### WHAT TO WATCH FOR ...

- This game will mark the 100th all-time between the Ole Miss Rebels and LSU Tigers dating back to 1894. LSU is Ole Miss' second-most played opponent behind Mississippi State, whom the Rebels will play for the 108th time on November 26. LSU holds a 56-39-4 advantage in the series. Prior to last year's loss, the Rebels had won two straight in the series which ended a six-game LSU winning streak. Before that Tiger winning streak, Ole Miss had taken four of five. Over the last 18 games in the series, LSU holds a slight 8-6 advantage.
- Rebel head coach Houston Nutt is 6-7 all time against LSU, but has won three of his last four against the Tigers including a 50-48 win over then No. 1 LSU at Tiger Stadium in 2007.
- The Tigers are currently ranked No. 1 in the BCS and both the Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches' polls. The Rebels are 0-7 all time against the nation's top team.
- Ole Miss head coach Houston Nutt is 1-2 all time in his career versus the No. 1 team in the country having knocked off No.1 LSU in 2007 and lost to No. 1 USC in 2004 and Auburn in 2010.
- Ole Miss is 8-6 (.571 pct.) in November games under head coach Houston Nutt.
- Junior kicker Bryson Rose connected on 17 straight field goals dating back to last season before missing his first attempt against Louisiana Tech. His streak was a school record and only one shy of the SEC record.
- With four receptions for 57 yards versus Louisiana Tech, freshman wide out Donte Moncrief is just four receptions and 26 yards shy of Mike Espy's freshman records of 30 receptions and 465 receiving yards set in 2002. He is also tied for fifth in the nation among true freshmen with four TD receptions on the season, which is also an Ole Miss freshman record.
- Nine true freshmen and four redshirt freshmen have started a game for Ole Miss this season. True freshmen have made a combined 30 starts, while redshirt freshmen have made a combined 14 starts for the Rebels.

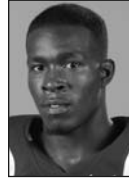

**CREDENTIALS**

All credential requests should be made through Ole Miss' new online credentialing website: [www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss](http://www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss). All requests should be made as early as possible and should be limited to working press only. Working space in Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium press box will be allotted on the following basis: (1) Daily newspapers and television stations covering for daily news programs; (2) Sports editors of Mississippi daily newspapers; (3) Radio personnel for an originating broadcast; (4) Official school daily, one seat only; (5) Television sports directors and approved special coverage; (6) Press and TV working photographers, weekly press representatives, non-broadcasting radio representatives and internet sites whose primary purpose is to gather news and disseminate it.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS**

Credentials for sideline photographers will be issued on the basis of circulation, with priority granted to agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis. All photographers must exchange their photo pass for armbands in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be done at the media "Will Call" table next to the press box elevators by gate six of the stadium. Gameday flip cards will be available at that location.

**PARKING**

Media parking passes should be requested at the same time press box or sideline passes are requested. Only a limited number of parking passes are available. The lot just to the west of the Turner Center (the former Intercollegiate Athletics lot) is reserved for media parking. Entry is available from Hill Drive. A golf cart is available to help members of the media transport heavy equipment from the press parking area to the press box.

**GAMEDAY SERVICES**

Members of the media covering Ole Miss will be provided with pregame notes for both teams, a game program and a flipcard. Statistics and a running play-by-play will be handed out after each quarter. Approximately 30 minutes following the completion of the game, a final statistical book, including complete team and individual statistics, running play-by-play and postgame quotes from players and coaches, will be available.

**WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE**

Coach Houston Nutt holds a weekly press conference each Monday during the season, beginning at 2:00 p.m. (CT), in the team meeting room of the Indoor Practice Facility, which is adjacent to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone. The number for the two-way teleconference may be obtained by contacting the Athletics Media Relations office at (662) 915-7522. A brief teleconference for Coach Nutt will also be held each Sunday following a game at 3 p.m. (same phone number and code as Monday press conference).

**COACHES/PLAYER INTERVIEWS**

**During Game Week**

Selected players will be available Monday following Coach Nutt's weekly press conference. All media interviews will be held in the team meeting room. All requests for player interviews during the week should be made at least one day in advance with Kyle Campbell (662-915-7522). Members of the media who wish to interview players on Monday MUST e-mail or text Kyle Campbell by 3 p.m. (CT) Sunday to request interviews. Players and assistant coaches will be available upon request after practice on Tuesday and Wednesday.

**After Practice**

Practice will be closed to the public. The first 20 minutes of practice will be open to the media on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Coach Nutt will be available for media after each practice in the team meeting room.

**After the Game**

Coach Nutt will hold a postgame news conference with the media in the team meeting room of the Indoor Practice Facility. Athletics Media Relations office representatives will be available to assist in postgame interviews. Complete postgame plans will be announced on gameday in the press box. An Athletics Media Relations staff member will accompany members of the press wishing to go to the sidelines, beginning with five minutes remaining in the final quarter.

