SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 12 national seed LSU softball team plays host to the NCAA Baton Rouge this weekend. LSU welcomes Texas A&M, Louisiana-Lafayette and McNeese to Tiger Park.
- ▶ All games of the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional will have live video and stats in the Geaux Zone on LSUsports.net
- ▶ LSU has compiled a 35-22 (.614) mark in the NCAA Tournament sparked by a pair of Women's College World Series appearances in 2001 and 2004. The Tigers also made the NCAA Super Regional round during 2006 and 2007 seasons.
- ▶ LSU is hosting its sixth regional [1999, 2000, 2001, 2006 and 2008] but first at Tiger Park's current location.
- ▶ An in-depth look at the last meetings with the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional participants can be found on pages 9-10 of this packet.
- ▶ LSU has spent 76 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 17 and No. 10 in this week's polls.

WHAT'S NEXT

- ▶ If LSU advances to the NCAA Super Regional round, the Tigers will face the winner of the NCAA Los Angeles Regional featuring No. 5 UCLA, Fresno State, San Diego State and UC Davis.
- ▶ LSU would have to travel to No. 5 UCLA, but would host the other three schools should they advance at Tiger Park.
- ▶ The NCAA Super Regionals are the best two-out-of-three series with the winner securing one of eight spots to the Women's College World Series. All games are televised by the ESPN Family of Networks.
- ▶ NCAA Super Regional series' run either Thursday/Friday, Friday/Saturday or Saturday/Sunday. The NCAA will announce game times following the NCAA Regional round.

TIGERS ON THE TUBE

The Tigers are slated to appear on television nine times in 2010, including five games on Cox Sports Network (cable channel 37). As part of the SEC on ESPN television package, LSU's series against Georgia and Tennessee will be carried on ESPN and ESPN U (cable channel 242).

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU reeled off a program-record 24-game winning streak.
- LSU finished its preconference tournament schedule by winning three consecutive titles at Tiger Park where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.
- The streak marked the third longest run in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads.
- LSU outscored its opponents by an impressive 158-18 margin and racked up a .328 team batting average to go along with a stifling 0.58 staff ERA during the streak.
- LSU lost five straight games at No. 6 Florida and No. 6 Alabama, who have appeared in the last two Women's College World Series.
- The Tigers put the skid into the rear view mirror and have strung together a 15-5 mark compiling sweeps over Mississippi State, Arkansas and Kentucky. LSU also has tallied a series win over No. 8 Georgia along with a runner-up finish at the 2010 SEC Tournament.
- LSU already has seven players register 20 or more RBIs and are an astonishing 121-for-133 in the stolen base department after the Tigers totaled only 46 stolen bases a season ago. LSU's 2.09 stolen bases per game ranks 14th in the nation.
- The 121 stolen bases are third for a single-season and most during the Yvette Girouard era, while the .910 stolen base success rate is currently on-pace to shatter a program record. The 2008 team notched an .892 mark.
- LSU has played phenomenal defense en route to the SEC's best fielding percentage at .975. The clip also ranks 12th nationally as the Tigers have committed 40 errors over their first 58 games.

- Shortridge, a 2010 NFCA All-South Region and All-SEC First-Team honoree, has slapped hits in 47 of 58 games highlighted by a pair of nine-game streaks [Feb. 21-March 5] & [March 6-20].
- Shortridge joined the elite company of former All-Americans Tara Asbill, Ashlee Ducote, Stephanie Hastings, Leslie Klein, Trena Peel and Britni Sneed as the only players in program history to earn multiple All-SEC First-Team picks.
- Shortridge has recorded hits during 15 of her last 18 games [April 11-May 15], including all three games of the SEC Tournament where she earned All-Tournament honors. She is 29-for-67 with nine multi-hit performances and nine RBIs during that stretch.
- After going the entire regular season without a home run, Shortridge ripped a line-drive, two-run long ball to vault LSU to a 2-1 walkoff win over Kentucky [May 13] after a 3 hour and 30 minute rain delay in the SEC quarterfinals. She followed that up with another seventh inning blast, a solo shot, to put the finishing touches on a 9-1 semifinal victory over No. 5 Florida [May 14].
- Shortridge has notched a team-best 28 multi-hit efforts, which are third in the SEC. The Tigers are 24-4 when Shortridge tallies a multi-hit game.
- Shortridge's 85 hits also are second in the league and tied for second-most for a single season at LSU [see page 7].
- After an 8-for-11 weekend at South Carolina, Shortridge joined former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner as the only Tigers to earn USA Softball Player of the Week [March 16].
- Shortridge has garnered the SEC's second most stolen bases with 44 and swiped multiple bags on 11 occasions this season. She has stolen a base against every SEC team this season highlighted by a steal of home plate to spark LSU's four-run sixth inning in the middle game of the Georgia series [April 30].
- Shortridge and Dee Douglas are the only players to steal 40 bases during a season for LSU. She needs one stolen base to match Douglas' single-season mark set of 45 during the 1999 season.

