LSU Hosts Mississippi State In 2010 Home Opener

After two successful weeks on the road, LSU opens its 2010 home schedule on Saturday, hosting Mississippi State at 6:05 p.m. CT in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised nationally on ESPNU – the second straight week that the Tigers will appear on the network. The contest will also serve as LSU's annual "Gold Game" as fans are asked to wear gold to the game. LSU goes into the game coming off a 27-3 win over Vanderbilt in Nashville last week. The Tigers, 2-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action, climbed to No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll and to No. 15 in the AP Top 25 this week. Through two games, LSU has played 17 freshmen (9 true, 8 redshirt) and the Tigers have had 11 players start for the first time in their career (8 vs. North Carolina, 3 vs. Vanderbilt). Mississippi State brings a 1-1 overall mark and an 0-1 SEC record into the game after dropping a 17-14 decision to Auburn last Thursday night. LSU has won 10 straight against Mississippi State, including last year's 30-26 victory in Starkville. During the 10-game winning streak, LSU has outscored the Bulldogs 404-131. LSU has won nine straight over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium, a streak that dates back to 1992. Overall, Mississippi State's last win over LSU came in 1999 by a 17-16 count in Starkville and the last time they won in Tiger Stadium came in 1991 by a 28-19 score. LSU goes into Saturday's game with one of the top defenses in the SEC as the Tigers are first in the league (and No. 4 in the nation) in rushing defense (44.5 ypg) and sacks (10 total), and No. 5 in total defense (285.5 ypg). LSU's average of 5.0 sacks per game ranks No. 2 nationally, while the 10.5 tackles for loss per game is No. 4 in the nation. Defensively, senior LB **Kelvin Sheppard** led the Tigers with 19 total tackles. Senior DT **Drake Nevis** leads the SEC with 3.5 sacks thru two games, while freshman DE **Sam Montgomery** is second on team with 2.0 sacks. In all, seven different Tigers have registered a sack, while 13 have recorded a tackle for a loss. Offensively, junior RB **Stevan Ridley** is third in the SEC with 240 rushing yards (120.0 per game), while sophomore WR **Russell Shepard** is tied for second in the league in TDs with three. Ridley's 159 rushing yards vs. Vanderbilt were the most by a Tiger in a league game since Alley Broussard ran for a school-record 250 yards vs. Ole Miss in 2004.

STORYLINES

- LSU goes after a 3-0 start for the fourth straight year.

- In two games, LSU has played 17 freshmen (9 true, 8 redshirt).

- LSU has also used 11 first-time starters during the first two weeks of the season (8 vs. North Carolina, 3 vs. Vanderbilt).

- LSU's 10 sacks are the most through the first two games of a season since 1998 when the Tigers had 11 during their first two games.

- LSU hasn't allowed any first quarter points so far this year, running its streak of regular-season games without yielding a first quarter TD to 10. Mississippi State was the last team to score first quarter points on the LSU defense during the regular season.

- By keeping Vanderbilt out of the endzone in the first quarter last week, LSU ran its streak of consecutive SEC games without allowing a first quarter touchdown to seven straight games dating back to last year's

Mississippi State contest.

- The Sept. 18 home opener is the latest scheduled home opener for LSU since 1993 when the Tigers played Auburn on Sept. 18 in Tiger Stadium. LSU did play its 2005 home opener on Monday, Sept. 26, but that was due to Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. LSU was scheduled to open the 2005 season at home on Sept. 3 against North Texas.

- **Les Miles** is 24-1 in Saturday night games in Tiger Stadium.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SIXTH SEASON

LSU goes into the 2010 season coming off the best decade in the history of the program – winning a pair of national titles along with 99 games – and the driving force behind the Tigers' continued dominance at the national level has been head coach Les Miles.

Now in his sixth year with the Tigers, Miles has guided the Tigers to unmatched success – both on and off the field – in his first five years at the school, winning more games than any other coach in LSU history during a 6-year span and claiming both the BCS National Championship and the Southeastern Conference title in 2007.

It's been under Miles' leadership that LSU has established itself as one of the elite college football programs – winning 53 games overall, including four bowl contests, graduating 116 players, having 31 players selected in the NFL Draft, seven of which were first round picks, and producing nine first-team All-Americans.

