• The SEC has now had eight of its teams ranked at least one week in the major polls. In 2008, the SEC had nine teams ranked at least one week in the polls and last year, the league had seven teams ranked at least one week.

• The SEC has six teams ranked in the latest Associated Press and USA Today polls and the BCS rankings (all conference highs).

• - The six games played on Oct. 16 were all sold out. The total attendance of those games was 533,066, an average of 88,844 fans per game. The average capacity of the six games was 100.4 percent. For the season, in 47 home dates, a total of 3,693,719 fans have watched SEC football live, an average of 78,590 fans per game. SEC stadiums have been filled to an average 98.33 capacity so far this season.

• - The SEC continues to lead the nation in non-conference winning percentage. The league is 28-5 against non-league foes, an 84.8 winning percentage. The Big 12 (36-8 / .818) and the Big Ten (35-8 / .814) are second and third behind the SEC.

SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

The head coach may challenge the ruling of any reviewable play. He retains a challenge if his initial challenge is successful and thus results in a reversal by the replay official. The head coach will then have a single challenge that he may use anytime during the game if his team has not used all its timeouts. Thus a team may have a total of two challenges in the game, but only if the first results in a reversal of the on-field ruling.

THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference has used instant replay since 2005.

THE PLAYS

Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
 - a. Scoring Plays, including the ball in possession of a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
 - b. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
 - c. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds
2. Passing Plays:
 - a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
 - b. Touching of a forward pass by a player or an official
 - c. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
 - d. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
 - e. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
 - f. Quarterback (Passer) starts arm forward, ball comes loose and play is ruled incomplete (if ball is quickly recovered)
 - g. Quarterback (Passer) throws incomplete swing pass that is close to being forward or backward, and pass is ruled forward (if ball is quickly recovered)
3. Miscellaneous:
 - a. Runner ruled not down.
 - b. Runner ruled down (when ball carrier is judged down by rule and the ball is fumbled, play may be reviewed if recovery of ball occurs in the immediate action following fumble and is prior to any official signaling ball is dead. Also reviewable when runner is ruled out of bounds near goal line.)
 - c. Forward progress with respect to first down
 - d. Touching of a kick
 - e. Number of players on field
 - f. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with reviewed plays)
 - g. Fourth-down/try fumble plays
 - h. Field Goal Attempts (only when ball is ruled below or above the crossbar, inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights.)
 - i. The game clock expires at the end of a half. If at the end of the game, the time may be restored to the clock only if the score is tied or the team that would next snap the ball trails by eight points or fewer.

THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with the HD Instant Replay system provided by XOS Digital. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official and the Communicator are selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live HD video feed is sent directly to the replay booth from the TV truck. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while recording it into the XOS Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play while the Communicator marks all incoming replays.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Replay Technician. As the Technician and the Communicator mark the incoming video, each view will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Replay Technician can touch the thumbnail and immediately send that play or replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a jog shuttle remote controlled by the Replay Official. All video is viewed on an HD monitor that sits in front of the Replay Official. The touch screen is only used to select the replays and to log specific play data in the event a call is overturned.

While all plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the HD Replay System developed by XOS Digital of Orlando, FL. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from XOS Digital.

SEC FOOTBALL ON TELEVISION

CBS SPORTS

CBS Sports continues to be the exclusive national network broadcaster of SEC home football games, including the SEC Championship Game. CBS Sports will showcase the top conference matchups each week of the package with the "SEC Game of the Week". The agreement also includes a prime time game and doubleheader opportunities. In addition, CBS Sports continues its coverage of SEC regular-season basketball. In addition to the broadcast rights on CBS Sports, this 15-year contract includes certain digital, internet, wireless, Video-on-Demand, data and enhanced highlight rights across all CBS platforms, including CBS College Sports Network and CBS Sports.com. Also, simulcasts of CBS Sports games will be available for distribution by the CBS College Sports Network.

ESPN

ESPN is the exclusive national cable home and the syndication rights holder for the SEC, including every SEC home football game (excluding those on the network broadcast package).

ESPN and ESPN2: The networks have increased coverage by combining to televise a minimum of 20 SEC games annually, including Saturday night and two primetime Thursday matchups.

ESPN: The 24-hour college sports network presents an SEC Game of the Week (generally in primetime and a minimum of 13 games annually) as well as the studio show *SEC Weekly*.

SEC Network (ESPN Regional Television): The nation's largest syndicator of collegiate sports programming, is the official over-the-air syndication home for the SEC and will feature an SEC Game of the Week (generally at noon ET), with a minimum of 13 games each season throughout the SEC footprint and beyond. In addition, ESPN produces the integrated SEC Studio show, hosted by Dari Nowkhah, with analyst Matt Stinchcomb, a former University of Georgia and NFL standout.

ESPN360.com: Simulcasts of SEC game telecasts are offered on the broadband sports network.

ESPN Mobile TV: Live games are simulcast on mobile phones.

ESPN International: The agreement includes global rights to present live games and encore presentations.

