SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 25 LSU faces its third consecutive SEC Eastern Division foe to open conference play as No. 24 Kentucky visits Tiger Park for a weekend series. The Tigers will make their 2011 television debut Saturday on CST.
- ▶ LSU has won 33 of 35 previous meetings with the Wildcats. UK's lone victories in the series came during the 2005 and 2009 seasons. A complete series history is available on page 2.
- ▶ The Tigers took all four games last season, including a comeback 2-1 triumph in the SEC Quarterfinals. After a three hour and 30 minute rain delay, Kirsten Shortridge belted a two-run walkoff home run.
- ▶ LSU also swept all three regular season games in Lexington. A complete look at those games can be found on page 7.
- ▶ LSU has spent 83 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 25 in this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has started the 2011 season with a 15-11 record. The Tigers have won 11 of 13 games inside the friendly confines of Tiger Park.
- Last time out, LSU dropped a 7-0 decision Wednesday at Southern Miss. During its six-game losing streak, the Tigers are being out-scored by a 46-4 margin.
- LSU concluded its non-conference tournament schedule with a sweep of Hofstra, Pittsburgh and then No. 12 Texas at the Purple & Gold Challenge to start the month of March.
- Brittany Mack, Meghan Patterson, Tiffany Shaw and Anissa Young represented LSU on the All-Tournament Team at the Purple & Gold Challenge with Young earning MVP honors.
- Young provided the go-ahead RBI single during the third inning of a 2-1 triumph against then No. 12 Texas [March 6].
- With two outs and the bases loaded in the ninth inning, Alex Boulet knocked a RBI single to vault LSU to a dramatic 1-0 victory over Hofstra [March 4] to hand head coach Yvette Girouard her 500th win at LSU.
- LSU has six players with 15 or more hits. Simone Heyward, Tiffany Shaw and Tammy Wray share the team lead with 20 hits each. Wray also is one of five players to collect double digit RBIs.
- LSU is hitting .276 as a team with runners in scoring position and has racked up 47 of its 102 RBIs with two outs.
- LSU has garnered 39 stolen bases with four players checking in with six or more. The Tigers posted 125 steals at a 2.05 per game ratio to rank 13th in the NCAA last season.
- For the first time in program history, LSU connected for back-to-back home runs during the sixth inning of its 6-2 triumph over Fordham [Feb. 26].
- Down 2-1, Young knocked a three-run dinger followed by solo shots from Wray and Ashley Langoni. All of the damage came off Fordham ace Jen Mineau, a 2010 NFCA First-Team All-American.

INJURY FRONT

- Ashley Applegate is questionable for this weekend's action. She has scored a run in two of her three pinch running appearances this season.
- Applegate started all 61 games for LSU and primarily hit out of the No. 2 spot in the lineup. She notched a .294 average and 22 RBIs to go along with a team-best 32 walks last season.
- Jessica Mouse is doubtful to make her season debut this weekend. She garnered spots on the 2010 SEC Defensive and All-Tournament teams as LSU's starting third basemen.
- Mouse batted .278 and drove home 25 RBIs primarily out of the No. 9 position in the lineup. Defensively, Mouse totaled a team-best 120 assists to rank second in the SEC.
- After seeing limited action in six games, Allison Falcon will miss the remainder of the 2011 season due to injury. LSU won 30 of 33 games last season when Falcon was the starting shortstop.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- Simone Heyward returned to the top of the lineup at the Cathedral City Classic [Feb. 25-27] after missing five games due to an injury.
- Heyward paces the squad with a team-best .339 batting average and recently had her 20 game on-base streak come to a close at Southern Miss [March 16].
- Heyward has produced hits in 15 games this season, including a team-high five multi-hit efforts.
- Heyward already has a trio of triples. Dating back to 2005, LSU's season leader in triples highest total was four by former All-American Leslie Klein during the 2006 and 2007 campaigns.
- Heyward has crossed the plate 18 times, and the Tigers are 10-2 in 2011 when she scores. She also has raced her way to 10 stolen bases and is second on the team in that category.
- After being used primarily as a pinch runner during her first three seasons, Tiffany Shaw has started 21 consecutive games being used at right field and designated player.

- Shaw has knocked a hit in 13 of those games en route to a .294 hitting clip after entering the 2011 season with only three career hits. She has scored 10 runs and totaled nine stolen bases.
- Shaw recently had a career-long five-game hitting streak come to a close [Feb. 27-March 9]. She drove home LSU's lone run during the Florida doubleheader on a RBI single during the fifth inning.
- Cassie Troclair has played in 24 of 26 games this season after having to sit out the 2010 season due to SEC transfer rules.
- Troclair is batting .283 and is tied for third on the team with four multi-hit efforts. She is looking to break out of a 2-for-15 stretch during her last nine games where she has earned a plate appearance [Feb. 25-March 16].
- Jacee Blades has reached base during 15 of her 20 starts on the season, including three of her last four outings [March 11-16].
- Blades also notched her third multi-hit effort of the season and went 2-for-4 against Hofstra [March 4].
- Blades used some nifty base running and slid around a tag at third base. Later, she crossed the plate as the tying run during LSU's 7-4 comeback triumph over Cal Poly [Feb. 26].
- Alex Boulet has scored a run during seven of her 10 pinch running appearances this season. She has stolen a base in eight of those efforts en route to a team-high 11 steals.
- Boulet drove home the game-winning RBI single with two outs and the bases loaded in the ninth inning against Hofstra [March 4].
- In 26 games this season, Juliana Santos has already passed her RBI total from all of 2010 when she had to battle multiple injuries.
- Santos knocked a solo home run to cap back-to-back dingers during the seventh inning of the UGA opener [March 11].
- Anissa Young is connecting for a .281 batting average from the heart of the order, but is looking to break out of a 1-for-14 run during LSU's six game losing skid [March 9-16].
- Young's paces the team with six home runs and 21 RBIs. Her six dingers are tied for 14th in the SEC.