Under Miles, the Tigers have also posted at least 11 victories in a season three times and they've finished ranked among the top five in the nation three straight years (2005, '06, and '07), a first at LSU.

With an astonishing 53-15 record in his first six years with the Tigers, Miles has climbed to the third-winningest coach in school history, while his four bowl victories rank second among all LSU head coaches.

In addition to his 53 victories, some other notable accomplishments during his first five years with the Tigers include: only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season – and he's done it twice; only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game; nine wins over coaches who have won national titles; and the only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. Since the 2005 season, LSU has placed 89 players on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 116 earning their college diploma.

Going to back the 2007 season, LSU has graduated 52 of its 65 seniors, including 19 of 24 from the national championship team, 16 of 18 from the 2008 squad, and 17 of 23 from the 2009 team. Ten of the 13 players during that stretch who haven't completed their requirements for graduation are currently playing in the NFL. The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, Tigers have produced 31 NFL Draft picks over the past five years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards.

Now, with the Tigers becoming the first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for the LSU football program continues to be solid. After 53 wins, including 19 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with five straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

Series Notes: LSU and Mississippi State will play for the 104th time with the Tigers holding a 67-33-3 advantage in the series that dates back to 1896 ... The Tigers have played MSU more than any other team and the 67 wins ranks as the second-most by LSU over any opponent trailing only the 69 victories that the Tigers have over Tulane ... The series dates back to a 52-0 LSU win in 1896 ... LSU is 45-18-1 against Mississippi State in games played in Baton Rouge ... LSU has won 10 straight and 17 of the last 18 with the Bulldogs ... LSU's won nine straight over the Bulldogs in Baton Rouge ... MSU's last win over LSU came in Starkville in 1999 by a 17-16 count and the last time they won in Baton Rouge came in 1991 by a 28-19 score ... LSU has scored 30 or more points against Mississippi State in 10 straight and 11 of the last 12 games dating back to 1998 ... LSU coach **Les Miles** is 5-0 vs. Mississippi State.

LAST TIME OUT: #19/16 LSU 27 VANDERBILT 3 (NASHVILLE, TENN.)

Stevan Ridley rushed for a career-best 159 yards and one touchdown and the LSU defense dismantled Vanderbilt as the Tigers broke open a tight game with 17 fourth quarter points in the 27-3 win over the Commodores in Nashville. LSU rolled up 392 yards of total offense, including 280 on the ground, as the Tigers overpowered the Commodores on the both sides of the ball in the victory. After a scoreless first quarter, **Russell Shepard** got the Tigers on the board with a 30-yard run just 40 seconds into the second quarter. **Josh Jasper** tacked on a 36-yard field goal as LSU led 10-0 at halftime. Vanderbilt pulled to within 10-3 early in the third quarter on a field goal. From there, it was all LSU as the Tigers scored 17 fourth quarter points highlighted by a 65-yard TD run by Ridley. **Alfred Blue** scored his first career TD on a 6-yard run and Jasper kicked a 23-yard field goal to round out the scoring for the Tigers. For the game, LSU's defense forced punts on 10 of Vanderbilt's 12 possessions – including all seven first half possessions – as the Tigers limited the Commodores to only 135 total yards – 65 rushing, 70 passing. Vanderbilt crossed into LSU territory just twice in the contest and they got inside the Tiger redzone just one time. **Drake Nevis** led the Tigers with five tackles and 2.5 sacks, while **Kelvin Sheppard** added nine stops for an LSU defense that recorded six sacks and held Vanderbilt to only eight first downs.

It's The Latest Scheduled Season-Opener for Tigers Since 1993

Saturday's game against Mississippi State is the latest scheduled season-opener for the Tigers since 1993 when LSU played Auburn in its home opener that year. LSU did play its 2005 home opener on Monday, Sept. 26, but that was due to Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. LSU was scheduled to open the 2005 season at home on Sept. 3 against North Texas but that game was postponed to Oct. 29.

