• The SEC has national-best six teams ranked in this week's Associated Press, USA Today, Harris Interactive and BCS rankings.

• The SEC has a 36-5 non-conference record this season. The 87.8 win percentage is tops in the nation.

Since 2006, the SEC is 196-37 in regular season non-conference games, an 84.1 win percentage.

• In 72 home dates this season, SEC games have drawn 5,561,446 fans, an average of 77,242 per game. There have been 41 sellouts and an average capacity of 98.63 percent.

* - After 11 weeks, SEC teams have scored 449 offensive TDs and 150 field goals. That equates to 75.0 percent of all offensive scores coming from TDs and 25.0 percent from field goals. It is the lowest percentage of field goals in a single-season in the SEC since 2001, when SEC teams accounted for 143 field goals (24.0 percent) and 452 offensive TDs (76.0 percent).

THE TEAMS: South Carolina (7-3, 5-3 SEC) is the Eastern Division Champion and the home team. Auburn (11-0, 7-0 SEC) is the Western Division Champion and the visiting team.

NATIONAL RANKINGS: Currently, Auburn is ranked second in the nation in the all four major polls and rankings (Associated Press, USA Today Coaches, Harris Interactive and BCS Rankings) while South Carolina is 17th in the four major polls and rankings.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME: The game, which started in 1992, is in its 19th year. It was a result of conference expansion, which saw Arkansas and South Carolina become the first members added in SEC history. Almost 1.3 million fans have witnessed the pageantry of the game first-hand, with 15 sellouts in its history. The first two games were played at Legion Field in Birmingham and the game has been played at the Georgia Dome since (1994).

SEC CHAMPIONS: Auburn will be vying for its seventh SEC Championship and first since 2004. South Carolina is attempting to win its first SEC football championship. The Tigers' Gene Chizik has never won an SEC title while the Gamecocks' Steve Spurrier won six SEC titles while the head coach at Florida (1991-93-94-95-96-2000).

TELEVISION: CBS Sports will televise the game nationally for the ninth straight year (VERNE LUNDQUIST, Play-by-Play; GARY DANIELSON, Analyst; TRACY WOLFSON, Sidelines).

RADIO: Managed by IMG College, the SEC Radio Network will broadcast the game to the 9-state SEC region and around the nation on the Westwood One Radio Network (SEC Radio Network: DAVE NEAL, Play-by-Play; DAVE ARCHER, Analyst; DAVE BAKER, Sidelines / Westwood One Radio: JOHN TAUTGES, Play-by-Play; TERRY DONAHUE, Analyst).

SERIES: Auburn leads the series, 7-1-1. The teams met earlier this year (Sept. 25 at Auburn), with the Tigers claiming a 35-27 win. The teams first met on Nov. 27, 1930 in Columbus, Ga., with Auburn winning, 25-7. Here is a listing of the nine meetings in the series:

IN THE SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME: This marks Auburn's fourth appearance in the contest while South Carolina is in the game for the first time. The Tigers are 1-2 in its previous visits to Atlanta. The Tigers lost to Tennessee, 30-29, in the 1997 game; lost to Florida, 28-6, in the 2000 game; and, defeated Tennessee, 38-28, in the 2004 game.

The last time a team made its first trip to the SEC Championship Game was 2002. In a team's first trip to the title game, that team is 4-4 in the contest. Alabama (1992), Georgia (2002), LSU (2001) and Tennessee (1997) won its first appearances in the SEC game while Arkansas (1995), Auburn (1997), Florida (1992) and Mississippi State (1998) lost its first appearances in the game.

LAST MEETING: Auburn defeated South Carolina, 35-27, on Sept. 25, 2010 at Auburn. The game was the fourth of the season for both teams. With the win, Auburn improved to 4-0 while South Carolina fell to 3-1. Cam Newton led Auburn with 176 rushing yards on 25 carries and three touchdowns while also completing 16-of-21 passes for 158 yards and two touchdowns. He was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week. Auburn DT Mike Blanc was named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week with seven tackles, a fumble recovery and a pass deflection. The Tigers held Carolina to just 79 yards rushing. Gamecock WR Alshon Jeffery caught eight passes for 192 yards and two touchdowns.

Carolina raced out to a 20-7 first-half lead before Newton sored his second rushing TD of the game on a three-yard run just before half to close the halftime gap to 20-14. The two teams traded touchdowns in the third quarter before Auburn went ahead for good, 28-27, early in the fourth quarter on a 7-yard TD pass from Newton to TE Philip Lutzenkirchen. Newton connected again with Emory Blake on a 12-yard TD pass midway through the quarter to make the final margin, 35-27.

RECENT HISTORY: Since 2001, Auburn has the SEC's fourth best overall record at 90-34 (.726) while South Carolina has the league's eighth best mark at 67-53 (.558). Since 2006, Auburn has the league's fourth best overall record at 44-18 (.710) while Carolina has the league's seventh best mark at 35-26 (.574).

BOWLING: The winner of the SEC Championship Game receives the conference's automatic berth in the Bowl Championship Series. Auburn will be looking to get into a BCS bowl for the second time (def. Virginia Tech, 16-13, in 2005 Sugar Bowl) while Carolina has never been in a BCS bowl game. Auburn is 20-13-2 in post-season bowl games and looking for a second consecutive bowl trip. South Carolina is 4-11 in post-season bowl games and looking for its third consecutive post-season bowl trip.

SEC SCORING TOUCHDOWNS IN BUNCHES

After 11 weeks, SEC teams have scored 449 offensive touchdowns and 150 field goals. That equates to 75.0 percent of all offensive scores coming from touchdowns and 25.0 percent from field goals. It is the lowest percentage of field goals in a single-season in the SEC since 2001, when SEC teams accounted for 143 field goals (24.0 percent) and 452 offensive touchdowns (76.0 percent).

SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

The head coach may challenge the ruling of any reviewable play. He retains a challenge if his initial challenge is successful and thus results in a reversal by the replay official. The head coach will then have a single challenge that he may use anytime during the game if his team has not used all its timeouts. Thus a team may have a total of two challenges in the game, but only if the first results in a reversal of the on-field ruling.

THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference has used instant replay since 2005.

THE PLAYS

Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
 - a. Scoring Plays, including the ball in possession of a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
 - b. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
 - c. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds
2. Passing Plays:
 - a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
 - b. Touching of a forward pass by a player or an official
 - c. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
 - d. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
 - e. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
 - f. Quarterback (Passer) starts arm forward, ball comes loose and play is ruled incomplete (if ball is quickly recovered)
 - g. Quarterback (Passer) throws incomplete swing pass that is close to being forward or backward, and pass is ruled forward (if ball is quickly recovered)
3. Miscellaneous:
 - a. Runner ruled not down.
 - b. Runner ruled down (when ball carrier is judged down by rule and the ball is fumbled, play may be reviewed if recovery of ball occurs in the immediate action following fumble and is prior to any official signaling ball is dead. Also reviewable when runner is ruled out of bounds near goal line.)
 - c. Forward progress with respect to first down
 - d. Touching of a kick
 - e. Number of players on field
 - f. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with reviewed plays)
 - g. Fourth-down/try fumble plays
 - h. Field Goal Attempts (only when ball is ruled below or above the crossbar, inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights.)
 - i. The game clock expires at the end of a half. If at the end of the game, the time may be restored to the clock only if the score is tied or the team that would next snap the ball trails by eight points or fewer.

THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with the HD Instant Replay system provided by XOS Digital. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official and the Communicator are selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live HD video feed is sent directly to the replay booth from the TV truck. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while recording it into the XOS Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play while the Communicator marks all incoming replays.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Replay Technician. As the Technician and the Communicator mark the incoming video, each view will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Replay Technician can touch the thumbnail and immediately send that play or replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a jog shuttle remote controlled by the Replay Official. All video is viewed on an HD monitor that sits in front of the Replay Official. The touch screen is only used to select the replays and to log specific play data in the event a call is overturned.

While all plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the HD Replay System developed by XOS Digital of Orlando, FL. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from XOS Digital.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL NOTES

A PRIMER FOR NCAA RULES FOR FOOTBALL SAFETY [From NCAA.com]

For years, the NCAA has been at the forefront of student-athlete safety and implemented initiatives to make competition as safe as possible. Rules changes have expanded beyond the traditional notion of helmet-to-helmet contact and added a focus on all hits targeting and contacting defenseless players above the shoulders.

“The health and safety of student-athletes is the reason the NCAA was created,” said NCAA President Mark Emmert. “We have to remain vigilant to that mission, and these types of injuries require our careful attention.”

Rogers Redding, football rules secretary-rules editor and Southeastern Conference Coordinator of Football Officials, noted that the NCAA Football Rules Committee continually reviews player safety and has implemented rules to remove the word intent from head-down contact, penalize the horse-collar tackle, eliminate wedge-blocking and strengthen penalties regarding the tackling of defenseless players.

“Student-athlete safety is of the utmost importance, and the Association will continue to protect its student-athletes,” Redding said.

Football student-athletes who target the head and neck area of defenseless players will continue to be penalized for initial contact with a forearm, elbow, shoulder or helmet. A 15-yard penalty is enforced on these violations. In egregious situations, officials may eject the offending player. Last season, five Division I football student-athletes were ejected from games for these violations.

Following the rules change in 2009 requiring conferences to further examine these fouls after games, 73 plays were reviewed, resulting in four suspensions from games. In addition, some conferences sent letters of reprimand to coaches and student-athletes following post-game reviews.

“We believe the committee’s decision has helped to reduce the unnecessary roughness penalties involving hits to the head,” said David Parry, national coordinator of football officials. “We have seen a decline in them.”

Rules changes for the 2010 season mandate that injured student-athletes, including those who exhibit signs of a concussion, must be cleared by appropriate medical personnel as determined by the institution before returning to competition. An injured player must also miss a play before he is allowed to take part in the game again. Previously, a player could return to action before the next play if a timeout was called.

Receiving teams are no longer allowed to have wedge-blocking formations of three or more players on kickoffs. (NCAA research showed that one of every five injuries that occur on kickoffs resulted in a concussion.) Two-player wedges remain legal, but the formation of three or more players in a wedge is now a foul that results in a 15-yard penalty. It also will be considered a live-ball foul, regardless of whether there is contact between opponents.

The NCAA’s health and safety needs are addressed through the collaborative efforts of national office staff, governance committees, sports rules committees, sports issues committees and external associations. The NCAA Football Rules Committee works closely with the NCAA Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspects of Sports and other medical experts.

NCAA football rules changes timeline

1976 – Rule changes for the 1976 football season eliminate the head and face as a primary and initial contact area for blocking and tackling.

2002 – The NCAA Football Rules Committee adds specific language to define when a student-athlete is defenseless and adds a point of emphasis for protection of these players.

2005 – The NCAA Football Rules Committee changes college football rules regarding spearing and head-down contact, removing any reference to “intent” from the rule. In addition to the rule change, the NCAA focuses on the education of student-athletes, coaches, officials and administrators regarding prevention of head and neck injuries. The NCAA partners with several membership groups (coaches, athletic trainers, etc.) to produce educational materials to teach proper tackling technique and prevention of head contact.

2008 – The NCAA makes the horse-collar tackle illegal, revamps illegal contact of an opponent and simplifies the chop-block rule. More emphasis is placed on eliminating hits on defenseless players and blows to the head. No player is permitted to initiate contact and target an opponent with the crown

of his helmet, and no player is permitted to initiate contact and target a defenseless opponent above the shoulders.

2009 – A rule is added to require conference review of fouls related to targeting/initiating contact to players. If a foul is not called, conferences are allowed to review plays and impose sanctions. As a result, several conferences enforce suspensions on fouls using supplementary discipline.

