### 10th-Ranked LSU Welcomes Tennessee To Tiger Stadium For SEC Tilt

LSU will play its first afternoon game in Tiger Stadium since the 2008 season when the 10th-ranked and undefeated Tigers host Tennessee on Saturday at 2:30 p.m. in a key Southeastern Conference contest for both teams. The game will be televised nationally by CBS. LSU, now 4-0 overall and 2-0 in SEC play, is coming off a 20-14 win over then-No. 21 West Virginia last week. The win over the Mountaineers lifted LSU to No. 10 in this week's USA Today Coaches' Poll and to No. 12 in the AP Top 25. Tennessee (2-2 overall, 0-1 in SEC) survived an upset bid from UAB last week, beating the Blazers, 32-29, in double-overtime in Knoxville. Saturday's game will be the first between the teams since the 2007 season when the Tigers beat the Vols, 21-14, in the SEC Championship Game—a victory that propelled the LSU into the national championship game. LSU's won six straight and eight of its last nine games in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers are 32-6 in Tiger Stadium under **Les Miles**, which includes a 15-6 record in SEC games and a 6-2 mark against SEC Eastern Division opponents. LSU brings the SEC's top overall defense into the contest as the Tigers are leading the league in rush defense (74.8 ypg) and total defense (254.0 ypg) and they are No. 2 in total defense (12.0 ppg) and No. 4 in pass defense (179.2 ypg). Offensively, LSU is averaging 26.5 points and 299.8 yards per game. The Tigers are No. 5 in the league in rushing with 189.8 yards a contest. In four games, LSU has played 22 freshmen (10 true, 12 redshirt) and the Tigers have had 13 players earn a start for the first time in their career (8 vs. North Carolina, 4 vs. Vanderbilt, 1 vs. Mississippi State). Individually, RB **Stevan Ridley** is averaging 108.5 yards rushing per game, while PK Josh Jasper is first in the SEC in field goals (9), scoring (38 total points) and field goal percentage (90.0 pct.). Junior CB Patrick Peterson leads the SEC in punt returns (28.1 avg.), is third in kickoff returns (31.7 avg.) and tied for sixth in interceptions with two. Senior LB **Kelvin Sheppard** leads the Tigers with 38 tackles, while DT **Drake Nevis** has 3.5 sacks to his credit.

#### STORYLINES

- LSU goes after a 5-0 start for the second straight year and the third time in the last four seasons.
- LSU will be after a 3-0 start in league play for the second consecutive year and for the third time under **Les Miles** (LSU won its first three SEC games in 2007 and 2009).
- It will be the first day game in Tiger Stadium since the 2008 home finale against Ole Miss. LSU is 5-4 in day games in Tiger Stadium under **Les Miles**.
- LSU has led in 14 straight quarters of football and the Tigers have only trailed in 18 seconds of football (out of 240 minutes) the entire season. North Carolina held a 10-7 lead on LSU in the season-opener following a 20-yard field goal, but the Tigers answered with a **Russell Shepard** 50-yard touchdown run eight seconds later at the 8:06 mark in the second quarter. LSU has not trailed since.
- Under **Les Miles**, LSU is 20-2 when a having a 100-yard rusher and the Tigers are 33-0 when reaching the 100-yard rushing mark as a team and holding the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards.
- LSU's **Patrick Peterson** is averaging 28.7 yards every time he touches the ball – he's returned 9 punts for 253 yards; 6 kickoffs for 190 yards and 2 interceptions for 46 yards.
- LSU hasn't allowed a point in the first quarter this year. LSU goes into the Tennessee game riding a streak of 12 straight regular-season games without allowing a first quarter TD. Mississippi State in week 4 of 2009 was the last team to score a first quarter touchdown on the LSU defense during the regular season. It's the longest such streak for the Tigers since going 14 straight quarters in 1971-72.

# Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SIXTH SEASON

LSU goes into the 2010 season coming off the best decade in the history of the program – winning a pair of national titles along with 99 games – and the driving force behind the Tigers' continued dominance at the national level has been head coach Les Miles.

Now in his sixth year with the Tigers, Miles has guided the Tigers to unmatched success – both on and off the field – in his first five years at the school, winning more games than any other coach in LSU history during a 6-year span and claiming both the BCS National Championship and the Southeastern Conference title in 2007.

It's been under Miles' leadership that LSU has established itself as one of the elite college football programs – winning 55 games overall, including four bowl contests, graduating 116 players, having 31 players selected in the NFL Draft, seven of which were first round picks, and producing nine first-team All-Americans.