Tiger Defense Off To Great Start

Through two games, the LSU defense, despite having 10 freshmen (7 redshirt, 3 true) on its 2-deep, has been dominating as the Tigers have recorded 10 sacks and are allowing just 44.5 yards per game rushing. The 10 sacks leads the nation, while the 44.5 rushing yards is tops in the league and ranks No. 4 nationally. LB **Kelvin Sheppard** leads the unit with 19 tackles, while DT **Drake Nevis** ranks first in the league with 3.5 sacks to his credit thru two games. Here's a look at some of notables by the LSU defense so far this year:

- The 10 sacks through the first two games of the season (4 vs. UNC, 6 vs. Vanderbilt) are the most by LSU during that span since 1998 when the Tigers opened the year with 11 sacks over their first two games (6 vs. Arkansas State, 5 vs. Auburn).
- The 70 passing yards allowed against Vanderbilt were the fewest in an SEC game against the Tigers since 2006 when Arkansas passed for 62 yards.
- The 8 first downs by Vanderbilt were the fewest against LSU since 2006 when UL-Lafayette had 8 against the Tigers in the season opener. It was also the fewest in an SEC against LSU since 2004 when Alabama managed just 8 first downs in a 26-10 loss to the Tigers.

Nevis Named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week

Defensive tackle **Drake Nevis** was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his performance against Vanderbilt. Nevis racked up five tackles, including 2.5 sacks for a loss of 17 yards in the Tigers' 27-3 victory over the Commodores.

LSU Defense Extends First Quarter SEC Touchdown Streak To 7 Straight

By keeping Vanderbilt out of the endzone in the first quarter last week, LSU ran its streak of consecutive SEC games without allowing a first quarter touchdown to seven straight games. LSU hasn't allowed a first quarter TD in an SEC game since the Mississippi State contest during week 4 of last year. Since then, the Tigers have limited their next 7 opponents to a combined total of 12 points in the first quarter – Georgia 0, Florida 3, Auburn 0, Alabama 0, Ole Miss 6, Arkansas 3, Vanderbilt 0.

Ridley Has Career Night Against Vanderbilt

LSU RB **Stevan Ridley** had the game of his career last week, rushing for 159 yards and one touchdown in the 27-3 win over Vanderbilt. The 159 yards marked the first 100-yard game of his career and it was highlighted by the longest run of his career – a 65-yard TD in the fourth quarter. Through two games, Ridley has rushed for 240 yards and ranks third in the SEC with 120.0 yards per game.

LSU is 19-2 Under Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU ran its record to 19-2 under **Les Miles** when a Tiger reaches 100 rushing yards following last week's win over Vanderbilt. LSU RB **Stevan Ridley** rushed for a career-best 159 yards and 1 TD in the victory over the Commodores. The only two games under Miles that the Tigers didn't win despite having a 100-yard rusher came in 2008 vs. Georgia (**Charles Scott**, 144 yards), and 2007 vs. Arkansas (**Jacob Hester**, 126 yards).

Ground Game

LSU pounded out 280 rushing yards against Vanderbilt last week, the most by the Tigers since rushing for 321 yards against Louisiana Tech on Nov. 10, 2007. It was also the most by an LSU team in a conference game since Sept. 22, 2007 when the Tigers had 290 rushing yards against South Carolina.

Tigers Have Won Four Straight And 14-Of-15 Home Openers

LSU has won four straight and 14 of its last 15 home openers going into the Mississippi State game. LSU last lost a home opener in 2005 when the Tigers dropped a 30-27 decision to Tennessee in overtime on a Monday night. Prior to that game, the last loss for the Tigers in a home opener came in 1994 when LSU fell to Texas A&M, 18-13. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 4-1 in home openers at LSU.

LSU's Jefferson Second-Winningest Active QB in SEC With 11-5 Record

LSU junior **Jordan Jefferson** goes into the Mississippi State game with an 11-5 overall record as the Tigers' starting quarterback. The 11 victories makes Jefferson the second-winningest active quarterback in the conference, trailing only Greg McElroy of Alabama, who is 16-0 as a starter. LSU backup **Jarrett Lee** has a 5-4 record as a starter, which ranks him sixth among all active quarterbacks in the SEC in terms of victories. Jefferson was 1-1 in 2008, 8-4 in 2009 and 2-0 this year, while Lee was 4-4 in 2008 and 1-0 last year. Jefferson is 5-1 as a starter in Tiger Stadium and he's 6-4 on the road.

LSU In the Top 25 For 19th Straight Week

The win over Vanderbilt stretched LSU's streak to consecutive weeks in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll to 19 straight. LSU is No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll this week and No. 15 in the AP Top 25. LSU has been ranked in both polls every week since the start of last year. Since Miles took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll in 79 of the 83 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 104 of 106 games ranked in the top 25, including 66 of 68 games under **Les Miles**. LSU has a 52-13 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles.

