LSU Faces Third Top 25 Opponent As No. 2 Tigers Travel To Face No. 16 West Virginia

Second-ranked LSU will put the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak on the line Saturday when the Tigers travel to face 16th-ranked West Virginia in Morgantown. Saturday's game marks LSU's first trip to Morgantown and just the second-ever meeting between the two teams. Last year, LSU beat the Mountaineers, 20-14, in Tiger Stadium. LSU brings a 35-game non-conference regular season winning streak into the contest. LSU hasn't lost a regular season game against a team from another league since a 26-8 setback to Virginia Tech in the 2002 season opener. Kickoff for the Tigers and the Mountaineers is set for 7:12 p.m. CT. The game will be broadcast nationally on ABC with Brent Musburger, Kirk Herbstreit and Erin Andrews handling the call. Both teams go into the contest undefeated as LSU is 3-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC play following last Thursday's 19-6 win over No. 25 Mississippi State, while West Virginia is coming off a 37-31 victory over Maryland. West Virginia represents the third Top 25 team that LSU has faced this year making the Tigers the only team in the nation with three games against ranked opponents thus far. LSU is 25-13 against Top 25 teams under head coach **Les Miles**. LSU goes into the West Virginia game with one of the top defenses in the nation as the Tigers are rated No. 3 in rushing defense (47.7 per game), No. 6 in total defense (207.7 per game) and 15th in scoring defense (12.0 per game). Offensively, LSU is averaging 36.0 points per game and 344.7 total yards a contest (166.0 rushing, 178.7 passing). Senior QB **Jarrett Lee** has completed 67.8 percent of his passes (40-of-59) for 444 yards and three scores in running his record to 9-4 as a starter. A trio of sophomores – **Spencer Ware** (226 yards, 3 TDs), **Michael Ford** (218 yards, 4 TDs) and **Alfred Blue** (55 yards, 1 TD) – lead the rushing attack for the Tigers. True freshman **Odell Beckham, Jr.** leads the team with 15 catches for 111 yards, while junior **Rueben Randle** is second on the club with 12 catches for 229 yards and a pair of scores. Defensively, 17 of the 21 players on the LSU 2-deep have at least one tackle for a loss. Sophomore DB **Tyrann Mathieu** leads the team with 24 tackles. DTs **Michael Brockers** and **Bennie Logan** each have 3.5 tackles for losses, while DE **Barkevious Mingo** and Mathieu have 3.0 TFL. Junior CB **Morris Claiborne** leads team with two interceptions.

STORYLINES

- LSU goes into the West Virginia game riding winning streaks of: 35 straight in non-conference regular season games; 20 straight in September; and 4 straight against non-conference Top 25 teams.

- LSU is ranked in the top 25 for the 36th straight poll and for the 97th time in 101 weeks under **Les Miles**. LSU has played 80 of its 82 games under Miles as a Top 25 team and the Tigers are 64-16 in those games. The 36 consecutive weeks is the fourth longest streak in the nation.

- LSU has scored on 40 consecutive trips (28 TDs, 12 FGs) inside the redzone, a streak that goes back to the second quarter of the McNeese State game on Oct. 16, 2010.

- LSU is 47-4 in night games under **Les Miles** compared to an 18-13 mark in day games.

- LSU is 23-2 under **Les Miles** when a back rushes for 100 yards. The Tigers are also 37-0 under Miles when rushing for 100+ yards as a team, while limiting the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards as a team.

- LSU has won 12 straight games when winning the turnover battle. Since the start of 2005, the Tigers are 28-4 when forcing more turnovers than they give up.

- LSU has scored 14 special teams touchdowns under **Les Miles**, which includes a punt return for a TD last year against West Virginia.

- LSU will be the only team in the nation to have played 3 ranked opponents through the first 4 games of the season.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SEVENTH SEASON

The driving force behind the LSU Tigers' continued dominance at the national level is head coach Les Miles. His steadfast approach expects excellence and dedication from his players, coaching staff and all who contribute to the success of LSU Football.

