SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 21 LSU embarks on its SEC road slate with a weekend series against No. 1 Georgia at Jack Turner Stadium. All three games of the UGA series will be carried live on ESPN 104.5 FM.
- ▶ Entering the weekend, LSU is 3-9 in program history against the nation's No. 1 team. The Tigers took two of three from top-ranked Tennessee during the 2008 season.
- ▶ LSU is 28-14 all-time against Georgia and has won five of its last seven with the Bulldogs dating back to 2008 season. A complete series history is available on page 2.
- ▶ Last season at Tiger Park, LSU claimed 5-1 and 5-3 wins over UGA before the Bulldogs notched a 3-2 victory in the series finale. A complete look at the 2010 season series with Georgia can be found on pages 7 & 8.
- ▶ LSU has spent 82 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 21 in this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has started the 2011 season with a 15-7 record. The Tigers have won tallied a 4-5 mark away from Tiger Park this season.
- Last time out, LSU fell 8-1 and 5-0 against No. 2 Florida to open SEC action. The Tigers were limited to four hits during the twinbill.
- Brittany Mack, Meghan Patterson, Tiffany Shaw and Anissa Young represented LSU on the All-Tournament Team at the Purple & Gold Challenge last weekend with Young earning MVP honors.
- Young provided the go-ahead RBI single during the third inning of a 2-1 triumph against Texas [March 6].
- With two outs and the bases loaded in the ninth inning, Alex Boulet knocked a RBI single to vault LSU to a dramatic 1-0 victory over Hofstra [March 4] to hand head coach Yvette Girouard her 500th win at LSU.
- LSU has nine players with 10 or more hits. Tammy Wray and Tiffany Shaw lead the way with 19 hits apiece. Wray and Anissa Young also are two of four players to collect double digit RBIs.
- LSU is hitting .313 as a team with runners in scoring position and has racked up 47 of its 100 RBIs with two outs.
- LSU has garnered 35 stolen bases with four players checking in with five or more. The Tigers posted 125 steals at a 2.05 per game ratio to rank 13th in the NCAA last season.
- For the first time in program history, LSU connected for back-to-back-to-back home runs during the sixth inning of its 6-2 triumph over Fordham [Feb. 26].
- Down 2-1, Young knocked a three-run dinger followed by solo shots from Wray and Ashley Langoni. All of the damage came off Fordham ace Jen Mineau, a 2010 NFCA First-Team All-American.

INJURY FRONT

- Ashley Applegate is questionable for this weekend's action. She scored a run in two of her three pinch running appearances this season.

- Applegate started all 61 games for LSU and primarily hit out of the No. 2 spot in the lineup. She notched a .294 average and 22 RBIs to go along with a team-best 32 walks last season.
- Jessica Mouse is doubtful to make her season debut versus No. 1 Georgia. She garnered spots on the 2010 SEC Defensive and All-Tournament teams as LSU's starting third basemen.
- Mouse batted .278 and drove home 25 RBIs primarily out of the No. 9 position in the lineup. Defensively, Mouse totaled a team-best 120 assists to rank second in the SEC.
- After seeing limited action in six games, Allison Falcon will miss the remainder of the 2011 season due to injury. LSU won 30 of 33 games last season when Falcon was the starting shortstop.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- Simone Heyward returned to the top of the lineup at the Cathedral City Classic [Feb. 25-27] after missing a five-game stretch due to an injury.
- With Heyward in the lineup, LSU is 13-4 and tallied 5.12 runs per game. In the five games without Heyward, LSU was 2-3 and held to under three or less runs on three occasions.
- Heyward has reached base during all 17 games of her career. She has produced hits in 13 of those games, including a quartet of multi-hit performances.
- Heyward already has a trio of triples. Dating back to 2005, LSU's season leader in triples highest total was four by former All-American Leslie Klein during the 2006 and 2007 campaigns.
- Heyward has crossed the plate 18 times and recently had a six-game streak come to a close [Feb. 13-26]. The Tigers have won 10 of 12 games when Heyward scores.
- Heyward has raced her way to nine stolen bases, including steals in three of her last eight games [Feb. 26-March 9].
- After being used primarily as a pinch runner during her first three seasons, Tiffany Shaw has started 17 consecutive games being used