2010 – Wedge blocking is eliminated and specific concussion and injury management rules are implemented. Injured student-athletes must be cleared by appropriate medical personnel (as determined by the institution) before returning to competition. The committee also clarifies that contact above the shoulders with any body part is a violation (e.g., forearm, shoulder, etc.). The committee took advantage of the two-year playing rules process that allowed for safety alterations in the non-change year.

SEC - AP POLL HISTORY

The Southeastern Conference has had at least five teams ranked in at least one AP Top 25 poll every year since expansion (1992).

Since 1992, the SEC has had at least 5 teams ranked in the AP Top 25 a total of 223 times, an average of 11.7 times per year. Since 1992, the SEC has had at least 5 teams ranked for at least 10 weeks in 15 of the last 19 years.

The SEC has had seven teams ranked in the AP Top 25 poll eight times since 1992, including this week. The league has also had seven teams ranked three weeks in 1999 and 2007 and one other week this season. Here is a history of multiple teams from the SEC in the AP Top 25 poll.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL NOTES

SEC - FOUR STRAIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

• Alabama's 37-21 win over Texas in the 2010 BCS National Championship Game gave the Southeastern Conference its fourth straight BCS National Championship and its sixth BCS title overall. The SEC is now 6-0 in BCS National Championship Games (LSU 2-0, Florida 2-0, Alabama 1-0, Tennessee 1-0).

• Alabama is the fourth SEC team to win a BCS National Championship and the third different SEC team to win it during the last four seasons. Tennessee won the BCS' first national title in 1998, LSU won the crown in 2003, Florida's claimed the national championship in 2006 and 2008 while LSU took the title in 2007 and Alabama claimed the national title this past season. The Big 12 has two BCS national titles followed by the ACC, Big Ten, Pac-10 and Big East with one each.

• The SEC is the first conference to claim four consecutive Associated Press (first poll - 1936), National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame (first poll - 1959), Football Writers Association of America (first poll - 1954) and USA Today or UPI Coaches Poll (first poll - 1950) national championships.

• Since SEC expansion in 1992, the SEC has the most national championships (AP, USA Today) with eight. During that time, the SEC has had more teams with national titles than any other conference (4). Here is a breakdown:

- SEC - Florida (2008, 2006, 1996), LSU (2003, 2007), Tennessee (1998), Alabama (1992, 2009)
- Big 12 - Texas (2005), Oklahoma (2000), Nebraska (1994, 1995, 1997)
- Big Ten - Ohio State (2002), Michigan (1997)
- Pac-10 - Southern California (2004, 2003)
- ACC - Florida State (1999, 1993)
- Big East - Miami, Fla. (2001)

SEC IN BOWL GAMES

• The SEC has the most wins (14) and the highest winning percentage of any conference that has three-or-more appearances in BCS bowl games. The SEC is 14-5 in BCS games (.737 percentage).

• Since conference expansion in 1992, the SEC has won at least five bowl games in nine of 18 seasons. The SEC has won at least six bowl games during the last four seasons (6-3 in 2006; 7-2 in 2007; 6-2 in 2008; 6-4 in 2009).

• The schools that currently comprise the SEC have appeared in 379 bowls (including 2009-10). That is by far the most of any conference in the nation. In its history, the SEC is 196-170-13 in post-season bowl games, a 53.4 winning percentage. The SEC has the nation's top bowl winning percentage surpassing the Pac-10 (120-107-6, 52.8 percentage). Below is a look at how the various conferences have fared in bowl games in its history (using 2009 conference alignments):

MISCELLANY

• Since 2000, the Southeastern Conference has had more teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Poll than any other conference. The SEC has had 43 teams ranked in the last nine final USA Today Coaches polls, an average of almost five per season. The Big 12 is second with 36 teams ranked since 2000. The SEC has led or tied for lead in most teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Polls in seven of the last nine seasons.

• For the 10th straight year, the SEC has led the nation in total number of former players on NFL opening weekend rosters. The SEC has 272 of its former players on NFL opening weekend rosters followed by the ACC with 228, the Big Ten at 217, the Big 12 at 184 and the Pac-10 at 180. LSU leads all SEC schools with 35, followed by Florida, Georgia and Tennessee with 33 each.

• The SEC had 49 players selected in the 2010 NFL Draft. The number represents the most SEC players ever taken in the NFL Draft. The SEC had the most players taken among conferences in the draft. Behind the SEC's 49 selections were the Big Ten (34), ACC (31), Big 12 (30) and Pac-10 (29).

• Since 1990, the SEC has had 782 total selections in the NFL Draft, an average of 37.2 selections per year. The Big Ten is second with 672 selections.

• The SEC has now led or tied for the most selections in the NFL Draft for 11 of the last 13 seasons and the last four drafts.

SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send nine of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2010 season.

The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One Bowl has the second selection, making its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The AT&T Cotton and the Outback Bowls share the third and fourth selections from the SEC. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference.

The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the fifth selection of preference from the SEC.

New to the SEC bowl rotation this year, the Gator Bowl has the sixth selection from the SEC.

The Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl has the seventh selection from the SEC.

In selections 8-9, the AutoZone Liberty and Birmingham Bowls share the selection over the four-year agreement.

2010 BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCHEDULE

Following the 2010 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the Discover Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose Bowl Game, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Tostitos BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

ESPN will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

SEC FOOTBALL ON TELEVISION

CBS SPORTS

CBS Sports continues to be the exclusive national network broadcaster of SEC home football games, including the SEC Championship Game. CBS Sports will showcase the top conference matchups each week of the package with the "SEC Game of the Week". The agreement also includes a prime time game and doubleheader opportunities. In addition, CBS Sports continues its coverage of SEC regular-season basketball. In addition to the broadcast rights on CBS Sports, this 15-year contract includes certain digital, internet, wireless, Video-on-Demand, data and enhanced highlight rights across all CBS platforms, including CBS College Sports Network and CBSsports.com. Also, simulcasts of CBS Sports games will be available for distribution by the CBS College Sports Network.

