### NEXT UP

#### LSU Looks To Extend Nation's Longest Non-Conference Regular Season Streak

LSU will look to extend the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak on Saturday when the second-ranked Tigers host Northwestern State at 7 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on LSU's pay-per-view network – TigerVision. LSU goes into the contest having won 34 straight non-conference regular season games, a streak that dates back to the 2002 season. Saturday's meeting will be the first between the teams since 1942 when the Tigers beat the Demons (then called Louisiana Normal) in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 10-0 all-time against Northwestern State with all of those games being played between 1911 and 1942. Saturday's game will also be a homecoming of sorts as Northwestern State head coach Bradley Dale Peveto served as an assistant on **Les Miles'** staff from 2005-08. Peveto, who is one of four former LSU coaches that the Tigers will face this year, is in his third year with the Demons. LSU brings a 1-0 overall mark into the contest after opening the year with a 40-27 win over No. 3 Oregon in Arlington, Texas. Northwestern State is 1-0 following a 28-27 win over Delta State in its season-opener last Thursday. LSU, winners of nine straight season-openers, brings an 11-game Tiger Stadium winning streak into the Northwestern State game. In addition, LSU has won 31 consecutive non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, a streak that dates back to the 2000 season when the Tigers dropped a 13-10 decision to UAB on Sept. 23. Miles is 19-0 in non-conference games in Tiger Stadium and he's 29-1 in all non-conference games at LSU. The Tigers are led offensively by a pair of sophomore RBs in **Spencer Ware** (99 yards, 1 TD) and **Michael Ford** (98 yards, 2 TDs). Senior QB **Jarrett Lee** is now 6-4 as a starter following last week's win over Oregon. Lee connected on 10-of-22 passes for 98 yards and a score in the season-opener. Defensively, the Tiger held Oregon to just 335 total yards, including 98 on the ground in the opener. Sophomore CB **Tyrann Mathieu** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors after leading the Tigers with 10 tackles, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, two pass breakups and a touchdown in the win over Oregon.

### STORYLINES

- LSU goes into the Northwestern State game riding streaks of: 34 straight regular-season non-conference wins (longest in nation); 31 straight non-conference wins in Tiger Stadium; 11 straight victories overall in Tiger Stadium; 18 straight wins in September; and 5 straight wins in home-openers.

- LSU is 29-1 in non-conference games and 24-0 in non-conference regular-season games under **Les Miles**.

- LSU has scored 14 special teams touchdowns under head **Les Miles** dating back to 2005.

- Northwestern State coach Bradley Dale Peveto is one of four former LSU coaches (head coach or assistant) that the Tigers will face this year. Others include Nick Saban (Alabama), Will Muschamp (Florida), and Derek Dooley (Tennessee).

- Peveto is also one of four former assistants for Miles who is now a head coach. Others include Larry Porter (Memphis), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State) and Mike Gundy (Oklahoma State).

- LSU is ranked No. 2 or higher in AP poll going into 2nd game of season for 3rd time in school history. Others

- came in '59 (#1) and '07 (#2).

- LSU is ranked in the top 25 for the 34th straight poll and for the 95th time in 99 weeks under Les Miles. LSU has played 78 of its 80 games under Miles in the top 25 and the Tigers are 62-16 in those games.

- LSU has won 11 straight games when winning the turnover battle. Since the start of 2005, the Tigers are 27-4 when forcing more turnovers than they give up.

- **Les Miles** is 1-0 against Northwestern State. Miles defeated the Demons, 24-0, in his first season at Oklahoma State on Sept. 29, 2001.

# Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SEVENTH SEASON

The driving force behind the LSU Tigers' continued dominance at the national level is head coach Les Miles. His steadfast approach expects excellence and dedication from his players, coaching staff and all who contribute to the success of LSU Football.

Since taking over as head coach at LSU in January of 2005, Miles has guided the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Title and to three Top 5 rankings. Miles' seven-year record with the Tigers is 63-17, which also includes a Southeastern Conference title, two appearances in the SEC Championship Game and five bowl victories.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in both the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 10 wins for the past six years, the Tigers have also had 104 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 133 earning their college diploma. LSU has graduated 62 of its 80 seniors since the 2007 season.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts in 2005 following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 37 NFL Draft picks over the past six years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards – the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies.