LAST FIVE MEETINGS

**November 20, 2010 • Baton Rouge, La.: LSU 43, Ole Miss 36:** Brandon Bolden scored two touchdowns and Ole Miss tallied the most points against LSU by any team this season, but the Tigers scored the go-ahead touchdown with 44 seconds left in the game to win the third annual Magnolia Bowl. LSU trailed 36-35 with 4:57 left when Patrick Peterson returned a kickoff 34 yards to midfield, setting up a game-winning drive that ended with Stevan Ridley's third touchdown rushing. Bolden rushed for 91 yards and two TDs for Ole Miss and Jeremiah Masoli finished 15 of 23 for 177 yards, one TD and two interceptions.

**November 21, 2009 • Oxford, Miss.: Ole Miss 25, LSU 23:** Time ran out on No. 8 LSU before it could attempt a short, potential game-winning field goal and Dexter McCluster and Ole Miss survived a frantic final minute to come away with the victory. McCluster ran for 148 yards and passed for a touchdown, a 27-yarder to wide-open Shay Hodge midway through the fourth quarter. Hodge had seven catches for 117 yards, tying the school record for 100-yard games in a season.

**November 22, 2008 • Baton Rouge, La.: Ole Miss 31, LSU 13:** Jevan Snead threw two TD passes, Mark Keith Summers ran for a 13-yard score out of the "Wild Rebel" formation and Ole Miss won its fourth straight game with a 31-13 triumph over No. 18 LSU. Snead was 16-of-25 for 274 yards. His scoring passes went for 34 and 25 yards, both to Mike Wallace. Ole Miss

knocked LSU starting QB Jarrett Lee out of the game and held the Tigers to only one TD.

**November 17, 2007 • Oxford, Miss.: LSU 41, Ole Miss 24:** Trindon Holliday returned a kickoff 98 yards for a score, and LSU forced two turnovers during goal-line stands to defeat Ole Miss, 41-24. Marshay Green had a 44-yard punt return for the Rebels to knot the game at 7-7, but LSU regained the lead and never looked back. Reserve quarterback Brent Schaeffer sparked some second-half offense for the Rebels, but his 302 yards of total offense weren't enough.

**November 18, 2006 • Baton Rouge, La.: LSU 23, Ole Miss 20:** Colt David kicked a 26-yard FG in overtime to lift No. 9 LSU to a 23-20 victory. Ole Miss built a 20-7 lead, before JaMarcus Russell tossed two TDs in the last 8:46, including a fourth down scoring toss to Dwayne Bowe in the final seconds of regulation. LSU could have won after that TD, but the Rebels blocked the extra point to force overtime.

**OLE MISS HEAD COACH HOUSTON NUTT**

Houston Nutt (Oklahoma State, 1981) is in his fourth and final season at the Ole Miss helm, after being named the University's 36th head football coach on Nov. 28, 2007. His first two seasons in Oxford saw him lead the Rebels to back-to-back Cotton Bowl victories and earn SEC Coach of the Year billing for the third time in his career and Region top coaching honors for the fifth time in 2008. He was also named the FCA Coach of the Year in 2009. During his 10 years as the head coach at Arkansas, Nutt guided the Razorbacks to eight bowl berths, three SEC Western Division titles, two SEC Championship game appearances and an average of more than seven wins per season. He also served head coaching stints at Boise State and Murray State, where he captured two OVC Championships.

**LSU HEAD COACH LES MILES**

Head coach Les Miles is in his seventh year at the head of the Louisiana State football program. Miles, 58, came to LSU after four seasons as head coach at Oklahoma State, where he posted a 28-21 record and lost to Ole Miss in the 2004 Cotton Bowl. Miles has posted a 73-16 record with the Tigers and has captured an SEC title and the 2007 BCS National Championship. In his career at Oklahoma State and LSU, Miles has posted a 4-3 record against the Rebels including a 4-2 mark as the head coach of the Tigers.

**LSU SCOUTING REPORT**

The Tigers are 10-0 on the season, 6-0 in the SEC, and are ranked No. 1 in the latest BCS rankings and the Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches' polls. Senior Jarrett Lee leads LSU with 1289 passing yards and 14 touchdowns. Spencer Ware has run for 600 yards and six TDs, while junior Rueben Randle leads the team with 38 receptions for 733 yards and eight TDs. Defensively, Sam Montgomery leads the team with 10.0 TFLs and 7.0 QB sacks, while Morris Claiborne has four interceptions.

**OLE MISS-LSU RIVALRY HITS CENTURY MARK**

Ole Miss and LSU, known as the Magnolia Bowl since 2008, will meet for the 100th time in Oxford making it the Rebels' second longest rivalry game behind the Egg Bowl. The Tigers lead the all-series 56-39-4, but Ole Miss has won two of the last three meetings.

