SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 14 LSU softball team looks to get back on the winning track with a weekend series against Mississippi State.
- ▶ LSU has won 18 consecutive decisions inside the friendly confines of Tiger Park dating back to February 20 and have outscored its opponents 109-16 during the streak.
- ▶ LSU used a pair of impressive comebacks last season en route to a series sweep at Mississippi State.
- ▶ The Tigers erased a 5-1 hole during the series finale behind RBI hits from Jessica Mouse, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge and Anissa Young. In the circle, Brittany Mack yielded one run on four hits over nine innings to pick up a pair of wins to open the series.
- ▶ An in-depth look at the 2009 season series can be found on pages 7 and 8 of this packet.
- ▶ LSU has spent 70 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 14 in this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU reeled off a program-record 24-game winning streak.
- LSU finished its preconference tournament schedule by winning three consecutive titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- The streak marked the third longest run in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads.
- LSU outscored its opponents by an impressive 158-18 margin and racked up a .328 team batting average to go along with a stifling 0.58 staff ERA during the streak.
- The Tigers are eager to end a five-game losing streak after falling to No. 6 Florida and No. 6 Alabama, a pair of 2008 & 2009 Women's College World Series squads, on the road.
- LSU also is raring to break out of a .130 hitting clip and put behind a 1-for-25 skid in RBI situations during the five-game stretch.
- LSU already has seven players register more than 15 RBIs and are an astonishing 81-for-86 in the stolen base department. The Tigers tallied only 46 stolen bases last season.
- The .942 stolen base success rate is currently on-pace to shatter a program record. The 2008 team notched an .892 mark.
- LSU has played phenomenal defense en route to the SEC's best fielding percentage at .977. The Tigers have committed just 24 errors over their first 38 games of the season.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.

- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 32 of 38 games highlighted by a team-best 19 multi-hit efforts, which are third in the SEC.
- Shortridge has racked up a .482 average [38-of-77] during her last 16 games and her 56 hits rank third in the SEC.
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge joined former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn USA Softball Player of the Week [Week of March 15].
- Shortridge has tallied the SEC's second most stolen bases with 33 and swiped multiple bags on eight occasions this season. She has stolen a base in 12 of her last 17 outings. [March 7-April 7].
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- With 16 runs scored over her last 16 games, Shortridge has surged into an eighth place tie in the SEC. She has crossed the plate 33 times and scored the game's first run nine occasions this season.
- Rachel Mitchell has notched multi-hit efforts in five of her last nine games highlighted by a career-best four hits at Southeastern Louisiana [March 24] to boost her average by 75 points during March and check in with a .348 clip for the season.
- Mitchell has popped four home runs and added 28 RBIs to share the team lead with Anissa Young. She has ripped 15 RBIs during her last 15 games [March 13-April 7] and recently picked up LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 1] accolades.
- Mitchell also has drawn 16 walks and is a perfect 12-for-12 on the base paths to rank just outside the SEC's Top 10 on the season.
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second consecutive season. Shortridge recently was named one of 25 finalists for the prestigious award.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 18-for-116 slump during LSU's first 38 games.

- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs in SEC action en route to SEC All-Freshmen and NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- Santos returned from a four-game hiatus by knocking a three-run home run at McNeese State [March 31] She notched a hit and scored a run during the Alabama doubleheader [April 7].
- Falcon has come away with hits in five of her last nine games where she has earned an at-bat [March 14-April 4] and tallied a career-best three hits against Nicholls State [March 23].
- Anissa Young is looking to break out of an 0-for-14 five-game mini slump. The Tigers are 13-1 in games where Young has drove home runs and her 28 RBIs rank just outside the SEC's Top 10.
- Young has been issued 16 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch 12 times. She forced home a run after being plunked during the sixth inning of game one of the Alabama doubleheader [April 7].
- During her two-year career, 31 of Young's 65 RBI's have come on her 13 home runs. The California native also has registered a .349 [61-for-175] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average up to .284 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best seven home runs to go along with 17 RBIs.
- Langoni returned to the lineup at McNeese State [March 31] after a 10-game absence and compiled hits in all three games of the Florida series [April 3-4].
- Langoni crushed a walk-off home run to give LSU a 5-4 nine-inning win over Houston [Feb. 28] after picking up LSWA Hitter of the Week accolades [Feb. 23].
- Langoni has produced 35 of her 46 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 25 of her last 42 hits have produced RBIs with 22 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Ashley Applegate is looking to snap out of an 0-for-14 stretch of her own over her last five games. Her batting average has moved to .296 and marks the first time since the Virginia game [Feb. 19] where she will enter a game not hitting above .300.
- Applegate has coaxed a team-best 20 walks and been plunked seven times to garner a .437 on-base clip.
- Applegate has reached base during 34 of 38 games, including all 24 games of LSU's winning streak earlier this season.
- Applegate knocked RBI-singles against Houston and Jacksonville State [Feb. 28] that either represented the tying or go-ahead runs late in those games.
- Courtney Hollier has surged into the starting lineup at second base. She is hitting .250 and chipped in 18 RBIs after going 2-for-32 at the plate last season.
- Hollier recorded a career-best seven-game hitting streak [March 6-17] and has connected for a .347 average [17-for-49] to go along from the No. 6 spot in the lineup.
- Hollier tacked on RBIs in games one and three of the Auburn series [March 20-21], including a sacrifice fly during the fifth inning to break a scoreless tie in the series finale.
- Morgan Russell has gone 12-for-32 and added eight RBIs during her last 17 games. She connected for a two-run double during the first game of the Auburn series [March 20], while her three hits were a career-high in the middle game at South Carolina [March 13].
- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs for the Tigers. LSU is 14-1 this season when she is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have combined to throw out five runners and limited LSU's opponents to just 14 stolen bases over the first 38 games of the season.
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 28 of 36 games where she has earned an at-bat.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already totaled 17 RBIs sparked by six multi-RBI efforts in 2010. She is second on the squad only behind Young and has produced 10 two-out RBIs.
- Mouse's defense at third base has been just as impressive and her 64 assists are tied for seventh in the SEC.