- Shaw has knocked a hit in 12 of those games after entering the season with only three career hits. She has scored 10 runs and totaled eight stolen bases.
- Shaw recently had a career-long five-game hitting streak come to a close during game two of the Florida doubleheader. She drove home LSU's lone run on a RBI single during the fifth inning of the opening game.
- Cassie Trosclair has played in 20 of 22 games this season after having to sit out the 2010 season due to SEC transfer rules.
- Trosclair is batting .293 and shares the team-lead with four multi-hit efforts. She is looking to break out of an 1-for-10 stretch during her last six appearances where she has earned an at-bat [Feb. 25-March 6].
- Jacee Blades has picked up hits during five of her last 11 starts [Feb. 19-March 9]. She notched her third multi-hit effort going 2-for-4 against Hofstra [March 4].
- Blades used some nifty base running and slid around a tag at third base. Later, she crossed the plate as the tying run during LSU's 7-4 comeback triumph over Cal Poly [Feb. 26].
- Alex Boulet has scored a run during seven of her nine pinch running appearances this season. She also has stolen a base in seven of those efforts en route to a team-high 10 steals.
- Boulet drove home the game-winning RBI single with two outs and the bases loaded in the ninth inning against Hofstra [March 4].
- In 22 games this season, Juliana Santos has already matched her RBI total from all of 2010 when she had to battle multiple injuries.
- Santos drew a bases loaded walk to plate the go-ahead run during LSU's 7-4 win over Cal Poly [Feb. 27].
- Anissa Young is connecting for a .304 batting average, a full 64 points above her 2010 total, from the heart of the order.
- Young also ranks among the SEC's Top 15 in home runs [6], RBIs [21], and runs scored [18].
- During her career, 49 of Young's 96 RBIs have come on her 22 home runs. The California native also has registered a .331 [90-for-272] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Young ripped a three-run dinger during the sixth inning of LSU's 4-0 victory over Pittsburgh [March 4]. She also platted the game-winning RBI single in a 2-1 triumph over No. 12 Texas [March 6].
- After being hit-by-a-pitch 21 times in 2010 to set a LSU single-season record, Young has already been plunked on 10 occasions to start 2011. She already has LSU's all-time career mark at 42.
- Tammy Wray reeled off a career-long six-game hitting streak [Feb. 26-March 6] after moving to the No. 4 spot in the lineup before going 0-for-6 during the Florida doubleheader [March 9].
- Wray has produced nine of her 16 RBIs over her last 10 games [Feb. 23-March 9]. She platted the tying run on a RBI single during LSU's 7-4 comeback win over Cal Poly [Feb. 27] to finish the game with a career-best three RBIs.
- Wray has started all 22 games and committed only one error with 37 assists filling in for Jessica Mouse at third base.
- Ashley Langoni has tallied a hit and a RBI during three of her last seven games [Feb. 26-March 9]. She has added 11 RBIs, good enough for a fourth-place tie on the team.
- Langoni broke a 15-game homerless streak to start the season with a solo shot against Fordham [Feb. 26] to cap LSU's three consecutive homers in the sixth inning.
- Langoni has produced 56 of her 75 career RBIs from either the No. 3 or No. 5 spots in the lineup.
- Heidi Pizer has appeared in 10 games with eight starts. She has already surpassed her hit [2] and RBIs [3] totals from last season.
- Pizer has three multi-RBI efforts en route to eight RBIs, the last coming at Houston [Feb. 19]. She has seen action at shortstop, designated player and first base.
- After totaling four hits in 42 plate appearances in 2010, Lauren Houston has already laced 10 hits and drove home nine RBIs this season.

BATON ROUGE - The No. 17 LSU softball turned in a complete performance for the ESPN national television audience sparked by Rachel Mitchell's record-breaking two-run blast coupled with a Cody Trahan complete game gem to upend No. 8 Georgia by a 5-1 margin to open a SEC series in-front of 1,416 fans at Tiger Park.

LSU (40-10, 18-5 SEC) notched its 40th win of the season and pulled within a half-game of Alabama for first place in the SEC Western Division race. The Tigers also ended Georgia's (40-9, 17-7 SEC) 15-game winning streak.

The historic dinger for Mitchell was the 33rd of her career, vaulting her into first place on LSU's all-time list. She eclipsed three-time All-American Leslie Klein [2004-07], who had 32 long balls for her career.

"The thought didn't occur to me until I was rounding second base, and then as I was coming up to third base, I thought, 'I broke the record!' I'm very excited," Mitchell said. "Leslie Klein is always out at the field helping us out. She always tells me that she wants me to break the record and now I have it.

Mitchell was joined by Kirsten Shortridge and Ashley Langoni with multi-hit efforts to fuel the Tigers. Shortridge also posted a pair of steals and joined Dee Douglas [1998-2001] as the only players to reach the 40-steal plateau in program history.

