Nearly 69 years to the day, Demons return to Tiger Stadium on 9-10-11

After a 40-0 loss by Louisiana State Normal's Demons in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 19, 1942, nobody thought it would be this long before Northwestern State and LSU teed it up again. Saturday night, the Demons follow their Southland Conference cousins, McNeese State, as the first two Louisiana FCS teams to play at LSU.

McNeese and Northwestern worked jointly with LSU officials to broker the ground-breaking deal, juggling their own schedules to make it possible.

It's a big event for NSU. Third-year coach Bradley Dale Peveto will dress out all 115 players, bringing the Demons down on three buses departing Natchitoches about noon Saturday. The nearly 300-member Spirit of Northwestern Marching Band will perform at halftime. The projected 92,000 in attendance will top the 86,520 at Georgia in 2002 as the largest crowd to watch the Demons play.

By week's end, NSU will have sold out of its 4,000-ticket allotment for the game, with many other Demon fans having obtained game tickets through LSU and friends who are LSU season ticket holders.

It's the 11th meeting all time between the two varsity football squads from LSU and Northwestern, with the previous 10 matchups between 1911 and 1942.

Major milestone looms with Demons one victory shy of 500 all-time

Demon football is one win away from 500 victories all-time since 1907 with a 499-416-22 record (.544 winning percentage), beginning its 102nd season of competition, and 104th year of existence. Louisiana Normal, which came Northwestern State College in 1944, did not field football teams in 1918 and 1943 due to World Wars I and II, respectively.

Although football games were played against club teams, area high schools and town teams prior to 1907, the first intercollegiate game for NSU took place against Louisiana Polytechnic. It didn't end well, a 43-0 loss, but it started something big. The Demons celebrated their football centennial in 2007, highlighted by fans voting and a blue-ribbon committee finalizing a roster of the Top 100 Players in Demon History. Assistant coach Brad Laird was on the roster.

Quite the comeback last week by the Demons

Northwestern pulled off its second-largest comeback in its 35 seasons of Division I competition last Thursday night, overcoming a 17-0 deficit to prevail 24-23 against Division II's 2010 finalists and No. 2-ranked team, Delta State. The only larger successful rally came in the 2005 opener, when NSU erased a 23-0 hole through two quarters at Louisiana-Monroe to win 27-23.

A couple of parallels in last week's victories

LSU and Northwestern had a couple of common threads in their opening wins last week.

Each team followed a backup quarterback to victory, and each team rode a big third quarter helped along by a productive running attack.

Hot-handed Henderson takes charge of Demon offense in record outing

Brad Henderson made a sensational debut as NSU's quarterback last Thursday night, completing 13 of 14 passes for 210 yards including a 32-yard TD. He set a school record by completing 13 in a row, and the 14th was dropped. Henderson led the Demons to scores on 4 of their first 5 series after halftime, erasing a 17-0 deficit.

The Demons averaged 6.2 yards per play with Henderson in the game, posting 324 on 52 snaps. In their third-quarter surge, the Demons posted 178 total yards.

Monday, the Louisiana Sports Writers Association voted Henderson as the state's college offensive player of the week. LSU DB Tyrann Mathieu won the defensive honor.

A 2010 junior college honorable mention All-American at East Mississippi CC, Henderson was offered a preferred walk-on opportunity at Alabama but chose NSU's scholarship offer.

Henderson's 13 straight completions erased the school record of 11 consecutive last season by Paul Harris at Southeastern Louisiana. That remains the record for most completions at the start of a game.

Disciplinary action removes Harris from squad

Junior quarterback Paul Harris is suspended indefinitely for conduct detrimental to the team during the first half and at halftime of last week's game. Harris started, but came out in a pre-determined rotation after his second series. He was benched for the remainder of the half for disciplinary reasons by head coach Bradley Dale Peveto. After further problems in the locker room at halftime, Peveto directed Harris to get out of uniform and not return to the sideline. The following day, Peveto announced the suspension of the Baton Rouge-Tara product, who has started 14 games (4 as a true freshman, 9 last year – missing 2 starts and 1 complete game due to injury).

Harris ranks in the Demons' career top 10 in passing yardage (2,828 yards) and total offense (3,628), sitting 10th in both categories. Brad Laird, NSU's defensive coordinator, holds both records, with 6,037 passing yards and 6,178 yards of total offense from 1991-95.

This Rose will stick you

Junior linebacker Derek Rose shared the Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Week award Monday after making 9 tackles, including 3 for lost yardage (-8), against Delta State. Rose spearheaded a defensive shutdown in the second half as the Demons overcame a 17-point deficit to win. The Statesmen netted only 63 yards in the second half, while quarterback Micah Davis, a Harlon Hill Award candidate, went 8-of-27 with two interceptions.