- With 32 runs scored over her last 36 games, Shortridge has surged into 10th place in the SEC. She has crossed the plate 49 times and scored the game's first run on 14 occasions this season.
- Rachel Mitchell, a NFCA All-South Region and All-SEC Second-Team performer, has collected hits in seven of her last 11 games [April 24-May 15] highlighted by five of multi-hit performances.
- Mitchell's average has climbed 52 points since the middle game of the Auburn series [March 20] and she checks in with a .345 season clip. Her 16 multi-hit performances are second on the team.
- Mitchell has popped seven home runs and added a team-best 45 RBIs to move into 10th place in the SEC. She has ripped 32 RBIs during her last 34 games [March 13-May 15] sparked by 11 in her last 11 outings [April 24-May 15]. Her two-run double pulled LSU back to 4-3 against Alabama [May 15] in the SEC final.
- Mitchell's 59 hits are second on the team with 36 of her base knocks coming versus RPI Top 50 opponents. She paces LSU with 14 multi-RBI games and the Tigers are 12-2 when she reaches this feat.
- Mitchell belted a two-run homer to start the Georgia series [April 29] to pass three-time All-American Leslie Klein with 33 long balls for the program record.
- Mitchell also has drawn 30 walks and is 19-for-20 on the base paths to secure 10th place in the SEC rankings.
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second consecutive season. Shortridge advanced as one of 25 finalists for the prestigious award but didn't advance to the Top 10 list.
- After starting the season 9-for-61, Juliana Santos has reeled off a 11-for-40 clip during her last 17 games [April 14-May 15]. She has slapped hits in 10 of those games highlighted by a two-run shot during the fourth inning of the Kentucky series finale [April 25].
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs in SEC action en route to SEC All-Freshmen and NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- LSU is 30-2 when Allison Falcon starts at shortstop. She cranked a two-out double down the right field line to keep the Tigers alive during the seventh inning against Kentucky [May 13] leading into the Shortridge homer.
- Anissa Young was 9-for-55 at the plate during the month of April but opened May with a bang with a three-run homer during the opening game of the Tennessee series [May 8]. She also added a 2-for-4 effort against No. 5 Florida [May 14].
- The Tigers are 19-2 in games where Young has recorded RBIs and her 39 RBIs for the season are just outside the SEC's Top 10.
- Young has been issued 23 walks and been hit-by-a-pitch 20 times to set a LSU single-season record. The previous mark was 16 held by Camille Harris during the 2006 season.
- During her two-year career, 36 of Young's 76 RBIs have come on her 16 home runs. The California native also has registered a .330 [73-for-221] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has bumped her batting average up to .290 after coming away with a .227 clip last season. She has belted a team-best nine home runs to go along with 32 RBIs.
- Langoni returned to the lineup after missing a 10-game stretch at McNeese State [March 31] and has reeled off 15 RBIs during her last 20 games [April 10-May 15]. She also earned LSWA Hitter of the Week [April 20] for the second time this season.
- Langoni has produced hits in 13 of those 20 games [April 10-May 15], including all three games of the Arkansas [April 17-18] and Kentucky [April 24-25] series.
- Langoni matched a career-best with four RBIs against Nicholls [April 14]. She has produced 45 of her 62 career RBIs from either the No. 3 or No. 5 spots in the lineup.
- Langoni went 1-for-8 at the SEC Tournament but drew four walks en route to three runs. 35 of Langoni's last 60 hits have produced RBIs with 28 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Ashley Applegate has come away with hits in 15 of her last 19 games [April 10-May 15]. She has matched a career-long six-game hitting streak [May 8-15] for the second time during 2010 [Feb. 13-19] and her average has moved up to .308 for the season.
- Applegate has coaxed a team-best 30 walks and been plunked 12 times to garner a .445 on-base clip.

