## CAROLINA OPENS 2010 SEASON VS. LSU IN CHICK-FIL-A KICKOFF GAME

North Carolina opens the 2010 season vs. LSU in a battle of preseason top 25 teams Saturday, Sept. 4 in the Chick-fil-A kickoff game in Atlanta. The Tar Heels are No. 18 in both the AP and USA Today Coaches poll, while LSU enters the game No. 16 in the coaches' poll and No. 21 in the writers' poll. The game will be televised nationally by ABC with kickoff at 8:12 p.m. This is Carolina's first game at the Georgia Dome since a 16-10 victory over Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl in 2001.

The Tar Heels are looking to build off back-to-back 8-win seasons and consecutive appearances in the Meineke Car Care Bowl. Carolina welcomes back 39 lettermen and an ACC-high 21 starters. The Tar Heels return 10 starters on offense, nine starters on defense and both their place-kicker and punter.

However, an offseason NCAA investigation into the Tar Heel football program has cast some doubt on what players will be available for Saturday's game. North Carolina Chancellor Holden Thorp, athletic director Dick Baddour and head coach Butch Davis held a press conference on Thursday, Aug. 26 to give an update on the NCAA review (see release on page 2).

## ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY AT CHICK-FIL-A GAME

ESPN's College GameDay Built by The Home Depot will open its third straight season at the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta.

The expanded three-hour College GameDay – now beginning at 9 a.m. ET on ESPNU and continuing at 10 a.m. on ESPN – telecast will

originate from Centennial Olympic Park Sept. 4.

College GameDay will get the day started with the country's most popular live college football show. Chris Fowler, Lee Corso, Kirk Herbstreit and Desmond Howard will break down all the match-ups throughout the three-hour program on the first Saturday of the season and set the stage for the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game that evening. Erin Andrews will co-host the additional first-hour of the program on ESPNU and serve as a contributor for the two hours on ESPN.

Known as the Daytona 500 of College Football, the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game has quickly established itself as the leading season-opening game in college football by creating a BCS-style event weekend around the game.

Fans will also experience a Fan Night at the Georgia Aquarium Friday night, a Kickoff Cook-Off tailgating experience following College GameDay on Saturday, team-specific tailgate parties for both LSU and North Carolina Saturday afternoon and a pre-game FanZone presented by Coca-Cola Zero fan experience and pep rally leading up to the game.

## SERIES NOTES VS. LSU

- LSU leads the series with North Carolina, 5-1, and has won five straight. The last meeting came in 1986 when the Tigers posted a 30-3 victory in Baton Rouge. Saturday's game is the first time the two schools have met at a neutral site.

- Carolina's only win in the series came in the first meeting in 1948 when a Charlie "Choo-Choo" Justice led squad prevailed 34-7 at Kenan Stadium.

- This is the first time Carolina and LSU have

faced each other as ranked teams. LSU has been ranked in three of the previous six meetings – 1961, 1985, 1986.

- Saturday's game features two of the nation's top defenses from a year ago. The Tar Heels finished No. 6 in 2009, allowing just 269.2 yards per game, while LSU was 26th in the country at 327.6. Carolina was 13th in scoring defense, while the Tigers finished 11th.

## DAVIS RETURNS TO SITE OF SUPER BOWL TRIUMPH

Carolina's game vs. LSU marks the first time Butch Davis has coached in the Georgia Dome since Jan. 30, 1994 when the Dallas Cowboys defeated the

**SCHEDULE CHANGED TO ACCOMMODATE LSU GAME**

To accommodate the 2010 LSU contest, Carolina had to move this year's game vs. William & Mary from Sept. 4 to Oct. 30. In addition, North Carolina and South Carolina mutually agreed to move a scheduled 2010 contest, which was to be played Sept. 18 in Columbia, to the opening Thursday night (Aug. 29) of the 2013 season. That game will be televised by ESPN.

