SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 25 LSU heads to Nicholls State for a Wednesday tilt before taking its SEC bye weekend. First pitch is set for 6 p.m. at the Colonel Softball Complex.
- ▶ LSU is 6-0 versus in-state opponents this season. The Tigers have racked up a .373 team batting average and a 1.10 staff ERA en route to an impressive 58-6 scoring advantage.
- ▶ LSU has won 20 of 21 previous meetings with Nicholls, including 20 straight in the series dating back to the 2000 season. A complete series history is available on page 2.
- ▶ LSU notched an 11-2 victory over the Colonels earlier this season. The Tigers left-handed batters of Jacee Blades, Alex Boulet, Tiffany Shaw and Cassie Troclair combined to score seven runs. A complete recap of that match-up is available on page 7.
- ▶ LSU has spent 84 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 25 and No. 24 in this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has started the 2011 season with a 17-12 record and enters Wednesday's game looking for its first road win away from Tiger Park.
- LSU has outscored its Louisiana opponents 58-6 en route to a 6-0 mark this season. The Tigers are hitting .373 as a team and pitched to a 1.06 staff ERA.
- Last time out, LSU took two of three games from No. 24 Kentucky over the weekend to snap a seven-game losing skid and notch its first SEC wins of the season.
- Ashley Langoni is the only Tiger to start all 29 games at the same position this season. LSU has already used 23 different batting order combinations in 2011.
- LSU has four players with 20 or more hits. Tiffany Shaw and Tammy Wray share the team lead with 23 hits each. Wray also is one of five players to collect double digit RBIs.
- LSU is hitting .252 as a team with runners in scoring position and has racked up 53 of its 108 RBIs have come with two outs.
- LSU has garnered 43 stolen bases. Alex Boulet, Simone Heyward and Tiffany Shaw each rank among the SEC's Top 10. The Tigers posted 125 steals at a 2.05 per game ratio to rank 13th in the NCAA last season.
- For the first time in program history, LSU connected for back-to-back-to-back home runs during the sixth inning of its 6-2 triumph over Fordham [Feb. 26].
- Down 2-1, Young knocked a three-run dinger followed by solo shots from Wray and Ashley Langoni. All of the damage came off Fordham ace Jen Mineau, a 2010 NFCA First-Team All-American.

INJURY FRONT

- Ashley Applegate is doubtful to return to the starting lineup for this week's action. She has scored a run in two of her three pinch running appearances in 2011.

- Applegate started all 61 games for LSU and primarily hit out of the No. 2 spot in the lineup. She notched a .294 average and 22 RBIs to go along with a team-best 32 walks last season.
- Jessica Mouse also is doubtful to make her season debut this week. She garnered spots on the 2010 SEC Defensive and All-Tournament teams as LSU's starting third basemen.
- Mouse batted .278 and drove home 25 RBIs primarily out of the No. 9 position in the lineup. Defensively, Mouse totaled a team-best 120 assists to rank second in the SEC.
- After seeing limited action in six games, Allison Falcon will miss the remainder of the 2011 season due to injury. LSU won 30 of 33 games last season when Falcon was the starting shortstop.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- Simone Heyward returned to the top of the lineup at the Cathedral City Classic [Feb. 25-27] after missing five games due to an injury.
- Heyward paces the squad with a team-best .303 batting average and is looking to break out of a 0-for-13 slump over her last five games [March 13-20].
- Heyward has produced hits in 15 games this season and shares the team lead with five multi-hit efforts.
- Heyward already has a trio of triples. Dating back to 2005, LSU's season leader in triples highest total was four by former All-American Leslie Klein during the 2006 and 2007 campaigns.
- Heyward has crossed the plate 18 times, and the Tigers are 10-2 in 2011 when she scores. She also has raced her way to a team-high 12 stolen bases, including two in her last three games.
- After being used primarily as a pinch runner during her first three seasons, Tiffany Shaw has started 24 consecutive games being used at right field and designated player.
- Shaw has knocked a hit in 15 of those games en route to a .295 hitting clip after entering the 2011 season with only three career hits. She has scored 11 runs and totaled 10 stolen bases.