- Applegate has reached base during 49 of 55 games, including all 24 games of LSU's winning streak. She is third on the team with 34 runs and LSU is 27-0 this season when she crosses the plate.
- Courtney Hollier knocked a RBI-single during the series opener against No. 8 Georgia [April 29]. She followed that up with a solo home run in game two to fuel LSU's four-run sixth inning.
- Hollier continued her strong hitting at Tennessee [May 8-9] and ripped a RBI-double down the left field line during game two. She tacked on a RBI bases loaded walk against No. 5 Florida [May 14].
- Hollier is hitting .215 for the season and chipped in 22 RBIs after recording a 2-for-32 mark at the plate last season. She has picked up RBIs in five of her last nine games [April 29-May 15].
- Morgan Russell has gone 20-for-73 and added all 12 of her RBIs during her last 33 games. She notched her fifth multi-RBI effort of the season during a 9-1 win over No. 5 Florida [May 15].
- Russell cranked her first career homer to open the second inning and belted a RBI-single during the fourth against the Gators.
- Lauren Houston also has produced five RBIs for the Tigers but has gone 0-for-25 during her last 15 games where she earned an at-bat. LSU is 17-1 this season when Houston is the starting catcher.
- Both catchers have combined to throw out seven runners and held LSU's opponents to just 32 stolen bases over the first 58 games.
- Jessica Mouse, who also started one game at catcher, has reached base in 47 of 56 games where she has earned an at-bat. She notched All-SEC Tournament accolades.
- Mouse came away with SEC Player of the Week [April 26] accolades after an amazing series at Kentucky [April 24-25] where she went 7-for-8 with five doubles and two RBIs.
- Mouse has boosted her average to .270 for the season and totaled 24 RBIs sparked by six multi-RBI efforts after tallying 14 RBIs during 2009.
- Mouse has produced timely hitting for the Tigers. She tied for second on the team with 13 two-out RBIs, only behind Kirsten Shortridge in that category.
- Mouse's defense at third base has been just as impressive and her 112 assists are third in the SEC.

- Seven of Trahan's 13 wins have come against RPI Top 50 teams. She also has compiled an impressive 120 strikeouts against 25 walks. Her 7.00 career strikeout per seven innings ratio is tied for fourth-best in program history.
- Trahan, a NFCA All-South Region Second-Team pick, has produced wins during five of her last seven decisions [April 10-May 15] highlighted by a complete game effort in a 9-1 win over No. 5 Florida [May 14] where she limited the Gators to one run on four hits. She now has a win over every SEC team.
- Trahan tossed a masterful complete game to open the Georgia series [April 29] where she held the high-octane Bulldogs to one run on five singles.
- Trahan also tallied a pair of victories over Arkansas [April 17-18], including a Senior Day triumph. She also sprayed five hits in a shutout at South Carolina [March 13] where she had to borrow cleats and a glove from her teammates.
- Trahan has garnered SEC Pitcher of the Week [March 22] and also notched LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors [March 10].
- Mack is 9-3 with a 1.59 ERA and has won eight of her last nine decisions. She has posted league wins over South Carolina [March 13], Auburn [March 20], Mississippi State [April 11] and Kentucky [April 25] highlighted by a one-hit gem versus the Gamecocks.
- Mack fired five innings of shutout ball against the Wildcats [April 25] before allowing a solo homer, three infield hits and a pair of walks during the sixth inning before giving way to Fico.
- Mack recently came away with a ESPN The Magazine All-District 6 Second-Team selection from CoSIDA [May 6].
- Mack's three setbacks came at Texas [Feb. 13], against No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] and McNeese State [April 21] when she only received one run of support.
- Mack struck out a season-best eight batters and allowed only one earned run versus the Longhorns and Wolverines.
- Fico has turned in a 19-6 record with a SEC-leading 1.21 ERA and secured a program single-season mark with five saves.
- Fico added to her memorable season and became the first player in program history to notch a share of the league's Freshmen of the Year award. She also came away with All-SEC Second-Team and NFCA All-South Region First-Team selections.
- Fico has racked up 140 strikeouts over 145.0 innings and limited opponents to a .189 batting average, fourth lowest in the SEC. She has posted nine of her 18 wins over RPI Top 50 opponents and tallied four or more Ks in 18 of her 20 outings over 3.0 innings.
- Fico surrendered only two earned runs over a 47.0 inning stretch after her setback at Alabama [April 7] before being touched up for four runs, three earned, in 2.2 frames at Tennessee [May 9].
- Fico bounced back with six strong frames of relief against Alabama [May 15] in the SEC Tournament finale. She allowed two solo homers and tallied four strikeouts.
- Fico shouldered the load at Kentucky [April 24-25]. She notched wins in games one and three of the series without Trahan and limited the Wildcats to one run one four hits during the series finale.
- Fico fired 7.2 frames of five-hit relief with nine strikeouts and sat down the final 12 batters she faced in the middle game of the Arkansas series [April 17]. She also added 4.2 innings of two-hit relief with six strikeouts during game two of the Georgia series [April 30].
- Fico notched back-to-back SEC Pitcher of the Week awards [April 19 & 26] and joined three-time All-American Britni Sneed [March 11 & 18, 2002] as the last player to accomplish that feat. She is the first freshman in program history to win the SEC weekly award.
- Fico also picked up SEC Freshman of the Week [March 22] and also earned LSWA Pitcher of the Week [March 3 & 23, April 20].
- Earlier this season, Fico put together a stretch of 26.0 straight scoreless frames [March 6-April 3] along with 10 straight wins from LSU's home opener to the Florida series [Feb. 17-April 3].
- Kirsten Shortridge has gone 3-1 over her seven appearances and tossed her first seven-inning complete game of her LSU career during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13].