Since taking over as head coach at LSU in January of 2005, Miles has guided the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Title and to three Top 5 rankings. Miles' seven-year record with the Tigers is 65-17, which also includes a Southeastern Conference title, two appearances in the SEC Championship Game and five bowl victories.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in both the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 10 wins for the past six years, the Tigers have also had 104 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 133 earning their college diploma. LSU has graduated 62 of its 80 seniors since the 2007 season.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts in 2005 following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 37 NFL Draft picks over the past six years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards – the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies.

Cornerback Patrick Peterson claimed two national awards in 2010 - the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back and the Bednarik Award as the country's top defender.

The foundation for LSU football is more stable than ever. After 65 wins over the past six years -- including 25 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25 -- and with six straight Top 10 recruiting classes, Miles and the Tigers have solidified LSU's standing as one of college football's premier programs.

One of Les Miles' most impressive qualities is his selfless desire to assist others. Each year, Miles and his wife Kathy host an event that raises nearly \$100,000 for the Children's Miracle Network. In addition, he is active in community service events such as the Mary Bird Perkins Cancer annual fundraiser, the Special Olympics and the Baton Rouge Children's Advocacy Center Celebrity Waiter Event.

Miles spent a week in June of 2006 taking part in the USO Tour, where the Tiger head coach visited American troops serving in Kuwait and Iraq. Miles was joined on the tour, which serves as a morale booster for the troops serving abroad, by former Notre Dame coach Lou Holtz and Tampa Bay Rays owner Vincent Naimoli.

The week-long trip saw Miles visit several U.S. bases in Kuwait before traveling to Iraq, where he met with hundreds of American troops and even flew over the city of Baghdad in a Black Hawk helicopter.

When Miles isn't overseeing his LSU football family, he can most likely be found in the bleachers supporting his wife and kids at their sporting events.

Series Notes:

LSU and West Virginia meet for the second straight year and for only the second time in football ... LSU leads the series, 1-0, after last year's 20-14 win in Baton Rouge ... LSU is 2-3 all-time against current members of the Big East – unless you no longer consider Syracuse in the Big East - with the only other win coming against Syracuse by a 13-10 count in the 1965 Sugar Bowl ... LSU is 1-0 vs. West Virginia, 1-1 vs. Syracuse, 0-1 vs. Rutgers, and 0-1 vs. Cincinnati ... Prior to last year's game vs. West Virginia, LSU last played a member of the Big East in the 1989 Hall of Fame Bowl, losing to Syracuse 23-10 ... LSU's first game against a current member of the Big East came in 1897 when the Tigers dropped a 26-0 decision to Cincinnati.

LAST TIME OUT: #3 LSU 19, #25 MISSISSIPPI STATE 6 • STARKVILLE, MISS.

LSU's defense held Mississippi State to nearly 400 yards below its season average as the third-ranked Tigers used a methodical offensive effort to post a 19-6 Thursday night win over the Bulldogs in Starkville. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 3-0 lead midway through the first quarter on a 21-yard **Drew Alleman** field goal. Mississippi State tied the game at 3-3 on its next possession before another Alleman field goal just before halftime gave the Tigers a 6-3 lead at the break. The Bulldogs tied the game at 6-6 late in the third quarter, before the Tigers closed the game with 13 unanswered points for the victory. First, Alleman broke the tie with a 41-yard field goal with 1:46 left in the third quarter and then **Jarrett Lee** connected with **Rueben Randle** on a 19-yard TD pass at the 11:56 mark in the fourth quarter to put the Tigers up by 10 at 16-6. Alleman closed the scoring with another field goal at the 2:53 mark. For the game, LSU's defense recorded 15 tackles for losses and five sacks in holding the Bulldogs to just 52 rushing yards and 193 total yards. On 11 possessions, LSU's defense forced a 3-and-out or a turnover seven times. Offensively, Lee completed 21-of-27 passes for 213 yards and one score, while **Spencer Ware** rushed for 107 yards to lead the Tigers rushing attack. LSU finished with 361 yards of total offense (148 rushing, 213 passing) as the Tigers had nearly 38 minutes of possession time.