Under Miles, the Tigers have also posted at least 11 victories in a season three times and they've finished ranked among the top five in the nation three straight years (2005, '06, and '07), a first at LSU.

With an astonishing 55-15 record in his first six years with the Tigers, Miles has climbed to the third-winningest coach in school history, while his four bowl victories rank second among all LSU head coaches.

In addition to his 55 victories, some other notable accomplishments during his first five years with the Tigers include: only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season – and he's done it twice; only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game; nine wins over coaches who have won national titles; and the only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. Since the 2005 season, LSU has placed 89 players on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 116 earning their college diploma.

Going to back the 2007 season, LSU has graduated 52 of its 65 seniors, including 19 of 24 from the national championship team, 16 of 18 from the 2008 squad, and 17 of 23 from the 2009 team. Ten of the 13 players during that stretch who haven't completed their requirements for graduation are currently playing in the NFL. The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, Tigers have produced 31 NFL Draft picks over the past five years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards.

Now, with the Tigers becoming the first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for the LSU football program continues to be solid. After 55 wins, including 20 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with five straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

**Series Notes:** LSU and Tennessee meet for the 31st time on Saturday with the Vols holding a 20-7-3 advantage in the series that dates back to the 1925 season ... LSU has won two straight and three of the last four games the Vols, including a 21-14 victory in the 2007 SEC Championship Game – the last time the teams played ... The last two times the teams have played in Tiger Stadium the game has gone to overtime ... Tennessee won 30-27 in a Monday night overtime game in 2005 ... Prior to that, LSU beat the Vols, 38-31, in overtime in 2000 ... LSU is 3-8-2 all-time against Tennessee in Tiger Stadium ... Since the start of the 2000 season, LSU is 4-2 against Tennessee ... LSU coach Les Miles is 2-1 against Tennessee ... No coach in LSU history has three wins against Tennessee – Miles and Nick Saban both have two wins against the Vols as head coach of the Tigers.

## LAST TIME OUT: #15/12 LSU 20 #22/21 WEST VIRGINIA 14 (IN BATON ROUGE)

**Patrick Peterson** returned a punt 60-yards for a touchdown and the LSU defense held West Virginia to just 177 total yards as the Tigers extended the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak to 31 games with a 20-14 win over the Mountaineers. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by **Stevan Ridley**. LSU extended the lead to 10-0 on a 49-yard field goal by **Josh Jasper** with 12:01 left in the first half. After forcing WVU to its fourth three-and-out of the first half, Peterson gathered in a punt and returned it 60 yards for a TD and a 17-0 LSU lead at the 9:39 mark in the second quarter. West Virginia added a score just before halftime, cutting the LSU lead to 17-7 at the break. WVU pulled to within 17-14 early in the third quarter, going 30 yards on a two plays following a **Jordan Jefferson** interception. That was as close as the Mountaineers would get as the Tigers held WVU to just 63 total yards and only three first downs in the fourth quarter. Ridley led the Tiger with 116 rushing yards and one TD, while QB **Jordan Jefferson** completed 10 of 22 passes for 75 yards. Defensively, LB **Kelvin Sheppard** paced the unit with 11 tackles, while DB **Tyrann Mathieu** recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass for the Tigers

## NOTEBOOK

### LSU-Tennessee Ties

LSU defensive coordinator **John Chavis** held the same position at Tennessee for 14 years from 1995-2008 ... Chavis, who spent a total of 20 years with the Vols, coached linebackers and the defensive line at Tennessee from 1989-1994 before being promoted to defensive coordinator for the 1995 season ... LSU running backs coach **Frank Wilson** coached the wide receivers at Tennessee in 2009 ... LSU administrative intern **Dominique Stevenson** started at middle linebacker for Chavis and the Vols from 1999-2001 ... Tennessee coach Derek Dooley spent five years at LSU on Nick Saban's staff from 2000-04 ... Dooley coached tight ends, special teams and running backs during his time with the Tigers ... Tennessee defensive backs coach Terry Joseph was a graduate assistant on Les Miles' staff in 2006 ... Tennessee linebackers coach Lance Thompson coached at LSU for two years in 2002 and 2003.

### More on the LSU-Tennessee Series

The last three times the teams have met, a fourth quarter or overtime score has determined the outcome. In 2006, LSU scored with 9 seconds left to beat the Vols, 28-24, in Knoxville. In that contest, JaMarcus Russell connected with Early Doucet in the back of the endzone for the score to complete the comeback. A year later at the SEC Championship Game in Atlanta, LSU CB Jonathan Zenon returned an interception 18 yards for a touchdown at the 9:54 mark in the fourth quarter to give the Tigers the lead for good at 21-14. LSU LB Darry Beckwith intercepted a Tennessee pass at the Tiger 7-yard line with less than three minutes left to secure the victory that sent LSU to the national championship game that year. In 2005, Tennessee scored 17 fourth quarter points and then added a TD in overtime to beat LSU, 30-27, in what was Les Miles' first game in Tiger Stadium.

