SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 14 LSU softball team finishes its seven-game road swing with a Wednesday twin bill at No. 6 Alabama. The Tigers are looking to bounce back from a weekend sweep at No. 6 Florida, while the Crimson Tide strung together a trio of victories at Auburn.
- ▶ LSU notched a pair of 3-2 and 6-5 triumphs over No. 2 Alabama at Tiger Park. Cody Trahan tossed a complete game with eight strikeouts, while Anissa Young scored the game winning run for the opening game walkoff win.
- ▶ Down 5-1 in game two, the Tigers exploded for five runs in the fifth inning fueled by a Rachel Mitchell three-run double. Kirsten Shortridge tossed four frames of one-run relief to pick up the win.

- ▶ LSU has spent 70 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 14 in this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU has charged back to win 27 of 28 games before dropping a three-game series at No. 6 Florida last weekend.
- LSU's impressive stretch was sparked by a 24-game winning streak which marked the longest stretch in program history. It also was the third longest streak in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads.
- LSU outscored its opponents by an impressive 158-18 margin and racked up a .328 team batting average along with a stifling 0.58 staff ERA during the streak.
- LSU has compiled an 8-3 record to start SEC action and currently are in a first-place tie with Arkansas for the division lead.
- LSU finished its preconference tournament schedule by winning three consecutive titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- LSU already has seven players register more than 15 RBIs and are an astonishing 78-for-83 in the stolen base department. The Tigers tallied only 46 stolen bases last season.
- LSU has compiled a .976 fielding percentage to and are tied for first place in the SEC. The Tigers have committed just 23 errors over the first 36 games of the season.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 31 of 36 games highlighted by a team-best 19 multi-hit efforts, which are third in the SEC.

- Shortridge has racked up a .484 average [38-of-77] during her last 22 games and her 55 hits rank third in the SEC.
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge joined former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn USA Softball Player of the Week [Week of March 15].
- Shortridge has tallied the SEC's second most stolen bases with 32 and swiped multiple bags on eight occasions this season. She has stolen a base in 11 of her last 15 outings [March 7-April 4].
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- With 15 runs scored over her last 15 games, Shortridge has surged into a ninth place tie in the SEC. She has crossed the plate 33 times and scored the game's first run nine occasions this season.
- Rachel Mitchell has notched RBIs in seven of her last 13 games. For the season, Mitchell checks in with a .346 batting average, three home runs and 25 RBIs.
- Mitchell knocked a career-best four hits to go along with three RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [March 24]. She has notched hits by six of her last seven games aided by four multi-hit efforts and her average climbed 75 points during the month of March.
- Mitchell has ripped 19 of her 25 RBIs in her last 21 games and recently picked up LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 1] accolades.
- Mitchell also has drawn 15 walks and is a perfect 12-for-12 on the base paths to rank just outside the SEC's Top 10 on the season.
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second straight season.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 17-for-111 slump during LSU's first 36 games.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs in league play to earn spots on the SEC All-Freshman and NFCA All-South Region First-Team squads in 2009.

- Santos returned from a four-game hiatus by knocking a three-run home run at McNeese State [March 31].
- Falcon has come away with hits in five of her last nine starts [March 14-April 4] and tallied a career-best three hits against Nicholls State [March 23].
- Anissa Young has powered hits during seven of 11 SEC contests [March 13-April 4] highlighted by a quartet of RBI-doubles to move her average to .278 for the season.
- Young paces the squad with 27 RBIs to rank just outside the SEC's Top 10. She totaled 23 of her team-best 27 RBIs during the Tigers 24-game winning streak.
- Young has been issued 16 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch 11 times. She garnered a 3-for-4 effort and three RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [March 24].
- During her two-year career, 31 of Young's 64 RBIs have come on her 13 home runs. The California native also has registered a .353 [61-for-173] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average to .304 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best seven home runs to go along with 17 RBIs.
- Langoni returned to the lineup at McNeese State [March 31] after a 10-game absence and compiled hits in all three games of the Florida series [April 3-4].
- Langoni crushed a walk-off home run to give LSU a 5-4 nine-inning win over Houston [Feb. 28] after picking up LSWA Hitter of the Week accolades [Feb. 23].
- Langoni has produced 35 of her 46 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 25 of her last 42 hits have produced RBIs with 22 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Ashley Applegate has smacked hits in 24 of 36 games en route to a .314 batting average. She has coaxed a team-best 20 walks and been plunked six times to garner a .477 on-base clip.
- Applegate has reached base during 34 of 36, including all 24 games of LSU's streak and scored a run in 14 of her last 21 outings.
- Applegate knocked RBI-singles against Houston and Jacksonville State [Feb. 28] that either represented the tying or go-ahead runs late in those games.
- Courtney Hollier has made the most of her 33 starts and recently had a career-best seven-game hitting streak end [March 6-17].
- Hollier has connected for a .347 average [17-for-49] to go along with two homers and 14 RBIs from the No. 6 spot in the lineup after going 2-for-32 during the entire 2009 season.
- Hollier tacked on RBIs in games one and three of the Auburn series [March 20-21], including a sacrifice fly during the fifth inning to break a scoreless tie in the series finale.
- Morgan Russell has gone 12-for-31 and added eight RBIs during her last 16 games. She connected for a two-run double during the first game of the Auburn series [March 20], while her three hits were a career-high in the middle game at South Carolina [March 13].
- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs for the Tigers. LSU is 14-0 this season when she is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have combined to throw out five runners and limited LSU's opponents to just 12 stolen bases over the first 36 games of the season.
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 26 of 34 games where she has earned an at-bat.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already racked up 17 RBIs sparked by six multi-RBI efforts in 2010. She shares the team lead with Young with 10 two-out RBIs.
- Mouse's defense at third base has been just as impressive and her 60 assists rank tied for eighth in the SEC's Top 10.

