SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 14 LSU softball team wraps up a critical home week with a weekend series against Auburn. The Tigers will welcome 25 former players back as part of Alumnae Weekend.
- ▶ LSU took two out of three games in Auburn to conclude the regular season last season. Cody Trahan notched both wins for LSU in the circle as the Tigers won the first and third games of the series. She worked around six walks in game one, while sitting down 15 of the last 19 batters she faced in the rubber game of the series.
- ▶ Rachel Mitchell opened the series with three RBIs on a pair of doubles as LSU picked up a 3-2 win.
- ▶ Down 1-0 in the fifth inning, Ashley Langoni belted a two-run homer to left field. Two innings later, Casey Faile struck for a two-run shot of her own to secure the 4-1 victory
- ▶ LSU has spent 67 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 14 in both editions of this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU has charged back to win 21 of its last 22 games highlighted by 18 straight victories.
- The 18-game streak is the longest winning streak during the Yvette Girouard era at LSU [see page 6].
- LSU has outscored its opponents by an impressive 118-12 margin and racked up a .307 team batting average during the streak. The Tigers also are hitting .310 with runners in scoring position.
- LSU is coming off a pair of Wednesday wins over Ole Miss after an impressive weekend sweep at South Carolina where the Tigers strung together three straight shutouts of the Gamecocks to open SEC action.
- LSU finished its non-conference schedule by winning three consecutive tournaments titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- LSU has seven players that have already registered double-digit RBIs and are an astonishing 65-for-68 in the stolen base department as a team.
- LSU has compiled a .973 fielding percentage to rank second in the SEC. The Tigers have committed nine errors in their last 18 games.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 24 of 27 games highlighted by a team-best 14 multi-hit efforts, which are third in the SEC.

- Shortridge has racked up a .533 average [24-of-45] during her last 13 games and her 41 hits rank third in the SEC.
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge is the reigning SEC and USA Softball Player of the Week. She joins former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn the prestigious national award.
- Shortridge has tallied the conference's second most stolen bases with 25 and swiped multiple bags on six occasions. She has stolen a base in 12 of her last 17 outings.
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- With seven runs during the South Carolina series, Shortridge vaulted into a fourth place tie in the SEC and has scored 28 runs on the season. She has crossed the plate in nine of her last 10 games.
- Shortridge batted .426 on a team-high 80 hits last season. Her .426 average was second-highest, while the 80 hits were tied for eighth-most in program history over a single season en route to All-SEC First-Team, NFCA All-South Region First-Team and NFCA All-America Third-Team accolades.
- Rachel Mitchell has compiled hits in seven of her last 11 games and notched a .355 hitting clip [11-for-31] to raise her season mark by 30 points during that span.
- Mitchell went 5-for-10 during the South Carolina series sparked by a 2-for-3 effort and three RBIs in the middle game of the series.
- For the season, Mitchell checks in with a .312 average and 18 RBIs. She has ripped 12 of her 18 RBIs in her last 11 games and picked up MVP honors at the Purple & Gold Challenge [March 5-7].
- Mitchell also has drawn 14 walks and is a perfect 11-for-11 on the base paths on the season.

- Mitchell collected 24 of her team-best 38 RBIs over her last 30 games in 2009 sparked by an eight-RBI weekend in the Mississippi State series [March 21-22] which allowed her to sweep SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors [Week of March 23].
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second straight season.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 12-for-87 slump during LSU's first 27 games.
- Santos notched a spot on the SEC All-Freshman squad and earned NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs against SEC opponents in 2009. She finished with a .279 hitting clip to go along with four home runs and 27 RBIs as she started 52 of 53 games at shortstop.
- Falcon cranked her first career home run in her final at-bat of the South Carolina series [March 14].
- Anissa Young has powered home RBIs in seven of her 10 games, including a team-best seven RBIs during the South Carolina series. She has surged into sixth place tie in the SEC with 24 RBIs and totaled 20 of her team-best 24 RBIs during the 18-game streak.
- Young is second on the squad and hitting .400 [14-for-35] with runners in scoring position.
- Young has been issued 13 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch eight times. She cranked a pair of home runs and notched a career-best five RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [Feb. 24].
- During her two-year career, 28 of Young's 61 RBIs have come on her 12 home runs. The California native also has notched a .353 [54-for-153] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average to .300 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best six home runs to go along with 16 RBIs.
- Langoni has knocked hits in six of her last eight games and knocked home the tying run against Campbell [March 6].
- Langoni crushed a walk-off home run to give LSU a 5-4 nine-inning win over Houston [Feb. 28] after picking up LSWA Hitter of the Week accolades [Feb. 23].
- Langoni has produced 34 of her 45 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 24 of her last 39 hits have produced RBIs with 21 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Langoni cranked three homers at the NCAA Tempe Regional to pick up All-Regional Team honors. She teamed with Santos and Young to account for 43.0 percent [92-of-214] of LSU's RBIs last season. The trio also cranked 21 of the team's 31 home runs.
- The sophomore trio currently has 11 of LSU's 16 home runs and 41-of-128 of the team's RBIs in 2010.
- Ashley Applegate has smacked hits in 19 of 27 games en route to a .311 batting average and her six-game hitting streak from Feb. 13-19 matched a career-best.
- Applegate has coaxed a team-best 16 walks and been plunked six times to garner a team-high .469 on-base percentage. She has reached base during every game of LSU's 18-game winning streak and scored a run in nine of her last 12 outings.
- Applegate knocked RBI-singles against Houston and Jacksonville State [Feb. 28] that either represented the tying or go-ahead runs late in those games.
- Applegate recorded hits in 15 of 26 SEC games and spent most of last season with over a .300 batting average. She represented the Tigers on the SEC Community Service Team.
- Courtney Hollier has made the most of her 24 starts and recently had a career-best seven-game hitting streak end [March 6-17].
- Hollier has connected for a .348 average [16-for-46] to go along with two homers and 13 RBIs from the No. 6 spot in the lineup after going 2-for-32 during the 2009 season.
- Hollier has tacked on RBIs in five of her last nine games highlighted by a three-RBI outing against Syracuse [March 7]. She also belted a 8th inning walk-off blast versus Campbell [March 6].
- Morgan Russell has gone 7-for-17 and added six RBIs during her last eight games. Her three hits were a career-high during the middle game of the South Carolina series [March 13].
- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs and garnered a .414 on-base percentage. The Tigers are 12-0 when Houston is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have thrown out a pair of runners and combined to hold LSU's opponents to just four stolen bases over the first 27 games of the season.

- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 20 of 25 games where she has earned an at-bat. She has worked nine walks and has been hit-by-a-pitch five times en route to a .403 on-base mark.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already reached 14 RBIs sparked by five multi-RBI efforts in 2010. She has plated a team-best nine RBIs with two outs.
- Mouse's fielding at third base has been just as impressive and is tied for seventh in the SEC with 45 assists.

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff compiled a SEC-leading 0.82 staff ERA and faced seven 2009 NCAA Tournament squads.
- The Tigers have already tossed 10 shutouts, including four straight [Feb. 21-27] in addition to a weekend blanking of South Carolina [March 13-14] to open SEC action.
- Rachele Fico, Brittany Mack and Cody Trahan represent the Tigers among the SEC's Top 6 in ERA. The trio has picked up at least four wins apiece during LSU's 18-game winning streak.
- Mack is 5-2 with a 1.02 ERA but her two setbacks at Texas [Feb. 13] and No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] came when she only received one run of support. She struck out eight batters and allowed only one earned run in both of those starts.
- Mack tossed a one-hit gem in the middle game of the South Carolina series [March 13]. She struck out four batters and retired the last 12 batters she faced after allowing the infield hit.
- Mack compiled an 11-4 mark with a 2.36 ERA and racked up 110 strikeouts in 103.2 innings of work. She held opponents to a staff low .197 hitting clip last season.
- Fico has strung together eight straight wins with two saves and held opponents to .136 hitting clip since opening weekend. She has been touched up for 24 hits and mowed down 57 batters over 50.2 innings of work.
- Fico hurled 2.2 frames of one-hit relief to pick up the win over Ole Miss [March 17]. She also earned LSWA Pitcher of the Week [March 3] earlier this season.
- Trahan has returned to the circle with a vengeance after missing opening weekend. She has a sparkling 7-0 record, sports a SEC-leading 0.30 ERA and has yielded only two runs in 46.0 innings.
- Trahan also has compiled an impressive 51 strikeouts against two walks. She sprayed five hits in a shutout at South Carolina where she had to borrow cleats and a glove from her teammates. She also picked LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors [March 10].
- Trahan went 12-7 and fired 11 complete games to earn NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors. She ranked in the SEC's Top 10 in ERA [2.46], strikeouts [141] and opponent average [.217].
- Shortridge has gone 2-0 over her four starts and tossed her first seven-inning complete game during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge totaled a 5-4 record with a 3.21 ERA over 15 appearances in the circle sparked by marquee victories over College World Series participants No. 2 Alabama [March 18] and No. 9 Arizona State [May 16] last season.

- Lauren Capello has reached base in nine of her 25 career at-bats as a pinch hitter with four hits, four walks and was hit-by-pitch.
- Katie Guillory is 0-for-2 and scored the game-tying run against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19] after going 3-for-12 at the plate in 2009.
- Tiffany Shaw has scored in 11 of her 16 running appearances, including seven of her last eight outings after missing LSU's first 26 games due to injury in 2009. She is 7-for-7 stealing bases.
- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in five of her nine pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during three of her four pinch running attempts.
- Heidi Pizer has made seven appearances and one start at short-stop. She is 0-for-5 at the plate.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU won 13 of 22 games decided by one run and 11 of the Tigers SEC tilts were decided in this fashion during the 2009 season. The Tigers are 3-3 their one-run decisions this season.
- Taking a page from the football program, LSU is a perfect 5-0 in night contests. The Tigers are 18-4 in day games.
- LSU has gone 20-0 when scoring three or more runs and has tallied a 19-2 record when scoring first.
- LSU has recorded a 13-0 mark when hitting a home run, while going 10-4 when not hitting a long ball.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up five comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].

- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
- Trailing 1-0 to Campbell [March 6], LSU made the most of two Camel errors to tie the score during the fifth inning to set up Courtney Hollier walk-off long ball to leadoff the eighth inning.
- Tied 1-1 in the fifth inning of game two against Ole Miss [March 17], Kirsten Shortridge manufactured a run and forced the Rebels into a fielding error for the winning run.
