SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 12 LSU softball team leaves the Pelican State for only the third time this season and heads into the heart of its seven-game road swing with a weekend series at No. 6 Florida.
- ▶ LSU holds a 27-13 advantage over Florida in the all-time series but the Gators have won six straight, five via the shutout, in the series.
- ▶ The last time LSU defeated Florida was a 1-0 triumph during the championship game of the 2007 SEC Tournament.
- ▶ The Tigers used back-to-back doubles by Rachel Mitchell and Leslie Klein to open the 9th inning to score the game's only run, while Dani Hofer tossed 4.2 frames of one-hit relief with nine strikeouts to secure the Tournament's MVP honors.
- ▶ An in-depth look at last season's meeting can be found on pages 7 and 8 of this packet.
- ▶ LSU has spent 69 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 12 in this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU has charged back to win 27 of its last 28 games highlighted by 24 straight victories.
- The 24-game streak is the longest streak in program history and eclipsed the 19-game effort by the 2000 squad. It also marks the third longest streak in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads.
- LSU has outscored its opponents by an impressive 158-18 margin and racked up a .328 team batting average along with a stifling 0.58 staff ERA during the streak.
- LSU has opened SEC action 8-0 to match its best league start under head coach Yvette Girouard. The 2008 team also started conference play 8-0.
- LSU finished its preconference tournament schedule by winning three consecutive titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- LSU already has seven players register more than 15 RBIs and are an astonishing 75-for-80 in the stolen base department. The Tigers tallied only 46 stolen bases last season.
- LSU has compiled a .975 fielding percentage to rank second in the SEC. The Tigers have committed 12 errors over the 24-game streak.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 29 of 33 games highlighted by a team-best 18 multi-hit efforts, which are third in the SEC.

- Shortridge has racked up a .522 average [35-of-67] during her last 19 games and her 52 hits rank third in the SEC.
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge joined former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn USA Softball Player of the Week [Week of March 15].
- Shortridge has tallied the SEC's second most stolen bases with 31 and swiped multiple bags on eight occasions this season. She has stolen a base in 10 of her last 12 outings [March 7-31].
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- With 15 runs scored over her last 12 games, Shortridge has surged into an eighth place tie in the SEC. She has crossed the plate 32 times and scored the game's first run nine times this season.
- Rachel Mitchell has notched RBIs in seven of her last 10 games. For the season, Mitchell checks in with a .361 batting average, three home runs and 25 RBIs.
- Mitchell knocked a career-best four hits to go along with three RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [March 24]. She has notched four consecutive multi-hit efforts and her average climbed 75 points during the month of March.
- Mitchell has ripped 19 of her 25 RBIs in her last 18 games and recently picked up LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 1] accolades.
- Mitchell also has drawn 15 walks and is a perfect 11-for-11 on the base paths to rank just outside the SEC's Top 10 on the season.
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second straight season.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 17-for-103 slump during LSU's first 33 games.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs in league play to earn spots on the SEC All-Freshman and NFCA All-South Region First-Team squads in 2009.

- Santos has reached base in five of her last six games and returned from a four-game hiatus by knocking a three-run home run at McNeese State [March 31].
- Falcon has come away with hits in five of her last eight starts [March 14-24] and scored a run in three of her last five outings.
- Anissa Young has powered hits during seven of eight SEC contests [March 13-21] highlighted by a quartet of RBI-doubles to raise her average to .307 for the season.
- Young paces the squad and has surged into a seventh place tie in the SEC with 27 RBIs. She has totaled 23 of her team-best 27 RBIs during LSU's 24-game winning streak.
- Young has been issued 16 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch 10 times. She garnered a 3-for-4 effort and three RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [March 24].
- During her two-year career, 31 of Young's 64 RBIs have come on her 13 home runs. The California native also has registered a .367 [61-for-166] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average to .286 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best six home runs to go along with 16 RBIs.
- Langoni returned to the lineup at McNeese State [March 31] after a 10-game absence and has knocked hits in six of her last nine games [Feb. 27-March 7, 31].
- Langoni crushed a walk-off home run to give LSU a 5-4 nine-inning win over Houston [Feb. 28] after picking up LSWA Hitter of the Week accolades [Feb. 23].
- Langoni has produced 34 of her 45 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 24 of her last 39 hits have produced RBIs with 21 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Ashley Applegate has smacked hits in 24 of 33 games en route to a .340 batting average. Her six-game hitting streak [Feb. 13-19] matched a career-best.
- Applegate has coaxed a team-best 18 walks and been plunked six times to garner a team-high .479 on-base clip. She has reached base during every game of LSU's 24-game streak and scored a run in 14 of her last 18 outings [Feb. 27-March 31].
- Applegate has produced a quartet of multi-hit performances, scored runs and picked up RBIs during four of her last six outings [March 20-31].
- Applegate knocked RBI-singles against Houston and Jacksonville State [Feb. 28] that either represented the tying or go-ahead runs late in those games.
- Courtney Hollier has made the most of her 30 starts and recently had a career-best seven-game hitting streak end [March 6-17]. She has chipped in RBIs in four of her last six games.
- Hollier has connected for a .347 average [17-for-49] to go along with two homers and 14 RBIs from the No. 6 spot in the lineup after going 2-for-32 during the entire 2009 season.
- Hollier tacked on RBIs in games one and three of the Auburn series [March 20-21], including a sacrifice fly during the fifth inning to break a scoreless tie in the series finale.
- Hollier has added three multi-RBI efforts highlighted by a three-RBI outing against Syracuse [March 7]. She also belted a 8th inning walk-off blast versus Campbell [March 6].
- Morgan Russell has gone 11-for-26 and added eight RBIs during her last 13 games. She is currently on a career-long four-game hitting streak [March 20-31].
- Russell connected for a two-run double during the first game of the Auburn series [March 20], while her three hits were a career-high in the middle game at South Carolina [March 13].
- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs for the Tigers. LSU is 14-0 this season when she is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have combined to throw out five runners and limited LSU's opponents to just 10 stolen bases over the first 33 games of the season.
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 24 of 31 games where she has earned an at-bat.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already racked up 17 RBIs sparked by six multi-RBI efforts in 2010. She shares the team lead with Anissa Young with 10 two-out RBIs.

