- ▶ The No. 17 LSU softball team concludes its regular season home slate on the national stage as No. 8 Georgia visits Tiger Park for a Thursday single-game followed by a Friday doubleheader.
- ▶ Games one and three of the series will be televised by ESPN and ESPN U, respectively.
- ▶ LSU will wear pink jerseys Friday evening as part of its 2nd annual Swing for the Cure event to benefit the Baton Rouge Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure®.
- ▶ LSU and Georgia met only one time during a rain-shortened series last season. The Tigers scored two runs in the seventh inning but its comeback effort fell short, 6-5.

**STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS**

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU reeled off a program-record 24-game winning streak.
- LSU finished its preconference tournament schedule by winning three consecutive titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- The streak marked the third longest run in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads.
- LSU outscored its opponents by an impressive 158-18 margin and racked up a .328 team batting average to go along with a stifling 0.58 staff ERA during the streak.
- LSU lost five straight games to No. 6 Florida and No. 6 Alabama, who have appeared in the last two Women's College World Series, on the road.
- The Tigers put the skid into the rear view mirror and have strung together a 10-1 mark compiling sweeps over Mississippi State, Arkansas and Kentucky along with a mid-week win at Nicholls.
- LSU already has five players register 20 or more RBIs and are an astonishing 104-for-113 in the stolen base department after the Tigers totaled only 46 stolen bases a season ago. LSU's 2.12 stolen bases per game ranks 16th in the nation.
- The 104 stolen bases are tied with the 2001 squad for third place over a single-season mark, while the .920 stolen base success rate is currently on-pace to shatter a program record. The 2008 team notched an .892 mark.
- LSU has played phenomenal defense en route to the SEC's best fielding percentage at .978. The clip also ranks fourth nationally as the Tigers have committed just 29 errors over their first 49 games.

- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. The Tigers were joined by Georgia with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 40 of 49 games highlighted by a pair of nine-game streaks [Feb. 21-March 5] & [March 6-20]. Her 70 hits are fourth in the SEC.
- Shortridge has notched a team-best 23 multi-hit efforts, which are fourth in the SEC. The Tigers are 21-2 when Shortridge tallies a multi-hit game.
- Shortridge has recorded hits during eight of her last nine games [April 11-25] to break out of a 1-15 slump sparked by a 3-for-4 performance in the middle game of the Kentucky series [April 25].
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge joined former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn USA Softball Player of the Week [March 16].
- Shortridge has garnered the SEC's second most stolen bases with 38 and swiped multiple bags on nine occasions this season. She has stolen a base in 12 of her last 22 outings. [March 17-April 25].
- Shortridge became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game when she notched that feat against Virginia [Feb. 19].
- With 26 runs scored over her last 27 games, Shortridge has surged into eighth place in the SEC. She has crossed the plate 43 times and scored the game's first run on 12 occasions this season.
- Rachel Mitchell has collected hits in 16 of her last 20 games [March 20-April 25], including all three games of the Kentucky series last weekend.
- Mitchell's average climbed 75 points during the month of March and she checks in with a .349 clip for the season. She is second on the squad with 13 multi-hit games.