ESPN Deportes: ESPN holds domestic Spanish-language rights for SEC football on the 24-hour, U.S.-based network.

ESPN GamePlan: The out-of-market college football pay-per-view service, offers SEC action.

ESPN Classic: The network may telecast select SEC live games as well as historic and immediate encore presentations.

ESPN.com: Extensive SEC content, including highlights, will be presented online.

COMCAST/ CHARTER SPORTS SOUTHEAST

Comcast / Charter Sports Southeast (CSS), the regional sports channel focusing on college sports in the southeast, has an agreement with ESPN to televise live Southeastern Conference (SEC) content including a minimum of six football games, twenty men's basketball games, and sixteen women's basketball games as well as fifty SEC Olympic sports each year. The agreement began with the 2009-10 academic year and goes for five years.

FOX SPORTS NET

Fox Sports Net's (FSN) regional sports networks serving the SEC territory – FOX Sports South, FOX Sports Carolinas, FOX Sports Tennessee, Sun Sports, FOX Sports Southwest and FOX Sports Houston – will be the outlets for a minimum of 92 SEC athletic events each year. Events will include eight live, exclusive football games, 20 men's basketball games, 24 women's basketball games (16 regular season, eight tournament), 16 baseball games (10 regular season, six tournament) and 24 additional Olympic sporting events (softball, volleyball, soccer, gymnastics). SEC athletic events on FSN will be distributed to more than 22 million cable and satellite households throughout the SEC territory.

INSTITUTIONAL MEDIA PACKAGES

As part of the SEC's television contracts, each conference institution was able to maintain a contractual television arrangement of its own. As part of this arrangement, each SEC institution has the ability to televise one pay-per-view football game per year as well as to host its own tape-delayed game package, coaches' TV shows as well as other sport packages.

SEC FOOTBALL SHOWS ON TELEVISION

SEC Weekly on ESPNU

SEC Weekly, a one-hour program airs Wednesdays at 5 p.m. ET on ESPNU, throughout the academic year and will cover SEC sports, including sport-by-sport previews, reviews, specials and features on student-athletes. The show is hosted by Cara Capuano with analyst Matt Stinchcomb, a former University of Georgia All-America and NFL player. *SEC Weekly* is a product of ESPN's landmark 15-year agreement with the Southeastern Conference. ESPNU will complement the show with SEC game telecasts, including football, basketball, Olympic sports and select conference championships.

SEC Gridiron Live

SEC Gridiron LIVE, airing live every Wednesday at 10 p.m. ET, breaks down every SEC game with footage, interviews and analysis. Tim Couch, former Kentucky standout and top pick in the 1999 NFL Draft, joins the live, weekly one-hour show as an analyst, with host Charles Davis and analyst Randy Cross. Also new to the SEC Gridiron LIVE team is social media host Kristina Akra. SECGridironLIVE.com is the hub for the show's social networking component, allowing viewers to participate in the live show and interact instantaneously with the broadcast team and SEC fans across the country.

CBS College Sports SEC Tailgate

Beginning Sept. 18, CBS Sports will start SEC programming with its live pre-game show COLLEGE FOOTBALL TODAY followed by the "SEC Game of the Week" CBS College Sports Network will broadcast SEC TAILGATE on select Saturdays at 2:00 PM, ET, from the site of CBS Sports' SEC Game of the Week. The show brings fans a fast paced and authoritative look at football and life in the SEC. The show captures all the excitement, traditions and festivities from the various campuses and stadiums across the SEC, and features local SEC legends and celebrity alumni.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL NOTES

SEC - FOUR STRAIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

• Alabama's 37-21 win over Texas in the 2010 BCS National Championship Game gave the Southeastern Conference its fourth straight BCS National Championship and its sixth BCS title overall. The SEC is now 6-0 in BCS National Championship Games (LSU 2-0, Florida 2-0, Alabama 1-0, Tennessee 1-0).

• Alabama is the fourth SEC team to win a BCS National Championship and the third different SEC team to win it during the last four seasons. Tennessee won the BCS' first national title in 1998, LSU won the crown in 2003, Florida's claimed the national championship in 2006 and 2008 while LSU took the title in 2007 and Alabama claimed the national title this past season. The Big 12 has two BCS national titles followed by the ACC, Big Ten, Pac-10 and Big East with one each.

• The SEC is the first conference to claim four consecutive Associated Press (first poll - 1936), National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame (first poll - 1959), Football Writers Association of America (first poll - 1954) and USA Today or UPI Coaches Poll (first poll - 1950) national championships.

• Since SEC expansion in 1992, the SEC has the most national championships (AP, USA Today) with eight. During that time, the SEC has had more teams with national titles than any other conference (4). Here is a breakdown:

SEC IN BOWL GAMES

• The SEC has the most wins (14) and the highest winning percentage of any conference that has three-or-more appearances in BCS bowl games. The SEC is 14-5 in BCS games (.737 percentage).

• Since conference expansion in 1992, the SEC has won at least five bowl games in nine of 18 seasons. The SEC has won at least six bowl games during the last four seasons (6-3 in 2006; 7-2 in 2007; 6-2 in 2008; 6-4 in 2009).