### Who's In and Who's Out for the Tigers

LSU lost starting right guard **Will Blackwell** on its first offensive play of the year against North Carolina. Blackwell suffered a broken ankle and will be out for what appears to be the remainder of the regular season. LSU also continues to be without WR **Chris Tolliver** (head). Tolliver returned to action briefly against Vanderbilt, but missed the Mississippi State game. LSU TE **Deangelo Peterson** (foot) played in his first game of the year last week vs. West Virginia, while TE **Mitch Joseph** missed the contest with an injury. Joseph will be out of action this week as well.

### Patrick Peterson Named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week Again

LSU standout **Patrick Peterson** has been named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for the second time this year after his performance in the win over West Virginia. Peterson accounted for 86 punt return yards, including a 60-yard touchdown that gave LSU a 17-0 lead with 9:39 left in the second quarter. Peterson also blocked a field goal with 7:37 in the first quarter. The preseason All-American is the first LSU player to return two punts for touchdowns in a single season since Skyler Green did so in 2003. Peterson was also SEC Special Teams Player of the Week against North Carolina.



## LSU In Top 10 Nationally In Three Defensive Categories

Four weeks into the season and LSU's defense is ranked among the top 10 in the nation in three defensive categories – scoring, rush defense, and total defense. LSU leads the SEC in both total defense (254.0 ypg) and rushing defense (74.75 ypg). The Tigers are No. 5 in the nation and second in the SEC in scoring defense (9.75 ppg) and they are No. 8 nationally in rush defense and No. 9 in total defense.

## Defense Continues To Shine

LSU's defense continued its torrid play against West Virginia, limiting the Mountaineers to just 177 yards of total offense in the 20-14 victory. The 177 yards marked the second time this year that LSU has held an opponent to fewer than 200 yards of offense (Vanderbilt had 135). Against the Mountaineers, the Tigers limited RB Noel Devine to just 37 rushing yards, some 80 yards below his season average and LSU held West Virginia to 3-and-outs on six of its 12 possessions. The following is a look at some of LSU's defensive highlights thus far:

- LSU hasn't allowed a point in the first quarter this year and they've given up just 17 first half points.
- In 49 possessions this year, LSU has forced the opponents to 3-and-outs 20 times and created 10 turnovers.
- LSU has only given up 1 rushing TD this year, the fewest by the Tigers during the first 4 games of a season since 2004, when the Tigers didn't allow a rushing TD until the Georgia game on Oct. 2.
- LSU has given up six TDs all year – four of which had to go at least 10 plays to reach the endzone.
- LSU has 11 sacks this year – the Tigers didn't get their 11 sack last year until the 8th game of the year.
- Seven players have recorded a sack and 14 players have a tackle for a loss.
- The 70 passing yards allowed against Vanderbilt were the fewest in an SEC game against the Tigers since 2006 when Arkansas passed for 62 yards.
- The 8 first downs by Vanderbilt were the fewest against LSU since 2006 when UL-Lafayette had 8 against the Tigers in the season opener. It was also the fewest in an SEC against LSU since 2004 when Alabama managed just 8 first downs in a 26-10 loss to the Tigers.
- LSU had five interceptions against Mississippi State, the most since picking off six passes against the Bulldogs in 2007. **Patrick Peterson** and **Morris Claiborne** had two picks apiece. It is the first time LSU had two players record multiple interceptions in the same game since at least 1976.

## LSU Hasn't Allowed A First Quarter TD In Regular Season Game Since Week 4 Last Year

The Tigers go into the Tennessee game having held its last 12 regular season opponents without a first quarter touchdown, a streak that goes back to the Georgia game last year. Mississippi State, in week 4 of 2009, was the last team in the regular season to score a first quarter touchdown against the Tigers. Since then, the Tigers have limited their next 12 opponents to a combined total of 15 points in the first quarter – Georgia 0, Florida 3, Auburn 0, Tulane 0, Alabama 0, Louisiana Tech 3, Ole Miss 6, Arkansas 3, North Carolina 0, Vanderbilt 0, Mississippi State 0, West Virginia 0. The streak is the longest for LSU since the 1971-72 seasons when the Tigers went 14 games during the regular season without allowing a first quarter TD. That streak included the final 10 games of the 1971 regular season and the first four games in 1972.

