SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 21 LSU opens Yvette Girouard's final season of SEC play with a Wednesday doubleheader against No. 2 Florida. The Tigers will make their season debut on ESPN 104.5 FM with Patrick Wright calling the action.
- ▶ LSU holds a 28-16 lead in the all-time series with the Gators, but Florida has won nine of the last 10 dating back to 2008. A complete series history is available on page 2.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has started the 2011 season with 11 consecutive home wins. The Tigers have outscored their opponents 64-10 coupled with a .338 team batting average and a 0.85 staff ERA.
- Brittany Mack, Meghan Patterson, Tiffany Shaw and Anissa Young represented LSU on the All-Tournament Team at the Purple & Gold Challenge last weekend with Young earning MVP honors.
- Young provided the go-ahead RBI single during the third inning of a 2-1 triumph against Texas [March 6].
- With two outs and the bases loaded in the ninth inning, Alex Boulet knocked a RBI single to vault LSU to a dramatic 1-0 victory over Hofstra [March 4] to hand head coach Yvette Girouard her 500th win at LSU.
- LSU has nine players with 10 or more hits. Tammy Wray, Tiffany Shaw and Anissa Young lead the way with 19, 18 and 17 hits, respectively. Wray and Young also are two of four players to collect double digit RBIs.
- LSU is hitting .316 as a team with runners in scoring position and has racked up 46 of their 99 RBIs with two outs.
- LSU has garnered 35 stolen bases with four players checking in with five or more. The Tigers posted 125 steals at a 2.05 per game ratio to rank 13th in the NCAA last season.
- For the first time in program history, LSU connected for back-to-back-to-back home runs during the sixth inning of its 6-2 triumph over Fordham [Feb. 26].
- Down 2-1, Young knocked a three-run dinger followed by solo shots from Wray and Ashley Langoni. All of the damage came off Fordham ace Jen Mineau, a 2010 NFCA First-Team All-American.

INJURY FRONT

- Ashley Applegate is questionable for Wednesday's action. She scored a run in two of her three pinch running appearances this season.

- Applegate started all 61 games for LSU and primarily hit out of the No. 2 spot in the lineup. She notched a .294 average and 22 RBIs to go along with a team-best 32 walks last season.
- Jessica Mouse is doubtful to make her season debut against No. 2 Florida. She garnered spots on the 2010 SEC Defensive and All-Tournament teams as LSU's starting third basemen.
- Mouse batted .278 and drove home 25 RBIs primarily out of the No. 9 position in the lineup. Defensively, Mouse totaled a team-best 120 assists to rank second in the SEC.
- After seeing limited action in six games, Allison Falcon will miss the remainder of the 2011 season due to injury. LSU won 30 of 33 games last season when Falcon was the starting shortstop.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- Simone Heyward returned to the top of the lineup at the Cathedral City Classic [Feb. 25-27] after missing a five-game stretch due to an injury.
- With Heyward in the lineup, LSU is 13-2 and tallied 5.73 runs per game. In the five games without Heyward, LSU was 2-3 and held to under three or less runs on three occasions.
- Heyward has reached base during all 15 games of her career. She has produced hits in 11 of those games, including a quartet of multi-hit performances.
- Heyward already has a trio of triples. Dating back to 2005, LSU's season leader in triples highest total was four by former All-American Leslie Klein during the 2006 and 2007 campaigns.
- Heyward has crossed the plate 18 times and recently had a six-game streak come to a close [Feb. 13-26]. The Tigers have won 10 of 12 games when Heyward scores.
- Heyward has raced her way to nine stolen bases, including steals in three of her last six games [Feb. 26-March 6].
- After being used primarily as a pinch runner during her first three seasons, Tiffany Shaw has started 15 consecutive games being used