NOTEBOOK

LSU Defense Ranks Among Best In Nation

Through three games, the LSU defense has established itself as one of the best in the nation as the Tigers are allowing just 12.0 points per game, 47.7 rushing yards a contest and 207.7 total yards a game. LSU ranks No. 3 in the nation in rush defense, No. 6 in total defense and No. 15 in scoring defense. LSU has allowed just 143 rushing yards in the first three games, which is the fewest by the Tigers since 2007 when Mississippi State (10), Virginia Tech (71) and Middle Tennessee (9) were limited to 90 yards during the first three games of the season. Here's a look at some other defensive highlights for LSU through three games:

- 17 of the 21 players on the 2-deep have a tackle for loss
- The starting defensive line has accounted for 11.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks
- The starting secondary has combined for 6.5 tackles for loss, 3 interceptions and 2 fumble recoveries
- LSU has allowed just 2 plays of over 20 yards (23 and 22 yards through the air by Miss. State on last drive of game)
- LSU hasn't allowed a rush of more than 15 yards and the Tigers have allowed just 8 rushing plays of 10 yards or more.
- On 36 possessions, LSU's defense has either forced a 3-and-out or a turnover 19 times.

Claiborne National Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week

LSU CB **Morris Claiborne** has been named the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in the Tigers win over Mississippi State last Thursday. Claiborne, a junior from Shreveport, La., had two interceptions and broke up a pass as the Tigers limited the Bulldogs to just 193 yards of total offense in the 19-6 victory. Mississippi State entered the game leading the Southeastern Conference in total offense (588.0) and rushing offense (321.0). Claiborne, who now has seven career interceptions, is currently tied for third in the SEC interceptions (2) and he's tied for eighth in passes defended (3). The Walter Camp Football Foundation is in its eighth season of honoring a player of the week on both offense and defense during the regular season.

Logan and Beckham, Jr. Claim Weekly SEC Honors

LSU DT **Bennie Logan** and WR **Odell Beckham, Jr.** were honored by the SEC for their play in the Tigers win over Mississippi State last week. Logan was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week and Beckham Jr. was cited as the league's freshman of the week. Logan had five tackles and 3.5 tackles for loss as the Tigers held Mississippi State to nearly 400 yards below their season average. Beckham, Jr. caught a career-best eight passes for 61 yards in the LSU victory.

LSU Brings Nation's Best 35-Game Non-Conference Regular-Season Streak Into West Virginia

LSU brings the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak into West Virginia on Saturday at 35 straight. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular-season game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va. Wisconsin is second on the list with 31 straight non-conference regular-season wins. **Les Miles** has accounted for 25 of the 35 wins during the streak.

LSU To Face Third Top 25 Team; Only Team In Nation To Do Play Three Top 25 Teams Thus Far

LSU will face its third Top 25 team on Saturday when the Tigers line up against No. 16 West Virginia. After Saturday, LSU will be the only team in college football to have faced three Top 25 teams through the first four weeks of the season. Even more impressive, all three of those contests will have come away from home. LSU is also the only team in the SEC to play two non-conference BCS opponents away from home this season. It marks the fourth time in school history and the first since 1988 that LSU will have played three Top 25 opponents through the first four weeks of the season. However, it's the first time in school history all three of those contests have come away from home.

LSU Defense Comes Up With 16 Tackles For Loss Against Mississippi State

LSU's 16 tackles for loss against Mississippi State were the most in a game for Tigers since recording 17 vs. Auburn on Sept. 18, 1999. **Bennie Logan** and **Michael Brockers** had 3.5 and 3.0 tackles for loss, respectively. It's the first time the Tigers have had two players in the same game collect at least three tackles for loss since Kareem Mitchell and Jeremy Lawrence each had three versus Auburn in 1999. Logan's 3.5 TFL were the most by a Tiger since Drake Nevis had 4.5 in the win over Florida last season. As a team, LSU's 30 tackles for loss are the most through the first three games of a season since the 1999 team had 44 (16 vs. San Jose State, 11 vs. North Texas, 17 vs. Auburn).

