Tigers on the SEC Community Service Team.
- Courtney Hollier has made the most of her 19 starts and has chipped in a .368 batting average. She also has ripped two home runs and 13 RBIs during LSU's 13-game winning streak.
- Hollier has tallied RBIs in her last four games highlighted by a walk-off blast to open the eighth inning against Campbell [March 6] after totaling two hits in 32 plate appearances last season.
- Morgan Russell and Lauren Houston have combined for a 9-for-42 clip at the plate.
- Both catchers tacked on multi-RBI efforts at the Purple & Gold Challenge last weekend and have held LSU's opponents to only eight stolen bases over the first 22 games of the season.
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 16 of 20 games where she has earned an at-bat. She has worked nine walks and has been hit-by-a-pitch four times en route to a .424 on-base percentage.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already reached 13 RBIs sparked by five multi-RBI efforts in 2010. She is coming off a 3-for-3 performance and knocked a two-run homer against Syracuse [March 7].

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff compiled a SEC-leading 0.91 staff ERA and have already faced seven 2009 NCAA Tournament squads.
- Rachele Fico, Brittany Mack and Cody Trahan represent the Tigers among the SEC's Top 10 in ERA. The trio has picked up at least three wins apiece during LSU's 13-game winning streak.
- Mack is 4-2 with a 1.12 ERA but has been dealt a pair of tough-luck losses to Texas [Feb. 13] and No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] where she has only received one run of support.
- Mack struck out eight batters and allowed only one earned run in both of those starts.
- Mack tossed a complete game gem against Houston [Feb. 27], LSU's first seven-inning shutout since Cody Trahan against Auburn during the 2008 SEC Tournament.

- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up four comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
- Trailing 1-0 to Campbell [March 6], LSU made the most of two Camel errors to tie the score during the fifth inning to set up Courtney Hollier walk-off long ball to leadoff the eighth inning.