## Tigers Have Trailed For Just 18 Seconds All Year

LSU goes into the Tennessee game having been behind in a game for only 18 seconds all season. LSU trailed North Carolina 10-7 in the season-opener following a 20-yard Tar Heel field goal. The Tigers answered with a **Russell Shepard** 50-yard TD run eighth seconds later, at the 8:06 mark in the second quarter, to regain the lead at 14-10. LSU hasn't trailed since, a string of 14 straight quarters of holding the lead over an opponent.

## LSU and Boise State Are Only Teams In Nation With Pair of Non-Conference Top 25 Wins

LSU and Boise State are the only teams in the nation with two wins over non-conference ranked teams this season. LSU defeated No. 18 North Carolina and No. 21 West Virginia. Boise State has wins over No. 10 Virginia Tech and No. 24 Oregon State. The two top 25 non-conference wins for LSU marks the first time in school history that the Tigers have beaten a pair of non-conference ranked opponents during the regular season.

## LSU vs. the SEC Eastern Division

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 11-7 against teams from the SEC Eastern Division, which includes a 1-1 mark in the SEC title game. LSU has won at least two games against the SEC Eastern Division in nine of the last 10 years (exception came in 2008 when LSU was 1-2 vs. SEC East). LSU is 1-0 vs. the SEC East this year, beating Vanderbilt 27-3 in week 2.

## Miles is 31-6 Overall In Tiger Stadium

LSU goes into the Tennessee game with a 31-6 overall mark under **Les Miles** in games played in Tiger Stadium. Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime – 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama in 2008. LSU also has a loss to No. 1 ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium.

## LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 51 of the 64 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis during the early 2000s, LSU has recorded a 51-13 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU was 6-3 in 2009 as a top 10 team.

## This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 217-60-4 (.779) at night under the lights compared to a 21-25-3 (.459) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 62-11 overall at home, which includes a 51-5 (.911) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 11-6 (.647) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. ## LSU In the Top 25 For 21st Straight Week

The win over West Virginia stretched LSU's streak to consecutive weeks in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll to 21 straight. LSU is No. 10 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll this week and No. 12 in the AP Top 25. LSU has been ranked in both polls every week since the start of last year. Since Miles took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll in 81 of the 85 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 106 of 108 games ranked in the top 25, including 68 of 70 games under **Les Miles**. LSU has a 55-13 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles.

## Miles Is 20-11 vs. Top 25 Opponents

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 20-11 in games against ranked opponents following the win over West Virginia. LSU is 2-0 against Top 25 teams this year after going 1-3 a year ago. Last year, LSU beat Georgia on the road and then dropped games to ranked foes in Florida, Alabama and Penn State. LSU won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. In games against teams ranked in the top 10, Miles is 8-7.

## LSU Wraps Up Fourth Straight Perfect September – Tigers Have Won School-Record 17 Straight In September

The win over West Virginia gave LSU its fourth straight year of being perfect in September. LSU is currently riding a school-record 17-game winning streak during the month of September. LSU is 20-2 in games played in September under **Les Miles**. LSU hasn't lost a game in September since 2006 when the Tigers dropped a 7-3 decision to Auburn. Next year, LSU plays September games against Oregon (in Dallas), Northwestern State, at Mississippi State and at West Virginia.

## LSU Keeps Non-Conference Regular-Season Streaks Alive Against West Virginia

With the win over West Virginia, LSU extended the nation's longest regular-season non-conference winning streak to 31 0 consecutive games. The 31-game non-conference regular-season winning streak dates back to the 2002 when the Tigers dropped a 26-8 decision to Virginia Tech in the season-opener. Since then, LSU has reeled off 31 straight non-conference wins during the regular season. In addition, LSU has won 29 consecutive non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, a streak that dates back to the 2000 season. The last time LSU lost a non-conference home game came on Sept. 23, 2000 when UAB stunned the Tigers, 13-10.

## Saturday Night Special – Tigers Are 27-1 In Saturday Night Home Games Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 41-4 in night games under Miles compared to a 14-11 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 27-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 27-1 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era. The only two home losses at night for the Tigers under Miles have come in 2005 on a Monday night against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime and then a 13-3 loss to No. 1-ranked Florida last year.