CIRCLE NOTES

- Cody Trahan, Brittany Mack and Rachele Fico continue to anchor the staff that has already tossed 14 shutouts en route to the SEC's lowest ERA at a 1.23 ratio.

- The trio of also are ranked among the SEC's Top 5 in ERA and Top 8 in opponent batting average. They also picked up at least six victories during LSU's 24-game winning streak.
- The staff has limited opponents to under three runs in 30 of the team's 38 games as the Tigers have played 20 games versus nine 2009 NCAA Tournament squads this season.
- Trahan returned to the circle with a vengeance after missing opening weekend. She started her senior campaign with eight consecutive wins before coming off a pair of tough-luck losses where she limited the potent offenses of Florida and Alabama to zero runs over the first five innings of each game.
- Trahan sports an 8-2 mark to go along with a 0.99 ERA and has yielded only 10 runs during 75.1 innings of work. She also has compiled an impressive 75 strikeouts against 11 walks.
- Trahan delivered a three-hitter and mowed down six batters to open the Auburn series [March 20] for her last win. She garnered SEC Pitcher of the Week [March 22] and also notched LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors [March 10] earlier this season.
- Trahan also sprayed five hits in a shutout at South Carolina [March 13] where she had to borrow cleats and a glove from her teammates.
- Mack is 7-2 with a staff-best 0.96 ERA and has won six consecutive decisions. She has wins over South Carolina [March 13] and Auburn [March 20] highlighted by a one-hit gem versus the Gamecocks where she sat down the final 12 batters he faced.
- Mack's two setbacks came at Texas [Feb. 13] and No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] when she only received one run of support. She struck out eight batters and allowed only one earned run in each outing.
- Mack was handed a no-decision at No. 7 Alabama [April 7] after limiting the Crimson Tide to one run on two hits during her four innings of work.
- Fico has turned in an 11-4 record with a 1.41 ERA and added three saves. She recently had a stretch of 26.0 straight scoreless frames [March 6-April 3] and her 10 straight wins dating back to opening weekend come to a close.
- Minus the Florida and Alabama stretch where she was touched up 10 runs, Fico has held her opponents to .144 hitting clip since opening weekend. She has allowed only seven runs, five earned, on 31 hits and punched out 69 batters over 62.2 innings of work.
- Fico's SEC wins have come in a five-hit shutout at South Carolina [March 14], 2.2 frames of one-hit relief to close the Ole Miss doubleheader [March 17] and a six-hitter to cap the Auburn sweep [March 21].
- Fico tallied SEC Freshman of the Week [March 22] and also earned LSWA Pitcher of the Week [March 3 & 23] earlier this season.
- Kirsten Shortridge has gone 3-1 over her six appearances and tossed her first seven-inning complete game of her LSU career during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge has yielded only one earned run in four of her five starts and also earned a win over Oklahoma State [Feb. 20].
- Shortridge returned to the circle for the first time since Feb. 28 and fired 4.0 innings of no-hit relief at McNeese State [March 31].

- Lauren Capello has reached base in nine of her 26 career at-bats as a pinch hitter with four hits, four walks and one hit-by-pitch.
- Katie Guillory is 0-for-3 after going 3-for-12 at the plate in 2009. She scored the game-tying run against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19].
- Tiffany Shaw has scored in 13 of her 20 running appearances, including nine of her last 14 outings. She is 3-for-10 at the plate with a RBI and 10-for-11 in the stolen base department.
- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in six of her 15 pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during five of her seven pinch running attempts.
- Heidi Pizer has made 10 appearances and one start at shortstop. She is 0-for-7 at the plate.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU won 13 of 22 games decided by one run and 11 of the Tigers SEC tilts were decided in this fashion during the 2009 season. The Tigers are 4-6 this season after going 0-3 during opening weekend.
- Taking a page from the football program, LSU is 8-1 in night contests against a 21-8 tally in day games.
- LSU has gone 26-1 when scoring three or more runs with its only setback coming in game two at Alabama [April 7] and has tallied a 24-3 record when scoring first.
- LSU has recorded a 16-2 mark when hitting a home run, while going 13-7 when not hitting a long ball. The Tiger sophomore class has belted 16 of the 22 long balls.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up five comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - Rachel Mitchell turned in a 3-for-8 performance with five RBIs and Brittany Mack picked up two wins in the circle to propel the No. 21 LSU softball team to 5-4 and 4-1 victories Saturday over Mississippi State at the MSU Softball Field.