Trahan, who missed the Kentucky series last weekend, returned the circle with a vengeance and mowed down 11 of the first 13 batters she faced. She limited UGA's high-octane offense to quintet of singles en route to her ninth complete game. The Little Cypress, Texas native added three strikeouts against one walk to improve to 12-2 on the season.

"Every time we put on our jerseys, Coach Girouard tells us that it's a privilege, not a right," Trahan said. "It's true, I didn't deserve it last weekend. I had to come out tonight, have my team's back and apologize by throwing well. I felt like I had to prove myself tonight and we got it done."

LSU clicked on all cylinders to build a 5-0 advantage through three innings. The Tigers dented the scoreboard for a pair of runs in the first and second innings followed by a single-run during the third.

Shortridge cranked the first offering for a single to centerfield. She stole second base and advanced to third on an Ashley Applegate fly ball to right field. Two batters later, Langoni connected for a RBI-single through the left side to push LSU ahead 1-0.

The Tigers continued the two-out magic as Anissa Young was hit-by-a-pitch and Juliana Santos drew a nine-pitch walk to load the bases. Morgan Russell tacked on a base-on-balls of her own to make it 2-0.

"We just executed all the way around," Shortridge said. "We executed in every aspect of the game, but we still left runners on-base. We need to continue executing against teams like Georgia. Coach [Girouard] always says to play Tiger softball because we're playing the name on our chest."

LSU opened the second with Jessica Mouse getting plunked. On a 2-1 pitch, Mitchell sent a majestic blast to left centerfield onto the berm for the record breaker as the Tigers surged out to a 4-0 lead.

"I told Rachel the other day that she would have broken it sooner. The ball doesn't carry as well as it should sometimes here," Girouard said. "She crushed that ball, it would have gone out a lot of parks. We got the ball out the park, and Georgia just missed some. Mitchell has been very important to us in her career."

Courtney Hollier put a 0-for-12 stretch in the rear view mirror during the third inning and belted a RBI-single to plate Santos and extend the Tiger advantage to 5-0.

Georgia notched a RBI-single from Taylor Schlopy in the fifth inning before Trahan retired seven of the last nine batters she faced to secure the 5-1 triumph. She coaxed the Bulldogs into 12 fly ball outs and Shortridge tallied seven putouts from her centerfield post.