## Josh Jasper, Lou Groza Award Candidate

In just two years as LSU's primary place kicker, **Josh Jasper** has firmly established himself in the Tiger record books. Jasper, a senior from Memphis, Tenn., is the LSU career leader in field goal percentage having drilled 87.5 percent of his field goals. David Browndyke (1986-89) is second in that category with a 81.3 percent average (61-of-75). Jasper ranks second in SEC history in career field goal percentage, trailing only Florida's Bobby Raymond, who made 87.8 (43-of-49) of his kicks from 1982-84. Jasper shattered the LSU game record for made field goals with five against Mississippi State and was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week and Lou Groza Award "Star of the Week" for his efforts. It broke the previous record of four in one game, set nine different times. Jasper's previous career high was four against Arkansas last season. He hit from 44, 32, 51, 37 and 21. Jasper also set an LSU record for field goals in a half with four in the first stanza. Heading into the Tennessee game, Jasper has made nine consecutive field goals since his first quarter miss against North Carolina. He booted two against West Virginia and is now 9-of-10 for the season and 28-of-32 for his career. For his career, he is 6-of-8 from 40 yards or more. Beyond 50-yards, Jasper is 3-of-4. Jasper is in sole possession of eighth place with in LSU career field goals made with 28. He surpassed Chris Jackson (26 from 2003-06). Jasper is also a perfect 50-of-50 for his career in PATs. The 50 consecutive PATs put him fifth in LSU consecutive PATs made.

## Drake Nevis, One of the Nation's Top Defensive Lineman

Through four games, one can make a case that defensive tackle **Drake Nevis** has been the top defensive lineman in the nation. For the second straight game, Nevis was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week after recording nine tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and his first career interception in the win over Mississippi State. He became the the first LSU defensive lineman to record an interception since defensive end Kirston Pittman had one against Florida on Oct. 6, 2007. He was also the first LSU defensive tackle to pick off a pass since Chad Lavalais did so against Alabama on Nov. 15, 2003. Nevis produced five tackles and 2.5 sacks for a loss of 17 yards a week earlier at Vanderbilt. For the season, Nevis ranks second in the SEC in sacks with 3.5 and he leads the Tigers and is fifth in the SEC with six tackles for loss. Nevis has racked up 7.5 sacks and 24.5 tackles for loss for his career.

## Ridley Off To Great Start

LSU RB **Stevan Ridley** is off to a great start in his first full season as the Tigers' primary running back. In four games, Ridley has rushed for 434 yards and three touchdowns. He's third in the SEC in rushing yards with 108.5 yards per game. Ridley has two 100-yard games to his credit this year, including a career-best 159 yards and one TD in the win over Vanderbilt.

## LSU is 20-2 Under Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU ran its record to 20-2 under **Les Miles** when a Tiger reaches 100 rushing yards following the win over West Virginia. LSU RB **Stevan Ridley** had his second 100-yard game, going for 116-yards and one touchdown in the win over the Mountaineers. The only two games under Miles that the Tigers didn't win despite having a 100-yard rusher came in 2008 vs. Georgia (Charles Scott, 144 yards), and 2007 vs. Arkansas (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

## LSU's Jefferson Second-Winningest Active QB in SEC With 13-5 Record

LSU junior **Jordan Jefferson** goes into the Tennessee game with a 13-5 overall record as the Tigers' starting quarterback. The 13 victories make Jefferson the second-winningest active quarterback in the conference, trailing only Greg McElroy of Alabama, who is 19-0 as a starter. LSU backup **Jarrett Lee** has a 5-4 record as a starter, which ranks him sixth among all active quarterbacks in the SEC in terms of victories. Jefferson was 1-1 in 2008, 8-4 in 2009 and 4-0 this year, while Lee was 4-4 in 2008 and 1-0 last year. Jefferson is 7-1 as a starter in Tiger Stadium and he's 6-4 on the road.

## Miles Has Victories Over Every SEC Team

With last year's win over Georgia, LSU coach **Les Miles** has recorded at least one victory over every team in the SEC. Miles is 29-13 in SEC regular season games and 30-14 in all league games (including SEC Championship Game). In addition, Miles has faced 50 different teams during his head coaching career and he's beaten all but two of them – Texas and Penn State.

## LSU Rebounds Following Loss Under Miles

For the first time during the **Les Miles** era, LSU went into a new season coming off a loss as the Tigers dropped a 19-17 decision to Penn State in the Capital One Bowl in January. LSU responded by beating North Carolina, 30-24, to run its record under **Les Miles** to 14-1 in games following a loss. LSU has only loss back-to-back games once under Miles, that coming in 2008 when the Tigers dropped consecutive games to Ole Miss and Arkansas in late November.