LSU Defense Goes Another Game Without Allowing A TD; Streak At 8 Quarters

LSU's defense ran its streak of keeping an opponent out of the endzone to eight straight quarters last week against Mississippi State. LSU has not allowed a touchdown in consecutive games for the first time since the 2006 season when Kentucky was held scoreless on Oct. 14 and Fresno State managed two field goals the following week on Oct. 21. Mississippi State, ranked 25th last week, became the first ranked team to not score a TD against LSU since No. Georgia Tech in the 2008 Chick-fil-A Bowl (38-3). LSU also held a ranked opponent without a TD on the road for the first time since beating No. 15 Texas A&M, 17-3, in College Station on Sept. 5, 1987.

LSU's Scored On 40 Straight Trips Inside Redzone

LSU goes into the West Virginia game having scored on 40 straight trips (28 TDs, 12 FGs) inside the redzone dating back to last year. This year, LSU ranks first in the SEC in redzone offense as the Tigers have scored on all 15 trips (12 TDs, 3 FGs) inside the 20-yard line. Last year, LSU finished the year by successfully converting on 25 straight possessions inside the redzone. The last time LSU reached the redzone and didn't convert came on Oct. 12, 2010 when the Tigers missed a second quarter field goal against McNeese State.

LSU Pulls A Rarity Under Miles Against Mississippi State

With a 200-yard passer and a 100-yard rusher against Mississippi State, LSU did something for the first time since the 2008 season in the win over the Bulldogs. Against Mississippi State, **Jarrett Lee** tossed for 213 yards and **Spencer Ware** rushed for 107 yards in the LSU victory. It marked the first time since the Georgia game in 2008 (Jarrett Lee 287 passing yards, Charles Scott 144 rushing yards) that the Tigers had a 200-yard passer and a 100-yard rusher in the same game. LSU's done it 11 time under **Les Miles** and the Tigers are 9-2 in those games. Here's a look at the 200-yard passer and 100-yard rusher games since 2005 for LSU:

LSU's 28-4 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 28-4 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle, which includes a 2-0 record this year. LSU won the turnover battle against both Oregon and Mississippi State. This year, LSU is plus-4 in the turnover margin category, which ranks second in the SEC behind Vanderbilt (+6). Since the start of the 2005 season, LSU is plus-26 in the turnover margin category. The Tigers have also won 12 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 12-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent.

LSU's Scored Following Five of Seven Takeaways This Year

LSU goes into the West Virginia game having scored 30 points on its seven takeaways this year. LSU's seven takeaways (3 fumbles, 4 interceptions) have resulted in 30 points for the Tigers. LSU Runs Top 25 Streak To 36 Straight

With its No. 2 national ranking in the Associated Press poll and No. 3 in the USA Today Coaches poll, LSU ran its streak to consecutive weeks in the national rankings to 36 straight. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 96 of the 100 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 117 of 120 games ranked in the top 25, including 79 of 81 games under Miles. LSU has a 63-16 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU hasn't played as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 vs. Arkansas and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Tigers, who are 5-0 in road games when having a 100-yard rusher, have won nine straight dating back to the Tulane game in 2008 when a running back reached the 100-yard mark. **Spencer Ware**, with 107 yards against Mississippi State, became the latest Tiger to reach the 100-yard mark for the Tigers.

Saturday Night Special – Tigers Are 47-4 In Night Games Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 47-4 in night games under Miles compared to an 18-13 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 10-1 in away night games under Miles with the only loss coming at Florida in 2008 by a 51-21 count. LSU is 30-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 30-1 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era. The only two home losses at night for the Tigers under Miles have come in 2005 on a Monday night against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime and a 13-3 loss to No. 1-ranked Florida in 2009. LSU's Brings 19-9 Record In Road Games Under Miles Into West Virginia Game

LSU goes into the West Virginia game with a 19-9 record in road games under **Les Miles**. The Tigers are 3-0 in non-conference road games under Miles with wins coming at Arizona State (35-31) in 2005; at Tulane (34-9) in 2007; and at Washington (31-23) in 2009.

