- ▶ The Tigers will pay tribute to Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge and Cody Trahan following Sunday's series finale.
- ▶ LSU took the final two games of last season's series at Arkansas. Trahan along with Casey Faile notched the wins for LSU in the circle.
- ▶ LSU jumped out to an 8-0 lead in game two. All eight runs were scored with two outs highlighted by an Ashley Langoni two-run double and a Jessica Mouse two-run home run.
- ▶ The Tigers also used two-out magic as Mouse, Juliana Santos and Anissa Young provided RBI hits during the series finale.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU reeled off a program-record 24-game winning streak.
- LSU finished its preconference tournament schedule by winning three consecutive titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- The streak marked the third longest run in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads.
- LSU outscored its opponents by an impressive 158-18 margin and racked up a .328 team batting average to go along with a stifling 0.58 staff ERA during the streak.
- LSU lost five straight games to No. 6 Florida and No. 6 Alabama, who have appeared in the last two Women's College World Series, on the road. The Tigers put the skid into the rear view mirror with a sweep over Mississippi State and mid-week triumph over Nicholls.
- LSU already has seven players register more than 15 RBIs and are an astonishing 94-for-100 in the stolen base department. The Tigers tallied only 46 stolen bases last season.
- The .940 stolen base success rate is currently on-pace to shatter a program record. The 2008 team notched an .892 mark.
- LSU has played phenomenal defense en route to the SEC's best fielding percentage at .978. The clip also ranks fourth nationally as the Tigers have committed just 25 errors over their first 42 games of the season.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.

- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 34 of 42 games highlighted by a team-best 20 multi-hit efforts, which are tied for third in the SEC.
- Shortridge broke out of a 2-for-18 six-game mini slump with a 3-for-4 performance and three RBIs against Nicholls. Her 60 hits rank third in the SEC.
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge joined former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn USA Softball Player of the Week [Week of March 15].
- Shortridge has tallied the SEC's second most stolen bases with 36 and swiped multiple bags on nine occasions this season. She has stolen a base in 10 of her last 16 outings. [March 17-April 14].
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- With 20 runs scored over her last 20 games, Shortridge has surged into an ninth place in the SEC. She has crossed the plate 37 times and scored the game's first run on 10 occasions this season.
- Rachel Mitchell has notched multi-hit efforts in six of her last 14 games highlighted by a career-best four hits at Southeastern Louisiana [March 24] to boost her average by 75 points during March and check in with a .352 clip for the season.
- Mitchell has popped four home runs and added a team-best 33 RBIs to move into a 10th place tie in the SEC. She has ripped 20 RBIs during her last 19 games [March 13-April 14] and recently picked up LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 1 & 13] accolades twice.
- Mitchell also has drawn 20 walks and is a perfect 15-for-15 on the base paths to rank just outside the SEC's Top 10 on the season.
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second consecutive season. Shortridge recently was named one of 25 finalists for the prestigious award.

- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 19-for-124 slump during LSU's first 42 games.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs in SEC action en route to SEC All-Freshmen and NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- Santos returned from a four-game hiatus by knocking a three-run home run at McNeese State [March 31] She notched a hit and scored a run in game two of the Alabama doubleheader [April 7].
- Falcon picked up a RBI on a sacrifice fly during the series finale against Mississippi State [April 11] and tallied a career-best three hits against Nicholls State [March 23].
- Anissa Young broke out of an 0-for-14 mini slump and turned in a 2-for-4 performance with three RBIs in the middle game of the Mississippi State series [April 10].
- The Tigers are 15-1 in games where Young has drove home runs and her 32 RBIs are just outside the SEC's Top 10.
- Young has been issued 18 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch 14 times. Camille Harris set LSU's program mark and was plunked 16 times during the 2006 season.
- During her two-year career, 32 of Young's 69 RBIs have come on her 14 home runs. The California native also has registered a .344 [64-for-186] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average up to .295 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best eight home runs to go along with 24 RBIs.
- Langoni returned to the lineup at McNeese State [March 31] after a 10-game absence and compiled hits in six of her last 10 games since her return.
- Langoni matched a career-best with four RBIs against Nicholls [April 14]. She has produced 35 of her 53 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 28 of her last 47 hits have produced RBIs with 24 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Ashley Applegate snapped out of an 0-for-14 stretch of her own and her batting returned to .304 after knocking hits in the final two games of the Mississippi State series.
- Applegate has coaxed a team-best 25 walks and been plunked 10 times to garner a .467 on-base clip.
- Applegate has reached base during 38 of 42 games, including all 24 games of LSU's winning streak earlier this season.
- Courtney Hollier has surged into the starting lineup at second base. She is hitting .245 and chipped in 18 RBIs after recording a 2-for-32 mark at the plate last season.
- Hollier recorded a career-best seven-game hitting streak [March 6-17] and has connected for a .327 average [17-for-52] to go along with 14 RBIs from the No. 6 spot in the lineup.
- Hollier tacked on RBIs in games one and three of the Auburn series [March 20-21], including a sacrifice fly during the fifth inning to break a scoreless tie in the series finale.
- Morgan Russell has gone 15-for-41 and added nine RBIs during her last 20 games. She connected for the game winning run with a RBI-single to open the MSU series [April 10].
- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs for the Tigers. LSU is 14-1 this season when she is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have combined to throw out five runners and held LSU's opponents to just 18 stolen bases over the first 42 games.
- Jessica Mouse, who also started one game at catcher, has reached base in 32 of 40 games where she has earned an at-bat.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already totaled 20 RBIs sparked by six multi-RBI efforts in 2010. She is tied for second with Shortridge on the squad and has produced 10 two-out RBIs.
- Mouse's defense at third base has been just as impressive and her 73 assists are sixth in the SEC.

CIRCLE NOTES

- Cody Trahan, Brittany Mack and Rachele Fico continue to anchor the staff that has already tossed 14 shutouts en route to the SEC's lowest ERA at a 1.26 ratio.
- The trio of also are ranked among the SEC's Top 4 in ERA and Top 7 in opponent batting average. They also picked up at least six victories during LSU's 24-game winning streak.

- The staff has limited opponents to under three runs in 34 of the team's 42 games as the Tigers have played 23 games versus 10 2009 NCAA Tournament squads this season.
- Trahan returned to the circle with a vengeance after missing opening weekend. She started her senior campaign with eight consecutive wins before coming off a pair of tough-luck losses to Florida and Alabama.
- Trahan sports an 9-2 mark to go along with a 0.96 ERA and has yielded only 11 runs during 80.0 innings of work. She also has compiled an impressive 85 strikeouts against 12 walks.
- Trahan bounced back and limited Mississippi State (April 10) to one run on two hits. She garnered SEC Pitcher of the Week (March 22) and also notched LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors (March 10).
- Trahan also sprayed five hits in a shutout at South Carolina (March 13) where she had to borrow cleats and a glove from her teammates.
- Mack is 8-2 with a 1.17 ERA and has won seven consecutive decisions. She has wins over South Carolina (March 13), Auburn (March 20) and Mississippi State (April 11), highlighted by a one-hit gem versus the Gamecocks.

- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in six of her 17 pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during seven of her nine pinch running attempts.
- Heidi Pizer has made 12 appearances and two starts. She was 0-for-7 at the plate before knocking a pair of home runs with three RBIs at Nicholls [April 14].

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU won 13 of 22 games decided by one run and 11 of the Tigers SEC tilts were decided in this fashion during the 2009 season. The Tigers are 5-6 this season after going 0-3 during opening weekend.
- Taking a page from the football program, LSU is 9-1 in night contests against a 24-8 tally in day games.
- LSU has gone 29-1 when scoring three or more runs with its only setback coming in game two at Alabama [April 7] and has tallied a 25-3 record when scoring first.
- LSU has recorded a 19-2 mark when hitting a home run, while going 14-7 when not hitting a long ball. The Tiger sophomore class has belted 20 of the 26 long balls.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up six comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].

- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
- Trailing 1-0 to Campbell [March 6], LSU made the most of two Camel errors to tie the score during the fifth inning to set up Courtney Hollier walk-off long ball to leadoff the eighth inning.
- Tied 1-1 in the fifth inning of game two against Ole Miss [March 17], Kirsten Shortridge manufactured a run and forced the Rebels into a fielding error for the winning run.
- With Mississippi State holding a 1-0 edge in the fifth inning [April 10], Langoni provided the equalizer with a two-out RBI-single. Two frames later, Morgan Russell knocked the game-winning single to hand LSU a 2-1 walk-off victory.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. -- The No. 18 LSU softball team reeled off a 10-4 game two victory after falling 8-7 in the first game against Arkansas at Bogle Park to open an SEC weekend series.

The Tigers (24-10-1, 9-6-1 SEC) maintained a .006 percentage point lead over Arkansas (24-16, 10-7) for second place in the SEC Western Division.

"We were able to produce in primetime situations on offense, but we weren't hitting our spots in the circle," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We have to put together all three facets of the game to be successful tomorrow in the rubber game."

Game 2 -- LSU 10, Arkansas 4

LSU fired out to an 8-0 lead after posting multiple runs in each of the first three innings. All eight runs were scored with two outs as Ashley Langoni cranked a two-run double to left field in the first inning.

The Tigers strung together six consecutive hits in the second inning to push the advantage to 6-0. Jessica Mouse started the rally with a double followed by a trio of RBI-singles by Kirsten Shortridge, Jazz Jackson and Juliana Santos. A Mitchell RBI-double into the left center-field gap capped the frame.

Anissa Young extended the third inning with a walk and Mouse belted a two-run homer to make it 8-0.

Arkansas responded with four runs in the home half of the frame as Kayla Johnson, Miranda Dixon and Sandra Smith tallied RBIs to chase Shortridge from the circle.

Casey Faile tossed 4.1 innings of three-hit relief. She mowed down seven batters against three walks and hasn't allowed an earned run in her last 22.2 innings of work.

LSU tacked on insurance runs in the fifth and sixth innings aided by RBIs from Jackson and Faile for the final margin of 10-4. The first five Tiger hitters finished with seven of the team's 10 RBIs.

Game 1 -- Arkansas 8, LSU 7

Down 3-2 heading into the fifth inning, LSU erupted for five runs highlighted by an Anissa Young three-run home run to grab a 7-3 advantage.

Miranda Dixon hit a two-run homer and Whitney Cloer added a bases loaded walk to draw the Razorbacks back to 7-6.

Arkansas scored an unearned run on an Ashley Langoni throwing error to tie the score at 7-7 in the seventh inning. Two batters later, Brittany Robison provided the walk-off hit for the 8-7 win.

Brittany Mack had her eight-game winning streak snapped and dropped to 10-2 in the circle. She was touched up for three hits and four walks in her one inning of relief.

Brittany Griffiths gave the Razorbacks a 1-0 edge with a RBI-double in the second inning. After a two-run single by Ashley Langoni in the third inning gave LSU a 2-1 lead, Griffiths added a two-run homer in the fourth inning to put Arkansas ahead, 3-2.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. -- The No. 18 LSU softball team came away with a 7-4 victory over Arkansas in the rubber game of a SEC weekend series at Bogle Park.

With the series win, the Tigers (25-10-1, 10-6-1 SEC) strengthen its grasp of second place in the SEC Western Division.

Cody Trahan went the distance and mowed down a season-best 11 strikeouts. She retired 13 of the first 14 batters she faced and carried a no-hitter into the fifth inning.

Arkansas (24-17, 10-8 SEC) scored four runs in the seventh on a pair of two-run hits by Brittany Griffiths and Jessica Bachkora for the final margin of 7-4.