• The schools that currently comprise the SEC have appeared in 379 bowls (including 2009-10). That is by far the most of any conference in the nation. In its history, the SEC is 196-170-13 in post-season bowl games, a 53.4 winning percentage. The SEC has the nation's top bowl winning percentage surpassing the Pac-10 (120-107-6, 52.8 percentage). Below is a look at how the various conferences have fared in bowl games in its history (using 2009 conference alignments):

MISCELLANY

• Since 2000, the Southeastern Conference has had more teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Poll than any other conference. The SEC has had 43 teams ranked in the last nine final USA Today Coaches polls, an average of almost five per season. The Big 12 is second with 36 teams ranked since 2000. The SEC has led or tied for lead in most teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Polls in seven of the last nine seasons.

• For the 10th straight year, the SEC has led the nation in total number of former players on NFL opening weekend rosters. The SEC has 272 of its former players on NFL opening weekend rosters followed by the ACC with 228, the Big Ten at 217, the Big 12 at 184 and the Pac-10 at 180. LSU leads all SEC schools with 35, followed by Florida, Georgia and Tennessee with 33 each.

• The SEC had 49 players selected in the 2010 NFL Draft. The number represents the most SEC players ever taken in the NFL Draft. The SEC had the most players taken among conferences in the draft. Behind the SEC's 49 selections were the Big Ten (34), ACC (31), Big 12 (30) and Pac-10 (29).

• Since 1990, the SEC has had 782 total selections in the NFL Draft, an average of 37.2 selections per year. The Big Ten is second with 672 selections.

• The SEC has now led or tied for the most selections in the NFL Draft for 11 of the last 13 seasons and the last four drafts.

SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send nine of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2010 season.

The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One Bowl has the second selection, making its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The AT&T Cotton and the Outback Bowls share the third and fourth selections from the SEC. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference.

The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the fifth selection of preference from the SEC.

New to the SEC bowl rotation this year, the Gator Bowl has the sixth selection from the SEC.

The Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl has the seventh selection from the SEC.

In selections 8-9, the AutoZone Liberty and Birmingham Bowls share the selection over the four-year agreement.

2010 BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCHEDULE

Following the 2010 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the Discover Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose Bowl Game, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Tostitos BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

ESPN will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL NOTES

SEC DIVISIONAL TIE-BREAKER

In the event of a tie for the division championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties to determine the SEC Football Championship Game representative. All Conference versus Conference Games (both division and non-division) will be counted in the Conference Standings.

Two-Team Tie. In the event two teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order:

- A. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams;
- B. Records of the tied teams within the division;
- C. Head-to-head competition against the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference record, and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- D. Overall record against non-divisional teams;
- E. Combined record against all common non-divisional teams;
- F. Record against the common non-divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional or non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- G. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game.

Three-Team Tie (or more). If three teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order: (Note: If one of the procedures results in one team being eliminated and two remaining, the two-team tiebreaker procedure as stated in No. 1 above will be used):

- A. Combined head to head record among the tied teams;
- B. Record of the tied teams within the division;
- C. Head to head competition against the team within the division with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- D. Overall Conference record against non divisional teams;
- E. Combined record against all common non divisional teams;
- F. Record against the common non divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through other common non divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- G. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest-ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the SEC Championship Game.

SEC - AP POLL HISTORY

The Southeastern Conference has had at least five teams ranked in at least one AP Top 25 poll every year since expansion (1992).

Since 1992, the SEC has had at least 5 teams ranked in the AP Top 25 a total of 220 times, an average of 11.5 times per year.

Since 1992, the SEC has had at least 5 teams ranked for at least 10 weeks in 15 of the last 19 years.

The SEC has had seven teams ranked in the AP Top 25 poll seven times since 1992, including three weeks in 1999 and 2007 and one week this season.

The national average for scoring offense is 28.0. The Pac-10 leads the nation in scoring at 32.8 points per game (SEC is third). The national average for total offense is 383.3. The Pac-10 leads the nation at 420.0 yards per game (SEC is fifth).

THIS IS THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

SEC MISSION STATEMENT

"The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

THE SEC

The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports – 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

2009-10 ANOTHER BANNER ATHLETIC YEAR FOR THE SEC

The SEC claimed four national championships in the 2009-10 year. SEC teams have won at least four national titles every year since 1991. In eight of its 20 sponsored sports, the SEC had either the national champion or the national runners-up. The SEC had national championships in football (Alabama), men's indoor track & field (Florida), women's swimming & diving (Florida) and baseball (South Carolina).

In its 77 year history, the Southeastern Conference has won 183 team national championships, including 67 since 2000. In this decade, the SEC has won at least one national championship in 16 of its 20 sponsored sports with the exception of women's cross country, volleyball, soccer and softball.