- After being hit-by-a-pitch 21 times in 2010 to set a LSU single-season record, Young has already been plunked on 13 occasions to start 2011. She already has LSU's all-time career mark at 45.
- Tammy Wray reeled off a career-long six-game hitting streak [Feb. 26-March 6] after moving to the No. 4 spot in the lineup before going 1-for-16 during LSU's six game losing streak [March 9-16].
- Wray has produced nine of her 16 RBIs over her last 14 games [Feb. 23-March 13]. She platted the tying run on a RBI single during LSU's 7-4 comeback win over Cal Poly [Feb. 27] to finish the game with a career-best three RBIs.
- Wray has started all 26 games and committed three errors with 48 assists filling in for Jessica Mouse at third base. Her 48 assists are fourth in the SEC.
- Ashley Langoni has garnered hits in five of her last 11 games [Feb. 26-March 16]. She has added 11 RBIs, good enough fourth place on the team.
- Langoni broke a 15-game homerless streak to start the season with a solo shot against Fordham [Feb. 26] to cap LSU's three consecutive homers in the sixth inning.

LEXINGTON, Ky. — Rachele Fico fired 8.1 innings of one-run ball en route to a save and a win to propel the No. 16 LSU softball team to 9-3 and 3-1 victories over Kentucky at the UK Softball Complex.

With the sweep, the Tigers (38-10, 17-5 SEC) vaulted into sole possession of third place in the overall SEC standings but remain one game behind of Alabama in the league's western division race.

"All in all, it was a great weekend for the Tigers," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We had fabulous production from a bunch of players and played excellent defense. Lineup wise, we went back to what worked for us for 80-percent of the season. I loved the way our players approached the weekend against a very talented Kentucky team."

Rachel Mitchell and Ashley Langoni combined for five of the team's eight RBIs, while Jessica Mouse turned in a 2-for-2 performance with two runs and a RBI during game one.

LSU fired out to a 2-0 advantage as Mitchell connected for a two-run home run over the left field wall. The historic long ball was the 32nd of her career and tied her with former three-time All-American Leslie Klein for the program's lead.

"Rachel has taken to heart that this is her senior season," Girouard said. "She wants to go out on a positive note and her mental approach has been razor sharp."

The Tigers took advantage of a Juliana Santos leadoff single to open the fourth inning. Two batters later, Mouse ripped a RBI-double down the left field line to cap a nine-pitch at-bat and push the lead to 3-0.

LSU tacked on an unearned run during the fifth inning before the Tigers pieced together six consecutive hits for a quartet of runs to start the sixth inning. Ashley Applegate, Mitchell, Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young knocked RBI-hits to make it 8-0.

Megan Yocke cranked a solo home run to put Kentucky (29-21, 11-14 SEC) on the board in the home half of the frame and break up Brittany Mack's bid for a shutout. The Wildcats used a trio of infield hits along with two walks to trim the deficit to 8-3.

With the bases loaded, Girouard turned to Fico out of the bullpen. She promptly fired three straight strikes to mow down Natalie Smith looking. The Connecticut native tossed a scoreless seventh inning to notch her fifth save of the season and established a new program single-season mark.

Mack moved to 9-3 and tallied six strikeouts against two walk in 5.1 innings of work.

"Brittany threw a great game, but just wasn't able to finish it," Girouard said. "Her movement and command over her pitches were phenomenal for five innings. This performance is something that she can build on going forward."

Young belted a solo shot in the second inning, while Santos tacked on a two-run bomb during the fourth inning to provide LSU's offense in the second game. Mouse also compiled a 3-for-3 effort to match a career-high. She reached base during her final eight plate appearances.

Kentucky received a homer from Destinee Mordecai for its lone offensive highlight as LSU completed the sweep with a 3-1 triumph.

"We know Juliana can hit at this level because she proved it last season," Girouard said. "She's had to battle a lot of injuries this season, but credit her because she shows a lot of fortitude to compete hard every day."

Fico limited the Wildcats to one run on four hits. She recorded five strikeouts against two walks to improve to 16-4 on the season.

Rachel Mitchell belted a three-run home run to left center-field to vault LSU out a 3-0 edge in the first inning. Kirsten Shortridge and Ashley Applegate set the table for Mitchell with back-to-back singles down the left field line.

Shortridge struck for an infield single en route to her 22nd multi-hit effort to start the fourth inning. She stole second base and came around to score on a Langoni RBI-single to extend the LSU advantage to 4-0.

Annie Rowlands put the Wildcats on the board in the home half of the frame with a two-out RBI-single to make it 4-1. Rachele Fico got out of a bases loaded situation by getting All-SEC Preseason Team selection Molly Johnson to ground out.

Falcon ignited the rally and ripped a 0-1 offering down the right field line for a double before Shortridge cranked a line-drive laser over the right centerfield wall for the win.