Miles Has 65 Wins at LSU; He's Averaging Over 10 Wins A Year as Head Coach of the Tigers

LSU coach **Les Miles** recorded his 65th victory at the school in the 19-6 win over Mississippi State. Now in his seventh year at LSU, Miles is 65-17 in his 82 games with the Tigers. Only two coaches in LSU history have won more games than Miles – Charles McClendon (137) and Bernie Moore (83). In terms of active SEC coaches, only Steve Spurrier (72) needed fewer games than Miles to get to 60 victories. Miles is also averaging 10.3 wins a year at LSU, making him the only coach in school history to average double-figure wins in five or more years.

LSU's Won 20 Straight Games In September

In addition to its 35-game non-conference regular season winning streak, LSU also brings a 20-game winning streak during the month of September into the West Virginia game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 23-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count.

More On Miles' List of Achievements

Now in his seventh season with the Tigers, head coach **Les Miles** has put together quite a list of achievements during his 82 games. The following is a look at some of Miles' highlights during his seven seasons with the Tigers:

- Fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), and 60 wins (76 games) in school history.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start for the third time in six years (2005, '07, '10)
- Led LSU to first 7-0 start since 1973 in 2010
- Only coach in SEC history to beat Urban Meyer and Nick Saban in the same year twice (2007, 2010)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice (2005, '07)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year (2010).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 11 wins over coaches who have won national titles
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings

Jarrett Lee's Streak Of Passes Without An Interception Ends at 131

Senior QB **Jarrett Lee** ran his streak of consecutive passes without an interception to 131 before throwing his first interception of the season last against Mississippi State. The 131 passes without an interception ranks as the second-longest streak in school history, trailing Alan Risher's mark of 137 in 1982. For the year, Lee has connected on 40-of-59 passes for 444 yards, 3 TDs and 1 interception.

Jarrett Lee Runs Record To 8-4 As Starting QB

Senior **Jarrett Lee** ran his record to 8-4 as LSU's starting quarterback with the win over Mississippi State. Lee went 4-4 as a redshirt freshman in 2008, 1-0 in 2009 and now he's 3-0 this year. Prior to the Oregon game, Lee's last start came in November of 2009 as he guided the Tigers to a 24-16 win over Louisiana Tech. During his career, Lee has helped rally the Tigers to four fourth-quarter comebacks, including a dramatic game-winning drive last year against Florida. For his career, Lee has thrown for 3,087 yards, 21 touchdowns and he's completed 253-of-457 passes for a 55.4 completion percentage.

Shepard Returns This Week

LSU WR **Russell Shepard** will see his first action of the year this week against West Virginia. Shepard missed LSU's first three games of the season after being declared ineligible on August 25 for violation of an NCAA rule. LSU immediately applied for his reinstatement and the NCAA ruled that Shepard would be reinstated after a three-game suspension.

True Freshman Playing Prominent Roles On Offense

Now three games into the season, several true freshmen are playing prominent roles on offense for the Tigers. **Odell Beckham, Jr.** and **Jarvis Landry** are both in the rotation at wide receiver, while **Kenny Hilliard** has seen time at fullback and **La'el Collins** at left guard. Beckham leads the Tigers in receiving with 15 catches for 111 yards, while Landry has three catches for 23 yards. On defense, **Anthony Johnson** is the rotation on the line and he's got 3 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack in three games.

Miles Is 25-13 vs. Top 25 Opponents

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 25-13 in games against ranked opponents during his seven years with the Tigers. LSU was 5-2 against Top 25 teams in 2010. LSU won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. In games against teams ranked in the top 10, Miles is 10-9.

LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 59 of the 74 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis during the early 2000s, LSU has recorded a 59-15 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU was 6-3 in 2009 as a top 10 team, 4-2 in 2010 and they are 3-0 this year.