Rose is one of 16 FCS defensive standouts on the Fathead.com Buck Buchanan Award Watchlist presented by The Sports Network. The Buchanan Award honors the FCS defensive player of the year and is presented at a dinner two days before the FCS Championship Game in Frisco, Texas, in January.

Last season Rose stacked up 138 tackles and became the first NSU sophomore since return specialist Terrence McGee (2000) to win All-America honors. In school history, there's been only one three-time football All-American: College Football Hall of Fame and Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame linebacker Gary Reasons, from 1981-83.

Rose had the most tackles by a Demon since 1991, when senior LB Andre "The Terminator" Carron set the single-season mark with 176. Carron broke Gary Reasons' school record of 172 in 1983. J.T. Fenceroy threatened that mark two years later with 170. The fourth-best total is 154 by Carron in his junior year, 1990, and Carron had 152 as a sophomore in 1989.

All-American Jamall Johnson, the leading tackler in the Canadian Football League last season, made 119 in 2004. Kurt Rodriguez had 127 stops in 2000.

In NCAA statistics, Rose last year ranked 14th nationally in tackles per game (11.0, 121 total). The NCAA uses game statistics with tackles credited from the press box.

NSU uses coaches' grades for our tackle totals. We don't believe a statistician sitting far from the field can accurately credit tackles in interior line play as well as a coach watching film with the benefit of replays, and we are most interested in maintaining the integrity of a fair comparison between today's players and the best in our history.

Aldredge earns national recognition for top performance by an FCS tight end

Senior TE Justin Aldredge was picked as the College Football Performance FCS "Tight End of the Week" winner. Also an FCS Athletic Directors Association Academic All-Star last season, Aldredge had 97 yards on three receptions, including the 32-yard touchdown from Henderson that put the Demons on the scoreboard less than two minutes into the second half. It was his ninth career touchdown catch.

Aldredge was also active on all special teams and was a stalwart blocking in the running attack as NSU posted 71 yards on the ground while turning around the game in the third quarter.

NSU has been very good in the close games recently

The 24-23 squeaker over Delta State marked the fifth time since the start of last year Northwestern has won a game decided in the fourth quarter, in their last five opportunities.

The Demons' first four wins in 2010 were by a total of 24 points with each outcome decided in the final two minutes or overtime. None of their 2010 losses were resolved in the waning minutes of play.

Tracking 3 keys to the season for the Demons

Turnover margin, minimizing "foolish" penalties and ramping up the running game have been set apart by coach Bradley Dale Peveto as 3 key areas for NSU to improve in 2011. Improvement came in two of those three keys in the opening win.

After week one, NSU is a +1 in turnover margin, and practically speaking, +2. The Demons lost two fumbles. They made two interceptions, recovered a fumble, and recovered a kickoff not fielded by Delta State (officially recorded as an onside kick although it sailed inside the Statesmen's 30). Last year, NSU was minus 15 in turnover margin, and still won five times. In the winless 2009 season,

DEMONS ON THE AIRWAYS

Natchitoches radio station 100.7 KZBL will be the flagship station for all Demon and Lady Demon sports. Baldridge-Dumas Communications operates 100.7 KZBL. The Demon Sports Network features Patrick Netherton as the play-by-play announcer and Tony Taglavore will provide insightful commentary with former Demon Britt Brittain on the spot for sideline updates. Demon football will also be available on network outlets in Alexandria (104.3 KEZP-FM), Shreveport (92.1 FM, KSYR), Many (99.9 KTEZ-FM), and Leesville (92.7 KBDV-FM) Broadcasts can also be heard by linking to "www.nsudemons.com" on the internet. Coach Peveto hosts the "Demon Huddle" talk show on 100.7 KZBL each Thursday night from 6-7 at Antoon's Riverfront Restaurant in Natchitoches.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials are necessary for admittance to the Turpin Stadium press box and field house. Credentials also grant the bearer a meal in the press box, served well before kickoff. All requests for credentials (press or sideline) should be made to SID Doug Ireland, by fax (318-357-4515) or e-mail (ireland@nsula.edu). Credentials will be mailed if time permits. If not, credentials will be available in the Sports Information office on Fridays before home games and at the Will Call window in the southwest corner of Turpin Stadium's press box side on game day.

PHOTO DECK

Photo deck space is limited. Northwestern's game taping crew has priority on the sixth level deck. There are two film decks on the fifth level, available on a first-come first-serve basis. Access to the top of the press box is available. There is usually space in the stands immediately below the press box. In the event of a televised game, the originating TV crew has priority.

POSTGAME INTERVIEW POLICY

To ensure equal access for all media, the Demon locker room will be closed. Postgame interviews will be conducted in the Stroud Room located to the east of the football lockerroom. Coach Bradley Dale Peveto and selected players will do a live postgame radio show outside the Stroud Room but will be available immediately in alternating shifts. SID Doug Ireland and other SID staff will arrange. At home games, the Turpin Stadium press box elevator will be held with approximately four minutes left to play and media will be escorted to field level at that time.