ESPN

ESPN is the exclusive national cable home and the syndication rights holder for the SEC, including every SEC home football game (excluding those on the network broadcast package).

ESPN and ESPN2: The networks have increased coverage by combining to televise a minimum of 20 SEC games annually, including Saturday night and two primetime Thursday matchups.

ESPNU: The 24-hour college sports network presents an SEC Game of the Week (generally in primetime and a minimum of 13 games annually) as well as the studio show *SEC Weekly*.

SEC Network (ESPN Regional Television): The nation's largest syndicator of collegiate sports programming, is the official over-the-air syndication home for the SEC and will feature an SEC Game of the Week (generally at noon ET), with a minimum of 13 games each season throughout the SEC footprint and beyond. In addition, ERT produces the integrated SEC Studio show, hosted by Dari Nowkhah, with analyst Matt Stinchcomb, a former University of Georgia and NFL standout.

ESPN360.com: Simulcasts of SEC game telecasts are offered on the broadband sports network.

ESPN Mobile TV: Live games are simulcast on mobile phones.

ESPN International: The agreement includes global rights to present live games and encore presentations.

ESPN Deportes: ESPN holds domestic Spanish-language rights for SEC football on the 24-hour, U.S.-based network.

ESPN GamePlan: The out-of-market college football pay-per-view service, offers SEC action.

ESPN Classic: The network may telecast select SEC live games as well as historic and immediate encore presentations.

ESPN.com: Extensive SEC content, including highlights, will be presented online.

COMCAST/ CHARTER SPORTS SOUTHEAST

Comcast / Charter Sports Southeast (CSS), the regional sports channel focusing on college sports in the southeast, has an agreement with ESPN to televise live Southeastern Conference (SEC) content including a minimum of six football games, twenty men's basketball games, and sixteen women's basketball games as well as fifty SEC Olympic sports each year. The agreement began with the 2009-10 academic year and goes for five years.

FOX SPORTS NET

Fox Sports Net's (FSN) regional sports networks serving the SEC territory – FOX Sports South, FOX Sports Carolinas, FOX Sports Tennessee, Sun Sports, FOX Sports Southwest and FOX Sports Houston – will be the outlets for a minimum of 92 SEC athletic events each year. Events will include eight live, exclusive football games, 20 men's basketball games, 24 women's basketball games (16 regular season, eight tournament), 16 baseball games (10 regular season, six tournament) and 24 additional Olympic sporting events (softball, volleyball, soccer, gymnastics). SEC athletic events on FSN will be distributed to more than 22 million cable and satellite households throughout the SEC territory.

INSTITUTIONAL MEDIA PACKAGES

As part of the SEC's television contracts, each conference institution was able to maintain a contractual television arrangement of its own. As part of this arrangement, each SEC institution has the ability to televise one pay-per-view football game per year as well as to host its own tape-delayed game package, coaches' TV shows as well as other sport packages.

SEC FOOTBALL SHOWS ON TELEVISION**SEC Weekly on ESPNU**

SEC Weekly, a one-hour program airs Wednesdays at 5 p.m. ET on ESPNU, throughout the academic year and will cover SEC sports, including sport-by-sport previews, reviews, specials and features on student-athletes. The show is hosted by Cara Capuano with analyst Matt Stinchcomb, a former University of Georgia All-America and NFL player. *SEC Weekly* is a product of ESPN's landmark 15-year agreement with the Southeastern Conference. ESPNU will complement the show with SEC game telecasts, including football, basketball, Olympic sports and select conference championships.

SEC Gridiron Live

SEC Gridiron LIVE, airing live every Wednesday at 10 p.m. ET, breaks down every SEC game with footage, interviews and analysis. Tim Couch, former Kentucky standout and top pick in the 1999 NFL Draft, joins the live, weekly one-hour show as an analyst, with host Charles Davis and analyst Randy Cross. Also new to the SEC Gridiron LIVE team is social media host Kristina Akra. SECGridironLIVE.com is the hub for the show's social networking component, allowing viewers to participate in the live show and interact instantaneously with the broadcast team and SEC fans across the country.

CBS College Sports SEC Tailgate

Beginning Sept. 18, CBS Sports will start SEC programming with its live pre-game show COLLEGE FOOTBALL TODAY followed by the "SEC Game of the Week" CBS College Sports Network will broadcast SEC TAILGATE on select Saturdays at 2:00 PM, ET, from the site of CBS Sports' SEC Game of the Week. The show brings fans a fast paced and authoritative look at football and life in the SEC. The show captures all the excitement, traditions and festivities from the various campuses and stadiums across the SEC, and features local SEC legends and celebrity alumni.

SEC MISSION STATEMENT

"The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

THE SEC

The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports – 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

2009-10 ANOTHER BANNER ATHLETIC YEAR FOR THE SEC

The SEC claimed four national championships in the 2009-10 year. SEC teams have won at least four national titles every year since 1991. In eight of its 20 sponsored sports, the SEC had either the national champion or the national runners-up. The SEC had national championships in football (Alabama), men's indoor track & field (Florida), women's swimming & diving (Florida) and baseball (South Carolina).

In its 77 year history, the Southeastern Conference has won 183 team national championships, including 67 since 2000. In this decade, the SEC has won at least one national championship in 16 of its 20 sponsored sports with the exception of women's cross country, volleyball, soccer and softball.

SEC LEADS ALL CONFERENCES IN 2009-10 OVERALL SPORTS CONFERENCE VS. CONFERENCE SURVEY

In a statistical survey that is based on NCAA championship and rankings, the Southeastern Conference placed first in both men's and women's sports. The survey, compiled each year since 1986 by Bo Carter, takes into account final NCAA championship standings in 10 men's and 11 women's sports and poll rankings in football. Each conference gets 20 points for a team that wins a national championship, 19 for a second place finish and down to 1 point for a 20th place finish. Wrestling is included in the men's totals, but the sport is not sponsored by the Southeastern Conference.

