PROJECTED LSU STARTING LINEUP OPTIONS

G 1 Anthony Hickey (Fr., 5-11, Hopkinsville, Ky.) or 4 Chris Bass (Sr., 6-1, Baton Rouge, La.)

Hickey was Mr. Basketball in Kentucky last season and a late period signee for LSU ... Has impressed in some of the scrimmages LSU played during pre-season workouts ... Bass has played significant minutes all three years at LSU, averaging 16.4 a game a year ago, 1.8 ppg and 2.4 apg) ... One of best assist-to-turnover ratios in league during year.

G 10 Andre Stringer (So., 5-9, Jackson, Miss.)

Stringer started at point guard from the third game on last year (30 of 32), averaging 11.2 points and 2.6 rebounds ... Led the team with 57 treys and is expected to get the start at the off-guard position.

G 22 Ralston Turner (So., 6-6, Muscle Shoals, Ala.)

Turner started every game he dressed for a year ago, missing first five SEC games after injury suffered late in game at Virginia, Jan. 2 ... In his 27 games, averaged a team best 12.3 points per game and was named to the Coaches All-SEC Freshman team ... Also averaged 2.6 rebounds and 1.6 assists with 48 treys ... 18 games in double figures.

F 24 Storm Warren (Sr., 6-7, Monroe, La.) or 5 Malcolm White (Sr., 6-9, Baton Rouge, La.)

Warren is healthy after battling several injuries that limited his effectiveness as a junior, but he has looked like he has returned to sophomore year form when he averaged double figures ... 22 starts last year, averaging 7.7 ppg and 5.7 rpg ... White started 31-of-32 games after transferring from Ole Miss, averaging 7.6 ppg and 5.1 rpg.

C 41 Justin Hamilton (Jr., 7-0, Alpine, Utah)

Transferred from Iowa State after his sophomore season ... Had the chance to see his first game action since March 2010 when team played six games in Italy in May 2011.

STORYLINES

• If Anthony Hickey starts the opener, it is believed he would be the first freshman to start at PG since Torris Bright in 2000 ... Andre Stringer did not start until the third game as a freshman a year ago.

• After a year with no seniors, the present 12-man roster is spread evenly with three seniors (Bass, Warren, White), juniors (DelPiero, Hamilton, Ludwig), sophomores (Courtney, Stringer, Turner) and freshman (Hickey, Isaac, O'Bryant III).

• This will be one of just two games

against Louisiana schools this year ... It was the Colonels that stopped LSU's very lengthy home winning streak against state schools a year ago.

• Several home and away series are either starting or already underway on this year's schedule -- the games with Coastal Carolina, S. Alabama, Houston, N. Texas and Virginia conclude home-and-homes, while LSU starts home-and-homes with Boise State, UC-Irvine and Marquette ... LSU will travel to Rutgers this year for the Big East/SEC Challenge,

but will have a home game in the Challenge in 2012.

• LSU returns 76.4 percent of its scoring from a year ago, including the top four averages in Turner (12.3), Stringer (11.2), Warren (7.7) and White (7.6) ... Also the top two rebound averages of a year ago are back -- Warren (5.7) and White (5.1).

• LSU plays four games on the road next week before returning home on Nov. 23 to face South Alabama. This will be the only home game not on television this season.

Trent Johnson

Head Coach • 4th year at LSU (13th year as head coach)

Trent Johnson, with two strong back-to-back recruiting classes on board, enters his fourth season as the head coach of the LSU Tigers in 2011-12.

Johnson's passion and vision for the LSU basketball program has the Tigers headed in the right direction.

As Johnson and his staff continue to develop players both on the court and off the court, they expected continued improvement athletically, academically and socially from the team.

Johnson, the 20th men's basketball coach at LSU, seeks to build on more than a decade of excellence at LSU, Stanford and Nevada. Having earned Conference Coach of the Year in all three leagues (Western Athletic Conference, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conference), Johnson knows the route to success to getting LSU back in the national spotlight.