WEEKDAY INTERVIEW POLICY

Player interviews must be set up through SID Doug Ireland at least one day in advance to minimize demands on the student-athlete's busy schedule. Brief face-to-face post-practice interviews may be conducted if time permits. the Demons were a miserable -19 in turnovers.

Penalties were abundant: 17 for 154 yards (both highs in Peveto's 23 games as coach), including five personal fouls and seven false starts. NSU averaged 88.4 penalty yards last year and had season worst totals of 15-141 in the season finale at Stephen F. Austin. In the five games in 2010 in which the Demons had 10+ penalties, they were 1-4, defeating only Division II Tarleton State. The 17 penalties were the most for the Demons in 44 games, since a 2007 loss at Northeastern.

The running game netted 116 yards, including 161 yards gained and 26 yards lost on four sacks. The Demons ran for 71 yards in the third quarter while turning the game around. Last year NSU averaged 106.2 ypg with a high of 242 at Central Arkansas.

Demons winless vs. current SEC teams in 18 tries

Along with going 0-10 (officially) against LSU, the Demons are 0-3 against Arkansas (all prior to the Razorbacks joining the SEC), 0-1 vs. Georgia, 0-2 against Mississippi State and 0-2 against Ole Miss. The Ole Miss defeats (27-7, 2006; 38-31, 2007) and the 2002 loss at Georgia (45-7, when the Bulldogs were No. 4 nationally) are the only three SEC matchups for the Demons since Northwestern became Division I in 1977.

Northwestern 0-2 against nationally-ranked BCS foes

The 2002 loss at Georgia was the second vs. a ranked FBS or BCS conference foe for the Demons as a Division I team. The 1988 NSU Demons fell 35-14 at No. 21 Missouri, but went on to win the Southland Conference and reach the FCS playoff semifinals with Bradley Dale Peveto as defensive coordinator.

LSU to NSU – Demons' coaching staff has 9 former Tigers, Demons have 2 ex-LSU players

Head coach Bradley Dale Peveto left the LSU staff three years ago, following four seasons with the Tigers, to become the Demons' head coach. He brought with him special teams coordinator and tight ends coach Brendan Farrell, who was with the Tigers for three years, and John Greely, a Baton Rouge native and student assistant who is NSU's football operations director. Former LSU strength and conditioning staffer Joe Long came over from SMU in early 2009 to take charge of that key function, implementing the same Gayle Hatch Strength and Conditioning System that has been in place at LSU. Hatch, the Baton Rouge icon, is a Northwestern alumnus who was a great basketball star for the Demons in the early 1960s. He is in the university's Long Purple Line for distinguished alumni along with the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame.

Former LSU linebacker (2007-08) and Academic All-SEC selection Phillip Piggott is in his second year on staff. Two-year (2008-09) Tigers' letterwinner (fullback, special teams) Austin Mangin and LSU graduate Alex Wright are in their first year as administrative graduate assistants for the Demons. Defensive line coach and assistant head coach for defense Jay Thomas was a graduate assistant coach at LSU under renowned assistant Pete Jenkins and head coach Mike Archer when the Tigers won the 1988 SEC title.

Transferring in from LSU to play for Peveto's Demons before last season was Jake Bryan, a tight end who started seven games in 2010 and played in all 11 with 9 catches for 106 yards and a TD. Deep snapper Justin Warner also transferred to Northwestern before last season and is the backup to David Larsen in that role.

Also on the Northwestern team is redshirt freshman fullback Forrest Graham, whose mother is Tiger Athletic Foundation director of ticketing/parking Jamie Graham.

NSU to LSU – four Demons close to the action for the Tigers

Coach Les Miles' sideline security team includes a former Demon football player. Capt. Russell Roge' grew up in Natchitoches, was a standout at St. Mary's HS locally and was on the Demon squad in the mid-1970s before he moved into the law enforcement ranks. He is now with the LSU Police Department and is one of Coach Miles' escorts on the field at games.

The "Voice of the Tigers" is a 1967 Northwestern graduate and a former Demon baseball player. Jim Hawthorne, a native of Anacoco, got his first collegiate broadcasting experience doing Northwestern football, basketball and baseball in Natchitoches for KNOC Radio alongside Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame broadcaster Norm Fletcher. Hawthorne is in his 30th year as the "Voice of the Tigers" and this spring was selected for the 2011 Lindsey Nelson Award given to the country's top college football play-by-play announcer. He is the "dean" of SEC broadcasters.