Miles Has Victories Over Every SEC Team

With last year's win over Georgia, LSU coach **Les Miles** has recorded at least one victory over every team in the SEC. Miles is 28-13 in SEC regular season games and 29-14 in all league games (including SEC Championship Game). In addition, Miles has faced 48 different teams during his head coaching career and he's beaten all but two of them – Texas and Penn State.

Russell Shepard On The Ground And Through The Air

WR **Russell Shepard** made the full-time move to wide receiver this offseason and his 2010 debut has been a success. Shepard accounted for 67 yards rushing, including a 50-yard touchdown run with 8:06 left in the second quarter versus North Carolina. He scored the season's first touchdown on a 6-yard pass from Jordan Jefferson with 8:57 left in the first quarter. In the win over UNC, Shepard became the first LSU player to record a receiving touchdown and a rushing touchdown in the same game since Early Doucet vs. Tulane on Sept. 23, 2006 (2 receiving, 1 rushing). In two games, Shepard leads the Tigers and ranks No. 2 in the SEC in touchdowns with three (2 rushing, 1 receiving).

Saturday Night Special – Tigers Are 24-2 In Night Home Games Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 39-4 in night games under Miles compared to a 14-11 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 24-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 24-1 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era. The loss to Tennessee came on Monday night in 2005.

LSU lost starting right guard **Will Blackwell** on its first offensive play of the year last week against North Carolina. Blackwell suffered a broken ankle and will be out at least six weeks. The Tigers got LB **Ryan Baker** (jaw), WR **Chris Tolliver** (head) and S **Karnell Hatcher** (knee) back last week for Vanderbilt. Outside of Blackwell, the only other Tiger out of action is TE **Deangelo Peterson** (foot).

The ESPN Family of Networks Streak at 23 Straight Wins

LSU goes into the Mississippi State game riding a 23-game winning streak on games played on the ESPN family of networks (excluding ABC). The last time LSU lost a game played on one of the ESPN networks came in 2005 when the Tigers dropped a 30-27 overtime decision to Tennessee on a Monday night (due to Hurricane Rita) on ESPN2. Since then, it's been 23 consecutive victories for the Tigers on the ESPN family. Here's a breakdown of the streak:

Jasper Into the Career Record Books

In just two years as LSU's primary place kicker, **Josh Jasper** has firmly established himself in the Tiger record books. Jasper, a senior from Memphis, Tenn., is the LSU career leader in field goal percentage having drilled 84.4 percent of his field goals. David Browndyke (1986-89) is second in that category with a 81.3 percent average (61-of-75). Following his two made field goals at Vanderbilt, Jasper is now 21-of-25 for his career and moved into the LSU career top 10 in field goals made. He sits tied for ninth place with Mark Lumpkin (1968-70) and surpassed Doug Moreau (1963-55, now LSU Sports Radio Network analyst). For the season, Jasper has connected on two of his three field goals. Jasper has also been perfect in his career in PAT kicks having made 46 consecutive PATs dating back to the 2008 season. He sits one PAT away from fifth place in LSU consecutive PATs made.

Patrick Peterson - Special All The Way Around

He's been labeled the best cornerback in college football. After his debut as LSU's primary return specialist, **Patrick Peterson** may add best return man in college football to his resume. Peterson set an LSU record for return yards against North Carolina with 257 yards - 157 on punt returns, 100 on kickoff returns. The 257 return yards were just 10 shy of breaking the SEC mark of 266 held by Nick Turner of Mississippi State. The 157 punt return yards ranked as the second-most in LSU history, only behind Norman Jefferson's 169 return yards versus Ole Miss in 1983. Peterson returned a punt 87 yards for a second quarter touchdown, which tied for the sixth-longest punt return in school history. He also set up another LSU touchdown with a 47-yard return to midfield midway through the second quarter. Peterson ranks No. 2 in the nation in punt returns (39.2), No. 3 in all-purpose yards (257.0) and No. 11 in kickoff returns (33.3). And, oh by the way, Peterson added five tackles, including one tackle for a loss, from the cornerback position. Peterson has scored touchdowns three different ways during his career at LSU - interception return (37 yards vs. Miss. State, '09), blocked field goal return (53 yards vs. Ole Miss, '09), and punt return (87 yards vs. North Carolina, '10). Peterson is one kickoff return for a TD away from becoming the first LSU player to score a touchdown four different ways since Kevin Faulk in the late 1990s.