In the 10 men's sports for the survey, the SEC had 398 points with the Pac-10 coming in second with 396 points, followed by the Big 12 with 395 points, Big Ten with 279.5 points, ACC with 238 points and the Big East with 83 points. In the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors, the SEC led the way with 502.5 points followed by the Pac-10 with 480 points, the Big 12 with 382 points, ACC with 369 points, Big Ten with 221 points and the Big East with 164 points.

Combining the 21 sports in the survey, the SEC had 900.5 points to pace all conferences followed by the Pac-10 with 876 points, Big 12 with 777 points, ACC with 607 points, Big Ten with 500.5 points and the Big East with 247 points. The SEC has had the highest men's point total in 17 seasons since 1986-87, the first year this survey was done, and in 11 of the last 12 seasons. The SEC has had the highest women's point total five times since 1986-87, including three of the last six years.

SEC LEADS DIVISION I CONFERENCES IN MOST FIRST-TEAM ESPN THE MAGAZINE CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

The Southeastern Conference had 15 of its student-athletes earn first-team ESPN The Magazine / CoSIDA Academic All-America status in 2009-10, more than any other Division I conference in the nation. The Big 12 had 14 while the Big Ten and Pac-10 had 13 student-athletes each earn the honor.

The SEC had 36 total student-athletes earn either first, second or third team mention. That total is second overall to the Big 12 Conference, which had 39. The Big Ten was third with 34 total student-athletes earned first, second or third team mention.

The SEC's academic success of its student-athletes in 2009-10 was not just Academic All-Americans. The league honored 2,424 of its own student-athletes who made the SEC Academic Honor Roll. The league also honored Auburn swimmer Jordan Anderson and Tennessee track & field athlete Phoebe Wright with its McWhorter Scholar-Athletes of the Year as well as naming a scholar-athlete of the year in each of its sports.

Among honors given by the NCAA, SEC student-athletes also shined. Three student-athletes from the SEC – Florida's Tim Tebow (football), Georgia's Courtney Kupets (gymnastics) and Alabama's Brittany Rogers (softball) were honored this past year with the Today's Top VIII Award from the NCAA. Since 2004, the SEC has had 10 student-athletes awarded this honor, more than any other conference in the country.

The SEC also had 13 student-athletes receive NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships in 2009-10, more than any other conference in the nation.

SEC SPORTSMANSHIP STATEMENT

The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states: "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

SEC TOPS IN FAN SUPPORT

The Southeastern Conference has led the nation in total attendance in football every year since 1981 (29 straight years). Since 1988, the SEC has led the nation in average attendance. More than 6.5 million fans witnessed first-hand, the excitement of SEC football in 2009. The average capacity of the 12 SEC stadiums during the last 10 years has been 97 percent. Every year since 1988, the SEC has had at least four teams ranked in the top 10 in average attendance.

In men's basketball, the SEC has finished second in national average attendance for four straight seasons and has finished in the top three every year since 1994 (17 straight years). Kentucky has led the nation in 14 of the last 15 years in attendance. In 2009-10, five SEC schools finished in the top 30 in average attendance.

In women's basketball, after finishing third in the nation for 10 straight seasons, the SEC was second in national average attendance in 2009-10. The SEC has had at least two schools in the top 25 in average attendance every year since 1999-2000. Tennessee has led the nation in attendance in 10 of the last 11 seasons. In 2009-10, the SEC had four schools finish in the top 25 in average attendance.

In baseball, the SEC and one of its institutions have led the NCAA in total and average attendance for the last 13 seasons, and 18 of the last 24 years. The SEC and its member institutions own virtually all regular season, conference tournament, NCAA Regional and Super Regional attendance records. The SEC has broken its own national record each of the last five seasons in total attendance, after having set a goal of 1.5 million fans in 2005 as part of the league's "Drive for 1.5 ... Pack the Parks" promotion.

THE COACHES

Bill Curry is in his first season at Georgia State with a record of 22-13 (.629) and 18th overall with a record of 89-109-4 (.450). The Panthers' offensive coordinator is John Bond and the defensive coordinator is John Thompson.

Nick Saban is in his fourth season at Alabama with a record of 41-10 (.804) and 17th overall with a record of 147-69-1 (.679). The Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator is Jim McElwain and the defensive coordinator is Kirby Smart.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN GEORGIA STATE HAS THE BALL

Drew Little is averaging 203.3 yards passing per game. The redshirt freshman has completed 63 percent of his passes for 2,033 yards with 18 touchdowns and just seven interceptions. One of the keys to the Panthers' success through the air is an offensive line that has allowed just eight sacks all season while GSU has averaged 32 pass attempts per game. Danny Williams leads the Panthers with 53 receptions for 640 yards and five touchdowns. He has recorded three 100-yard games, most recently Oct. 23 at Old Dominion, when he caught a season-high 11 balls for 102 yards.

The Alabama defense put constant pressure on Mississippi State, recording five sacks on Saturday. The five sacks are the most this season, more than doubling the largest output of 2010. Damion Square recorded a career-high two sacks on Saturday night against Mississippi State. He had one career sack coming into the game. C.J. Mosley and safety Mark Barron both recorded career highs in tackles. Mosley accounted for 12 stops, while Barron notched 11 tackles, matching his career high of 11 set earlier this season against Florida. Robert Lester added two interceptions to his 2010 total against Mississippi State - he now has seven interceptions this season to lead the SEC.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ALABAMA HAS THE BALL

In the win over North Carolina Central, the GSU defense came up with four turnovers, including a season-high three interceptions, giving the Panthers 11 takeaways in the last three games, all victories. Jake Muasau leads the team with 8.5 tackles for loss. He has also collected three fumble recoveries, four forced fumbles, an interception and three pass breakups. Fred Barnes leads GSU with 58 tackles.

