## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 16 LSU softball team opens the home stretch of the regular season with a weekend series at Kentucky.
- ▶ The Tigers are 10-0 all-time in Lexington. First pitch for Saturday's doubleheader is slated for 12 p.m. followed by an 11 a.m. start for the series finale.
- ▶ LSU took two of three games last season at Tiger Park. The Tigers emerged with wins in the first and third game of the series behind strong performances from Cody Trahan.
- ▶ LSU was kickstarted in the rubber game of the series by a Juliana Santos, who cranked a grand slam to spark five consecutive hits to open the game.

- ▶ LSU has spent 72 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 16 and No. 12 in this week's polls.

**STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS**

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU reeled off a program-record 24-game winning streak.
- LSU finished its preconference tournament schedule by winning three consecutive titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- The streak marked the third longest run in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads.
- LSU outscored its opponents by an impressive 158-18 margin and racked up a .328 team batting average to go along with a stifling 0.58 staff ERA during the streak.
- LSU lost five straight games to No. 6 Florida and No. 6 Alabama, who have appeared in the last two Women's College World Series, on the road.
- The Tigers put the skid into the rear view mirror and have strung together a 7-1 mark compiling sweeps over Mississippi State and Arkansas along with a mid-week win at Nicholls.
- LSU already has five players register 20 or more RBIs and are an astonishing 102-for-109 in the stolen base department. The Tigers tallied only 46 stolen bases a season ago.
- The 102 stolen bases are tied with the 1999 squad for fourth place over a single-season mark, while the .936 stolen base success rate is currently on-pace to shatter a program record. The 2008 team notched an .892 mark.
- LSU has played phenomenal defense en route to the SEC's best fielding percentage at .978.
- The clip also ranks fifth nationally as the Tigers have committed just 28 errors over their first 46 games.

- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 38 of 46 games highlighted by a team-best 21 multi-hit efforts, which are fourth in the SEC.
- Shortridge has hit safely in her last six games to break out of a 1-15 slump. Her 65 hits rank third in the SEC.
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge joined former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn USA Softball Player of the Week [Week of March 15].
- Shortridge has tallied the SEC's second most stolen bases with 37 and swiped multiple bags on nine occasions this season. She has stolen a base in 11 of her last 19 outings. [March 17-April 21].
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- With 22 runs scored over her last 24 games, Shortridge has surged into ninth place in the SEC. She has crossed the plate 39 times and scored the game's first run on 10 occasions this season.
- Rachel Mitchell has collected hits in 13 of her last 17 games, including five of six efforts since moving to the top of the lineup. Her average climbed 75 points during the month of March and she checks in with a .341 clip for the season.
- Mitchell has popped four home runs and added a team-best 34 RBIs to move into 10th place in the SEC. She has ripped 21 RBIs during her last 23 games [March 13-April 21] and recently picked up LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 1 & 13] accolades twice.
- Mitchell also has drawn 22 walks and is a perfect 16-for-16 on the base paths to surge into a ninth place tie with teammate Tiffany Shaw in the SEC rankings.

- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second consecutive season. Shortridge recently was named one of 25 finalists for the prestigious award.
- After starting the season 9-for-61, Juliana Santos reeled off a 5-for-12 clip during her last five games. She knocked a RBI-single to open the Arkansas series [April 18].
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs in SEC action en route to SEC All-Freshmen and NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- Allison Falcon turned in a 2-for-2 performance with a clutch two-out RBI-single during the fifth inning to push LSU's lead to 3-1 during the Arkansas series finale [April 18].
- Anissa Young is 6-for-39 at the plate during her last 13 games [April 3-21] but still has managed to add six RBIs, including a trio of RBIs during the middle game of the Mississippi State series.
- The Tigers are 16-1 in games where Young has notched RBIs and her 33 RBIs are just outside the SEC's Top 10.
- Young has been issued 18 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch 14 times. Camille Harris set LSU's program mark and was plunked 16 times during the 2006 season.
- During her two-year career, 32 of Young's 70 RBI's have come on her 14 home runs. The California native also has registered a .340 [66-for-194] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average up to .297 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best nine home runs to go along with 28 RBIs.
- Langoni returned to the lineup at McNeese State [March 31] after a 10-game absence and has reeled off 11 RBIs during her last eight games [April 10-21]. She also earned LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 20] for the second time this season.
- Langoni matched a career-best with four RBIs against Nicholls [April 14]. She has produced 45 of her 58 career RBIs from either the No. 3 or No. 5 spots in the lineup.
- 31 of Langoni's last 51 hits have produced RBIs with 26 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Ashley Applegate snapped out of an 0-for-14 stretch of her own and her batting returned to .312 after knocking hits in the final two games of the Arkansas series.
- Applegate has coaxed a team-best 28 walks and been plunked 10 times to garner a .472 on-base clip.
- Applegate has reached base during 41 of 46 games, including all 24 games of LSU's winning streak earlier this season.
- Applegate laced a RBI-single to break a 1-1 tie during the fifth inning of the series finale against Arkansas [April 18].
- Courtney Hollier has surged into the starting lineup at second base. She is hitting .237 and chipped in 18 RBIs after recording a 2-for-32 mark at the plate last season.
- Hollier recorded a career-best seven-game hitting streak [March 6-17] and has connected for a .327 average [17-for-52] to go along with 14 RBIs from the No. 6 spot in the lineup.
- Hollier tacked on RBIs in games one and three of the Auburn series [March 20-21], including a sacrifice fly during the fifth inning to break a scoreless tie in the series finale.
- Morgan Russell has gone 15-for-44 and added nine RBIs during her last 21 games. She ripped a walkoff RBI-single to open the Mississippi State series [April 10].
- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs for the Tigers but has gone 0-for-25 during her 15 games where she tallied an at-bat. LSU is 17-1 this season when Houston is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have combined to throw out five runners and held LSU's opponents to just 19 stolen bases over the first 46 games.
- Jessica Mouse, who also started one game at catcher, has reached base in 35 of 44 games where she has earned an at-bat.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already totaled 20 RBIs sparked by six multi-RBI efforts in 2010.
- Mouse has produced timely hitting for the Tigers and is tied for third on the squad with 10 two-out RBIs.
- Mouse's defense at third base has been just as impressive and her 82 assists are tied for fifth in the SEC.

- Cody Trahan, Brittany Mack and Rachele Fico continue to anchor the staff that has already tossed 14 shutouts en route to the SEC's lowest and nation's second-best ERA at a 1.31 ratio.
- The trio also are ranked among the SEC's Top 3 in individual ERA and are Top 11 in opponent batting average.
- The staff has limited opponents to under three runs in 36 of the team's 46 games as the Tigers have played 26 games versus 11 2009 NCAA Tournament squads.
- Trahan returned to the circle with a vengeance after missing opening weekend. She started her senior campaign with eight consecutive wins before coming off a pair of tough-luck losses to No. 6 Florida [April 3] and No. 6 Alabama [April 7].
- Trahan sports an 11-2 mark to go along with a 1.14 ERA and has yielded only 15 runs during 92.0 innings of work. She also has compiled an impressive 93 strikeouts against 14 walks.
- Trahan has bounced back to produce three straight wins, including a pair of victories over Arkansas [April 17-18]. She recorded four Ks in each start and earned the win on Senior Day.
- Trahan has garnered SEC Pitcher of the Week [March 22] and also notched LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors [March 10].
- Trahan also sprayed five hits in a shutout at South Carolina [March 13] where she had to borrow cleats and a glove from her teammates.
- Mack is 8-3 with a 1.40 ERA and has won seven consecutive decisions. She has league wins over South Carolina [March 13], Auburn [March 20] and Mississippi State [April 11], highlighted by a one-hit gem versus the Gamecocks.
- Mack's three setbacks came at Texas [Feb. 13], against No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] and McNeese State [April 21] when she only received one run of support. She struck out eight batters and allowed only one earned run in each outing.
- Fico has turned in an 14-4 record with a 1.14 ERA and matched a program single-season mark with four saves. She also became the first freshman pitcher in program history to come away with SEC Pitcher of the Week [April 19].
- Fico hasn't surrendered an earned run in 22.0 consecutive innings after her setback at Alabama [April 7]. She fired 7.2 frames of five-hit relief with nine strikeouts and sat down the final 12 batters she faced in the middle game of the Arkansas series [April 17].
- Fico tallied SEC Freshman of the Week [March 22] and also earned LSWA Pitcher of the Week [March 3 & 23, April 20].
- Minus the Florida and Alabama stretch where she was touched up 10 runs, Fico has held her opponents to .151 hitting clip since opening weekend. She has allowed only eight runs, five earned, on 43 hits and punched out 87 batters over 83.2 innings of work.
- Earlier this season, Fico put together a stretch of 26.0 straight scoreless frames [March 6-April 3] and her 10 straight wins dating back to opening weekend come to a close [Feb. 17-April 3].
- Kirsten Shortridge has gone 3-1 over her seven appearances and tossed her first seven-inning complete game of her LSU career during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge has yielded only one earned run in four of her six starts and also earned a win over Oklahoma State [Feb. 20]. She returned to the circle for the first time since Feb. 28 and fired 4.0 innings of no-hit relief at McNeese State [March 31].

## OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in nine of her 26 career at-bats as a pinch hitter with four hits, four walks and one hit-by-pitch.
- Katie Guillory is 0-for-3 after going 3-for-12 at the plate in 2009. She scored the game-tying run against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19].
- Tiffany Shaw has scored in 16 of her 26 running appearances, including 12 of her last 20 outings.
- Shaw is 3-for-10 at the plate with a RBI and 16-for-18 in the stolen base department to rank tied for ninth in the SEC. She has recorded a steal in five of her last six appearances [April 10-21].
- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in six of her 17 pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during seven of her 12 pinch running attempts.
- Heidi Pizer has made 15 appearances and two starts. She was 0-for-7 at the plate before knocking a pair of home runs with three RBIs at Nicholls [April 14].

## IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU won 13 of 22 games decided by one run and 11 of the Tigers SEC tilts were decided in this fashion during the 2009 season. The Tigers have won seven of their last nine one-run decisions after going 0-3 during opening weekend.
- Taking a page from the football program, LSU is 9-2 in night contests against a 27-8 tally in day games.
- LSU has gone 32-1 when scoring three or more runs with its only setback coming in game two at Alabama [April 7] and has tallied a 27-5 record when scoring first.
- LSU has recorded a 20-2 mark when hitting a home run, while going 16-8 when not hitting a long ball. The Tiger sophomore class has belted 21 of the 27 long balls.

## GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up seven comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
- Trailing 1-0 to Campbell [March 6], LSU made the most of two Camel errors to tie the score during the fifth inning to set up Courtney Hollier walk-off long ball to leadoff the eighth inning.
- Tied 1-1 in the fifth inning of game two against Ole Miss [March 17], Kirsten Shortridge manufactured a run and forced the Rebels into a fielding error for the winning run.
- With Mississippi State holding a 1-0 edge in the fifth inning [April 10], Langoni provided the equalizer with a two-out RBI-single. Two frames later, Morgan Russell knocked the game-winning single to hand LSU a 2-1 walk-off victory.
- Down 2-0 against Arkansas [April 17], LSU garnered runs in the fourth and fifth innings before Langoni cranked a walkoff double in the 10th inning for the 3-2 triumph.

BATON ROUGE -- The No. 19 LSU softball team split its doubleheader to open SEC action winning game one 3-2 before falling 6-5 in eight innings against Kentucky Saturday at the new Tiger Park.

The Tigers (13-5, 1-1 SEC) had its seven-game winning streak snapped and fell to the Wildcats (10-6, 1-1 SEC) for only the second time in 30 all-time meetings.

In between games, LSU honored its softball alumni as part of alumni weekend. Approximately 30 players were on-hand, including All-Americans Stephanie Hastings, Kristin Schmidt, Leslie Klein and Emily Turner.

"We had our opportunities to complete the sweep," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "A couple of defensive lapses and not capitalizing on offensive chances cost us. Give Kentucky credit because they came back and beat us."