- Mitchell has popped six home runs and added a team-best 40 RBIs to move into eighth place in the SEC. She belted two homers in the Kentucky series [April 24-25] to match three-time All-American Leslie Klein with 32 long balls for the program record.
- Mitchell paces LSU with 12 multi-RBI games and the Tigers are 11-1 when she accomplishes this feat.
- Mitchell has ripped 27 RBIs during her last 26 games [March 13-April 25] and recently picked up LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 1 & 13] accolades twice.
- Mitchell also has drawn 23 walks and is a perfect 17-for-17 on the base paths to surge into 10th place in the SEC rankings.
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second consecutive season. Shortridge was named one of 25 finalists for the prestigious award [April 7].
- After starting the season 9-for-61, Juliana Santos has reeled off a 7-for-19 clip during her last eight games [April 14-25]. She cranked a two-run shot during the fourth inning of the Kentucky series finale [April 25].
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs in SEC action en route to SEC All-Freshmen and NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- LSU is 29-2 when Allison Falcon starts at shortstop. She turned in a 2-for-2 performance with a clutch two-out RBI-single during the fifth inning to push LSU's lead to 3-1 during the Arkansas series finale [April 18].
- Anissa Young is 8-for-49 at the plate during her last 16 games [April 3-25] but still has managed to add eight RBIs, including RBIs over the last two games of the Kentucky series [April 25].
- The Tigers are 18-1 in games where Young has notched RBIs and her 35 RBIs are just outside the SEC's Top 10.
- Young has been issued 19 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch 15 times. Camille Harris set LSU's program mark and was plunked 16 times during the 2006 season.
- During her two-year career, 33 of Young's 72 RBIs have come on her 15 home runs. The California native also has registered a .337 [68-for-202] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average up to .315 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best nine home runs to go along with 31 RBIs.
- Langoni returned to the lineup after missing a 10-game stretch at McNeese State [March 31] and has reeled off 14 RBIs during her last 11 games [April 10-25]. She also earned LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 20] for the second time this season.
- Langoni has produced hits in nine of her last 11 games [April 10-25], including all three games of the Arkansas [April 17-18] and Kentucky [April 24-25] series.
- Langoni matched a career-best with four RBIs against Nicholls [April 14]. She has produced 45 of her 61 career RBIs from either the No. 3 or No. 5 spots in the lineup.
- 34 of Langoni's last 55 hits have produced RBIs with 28 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Ashley Applegate has come away with hits in eight of her last 10 games [April 10-25] and her average returned to a .299 clip.
- Applegate has coaxed a team-best 29 walks and been plunked 10 times to garner a .455 on-base clip. She has reached base during 43 of 49 games, including all 24 games of LSU's winning streak earlier this season.
- Applegate is third on the squad with 31 runs scored and LSU is 24-0 this season when she crosses the plate.
- Applegate laced a RBI-single to break a 1-1 tie during the fifth inning of the series finale against Arkansas [April 18].
- Courtney Hollier is 0-for-12 at the plate and has been used as a defensive replacement at second base and shortstop during seven of the last eight games [April 17-25].
- Hollier is hitting .227 for the season and chipped in 18 RBIs after recording a 2-for-32 mark at the plate last season. She recorded a career-best seven-game hitting streak [March 6-17].
- Morgan Russell has gone 15-for-52 and added nine RBIs during her last 24 games. She ripped a walkoff RBI-single to open the Mississippi State series [April 10].

- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs for the Tigers but has gone 0-for-25 during her 15 games where she tallied an at-bat. LSU is 17-1 this season when Houston is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have combined to throw out six runners and held LSU's opponents to just 20 stolen bases over the first 49 games.
- Jessica Mouse, who also started one game at catcher, has reached base in 38 of 47 games where she has earned an at-bat.
- Mouse is the reigning SEC Player of the Week [April 26] after an amazing series at Kentucky [April 24-25] where she went 7-for-8 with five doubles and two RBIs.
- After entering the weekend a .247 batting average, Mouse raised her hitting clip by 38 points after a trio of multi-hit games. She also notched two walks and has reached base in her last eight plate appearances.
- After driving home 14 RBIs last season, Mouse has already totaled 22 RBIs sparked by six multi-RBI efforts in 2010.
- Mouse has produced timely hitting for the Tigers. She is tied with Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young for the team lead with 12 two-out RBIs.
- Mouse's defense at third base has been just as impressive and her 88 assists are sixth in the SEC.

- Trahan missed the Kentucky series [April 24-25] due to a violation of team rules but will return to the circle against Georgia.
- Mack is 9-3 with a 1.55 ERA and has won eight of her last nine decisions. She has posted league wins over South Carolina [March 13], Auburn [March 20], Mississippi State [April 11] and Kentucky [April 25] highlighted by a one-hit gem versus the Gamecocks.