**MAGNOLIA BOWL TO BENEFIT ST. JUDE:**

The Magnolia Bowl battle between the Ole Miss Rebels and LSU Tigers is taking on much greater meaning this year, as events surrounding the game will benefit St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. St. Jude patients will begin Saturday's activities by leading the Rebels down the traditional Walk of Champions and then serving as honorary team captains. In addition, numerous visuals in the stadium will bring awareness to the hospital, including Ole Miss players wearing helmet stickers and coaches wearing St. Jude lapel pins. Fans will have several donation opportunities as

part of the game. OleMissSports.com is auctioning a gameday experience that includes sideline passes, a parking pass and VIP access, and proceeds will go to St. Jude. There will also be "text to donate" messages during the game and a tent in The Grove with information on the hospital and details on giving. For Ole Miss, the festivities begin Monday when Rebel student-athletes, including the senior football players, will make the trip to Memphis to visit with hospital patients.

**NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER**

The Rebels are 8-6 (.571 winning pct.) in November games under head coach Houston Nutt. Ole Miss has lost both November games this season (Kentucky, Louisiana Tech). The Rebels went 1-3 last year (W, Louisiana-Lafayette; L, Tennessee, LSU, Mississippi State). Ole Miss went 3-1 overall in November in 2009 and a 4-0 record in November games in 2008, Nutt's first season in Oxford. As an SEC head coach, Nutt owns a 36-19 record (.655 winning pct.) in November and is 25-15 (.625 winning pct.) during his career in the final three SEC games of the regular season.

**HOUSTON & GOLIATH:**

Knocking off the nation's best is nothing new for Rebel head coach Houston Nutt. His victory over No. 4 Florida in 2008 was the fifth career win over a top-five opponent as a head coach. Nutt is 5-10 all-time against top-five teams, including a 50-48 triple OT victory at No. 1 LSU in 2007. In all five wins, Nutt's team entered the game unranked, and four of the wins came on the road. **OLE MISS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS**

- In No. 1 LSU, Ole Miss encounters its fourth ranked opponent of the year. The Rebels have dropped all of three of the previous meeting versus ranked opponents this season.
- Last year, Ole Miss faced five top-25 foes and posted a 0-5 mark. Before that five-game skid, the Rebels last knocked off four of their last five ranked opponents including two wins over top-10 teams.
- Ole Miss is 58-136-2 all-time versus ranked teams.

**ROSE ON A ROLL**

Junior placekicker **Bryson Rose** had connected on 17 straight field goal attempts dating back to last season prior to a miss in his first attempt versus Louisiana Tech. His streak was a school record and just one field goal made shy of the SEC record of 18-straight made by Tennessee kicker Fuad Reveiz in 1984. His streak was the longest active streak in the nation.

**THE BOLDEN STANDARD**

With 114 yards rushing against Auburn, senior running back **Brandon Bolden** passed Dou Innocent for fourth place on the Ole Miss career rushing list with 2,485 yards. Bolden also passed Mike Wallace for third on the Rebel all-purpose yards list with 122 yards from scrimmage versus the Tigers and now has 3,500 all-purpose yards. With a pair of TDs against Tigers, he is within

reach of a couple of Ole Miss touchdown records. After tying the single-season school record with 14 rushing TDs and 17 total scores last year, Bolden has 27 rushing and 32 total TDs and trails only Deuce McAllister's school records of 37 rushing and 41 total touchdowns. The preseason Doak Walker Award candidate led the team with 976 rushing yards, 32 receptions and 1,320 all-purpose yards last year. **BRASSELL EXCELS ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL**

Freshman **Nickolas Brassell** has been a playmaker all over the field for Ole Miss. He boasts 20 catches for 271 yards in SEC play. Against Kentucky, he caught three passes for 40 yards and his second touchdown of the year. He also rushed once for 56 yards. In his first career start on defense, he posted three tackles, 0.5 QB sack and a pass breakup. Versus Auburn, Brassell caught a team-high four passes including his first career receiving touchdown. Against Arkansas, he caught a career-high eight passes for 70 yards and recorded one tackle and one PBU on defense. Against Alabama, he posted his first career 100-yard receiving game with four receptions for 101 yards and totaled a career-high five solo tackles in his first extensive action at cornerback. Versus Georgia, Brassell returned a punt 84 yards for his first career touchdown. He also caught two passes for 52 yards and rushed once for 14 yards. On defense, Brassell recorded one tackle as a cornerback. In his first action on defense at Vanderbilt, he posted a pair of pass breakups on his first two plays. He also forced and recovered a fumble and posted one tackle. A U.S. Army, PrepStar and SuperPrep High School All-America selection, he posted 52 receptions for 875 yards and 13 TDs as a senior.

**MONCRIEF CATCHES ON**

After he posted career highs with five receptions for 73 yards and two touchdowns against Arkansas, freshman wide out **Donte Moncrief** now leads the Rebels with four TD catches and has four of Ole Miss' eight receiving scores on the season. In SEC play, Moncrief leads all freshman with 347 receiving yards and four TDs and ranks 10th among all players averaging 43.9 receiving yards per game. He is tied for fifth in the nation among true freshmen with his four TD receptions. Moncrief leads the team with 439 yards receiving and 26 receptions.