Another NSU graduate is in his ninth season as the television "Voice of the Tigers" for Cox Sports Television. Lyn Rollins, who was also around Northwestern and under the guidance of Norm Fletcher in the late 1960s and early 1970s before graduating in 1972, is the play-by-play announcer for CST's coverage of LSU sports. He took that job in 2003 after more than a decade as the radio "Voice of the Demons" on the Demon Sports Network. Twice, Rollins has been honored as the Louisiana Sportscaster of the Year.

LSU assistant AD/ticket manager Brian Broussard worked as Northwestern's ticket manager in 1996 prior to joining the LSU staff.

Demons have Tigers to thank for six of our all-time greats

Some of Northwestern's greatest players began their careers at LSU. Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame members and Demon greats RB Charlie Tolar and WR Charlie Hennigan first attended LSU in the 1950s, with Hennigan running track for the Tigers, not playing football. Tolar set the Demons' career rushing mark from 1956-58. Hennigan was a track star for the Demons in an era when Northwestern rarely passed (1955-57). They rank among the all-time AFL greats, teaming with LSU's Billy Cannon on the high-scoring Houston Oilers teams of that era.

They are among six legends listed on the Top 100 Demon Players of All-Time centennial team in 2007 who began their careers at LSU. Others: LB Sammy Joe Odom (1962-63 with the Demons), DT Ed Orgeron (1980-83), the former Ole Miss coach; QB Craig Nall (2001) and most recently, DT Tory Collins (2003-06).

Demon legend Bobby Hebert is proud Tiger Dad

Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame QB Bobby Hebert starred for the Demons from 1978-82. His son T-Bob is a starting guard for the Tigers. In a memorable scene from the 1997 NSU season, in near tornadic conditions with torrential rains falling at Troy State, Bobby and 8-year-old T-Bob resolutely stood alongside Demon Sports Network sideline reporter Britt Brittain (Bobby's first college roommate) as the only people on the Northwestern sideline who weren't in team gear or on the chain gang. Play was delayed at halftime due to a tornado warning, and the Heberts shrewdly relocated to the press box to watch the rest of a stirring 14-13 Demon victory Nov. 1, 1997.

LSU's Will Blackwell also has family bond with Demon football

Tigers' offensive lineman Will Blackwell is the son of a former Demon standout, tight end Jimmy Blackwell, who played with Bobby Hebert at NSU. Jimmy lettered four years from 1980-83. Will's maternal grandfather is former Demons' defensive coordinator Jerry Arledge (now at West Monroe HS), who was on A.L. Williams' staff at Northwestern along with offensive coordinator Billy Laird (now at Ruston HS), the father of Demons' defensive coordinator Brad Laird.

Northwestern State is receiving votes

The Bonnettes

Michael Bonnette is the LSU sports information director. Younger brother Matthew Bonnette is the NSU associate SID. Their dad, Louis, is a CoSIDA Hall of Famer at McNeese, who played LSU last year, making this Bonnette Bowl 2.

It has happened before...

...Demons coach Bradley Dale Peveto has visited Tiger Stadium and walked away a winner. That happened when he was an assistant coach for Houston in 1999 and the Cougars prevailed 20-7 on Nov. 13.

...The Demons have beaten LSU in football. It happened when the newly-dubbed Demons of Louisiana State Normal School opened the 1924 season at home Oct. 3 with a 13-0 win over the LSU Freshmen. That was sandwiched between season opening losses at LSU in 1923 (40-0) and 1925 (27-0) to the varsity Tigers. Those shutouts are among 10 meetings officially on both schools' books, with the Demons never having scored in 10 matchups with the LSU varsity.

Memories of the last meeting, in 1942, still strong for three Demons

At least two players, and one coach, can share recollections of the Demons' last visit to LSU, 69 years ago in 1942. Dr. Thomas Paul Southerland of Natchitoches and J.C. Carlin of Alexandria pulled on leather helmets for Louisiana State Normal, the reigning Louisiana Intercollegiate Champions, with assistant coach Walter Ledet on the sidelines on that Sept. 19 evening. The game didn't end well for the Demons, a 40-0 loss, but it kicked off a 6-2 season for Normal, which didn't give up more than a touchdown and only 31 total points in any of its remaining games. Southerland, Carlin and Ledet are believed to be the only surviving members of that team.

Every one of the players from the Demons' 1942 teams went from the playing field to World War II. Normal did not field a team in 1943. Only two returned to play football for the Demons after the war, but none was killed in action.

Carlin flew 35 combat missions for the U.S. Army Air Corps in heavy bombardment in WWII. Southerland served in the Pacific theatre and received a commendation for service at Iwo Jima, with involvement also at Saipan and Okinawa.

Southerland is a retired vice president at Northwestern while Ledet retired as registrar and made the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame due largely to his exploits as track and field coach. The 1942 team also included future Northwestern president Dr. Arnold Kilpatrick.