- Shortridge compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge has yielded only one earned run in four of her six starts and also earned a win over Oklahoma State [Feb. 20]. She has tossed only 7.1 frames since the Houston game [Feb. 28].

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in nine of her 27 career at-bats as a pinch hitter with four hits, four walks and one hit-by-pitch.
- Katie Guillory is 0-for-3 after going 3-for-12 at the plate in 2009. She has scored seven times as a pinch runner, including four of her last 10 outings [April 18-May 15].
- Tiffany Shaw has scored in 21 of her 34 running appearances, including 17 of her last 28 outings dating back to Feb. 28. She is 3-for-12 at the plate with a RBI and 17-for-19 in the stolen base department to rank just outside the SEC's Top 10.
- Jackie Victoriano has crossed the plate in six of her 18 pinch running appearances, while Lindsay Price has scored during seven of her 16 pinch running attempts.
- Heidi Pizer has made 17 appearances and two starts. She was 0-for-7 at the plate before cranking a pair of home runs with three RBIs at Nicholls [April 14].

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU won 13 of 22 games decided by one run and 11 of the Tigers SEC tilts were decided in this fashion during the 2009 season. The Tigers have won eight of their last 13 one-run decisions this season after going 0-3 during opening weekend.
- Taking a page from the football program, LSU is 10-4 in night contests against a 34-10 tally in day games. Night contests are when first pitch is after 6 p.m. local time.
- LSU has gone 39-3 when scoring three or more runs with its only setbacks coming in game two at Alabama [April 7], the Tennessee series opener [May 8] and the SEC final versus the Tide [May 15].
- LSU has recorded a 27-3 mark when hitting a home run, while going 17-11 when not hitting a long ball. The Tiger sophomore class has belted 26 of the 37 long balls.
- LSU snapped a 17-game streak dating back to the Nicholls game last season [April 7] when trailing entering the seventh inning with its 2-1 walkoff win over Kentucky [May 13].
- LSU is 3-0 in extra inning affairs highlighted by walkoff blasts from Ashley Langoni and Courtney Hollier to notch wins over Houston [Feb. 28] and Campbell [March 6], respectively.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up nine comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
- Down 4-3 to Houston [Feb. 28], Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying single in the sixth inning before Langoni cranked a walk-off blast three frames later to claim a 5-4 triumph.
- Trailing 1-0 to Campbell [March 6], LSU made the most of two Camel errors to tie the score during the fifth inning to set up Courtney Hollier walk-off long ball to leadoff the eighth inning.
- Tied 1-1 in the fifth inning of game two against Ole Miss [March 17], Kirsten Shortridge manufactured a run and forced the Rebels into a fielding error for the winning run.
- With Mississippi State holding a 1-0 edge in the fifth inning [April 10], Langoni provided the equalizer with a two-out RBI-single.

The Tigers capped the frame via a Juliana Santos bases loaded walk.
- Shortridge slapped a two-run, line drive homer for her first dinger of the season to vault LSU to a 2-1 walkoff win over Kentucky [May 13] in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament. Allison Falcon kept the Tigers alive with a double to set the table for Shortridge.

LAKE CHARLES - Juliana Santos blasted a three-run home run to jumpstart the No. 12 LSU softball team, while Kirsten Shortridge fired four scoreless frames of relief as the Tigers notched a 7-2 victory over McNeese State in front of a program-record 853 fans at Cowgirl Diamond.

LSU (29-4) pushed the nation's longest winning streak to 24 games. The streak also moved into third place in school history behind only the 1996-97 baseball and 1980-81 men's basketball squads.

"We always expect to get everyone's best shot and credit to Mc-Neese for jumping on us early," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "Kirsten was phenomenal and looked extremely strong in the circle. It's been a hard luck year for Juliana [with injuries]. She's battled everything and it was good to get her an opportunity to swing the bat well heading into this critical stretch."