Senior quarterback Greg McElroy surpassed the 5,000-yard mark for career total offense tonight. With 247 total yards against Mississippi State (227 passing 20 rushing), McElroy became the sixth player in Alabama football history to break the 5,000-yard barrier. He had two touchdown passes against Mississippi State, the 33rd and 34th of McElroy's Alabama career. Julio Jones has caught 58 passes for 799 yards and four touchdowns. Mark Ingram's 78 yard touchdown off a screen pass last week vs. MSU is the longest gain of Ingram's Alabama career.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Iain Vance, the senior from Duluth, Ga., is 15-of-17 on field goals and 34-of-36 on PATs with game-winning kicks against Campbell (one second left) and North Carolina Central (overtime). Starting punter Bo Schlechter, who has missed the last two games with a knee injury, averages 44.3 yards per punt, including eight kicks of 50 yards or more and eight of 27 punts downed inside the opponents' 20-yard line. Darren McCray has a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, and Albert Wilson averages a team-leading 25.2 yards on 19 returns.

Despite having an 81-yard punt return for a touchdown erased by a penalty, junior wide receiver Marquis Maze enjoyed a fine all-purpose yardage game for Alabama. Maze accounted for 166 total yards in the game. Maze caught five passes for 89 yards and a touchdown, very close to matching his single-game highs for receptions and yards. Maze's single-game high for catches is six (vs. LSU, 2009) and his single-game best for receiving yards is 96 (vs. Florida, 2009). He also returned three punts for 36 yards and returned two kickoffs for 41 yards in the game.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TROY HAS THE BALL

Jerrel Jernigan set the Sun Belt Conference record for career receptions last week. His 10 catches in the game give him 236 all-time receptions, leading both Troy and the conference. He also broke the record for career receiving yardage at Troy. His 32 yards were enough to put him at the top of the list with 2,922. Shawn Southward led all Trojans with three of the five Troy touchdowns vs. FIU. Corey Robinson finished the night completing 28 of 47 pass attempts with two touchdowns and two interceptions for 299 yards.

Florida was held to 35 rushing yards, the seventh time in 10 games this season Carolina has held an opponent under 100 yards on the ground. The Gamecocks are 6-1 this season and 19-4 under Steve Spurrier when holding an opponent to less than 100 yards rushing. The Gamecocks held Florida to 226 total yards, the lowest total by a Gamecock opponent this season and third time this season and the 24th time under Spurrier for the Gamecock defense to hold a team under 300 yards. Carolina is 3-0 this season and 20-4 under Spurrier when keeping the opponent under 300 total yards. With 3 sacks at UF, the Gamecocks set the all-time school record with 35 for the season. DB Stephon Gilmore had his second interception of the season and the third of his career.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN SOUTH CAROLINA HAS THE BALL

Troy sophomore defensive end Jonathan Massaquoi had posted three sacks in each of the last two games and entered play last week ranked second in the nation in sacks per game. He has 14.5 TFLs on the year and 9.5 sacks. Xavier Lamb leads the team with 63 total tackles, including 6.0 TFLs and two sacks. LaDarius Madden leads the secondary with three interceptions this season.

Marcus Lattimore carried a school-record 40 times for 212 yards (8th highest in school history) and three TDs in the win at Florida. He also caught two passes for 31 yards. On the season, he established a school freshman record for rushing yards in a season (964). His three TD's gives him 16 on the season, breaking the school's freshman record of 13 and tying for the school's overall single season mark. Alshon Jeffery had six catches for 53 yards on the night last week, giving him 1,087 for the season. He needs just 56 more yards to set the all-time single-season receiving record at South Carolina. Stephen Garcia was 15-for-22 for 156 yards; he also rushed 12 times for 28 yards and a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Michael Taylor is 13-17 on field goals in 2010, including 6-9 over 30 yards. His longest came from 43 yards out. Will Goggans is the punter and gets 43.1 yards per punt, with a long of 70 yards this season. He has had six punts over 50 yards this season and landed 15 inside the 20 yard line. Jernigan returns both punt and kickoffs and has a touchdown in each category this season.

After missing an early extra point, Spencer Lanning was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goal attempts at Florida, hitting from 49, 47 and 41 yards out, all in the first half. He also punted six times for a 43.7 yard average with a long of 49 yards. Lanning's first field goal was a 49-yarder that put the Gamecocks on the scoreboard in the first quarter. His second two field goals were in the second quarter and gave Carolina a 15-7 halftime lead. The average starting field position for Florida's six drives started by Lanning's punts was the 20-yard line.

Jerry Moore is in his 22nd season at ASU with a record of 198-77 (.720) and 29th overall with a record of 225-125-2 (.642). Moore is the Mountaineers' offensive coordinator and the defensive coordinator is Dale Jones.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN APPALACHIAN STATE HAS THE BALL

Offensively, senior running back Devon Moore and junior wide receiver Brian Quick combined to score all five of the Mountaineers' touchdowns last week. Moore turned in his finest performance of the season, rushing for 115 yards on 17 carries and three scores, all season highs. The 100-yard effort was his first of the season and eighth of his career. Quick caught five passes for 73 yards and scored on six- and 34-yard receptions. Quarterback DeAndre Presley bounced back from last week's sub-par performance at Georgia Southern to complete 15 of his first 17 passes and finish with 192 yards on 17-of-26 completions and 17 more yards on 11 rushes.