Peterson Named SEC Special Teams and Lott IMPACT Player of the Week

LSU cornerback/return specialist **Patrick Peterson** picked up a pair of awards last week - earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors as well as being named the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week. Peterson, a 6-1, 211-pound junior from Pompano Beach, Fla., set an LSU record with 257 return yards in the Tigers' 30-24 win over North Carolina in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic. The return yards finished nine shy of tying the Southeastern Conference single-game record held by Nick Turner of Mississippi State. Peterson had an 87-yard punt return for a touchdown, a total of 157 yards in punt returns and 100 more in kickoff returns. He also contributed five tackles. Peterson is on watch lists for every postseason defensive award, including the Lott Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Award, Jim Thorpe Award and Chuck Bednarik Award. LSU will receive \$1,000 from the Lott Foundation for its general scholarship fund in recognition of Peterson's achievement.

LSU Rebounds Following Loss Under Miles

For the first time during the **Les Miles** era, LSU went into a new season coming off a loss as the Tigers dropped a 19-17 decision to Penn State in the Capital One Bowl in January. LSU responded by beating North Carolina, 30-24, to run its record under Les Miles to 14-1 in games following a loss. LSU has only loss back-to-back games once under Miles, that coming in 2008 when the Tigers dropped consecutive games to Ole Miss and Arkansas in late November.

LSU's Won A School-Record 15 Straight Games During Month of September

LSU brings a school-record 15-game winning streak during the month of September into the Mississippi State game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 18-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count.

Youth Movement

LSU played a total of 18 first-time players, including nine true freshmen, in the season-opening win over North Carolina. The nine true freshmen were the most to play in a season-opener under Miles and it's the most to see action in a single-season since 2006 when 10 true freshmen played for the Tigers. The breakdown of first-time players for the Tigers against North Carolina was: 9 true freshmen, 8 redshirt freshmen and one junior college transfer. Of the 18 first-timers, 11 were used on defense. Rush Defense Has Big Night Against North Carolina

LSU's rushing defense came up big in the season-opener against North Carolina as the Tigers allowed just 24 yards on the ground. The 24 rushing yards were the fewest by an opponent since Alabama had 20 yards rushing on Nov. 3, 2007. It was also the third-lowest total in a season-opener dating back to 1970 when the Tigers set a school-record by holding Texas A&M to minus-42 yards on the ground in a 20-18 loss. The other season-opener low total came in 2007 when the Tigers surrendered just 10 rushing yards in the 45-0 win over Mississippi State. Other defensive highlights from the North Carolina game include: four sacks from four different players and 15 total tackles for losses (-62 yards).

Miles is 28-6 Overall and 13-6 In SEC Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU goes into the Mississippi State game with a 29-6 overall mark and a 13-6 SEC record under **Les Miles** in games played in Tiger Stadium. Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama last year.

Miles Is 19-11 vs. Top 25 Opponents

LSU coach **Les Miles** is now 19-11 in games against ranked opponents following the win over North Carolina. Last year, LSU was 1-2 vs. top 25 teams with the win coming against Georgia in Athens. LSU won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. In games against teams ranked in the top 10, Miles is 8-7.

A New Face At Left Tackle

For the first time in 53 games, LSU started a new player at left tackle as senior **Joseph Barksdale** has taken over the spot this year. Barksdale, who has started a team-high 28 straight games (26 at right tackle, 2 at left tackle), replaced Ciron Black, who started a school-record 53 games at left tackle over the past four years. As a matter of fact, since the start of the 2002 season, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Andrew Whitworth and Black. Whitworth, now a starter for the Cincinnati Bengals, started 52 straight games at left tackle from 2002-05 with Black starting every game at the position from 2006-09.

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 215-60-4 (.775) at night under the lights compared to a 21-25-3 (.459) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 60-11 overall at home, which includes a 49-5 (.903) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 11-6 (.647) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. LSU Is 32-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman. In 67 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 49-5 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 33-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 32-0. Murphy To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to senior running back **Richard Murphy** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. LSU coach **Les Miles**, along with input from the three other players who have worn Jersey No. 18, determined the Richard Murphy would wear the jersey in 2010.