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff compiled a SEC-leading and NCAA-best 1.07 staff ERA. The Tigers have played 18 games versus eight 2009 NCAA Tournament squads this season.
- The Tigers have already tossed 14 shutouts, including four straight [Feb. 21-27] in addition to a weekend blanking of South Carolina [March 13-14] to open SEC action.
- Rachele Fico, Brittany Mack and Cody Trahan represent the Tigers among the SEC's Top 4 in ERA. The trio picked up at least six wins apiece during LSU's 24-game winning streak.

- Mack is 7-2 with a 0.91 ERA. Her two setbacks at Texas [Feb. 13] and No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] came when she only received one run of support. She struck out eight batters and allowed only one earned run in both of those starts.
- Mack tossed a one-hit gem in the middle game of the South Carolina series [March 13]. She struck out four batters and retired the last 12 batters she faced after allowing the infield hit.
- Mack also fired 6.2 frames and added five strikeouts in her win during game two of the Auburn series [March 20].
- Fico had her impressive stretch of 10 straight wins dating back to opening weekend come to close with a setback in the series finale at No. 6 Florida [April 4].
- Minus the Florida series, Fico has held her opponents to .144 hitting clip since opening weekend. She has been touched up for only seven runs, five earned, on 31 hits and mowed down 69 batters over 62.2 innings of work.
- Fico tallied SEC Freshman of the Week [March 22] and also earned LSWA Pitcher of the Week [March 3 & 23] earlier this season. Her stretch of 26.0 straight scoreless frames [March 6-April 3] came to a close in the series opener at No. 6 Florida.
- Trahan has returned to the circle with a vengeance after missing opening weekend. She has a sparkling 8-1 record, sports a SEC-leading 0.75 ERA and has yielded only six runs in 65.1 innings.
- Trahan was the tough-luck loser in a 2-1 decision during the middle game of the Florida series [April 3] after holding the potent Gator offense scoreless for the first five frames of the game.
- Trahan also has compiled an impressive 69 strikeouts against seven walks. She sprayed five hits in a shutout at South Carolina [March 13] where she had to borrow cleats and a glove from her teammates.
- Trahan garnered SEC Pitcher of the Week [March 22] and also notched LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors [March 10] earlier this season.
- Shortridge has gone 3-1 over her six appearances and tossed her first seven-inning complete game of her LSU career during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge has yielded only one earned run in four of her five starts and also earned a win over Oklahoma State [Feb. 20].
- Shortridge returned to the circle for the first time since Feb. 28 and fired 4.0 innings of no-hit relief at McNeese State [March 31].