## Patrick Peterson – Special All The Way Around

He's been labeled the best cornerback in college football. After his debut as LSU's primary return specialist, **Patrick Peterson** may add best return man in college football to his resume. Peterson set an LSU record for return yards against North Carolina with 257 yards - 157 on punt returns, 100 on kickoff returns. The 257 return yards were just 10 shy of breaking the SEC mark of 266 held by Nick Turner of Mississippi State. The 157 punt return yards ranked as the second-most in LSU history, only behind Norman Jefferson's 169 return yards versus Ole Miss in 1983. Peterson returned a punt 87 yards for a second quarter touchdown, which tied for the sixth-longest punt return in school history. He also set up another LSU touchdown with a 47-yard return to midfield midway through the second quarter. Peterson accounted for 87 punt return yards against West Virginia, including a 60-yard touchdown with 9:39 left in the second quarter. He became the first player since Skyler Green in 2003 to return two punts for touchdowns in the same season. He added a blocked field goal to his resume in the first quarter against the Mountaineers. Peterson ranks No. 2 in the nation in punt returns (28.1), No. 63 in all-purpose yards (122.2) and No. 15 in kickoff returns (31.7). And, oh by the way, Peterson has added 11 tackles, including one tackle for a loss, from the cornerback position. Peterson has scored touchdowns three different ways during his career at LSU - interception return (37 yards vs. Miss. State, '09), blocked field goal return (53 yards vs. Ole Miss, '09), and punt return (87 yards vs. North Carolina, '10; 60 yards vs. West Virginia, '10). Peterson is one kickoff return for a TD away from becoming the first LSU player to score a touchdown four different ways since Kevin Faulk in the late 1990s.

## A New Face At Left Tackle

For the first time in 53 games, LSU started a new player at left tackle as senior **Joseph Barksdale** has taken over the spot this year. Barksdale, who has started a team-high 30 straight games (26 at right tackle, 3 4t left tackle), replaced Ciron Black, who started a school-record 53 games at left tackle over the past four years. As a matter of fact, since the start of the 2002 season, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Andrew Whitworth and Black. Whitworth, now a starter for the Cincinnati Bengals, started 52 straight games at left tackle from 2002-05 with Black starting every game at the position from 2006-09.

## LSU Is 33-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman. In 70 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 49-5 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 33-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 32-0. ## Murphy To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to senior running back **Richard Murphy** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. LSU coach **Les Miles**, along with input from the three other players who have worn Jersey No. 18, determined the Richard Murphy would wear the jersey in 2010.

## LSU 150

In celebration of the school's sesquicentennial anniversary in 2010, the Tigers will be boasting an "LSU 150" patch on their jerseys this season. The LSU 150 logo will also be painted onto the field in Tiger Stadium. The University will celebrate 150 years of excellence the entire season. Classes first began in 1860 and in 1870, the institution officially became Louisiana State University.

## Peterson Named SEC Special Teams and Lott IMPACT Player of the Week vs. North Carolina

LSU cornerback/return specialist **Patrick Peterson** picked up a pair of awards against North Carolina - earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors as well as being named the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week. Peterson, a 6-1, 211-pound junior from Pompano Beach, Fla., set an LSU record with 257 return yards in the Tigers' 30-24 win over North Carolina in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic. The return yards finished nine shy of tying the Southeastern Conference single-game record held by Nick Turner of Mississippi State. Peterson had an 87-yard punt return for a touchdown, a total of 157 yards in punt returns and 100 more in kickoff returns. He also contributed five tackles. Peterson is on watch lists for every postseason defensive award, including the Lott Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Award, Jim Thorpe Award and Chuck Bednarik Award. LSU received \$1,000 from the Lott Foundation for its general scholarship fund in recognition of Peterson's achievement.

## LSU Rebounds Following Loss Under Miles

For the first time during the **Les Miles** era, LSU went into a new season coming off a loss as the Tigers dropped a 19-17 decision to Penn State in the Capital One Bowl in January. LSU responded by beating North Carolina, 30-24, to run its record under Les Miles to 14-1 in games following a loss. LSU has only loss back-to-back games once under Miles, that coming in 2008 when the Tigers dropped consecutive games to Ole Miss and Arkansas in late November.