- Mack fired five innings of shutout ball against the Wildcats [April 25] before allowing a solo homer, three infield hits and a pair of walks during the sixth inning before giving way to Fico.
- Mack's three setbacks came at Texas [Feb. 13], against No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] and McNeese State [April 21] when she only received one run of support.
- Mack struck out a season-best eight batters and allowed only one earned run versus the Longhorns and Wolverines.
- Fico has turned in a 16-4 record with a SEC-leading 1.13 ERA and secured a program single-season mark with five saves.
- Fico has notched back-to-back SEC Pitcher of the Week awards [April 19 & 26]. She joins three-time All-American Britni Sneed [March 11 & 18, 2002] as the last player to accomplish that feat and is the first freshman in program history to win the award.
- Fico has surrendered only two earned runs in her last 35.1 innings of work after her setback at Alabama [April 7]. She posted a 2-0 mark with a save in each of her two weeks.
- Fico shouldered the load at Kentucky [April 24-25]. She notched wins in games one and three of the series without Trahan and limited the Wildcats to one run one four hits during the series finale.
- Fico fired 7.2 frames of five-hit relief with nine strikeouts and sat down the final 12 batters she faced in the middle game of the Arkansas series [April 17].
- Fico tallied SEC Freshman of the Week [March 22] and also earned LSWA Pitcher of the Week [March 3 & 23, April 20].
- Minus the Florida and Alabama stretch where she was touched up 10 runs, Fico has held her opponents to .163 hitting clip since opening weekend. She has allowed only 11 runs, seven earned, on 54 hits and punched out 96 batters over 97.0 innings of work.
- Earlier this season, Fico put together a stretch of 26.0 straight scoreless frames [March 6-April 3] along with 10 straight wins from LSU's home opener to the Florida series [Feb. 17-April 3].
- Kirsten Shortridge has gone 3-1 over her seven appearances and tossed her first seven-inning complete game of her LSU career during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge has yielded only one earned run in four of her six starts and also earned a win over Oklahoma State [Feb. 20]. She returned to the circle for the first time since Feb. 28 and fired 4.0 innings of no-hit relief at McNeese State [March 31].

**OFF THE BENCH**

- Lauren Capello has reached base in nine of her 26 career at-bats as a pinch hitter with four hits, four walks and one hit-by-pitch.
- Katie Guillory is 0-for-3 after going 3-for-12 at the plate in 2009. She has scored five times as a pinch runner, including two of her last three outings [April 18-25]
- Tiffany Shaw has scored in 16 of her 27 running appearances, including 12 of her last 21 outings.
- Shaw is 3-for-10 at the plate with a RBI and 16-for-18 in the stolen base department to rank tied for 11th in the SEC. She has recorded a steal in five of her last seven appearances [April 10-25].
- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in six of her 17 pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during seven of her 15 pinch running attempts.
- Heidi Pizer has made 16 appearances and two starts. She was 0-for-7 at the plate before cranking a pair of home runs with three RBIs at Nicholls [April 14].

**IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY**

- LSU won 13 of 22 games decided by one run and 11 of the Tigers SEC tilts were decided in this fashion during the 2009 season. The Tigers have won seven of their last nine one-run decisions this season after going 0-3 during opening weekend.
- Taking a page from the football program, LSU is 9-2 in night contests against a 30-8 tally in day games. Night contests are when first pitch is after 6 p.m.
- LSU has gone 35-1 when scoring three or more runs with its only setback coming in game two at Alabama [April 7] and has tallied a 30-5 record when scoring first.

- Tied 1-1 in the fifth inning of game two against Ole Miss [March 17], Kirsten Shortridge manufactured a run and forced the Rebels into a fielding error for the winning run.
- With Mississippi State holding a 1-0 edge in the fifth inning [April 10], Langoni provided the equalizer with a two-out RBI-single. Two frames later, Morgan Russell knocked the game-winning single to hand LSU a 2-1 walk-off victory.

ATHENS, Ga. -- The No. 20 LSU softball team scored two runs in the seventh inning but its comeback effort fell short 6-5 against No. 8 Georgia Saturday afternoon at the UGA Softball Complex.

LSU (15-6, 2-2 SEC) had to deal with rainy conditions and was playing its first road game since opening weekend in Hawai'i.

"It was a miserable day to play softball," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "When you're soaking wet and it's below 40 degrees, you have to be tougher than the elements. To our credit, we battled and never quit before the final out."

Down 6-3 heading into the seventh inning, Juliana Santos ignited the Tigers with a leadoff double into the right centerfield gap. Ashley Langoni reached on a fielding error by UGA pitcher Sarah McCloud to put runners on the corners with no one out.

LSU pulled back to 6-4 as Ashley Applegate reached on a fielder's choice that scored Santos and forced Langoni out at second base.