**TAR HEELS IN TOP 25 RANKINGS**

For the second straight season, North Carolina begins the year ranked in the top 25 in both major polls. Carolina will open the year ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press poll, its highest preseason ranking since 1998. The Tar Heels are one of five Atlantic Coast Conference teams in the preseason poll, joining No. 10 Virginia Tech, No. 13 Miami, No. 16 Georgia Tech and No. 20 Florida State. UNC's opening week opponent, Louisiana State, is ranked No. 21. Carolina is also No. 18 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

The last time Carolina finished the season ranked in either poll was 1997 when it was No. 4 in the coaches poll and No. 6 in the AP poll.

**RECENT HISTORY IN OPENERS**

- Butch Davis is 3-0 in season openers at North Carolina, following wins over James Madison in 2007, McNeese State in 2008 and The Citadel in 2009. LSU is the first FBS team Carolina has played in the season opener under Davis.
- UNC is looking to win four straight season openers for the first time since winning six consecutive from 1989-94.

**2010 SCHEDULE**

Six home games and a season-opening contest in Atlanta vs. LSU in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff game highlight North Carolina's 2010 football schedule. Carolina's home slate features games against Georgia Tech (Sept. 18), East Carolina (Oct. 2), Clemson (Oct. 9), William & Mary (Oct. 30), Virginia Tech (Nov. 13) and NC State (Nov. 20). This will be the first game between Carolina and Clemson in Chapel Hill since 2002.

The Tar Heels' road schedule feature contests at Rutgers (Sept. 25), Virginia (Oct. 16), Miami (Oct. 23), Florida State (Nov. 6) and Duke (Nov. 27).

Carolina plays an ACC-high eight teams that finished 2009 with nine or more wins and eight of the Tar Heels' 12 opponents played in a bowl game last season. Based on opponents' combined winning percentage, Carolina (.97-.60; .618) will face the league's most difficult schedule in 2010, ahead of Virginia Tech (.95-.59; .617), Miami (.92-.61; .601), NC State (.91-.64; .587), Georgia Tech (.87-.64; .576), Florida State (.86-.66; .566), Virginia (.82-.73; .529), Maryland (.79-.72; .523), Wake Forest (.77-.76; .503), Clemson (.72-.79; .477) and Boston College (.68-.80; .460).

**COACHING STAFF CONTINUITY**

For the first time since Carl Torbush's first two years as UNC's head coach (1998-99), Carolina's coaching staff is completely intact in back-to-back seasons. All nine assistants, plus strength and conditioning coordinator Jeff Connors, will return for the 2010 season.

**CAROLINA UPDATES NCAA INVESTIGATION - AUG. 26, 2010**

The NCAA and the University of North Carolina have been conducting a joint review related to possible agent violations. During the course of that review, the University learned of possible academic misconduct involving a former undergraduate tutor and student-athletes on the football team. The NCAA has allowed us to acknowledge the nature of this aspect of the review.

"Academic achievement and fairness are at the heart of the University of North Carolina and the Department of Athletics," says UNC Chancellor Holden Thorp. "We are treating this issue with the seriousness that you would expect. It's a privilege to put on the North Carolina uniform and to represent this University, and it's our job to make sure that the people who do so have earned that privilege."

"We share the concern our students, faculty, staff, alumni and fans will have about this issue and recognize the desire for more information," says Director of Athletics Dick Baddour. "We have to work with the NCAA to determine all the facts before we can provide more information."

"There is nothing more sacred than academic integrity at the University of North Carolina. I have believed in that for the nearly 50 years I've been a part of this great University," says Baddour. "We will find out what happened and deal with it seriously and through whatever measures are deemed appropriate by the NCAA and University."

Professor Jack Evans and Professor Lissa Broome, former and current Faculty Athletics Representatives, are leading the academic component of the investigation from the University's side. John Blanchard, senior associate AD for student affairs, Lance Markos, director of compliance, and the UNC legal counsel's office are also part of the team.