SEC LEADS ALL CONFERENCES IN 2009-10 OVERALL SPORTS CONFERENCE VS. CONFERENCE SURVEY

In a statistical survey that is based on NCAA championship and rankings, the Southeastern Conference placed first in both men's and women's sports. The survey, compiled each year since 1986 by Bo Carter, takes into account final NCAA championship standings in 10 men's and 11 women's sports and poll rankings in football. Each conference gets 20 points for a team that wins a national championship, 19 for a second place finish and down to 1 point for a 20th place finish. Wrestling is included in the men's totals, but the sport is not sponsored by the Southeastern Conference.

In the 10 men's sports for the survey, the SEC had 398 points with the Pac-10 coming in second with 396 points, followed by the Big 12 with 395 points, Big Ten with 279.5 points, ACC with 238 points and the Big East with 83 points. In the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors, the SEC led the way with 502.5 points followed by the Pac-10 with 480 points, the Big 12 with 382 points, ACC with 369 points, Big Ten with 221 points and the Big East with 164 points.

Combining the 21 sports in the survey, the SEC had 900.5 points to pace all conferences followed by the Pac-10 with 876 points, Big 12 with 777 points, ACC with 607 points, Big Ten with 500.5 points and the Big East with 247 points. The SEC has had the highest men's point total in 17 seasons since 1986-87, the first year this survey was done, and in 11 of the last 12 seasons. The SEC has had the highest women's point total five times since 1986-87, including three of the last six years.

SEC LEADS DIVISION I CONFERENCES IN MOST FIRST-TEAM ESPN THE MAGAZINE CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

The Southeastern Conference had 15 of its student-athletes earn first-team ESPN The Magazine / CoSIDA Academic All-America status in 2009-10, more than any other Division I conference in the nation. The Big 12 had 14 while the Big Ten and Pac-10 had 13 student-athletes each earn the honor.

The SEC had 36 total student-athletes earn either first, second or third team mention. That total is second overall to the Big 12 Conference, which had 39. The Big Ten was third with 34 total student-athletes earned first, second or third team mention.

The SEC's academic success of its student-athletes in 2009-10 was not just Academic All-Americans. The league honored 2,424 of its own student-athletes who made the SEC Academic Honor Roll. The league also honored Auburn swimmer Jordan Anderson and Tennessee track & field athlete Phoebe Wright with its McWhorter Scholar-Athletes of the Year as well as naming a scholar-athlete of the year in each of its sports.

Among honors given by the NCAA, SEC student-athletes also shined. Three student-athletes from the SEC – Florida's Tim Tebow (football), Georgia's Courtney Kupets (gymnastics) and Alabama's Brittany Rogers (softball) were honored this past year with the Today's Top VIII Award from the NCAA. Since 2004, the SEC has had 10 student-athletes awarded this honor, more than any other conference in the country.

The SEC also had 13 student-athletes receive NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships in 2009-10, more than any other conference in the nation.

SEC SPORTSMANSHIP STATEMENT

The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states: "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

SEC TOPS IN FAN SUPPORT

The Southeastern Conference has led the nation in total attendance in football every year since 1981 (29 straight years). Since 1988, the SEC has led the nation in average attendance. More than 6.5 million fans witnessed first-hand, the excitement of SEC football in 2009. The average capacity of the 12 SEC stadiums during the last 10 years has been 97 percent. Every year since 1988, the SEC has had at least four teams ranked in the top 10 in average attendance.

In men's basketball, the SEC has finished second in national average attendance for four straight seasons and has finished in the top three every year since 1994 (17 straight years). Kentucky has led the nation in 14 of the last 15 years in attendance. In 2009-10, five SEC schools finished in the top 30 in average attendance.

In women's basketball, after finishing third in the nation for 10 straight seasons, the SEC was second in national average attendance in 2009-10. The SEC has had at least two schools in the top 25 in average attendance every year since 1999-2000. Tennessee has led the nation in attendance in 10 of the last 11 seasons. In 2009-10, the SEC had four schools finish in the top 25 in average attendance.

In baseball, the SEC and one of its institutions have led the NCAA in total and average attendance for the last 13 seasons, and 18 of the last 24 years. The SEC and its member institutions own virtually all regular season, conference tournament, NCAA Regional and Super Regional attendance records. The SEC has broken its own national record each of the last five seasons in total attendance, after having set a goal of 1.5 million fans in 2005 as part of the league's "Drive for 1.5 ... Pack the Parks" promotion.

THE COACHES

Houston Nutt is in his third season at Ole Miss with a record of 21-11 (.656) and 18th overall with a record of 132-81 (.620). The Rebels' co-offensive coordinators are Mike Markuson and Dave Rader and the defensive coordinator is Tyrone Nix.

Bobby Petrino is in his third season at Arkansas with a record of 16-14 (.533) and eighth overall with a record of 60-33 (.645). The Razorbacks' offensive coordinator is Garrick McGee and the defensive coordinator is Willie Robinson.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN OLE MISS HAS THE BALL

The Rebels currently rank second in the SEC in rushing averaging 215.5 yards per game. Brandon Bolden currently ranks fourth in the SEC averaging 91.7 yard per game. Jeremiah Masoli currently ranks seventh in the SEC in total offense averaging 205.8 yards per game and ninth in passing efficiency (122.7).