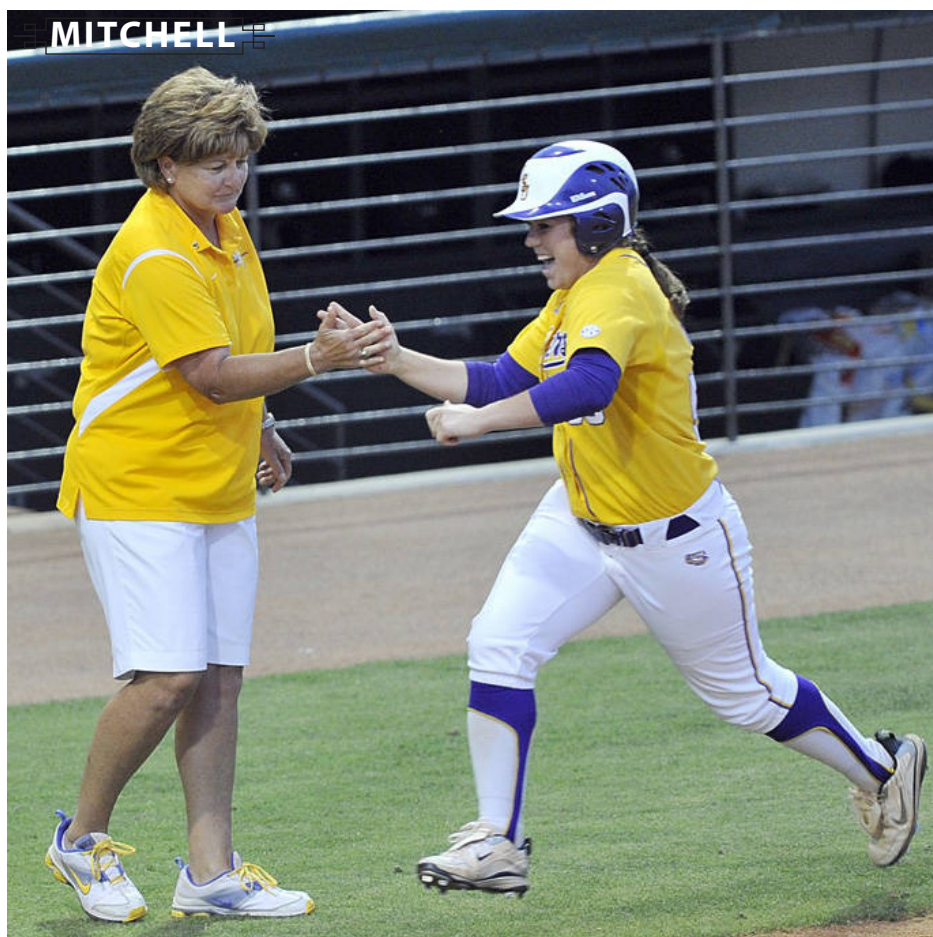

BATON ROUGE - The No. 17 LSU softball team used a dramatic four-run sixth inning to snatch a 5-3 comeback victory before No. 8 Georgia escaped with a 3-2 win during the nightcap Friday evening at Tiger Park in-front of 1,663 fans. The crowd marked the fifth-highest in program history.

Playing host to its 2nd annual Swing for the Cure event, LSU raised \$1,935.50 to benefit the Baton Rouge Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure®. The Tigers honored local breast cancer survivors and their families on the field prior to the series finale. Dr. KC White, Dean of Students and Vice Chancellor of Student Life, tossed out the ceremonial first pitch.

Down 3-1 entering the sixth inning of game one, Courtney Hollier jumpstarted the LSU rally and belted a solo home run down the left field line with one out.

Jessica Mouse coaxed a walk to chase UGA pitcher Sarah McCloud from the game. The Tigers continued the charge as Kirsten Shortridge and Ashley Applegate ripped back-to-back singles to load the bases.

Rachel Mitchell provided the equalizer to make it 3-3 with a sacrifice fly to deep centerfield that not only allowed Mouse to score but enabled Shortridge and Applegate to move into scoring position.

Ashley Langoni was plunked to reload the bases and the Tigers grabbed a 4-3 advantage on a heart stopping play when Shortridge stole home on a toss back to the pitcher.

"I read it in the fifth inning [when I at third base]," Shortridge said. "I looked at Coach Girouard and said, 'Coach Girouard, they're not paying attention to me.' She said, 'Shorty, you're fast, but you're not that fast. You can't steal home.' I really trusted the hitters that were coming up, so it made me think twice about it, but I just took off."

"You have to give it all to Kirsten," Girouard said. "Never in my career have I had someone who stole home, so that was a game-changer obviously, and it's like I say all the time, she's the best athlete on the field, and she took over."

LSU capped the frame with consecutive walks to Anissa Young and Juliana Santos to go ahead 5-3. Rachele Fico fired 4.2 frames two-hit relief to nail down the 5-3 triumph. She notched six strikeouts against one walk and improved to 17-4 on the season.

Alison Owen was tagged with the first loss of her collegiate career and fell to 10-1.

Georgia dented the scoreboard for single runs during the first, second and third innings before the Tigers pieced together four walks to trim the deficit to 3-1 through three innings.

Both starters, Brittany Mack and McCloud, garnered no-decisions. Mack was touched up for three runs, one earned, on three hits in 2.1 innings of work, while McCloud surrendered three runs on five hits to go along with seven walks over her 5.1 frames.

LSU dialed up the late-inning heroics in the second game after entering the seventh inning behind 3-0. A leadoff fielding error allowed Hollier to reach base. After Mouse was hit-by-a-pitch, Shortridge laced a RBI-single though the right side to push the Tigers back to 3-1.

With runners on the corners, an Applegate ground ball scored pinch runner Tiffany Shaw and advanced Shortridge to second base. The Tigers were poised to send the game into extra frames but Mitchell flew out to left field on a full count offering.

"This isn't going to stop us and we're just going to keep moving forward," Mitchell said. "We're disappointed we couldn't win this game, but we're not going to let it affect us. We need to put it in the back of our minds. We're going to remember it and work hard."

Georgia connected for a trio of two-out singles capped by an Alisa Goler line drive to left field to give the Bulldogs a 1-0 advantage in the third inning. A Langoni dropped fly ball kept the frame alive and handed Georgia two unearned runs to turn the score to 3-0.

Owen (11-1) bounced back from her shaky relief outing and held the Tigers scoreless through the first six innings en route to the complete game win.

Cody Trahan was the tough-luck loser and dropped to 12-3 on the season. She limited the high-octane Bulldog attack to a sextet of singles and picked up eight strikeouts against zero walks.