The Academic Support Program for Student-Athletes, which operates within the College of Arts and Sciences, employs students to tutor and mentor student-athletes.

Tutors are trained to know what actions are acceptable when working with student-athletes. They are given specific instruction that once they work with student-athletes, they remain classified as representatives of the department of athletics, even when they are no longer employed by the University.

"As much as we'd like to finalize both the reviews of possible agent violations and academic issues before the first game, there is no definitive timetable," Baddour says. "It is likely the review will extend beyond the start of the season."

"It's important to have continuity on your staff to build relationships not only with the current players but with the high school coaches and future recruits," said Davis. "I'm pleased to have our entire staff intact this year."

**KENAN STADIUM MASTER PLAN**

In late May, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Board of Trustees approved the Carolina Student-Athlete Center for Excellence, a five-story privately financed structure that will be built in Kenan Stadium's east end zone to house the academic support center for student-athletes, the Carolina Leadership Academy, Olympic sports' strength and conditioning center, visiting locker room, club seats and individual suites.

Construction began immediately on the project that is expected to take roughly 15 months to complete in time for the start of the 2011 football season. The Center for Excellence will replace the Kenan Fieldhouse, which was built in 1927.

Sales of club seats and individual suites began in October 2009. Those sales will provide approximately 50 percent of the funding of the \$70 million project. Private donations will fund the rest of the project. The athletic department will not use state funds.

"The Carolina Student-Athlete Center for Excellence will help us provide exceptional academic support to our nearly 800 student-athletes," says Director of Athletics Dick Baddour. "It also creates a new source of revenue that over the next 30 years will help us maintain the broad-based, 28-sport program we have long enjoyed."

**POTENTIAL NFL DRAFTEES RETURN FOR SENIOR SEASON**

Six North Carolina juniors explored the possibility of going pro after the bowl game last season, but all six elected to return for the 2010 season, including DT Marvin Austin, LB Bruce Carter, LB Quan Sturdivant, CB Kendric Burney, S Deunta Williams and WR Greg Little. Sturdivant, Burney and Williams were 2009 first-team All-ACC selections and Austin and Carter were second-team picks. Little became just the fifth player in UNC history to post more than 60 receptions.

Austin, Carter and Sturdivant all have been listed as the No. 1 NFL draft prospects at their respective positions by ESPN's Mel Kiper Jr. In its rankings of 2011 NFL prospects, CollegeFootballNews.com has Austin listed as the No. 1 defensive tackle, Sturdivant as the No. 2 inside linebacker, Carter as the No. 1 outside linebacker, Williams as the No. 1 free safety, Burney as the No. 2 cornerback and Little as the No. 11 wide receiver. Other UNC players on that list include No. 1 defensive end prospect Robert Quinn (a junior) and cornerback Charles Brown as the No. 13 cornerback.

**BUTCH DAVIS REBUILDING JOB**

In Butch Davis' three seasons at UNC, the Tar Heels have won 20 games (4-8 in 2007, 8-5 in 2008, 8-5 in 2009), which is one more than they won in the five years (2002-06) prior to his arrival. Among the evidence that Carolina football has improved its profile since his arrival:

- Season ticket sales have increased
- Carolina played its first Thursday Night ESPN football game in 2009
- Carolina's 2010 Spring Game was broadcast nationally on ESPN and drew a school-record 29,500.
- Carolina has produced first-round NFL Draft picks (Kentwan Balmer by the San Francisco 49ers in 2008 and Hakeem Nicks by the New York Giants in 2009) under Davis.
- Carolina advanced to back-to-back bowl games for the first time since going to seven straight from 1992-98.
- Carolina will play in the prestigious Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game vs. LSU in the 2010 season opener.
- Three of Davis' four UNC recruiting classes have been ranked in the Top 25 by a majority of recruiting analysts.