In his first season at LSU, Johnson led the Tigers to 27 wins, tied for the third most wins in a season in LSU history. The Tigers won the SEC regular season championship with a record of 13-3. LSU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006, advancing to the second round before falling, 84-70, to North Carolina in the closest game the eventual national champions would have to play. LSU had a second half lead on the Tar Heels and the game was still in the balance entering the final eight minutes.

Coach Johnson has a blueprint for success for himself and his layers. As his players grasp the vision for success, they have the opportunity to embrace playing in a fast-paced system where executing in the half court and defending and rebounding are at a high level.

Johnson has a record of success and his team will have the opportunity to blend together and learn from a coach that is a fierce competitor who exudes and demands toughness.

His devotion of the team, his protective beliefs toward his players and his loyalty to his former players is evidenced the fact that three of his former players are now members of the LSU basketball staff. Johnson is a program builder and he has re-established the base of the LSU program by visiting with former players and coaches to bring together the past, the present and the future of the program.

Johnson also is charged with the development of athletes both on and off the court. Off the court, he has worked hard since day one to make sure student-athletes understand the "student" part of their days at LSU. At all three spots in his head coaching career, he has developed not just successful athletes and winning basketball teams, but young men who are having success in life.

In his 12 years combined as a Division I head coach at LSU, Stanford and Nevada, he has won 208 games and taken teams in seven-of-the-last-nine seasons to post-season play, including five NCAA appearances.

Johnson was named the 2009 consensus SEC Coach of the Year and was a finalist for four national coach of the year honors as he became the first LSU men's basketball coach to win the league title and take the team to post-season play in his first year at the school.

Johnson has always been a big believer in special causes and joined former LSU basketball coach Dale Brown and star center Shaquille O'Neal in cutting a series of commercials that aired nationally for the "Be A Match" organization of bone marrow donors.

In June 2010, Johnson was part of a 10-day trip to Africa as part of the Nkomazi Sports Club Organization program that was established to stop the transmission of HIV through culturally relevant, locally sustainable health and life skills education-based programs in communities affected by HIV/AIDS.

He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and has served on the NABC Special Committee on Recruiting and Access. He also gives his time freely to such organizations as the Boy Scouts of America, the Louisiana Health and Rehab Center, Inc., the American Diabestes Association, Samaritan's Feet, Troops First and the Jummy V Foundation for cancer research.

Johnson, was born in Berkeley, Calif., and is married to Jackie and they have two children: a daughter, Tinishia, 28, and a son, Terry, 25.

Johnson's vision and passion is what drives him to make LSU basketball a success. With a coaching staff and a group of players that believe in the same vision and passion, that success has to be very much in site.

A Scrimmage Rather Than Exhibitions

For the fourth straight year, there were no men's exhibition games prior to the start of the 2011-12 season. LSU took advantage of an NCAA rule that many schools are using to play other Division I schools in private scrimmages. No media or fans are allowed to watch and the only people in the building are athletic staff members. Each team may keep stats of its own players and shoot video for teaching purposes. No publicity may be given of the results of the scrimmage.

In one change, LSU had only one of these scrimmages this year instead of two as they did each of the first three years in Trent Johnson's tenure.

But There Were Some Games in Italy

The Tiger team traveled to Italy for six games in May of this year with one of the primary aspects of the trip the chance to give transfer Justin Hamilton a chance to see some game action for the first time in over a year.

It also allowed the LSU team to try some new things such as playing at a faster pace, implementing some parts of a motion offense and allow the team some extra

practices and game competition as allowed by the NCAA.

LSU won all six games in the trip which started in Rome and included stops in Florence, Milan and Varese.

Opening Games

The Tigers have done well in season openers in the first 103 years of the program with an 84-19 record ... This will mark the 16th straight season the Tigers have opened in the confines of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center and LSU has won each of the last 15 openers.

Not The First Basketball-Football Doubleheader

This opening day of LSU basketball followed by a football game is not the first time it has happened but it is the first one that was scheduled to play out that way. In 2008, Trent Johnson's first game as coach, the Tigers were scheduled to play Jackson State on the night of Nov. 15. But earlier in the season, Hurricane Gustav forced a postponement of LSU's home football game with Troy. The Tiger football team has an open date on Nov. 15 so the game was mutually agreed to be rescheduled for that night in Tiger Stadium and the LSU basketball team moved its game to the afternoon.