**SONIC YOUTH**

- Nine true freshmen and four redshirt freshmen have started a game for Ole Miss this season. True freshmen have made a combined 30 starts, while redshirt freshmen have made a combined 14 starts for the Rebels.
- The Rebels have had 17 first-year players (freshmen or transfers not on roster last season) start at least one game this season and those players have combined for 65 starts.
- The Rebels have eight true freshmen, five redshirt freshmen and eight transfers on the current two-deep depth chart.
- Thirty-one players have made their career debut this season for Ole Miss, including eight true freshmen.

only Rebel to record three seasons with at least 1,000 all-purpose yards. McAllister, who earned second team All-America and first team All-SEC honors, accounted for 4,889 career yards and 41 touchdowns. The Legends will be honored at this year's SEC "Weekend of Champions" which culminates with the SEC Football Championship Game on Sat., Dec. 3 at the Georgia Dome.

### SAWYER TAKES IT TO THE HOUSE

Sophomore DB **Charles Sawyer** is currently tied for 15th in the nation and fifth in the SEC with four interceptions. Versus Auburn, Sawyer posted a team-high 10 tackles including tying a career high with eight solo stops. After moving to corner versus Arkansas due to injury, Sawyer posted a career-high three pass breakups and one tackle. He limited the SEC's leading receiver Jarius Wright to just one reception for 20 yards. Against BYU, he picked off quarterback Jake Heaps' pass and returned it 96 yards for a touchdown. It was Sawyer's first career pick six and the Rebels' first since D.T. Shackelford's score against Southeastern Louisiana in 2009. It was the longest interception return for a score since Dustin Mouzon's 99-yard return against Memphis in 2007 and the fifth-longest return in school history. Sawyer also added seven tackles (six solo) in his first career start at safety.

### MORE THE MARRY

In his first season as a starter, sophomore **Mike Marry** is excelling at the linebacker spot. The Largo, Fla., native ranks 11th in the SEC in tackles, averaging 7.2 stops a game. Marry has totaled double-digit tackles in three games this season, including a career-high 13 stops against BYU.

### CAMPBELL KILLS IT

Punter **Tyler Campbell** currently ranks 24th in the nation and third in the SEC in punting with a 43.2-yard average. He is also tied for fourth in the nation with 23 punts downed inside the 20-yard line. Versus Georgia, Campbell punted a career-high nine times for a 50.8-yard average and downed three punts inside the 20-yard line. Against BYU, Campbell nailed four punts for a 56.75-yard average including a career long 73-yard boot. The 56.8-yard average was also the third-best single game average in school history. Campbell had a season to remember a year ago. The junior from Little Rock, Ark., finished as the NCAA punting champion with a 46.37-yard average, which is the third best single-season mark in school history. A preseason All-America second team selection by Sporting News, Campbell also holds a 45.2-yard career average which trails only Merle Hapes' mark of 46.0 in Ole Miss history. Last season, Campbell booted 19 punts over 50 yards and five over 60 yards en route to second team All-SEC and third team All-America honors. Against LSU, he booted a season-long 69-yard kick and finished the game with a 62.0-yard average on three kicks.

### ODDS AND ENDS

- Ole Miss is first in the nation and first in the SEC in punt return average with 22.60 ypr ... The Rebels also rank third in the SEC and 24th in the nation in net punting at 38.79 ypp.
- The Ole Miss "D" ranks fourth in redzone defense, allowing a score just 76.9 percent of the time.

### NO FLAG FOOTBALL

Ole Miss played a spotless game against Alabama, with the Rebels playing the entire game without committing a penalty. The last time Ole Miss played an entire game without a penalty was Jacksonville State last season and it is believed to be only the second time since 1944 the Rebels have not been flagged for a penalty in a game.

### PICK CITY

After recording just six interceptions last season, Ole Miss has picked off nine passes in 10 games this year. The Rebels posted four interceptions against Southern Illinois for the first time in a game since the 2010 Cotton Bowl versus Oklahoma State. Ole Miss is tied for 55th in the nation in interceptions.

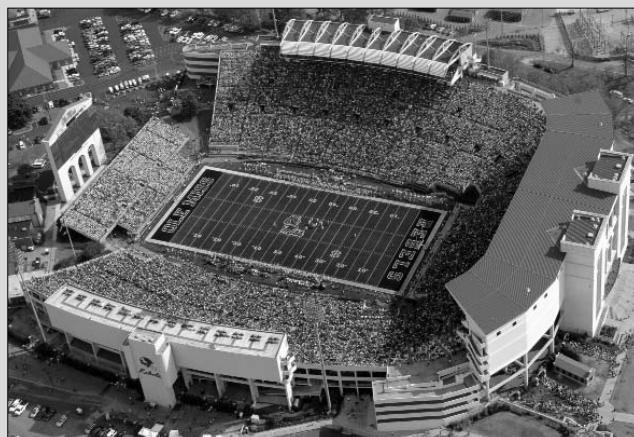
### MIDSEASON HONORS

Junior P **Tyler Campbell** was named to the All-SEC first team, while senior DE **Wayne Dorsey**, sophomore LB **Mike Marry**, sophomore S **Charles Sawyer**, sophomore PR **Jeff Scott** and senior OL **Bradley Sowell** were honored on the All-SEC third team. Campbell and Scott were also named midseason All-SEC first team selections by CollegeFootballNews.com for punter and punt returner and Campbell was also honored as a first team pick by ESPN.com.