Arkansas ranks second in the SEC and eighth in the NCAA in sacks, averaging 3.17 per game in 2010. Defensive end Jake Bequette leads the team and is tied for seventh in the SEC with 4.0 this season, while fellow DE Tenarius Wright's 3.0 sacks are tied for 10th in the conference. Jerry Franklin leads the team and is tied for ninth in the SEC with 47 tackles this season. Anthony Leon leads the team and is tied for sixth in the SEC with 8.0 tackles for a loss. He also is third on the team with 2.5 sacks in 2010. Ramon Broadway is tied for fifth in the SEC with six passes defended this season.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ARKANSAS HAS THE BALL

The Rebel defense ranks fourth in the SEC in sacks (17). Jonathan Cornell leads Ole Miss and ranks 10th in the SEC in tackles (7.5 pg). He also is tied for sixth in the league in TFLs (1.33 pg) and 10th for sacks (0.5 pg). Fon Ingram lead the team at Alabama with a career-high 11 tackles (seven solo). Jerrell Powe posted a career-high 1.5 QB sacks in the game. Powe had matched his previous high of 1.0 sack four times in his career.

Ryan Mallett leads the SEC and ranks fifth in the NCAA with 307.3 passing yards per game. His SEC-leading total of 47 completions of 15 yards or more is second in the nation, while his SEC-high 17 completions of 25 yards or more is tied for fourth in the country. Greg Childs is tied for second in the SEC and tied for 20th in the NCAA with five touchdown receptions this season. He also ranks second in the SEC and 20th in the NCAA with 87.8 receiving yards per game. Joe Adams ranks third in the SEC and 17th in the NCAA with his 17.68 yards-per-catch average.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Sophomore placekicker Bryson Rose has started out the 2010 season an outstanding 32-for-34 on kicks. Rose converted on a 22-yard field goal and his only PAT at Alabama and set a career-high with 13 points against Fresno State. He also connected on a career-long 41-yard field goal as part of a perfect day that helped Ole Miss to a road win over Tulane, as he finished 2-for-2 on FGs and 3-for-3 on PATs. Rose rank in the SEC in PAT percentage (1.000/1st), scoring (7.7 ppg/4th) and field goals (1.17 pg/4th).

Freshman Zach Hocker is a perfect 24-for-24 on PATs and 5-of-6 on field goals. In his first SEC game, Hocker made a 48-yard field goal that was the longest for the Razorbacks since 2000. He then matched that with a 48 yarder against Alabama. Alex Tejada has recorded nine touchbacks so far this season, including four in the season opener vs. Tennessee Tech, to put together the fourth-highest total in the SEC. Adams has been the Razorbacks' punt returner all season. He has returned eight punts for 91 yards, an average of 11.4 yards per return.

SERIES/GAME NOTES

Record: ARK, 30-25-1

This game will mark the 57th meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Arkansas dating back to 1908... Ole Miss records show the Rebels trailing the series 26-29-1, while Arkansas' records indicate a 30-25-1 advantage for the Razorbacks... Arkansas claims a forfeit victory in a 1914 game that Ole Miss won 13-7...The two teams met almost yearly from 1937-1969 before the series took a hiatus until 1981... The two schools have played yearly since then, and Ole Miss is 11-17-1 against Arkansas since the series resumed. Arkansas holds a 10-8 edge since it joined the SEC in 1992.

THE COACHES

Les Miles is in his sixth season at LSU with a record of 58-15 (.795) and 10th overall with a record of 86-36 (.705). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gary Crowton and the defensive coordinator is John Chavis.

Gene Chizik is in his second season at Auburn with a record of 14-5 (.737) and in his fourth season overall with a record of 19-24 (.442). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gus Malzahn and the defensive coordinator is Ted Roof.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LSU HAS THE BALL

Stevan Ridley continues to rank among the SEC leaders in rushing with 686 yards and six TDs. Ridley, who leads the SEC in carries with 140, is averaging 98 yards a game and 4.9 yards per carry. Ridley has three 100-yard games to his credit this year and the Tigers won all three of those games. Both Jordan Jefferson and Jarrett Lee have victories over Auburn to their credit – Lee won at Auburn in 2008 as the starting quarterback, while Jefferson led the LSU to a victory over Auburn last year in Tigers Stadium.

Auburn's defense has excelled against the run this season, ranking third in the SEC and 15th nationally in rushing defense, allowing just 101.7 yards per game. Nick Fairley has emerged as a force at defensive tackle for Auburn, leading the SEC in tackles for loss (13.5) and tying for second in sacks (5.0). His 13.5 tackles for loss are tied for fourth most in the country and he has at least one in every game this season. Josh Byrnes led Auburn in tackles last season with 104, and is leading again this season with 42 tackles, including 4.5 tackles for loss.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN AUBURN HAS THE BALL

The Tigers rank third nationally in total defense (242.1), sixth in rushing defense (83.6), eighth in pass defense (158.6) and 11th in scoring defense (14.4), leading the SEC in all but scoring defense. Kelvin Sheppard is second in the SEC in tackles, averaging 9.4 per game. Drake Nevis is third in the league in tackles for loss (11.5) and tied for second with five sacks. Nevis has racked up 9.0 sacks and 30.0 tackles for loss for his career.