Demons among nation's most improved in 2010

With an improvement of five wins in 2010 over the 2009 season, Northwestern State tied Maryland for the fourth most improved record in NCAA Division I football last season.

The improvement extended to the classroom. When the NCAA issued its annual Academic Progress Rate report in May, Northwestern ranked seventh among 125 FCS programs in the level of improvement from 2008-09 to 2009-10 in the APR score for its football program. That jump came in Bradley Dale Peveto's first season as the Demons' head coach.

Get into your seats for the Demons' first play and first possession

Last year, Northwestern averaged 19 yards per play on its first offensive snap of the game. NSU has scored on its first possession of the game 9 times in 23 games over the past two seasons under offensive coordinator Todd Cooley.

The first play and series vs. Delta State were comparatively mundane: a 3-yard loss on a rushing play started the possession, which ended with a punt after six plays and 24 yards gained.

Young and experienced: playing true freshmen pays dividends for Demons

Three true freshmen played against Delta State: TE Chris De-ver, WR Brandon Monroe and LB Ragan Robichaux.

The Demons have another 23 players who have played as true freshmen in either 2009 (13) or 2010 (10) on their 2011 roster. A total of 59 letterwinners opened preseason camp Aug. 2.

Accomplished returners

Northwestern State senior linebacker Yaser Elqutub won the Southland Conference's Steve McCarty Citizenship Award for 2010-11, and was also recognized in May as one of 133 Newman Civic Fellows from around the country based on his community service activities.

Elqutub and senior tight end Justin Aldredge were among only 55 players from around the country chosen for the FCS Athletic Directors Association Academic All-Star Team for 2010, spotlighting outstanding scholar-athletes in Division I's playoff subdivision. Elqutub and Aldredge also are returning Academic All-District 6 selections, making that team last fall alongside players from Texas, LSU and Oklahoma, among others, on a ballot including nominees from Division I teams in six states: New Mexico, Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Mississippi, and Louisiana.

Injuries have six Demons on the shelf

Northwestern lost two players for the season and four more are out indefinitely after major injuries in preseason. There aren't any injuries from the Delta State game that will keep players off the field at LSU.

Out for the year: second team G Josh Cunningham (knee), backup DT Cornist Broadway (back). Out indefinitely, possibly all season: backup LB Wa'Derrious Sellers (shoulder), backup OL Sasha Erler (arm), backup OL Bingo Henderson (knee), true freshman OL Xavier Jefferson (wrist).

Demons have game captains for LSU

Captains for the season opener, as chosen by the coaches, are senior C Zach Case, senior LB Yaser Elqutub, and senior S and holder Phil LeBlanc. Noteworthy that two of last week's captains, TE Justin Aldredge and DE Ricky Issac, were named "Players of the Game" for their position group by the NSU coaching staff after grading game tape.

"The Demon Deacons" provide leadership for NSU players

The team relies heavily on 19 "Demon Deacons," the team's leadership group. Coach Bradley Dale Peveto regularly consults with the Demon Deacons on issues big and small - to assure that players have real input into decisions that impact their NSU experience. Players in each position group vote for their "Deacon" and if there's a neck-and-neck vote, two players are selected.

The Demon Deacons concept was initially used at Northwestern by one of Peveto's mentors, coach Sam Goodwin, the school's winningest coach in his 17 seasons (1983-99). Peveto came from LSU, where coach Les Miles and the Tigers followed

the same approach with their "Unity Council."

The Demon Deacons offensively are QBs Paul Harris and Brad Henderson, RBs Sidney Riley and Sterling Endsley, WR T.C. Henry, OL Zach Case, FB Brant Legendre and TEs Justin Aldredge and David Larsen.

Defensively, Demon Deacons are DE Wade Williams and Ricky Issac, DT Quinn Anthony, LBs Derek Rose and Yaser Elqutub, S Phil LeBlanc and Jamaal White, CBs Jeremy Lane and Cashas Pollard. Special teams are represented by K John Shaughnessy.

All Demons going by the same name

The new NSU jersey tops have a significant change in style. Players' surnames are no longer on the back of the jerseys.

Instead, the word "Demons" is on the back of each jersey.

Coach Bradley Dale Peveto wanted to emphasize the team concept.

Poignant tribute to Coach Peveto and his family

The afternoon before opening the 2011 season, the Demons gathered in their Ready Room for a team meeting. The Demon Deacons, 19 players elected by their teammates to represent them as team leaders, made a presentation to their head coach.

In a six-week stretch from mid-May and into early July, Bradley Dale Peveto lost two of his three brothers. The youngest, Garey Birt Peveto, 47, was stricken by a fatal heart attack in May after returning from the Texas HS track and field championships, where he was coaching a high jumper. Then the long battle with cancer ended in early July for Jeff Peveto, 52, also a lifelong high school coach like their father, Big Ed.