Ashley Applegate and Rachel Mitchell opened the third inning with back-to-back singles. Three batters later, Santos made an instant impact after missing the last four games due to injury and connected on a 3-1 offering for a three-run homer to turn a 2-0 deficit into a 3-2 advantage.

"It's been a long season for me," Santos said. "It felt good to get back out there, and I finally got a break at the plate. I was very over-anxious during my first at-bat so I wanted to relax when I got another chance. Coach [Girouard] always talks about playing within yourself and that's what I did."

The Tigers pushed their lead to 4-2 on a Shortridge sacrifice fly during the fourth inning. LSU tacked on a trio of insurance runs in the fifth as Courtney Hollier, Lauren Houston and Shortridge notched RBIs for the final margin of 7-2.

Shortridge picked up the win to improve to 3-0 on the season. She tossed four innings of no-hit ball in her first pitching action since Feb. 28 and picked up six strikeouts against four walks.

"It's easy to pitch with our great defense playing behind me," Shortridge said. "It felt good to get the rust off. I wanted to work on placing the ball where it needed to be during certain counts."

McNeese State jumped out to a 2-0 edge on a Liz Morvant two-run homer to left field that crept just past the outstretched glove of Ashley Langoni in the first inning.

BATON ROUGE - The No. 16 LSU softball had its 25-game home winning streak come to a close as McNeese State rode the right arm of Meagan Bond to a four-hit shutout and 3-0 decision at Tiger Park.

LSU (36-10) dropped its first mid-week contest to end a stretch of 13 straight wins to open the new Tiger Park, while McNeese State (25-23) notched its first win in 14 attempts in Baton Rouge.

"We were a little bit too cool for school," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We can't win if we can't touch the plate, and that's the nemesis of our team right now. Unless we start swinging the bats like we're capable of doing, we're not going to go too far. We have to get everybody's attention here."

McNeese State grabbed a 2-0 advantage behind a Molly Guidry two-run home run in the first inning. Bond limited the Tigers to a quartet of singles and recorded three strikeouts against one walk en route to her 15th win of the season. LSU left single runners on-base during the second, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh innings

The Cowgirls tacked on a Whitney Corbello RBI-single in the sixth inning for the final margin of 3-0. Brittany Mack was tagged with the loss and surrendered three runs on four hits over six-plus frames to fall to 8-3 on the season.

"We just struggled, couldn't get into our groove and find it," outfielder Rachel Mitchell said. "Every team has bad days. That's just one of ours. They're a good team, but we're always so focused and ready to play and win. It definitely shocked me that we weren't able to do that."

LSU jumped on the board early in the game. With two outs, Mitchell doubled to right field just beyond the reach of Holly Tankersley. After a walk to Quinlan Duhon, Mitchell scored on a double to left center by Roessner for the 1-0 advantage.

Louisiana-Lafayette evened the game in the top of the second. With one out, Brooke Brodhead doubled just out of the reach of a diving Hollis at shortstop. She moved to third on a sacrifice bunt by Karli Hubbard. Brodhead then scored on an infield single by Katie Smith.

In the top of the fourth, the Cajuns opened the game up with three unearned runs. Three-straight walks to start the inning load the bases with no outs. On a fielder's choice by Vanessa Soto, Hollis mis-played a ball to shortstop and was unable to make a throw to the plate and her throw to first was not in time to get Soto. The error allowed Hubbard to score from third. Then, with two outs and an 0-2 count, Lana Bowers hit a shallow single to left field that allowed Smith and Vallie Gaspard to come around and score for the 4-1 ULL lead.

In the bottom of the sixth, the Tigers got back to within striking distance. Roessner reached to start the inning on an error by the shortstop. With Tiffany Shaw running for Roessner, Hollis doubled to center field to score Shaw from first. A single to left field by Sluss scored Hollis to put LSU within one, 4-3.

However, Louisiana-Lafayette put up two more in the top of the seventh that put the game out of reach. The Cajuns led off with back-to-back singles by Hubbard and Smith. The pair moved to second and third on an infield ground out by Gaspard. Soto then singled in both runs on a base hit to left field to conclude the scoring at 6-3.

Donna Bourgeois started and earned the win for ULL to improve to 16-4 on the season. She allowed three runs, only one of which was earned, on seven hits with two walks and four strikeouts over five and two-thirds innings. Ashley Brignac came on in relief in the sixth and earned her third save of the season. She did not surrender a hit, while striking out one over the final inning and a third.