- Shaw has batted in five different spots in the lineup. LSU has won seven of eight games when she hits in the No. 9 spot in the order. She also has compiled a team-best five multi-hit efforts.
- Cassie Trosclair has played in 25 of 29 games this season after having to sit out the 2010 season due to SEC transfer rules.
- Trosclair is batting .265 and is looking to break out of a 2-for-18 stretch during her last 10 games where she has earned a plate appearance [Feb. 25-March 18].
- Jacee Blades has reached base during 16 of her 23 starts on the season, including four of her last seven outings [March 11-20].
- Blades also notched her third multi-hit effort of the season and went 2-for-4 against Hofstra [March 4].
- Blades has seen action at right field, centerfield, shortstop and second base. She has garnered 33 putouts and 13 assists en route to a spotless fielding percentage.
- Alex Boulet has scored a run during seven of her 11 pinch running appearances this season. She has stolen a base in eight of those efforts en route to 11 steals, good enough for second on the team.
- Boulet drove home the game-winning RBI single with two outs and the bases loaded in the ninth inning against Hofstra [March 4].
- In 28 games this season, Juliana Santos has already passed her RBI total from all of 2010 when she had to battle multiple injuries.
- Santos knocked a solo home run to cap back-to-back dingers during the seventh inning of the UGA opener [March 11]. She also scored runs in wins during the last two games of the Kentucky series [March 19-20].
- Ashley Langoni has compiled a five-game hitting streak [March 13-20] and registered RBIs during all three games of the Kentucky series [March 18-20].
- During the streak, Langoni is batting .538 [7-for-13] with seven RBIs and provided the go-ahead home run in the series finale versus Kentucky [March 20] during the third inning.
- Langoni has posted 18 of her 22 hits along with 12 of her 15 RBIs from the No. 3 hole in the lineup. She matched a career-high with three hits in the series opener against the Wildcats.
- For her career, Langoni has provided 61 of her 80 career RBIs from either the No. 3 or No. 5 spots in the lineup.
- Anissa Young is connecting for a .271 batting average and paces the team with six home runs and 21 RBIs. Her six dingers are tied for 14th in the SEC.
- Young has notched 15 of her 19 hits in addition to 13 of her 21 RBIs on the season from the No. 4 slot in the lineup. She also has tallied a .341 hitting clip in that spot.
- During her career, 49 of Young's 96 RBIs have come on her 22 home runs. The California native also has registered a .326 [92-for-282] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Young platted the game-winning RBI single in a 2-1 triumph over No. 12 Texas [March 6] during the third inning.
- After being hit-by-a-pitch 21 times in 2010 to set a LSU single-season record, Young has already been plunked on 14 occasions to start 2011. She already has LSU's all-time career mark at 46.
- Tammy Wray recorded a hit and added a RBI during two of three games against Kentucky [March 18-20].
- Wray has produced 11 of her 18 RBIs over her last 17 games [Feb. 23-March 20]. She was hit-by-a-pitch with the bases loaded in the fifth inning to break a 1-1 tie during the middle game of the series.
- Wray has started all 29 games, 27 of them at third base, filling in for Jessica Mouse. Defensively, she has tallied 50 assists to tie for seventh place in the SEC.
- Heidi Pizer has appeared in 15 games with 10 starts. She has already surpassed her hit [2] and RBIs [3] totals from last season.

- Rachele Fico has tallied a 5-8 mark to go along with a 3.71 ERA to start her sophomore season. She has tallied double digit strikeouts on two occasions and her 78 Ks are tied for ninth in the SEC.
- Last time out, Fico was touched up for six runs on a career-best 13 hits in a loss to open the Kentucky series [March 18].
- At the Purple & Gold Challenge, Fico worked around a career-high six walks but stranded 10 base runners during a 2-1 victory over No. 12 Texas [March 6].
- Fico fired 4.2 frames of two-hit relief with nine strikeouts during LSU's 4-1 setback against No. 3 Arizona [Feb. 25].
- Fico tossed the program's third perfect game against Southeastern Louisiana [Feb. 16]. She retired seven of the 15 batters she faced via the strikeout and snagged a line drive in the fifth inning to secure perfection.
- Fico has surrendered six earned runs in a trio of game one's versus No. 2 Florida [March 9], No. 1 Georgia [March 11] and No. 24 Kentucky [March 20]. She also has allowed five earned runs during starts against No. 20 Oklahoma State [Feb. 18] and No. 14 California [Feb. 26].
- Brittany Mack has won seven of her 10 decisions to go along with a 2.92 ERA. Her setbacks have come against No. 1 Georgia [March 12], No. 2 Florida [March 9] and No. 3 Arizona [Feb. 25].
- Mack secured a pair of wins to conclude the Kentucky series [March 19-20] en route to back-to-back complete games. She racked up 10 strikeouts and limited the Wildcats to two runs, one earned, on five hits.

HOUSTON, Texas - The No. 18 LSU softball team used an eight-run fifth inning to put a two-game losing streak in the rear view mirror and claim an 11-2 five-inning rout of Nicholls to conclude day two of the Houston Hilton Plaza Classic at the Cougar Softball Stadium.

LSU's slap hitters of Jacee Blades, Alex Boulet, Tiffany Shaw and Cassie Trosclair combined to score seven of the Tigers 11 runs. Blades also registered a career-best 3-for-3 performance at the plate, while Trosclair and Shaw notched multi-hit efforts.

"I'm proud of our slappers because they really got the job done," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We can create a lot of havoc on the field. It's been a stressful day, but we found a way to get it done with the people on the field."

LSU sent 13 batters to the plate in the fifth inning. A pair of Nicholls errors extended the frame and allowed the first two runs of the frame to cross the plate.

Ashley Langoni, Anissa Young and Heidi Pizer followed with consecutive RBIs before Lauren Houston delivered a three-run dinger, her first of the season, to straight-away centerfield to make it 11-2.

Meghan Patterson went the distance and allowed two runs on two hits. The Destrehan native racked up nine strikeouts against two walks to move to 4-0 on the season.

"Meghan was on-point again tonight," Girouard said. "She gave up the two runs on some bloop hits but was in total control. Her strengths have been making the ball move, and I've been really impressed with how she's handled herself out there."

LSU used small ball to grab a 3-0 edge during the third inning. Infield singles by Blades and Trosclair sandwiched between a Boulet walk loaded the bases. Shaw and Juliana Santos picked up RBIs on groundballs coupled by another run on a Nicholls passed ball.

The Colonels pulled within 3-2 on an Ashley Ray two-run double during the home half of the frame, but Patterson stranded the runner on an interference call.