The Demon Deacons decided to honor the memory of the two brothers with a decal of their initials on the back of the NSU helmets, and to dedicate this season to their memory and in honor of the Peveto family. This was a complete surprise to NSU's head coach, although he knew something was up when his wife Melissa and children Peyton and Jacob were at the meeting along with family friend Jim Pierson.

Dancing Demons

A first-year ritual takes place about an hour before kickoff when the Demons take the field for their stretching and exercise in pre-game. NSU will do a haka dance, a traditional dance form of the South Pacific and mostly known from the Maori people of New Zealand, whose rugby team uses the haka in its pregame ritual.

NSU junior college transfer Isaac Puapounga (Poo-ah-POO-ugna) has Samoan roots. The team had a talent show during preseason camp and a haka dance was Isaac's choice of performance. The other Demons loved it, and decided they wanted to add it to their pregame ritual as a fun way to focus and show unity before the game.

Postgame press conference will be streamed live on nsudemons.com

We're offering a new postgame feature to assist writers on deadline and bring increased access to online fans. For every NSU football game this year, the postgame press conference with head coach Bradley Dale Peveto and NSU players will be available at no charge on the nsudemons.com website. The start time will vary depending on the length of each game and how quickly Coach Peveto and the players can get to the press room. We project about 15 minutes after the game ends. We'll have the log-in ready for you 10 minutes after the game ends.

All in the family

TE Justin Aldredge had plenty of family tradition to consider when deciding to play at Northwestern. Aldredge is the grandson of one of NSU's all-time greats, All-America end Corwyn Aldredge, who played two NFL seasons with Cleveland following his days as a Demon in 1962-64. Justin's father, Corwyn Jr., was an All-Southeastern Conference tight end at Mississippi State who played two NFL seasons in Tampa Bay. His uncle, Duke Marcus, was a linebacker on the 1987 Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe) team that won the national FCS title (formerly Division I-AA).

True freshman CB Tri McCoy is the son of Demon letterman Triand McCoy, who played DT from 1986-89. Dad was part of the 1988 Southland Conference championship squad.

WR Louis Hollier is the son of Louis Hollier Sr., who played LB at Louisiana-Lafayette. DE Mike Adams is the son of a former New Orleans Saints defender and a third-round NFL Draft pick by the same name.

Coaches upstairs, on field

During the game, NSU has defensive coordinator Brad Laird, offensive coordinator Todd Cooley, and graduate assistants Jake Landell, Matt Mandich, Phillip Pigott and A.J. Rachal upstairs in the press box.

On the field are head coach/linebackers coach Bradley Dale Peveto, offensive line coach Jeremy Offutt, running backs coach Jake Simon, receivers coach Sean Anderson, tight ends coach and special teams coordinator Brendan Farrell, defensive line coach Jay Thomas and cornerbacks coach De'Vonn Lockett.

NSU's NFL tradition

Northwestern has a proud tradition of producing pro football players – and pro stars. Among the dozens of Demons advancing to the NFL have been eight who have become Pro Bowlers, nine who have played in the Super Bowl, one in the Pro Football Hall of Fame (Jackie Smith) and two in the College Football Hall of Fame (Joe Delaney, Gary Reasons).

Two (Bobby Hebert, Mark Duper) have been featured on the cover of Sports Illustrated.

All of the players who played at least one full NFL season are featured with their own personalized displays on 53 pillars underneath the west side of Turpin Stadium. Nearly two dozen others who went to NFL camps are listed on 2 more pillars.

Two former players coaching on Sundays this season

There are 5 NSU alumni active in the NFL, 2 playing with the Buffalo Bills. Two more former Demon players are coaching. New Orleans Saints defensive line coach Bill Johnson and Philadelphia Eagles strength coach Barry Rubin are on NFL sidelines each Sunday.

Johnson arrived in New Orleans in 2009 after being on Mike Shanahan's staff in Denver in 2007-08. It was excellent timing – the Saints stormed to the Super Bowl title.

Johnson played center from 1975-78, and Rubin was a Jewish All-America tight end from 1978-80. Johnson and Rubin were student/graduate coaches and began their coaching careers here.

Rubin is in his 14th NFL season. He was formerly assistant and then head strength coach in Green Bay, and returned to the NFL ranks two years ago with the Eagles. Johnson is in his 11th NFL season.

Three Demons active in the NFL, three more in the CFL

Former Demon All-Americans Demetrius Bell and Terrence McGee are starters for the Buffalo Bills. Isiah "Ike" Greenhouse is on the Dallas Cowboys' practice roster.

McGee is beginning his 9th season with Buffalo. The 2005 Pro Bowler last year signed a long-term contract (4 years, \$27 million). McGee is a well-regarded starting cornerback who has also made a mark as a kick returner. In 2005, McGee became the first player in NFL history to run back a kickoff and an interception for touchdowns in the same game (vs. Cincinnati). He shares the Bills' franchise record with 7 return TD (5 KOR, 1 int., 1 fumble).