## LSU Capped Decade of Dominance In 2009

LSU put an end to the most successful decade in school history in 2009 by posting a 9-4 overall record and advancing to a major New Year's Day Bowl. LSU's 99 wins during from 2000-09 ranked second to only Florida (100) in the SEC. The decade saw LSU claim a pair of national championships in 2003 and 2007 and three SEC titles (2001, 2003, and 2007). LSU played in a bowl game each year, winning seven, four of which were BCS games. Five national award winners, 18 first-team All-Americans, six Academic All-Americans, 53 NFL Draft picks and 180 college graduates highlight a decade that has seen LSU establish itself as one of the premier football programs – on the field, in the classroom and in the community – in college athletics. Some other highlights for LSU during the decade include:

- Tied for first in the SEC in bowl appearances (10), SEC Championships (3) and Top 25 final rankings (9).
- Won more home games (59) than any other team in the SEC.
- Had the best regular-season non-conference record in the SEC with a 34-2 mark.
- Led the SEC in shutouts with 10
- With 99 wins from 2000-09, only three teams in the history of the SEC have won more games in a decade than LSU – Alabama (103) in the 70's, and Florida, who won 102 games in the 90's and 100 games from 2000-09.
- The Tigers played 111 of its 130 games from 2000-09 ranked in the top 25.

## LSU's Won At Least 8 Games For 10 Straight Years

By going 9-4 in 2009, LSU ran its streak of consecutive season with at least eight wins to 10 straight. LSU won at least eight games every year from 2000-09, and its current streak ranks as the fifth-longest in the nation. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had five defensive linemen earn a total of six First-Team All-America honors and 10 members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. In 2007, DT Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defensive player in school history - winning four national awards - on his way to becoming the fifth overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft. In the spring of 2009, Defensive end Tyson Jackson became the highest LSU defender ever picked in the NFL Draft, going No. 3 overall to Kansas City. - LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 86th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 79th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 31 of its last 36 games at home. Head coach **Les Miles** is 26-1 in Saturday Night games in Death Valley.
- More than 85,000 fans have attended each of LSU's last 71 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 61 times, including a school-record 93,129 for the Oct. 10, 2009 game that pitted No. 4 LSU against No. 1 Florida.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 46 of the past 53 seasons.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 217-60-4 (.778) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 21-25-3 (.459) at home during the day in that span.

## Zenon's Pick Six Gives LSU SEC Championship Crown, BCS Title Berth, 21-14

Jonathan Zenon returned an interception 18-yards for a touchdown midway through the fourth quarter as seventh-ranked LSU rallied for a 21-14 win over 14th-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship Game in Atlanta. The victory marked the 10th league title for LSU and the first since claiming the 2003 crown. Trailing 14-13 with just over 10 minutes left in the contest, Zenon stepped in front of an Erik Ainge pass and returned it 18 yards for what proved to be the winning points for the Tigers. Playing without starting quarterback Matt Flynn, backup Ryan Perrilloux completed 20 of 30 passes for 243 yards and a touchdown. Despite dominating the first half statistically, LSU managed just a pair of field goals in the first two quarters and trailed 7-6 at halftime. The Tigers took their first lead of the game on a 27-yard TD pass from Perrilloux to Demetrius Byrd early in the third quarter. The Vols regained the lead at 14-13 late in the fourth quarter setting up a defensive battle in the fourth quarter. LSU's defense intercepted a pair of passes in the fourth quarter and stopped the Vols without points inside the LSU 25-yard line twice during the final nine minutes of the contest, including an interception by linebacker Darry Beckwith at the 7-yard line to halt another Tennessee scoring opportunity with under three minutes left in the game. For the game, the Tigers rolled up 496 yards of offense, including 212 on the ground. Jacob Hester led the Tigers with 120 yards rushing. Perrilloux earned game MVP honors for the Tigers.

## Tigers Survive North Carolina Rally To Win Season-Opener, 30-24

LSU held off a furious North Carolina rally as the Tigers opened their sixth season under Les Miles with a 30-24 victory over the 18th-ranked Tar Heels in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta. Leading 30-10 early in the fourth quarter and with North Carolina backed up on its own 3-yard line, the Tigers spotted the Tar Heels a 97-yard TD pass to close the gap to 30-17 with 10:34 to play. That TD changed the momentum of the game as the Tiger offense couldn't get anything going. LSU went 3-and-out on its next possession before the Tar Heels marched 67 yards on 13 plays to pull with 30-24 with 2:31 to play. After UNC recovered its onside kick, the Tiger defense stepped up, forcing what appeared to be a game-ending turnover on fourth down. With the ball on the UNC 39-yard line and with just over a minute left, LSU tried to run out the clock but a fumble by **Stevan Ridley** gave the ball back to UNC with 1:08 left in the contest. With no timeouts, the Tar Heels marched all the way to the LSU 6-yard line before the Tiger defense batted away passes in the endzone on consecutive downs to seal the victory. LSU jumped out to a 30-10 halftime lead thanks to a series of big plays in the second quarter, including an 87-yard punt return for a TD by **Patrick Peterson**, a 50-yard TD run by **Russell Shepard** and a 51-yard TD pass from **Jordan Jefferson** to **Reuben Randle**. Peterson finished with a school-record 257 return yards, just nine yards shy of tying the SEC record. LSU's defense limited UNC to just 24 yards rushing, while the Tigers racked up 162 yards on the ground, 81 coming from Ridley and 67 from Shepard.