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff compiled a SEC-leading and NCAA-best 0.76 staff ERA. The Tigers have played 15 games versus eight 2009 NCAA Tournament squads this season.
- The Tigers have already tossed 14 shutouts, including four straight [Feb. 21-27] in addition to a weekend blanking of South Carolina [March 13-14] to open SEC action.
- Rachele Fico, Brittany Mack and Cody Trahan represent the Tigers among the SEC's Top 3 in ERA. The trio has picked up at least six wins apiece during LSU's 24-game winning streak.
- Mack is 7-2 with a 0.92 ERA. Her two setbacks at Texas [Feb. 13] and No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] came when she only received one run of support. She struck out eight batters and allowed only one earned run in both of those starts.
- Mack tossed a one-hit gem in the middle game of the South Carolina series [March 13]. She struck out four batters and retired the last 12 batters she faced after allowing the infield hit.
- Mack also fired 6.2 frames and added five strikeouts in her win during game two of the Auburn series [March 20].
- Fico has strung together 10 straight wins with three saves and held opponents to .144 hitting clip since opening weekend. She has been touched up for only seven runs, five earned, on 31 hits and mowed down 69 batters over 62.2 innings of work.
- Fico hurled 2.2 frames of one-hit relief to pick up the win over Ole Miss [March 17]. She stranded runners at second and third base by recording the final out of LSU's 4-3 win over Auburn [March 20].
- In her last start, Fico shut down Auburn en route to SEC Freshman of the Week [March 22]. She also earned LSWA Pitcher of the Week [March 3 & 23] earlier this season and has tossed 25.1 straight scoreless frames [March 6-31].
- Trahan has returned to the circle with a vengeance after missing opening weekend. She has a sparkling 8-0 record, sports a SEC-leading 0.48 ERA and has yielded only four runs in 58.0 innings.
- Trahan also has compiled an impressive 65 strikeouts against five walks. She sprayed five hits in a shutout at South Carolina [March 13] where she had to borrow cleats and a glove from her teammates.
- Trahan also tacked on a three-hitter to go along with six strikeouts to start the Auburn series [March 20] en route to SEC Pitcher of the Week [March 22]. She also notched LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors [March 10] earlier this season.
- Shortridge has gone 3-0 over her five appearances and tossed her first seven-inning complete game of her LSU career during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge has yielded only one earned run in each of her four starts and also earned a win over Oklahoma State [Feb. 20].
- Shortridge returned to the circle for the first time since Feb. 28 and fired 4.0 innings of no-hit relief at McNeese State [March 31].

- Katie Guillory is 0-for-3 and scored the game-tying run against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19] after going 3-for-12 at the plate in 2009.
- Tiffany Shaw has scored in 12 of her 17 running appearances, including eight of her last 11 outings. She is 3-for-10 at the plate with a RBI and 9-for-10 in the stolen base department.
- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in six of her 14 pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during five of her six pinch running attempts.
- Heidi Pizer has made nine appearances and one start at shortstop. She is 0-for-6 at the plate.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU won 13 of 22 games decided by one run and 11 of the Tigers SEC tilts were decided in this fashion during the 2009 season. The Tigers are 4-4 this season and have emerged with victories in their last four one-run decisions after going 0-3 during opening weekend.
- Taking a page from the football program, LSU is a perfect 8-0 in night contests. The Tigers also are 21-4 in day games.
- LSU has gone 26-0 when scoring three or more runs and has tallied a 24-2 record when scoring first.
- LSU has recorded a 16-0 mark when hitting a home run, while going 13-4 when not hitting a long ball. The Tiger sophomore class has belted 15 of the 20 longballs.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up five comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
- Trailing 1-0 to Campbell [March 6], LSU made the most of two Camel errors to tie the score during the fifth inning to set up Courtney Hollier walk-off long ball to leadoff the eighth inning.
- Tied 1-1 in the fifth inning of game two against Ole Miss [March 17], Kirsten Shortridge manufactured a run and forced the Rebels into a fielding error for the winning run.