Cam Newton leads the SEC and ranks 11th nationally (third among quarterbacks) in rushing (122.9). He has posted four of the top 50 rushing performances in school history. Newton is the only player in school history to rush for at least 170 yards in three straight SEC games, and his four 170-yard games in one season has been matched only by Bo Jackson (1985) in Auburn history. Newton leads the nation with 25 combined touchdowns rushing and passing, which is just one shy of the Auburn single season record. Newton is second in the nation in passing efficiency (180.53) and 11th in total offense (305.4). Auburn has the SEC's top scoring offense.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Patrick Peterson has excelled as a returner, leading the SEC and ranking fourth nationally in punt returns (21.1), including two touchdowns, and ranking second in the league in kickoff returns (28.2). Josh Jasper is the LSU career leader in field goal percentage having drilled 84.2 percent of his field goals.

Wes Byrum is just four points away from becoming Auburn's all-time leading scorer. He currently ranks second with 309 career points. Onterio McCalebb returned a kickoff 99 yards against Arkansas. Junior Quindarius Carr has averaged 6.8 yards per punt return, which is eighth in the league.

Neil Callaway is in his fourth season at UAB and overall with a record of 13-29 (.236). The Blazers' offensive coordinator is Kim Helton and the defensive coordinator is Eric Schumann.

Dan Mullen is in his second season at MSU and overall with a record of 10-9 (.526). Les Koenning serves as the offensive coordinator and the co-defensive coordinators are Manny Diaz and Chris Wilson.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN UAB HAS THE BALL

WR Frantrell Forrest is No. 3 on the UAB career list for receptions (150), receiving yards (2,021) and receiving touchdowns (20). He had seven catches for 99 yards and two touchdowns last Saturday in the win over UTEP. QB Bryan Ellis has passed for 1,154 yards and eight touchdowns in the past four games. He was named Conference USA Offensive Player-of-the-Week in back-to-back weeks following his 360-yards/3 TD pass performance vs. Troy (Sept. 18) and his 373 yards/1 TD pass effort vs. Tennessee on Sept. 25. Pat Shed has 317 yards rushing and is averaging over six yards per carry (6.5 avg.). He ranks No. 37 in the nation in all-purpose yards average (130.3).

State ranks 13 nationally in scoring defense (16.0 points per game allowed) and 117th in tackles for loss (7.43 per game). Through seven games, State has allowed only eight touchdowns in 23 times the ball has reached inside its 20 yard line. Chris White posted 11 total tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks as the Bulldog defense held Florida to its lowest point total in five years. Corey Broomfield is tied for the national lead among active players with three career pick-sixes and the total has set the Mississippi State school record. It's also tied for second most in the history of the SEC midway through his sophomore season.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN MISSISSIPPI STATE HAS THE BALL

Bryant Turner has recorded eight tackles for loss, including five sacks. Turner is tied for No. 21 nationally and is tied for third in Conference USA in sacks. He is No. 7 all-time at UAB in sacks with 16. When UAB beat UTEP 21-6 last Saturday, the defensive effort represented the first time since the 2008 season finale at UCF that the Blazers did not allow an opponent to score a touchdown.

Over the past three weeks, the Mississippi State running game has accounted for 851 yards and 10 touchdowns. The Bulldogs are averaging over 280 yards per contest in those three games - all victories. Vick Ballard has already scored 12 touchdowns. Ballard had scored at least one touchdown in each game prior to last weekend, and he remains tied for the SEC lead with both a total of 72 points and 12 touchdowns scored. Derek Sherrod has been named SEC offensive lineman of the week twice in the last month.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Trey Ragland has punted 26 times for a 44.5 yards per kick average (No. 21 nationally) over UAB's first six games. Ragland is second in Conference USA with that average and the Blazers are No. 8 in the country as a team in net punting with a 40.88 yards per punt average.

Mississippi State punter Heath Hutchins may not be leading the nation in punting yards, but the senior has punted 27 times and allowed only 15 return yards. After dropping 11 punts inside the 20 a year ago, Hutchins has already pinned opponents deep in their own territory 12 times this season. State ranks 33rd nationally and fourth in the SEC in net punting.

With a win over #22 Florida last weekend, Mississippi State jumped into both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls at #24 this week... It marks the first time since Sept. 21, 2001 that State is ranked in either poll...Mississippi State has not posted an undefeated non-conference schedule since winning three out of three league games in 2000...The Bulldogs haven't won four non-conference, regular season games since 1990.

THE COACHES

Steve Spurrier is in his sixth season at South Carolina with a record of 39-30 (.565) and in his 26th season overall with a record of 228-111-2 (.669). Spurrier serves as the

Gamecocks' offensive coordinator and the defensive coordinator is Lorenzo Ward.