LSU Capped Decade of Dominance In 2009

LSU put an end to the most successful decade in school history in 2009 by posting a 9-4 overall record and advancing to a major New Year's Day Bowl. LSU's 99 wins during from 2000-09 ranked second to only Florida (100) in the SEC. The decade saw LSU claim a pair of national championships in 2003 and 2007 and three SEC titles (2001, 2003, and 2007). LSU played in a bowl game each year, winning seven, four of which were BCS games. Five national award winners, 18 first-team All-Americans, six Academic All-Americans, 53 NFL Draft picks and 180 college graduates highlight a decade that has seen LSU establish itself as one of the premier football programs – on the field, in the classroom and in the community – in college athletics. Some other highlights for LSU during the decade include:

- Tied for first in the SEC in bowl appearances (10), SEC Championships (3) and Top 25 final rankings (9).
- Won more home games (59) than any other team in the SEC.
- Had the best regular-season non-conference record in the SEC with a 34-2 mark.
- Led the SEC in shutouts with 10
- With 99 wins from 2000-09, only three teams in the history of the SEC have won more games in a decade than LSU – Alabama (103) in the 70's, and Florida, who won 102 games in the 90's and 100 games from 2000-09.
- The Tigers played 111 of its 130 games from 2000-09 ranked in the top 25.

LSU's Won At Least 8 Games For 10 Straight Years

By going 9-4 in 2009, LSU ran its streak of consecutive season with at least eight wins to 10 straight. LSU won at least eight games every year from 2000-09, and its current streak ranks as the fifth-longest in the nation. Here's a look at those teams with a current streak of winning at least eight:

LSU's The Winningest Program In SEC Over Last 10 Years

LSU Has Become D-Line U

You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Draft picks from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had five defensive linemen earn a total of six First-Team All-America honors and 10 members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. In 2007, DT Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defensive player in school history - winning four national awards - on his way to becoming the fifth overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft. In the spring of 2009, Defensive end Tyson Jackson became the highest LSU defender ever picked in the NFL Draft, going No. 3 overall to Kansas City. Son of former New Orleans Saints and Atlanta Falcons quarterback Bobby Hebert ... Was given the nickname "T-Bob" by his great-grandmother ... Listens to "When the Levee Breaks" by Led Zeppelin before every game ... Describes himself as "a huge nerd." Collects comic books and video games. Said his favorite comic book growing up was The Green Lantern.

#72 Alex Hurst • OT

Attended the University of New Orleans as a student in 2006 before walking on at LSU in 2007 ... Awarded a scholarship prior to the 2009 season.

#38 Derek Helton • P

Picked up a ball his junior year in high school (Kansas), starting kicking it around and his teammates realized he had a gift ... Personal hero: Mom; went back to school, got master's degree with 2 kids; big struggle for her and "that motivates me".

#95 Lazarius Levingston • DT

Nickname is "Pep" ... Motivated by his mother ... A single parent, she motivated him to go to school and get an education ... His little sister, Marquesha, got shot in the head and was "an inch away from dying" ... Before he came to LSU, the one thing she told him "Pep, if you don't do anything else, make the people at LSU love you" ... This meant a lot to him.

#99 Sam Montgomery • DE

Nickname is "Sonic" because he loves Sonic the hedgehog ... Didn't start playing football until his junior year of high school ... Notables

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 86th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 79th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 29 of its last 34 games at home. Head coach Les Miles is 24-1 in Saturday Night games in Death Valley.
- More than 85,000 fans have attended each of LSU's last 69 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 59 times, including a school-record 93,129 for the Oct. 10, 2009 game that pitted No. 4 LSU against No. 1 Florida.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 46 of the past 53 seasons.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 215-60-4 (.778) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 21-25-3 (.459) at home during the day in that span.