"It was a workmen like performance today by the Tigers," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "Mississippi State has always been a tough place for us to play. We were very methodically at the plate and Brittany looked awfully good in the circle."

Game 1 – LSU 5, Mississippi State 4

Jessica Mouse provided a solo homer run to break a 4-4 tie with two outs in the seventh inning, while Mack fired two innings of one-hit relief to improve to 6-1 in the circle. The Texas native struck out four of the eight batters she faced.

The Tigers (18-6, 5-2 SEC) overcame an early 2-0 deficit by posting four runs in the third inning. Mouse knocked a one-out single before Shortridge reached on a fielding error.

A Jazz Jackson fielder's choice put runners on the corners and Santos cranked a RBI-single into centerfield to bring the Tigers within 2-1.

On a 0-2 pitch, Mitchell connected for a three-run homer to left centerfield to give LSU a 4-2 edge.

"I've been seeing the ball better recently and have been patient at the plate," Mitchell said. "I'm not being too aggressive and just doing a better job of feeling my swing."

Mississippi State (14-14, 0-8 SEC) drew even with a pair of runs in the sixth inning. Back-to-back singles by Ali Bainbridge and Sammie Jo Bailey followed by a Kaili Smith RBI-double tied the score at 4-4.

Game 2 – LSU 4, Mississippi State 1

LSU broke through for four runs in the third inning as Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson strung together a pair of infield singles. Shortridge scored from first base on Jackson's single on a throwing error by MSU pitcher Lindsey Dunlap.

After a Santos walk, Mitchell delivered a two-run double into the right centerfield gap to make it 3-0. Three batters later, Anissa Young capped the frame with a RBI-single to score pushing the Tiger advantage to 4-0.

The Bulldogs loaded the bases in the home half of the frame and pulled within 4-1 when Bainbridge was hit-by-a-pitch. Mack buckled down and got Bailey to foul out to end the threat.

"I realized how well my off speed curve was working during the first game and took that same approach into the second game," Mack said. "It was key for me just to concentrate and focus on hitting my spots taking each inning pitch-by-pitch."

Mack finished with six strikeouts against two walks and limited MSU to three hits en route to her seventh win of the season. She retired the last eight batters she faced to secure the 4-1 win.

STARKVILLE, Miss. -- The No. 21 LSU softball team stormed back with six runs over the final three innings to earn a 7-5 triumph Sunday to complete a weekend sweep over Mississippi State at the MSU Softball Field.

LSU (20-6, 7-2 SEC) used a balanced offensive assault and matched a season-high pounding out 14 hits, while Casey Faile faced the minimum over three innings allowing only one-hit to improve to 4-2.

"This team continues to battle and didn't panic when they were behind," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "Maybe youth is a good thing in this instance because sometimes they don't know any better. I challenged Casey last week [at practice]. A huge pat on the back for her to come in and make the most of her opportunity the way she did."

Down 5-1 in the fifth inning, Anissa Young jump-started the Tigers by belting a 3-1 pitch over the left center field fence.

A pair of singles by Jessica Mouse and Kirsten Shortridge coupled with Jazz Jackson getting hit-by-a pitch loaded the bases. Rachel Mitchell delivered a two-out, two-run single to draw the Tigers back to 5-4. The Texas native has drove home 11 RBIs over her last five games.

"Rachel continues to stay hot at the best time," Girouard said. "She's pretty to watch at the plate and validating her preseason All-SEC selection."

Young was hit-by-a-pitch to start the sixth inning and pinch runner Katie Guillory came around to score as Mouse cranked a triple off the left field fence that stayed inches fair to knot the score at 5-5. Five pitches later, Shortridge tacked on the go-ahead run with a RBI-single to surge the Tigers ahead, 6-5.

"I pull the heck out of everything at the plate, and I was willing that ball to stay fair," Mouse said. "The best thing about this team is that we stay together and believe in ourselves to come back even if it seems like we're out of it sometimes."

LSU added an insurance run via a Young RBI-single in the seventh inning to push the lead to 7-5.

Mississippi State attempted to rally in the home half of the frame as Kaili Smith opened with a leadoff. Faile ended the threat by snagging a line drive off the bat of Sammie Jo Bailey and doubled-off Smith at first base.

The Bulldogs (14-15, 0-9 SEC) scored runs each of the first four innings to build a 5-1 advantage. Smith knocked a RBI-triple in the first inning to even the score at 1-1 and teamed with Chelsea Bramlett for bases loaded walks during the second inning to give MSU a 3-1 advantage.

Mississippi State used a Courtney Nesbit RBI-double in the third inning along with an unearned run to make it 5-1 after four innings.