Florida is the only school in the nation that has four players with at least three interceptions. Justin Trattou tallied a career-high nine tackles in back-to-back games against LSU and Mississippi State and added eight against Georgia. He has a team-high seven tackles for loss during SEC play. Jelani Jenkins posted a career-high 11 tackles against South Carolina. He has 60 tackles on the season, second-highest on the team, with four tackles for loss and two sacks. A.J. Jones has 44 tackles, including four tackles for loss, one sack and three pass breakups this season. Ahmad Black leads the team for the season with 93 tackles and 10 tackles for loss.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN FLORIDA HAS THE BALL

Linebacker D.J. Smith led the staunch defensive effort vs. Wofford with a game-high 10 tackles, his seventh double-digit tackle performance in the last eight games. Defensive end John Rizer chipped in with a career-high nine tackles and a fumble recovery and linebacker Brandon Grier also added a career-best nine stops, including 1.5 of ASU's six tackles for loss. Smith leads the team with 108 tackles on the season. Jabari Fletcher has 12 TFLs and seven sacks. Mark LeGree leads with five interceptions.

John Brantley has completed 172 of 282 passes (61.0 percent) for 1,746 yards and eight touchdowns with seven interceptions for a passer rating of 117.4. Jeff Demps leads the Gators with 487 rushing yards, averaging 6.1 yards per carry. Deonte Thompson leads the UF receiving corps with 30 receptions for 448 yards (14.9 avg.). Thompson picked up his first touchdown of the season on a 31-yard catch in the second quarter against Vanderbilt. Chris Rainey led the Gators in all-purpose yards against Georgia (241) and Vanderbilt (136).

SPECIAL TEAMS

Appalachian also turned in a number of big plays on special teams in their last game. Brad Hardee forced a fumble on a kickoff to set up a second-quarter touchdown, Jason Vitaris booted a 50-yard field goal in the fourth quarter, the longest by a Mountaineer in over a decade, and Ed Gainey blocked the extra-point attempt following Wofford's final touchdown. Troy Sanders returned it for a defensive two-point conversion that closed out the scoring. The defensive two-point conversion was the second in three weeks for Sanders.

Chas Henry leads the nation in yards per punt with a 47.4 average. He also has helped the Gators to the best net punting average in the nation at 42.3 yards. Henry had at least one punt of 57 yards in six straight games. Pressed into field goal kicking duties, Henry knocked home the game-winning 37-yard field goal in overtime against Georgia. Andre Debose leads the SEC and is sixth nationally with a 29.1 kickoff return average and two touchdowns.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LSU HAS THE BALL

Senior linebacker Allen Walker is having an outstanding final campaign. He is currently tied for third in the SEC in forced fumbles with three and is fifth on the team in tackles. Jonathan Cornell leads Ole Miss and ranks 12th in the SEC in tackles (7.0 pg). He also ranks sixth in the league in TFLs (1.38 pg) and 14th in sacks (0.44 pg) and was named second team midseason All-SEC by Phil Steele. Marry totaled a team-high 11 tackles and 3.0 TFLs in his first start versus ULL.

Offensively, the Tigers are averaging 27.9 points and 322.7 total yards (181.4 rushing, 141.3 passing) per game. LSU QB Jordan Jefferson is 18-6 as a starter, which includes an 11-1 record in games played in Tiger Stadium. LSU RB Stevan Ridley ranks third in the SEC in rushing with 878 yards and nine TDs. Terrence Toliver and Rueben Randle lead the receiving group, with a 864 yards and five touchdowns between them.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN OLE MISS HAS THE BALL

The Ole Miss offensive line leads the SEC and ranks 15th in the country having allowed only 10 sacks on the season despite starting seven different offensive line combinations in its 10 games. The Rebels currently rank second in the SEC and 14th in the nation in rushing averaging 219.0 yards per game. Running back Brandon Bolden rushed 113 yards and a pair of touchdowns on just 12 carries against Tennessee. He currently ranks sixth in the SEC averaging 84.0 yards per game. Jeremiah Masoli currently ranks seventh in the SEC in total offense (206.9 yard/game) and eighth in passing efficiency (123.2).

The Tigers continued their stellar defensive play last week, holding ULM scoreless and allowing just 190 yards of total offense, the third time this year LSU had held a team to less than 200 total yards. Defensively, LSU leads the SEC and ranks among the top 10 in the nation in total defense (273.6), pass defense (148.6). The Tigers are also in the top 10 nationally in scoring defense, allowing 14.6 points per game. LB Kelvin Sheppard leads the Tigers with 88 tackles, while DT is first on the team in tackles for loss (12.5) and sacks (6.0). In nine games, Drake Nevis ranks third on the team with 47 tackles, including 12.5 tackles for losses and 6.0 sacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Sophomore placekicker Bryson Rose has had an outstanding 2010 season connecting 52-for-54 on kicks. Rose converted on all five field goal attempts and all four PATs for a career-high with 19 points against Louisiana-Lafayette. Rose ranks in the SEC in PAT percentage (1.000/1st), scoring (8.7 ppg/3rd) and field goals (1.56 pg/3rd). Jesse Grandy has helped Ole Miss rank second the SEC, and 11th nationally, in punt return average at 14.3 yards per return.

Patrick Peterson Peterson ranks second in the SEC in punt return average at 17.6 (22 returns, 388 yards and 2 TDs) and he's second in kickoff returns with a 27.0 average (21 returns, 567 yards). Jasper is also first in the conference in field goals over 40 yards with eight, which includes a career-long of 53 yards vs. ULM. Bobby Petrino is in his third season at Arkansas with a record of 20-14 (.588) and eighth overall with a record of 64-33 (.660). The Razorbacks' offensive coordinator is Garrick McGee and the defensive coordinator is Willie Robinson.

Dan Mullen is in his second season at MSU and overall with a record of 12-10 (.545). Les Koenning serves as the offensive coordinator and the co-defensive coordinators are Manny Diaz and Chris Wilson.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ARKANSAS HAS THE BALL

Ryan Mallett has thrown for 2,967 yards this season to put up the just the ninth 2,000-yard passing season in Arkansas history. He has completed 212-of-315 passes that have resulted in 24 touchdowns. He leads the SEC and ranks fifth in the NCAA with 296.7 passing yards per game. Knile Davis leads Arkansas with 844 rushing yards this season. He ranks fifth in the SEC with 82.3 rushing yards per game against conference competition. Joe Adams ranks third in the SEC and 16th in the NCAA with his 17.3 yards-per-reception average. Jarius Wright has averaged 29.5 yards per touch-down reception in his career.