The Chief Back To Run LSU Defense

John "Chief" Chavis returns for a third season as LSU's defensive coordinator in 2011. Last year, Chavis led the Tiger defense to top 12 national ranking in three defensive categories. LSU led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in pass defense (169.8 ypg); the Tigers were second in the SEC and No. 11 in the nation in scoring defense (18.2 ppg); and LSU was third in the league and No. 12 in the country in total defense (307.2 ypg). In his first year at LSU in 2009, the Tigers were 11th in the nation in scoring defense as they allowed just six rushing TDs all year. The Tigers opened 2011 by limiting Oregon's high-powered offense to 335 yards and just 95 rushing yards, well below their average of a year ago. In week 2, LSU held Northwestern State to minus-4 yards rushing, the first since 1982 for an opponent to be held to negative rushing yards (Ole Miss, minus-50). Last week, the Tiger defense held Mississippi State to nearly 400 yards below their season average. Mississippi State entered the game leading the SEC in both total offense and rushing offense and the Tigers held the Bulldog to season lows of 193 total yards and 52 rushing yards.

LSU Is 37-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 82 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 61-7 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 39-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 37-0, including a 3-0 record in 2011. The Significance of the Oregon Win

- Was the highest ranked win for LSU since topping No. 1 Ohio State in the 2008 BCS Championship Game.
- Was the highest ranked regular season win for LSU since upsetting No. 1 Florida on Oct. 11, 1997.
- It was the first win over a non-conference top-five team in the regular season in school history. The previous highest ranked non-conference regular season victories were over a No. 7-ranked team three times. (No. 7 Texas A&M in 1987, No. 7 Florida State in 1982, No. 7 Notre Dame in 1971).

LSU's Fourth-Quarter Comebacks Under Les Miles

For the 17th time under **Les Miles**, LSU won a football game despite trailing in the fourth quarter as the Tigers rallied from deficits of 24-23, 30-29, and 36-35 to beat Ole Miss, 43-36, in Tiger Stadium in week 11 last year. The following is a look at LSU's fourth quarter comebacks under Miles, how many points the Tigers had to overcome in the final frame to win and the quarterback who engineered the comeback:

Brandon Taylor To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to senior safety **Brandon Taylor** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. RB Richard Murphy, now with the Jacksonville Jaguars, owned the number in 2010. LSU coach **Les Miles**, along with input from the three other players who have worn Jersey No. 18, determined that Brandon Taylor would wear the jersey in 2011.

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 220-60-4 (.780) at night under the lights compared to a 24-25-3 (.490) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 68-11 overall at home, which includes a 54-5 (.915) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 14-6 (.700) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. LSU Has Become D-Line U.

You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Draft picks from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had six defensive linemen earn a total of seven First-Team All-America honors and 12 members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. In 2007, DT Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defensive player in school history - winning four national awards - on his way to becoming the fifth overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft. In the spring of 2009, Defensive end Tyson Jackson became the highest LSU defender ever picked in the NFL Draft, going No. 3 overall to Kansas City. The 2010 season saw Drake Nevis earn All-America honors prior to being selected in the third round of the 2011 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts. - LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 87th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 80th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 37 of its last 42 games at home and 12 straight. Head coach **Les Miles** is 29-1 in Saturday Night home games.

Peterson, Defense Lead Tigers Past #21 West Virginia, 20-14

Patrick Peterson returned a punt 60-yards for a touchdown and the LSU defense held West Virginia to just 177 total yards as the Tigers extended the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak to 31 games with a 20-14 win over the Mountaineers. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Stevan Ridley. LSU extended the lead to 10-0 on a 49-yard field goal by Josh Jasper with 12:01 left in the first half. After forcing WVU to its fourth three-and-out of the first half, Peterson gathered in a punt and returned it 60 yards for a TD and a 17-0 LSU lead at the 9:39 mark in the second quarter. West Virginia added a score just before halftime, cutting the LSU lead to 17-7 at the break. WVU pulled to within 17-14 early in the third quarter, going 30 yards on a two plays following a Jordan Jefferson interception. That was as close as the Mountaineers would get as the Tigers held WVU to just 63 total yards and only three first downs in the fourth quarter. Ridley led the Tiger with 116 rushing yards and one TD, while QB Jordan Jefferson completed 10 of 22 passes for 75 yards. Defensively, LB Kelvin Sheppard paced the unit with 11 tackles, while DB **Tyrann Mathieu** recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass for the Tigers