So this will be the second time that LSU men's basketball and football have both played in their venues on North Stadium Drive and for the first time, admission to the men's basketball game will be free of charge.

The Color Purple

Fans have been urged to wear purple to the LSU football game this Saturday and the Tiger football team is going to wear purple jerseys as well.

Now the LSU Basketball team is joining in and will wear for the first time at home in many years, their purple jerseys in front of the home crowd at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in honor of the "wear purple" theme.

The Series With Nicholls State

The Tigers and Colonels will meet for the 18th time since the first meeting in December 1987 with LSU holding a 16-1 advantage. Nicholls won last year's meeting, 62-53, in the second game of the season on Nov. 16, 2010 ... Matt Derenbecker and Andre Stringer each had 14 points to lead LSU in scoring, while Storm Warren had 14 rebounds ... Nicholls was 14-14 a year ago under eighth-year coach J. P. Piper. The Colonels won their lone official exhibition contest, 73-69 over NAIA-school, the University of Mobile. Trevon Lewis had 18 points to lead Nicholls, with Chris Talkington scoring 17 and Shane Rilleux 12.

The Colonels shot 47.1 percent from the field (24-of-51), but was outrebounded, 46-32.

Season 41 At The PMAC

It was the 1971-72 season that the first game was played in the then LSU Assembly Center, opening the building on Jan. 3, 1972 against Vanderbilt, an 80-73 loss. The Tigers got their first win in the building on Jan. 6, 1972 against Georgetown, 90-71.

LSU will be trying to get its home field advantage back this season at the Maravich Center after winning just 8-of-18 games a year ago. The Tigers still have a good percentage in the building's history of 461-164 (73.8%) overall, including 247-36 (87.3 percent) in non-conference contests ... Trent Johnson is 28-5 in his three years as head coach at LSU in home non-conference contests.

The Three Point Shot -- 25th Anniversary

This season is the 25th anniversary of the shot that changed the game of college basketball -- the three-point field goal ... It was the 1986-87 season when teams had the opportunity to make a shot from an arc 19 feet-9 inches from the goal and get a bonus third point for a field goal.

The line has been backed up during that time, now at 20 feet-9 inches, but the

shot has become a major part of the game.

Anthony Wilson in the first year of the shot for LSU in 1987 made 95 treys and that number still 25 years later remains the record for a single season at LSU. Several players got close -- Chris Jackson (84 in 1989; 88 in 1990); Darryl Mitchell (82 in 2006) and Marcus Thornton (90 in 2008).

Chris Jackson is the only player to make double figure treys in a game -- 10 against Tennessee (2-10-1990) ... Marcus Thornton is the last to post seven or more in a game in 2008, hitting eight treys at Auburn (1-30-2008).

Darrel Mitchell has the career mark in threys with 258 (2002-06) with Torris Bright (2000-03) at 237 and Ronnie Henderson (1993-96) 189.

LSU's team record for treys is 17 at Tennessee on March 1, 2003. Ironically last year, LSU had the highs and lows in three-point shooting making 70.6 percent at South Alabama (12-of-17) on Nov. 28, 2010 and hitting just 7.7 percent (1-of-13) on Jan. 12, 2011.

Looking To Play 40 Minutes

LSU's three wins in the SEC was so close to being much more last year as there were five games in the second half of the league season in which the Tigers were unable to sustain a rally in the final few minutes of the game:

South Carolina - 2/2/11 - Down 13 with 7:23 to play, LSU scores next nine to cut the game to four, 57-53, with 4:14 left ... Only able to add three free throws in 64-56 loss.

Miss. State - 2/5 - Up 57-54 with 3:23 to play on the second of back-to-back Andre Stringer treys, Tigers do not score again, lose 58-57.

At Ole Miss - 2/9 - Three by Ralston Turner tied game at 60-60 with 3:03 to play, Tigers do not score again, lose 66-60

Alabama - 2/17 - Battling the Western Division leaders down the stretch, Matt Derenbecker's trey with 4:01 to play makes Alabama lead just four, 60-56, with 4:01 to play ... Tigers do not score again, lose, 67-56.

