SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 13 LSU softball team steps out of SEC action and embarks on an in-state, three-game swing opening with a Tuesday tilt against Nicholls State.
- ▶ The Tigers and Colonels were originally scheduled to play on March 10 before being postponed due to weather. LSU is scheduled to head to Thibodeaux on April 14.
- ▶ LSU won both of its meetings with Nicholls State in 2009 highlighted by an 8-0 victory at Tiger Park. Kirsten Shortridge went 2-for-3 with two RBIs, while Cody Trahan struck out seven batters over three innings of work.
- ▶ LSU and Southeastern Louisiana met earlier this season at Tiger Park. The Tigers picked up an 11-0 win as Anissa Young belted a pair of home runs to go along with a career-best five RBIs.
- ▶ LSU has spent 68 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 13 and No. 12 in this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU has charged back to win 24 of its last 25 games highlighted by 21 straight victories.
- The 21-game streak is the longest streak in program history and eclipsed the 19-game effort by the 2000 squad.
- LSU has outscored its opponents by an impressive 133-16 margin and racked up a .311 team batting average and a stifling 0.56 staff ERA during the streak.
- LSU has opened SEC action 8-0 to match the best league start under head coach Yvette Girouard. The 2008 team also started conference play 8-0.
- LSU finished its non-conference schedule by winning three consecutive tournaments titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- LSU has already had seven players register double-digit RBIs and are an astonishing 69-for-73 in the stolen base department.
- LSU has compiled a .972 fielding percentage to rank second in the SEC. The Tigers have committed 12 errors in their last 21 games.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 26 of 30 games highlighted by a team-best 16 multi-hit efforts, which are third in the SEC.
- Shortridge has racked up a .518 average [29-of-56] during her last 16 games and her 46 hits rank third in the SEC.
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge joined former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn USA Softball Player of the Week [Week of March 15].

- Shortridge has tallied the SEC's second most stolen bases with 29 and swiped multiple bags on eight occasions this season. She has stolen a base in eight of her last nine outings [March 7-21], including four straight.
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- With two runs scored during the Auburn series, Shortridge is tied for fourth place in the SEC and has scored 30 runs on the season. She has crossed the plate in 11 of her last 13 games.
- Rachel Mitchell has notched RBIs in six of her last seven games and turned in a 3-for-3 performance with a two-run homer to put the finishing touches on a series sweep of Auburn [March 21].
- For the season, Mitchell checks in with a .318 batting average, two home runs and 22 RBIs. She has ripped 16 of her 22 RBIs in her last 14 games and garnered MVP honors at the Purple & Gold Challenge [March 5-7].
- Mitchell has drawn 15 walks and is a perfect 11-for-11 on the base paths to rank just outside the SEC's Top 10 on the season.
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second straight season.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 14-for-95 slump during LSU's first 30 games.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs in league play to earn spots on the SEC All-Freshman and NFCA All-South Region First-Team squads in 2009.
- Santos has reached base in four of her last five games, while Falcon has knocked hits in four of her last six outings.
- Anissa Young has powered hits during seven of eight SEC contests [March 13-21] highlighted by a quartet of RBI-doubles to raise her average to .291 for the season.
- Young paces the squad and has surged into a seventh place tie in the SEC with 24 RBIs. She has totaled 20 of her team-best 24 RBIs during LSU's 21-game winning streak.

- Young is second on the squad and hitting .385 [15-for-39] with runners in scoring position.
- Young has been issued 15 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch eight times. She cranked a pair of home runs and notched a career-high five RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [Feb. 24].
- During her two-year career, 28 of Young's 61 RBI's have come on her 12 home runs. The California native also has registered a .354 [57-for-161] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average to .300 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best six home runs to go along with 16 RBIs.
- Langoni has knocked hits in six of her last eight games and drove home the tying run against Campbell [March 6].
- Langoni crushed a walk-off home run to give LSU a 5-4 nine-inning win over Houston [Feb. 28] after picking up LSWA Hitter of the Week accolades [Feb. 23].
- Langoni has produced 34 of her 45 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 24 of her last 39 hits have produced RBIs with 21 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Ashley Applegate has smacked hits in 22 of 30 games en route to a .345 batting average and her six-game hitting streak [Feb. 13-19] matched a career-best.
- Applegate has coaxed a team-best 18 walks and been plunked six times to garner a team-high .491 on-base clip. She has reached base during every game of LSU's 21-game winning streak and scored a run in 12 of her last 15 outings [Feb. 27-March 21].
- Applegate produced a trio of multi-hit performances, scored runs and picked up RBIs during all three games of the Auburn series [March 21].
- Applegate knocked RBI-singles against Houston and Jacksonville State [Feb. 28] that either represented the tying or go-ahead runs late in those games.
- Courtney Hollier has made the most of her 27 starts and recently had a career-best seven-game hitting streak end [March 6-17].
- Hollier has connected for a .347 average [17-for-49] to go along with two homers and 14 RBIs from the No. 6 spot in the lineup after going 2-for-32 during the 2009 season.
- Hollier tacked on RBIs in games one and three of the Auburn series [March 20-21], including a sacrifice fly during the fifth inning to break a scoreless tie in the series finale.
- Hollier has added three multi-RBI efforts highlighted by a three-RBI outing against Syracuse [March 7]. She also belted a 8th inning walk-off blast versus Campbell [March 6].
- Morgan Russell has gone 9-for-23 and added eight RBIs during her last 10 games. She connected for a two-run double during the first game of the Auburn series [March 20], while her three hits were a career-high in the middle game at South Carolina [March 13].
- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs and garnered a .375 on-base percentage. The Tigers are 13-0 when Houston is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have thrown out a pair of runners and combined to hold LSU's opponents to just nine stolen bases over the first 30 games of the season.
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 22 of 28 games where she has earned an at-bat. She has worked nine walks and has been hit-by-a-pitch five times.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already racked up 15 RBIs sparked by five multi-RBI efforts in 2010. She has plated a team-best nine RBIs with two outs.
- Mouse's defense at third base has been just as impressive and is tied for eighth in the SEC with 49 assists.