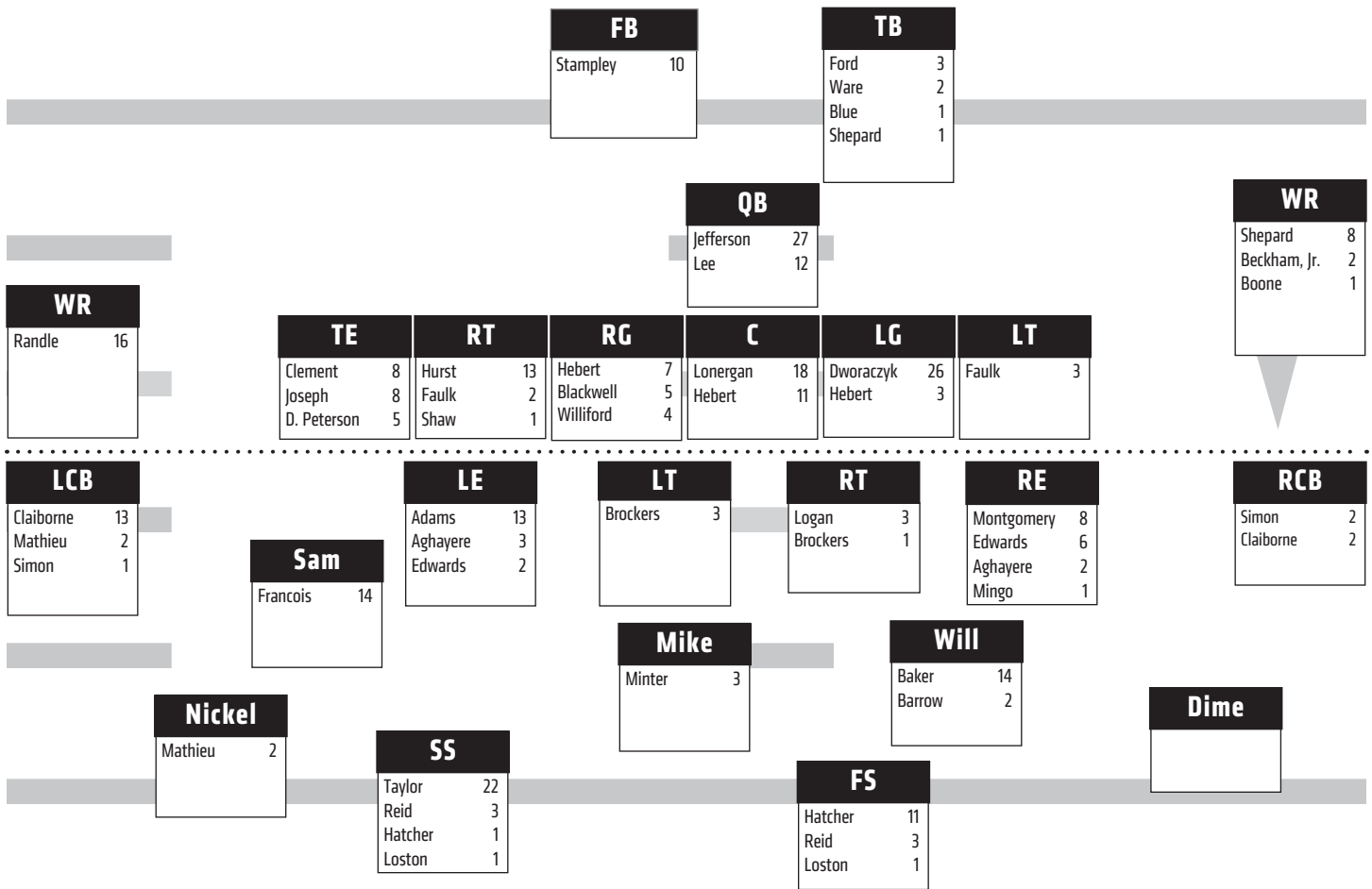

No. 4 LSU Shuts Down No. 3 Oregon in Cowboys Classic, 40-27

LSU's defense contained one of the most potent offensive attacks in college football limiting Oregon to just 335 total yards as the fourth-ranked Tigers opened 2011 with an impressive 40-27 victory over the third-ranked Ducks in Cowboys Stadium. While the defense was doing its job, the LSU offense was methodical in its approach, wearing down the Ducks with a steady pounding of sophomore running backs **Spencer Ware** (99 yards, 1 TD) and **Michael Ford** (96 yards, 2 TDs). The duo combined for 195 yards and 3 TDs as the Tigers broke open a tight game at halftime with 17 unanswered points during a 7-minute stretch in the second half. Trailing 6-3 early in the second quarter, LSU DB **Tyrann Mathieu** stripped Oregon's punt returner Kenyon Barner of the ball and then scooped up the fumble and raced three-yards for the score, giving the Tigers a 9-6 advantage. LSU QB **Jarrett Lee** hit **Rueben Randle** with a 10-yard TD pass just before halftime to give the Tigers the lead for good at 16-13. Touchdown runs by Ford and Ware in the third quarter stretched the lead to 30-13 at the 3:03 mark. Oregon pulled to within 33-20 early in the fourth quarter, but a 16-yard TD run by Ford put the game out of reach at 40-20 with just over two minutes left in the contest. LSU held Oregon All-America RB LaMichael James to just 54 yards on 18 carries. Lee finished 10-of-22 for 98 yards and 1 TD.

Tiger Defense Stifles Northwestern State in 49-3 Rout

LSU put together another outstanding defensive outing - limiting Northwestern State to just 95 total yards - and the Tiger offense scored touchdowns on seven of 12 possessions in a 49-3 win over the Demons in Tiger Stadium. The win was the 35th straight non-conference regular-season victory for the Tigers. LSU never trailed in the contest, scoring on its first possession when **Jarrett Lee** connected with **Deangelo Peterson** on a 9-yard TD pass. The Demons cut the margin to 7-3 early in the second quarter, but the Tigers responded with TDs on three of their next four possessions to take a 28-3 lead at halftime. **Zach Mettenberger** started the second half for LSU and completed 