Cornerback Patrick Peterson claimed two national awards in 2010 - the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back and the Bednarik Award as the country's top defender.

The foundation for LSU football is more stable than ever. After 63 wins over the past six years -- including 24 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25 -- and with six straight Top 10 recruiting classes, Miles and the Tigers have solidified LSU's standing as one of college football's premier programs.

One of Les Miles' most impressive qualities is his selfless desire to assist others. Each year, Miles and his wife Kathy host an event that raises nearly \$100,000 for the Children's Miracle Network. In addition, he is active in community service events such as the Mary Bird Perkins Cancer annual fundraiser, the Special Olympics and the Baton Rouge Children's Advocacy Center Celebrity Waiter Event.

Miles spent a week in June of 2006 taking part in the USO Tour, where the Tiger head coach visited American troops serving in Kuwait and Iraq. Miles was joined on the tour, which serves as a morale booster for the troops serving abroad, by former Notre Dame coach Lou Holtz and Tampa Bay Rays owner Vincent Naimoli.

The week-long trip saw Miles visit several U.S. bases in Kuwait before traveling to Iraq, where he met with hundreds of American troops and even flew over the city of Baghdad in a Black Hawk helicopter.

When Miles isn't overseeing his LSU football family, he can most likely be found in the bleachers supporting his wife and kids at their sporting events.

## LAST TIME OUT: #4 LSU 40, #3 OREGON 27

LSU's defense contained one of the most potent offensive attacks in college football limiting Oregon to just 335 total yards as the fourth-ranked Tigers opened 2011 with an impressive 40-27 victory over the third-ranked Ducks in Cowboys Stadium. While the defense was doing its job, the LSU offense was methodical in its approach, wearing down the Ducks with a steady pounding of sophomore running backs **Spencer Ware** (99 yards, 1 TD) and **Michael Ford** (96 yards, 2 TDs). The duo combined for 195 yards and 3 TDs as the Tigers broke open a tight game at halftime with 17 unanswered points during a 7-minute stretch in the second half. Trailing 6-3 early in the second quarter, LSU DB **Tyrann Mathieu** stripped Oregon's punt returner Kenyon Barner of the ball and then scooped up the fumble and raced three-yards for the score, giving the Tigers a 9-6 advantage. LSU QB **Jarrett Lee** hit **Rueben Randle** with a 10-yard TD pass just before halftime to give the Tigers the lead for good at 16-13. Touchdown runs by Ford and Ware in the third quarter stretched the lead to 30-13 at the 3:03 mark. Oregon pulled to within 33-20 early in the fourth quarter, but a 16-yard TD run by Ford put the game out of reach at 40-20 with just over two minutes left in the contest. LSU held Oregon All-America RB LaMichael James to just 54 yards on 18 carries. Lee finished 10-of-22 for 98 yards and 1 TD.

### Northwestern State's LSU Ties

LSU and Northwestern State share quite a few ties as Demons head coach Bradley Dale Peveto served as an assistant on **Les Miles'** staff for three years from 2005-08 ... Northwestern State tight ends coach and special teams coordinator Brendan Farrell worked alongside Peveto on the LSU staff for three years ... Other staff ties include John Greeley (Director of Football Ops), who worked in the recruiting office at LSU and is a graduate of LSU ... Head strength coach Joe Long is an LSU graduate and he worked on **Tommy Moffitt's** staff at LSU for two years in 2006-07 ... Two former LSU football players - Austin Mangin and Phillip Pigott - are both administrative assistants on the football staff at Northwestern State ... Northwestern State assoc. SID Matthew Bonnette is the brother of LSU SID Michael Bonnette.

### LSU'S Northwestern State Ties

**Jim Hawthorne**, the Voice of the Tigers, is a 1967 graduate of Northwestern State where he was a member of the Demons baseball team. Hawthorne, who got his start in the broadcast business doing play-by-play for Northwestern State, is in his 30th season as the Voice of the Tigers. Other ties include LSU Asst. AD for Ticket Operations **Brian Broussard**, who worked as the ticket manager at Northwestern State in 1996; Assistant strength coach **Derrick LeBlanc** is a 1997 graduate of Northwestern State where he played football for four years.