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in nine of her 26 career at-bats as a pinch hitter with four hits, four walks and one hit-by-pitch.
- Katie Guillory is 0-for-3 and scored the game-tying run against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19] after going 3-for-12 at the plate in 2009.
- Tiffany Shaw has scored in 12 of her 18 running appearances, including eight of her last 12 outings. She is 3-for-10 at the plate with a RBI and 9-for-10 in the stolen base department.
- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in six of her 15 pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during five of her seven pinch running attempts.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU won 13 of 22 games decided by one run and 11 of the Tigers SEC tilts were decided in this fashion during the 2009 season. The Tigers are 4-5 this season and have emerged with victories in four of their last six one-run decisions after going 0-3 during opening weekend.
- Taking a page from the football program, LSU is a perfect 8-0 in night contests. The Tigers also are 21-7 in day games.
- LSU has gone 26-0 when scoring three or more runs and has tallied a 24-3 record when scoring first.
- LSU has recorded a 16-1 mark when hitting a home run, while going 13-6 when not hitting a long ball. The Tiger sophomore class has belted 16 of the 21 long balls.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up five comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
- Trailing 1-0 to Campbell [March 6], LSU made the most of two Camel errors to tie the score during the fifth inning to set up Courtney Hollier walk-off long ball to leadoff the eighth inning.
- Tied 1-1 in the fifth inning of game two against Ole Miss [March 17], Kirsten Shortridge manufactured a run and forced the Rebels into a fielding error for the winning run.

BATON ROUGE - The No. 21 LSU softball team earned a critical sweep picking up 3-2 and 6-5 victories over No. 2 Alabama Wednesday in front of 1,635 fans at the new Tiger Park.

"This was a dog fight from start to finish," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "It's always a battle against Alabama. These were two unbelievable wins for our young team. The aspect of this team that I continue to absolutely love is that they never quit."

The Tigers (17-6, 4-2 SEC) erupted for five runs in the fifth inning in game two to turn a 5-1 deficit into a 6-5 lead. Jessica Mouse, Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson strung together a trio of singles to ignite a one-out rally and load the bases for Juliana Santos, who was hit-by-a-pitch to pull LSU back to 5-2.

On the next pitch, Rachel Mitchell belted a bases clearing double into the left centerfield gap to even the score at 5-5. Ashley Applegate tacked on a single and Mitchell alertly scored the go-ahead when Alabama shortstop Kellie Eubanks dropped the throw into second base by right fielder Jennifer Fenton.

Shortridge fired four innings of three-hit relief and nailed down the 6-5 win by retiring eight of the last nine batters she faced to improve to 3-2 in the circle. It was her first pitching appearance since facing UAB on February 21.

"Kirsten had been hurting and not been able to get into the bullpen to work on pitching," Girouard said. "We are taking steps forward with Kirsten [pitching] from here on out. She took it one pitch at a time, and acted as if the next pitch was the most important pitch every time."

Alabama (23-4, 3-2 SEC) used a pair of two-run home runs by Jazlyn Lunceford and Whitney Lawson in the second and third innings coupled with a Charlotte Morgan RBI-double in the fifth to build a 5-1 advantage.

"I felt the intensity that I thought I might have lost since it had been a while since I was on the mound," Shortridge said. "All the things our team was missing are finally coming together. We are seeing glimpses of how awesome our team really is."

In game one, Morgan kept the Crimson Tide alive with a two-out, RBI-single in the seventh inning to tie the score at 2-2.

Anissa Young opened the home half of the frame lining out to UA second baseman Whitney Larson on a 2-0 pitch. After the out, Girouard went to home plate umpire James Martarona to challenge that Alabama head coach Patrick Murphy didn't report Larson's substitution.

Young was able to bat again and took two balls for a leadoff walk. After a wild pitch moved pinch runner Katie Guillory to second base, Morgan Russell followed with sacrifice bunt to advance Guillory to third.

Mouse put runners on the corners after getting hit-by-a-pitch. With two outs, Jazz Jackson delivered the decisive blow forcing a fielding error from Eubanks at shortstop that allowed Guillory to cross home plate for the 3-2 win.

"I knew something was up when the coaches started running towards me," Girouard said. "They [Alabama] did not report the defensive switch, and that was a turning point in the game. It changed the whole completion of that inning for us."

Alabama's Brittany Rogers opened the game with bunt single and stolen base. A RBI-double from Kelley Montalvo gave the Crimson Tide a 1-0 edge.

LSU fired back in the third inning as Mouse started the frame with a double and advanced to third base on a Shortridge infield single. Santos knocked a one-out RBI-single down the left field line to knot the score at 1-1.

The Tigers snatched a 2-1 advantage when Ashley Langoni cranked her team-leading fourth homer of the season onto the left field berm in the fifth inning.

Cody Trahan bounced back with an eight-strikeout performance against two walks. She was touched up for only two runs on six hits to improve to 6-1.

"We worked a lot this week on fixing my curve ball," Trahan said. "I have to constantly remind myself that I can do this and stay confident. These wins were a huge boost for our confidence."