BATON ROUGE -- The No. 18 LSU softball team dropped a pair of hard-fought 3-0 and 1-0 decisions against No. 1 Florida Saturday in-front of 1,679 fans at the new Tiger Park. It marked the third-highest crowd in program history.

The Gators (45-3, 22-1 SEC) rode the right-arms of Stacey Nelson and Stephanie Brombacher to clinch the SEC regular season title as the Tigers (27-12-1, 10-8-1 SEC) were shut out for the first time since the 2006 season in a SEC doubleheader.

"We're on the verge of being really good this year," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We had our chances with the right people at the plate, but we just couldn't get it done today. Give Florida credit because they were opportunistic and had awesome pitching."

"I thought we played well, and today would have been totally different if we would have taken advantage of some of the primetime situations we had," third baseman Jessica Mouse said. "We just need to make a couple of small adjustments at the plate for tomorrow."

Game 1 - Florida 3, LSU 0

Florida jumped out to a 2-0 advantage stringing together a two-out Ali Gardiner single followed by a Francesca Enea two-run homer that snuck over the left field fence. The Gators tacked on a sacrifice fly by Michelle Moultrie in the fifth inning to make it 3-0.

LSU attempted to rally in the seventh inning as Ashley Applegate and Casey Faile knocked a pair of singles sending the tying run to the plate with two outs. Stacey Nelson regrouped and got Jessica Mouse to foul out to keep the score, 3-0.

Nelson tallied six strikeouts against one walk to improve to 26-3, while Cody Trahan was tagged with the loss dropping to 7-4 for LSU.

Game 2 - Florida 1, LSU 0

LSU's Brittany Mack pitched her way out of trouble by getting the Gators to leave the bases loaded in the first inning. With a runner at third and one out in the second inning, the Tigers also received a fantastic defensive play from shortstop Juliana Santos. She drove to her left, threw from her knees and Morgan Russell applied the tag at the plate on pinch runner Danyell Hines.

Florida was able to manufacture a run in the fourth inning. Kelsey Bruder knocked a leadoff single and moved to second base on a Megan Bush sacrifice bunt with one out. On the first pitch, Kristina Hilberth platted Bruder with a single that squirted past the outstretched glove of Santos.

LSU put the tying run in scoring position with two outs after an Ashley Langoni walk and a Jessica Mouse single to left field during the fifth inning. Kirsten Shortridge hit a high chopper, but UF pitcher Stephanie Brombacher fielded the ball after fully extending to thwart the LSU rally.

Brombacher limited the Tigers to a pair of hits to move to at 19-0, while Nelson notched her third save of the season. Mack was the tough-luck loser and fell to 11-3 after scattering one run on five hits.

BATON ROUGE -- Ali Gardiner hit a pair of two-run homers in the first and second innings as No. 1 Florida completed a weekend sweep with a 12-0 win over the No. 18 LSU softball team Sunday at the new Tiger Park.

It was the first time that the Tigers (27-13-1, 10-9-1 SEC) have allowed double digit runs since the Georgia series opener during the 2007 season.

"It was all Florida. They are very good, and we didn't show up today," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "There aren't very many bright spots for the Tigers when you can't touch home plate, but no doubt this game was all Florida."

The Gators (46-3, 23-1 SEC) also made the most of two LSU errors in the second and fourth innings that extended frames allowing Florida to score 10 unearned runs. Kelsey Bruder and Megan Bush tacked on homers to cap a six-run fourth inning.

Stacey Nelson tossed a five-hit shutout and compiled seven strikeouts to improve to 27-3, while Cody Trahan dropped to 7-5 for the Tigers.

Down 2-0 in the first inning, LSU loaded the bases as Jazz Jackson and Ashley Applegate knocked a pair of infield singles coupled with a Juliana Santos walk. On a 1-2 pitch, Anissa Young hit a chopper that Trahan was able to field fully extended. She flipped to first to retire the side.

"We had opportunities in each game, but just didn't capitalize," Jackson said. "Florida does a really good of capitalizing on every mistake. Losing this series is a bump in the road, but it's not our last opportunity to get where we want to go. We have to put this behind us as soon as possible and move on."