The Bulldogs have the SEC's third best overall redzone defense, allowing 22 scores on 30 trips, but its TD percentage ranks second in the conference. Chris White has posted 54 tackles in the last five games, and is currently fourth in the conference with a 8.9 tackle-per-game average. Corey Broomfield is tied for the national lead among active players with three career pick-sixes and the total has tied the Mississippi State school record. It's also tied for second most in the history of the SEC, and is only two-thirds through his sophomore season.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN MISSISSIPPI STATE HAS THE BALL

Arkansas ranks second in the SEC and tied for 12th in the NCAA in sacks, averaging 2.80 per game in 2010. Defensive end Jake Bequette leads the team and is tied for fifth in the SEC with 6.0 this season, while fellow DE Tenarius Wright's 4.0 sacks are tied for 10th in the conference. Jerry Franklin leads the team with 70 tackles this season and has paced the team in tackles six times this season, including vs. UTEP with seven. Tramain Thomas is fourth in the SEC with a team-leading four interceptions in 2010.

The Bulldogs currently rank 18th nationally with a 211.7 ypg rushing average and are 7-0 on the season when out-rushing their opponent. Derek Sherrod has been named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week three times following the last six Bulldog games. Vick Ballard has scored 13 touchdowns for the Bulldogs in his first season. Ballard leads the Mississippi State offense with three TD rushes over 50 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown against Alcorn State. Chris Relf is only four yards away from becoming only the sixth quarterback in school history to eclipse the 1,000 yard rushing mark.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Freshman Zach Hocker is a perfect 46-for-46 on PATs and 11-of-12 on field goals to rank ninth in the SEC with 79 points. His 91.7 field goal percentage is tied for eighth in the NCAA and puts Arkansas on top of the conference. Adams has been the Razorbacks' primary punt returner this season. He has returned 13 punts for 251 yards, an average of 19.3 yards per return. His average return leads the SEC and ranks fourth in the NCAA.

Mississippi State punter Heath Hutchins may not be leading the nation in punting yards, but the senior has punted 47 times and allowed only 52 return yards. Hutchins has pinned opponents deep in their own territory 21 times this season. He's also forced 15 fair catches with three fumbled and turned back over to State.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL

QB Tyler Bray threw for 323 yards and three TD's vs. Ole Miss in his second career start. His first was at Memphis the week prior, and when he threw for 325 yards and five TD's. Bray is the first Tennessee quarterback to throw for 300+ yards in his first two career starts. Justin Hunter has tied a Tennessee freshman record with five touch-down receptions. Tauren Poole rushed 12 times for 107 yards and two touchdowns vs. Mississippi, his sixth 100-yard rushing game in 2010. Denarius Moore has 16 catches for 422 yards and three TD in his last three games.

Vanderbilt's struggling offense (18 ppg) is evident in the fact that opponents are averaging 75 plays per game against the Commodore defense. The Vanderbilt has been unable to force key turnovers during its current five-game losing streak. The Commodores have forced just three turnovers in the stretch against tough SEC foes. Vanderbilt standouts Casey Hayward and Tim Fugger remain among the national leaders in key defensive stats. Hayward ranks second in the SEC lead with five interceptions and tops the league with 13 defended passes. Fugger ranks fourth nationally with four forced fumbles.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN VANDERBILT HAS THE BALL

Prentiss Waggner has set a Tennessee season record with his third interception returned for a touchdown. DT Malik Jackson leads the Vols with 4.0 sacks in 2010. Nick Reveiz ranks 9th in the SEC with a career-high 77 tackles, including double-digit totals five times this season, most recently vs. Alabama (11). Gerald Williams is tied for second in sacks with 2.5. His 29 tackles are third on the D-line. Herman Lathers ranks third on the Vols with 50 tackles. Janzen Jackson ranks second on Vols with 51 tackles. He also recorded his third interception (T-5th, SEC) of the season vs. Ole Miss.

Zac Stacy, one of the Commodores' top backs for the last two seasons, has joined fellow sophomore running back Warren Norman on the sidelines for the rest of the 2010 season due to injury. Last week, Mason Johnston became the latest added to the injury list and will miss the rest of the season. Kennard Reeves set a career high with 105 rushing yards in his first starting assignment last week. He also added a career-long rush of 31 yards in 19 carries, the highest single-game total of his career. The Vanderbilt offense produced 242 total yards in the first half, the highest total against an SEC foe this season. Jordan Matthews has touchdown receptions in consecutive games.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Daniel Lincoln returned to the lineup vs. Ole Miss after missing five games. Lincoln made his only field-goal attempt and has made his first eight attempts of the season, tying his school record of eight consecutive makes. Chad Cunningham ranks fifth among SEC punters in conference games with a 43.8-yard average. He ranks 8th in the conference for full-season average of 42.6.

Placekicker Ryan Fowler was 2-of-2 in field goals, hitting from 20 and 29 yards. His first conversion early in the first quarter was his first field goal attempt in five games. He is now 5-6 on the year. Richard Kent is averaging 41.6 yards per punt, with 25 inside the 20-yard line and 17 punts over 50 yards.

Vanderbilt snapped a 22-game losing streak versus Tennessee in 2005, earning a come-from-behind 28-24 victory in Knoxville... The Commodore win also ended a 14-game Vanderbilt losing streak in Neyland Stadium that dated to a 17-14 victory in 1975...In 2007, Vanderbilt held a fourth quarter lead before the Volunteers rallied to score 16 points to earn a 25-24 victory...The Commodores have played Tennessee more than any other team...It is the SEC's fourth most frequently played rivalry. The series is in dispute - Vanderbilt recognizes a 1918 win; Tennessee does not recognize the game... Vanderbilt also controlled the early years between the universities, holding a 19-2-3 overall record through 1927.