## Ridley Rushes Tigers Past Vanderbilt in SEC Opener, 27-3

Stevan Ridley rushed for a career-best 159 yards and one touchdown and the LSU defense dismantled Vanderbilt as the Tigers broke open a tight game with 17 fourth quarter points in the 27-3 win over the Commodores in Nashville. LSU rolled up 392 yards of total offense, including 280 on the ground, as the Tigers overpowered the Commodores on the both sides of the ball in the victory. After a scoreless first quarter, **Russell Shepard** got the Tigers on the board with a 30-yard run just 40 seconds into the second quarter. **Josh Jasper** tacked on a 36-yard field goal as LSU led 10-0 at halftime. Vanderbilt pulled to within 10-3 early in the third quarter on a field goal. From there, it was all LSU as the Tigers scored 17 fourth quarter points highlighted by a 65-yard TD run by Ridley. **Alfred Blue** scored his first career TD on a 6-yard run and Jasper kicked a 23-yard field goal to round out the scoring for the Tigers. For the game, LSU's defense forced punts on 10 of Vanderbilt's 12 possessions - including all seven first half possessions - as the Tigers limited the Commodores to only 135 total yards - 65 rushing, 70 passing. Vanderbilt crossed into LSU territory just twice in the contest and they got inside the Tiger redzone just one time. **Drake Nevis** led the Tigers with five tackles and 2.5 sacks, while **Kelvin Sheppard** added nine stops for an LSU defense that recorded six sacks and held Vanderbilt to only eight first downs.

## Jasper Shatters LSU Field Goal Record As LSU Downs Mississippi State, 29-7

LSU's defense intercepted five passes and **Josh Jasper** set a school-record with five field goals as the Tigers remained undefeated with a 29-7 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU never trailed in the contest, scoring all 12 of its first half points on Jasper field goals. Jasper opened the scoring with a 44-yard field goal on LSU's first possession and then added second quarter field goals of 32, 51, and 37 yards to give the Tigers a 12-0 lead at halftime. Mississippi State pulled to within 12-7 early in the third quarter, however LSU responded with a 7-play, 60-yard drive capped with a 16-yard TD run by **Jordan Jefferson** to extend the lead to 19-7. A **Drake Nevis** interception on MSU's next possession setup another TD by the Tigers as **Stevan Ridley** scored on a 2-yard run to stretch the lead to 26-7. Jasper capped the scoring with 21-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter. Offensively, LSU scored on seven of its nine possessions (5 field goals, 2 TDs) and punted just one time in the game. Ridley led the LSU offense with 78 yards rushing and one TD, while Jefferson completed 10 of 16 passes for 97 yards to go with 40 rushing yards. Defensively, **Patrick Peterson** and **Morris Claiborne** each intercepted two passes as the Tigers limited MSU to 268 total yards. **Ryan Baker** led the Tigers with 10 tackles, while Nevis added nine tackles, 1.5 tackles for losses and an interception.

## Peterson, Defense Lead Tigers Past #21 West Virginia, 20-14

Patrick Peterson returned a punt 60-yards for a touchdown and the LSU defense held West Virginia to just 177 total yards as the Tigers extended the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak to 31 games with a 20-14 win over the Mountaineers. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by **Stevan Ridley**. LSU extended the lead to 10-0 on a 49-yard field goal by **Josh Jasper** with 12:01 left in the first half. After forcing WVU to its fourth three-and-out of the first half, Peterson gathered in a punt and returned it 60 yards for a TD and a 17-0 LSU lead at the 9:39 mark in the second quarter. West Virginia added a score just before halftime, cutting the LSU lead to 17-7 at the break. WVU pulled to within 17-14 early in the third quarter, going 30 yards on a two plays following a **Jordan Jefferson** interception. That was as close as the Mountaineers would get as the Tigers held WVU to just 63 total yards and only three first downs in the fourth quarter. Ridley led the Tiger with 116 rushing yards and one TD, while QB **Jordan Jefferson** completed 10 of 22 passes for 75 yards. Defensively, LB **Kelvin Sheppard** paced the unit with 11 tackles, while DB **Tyrann Mathieu** recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass for the Tigers