An Anissa Young single followed by a Morgan Russell walk loaded the bases for Jessica Mouse, who battled back from a 0-2 count. She drew even at 2-2 and belted a single to left field drawing LSU within 6-5.

Kirsten Shortridge grounded out to UGA shortstop Kristin Schnake, who threw home to force Young out at the plate. The Bulldogs turned to Christie Hamilton, and she struck out Jazz Jackson to secure the 6-5 win.

Cody Trahan had her streak of five consecutive wins in the circle come to close. She registered eight strikeouts against five walks and was touched up for three home runs.

"The pitchers have to do a better job of hitting their spots and keeping the ball in the ballpark," Girouard said. "The ball hit too much of the plate and you're going to pay for those types of mistakes in this league."

Georgia (16-4, 1-2 SEC) jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first inning aided by a Taylor Schlopy home run and an unearned run. The Bulldogs took advantage on a leadoff walk, a wild pitch and pass ball to extend the lead to 3-0 in the second inning.

LSU trimmed the deficit to 3-2 on a two-run triple by Langoni in the third inning.

Megan Wiggins knocked a home run in the home half of the frame and added a bases loaded walk to make it 5-2 through four innings.

The Tigers manufactured a run in the sixth inning as Jazz Jackson slapped her third hit of the afternoon with a RBI-single. The three hits for Jackson matched a season-high.

Schlopy responded with her second homer of the afternoon to give Georgia a 6-3 advantage heading into the seventh inning.

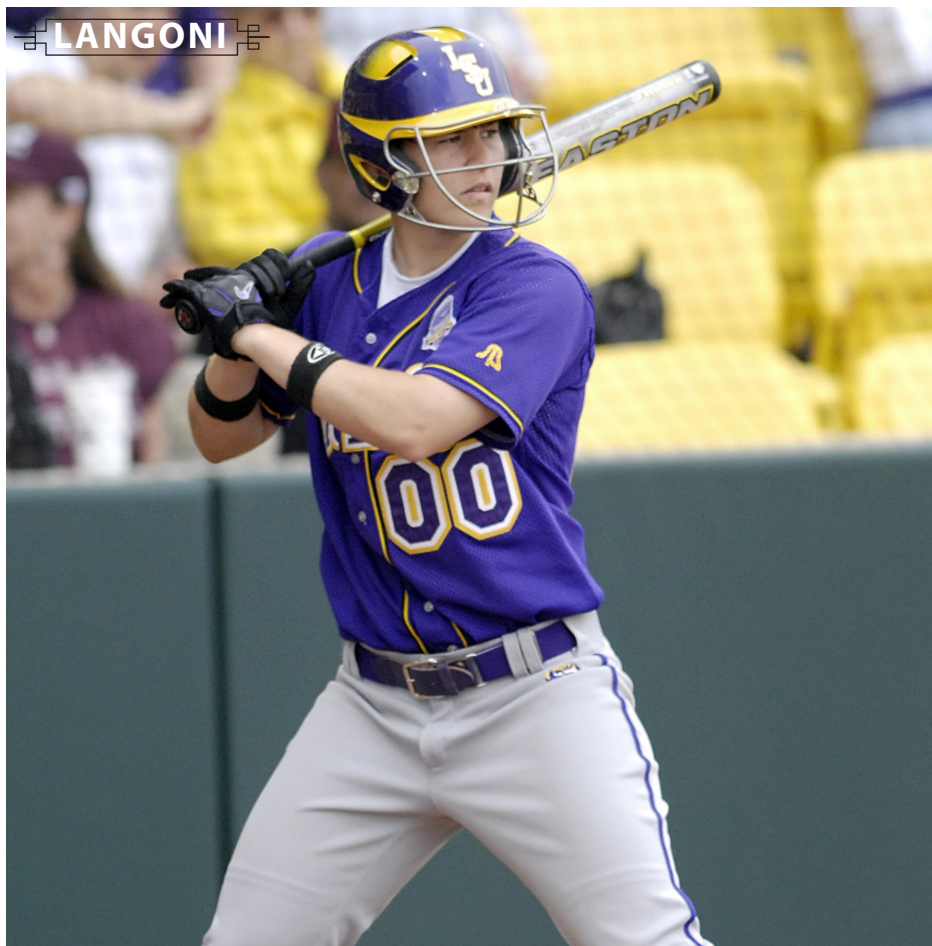