He was recently named the 47th best player in club history.

Bell was a 2007 All-American offensive tackle for the Demons. He was a 7th-round 2008 NFL Draft pick by the Bills. He defied projections that had him, at best, making the practice squad last year. He became the starting left tackle in 2009 for the first 8 games, before an injury sidelined him. He was the starting left tackle in all 16 games last season and has won that job again this year, coach Chan Gailey confirmed Wednesday. This is the final year of Bell's rookie contract and a good season would lead to a huge pay boost for him.

Greenhouse spent his rookie season in 2010 with the Houston Texans, on the practice squad, activated for two games. The Cowboys are, like the Texans, impressed with his special teams play and are trying to develop him as a linebacker.

Another former Demon, 2004 All-American LB Jamall Johnson, is a veteran with the CFL's Hamilton Tiger Cats. He led the CFL in tackles last season. He has a rookie Demon in front of him, 2009 senior DT Al Smith. Playing for the Edmonton Eskimos is former Demon CB David Pittman.

He's a captain of enthusiasm. He's a human energy burst. He's a passionate leader. He's a documented coaching whiz on defense and special teams. He's all in, for the long haul. And he's going to do it the right way.

Those qualities have all been evident from the time Bradley Dale Peveto strode to the podium in front of 250 people on Dec. 22, 2008 to shake the hand of Northwestern State director of athletics Greg Burke before making his first remarks as the Demons' head football coach.

He's known as "Coach Peve" to many - "Big Daddy Peve" to others - and is a fast-bonding friend to anyone who crosses his path.

A pair of Texas couples visiting Natchitoches encountered him at lunch in a local restaurant. They came away feeling they had met the local Chamber of Commerce president, so detailed and effusive were his tips on places to visit, things to do and dining recommendations.

That personality has contributed to a long-recognized knack for recruiting. It's been borne out at NSU both with players and coaches.

The Demons' 2009 signing class, put together in six weeks after Peveto was hired, was ranked No. 1 in FCS by Rivals.com experts. The 2010 class was rated No. 4 nationally among FCS schools in the Rivals.com rankings the day after National Signing Day. In 2011, Rivals.com stopped ranking FCS signing classes - but Peveto and staff didn't stop signing highly-recruited prospects.

Looking through his coaching staff, Peveto has blended accomplished NSU assistants with top-quality newcomers to Natchitoches such as former Nicholls head coach Jay Thomas and former Central Arkansas offensive coordinator Todd Cooley. His staff has followed his lead and has become very active and visible in the community and with NSU alumni and supporters.

Peveto is a former LSU co-defensive coordinator whose highly-successful 23-year college football coaching career includes the Tigers' 2007 BCS national championship and Northwestern State's FCS semifinal playoff season of 1998.

His latest accomplishment is entering the conversation for the national Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award from the Sports Network last November, as the Demons were surging in a stretch run that brought them to the brink of a championship and postseason play. NSU entered the final game of the 2010 season with the opportunity to win a share of the Southland Conference crown, and advance to the FCS playoffs, but could not overcome Top 10-ranked Stephen F. Austin on the road.

Still, the accomplishment Peveto is more proud about is having the Demons rank as the nation's fourth most-improved team in Division I last season, winning five more games than in 2009.

Right alongside that feat: having one of the most improved Academic Progress Rate scores among any FCS football program in his first year, 2009-10. That 42 percent jump was reported in this May's APR release by the NCAA and ranks seventh among the 117 FCS programs in Division I.

Peveto is the 13th head coach in the 102-year history of intercollegiate football at Northwestern. He was defensive coordinator for the Demons from 1996-98 under the school's winningest head coach, Sam Goodwin.

Northwestern won the Southland Conference championship and reached the FCS playoffs in 1997 and 1998, going 12-2 in the SLC and 19-7 overall in those seasons. The 1998 team, outright SLC champions, finished with a No. 3 national ranking after reaching No. 2 at the outset of the national playoffs, hosting three postseason games in Turpin Stadium before a fourth-quarter rally by eventual national champion Massachusetts halted the 11-3 Demons in a semifinal game. The 1997 Demons shared the SLC title by winning six straight games after a 2-3 start, capping the run with a stirring 38-21 homefield triumph over rival Stephen F. Austin, denying the Lumberjacks a co-championship and a postseason berth.

Peveto has also been defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State and Houston, where he was also assistant head coach in 2002. He has also been part of coaching staffs at Arkansas, Southern Mississippi, Stephen F. Austin and Trinity Valley Community College. The Orange-field, Texas, native played in four bowl games from 1982-86 at SMU, where he was a safety, special teams star and team captain while the Mustangs went 43-14.