## NUTT ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE

Ole Miss has produced record-setting attendance and season ticket sales under fourth-year head coach Houston Nutt. Just consider the following facts:

- The Rebels have sold over 141,500 season tickets during Nutt's last three seasons, including more than 46,000 in 2011.
- Ole Miss has played before a total of 1,489,232 home fans during the Nutt era for an average of 55,157 fans per game.
- The Rebels set a school record with 51,000 season tickets sold in 2009.
- The largest home crowd in school history of 62,657 was on hand for the 2009 Ole Miss-Alabama game.
- Five of the seven largest crowds in school history have come during Nutt's tenure (Alabama 2009, LSU 2009, Tennessee 2009, Auburn 2010 and Alabama 2011).
- The average home attendance of 55,767 in 2009 was the second-highest mark in school history.
- Ole Miss has played before a home crowd of more than 60,000 five times under Houston Nutt.

**SCOTT SCORES**

Versus Fresno State, RB **Jeff Scott** rushed for a career-high 138 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries. He added 24 yards on one reception and 44 yards on two kick returns. The game marked his third career 100-yard rushing game and third career 200 all-purpose yard game. In his first start of the season versus Southern Illinois, Scott became the first Rebel to score two rushing touchdowns and return a punt for a touchdown in the same game since Deuce McAllister versus Auburn in 2000. He also became the first Rebel to score three TDs in one quarter since Randy Baldwin scored three times in the first quarter versus Arkansas State in 1990. Scott rushed for a career-high three touchdowns in the game and is the first Ole Miss player to rush for three scores since Dexter McCluster scored four rushing TDs against Tennessee in 2009. Scott finished the game with 118 yards rushing for the second 100-yard rushing game for his career. He also added 63 yards on punt returns, including his first 67-yard punt return for a score, and 29 yards on kick returns for 210 all-purpose yards, the most all-purpose yards since he totaled 214 against LSU last year. Scott would lead the SEC with a 19.7-yard average on punt returns if he met the minimum number of returns, is tied for seventh in the league in total TDs with seven and ranks sixth in all-purpose yards averaging 101.4 yards per game.

**CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'**

Ole Miss played its first-ever game in the state of California this season at Fresno State. The Rebels knocked off the Bulldogs 38-28 in Fresno for their first-ever victory in the Golden State. The Rebels' previous most-western road game was at Wyoming in 2004.

**DEFENSE COMES UP BIG VS. COUGARS**

Facing a team that averaged 26.2 points per game a year ago, the Ole Miss defense rose to the occasion against BYU. Led by **Charles Sawyer's** 96-yard interception return for a touchdown, the Rebel "D" limited BYU to just seven offensive points and snapped a streak of 22 straight quarters with a score for the Cougars. Senior safety **Damien Jackson** and sophomore linebacker **Mike Marry** both posted a career-high 13 tackles, while senior CB **Marcus Temple** collected 6 stops (five solo) and a sack.

**LOCKETT BACK IN ACTION**

Senior **Kentrell Lockett** was granted a sixth-year of eligibility in the off-season by the NCAA after tearing his left ACL against Fresno State a year ago. The 2010 Chucky Mullins Award winner, entered this season with 23.5 TFLs and was a preseason All-SEC first team pick.

**FORWARD TOGETHER REBELS**

A pivotal moment in the rise of the Ole Miss Rebels took place on August 9 when the athletics department and UMAA Foundation announced the Forward Together capital campaign, which seeks to raise \$150 million in support of a comprehensive initiative aimed at new facility construction and existing facility enhancements for Ole Miss Athletics. Among the football improvements planned are renovations and improvements to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium concourse area, expansion of the north end-zone of Vaught-Hemingway Stadium to improve the overall aesthetic look and feel of the stadium and creation of an Ole Miss Athletics Hall of Fame. The plans also include a new, state-of-the-art basketball arena to replace Tad Smith Coliseum. On October 7, Ole Miss announced that it had reached \$40 million in commitments for the campaign.

**FAMILIAR FACES, NEW PLACES**

Ole Miss welcomed three new assistant coaches this season with the addition of **Gunter Brewer**, **Keith Burns** and **David Lee**. However, all three bring ties to the Rebels and the coaching staff. Brewer is the son of former Ole Miss head coach Billy Brewer and was a graduate assistant for the Rebels from 1988-89. Burns comes to Oxford from Kansas State, but is familiar to Houston Nutt, having served as Nutt's defensive coordinator at Arkansas from 1998-2002. Lee is back for his second stint in Oxford after serving as the Rebels' quarterbacks coach from 1978-82. This also marks Lee's third tour under Nutt, having served as quarterbacks coach at Arkansas from 2001-02 and offensive coordinator in 2007.

**CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD**

In the spring, LB **D.T. Shackelford** was selected as the 2011 recipient of the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a defensive player each year. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away on May 6, 1991. Shackelford, who torn his right ACL in the spring, will wear in the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor and is the first junior to ever win the award.

**100 IN 100**

In response to the athletics department's gameday satisfaction survey, Ole Miss created the "100 In 100" plan which called for 100 gameday improvements in 100 days in preparation for the 2011 season. Among the improvements (which actually totaled 102) were a gameday guide for fans, increasing the band size and providing new uniforms, relocating the band, improved stadium aesthetics and redesigned stadium cups with fight song lyrics.

**TEAM CAPTAINS**

On August 29, **Houston Nutt** announced the team captains for the 2011 season. This year's permanent captains, which are all seniors, include: on offense, RB **Brandon Bolden**, WR **Derrick Herman**, and OL **Bradley Sowell** and on defense, DE **Wayne Dorsey**, DE **Kentrell Lockett** and CB **Marcus Temple**. Lockett, who is returning for a sixth year after a torn ACL cut his 2010 campaign short, becomes just the fourth Rebel in the modern era to be chosen a team captain twice in his career. Others include Jamie Holder in 1984-85, Kenny King in 1974-75 and Bob McCain in 1944-45.

**GRADUATING REBELS**

Five student-athletes on the Ole Miss football team have already received their undergraduate degrees. **REBELS FACE LAST 6 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS IN OXFORD**

Ole Miss will host the past six national champions (Alabama, Auburn, Florida [twice], LSU and Texas) at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium over the next two seasons. In addition, over the next three seasons, the Rebels rank first in the nation in the numbers of visitors that have played in a BCS game (8), won a BCS game (5), the combined bowl wins (18), and 10 of the 14 opponents have won a bowl game, which is also first in the nation. Ole Miss also ranks first in the SEC and third in the nation behind Michigan and Michigan State in numbers of opponents that have played in a bowl game (25) during the three-year period.

- Running back **Jeff Scott** tore off a 69-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, which was the longest TD run by a Rebel since Scott's 83-yard score against Auburn last season. **BATON ROUGE, La. (AP)** - Ole Miss tallied the most points against LSU by any team this season, but the Tigers scored the go-ahead touchdown with 44 seconds left in the game to win the third annual Magnolia Bowl 43-36.

Baton Rouge native Brandon Bolden scored two touchdowns including his 13th career rushing touchdown, which is second most in school history. Bolden now has 22 career rushing scores, which is tied for second in Ole Miss history with John Fourcade and Joe Gunn.

Jordan Jefferson passed for a career-high 254 yards, threw for one touchdown and ran for another, and fifth-ranked LSU beat Ole Miss for the first time in three meetings.

LSU (10-1, 6-1 SEC) trailed 36-35 with 4:57 left when Patrick Peterson returned a kickoff 34 yards to midfield, setting up a game-winning drive that ended with Stevan Ridley's third touchdown rushing.

Ole Miss (4-7, 1-6) still had 44 seconds to come back, which did not seem all that unlikely the way the fourth quarter was going. But LSU's defense held firm and Peterson intercepted Jeremiah Masoli's desperation pass as time ran out.

LSU was heavily favored, but as usual, coach Houston Nutt found a way to make the Tigers nervous in a wild, seesaw game that featured 890 yards of offense.

Bolden rushed for 91 yards and two TDs for Ole Miss, which came in needing to win its final two games to be eligible for a bowl. Masoli finished 15 of 23 for 177 yards, one TD and two interceptions. Jeff Scott had 188 yards on kickoff returns for the Rebels, including three of at least 39 yards.

Jefferson was 13 of 17 with one interception, while Ridley's 89 yards rushing led LSU.

**OXFORD, Miss. (AP)** - Senior Brandon Bolden scored his 33rd career touchdown and topped 100 all-purpose yards, but Ole Miss fell 27-7 to Louisiana Tech on homecoming in Oxford.

Chad Boyd and Javontay Crowe scored defensive touchdowns, and Matt Nelson added a pair of field goals for Louisiana Tech.

Boyd scooped up a mishandled backfield exchange and raced 33 yards for a third quarter touchdown while Crowe's 26-yard interception return in the fourth helped the Bulldogs erase a 7-0 deficit. Nelson added field goals of 43 and 35 yards.

The win was the fifth straight for Louisiana Tech (6-4), who defeated a Southeastern Conference team for the first time since beating Mississippi State 22-14 in 2008.

The Rebels (2-8), following Monday's announcement that fourth-year head coach Houston Nutt would not return next season, lost its fifth consecutive game.

Louisiana Tech led 10-7 at halftime, tying the game on a 21-yard touchdown pass from Colby Cameron to Taulib Ikharo and a 43-yard field goal by Nelson on the first half's final play.

After taking a 7-0 lead, the Ole Miss offense sputtered, finishing with 307 total yards.