Robbie Caldwell is in his first season at Vanderbilt and overall. The Commodores' offensive coordinator is Jimmy Kiser and the defensive coordinator is Jamie Bryant.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN SOUTH CAROLINA HAS THE BALL

Alshon Jeffery leads the SEC and is third in the nation in receiving yards per game, averaging 115.0 yards per contest. He also leads the league with 6.7 catches per game. Jeffery needs 113 receiving yards to move into the all-time top-10 in career yardage at South Carolina. Stephen Garcia became just the sixth player in South Carolina history to surpass the 5,000-yard career passing mark with a career-high 382 yards at Kentucky. His effort vs. the Wildcats was the eighth-best passing yardage game in Carolina history. Marcus Lattimore is on pace to become South Carolina's all-time leader in single-season touchdowns. He has scored 12 times; the single-season record is 16.

Chris Marve is trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn achieved the feat in 1998-2000. Junior cornerback Casey Hayward shares SEC lead with four interceptions and tops the conference with eight defended passes. Facing Georgia and its standout WR A.J. Green, Hayward was credited with nine tackles and a defended pass for the defense. Sean Richardson is SEC's seventh leading tackler (8.2 per game).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN VANDERBILT HAS THE BALL

The Gamecocks lead the Southeastern Conference and are ranked No. 2 in the nation with 22 sacks (3.67 per game). The SC defense has allowed 16 scores in 24 tries by opposing offenses (66.7%), with only eight touchdowns. That number leads the SEC and ranks ninth in the nation. DE Devin Taylor and DE Melvin Ingram each have 4.5 sacks while DT Travian Robertson has 3.0 and LB Rodney Paulk has 2.5.

For the second time this season, an SEC opponent limited the Commodores to less than 150 yards of total offense last week. Vanderbilt managed just 140 total yards. Earlier, LSU held the Commodore offense to 135 total yards. Barden tops team in catches (18) and receiving yards (180). Warren Norman had 188 all-purpose yards vs. Georgia.

Norman also leads Vanderbilt in rushing yards (58.3 ypg). Just a sophomore, Norman tops all Commodores with 1,139 career rushing yards and seven rushing TDs. DeVonte Holloman leads the team with 40 tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Through six games, Spencer Lanning has punted 19 times for an average of 45.6 yards per punt; however, he has not punted enough to qualify for the national rankings. He is second in the SEC in that category. He is also 4-for-5 on field goal attempts on the season.

Norman continues to move up Vanderbilt all-time kickoff return charts. Norman, who had 155 yards on eight returns at Georgia, moved up three positions to No. 6 all-time on the list. He is averaging 25.4 yards per return this year, ranking sixth in the SEC and 44th in the NCAA. Norman is now averaging 26.0 yards per kickoff for his career. In 2009, he set a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2 yard average.

Nick Saban is in his fourth season at Alabama with a record of 39-9 (.813) and 17th overall with a record of 145-68-1 (.680). The Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator is Jim McElwain and the defensive coordinator is Kirby Smart.

Derek Dooley is in his first season at Tennessee and in his fourth season overall with a record of 19-24 (.442). The Volunteers' offensive coordinator is Jim Chaney and the defensive coordinator is Justin Wilcox.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ALABAMA HAS THE BALL

Mark Ingram rushed for 60 yards on 15 carries against Mississippi, moved him up the Alabama career rushing yards chart and is in fourth place with 2,842 yards in his career. He has only lost one fumble in 485 career rushing attempts, 51 career receptions and one kickoff return for a total of 537 career touches. Julio Jones has caught 33 passes for 448 yards and three touchdowns in seven games in 2010, averaging 13.6 yards per catch. Greg McElroy has completed 71.6 percent of his passes for 1,517 yards, 11 touchdowns and three interceptions while ranking sixth nationally in passing efficiency at 168.97.

Tennessee is tied for 5th in the SEC in turnover margin at +1. Chris Walker leads the front four with 28 tackles (2.0 for loss) this season and is second on the team with four quarterback hurries. Gerald Williams leads the squad with 2.5 sacks and is tied for the team lead with 4 tackles for loss. Nick Reveiz is tied for 4th in the SEC with a career-high 54 tackles. Prentiss Waggner leads the team with two interceptions, both returned for TDs. Janzen Jackson ranks third on the team with 32 tackles.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL

The Crimson Tide has not allowed a 100-yard rusher in an astonishing 41 games, dating back to Oct. 13, 2007. Robert Lester now has four interceptions this season to rank tied for second in the SEC and rank tied for ninth nationally at .57 per game. Fellow sophomore Dre Kirkpatrick is close behind with three picks on the season to rank tied for 35th nationally and tied for fourth in the SEC at .43 per game. As a team, Alabama is tied for the SEC lead with 13 interceptions. Dont'a Hightower has 36 tackles, two pass breakups and five quarterback hurries in 2010. Mark Barron leads the team with 47 tackles.

Justin Hunter ranks second on the team with 236 receiving yards and two touchdowns, and is averaging 23.6 yards per catch (10 receptions). Matt Simms ranks sixth in the SEC in passing yards per game at 189.3. Tauren Poole stands seventh in the SEC with a 79.7-yard rushing average. Poole is tied with Denarius Moore for the team lead with five touchdowns. Denarius Moore leads the team with 18 receptions, 257 yards, and four receiving TDs (five overall).