8-of-11 passes for 92 yards and 1 TD in his first action as a Tiger. **Michael Ford** led the Tigers in rushing with 72 yards and a pair of scores, while **Alfred Blue** added 53 yards and 1 TD as the Tigers grounded out 175 rushing yards. Mettenberger and Lee combined to complete 17 of 21 passes for 225 yards and a pair of TDs as LSU's offense accounted for 400 total yards. Defensively, the Tigers held the Demons to minus-4 rushing yards on 27 attempts. It's the first time since 1982 that an LSU defense held an opponent to negative rushing yards (Ole Miss, minus-50 yards, 1982). **Morris Claiborne** led the LSU defense with 6 tackles as the Tigers had 12 players account for a tackle for loss in the game.

Tigers Score 13 Unanswered To Put Away No. 25 Mississippi State on Thursday

LSU's defense held Mississippi State to nearly 400 yards below its season average as the third-ranked Tigers used a methodical offensive effort to post a 19-6 Thursday night win over the Bulldogs in Starkville. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 3-0 lead midway through the first quarter on a 21-yard **Drew Alleman** field goal. Mississippi State tied the game at 3-3 on its next possession before another Alleman field goal just before halftime gave the Tigers a 6-3 lead at the break. The Bulldogs tied the game at 6-6 late in the third quarter, before the Tigers closed the game with 13 unanswered points for the victory. First, Alleman broke the tie with a 41-yard field goal with 1:46 left in the third quarter and then **Jarrett Lee** connected with **Rueben Randle** on a 19-yard TD pass at the 11:56 mark in the fourth quarter to put the Tigers up by 10 at 16-6. Alleman closed the scoring with another field goal at the 2:53 mark. For the game, LSU's defense recorded 15 tackles for losses and five sacks in holding the Bulldogs to just 52 rushing yards and 193 total yards. On 11 possessions, LSU's defense forced a 3-and-out or a turnover seven times. Offensively, Lee completed 21-of-27 passes for 213 yards and one score, while **Spencer Ware** rushed for 107 yards to lead the Tigers rushing attack. LSU finished with 361 yards of total offense (148 rushing, 213 passing) as the Tigers had nearly 38 minutes of possession time.