Auburn - 3/5 - Determined to make a statement to close the season, the Tigers came out with some early emotion and moved to a five-point advantage at the half and then used an 11-1 run to start the second half to seemingly put Auburn to the brink with a 40-25 lead with 14 minutes to play ... But Auburn rallied strongly using an 11-0 run that would eventually be 20-2 that would give Auburn the lead with five minutes to play.

Well, Who Knows What Is Ahead For The NBA

As the negotiations get tougher and tougher, the status of the NBA becomes tough to know ... LSU has seven players waiting to find out if, when and where they will go back to work (at least that was the number that finished the season in the league) ... At least two players (Glen Davis and Marcus Thornton) are free agents looking to see what offers there will be once negotiations can become ... Two more, Garrett Temple and Chris Johnson, will be looking to extend the 10-day contracts that had them finishing the season on teams ... What is known is that Shaquille O'Neal has retired and that means that Brandon Bass, entering his seventh season in the league, is LSU's new senior member in the NBA. Here is the way things stood at the end of the regular season:

Brandon Bass, Orlando Magic - entering his 3rd season with Orlando, 7th in NBA

Glen Davis, Boston Celtics - free agent after four seasons in Boston

Chris Johnson, Portland Trailblazers - finished with Portland (10-day contracts)

Anthony Randolph, Minnesota - entering his fourth season in the NBA

Tyrus Thomas, Charlotte - entering 2nd full season with Charlotte, 6th in NBA

**Marcus Thornton, Sacramento – free agent, traded in mid-season from New Orleans
Garrett Temple, Charlotte Bobcats – Has signed 1-year deal with Casale in Italy.**

The Standings Will Look Different This Year In The SEC

For the first time since the 1991-92 season, the Southeastern Conference men's basketball standings will not be divided into Eastern and Western Divisions. The coaches voted and the athletic directors approved the move back to a league standing sheet that goes 1-12, top to bottom with the top four teams in the standings getting byes on the first night of the SEC Tournament. In the past, the top two teams in each division received the byes.

The 16-game schedule for this year is still based on divisional play of past years, home and home against the west teams and one game against the east, but the schedule for next year is still in a state of flux with new teams entering the league next year. It is expected the men's basketball teams will play some sort of 18-game conference schedule next year.

Tournament Goes Back To New Orleans

For the third time, the Southeastern Conference Tournament will be held in New Orleans, March 8-11, 2012 ... The tournament was previously held in 1996 and 2003 in New Orleans at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, but this year's event will be held at the home of the New Orleans Hornets, the New Orleans Arena ... The winner of the event receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

Tigers Sign Malik Morgan In Early Signing Period

The LSU Athletics Department and men's basketball Coach Trent Johnson announced on Wednesday that the school has received the signed national letter of intent papers from highly-ranked guard Malik Morgan from River Ridge, La. Morgan, who is 6-3, is entering his senior season at John Curtis High School.

Morgan has garnered national recognition from the recruiting sites, ranking No. 75 overall in The Rivals 150 for the class of 2012. The four-star prospect is also ranked 11th in the country at the shooting guard position.

This past year Morgan averaged 28.9 points a game, including a career-high 52 points in one game against Riverside. He also averaged nine rebounds, two steals and two assists a game.

"We are very excited about the addition of Malik Morgan to the LSU Basketball family," said LSU Coach Trent Johnson. "Besides coming from a great family, Malik is a very, very good basketball player. He is very skilled -- not a good scorer, but a great scorer. One of the most impressive things about Malik besides his offensive skills and his ability to make players better, is his overall competitiveness. He is very competitive and he is going to have a huge impact on our team next year. Without question, I didn't see a better guard in the state of Louisiana, let alone his rankings as one of the best guards in the country."

Morgan's mother, the former Detra Brown, was a four-year letter-winner in volleyball while at LSU where she was twice an All-SEC selection. She still ranks fourth at LSU in career kills (1,504) and is one of only five players in the program's history to ever record 1,000 digs and 1,000 kills in a career.

Morgan chose LSU over Boston College, Georgia Tech, Missouri, Oklahoma and UTEP.