- Shaw has knocked a hit in 11 of those games after entering the season with only three career hits. She has scored 10 runs and totaled eight stolen bases.
- Shaw is on a four-game hitting streak fueled by a career-best three hits against Hofstra [March 4]
- Cassie Trosclair has played in 19 of 20 games this season after having to sit out the 2010 season due to SEC transfer rules.
- Trosclair is batting .293 and shares the team-lead with four multi-hit efforts. She is looking to break out of an 1-for-10 stretch during her last six games [Feb. 25-March 6].
- Jacee Blades has picked up hits during five of her last nine starts [Feb. 19-March 6]. She notched her third multi-hit effort going 2-for-4 against Hofstra [March 4].
- Blades used some nifty base running and slid around a tag at third base. Later, she crossed the plate as the tying run during LSU's 7-4 comeback triumph over Cal Poly [Feb. 26].
- Alex Boulet has scored a run during seven of her nine pinch running appearances this season. She also has stolen a base in seven of those efforts en route to a team-high 10 steals.
- Boulet drove home the game-winning RBI single with two outs and the bases loaded in the ninth inning against Hofstra [March 4].
- In 20 games this season, Juliana Santos has already matched her RBI total from all of 2010 when she had to battle multiple injuries.
- Santos drew a bases loaded walk to plate the go-ahead run during LSU's 7-4 win over Cal Poly [Feb. 27].
- Anissa Young has taken her game to a new level to open the 2011 season. She is connecting for a .340 batting average from the heart of the order.
- Young also ranks among the SEC's Top 15 in home runs [6], RBIs [21], and slugging percentage [.760].

- Wray has produced nine of her 16 RBIs over her last eight games [Feb. 23-March 6]. She platted the tying run on a RBI single during LSU's 7-4 comeback win over Cal Poly [Feb. 27] to finish the game with a career-best three RBIs.
- Wray has started all 20 games and committed only one error with 37 assists filling in for Jessica Mouse at third base.
- Ashley Langoni has tallied a hit and a RBI during three of her last five games [Feb. 26-March 6]. She has added 11 RBIs, good enough for a fourth-place tie on the team.
- Langoni broke a 15-game homerless streak to start the season with a solo shot against Fordham [Feb. 26] to cap LSU's three consecutive homers in the sixth inning.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - The No. 12 LSU softball team had its program-record 24-game winning streak come to a close as No. 6 Florida handed the Tigers a pair of 4-1 and 2-1 setbacks Saturday at Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium in-front of a program-best 2,433 fans.

The 24-game streak marked the third longest in school history only behind runs of 25 by the 1980-81 men's basketball and 27 by the 1996-97 baseball teams, respectively.

Cody Trahan pitched a magnificent second game for LSU (29-6, 8-2 SEC) and sat down 15 of the first 17 batters she faced highlighted by nine straight to open the game.

The Tigers dented scoreboard during the third inning. Morgan Russell was hit-by-a-pitch to open the frame, but pinch runner Tiffany Shaw was forced out at second base on the Jessica Mouse sacrifice bunt attempt.

Kirsten Shortridge ripped a single up-the-middle and an Ashley Applegate ground ball moved the runners into scoring position to set up Rachel Mitchell, who knocked a ground ball of her own to short-stop. Shortridge provided a decoy en route to third base in addition to Mitchell hustling down the line to force UF shortstop Megan Bush to misfield the ball and give LSU a 1-0 edge.

Trahan was able to pitch out of trouble with multiple runners on-base in the fourth inning. She clamped down to get Kelsey Bruder to pop up along with Megan Bush to fly out.

Florida had a similar situation two frames later. With two outs, Bruder connected on a 2-2 offering for a RBI-single to even the score at 1-1.

Corrie Brooks provided a walk-off homer to left centerfield with one out in the seventh inning to hand Trahan her first loss of the season. Ensley Gammel allowed two hits and registered three strikeouts against one walk to improve to 6-0.

"Cody pitched well, had them on the ropes and couldn't quite finish it," Girouard said. "I'm disappointed that we didn't win the second game. We made some uncharacteristic mistakes, tried to make way too many things happen and ran ourselves out of some innings. At the same time, give Florida credit. They pitched well and got timely hitting. It was a great atmosphere for college softball."

Florida jumped out to a 4-0 lead after two innings in game one capped by a Francesca Enea two-run double. Kirsten Shortridge fell to 3-1 and surrendered four hits in over an inning of work.