SPECIAL TEAMS

Trent Richardson's 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on Sept. 18 at Duke did not make the Alabama all-time top-10 list for longest kickoff returns, but it did mark the first Crimson Tide kickoff return for a touchdown since a 100-yard return for a score by Tyrone Prothro on October 10, 2004. Richardson is third in the SEC and ranks 21st nationally in kickoff returns this season with a 27.80 ypr average.

Michael Palardy has served as the placekicker the last two games. He is 4-for-4 on PAT's and missed his only field goal attempt (45 yards at LSU). Palardy also punted once for 51 yards at LSU, his first collegiate attempt. He has also handled kickoff duties in four games. Chad Cunningham punted five times for a 44.0-yard avg. at Georgia after a season-best 47.5-yard average on four punts at LSU, with two of 50-plus yards and two downed inside the 20-yard line. His 43.0-yard average ranks 7th in the SEC.

Mark Richt is in his 10th season at Georgia and overall with a record of 93-31 (.750). The Bulldogs' offensive coordinator is Mike Bobo and Todd Grantham serves as the defensive coordinator.

Joker Phillips is in his first season at Kentucky and overall. The Wildcats' offensive coordinator is Randy Sanders and the defensive coordinator is Steve Brown.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN GEORGIA HAS THE BALL

A.J. Murray scorched the Commodore defense for a career-high 287 yards and two touchdowns. His passing efficiency has steadily risen for four straight games, peaking with a 190.4 mark against VU. With 18 career touchdown catches, A.J. Green ranks fourth in Bulldog history. Green managed another touchdown versus the Commodores on three catches. In his first start since MSU, sophomore TB Washaun Ealey exploded for the second 100-yard game of his career after registering 123 yards on 17 carries and a touchdown against Vanderbilt. Kris Durham was the leading receiver in each of the first three games and is the team leader in 2010. He has 22 catches for 453 yards and two touchdowns on the year.

UK leads the SEC in pass defense, limiting the opponent to just 153.2 yards per game in the air. Danny Trevathan is having an impressive season as he paces the defense with a league-leading 70 tackles. He has posted double-figure tackles in four games this season, including three in a row. He also ranks fifth in the league in the tackles for loss category with nine TFL. Winston Guy is second on the team in tackles with 46 stops and has played consistently with at least four tackles each game, including a season-high 10 vs. South Carolina. Ricky Lumpkin has 3.5 tackles for loss in the first seven games, including a quarterback sack, and also has been credited with a quarterback hurry.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN KENTUCKY HAS THE BALL

Justin Houston remains the SEC leader with 6.5. Houston is also fourth in the conference in tackles for loss (11). He exploded for a career-high 10 tackles, including two sacks, and forced a fumble against South Carolina. Houston tallied five tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss in the victory over the Volunteers to go along with seven QB hurries. Akeem Dent has registered 10 or more tackles in three out of the last four games and has led Georgia in tackles during all four of those contests. He tied his career high with 12 tackles against the Volunteers (previous career high came against Colorado) and is tied for fourth in the league with 62 stops.

Mike Hartline is coming off one of his finest performances as a Wildcat as he set a career high for TD passes (four), passing yards (349) and completions (32) against USC. He currently ranks second in the SEC in passing yards per game (255.9) and is fourth in total offense (257.1 yards per game). Randall Cobb became UK's leader in career touchdowns last week. Cobb now has 33 TDs in just 30 career games. Chris Matthews has an SEC-high six TD catches this season. Chris Matthews had 12 catches for 177 yards against South Carolina, both career highs.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Blair Walsh has also hit at least one FG in 15 straight games and 29 games in his career. Walsh is now 13-for-15 on FGs for the year and 48-for-60 in his career. So far in 2010, Drew Butler has averaged 45.0 yards on 30 punts, nine that went for 50+.

Punter Ryan Tydlacka was named SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against South Carolina. Tydlacka averaged 41.5 yards per punt with three punts inside the 20. Joe Mansour has handled most of the kickoffs this season. He now has a league-leading 14 touchbacks this season. Cobb is a capable punt returner and ranks fourth in the SEC in punt return average with 9.8 yards per runback. He has two punt return touchdowns in his career.

The Georgia-Kentucky series began in 1939, and the Bulldogs hold a 49-12-2 edge... The Wildcats' 12th win in the series came in Athens in 2009 as Kentucky edged Georgia 34-27... The Bulldogs took a 20-6 lead going into the second half, but Kentucky exploded for four touchdowns in the second half and Georgia turned it over four times... Tight end Orson Charles had a career day in his first year with the Bulldogs after snagging four catches for 73 yards and a touchdown... Quarterback Joe Cox led Georgia's passing attack with 291 yards and three touchdowns, although completing only 12 of 30 attempts... This was only the third time in 19 seasons that Kentucky posted a victory against the Bulldogs.