### Mathieu Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week and Thorpe DB of the Week

LSU DB **Tyrann Mathieu** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week as well as Thorpe Defensive Back of the Week following his performance in the Tigers' 40-27 win over third-ranked Oregon. Mathieu, a sophomore from New Orleans, had another outstanding all-around game for the Tigers with team-high 10 tackles, one forced fumble, two pass breakups and a tackle for a loss. It was just the second start of Mathieu's career. Mathieu also scored LSU's first touchdown of the game when he both stripped Oregon's punt returner Kenyon Barner of the ball and then scooped up the fumble and raced three-yards for the score. Mathieu, who is listed at 5-feet-9, 180 pounds, was at times the smallest player on the field. He played every defensive snap (82 plays) for the Tigers as LSU's defense limited Oregon to just 335 total yards, including only 95 on the ground. LSU also held Oregon All-America running back LaMichael James to only 54 yards on 18 carries. In 14 career games with the Tigers, Mathieu ranks second in school history with six forced fumbles. He's also forced at least one turnover in six of the 14 games in his LSU career. The defensive player of the week honor is the first of Mathieu's career.

### LSU's 34-Game Non-Conference Regular-Season Streak Longest In Nation

LSU brings the nation's longest non-conference regular-season winning streak into the Northwestern State game at 34 straight. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular-season game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va. Wisconsin is second on the list with 29 straight non-conference regular-season wins, followed by Missouri (22) and Kentucky (20). **Les Miles** has accounted for 24 of the 34 wins during the streak.



## The Significance of the Oregon Win

- Was the highest ranked win for LSU since topping No. 1 Ohio State in the 2008 BCS Championship Game.
- Was the highest ranked regular season win for LSU since upsetting No. 1 Florida on Oct. 11, 1997.
- It was the first win over a non-conference top-five team in the regular season in school history. The previous highest ranked non-conference regular season victories were over a No. 7-ranked team three times. (No. 7 Texas A&M in 1987, No. 7 Florida State in 1982, No. 7 Notre Dame in 1971).

## LSU Scores TD On Special Teams For 14th Time Under Les Miles

When DB **Tyrann Mathieu** stripped Oregon punt returner Kenyon Barner of the ball and then scooped it up and ran 3-yards for the score last week, it marked the 14th time under **Les Miles** that the Tigers have scored a touchdown on special teams. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all seven seasons under Miles. The following is a breakdown of LSU's special teams touchdowns under Miles:

## LSU Wins Turnover Battle Vs. Oregon; Tigers are 27-4 Under Miles When Doing So

LSU was plus-3 in the turnover margin category last week against Oregon as the Tigers forced four turnovers (3 fumbles, 1 interception), while giving up just a fumble in the 40-27 victory. LSU converted those four turnovers into 21 points, representing the most points off takeaways for the Tigers against a ranked team since at least 2000. In 80 games under **Les Miles**, the Tigers are 27-4 when winning the turnover battle. Since the start of the 2005 season, LSU is plus-25 in the turnover margin category. The Tigers have also won 11 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 11-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent.

## LSU Runs Top 25 Streak To 34 Straight

By jumping to No. 2 in the Associated Press poll and No. 3 in the ESPN USA Today Coaches poll, LSU ran its streak to consecutive weeks in the national rankings to 34 straight. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 95 of the 99 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 116 of 119 games ranked in the top 25, including 78 of 80 games under Miles. LSU has a 62-16 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU hasn't played as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 vs. Arkansas and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU was ranked in the preseason Top 25 for the 11th straight year heading into 2011.

## Miles is 37-6 Overall In Tiger Stadium

LSU goes into the 2011 home season with a 36-6 mark under **Les Miles** in Tiger Stadium. LSU was a perfect 7-0 at home in 2010 and the Tigers bring an 11-game home winning streak into the Northwestern State contest. Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama in 2008. LSU also has a loss to No. 1 ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium.

## This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 219-60-4 (.780) at night under the lights compared to a 24-25-3 (.490) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 67-11 overall at home, which includes a 53-5 (.913) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 14-6 (.700) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. ## LSU vs. Louisiana Schools

The Tigers bring a 132-25-8 mark all-time against teams from Louisiana into the Northwestern State contest. The Tigers have won 27 straight games against in-state opponents. LSU's last loss to an in-state foe came in 1982 when Tulane posted a 31-28 win over LSU in Tiger Stadium.