Jones, Last-Minute Goalline Stand Help Tigers Past Mississippi State, 30-26

Chad Jones returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown to start the fourth quarter and a last-minute goalline stand by the LSU defense helped the Tigers hold off Mississippi State, 30-26, in Starkville. Patrick Peterson opened the scoring for the Tigers, returning an interception 37 yards on State's first offensive play to give LSU a 6-0 lead. Mississippi State responded on its next possession to take a 7-6 lead. The Tigers struck back, going 66-yards on seven plays, capped with a Brandon LaFell 4-yard TD reception from Jordan Jefferson, putting LSU up 13-6. After an errant snap on a punt gave Mississippi State the ball at the LSU 1-yard line, the Bulldogs needed just one play to regain the lead at 14-13 on a 1-yard run by Anthony Dixon. LSU extended its lead on the first play of the third quarter when Jefferson connected with LaFell on a 58-yard TD pass to extend the lead to 23-14. The Bulldogs responded, going 73 yards on six plays to pull to within 23-21 on a 50-yard TD pass at the 6:33 mark. Jones' 93-yard punt return to open the fourth quarter gave the Tigers a 30-21 cushion. After a State field goal at the 10:13 mark pulled the Bulldogs to within 30-24, LSU's offense couldn't sustain drives on its next two possessions, opening the door for a Bulldogs possession that had State driving all the way to the Tiger 2-yard line with just over a minute left in the game. LSU's defense turned back State on four straight downs, including three from the 1-yard line, preserving the victory.

Tigers Survive North Carolina Rally To Win Season-Opener, 30-24

LSU held off a furious North Carolina rally as the Tigers opened their sixth season under Les Miles with a 30-24 victory over the 18th-ranked Tar Heels in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta. Leading 30-10 early in the fourth quarter and with North Carolina backed up on its own 3-yard line, the Tigers spotted the Tar Heels a 97-yard TD pass to close the gap to 30-17 with 10:34 to play. That TD changed the momentum of the game as the Tiger offense couldn't get anything going. LSU went 3-and-out on its next possession before the Tar Heels marched 67 yards on 13 plays to pull with 30-24 with 2:31 to play. After UNC recovered its onside kick, the Tiger defense stepped up, forcing what appeared to be a game-ending turnover on fourth down. With the ball on the UNC 39-yard line and with just over a minute left, LSU tried to run out the clock but a fumble by **Stevan Ridley** gave the ball back to UNC with 1:08 left in the contest. With no timeouts, the Tar Heels marched all the way to the LSU 6-yard line before the Tiger defense batted away passes in the endzone on consecutive downs to seal the victory. LSU jumped out to a 30-10 halftime lead thanks to a series of big plays in the second quarter, including an 87-yard punt return for a TD by **Patrick Peterson**, a 50-yard TD run by **Russell Shepard** and a 51-yard TD pass from **Jordan Jefferson** to **Reuben Randle**. Peterson finished with a school-record 257 return yards, just nine yards shy of tying the SEC record. LSU's defense limited UNC to just 24 yards rushing, while the Tigers racked up 162 yards on the ground, 81 coming from Ridley and 67 from Shepard.

Ridley Rushes Tigers Past Vanderbilt in SEC Opener, 27-3

Stevan Ridley rushed for a career-best 159 yards and one touchdown and the LSU defense dismantled Vanderbilt as the Tigers broke open a tight game with 17 fourth quarter points in the 27-3 win over the Commodores in Nashville. LSU rolled up 392 yards of total offense, including 280 on the ground, as the Tigers overpowered the Commodores on the both sides of the ball in the victory. After a scoreless first quarter, **Russell Shepard** got the Tigers on the board with a 30-yard run just 40 seconds into the second quarter. **Josh Jasper** tacked on a 36-yard field goal as LSU led 10-0 at halftime. Vanderbilt pulled to within 10-3 early in the third quarter on a field goal. From there, it was all LSU as the Tigers scored 17 fourth quarter points highlighted by a 65-yard TD run by Ridley. **Alfred Blue** scored his first career TD on a 6-yard run and Jasper kicked a 23-yard field goal to round out the scoring for the Tigers. For the game, LSU's defense forced punts on 10 of Vanderbilt's 12 possessions - including all seven first half possessions - as the Tigers limited the Commodores to only 135 total yards - 65 rushing, 70 passing. Vanderbilt crossed into LSU territory just twice in the contest and they got inside the Tiger redzone just one time. **Drake Nevis** led the Tigers with five tackles and 2.5 sacks, while **Kelvin Sheppard** added nine stops for an LSU defense that recorded six sacks and held Vanderbilt to only eight first downs.