"We'll have to be more mature at the plate, on the mound and in the field," Girouard said. "Basically, we'll have to battle back tomorrow to win the series."

Below is a game-by-game recap.

Game 1 - LSU 3, Kentucky 2

LSU stormed back from a 1-0 deficit with a pair of home runs in the fourth inning.

Juliana Santos drew a leadoff walk before Rachel Mitchell cranked a 2-0 pitch down the right field line to give the Tigers a 2-1. Two batters later, Ashley Langoni belted a longball over the left field berm to extend the lead to 3-1.

The Wildcats took advantage of a trio of walks in the fifth inning to draw back to 3-2 before reliever Brittany Mack got out of a bases loaded jam forcing Natalie Smith to ground out.

Cody Trahan reentered the game and retired the last six batters in order to secure the 3-2 victory. The Texas native won her fourth consecutive start allowing three hits and an unearned run.

Game 2 - Kentucky 6, LSU 5 (8 Innings)

The Tigers jumped out to a 4-0 lead stringing together four hits in the third inning. Kirsten Shortridge opened the frame with a triple to left field and came around to score on an Ashley Applegate RBI-single.

Santos knocked a single through the left side to set the table for Langoni to connect for a three-run homer over the left field wall that went off the glove of UK's Annie Rowlands.

LSU pushed the advantage to 5-0 in the fourth inning on a Jazz Jackson sacrifice fly that scored Lauren Capello, who reached on a leadoff walk.

Kentucky chipped away at the LSU lead by plating runs in the fifth and sixth innings to draw back to 5-2.

The Wildcats loaded the bases in the seventh inning on a single, walk and fielder's choice with no outs before Natalie Smith delivered a three-run double to even the score at 5-5. UK added an unearned run in the eighth inning aided by a Casey Faile throwing error to take a 6-5 lead.

LSU rallied during the home half of the frame with two outs. Applegate tallied her fourth hit of the game on an infield single, while Mitchell and Santos drew back-to-back walks to fill the bases with Tigers.

On a 2-2 pitch, Morgan Russell grounded out to UK third basemen Brittany Cervantes to end the game.

**BATON ROUGE** - The No. 19 LSU softball team reeled off five consecutive hits en route to five runs in the first inning highlighted by a Juliana Santos grand slam and didn't look back in a 10-2 five-inning rout over Kentucky at the new Tiger Park.

The Tigers (14-5, 2-1 SEC) won its opening SEC series for the 12th time in 13 series since softball was reinstated in 1997.

"It was important for us to come out and set the tone," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We know we have to score runs and approach every inning like its 0-0. We were playing with a makeshift lineup [without starting second baseman Ashley Langoni] and shuffled some things around today. All in all, it was a great job by the Tigers today."

Kirsten Shortridge, Jazz Jackson and Rachell Mitchell set the table with a trio of infield hits for Santos, who cranked a 2-2 pitch onto the left field berm to give the Tigers a 4-0 advantage.

Santos finished the game with a career-best five RBIs after adding a bases loaded walk in the fifth inning. She became the first LSU player to reach that feat since Taylr Hollis against St. John's (Feb. 15) last season.

Ashley Applegate tacked on single and advanced to second on a fielding error by UK right fielder Destinee Mordecai. She came around to score on an Anissa Young RBI-single to cap the five-run first inning.

A Katie McCarty RBI-single in the second inning allowed Kentucky to pull within 5-1 before Young belted a towering homer to left field to stretch the LSU lead back to 6-1 in the third inning.

The Wildcats strung together back-to-back hits in the fifth inning as Holly Johnson knocked a RBI-double to draw UK back to 6-2.

LSU responded with four runs during a two-out rally in the home half of the frame. Courtney Hollier hustled down the line to force a throwing error by Johnson on a ground ball. The Tigers showed patience at the plate as Shortridge, Mitchell and Santos drew walks sprinkled between singles by Jessica Mouse and Jackson to make it 9-2.

Jackson scored on a wild pitch by UK reliever Rachel Riley for the final margin of 10-2. She finished the game with a season-best three hits.

Cody Trahan won her fifth consecutive start firing a complete game in the circle.