"It was a statement game for us to come back after what happened in game one of the series," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We weren't sure whether or not Cody was going to be able to pitch. She hit her spots, got ahead in the count and that allowed her to use her weapons."

Eight of the nine batters for LSU recorded hits as the Tiger offense capped an impressive weekend with its third straight double-digit hit effort. LSU tallied a .361 batting average and racked up 35 hits.

The Tigers manufactured a run in the first inning as Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson reached base on a hit batter and a walk, respectively.

A double steal moved the duo into scoring position and Shortridge alertly scored on a dropped third strike when Arkansas catcher Whitney Cloer threw down to first base for the game's first run.

LSU tacked on a three more runs in the second inning. Anissa Young knocked a double into the left centerfield gap. Morgan Russell added a single and Jessica Mouse drew a walk to load the bases setting the table for RBI-singles from Shortridge and Juliana Santos to make it 4-0.

The Tigers added an unearned run in the fourth inning as Jessica Mouse knocked a single through the left side to push the advantage to 5-0. Ashley Applegate and Young cranked RBI-singles in the sixth inning to extend the lead to 7-0.

"It's nice to see our hitters make adjustments and show our depth as a line-up from top to bottom," Girouard said. "We're scoring runs in primetime situations, especially with two outs."

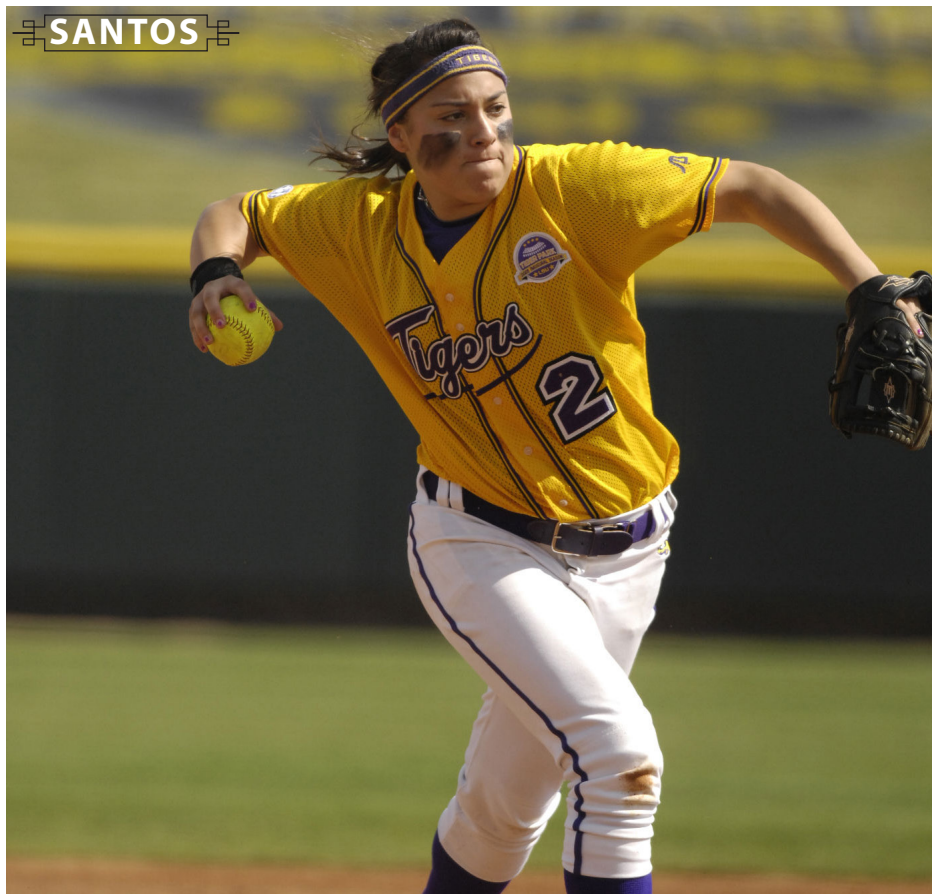