With Peveto on the sidelines as co-coordinator and linebackers coach in 2008, LSU's defense ranked 17th in the nation in rushing defense

(110 ypg) and 32nd in total defense (326 ypg). In his three previous years with LSU, Peveto held a dual role, serving as the special teams coordinator and coaching the Tiger linebackers.

As linebackers coach, Peveto's development of players at that position was critical to the success of the Tiger defense that ranked among the top five in the nation in 2005-07. In 2007, linebacker Ali Highsmith earned first-team All-America honors from CBSsports.com, while also being named a second-team All-American by the Associated Press. Highsmith earned first-team All-SEC honors in 2006, while junior Darry Beckwith was a second-team All-SEC pick.

As LSU's special teams coordinator, Peveto had both his punter (Patrick Fisher) and placekicker (Colt David) earn first-team All-SEC honors in 2007. It marked the first time in school history that LSU had the All-SEC punter and kicker on its roster in the same season. Fisher averaged a league-best 44.5 yards per punt in 2007, while David kicked a school-record 26 field goals and led the SEC in scoring with a league record 147 total points.

In his three years as LSU's special teams coordinator, the Tigers returned two punts for touchdowns and a pair of kickoffs for a score. They also blocked six kicks, converted 49-of-71 field goals and 165-of-167 extra points.

In 2005, Peveto's impact was immediate as the Tigers fielded some of the best special teams units in the country. LSU ranked first in the SEC and fifth in the nation in net punting (39.0 average). The Tigers were also first in the conference in kickoff coverage (45.5 net average) and second in the league and 12th nationally in punt return average (14.1). LSU's field goal and point-after-touchdown units were also much improved as the Tigers converted 45-of-46 PATs in 2005 and connected on 14-of-24 field goals.

Peveto (pronounced PEA-vit-toe) left LSU on a high note. He completed his duties as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at LSU when the Tigers dominated Georgia Tech in the 2009 Chick-Fil-A Bowl in Atlanta. LSU's defense shackled the nation's No. 1 rushing offense in a 38-3 rout.

In his three years as defensive coordinator at Northwestern, Peveto's defense quickly earned the nickname "Purple Swarm" and coined the phrase "Swarm, Baby, Swarm" for his attacking defensive style, which had NSU ranked nationally in several statistical categories during each of his three seasons. Four of his players earned All-America honors. In addition, four Demon players were selected in the NFL draft, three after the 1998 season, including current Washington Redskins safety Mike Green.

Under his direction, the Demon defense also set single-game records for fewest yards allowed, fewest rushing yards allowed, and most quarterback sacks. NSU also set school season records for most defensive touchdowns scored. In addition, the "Purple Swarm" also set season records for quarterback sacks in two of his three seasons, accumulating 52 in 1998 and 122 in the last three years.

Peveto comes from a family with a rich football coaching tradition. His late father, Ed, coached high school football in the southeast Texas area and was inducted into the Greater Houston Coaches Hall of Honor in 1993 and into the Golden Triangle Coaches Hall of Fame in 1997. Two of his brothers, Jeff and Garey Birt, coached at high schools in the southeast Texas area.

Peveto is married to the former Melissa Weser, and the couple has a daughter, Payton Marie (8), and a son, Jacob Edward (5).

COURAGEOUS COMBACK CARRIES DEMONS TO 24-23 VICTORY IN SEASON OPENER

Northwestern State 24, Delta State 23
Sept. 1, 2011 • Turpin Stadium • Natchitoches, La.

Junior college transfer quarterback Brad Henderson caught fire, completing a school record 13 straight passes to spark a huge second-half rally from a 17-point deficit as Northwestern State prevailed 24-23 over Division II power Delta State last Thursday night at Turpin Stadium.



Quarterback Brad Henderson set a school record with 13 consecutive pass completions.

Henderson replaced starter Paul Harris and guided the Demons (1-0) back from a 17-0 halftime deficit with 24 unanswered points, scoring on four of their first five possessions after halftime and fumbling away another chance inside the visitors' 30. Delta State (1-1), last year's Division II runner-up and No.

2 in the division this season, missed a chance to win the game with 10 seconds left on a failed two-point conversion pass.

Northwestern won its 499th all-time game with its second-biggest rally since moving into Division I in 1977, topped only by a second-half rally from a 23-0 deficit to win 27-23 in the 2005 opener at Louisiana-Monroe.

Henderson completed his first 13 passes, including a 32-yard touchdown to senior tight end Justin Aldredge less than two minutes into the second half to get NSU on the board. The Demons drew within 17-14 on a 10-play, 61-yard drive capped by a 2-yard Sterling Endsley run, and took the lead on a 3-yard Endsley run set up by a Cashas Pollard interception at the Statesmen's 41-yard line.