Ole Miss scored on its second series, capping a 78-yard drive with a 34-yard touchdown catch by Bolden from Randall Mackey.

Bolden finished the game with 112 all-purpose yards, gaining 46 rushing yards and 66 receiving yards.

Louisiana Tech regained control by halftime and used opportunistic plays from its defense in the second half to seal it. Boyd scored with 3:49 left in the third period and three series later, Crowe finished the scoring with 11:08 remaining.

Hunter Lee rushed for 127 yards on 24 carries as the Bulldogs rolled up 350 total yards. Cameron finished 13 of 27 for 180 yards while Quinton Patton and Ikharo finished with three receptions apiece. Adrien Cole led the Louisiana Tech defense with 10 tackles, including two for loss.

Ole Miss kicker Bryson Rose, who had hit 17 consecutive field goals over a two-year period, missed from 36 and 52 yards. Rose was within one kick of tying the SEC record set by Tennessee's Fuad Reveiz in 1982.

**BYU 14, OLE MISS 13**

OXFORD, Miss. - Defensive back Charles Sawyer returned an interception 96 yards for a touchdown, but BYU rallied to defeat Ole Miss 14-13 in front of 55,127 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

Ole Miss led 3-0 at halftime and stretched it to 10-0 with 8:34 left in the third quarter on a 96-yard interception return for a touchdown by Sawyer.

BYU trailed 13-0 early in the fourth quarter, but Jake Heaps hit Ross Apo for a 19-yard touchdown with 9:52 remaining to pull within 13-7. Less than five minutes later, BYU's defensive pressure forced Ole Miss quarterback Zack Stoudt to fumble, and Van Noy jumped on the football to cap a stunning comeback.

BYU won its first game as an independent after leaving the Mountain West Conference last year. Heaps completed 24 of 38 passes for 225 yards, one touchdown and one interception. The Cougars outgained the Rebels 318-208.

The first half was full of punts, defense and missed opportunities. BYU gained just 102 yards while Ole Miss managed just 93. Bryson Rose kicked a 20-yard field goal with 49 seconds left in the first half to give the Rebels a 3-0 halftime lead.

Ole Miss sophomore Barry Brunetti started at quarterback before giving way to Zack Stoudt late in the second quarter.

Stoudt's presence immediately energized the Rebels. The junior completed two passes for a combined 21 yards on his first drive, which ended in Rose's field goal just before the half. Stoudt finished 13 of 25 passing for 140 yards.

But the Rebels really didn't get going until Sawyer's interception, which stretched the lead to 10-0 and was the program's longest interception return for a touchdown since 2007. Another Rose field goal stretched the Rebels' lead to 13-0 early in the fourth quarter.

But the Cougars kept pounding away, with a 69-57 advantage in offensive plays. By the fourth quarter, the Rebels' defense looked gassed, and didn't have an answer for the BYU offense.

The biggest play was Stoudt's fumble. Three BYU defenders converged on Stoudt, slamming him to the turf as the ball popped loose. Van Noy took advantage of the opportunity, pouncing on the bouncing ball to lead the Cougars to the victory.

**OLE MISS 42, SOUTHERN ILLINOIS 24**

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Jeff Scott waited more than a season for a chance to be Ole Miss' featured running back. Four touchdowns later, the sophomore certainly made the most of his opportunity.

The 5-foot-7, 175-pound Scott rushed for three touchdowns and added another on a punt return, turning in a spectacular performance as Ole Miss downed Southern Illinois 42-24 on Saturday night.

Scott scored three touchdowns in the first six minutes of the game with the third coming on a 67-yard punt return that ended with him tip-toeing down the right sideline and just inside the bright orange pylon. It gave Ole Miss a 21-0 lead and the rout appeared to be well underway.

But the rest of the game wasn't as easy. Ole Miss (1-1) had a 35-10 lead early in the third quarter before Southern Illinois responded with two touchdown drives in the second half to pull within 35-24.

Steve Strother rushed for 116 yards for Southern Illinois (1-1), but the Salukis couldn't overcome four interceptions thrown by Paul McIntosh.

Ole Miss was playing without its top two running backs - seniors Brandon Bolden and Enrique Davis - after the pair suffered injuries in last week's season opener against BYU. But Scott was stellar in their place, rushing for touchdowns of 37 and 4 yards in the opening minutes before the punt return for a touchdown pushed the Rebels' lead to 21-0 with 9:09 remaining in the first half.

Scott's fourth touchdown of the night stretched the Rebels' lead to 35-10 with 10:23 left in the third quarter, but SIU responded with two touchdowns to pull within 35-24 with 6:39 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Zack Stoudt was decent in his first start as the Ole Miss quarterback, completing 11 of 18 passes for 118 yards and a touchdown.

Randall Mackey also saw his first action behind center, completing his only pass attempt for 18 yards and rushing for 36 yards on six carries.

Southern Illinois outgained Ole Miss 420-315. But Ole Miss coach Houston Nutt didn't dwell on the less-than-stellar numbers.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) - Vanderbilt scored 21 straight in the second quarter, as Ole Miss dropped its Southeastern Conference opener to the Commodores 30-7 here Saturday at Vanderbilt Stadium.