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff compiled a SEC-leading 0.77 staff ERA and faced eight 2009 NCAA Tournament squads.
- The Tigers have already tossed 12 shutouts, including four straight [Feb. 21-27] in addition to a weekend blanking of South Carolina [March 13-14] to open SEC action.
- Rachele Fico, Brittany Mack and Cody Trahan represent the Tigers among the SEC's Top 5 in ERA. The trio has picked up at least five wins apiece during LSU's 21-game winning streak.
- Mack is 6-2 with a 1.02 ERA. Her two setbacks at Texas [Feb. 13] and No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] came when she only received one run of support. She struck out eight batters and allowed only one earned run in both of those starts.

- Mack tossed a one-hit gem in the middle game of the South Carolina series [March 13]. She struck out four batters and retired the last 12 batters she faced after allowing the infield hit.
- Mack also fired 6.2 frames and added five strikeouts in her win during game two of the Auburn series [March 20].
- Fico has strung together nine straight wins with three saves and held opponents to .153 hitting clip since opening weekend. She has been touched up for only seven runs, five earned, on 31 hits and mowed down 62 batters over 58.0 innings of work.
- Fico hurled 2.2 frames of one-hit relief to pick up the win over Ole Miss [March 17]. She stranded runners at second and third base by recording the final out of LSU's 4-3 win over Auburn [March 20].
- In her lone start of the weekend, Fico shut down Auburn to extend her scoreless innings streak to 20.2 frames [March 6-21] en route to SEC Freshman of the Week [March 22]. She also earned LSWA Pitcher of the Week [March 3] earlier this season.
- Trahan has returned to the circle with a vengeance after missing opening weekend. She has a sparkling 8-0 record, sports a SEC-leading 0.26 ERA and has yielded only two runs in 53.0 innings.
- Trahan also has compiled an impressive 57 strikeouts against four walks. She sprayed five hits in a shutout at South Carolina [March 13] where she had to borrow cleats and a glove from her teammates.
- Trahan tacked on a three-hitter to go along with six strikeouts to start the Auburn series [March 20] en route to SEC Pitcher of the Week [March 22]. She also notched LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors [March 10] earlier this season.
- Shortridge has gone 2-0 over her four starts and tossed her first seven-inning complete game of her LSU career during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge has yielded only one earned run in each of her four starts and also earned a win over Oklahoma State [Feb. 20].

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in nine of her 25 career at-bats as a pinch hitter with four hits, four walks and one hit-by-pitch.
- Katie Guillory is 0-for-2 and scored the game-tying run against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19] after going 3-for-12 at the plate in 2009.
- Tiffany Shaw has scored in 11 of her 16 running appearances, including seven of her last eight outings.
- Shaw is 7-for-8 in the stolen base department and went 1-for-1 with a walk in the Auburn opener [March 20].
- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in five of her 11 pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during four of her five pinch running attempts.
- Heidi Pizer has made seven appearances and one start at short-stop. She is 0-for-5 at the plate.

- LSU has recorded a 14-0 mark when hitting a home run, while going 12-4 when not hitting a long ball.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up five comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
- Trailing 1-0 to Campbell [March 6], LSU made the most of two Camel errors to tie the score during the fifth inning to set up Courtney Hollier walk-off long ball to leadoff the eighth inning.
- Tied 1-1 in the fifth inning of game two against Ole Miss [March 17], Kirsten Shortridge manufactured a run and forced the Rebels into a fielding error for the winning run.
