SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ Following its SEC bye weekend, No. 25 LSU travels to Southeastern Louisiana for a Tuesday match-up. First pitch is set for 6 p.m. at North Oak Park in Hammond.
- ▶ LSU is 7-0 versus in-state opponents this season. The Tigers have racked up a .365 team batting average and a 0.92 staff ERA en route to an impressive 66-6 scoring advantage.
- ▶ LSU has emerged with victories in 16 of the 17 previous meetings versus Southeastern Louisiana. A complete series history is available on page 2.
- ▶ LSU came away with a 9-0 five-inning triumph over the Lady Lions earlier this season. Rachele Fico tossed the third perfect game in program history. A complete recap of that match-up is available on page 7.
- ▶ LSU has spent 84 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 25 and No. 24 in this week's polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has started the 2011 season with a 18-12 record and enters Tuesday's game on a three-game winning streak.
- Last time out, LSU notched an 8-0 five-inning triumph over Nicholls State. Eight different Tigers recorded hits, while Meghan Patterson and Rachele Fico combined for 10 strikeouts.
- Ashley Langoni is the only Tiger to start all 30 games at the same position this season. LSU has already used 24 different batting order combinations in 2011.
- LSU has five players with 20 or more hits. Tammy Wray holds the team lead with 24, while Ashley Langoni and Tiffany Shaw are right behind her 23 hits apiece. Langoni and Wray also are two of five players to collect double digit RBIs.
- LSU is hitting .257 as a team with runners in scoring position and has racked up 56 of its 114 RBIs have come with two outs.
- LSU has garnered 44 stolen bases. Alex Boulet, Simone Heyward and Tiffany Shaw each rank among the SEC's Top 10. The Tigers posted 125 steals at a 2.05 per game ratio to rank 13th in the NCAA last season.
- For the first time in program history, LSU connected for back-to-back-to-back home runs during the sixth inning of its 6-2 triumph over Fordham [Feb. 26].
- Down 2-1, Young knocked a three-run dinger followed by solo shots from Wray and Ashley Langoni. All of the damage came off Fordham ace Jen Mineau, a 2010 NFCA First-Team All-American.

INJURY FRONT

- Ashley Applegate is doubtful to return to the starting lineup for this week's action. She has scored a run in two of her three pinch running appearances in 2011.
- Applegate started all 61 games for LSU and primarily hit out of the No. 2 spot in the lineup. She notched a .294 average and 22 RBIs to

go along with a team-best 32 walks last season.

- Jessica Mouse also is doubtful to make her season debut this week. She garnered spots on the 2010 SEC Defensive and All-Tournament teams as LSU's starting third basemen.
- Mouse batted .278 and drove home 25 RBIs primarily out of the No. 9 position in the lineup. Defensively, Mouse totaled a team-best 120 assists to rank second in the SEC.
- After seeing limited action in six games, Allison Falcon will miss the remainder of the 2011 season due to injury. LSU won 30 of 33 games last season when Falcon was the starting shortstop.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- Simone Heyward returned to the top of the lineup at the Cathedral City Classic [Feb. 25-27] after missing five games due to an injury.
- Heyward paces the squad with a team-best .304 batting average and ended a 0-for-13 stretch with a RBI single during LSU's seven run third inning at Nicholls State [March 23].
- Heyward has produced hits in 16 games this season and shares the team lead with five multi-hit efforts.
- Heyward already has a trio of triples. Dating back to 2005, LSU's season leader in triples highest total was four by former All-American Leslie Klein during the 2006 and 2007 campaigns.
- Heyward has crossed the plate 19 times, and the Tigers are 11-2 in 2011 when she scores. She also has raced her way to a team-high 13 stolen bases, including three in her last four outings dating back to March 18.
- After being used primarily as a pinch runner during her first three seasons, Tiffany Shaw has started 25 consecutive games being used at right field and designated player.
- Shaw has knocked a hit in 15 of those games en route to a .288 hitting clip after entering the 2011 season with only three career hits. She also has scored 12 runs and totaled 10 stolen bases.
- Shaw has batted in five different spots in the lineup. LSU has won

eight of nine games when she hits in the No. 9 spot in the order. She also has compiled a team-best five multi-hit efforts.