## Miles Has 63 Wins at LSU; He's Averaging 10.3 Wins A Year as Head Coach of the Tigers

LSU coach **Les Miles** recorded his 63rd victory at the school in the 40-27 win over Oregon to open the 2011 season. Now in his seventh year at LSU, Miles is 63-17 in his 80 games with the Tigers. Only two coaches in LSU history have won more games than Miles – Charles McClendon (137) and Bernie Moore (83). In terms of active SEC coaches, only Steve Spurrier (72) needed fewer games than Miles to get to 60 victories. Miles is also averaging 10.3 wins a year at LSU, making him the only coach in school history to average double-figure wins in five or more years.

## More On Miles' List of Achievements

Now in his seventh season with the Tigers, head coach **Les Miles** has put together quite a list of achievements during his 80 games. The following is a look at some of Miles' highlights during his seven seasons with the Tigers:

- Fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), and 60 wins (76 games) in school history.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start for the third time in six years (2005, '07, '10)
- Led LSU to first 7-0 start since 1973 in 2010
- Only coach in SEC history to beat Urban Meyer and Nick Saban in the same year twice (2007, 2010)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice (2005, '07)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year (2010).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 11 wins over coaches who have won national titles
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings

## LSU's Won 18 Straight Games In September

In addition to its 34-game non-conference regular season winning streak, LSU also brings an 18-game winning streak during the month of September into the Northwestern State game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 21-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count.

## Jarrett Lee Runs Record To 6-4 As Starting QB

Senior **Jarrett Lee** ran his record to 6-4 as LSU's starting quarterback with the win over Oregon. Lee went 4-4 as a redshirt freshman in 2008, 1-0 in 2009 and now he's 1-0 this year. Prior to the Oregon game, Lee's last start came in November of 2009 as he guided the Tigers to a 24-16 win over Louisiana Tech. During his career, Lee has help rally the Tigers to four fourth-quarter comebacks, including a dramatic game-winning drive last year against Florida. For his career, Lee has thrown for 2,741 yards, 19 touchdowns and he's completed 223-of-420 passes for a 53.1 completion percentage.

## Jarrett Lee's Thrown 96 Straight Passes Without an Interception

Senior QB **Jarrett Lee** ran his streak of consecutive passes without an interception to 96 straight last week vs. Oregon. Lee hasn't thrown an interception since the fourth quarter of the Tennessee game last year.

## Wing and Alleman Come Up Big In Starting Debuts

LSU opened the 2011 season with a pair of new specialists in redshirt freshman punter **Brad Wing** and junior kicker **Drew Alleman** and both players came up big in the win over Oregon. Wing, the first freshman to hold the punting job for the Tigers since 2000 when Donnie Jones punted for LSU, averaged 41.3 yards on five punts. He had two punts downed inside the 20-yard line with a long of 58 yards. Alleman kicked the first two field goals of his career in the victory – a 44-yarder and a 32-yarder.

## Current LSU Running Backs Have Gone 134 Carries Without Losing A Fumble; Overall Streak At 348

LSU's current group of running backs go into the Northwestern State game riding a streak of 134 carries without losing a fumble. The streak dates back to the Mississippi State game in 2010 when freshman **Alfred Blue** lost a fumble on LSU's final offensive play of the game. Since then, the Tigers have gone 11 straight games without a lost fumble by a running back. Overall, LSU running backs (including 2 that are no longer on team) haven't lost a fumble in 348 straight carries. The following is a look at the number of carries by each running back during the streak: **Stevan Ridley** (194), **Michael Ford** (57), **Spencer Ware** (49), **Richard Murphy** (19), **Russell Shepard** (15), **Alfred Blue** (11), and **Kenny Hilliard** (2). Note: Ridley and Murphy completed are now in the NFL.

## Miles Is 24-13 vs. Top 25 Opponents

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 24-13 in games against ranked opponents during his six years with the Tigers. LSU was 5-2 against Top 25 teams in 2010. LSU won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. In games against teams ranked in the top 10, Miles is 10-9.

## LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 57 of the 72 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis during the early 2000s, LSU has recorded a 57-15 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU was 6-3 in 2009 as a top 10 team and the Tigers were 4-2 a year ago.

## The Chief Back To Run LSU Defense

**John "Chief" Chavis** returns for a third season as LSU's defensive coordinator in 2011. Last year, Chavis led the Tiger defense to top 12 national ranking in three defensive categories. LSU led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in pass defense (169.8 ypg); the Tigers were second in the SEC and No. 11 in the nation in scoring defense (18.2 ppg); and LSU was third in the league and No. 12 in the country in total defense (307.2 ypg). In his first year at LSU in 2009, the Tigers were 11th in the nation in scoring defense as they allowed just six rushing TDs all year. The Tigers opened 2011 by limiting Oregon's high-powered offense to 335 yards and just 95 rushing yards, well below their average of a year ago.

## LSU's Fourth-Quarter Comebacks Under Les Miles

For the 17th time under **Les Miles**, LSU won a football game despite trailing in the fourth quarter as the Tigers rallied from deficits of 24-23, 30-29, and 36-35 to beat Ole Miss, 43-36, in Tiger Stadium in week 11 last year. The following is a look at LSU's fourth quarter comebacks under Miles, how many points the Tigers had to overcome in the final frame to win and the quarterback who engineered the comeback:

## Brandon Taylor To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to senior safety **Brandon Taylor** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. RB Richard Murphy, now with the Jacksonville Jaguars, owned the number in 2010. LSU coach **Les Miles**, along with input from the three other players who have worn Jersey No. 18, determined that Brandon Taylor would wear the jersey in 2011.

Black was preceded at left tackle by Andrew Whitworth, who made 52 consecutive starts at left tackle from 2002-05.

You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Draft picks from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had six defensive linemen earn a total of seven First-Team All-America honors and 12 members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. In 2007, DT Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defensive player in school history - winning four national awards - on his way to becoming the fifth overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft. In the spring of 2009, Defensive end Tyson Jackson became the highest LSU defender ever picked in the NFL Draft, going No. 3 overall to Kansas City. The 2010 season saw Drake Nevis earn All-America honors prior to being selected in the third round of the 2011 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts. - LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 87th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 80th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 36 of its last 41 games at home and 11 straight. Head coach **Les Miles** is 28-1 in Saturday Night home games.
- More than 85,000 fans have attended each of LSU's last 76 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 66 times, including a school-record 93,129 for the Oct. 10, 2009 game that pitted No. 4 LSU against No. 1 Florida.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 47 of the past 54 seasons.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 219-60-4 (.781) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 24-25-3 (.490) at home during the day in that span.
- LSU has won 28 consecutive home games over non-conference opponents. **Les Miles** is 19-0 in non-conference home games.

## No. 4 LSU Shuts Down No. 3 Oregon in Cowboys Classic, 40-27

LSU's defense contained one of the most potent offensive attacks in college football limiting Oregon to just 335 total yards as the fourth-ranked Tigers opened 2011 with an impressive 40-27 victory over the third-ranked Ducks in Cowboys Stadium. While the defense was doing its job, the LSU offense was methodical in its approach, wearing down the Ducks with a steady pounding of sophomore running backs **Spencer Ware** (99 yards, 1 TD) and **Michael Ford** (96 yards, 2 TDs). The duo combined for 195 yards and 3 TDs as the Tigers broke open a tight game at halftime with 17 unanswered points during a 7-minute stretch in the second half. Trailing 6-3 early in the second quarter, LSU DB **Tyrann Mathieu** stripped Oregon's punt returner Kenyon Barner of the ball and then scooped up the fumble and raced three-yards for the score, giving the Tigers a 9-6 advantage. LSU QB **Jarrett Lee** hit **Rueben Randle** with a 10-yard TD pass just before halftime to give the Tigers the lead for good at 16-13. Touchdown runs by Ford and Ware in the third quarter stretched the lead to 30-13 at the 3:03 mark. Oregon pulled to within 33-20 early in the fourth quarter, but a 16-yard TD run by Ford put the game out of reach at 40-20 with just over two minutes left in the contest. LSU held Oregon All-America RB LaMichael James to just 54 yards on 18 carries. Lee finished 10-of-22 for 98 yards and 1 TD.