LSU had opportunities to cash in on Stephanie Brombacher, but left runners in scoring position during each the final four frames. Ashley Langoni belted her team-leading seventh homer of the season to pull, the Tigers back to 4-1 in the fifth inning.

"Tomorrow is another day. The bottom line is we have to touch the plate more," Girouard said. "Our players have got to do a better job of getting base hits when we have runners in scoring position for us to be successful."

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - The No. 12 LSU softball team dropped a 7-1 decision to No. 6 Florida during Sunday's series finale at Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium in-front of a 1,043 fans.

The Gators used a balanced offensive attack as eight of the nine starters garnered a hit off of three different LSU pitches. Ensley Gammel fired four innings of three-hit relief and surrendered an unearned run to improve to 7-0, while Rachele Fico had her streak of 10 consecutive wins dating back to opening weekend come to a close.

Florida coaxed a pair of walks and Kelsey Bruder was hit-by-a-pitch to load the bases in the first inning. LSU quickly turned to Fico in relief of Brittany Mack. She received an excellent defensive play by Anissa Young at first base, who snagged a Brittany Schutte line drive and stepped on the bag for the unassisted double play to keep the game scoreless.

The Gators responded with a pair of two-out hits to build a 3-0 advantage after three innings. Aja Paculba knocked a RBI-single in the second and Schutte followed with a two-run homer during the third.

Stephanie Brombacher recorded three innings of one-hit ball to go along with four strikeouts before giving way Gammel to open the fourth inning.

Ashley Langoni and Rachel Mitchell ripped a pair of singles off Gammel to set up LSU's best scoring opportunity. Anissa Young followed with a sharp ground ball of her own but it was right to Paculba at second base, who alertly turned the double play. A chopper legged out by Juliana Santos forced UF shortstop Megan Bush into a fielding error, which allowed Langoni to cross the plate to make it 3-1.

Florida tallied four runs in the sixth inning behind RBIs from Gammel, Paculba, Michelle Moultrie and Francesca Enea. Gammel retired the nine of the last 10 batters she faced highlighted by seven straight to secure the 7-1 win.

FAYETTEVILLE, ARK. - The No. 17 LSU softball team gave head coach Yvette Girouard the best birthday gift of all as Cody Trahan fired a complete game to push the Tigers to a 9-1 victory over No. 5 Florida Friday in the SEC Tournament Semifinals.

Trahan kept the high-octane Gators out of rhythm and was touched up for only one run on four hits. She also added four strikeouts against three walks to improve to 13-4 on the season. The Little Cypress, Texas native has now registered wins against every SEC team during her career.

Kirsten Shortridge racked up a 3-for-5 effort with two RBIs and provided a solo home run, her second dinger in as many days, after being held without a long ball during the regular season.

Morgan Russell also belted her first career home run during the third inning. Courtney Hollier, Jessica Mouse and Juliana Santos tacked on RBIs of their own as every LSU player in the starting lineup reached base and the Tigers erupted for eight runs during the first four frames.

The Tigers were clicking on all cylinders as Shortridge and Ashley Applegate registered back-to-back singles to start the first inning. A throwing error by UF shortstop Megan Bush allowed the runners to move into scoring position.

Ashley Langoni followed with a walk to load the bases. After an Anissa Young ground out forced Shortridge out at the plate, Juliana Santos coaxed another free pass to give LSU a 1-0 edge. An illegal pitch on Gator ace Stephanie Brombacher allowed Applegate to cross the plate for a 2-0 lead.

Florida put two runners on the first inning, but Trahan thwarted the rally by getting Bush to strike out looking. That opened a stretch of eight of nine batters retired by Trahan.

Russell laced her first career homer to left centerfield to open the second inning before the Tigers batted around the lineup en route to a trio of runs in the third inning. Hollier was issued a bases loaded walk, while Mouse and Shortridge ripped RBI-singles to make it 6-0.

LSU added a pair of unearned runs in the fourth inning aided by two Gator errors. Russell picked up her fifth multi-RBI effort of the season with a RBI-single to extend the advantage to 8-0.

Bush knocked a solo home run for Florida's only in the bottom of the frame. Brombacher was tagged with the loss and surrendered four runs on three hits over 2.1 innings of work to drop to 29-6.