- Cassie Troclair has played in 26 of 30 games this season after having to sit out the 2010 season due to SEC transfer rules.
- Troclair is batting .260 and is looking to break out of a 2-for-19 stretch during her last 11 games where she has earned a plate appearance [Feb. 25-March 23].
- Jacee Blades has reached base during 17 of her 24 starts on the season, including five of her last eight outings [March 11-23].
- Blades also notched her third multi-hit effort of the season and went 2-for-4 against Hofstra [March 4].
- Blades has seen action at right field, centerfield, shortstop and second base. She has garnered 33 putouts and 14 assists en route to a spotless fielding percentage.
- Alex Boulet has scored a run during seven of her 11 pinch running appearances this season. She has stolen a base in eight of those efforts en route to 11 steals, good enough for second on the team.
- Boulet drove home the game-winning RBI single with two outs and the bases loaded in the ninth inning against Hofstra [March 4].
- In 29 games this season, Juliana Santos has already passed her RBI total from all of 2010 when she had to battle multiple injuries.
- Santos knocked a solo home run to cap back-to-back dingers during the seventh inning of the UGA opener [March 11]. She also scored runs in wins during LSU's two wins in the Kentucky series [March 19-20].
- Ashley Langoni has matched a career-long six-game hitting streak [March 13-23] and registered RBIs during her last four games [March 18-23] highlighted by all three games of the Kentucky series [March 18-20].
- During the streak, Langoni is batting .500 [8-for-16] with eight RBIs and boosted her average by 53 points. She provided the go-ahead home run in the series finale versus Kentucky [March 20] during the third inning.
- Langoni has posted 19 of her 23 hits along with 13 of her 16 RBIs from the No. 3 hole in the lineup. She matched a career-high with three hits in the series opener against the Wildcats.
- For her career, Langoni has provided 62 of her 81 career RBIs from either the No. 3 or No. 5 spots in the lineup.
- Anissa Young is connecting for a .278 batting average and paces the team with six home runs and 21 RBIs.
- Young has notched 16 of her 20 hits in addition to 13 of her 21 RBIs on the season from the No. 4 slot in the lineup. She also has tallied a .348 hitting clip in that spot.
- During her career, 49 of Young's 96 RBIs have come on her 22 home runs. The California native also has registered a .329 [93-for-283] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Young platted the game-winning RBI single in a 2-1 triumph over No. 12 Texas [March 6] during the third inning.
- After being hit-by-a-pitch 21 times in 2010 to set a LSU single-season record, Young has already been plunked on 14 occasions to start 2011. She already has LSU's all-time career mark at 46.
- Tammy Wray has recorded a hit in three of her last four games [March 18-23] and added a RBI in three straight contests dating back to the middle game of the UK series.
- Wray has produced 12 of her 19 RBIs over her last 18 games [Feb. 23-March 23]. She provided a solo home run to open the scoring during the second inning at Nicholls State [March 23].
- Wray has started all 30 games, 27 of them at third base. Defensively, she has tallied 51 assists for 14th place in the SEC.
- Heidi Pizer has appeared in 16 games with 11 starts. She has already surpassed her hit [2] and RBIs [3] totals from last season.
- Pizer has been the starting first basemen during LSU's three game winning streak and connected for a double against Nicholls State [March 23].
- After totaling four hits in 42 plate appearances in 2010, Lauren Houston has already laced 13 hits over 43 at-bats on a pair of homers and collected 10 RBIs this season.

BATON ROUGE - Rachele Fico tossed the third perfect game in program history as the No. 18 LSU softball team raced its way to a dominant 9-0 five-inning victory over Southeastern Louisiana in front of 1,011 fans at Tiger Park.

"Rachele was magnificent tonight," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "She played great defense and certainly was the deciding factor in tonight's game. Offensively, the speed factor wasn't as noticeable tonight, but the power game sure did show up. We hit the ball hard, and the intensity was magnificent. It's a team that really enjoys coming out here and playing softball. It was the first time we had worn this uniform combination [gold jerseys and purple pants], and we might have to do it again."

Fico sat down all 15 batters she faced, seven via the strikeout. A ball didn't leave the infield as the sophomore right-hander joined Tiffany Garcia [Grambling State, 02/15/06] along with a combined effort from Britni Sneed and Sarah Meadors [Tennessee, 03/18/01] as the only perfect gems in Tiger history.

Southeastern Louisiana's (3-3) best opportunity for a hit came with one out during the fifth inning, but Fico snagged the line drive off the bat of Megan McCollum. Four pitches later, Fico mowed down Lauren Coniglio to secure her place in the LSU record book.

"Being in this atmosphere, surrounded by my teammates, it's just a great day to be a Tiger," Fico said. "I love it here. My teammates mean the world to me and it amazes me that I was able to accomplish something like that with my teammates behind me."

Tammy Wray and Anissa Young turned in identical 3-for-3 performances at the plate and drove home three RBIs apiece. The duo also launched a pair of two-run home runs in the first and third innings, respectively. Simone Heyward and Morgan Russell added RBIs as the Tigers scored all nine of their runs with two outs.

LSU seized the momentum early with three runs in the first inning. It marked the fifth time in seven games that the Tigers have scored during the opening frame this season.

Juliana Santos ripped a double down the right field line and advanced to third on an Ashley Langoni fly ball to the warning track. On the first pitch, Anissa Young chopped a RBI-single through the middle to hand the Tigers a 1-0 lead.

Tammy Wray capped the three-run stanza with a two-run homer that cleared the left field berm. It was the first long ball of Wray's career.

"I don't think it's going to be the last of Tammy Wray's home runs," Girouard said. "She had a tough spring but has come a long way with her hitting. I'm hoping she has some more confidence now. She has done a tremendous job defensively at third base filling in for [Jessica] Mouse."

Young tacked on a two-run shot of her own to centerfield followed by a Russell RBI-double into the right centerfield gap to make it 6-0 after three innings.

LSU put the finishing touches on the win with another three-spot during the fourth inning highlighted by a Wray RBI-single for the final margin of 9-0.

"I think our lineup is awesome," Wray said. "We have Simone [Heyward] with the speed at the top of the lineup, followed by our four power hitters, then back to speed at the bottom. I think our lineup is solid, one through nine."