The win marks Vanderbilt's first 3-0 start since 2008 when the Commodores won their first bowl since 1955. The Commodores also beat Ole Miss (1-2) in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams for their fifth win in seven years in this series.

Vanderbilt picked off five passes, all off Zack Stoudt, and Trey Wilson's interception return for a TD is the Commodores' third this season. Stoudt came through with a 47-yard TD pass to Donte Moncrief with 2:15 left to avoid being shut out by Vandy for the first time since 1946.

The Commodores got going late in the second and took control. Stacy picked up 26 yards after Smith handed the ball off to the running back using his left, non-throwing hand, almost directly behind him in a bit of nice misdirection. Smith finished off the drive on an option keeper for 19 yards and a 7-0 lead with 5:40 left in the second quarter.

With Ole Miss facing third-and-15, defensive end Walker May hurried Stoudt into a throw that went straight to Wilson, and the Vanderbilt cornerback ran it back up the left sideline for a 14-0 lead with 4:39 remaining. It was Wilson's second TD off an interception this season and the third overall for Vanderbilt - the first time the Commodores have had three of those in a season.

After another Ole Miss three-and-out, Seymour pushed his way in to finish off a 9-yard TD and a 21-0 lead that had Commodores' fans celebrating a rare early lead.

Freshman Isaiah Crowell had several big gains on the ground, and Andy Murray's 2-yard touchdown pass to Orson Charles gave the Bulldogs a 17-0 lead with 6:01 in the second quarter.

But the Rebels responded with a flurry. After a reverse handoff, Randall Mackey hit a wide-open Donte Moncrief for a 38-yard touchdown to pull within 17-7. Then Ole Miss immediately recovered an onside kick and the Vaught-Hemingway Stadium crowd of 58,042 had something to cheer about.

The momentum was short lived. Mackey threw an interception three plays later.

Both of the Rebels' touchdowns came after a reverse. Mackey threw a 38-yard touchdown pass to Moncrief after taking a handoff from running back Jeff Scott. Nick Brassell scored on an 81-yard punt return after Scott caught the punt, ran across the field and handed off to Brassell.

Scott appeared to give the Rebels a second punt return for a score in the game's final minute, but the 67-yard TD return was called back on a blocking penalty.

The Rebels rotated Zack Stoudt and Mackey throughout the game. Stoudt completed just 7 of 23 passes for 71 yards and an interception. Mackey completed 3 of 7 passes for 78 yards, a touchdown and an interception.

Murray completed 17 of 26 passes for 268 yards and two touchdowns. Crowell rushed for 147 yards on 30 carries, helping the Bulldogs (2-2, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) grind to the road victory. Malcolm Mitchell caught three passes for 93 yards as the Bulldogs gained 475 total yards.

FRESNO, Calif. (AP) - Running back Jeff Scott rushed for a career-high 138 yards and scored two touchdowns, and senior running back Brandon Bolden added two touchdowns to lead the Ole Miss Rebels (2-3) to a 38-28 win against Fresno State at Jim Sweeney Field.

The Rebels capped their first trip ever to California by earning their first win of the season against an FBS-level team.

Ole Miss led Fresno State 20-14 at the half behind Bolden's two TD runs. The Baton Rouge, La., native now ranks second in Ole Miss history with 25 rushing TDs and 30 total touchdowns. He also moved into sixth place in school history with 3,206 all-purpose yards. In two career games versus Fresno State, Bolden has 271 yards rushing and five TDs.

Scott tore off a 69-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, which was the longest TD run by a Rebel since Scott's 83-yard score against Auburn last season. Scott posted his third career 100-yard rushing game and his second of the season. He also caught one pass for 24 yards and added 44 yards on kickoff returns. The 206 all-purpose yards mark the second 200-yard all-purpose game of his season and the third of his career.

The Bulldogs scored twice in the third quarter and led 28-27 heading into the final frame, but it was all Rebels in the final 15 minutes. Scott scored his second touchdown - a 12-yard run - with 8:49 remaining for the go ahead score and the Rebels added the two-point conversion for a 35-28 lead.

Junior Bryson Rose connected on a 24-yard field goal attempt with 3:24 left in the fourth quarter and has now made 13 consecutive field goal attempts dating back to last season.

In his first career start, junior quarterback Randall Mackey threw for 214 yards and one touchdown on 8-of-18 passing. He also rushed five times for 35 yards.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Freshman Nickolas Brassell posted his first career 100-yard receiving game as Ole Miss fell to No. 2 Alabama 52-7 in front of a crowd 61,792 in Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, which marked the fourth-largest crowd in Ole Miss history.

Alabama running back Trent Richardson ran for a career-best 183 yards and set another a career best with four touchdowns. Richardson put the Rebels (2-4, 0-3 SEC) away with an electric 76-yard run midway through the third quarter.

Randall Mackey's 59-yard pass completion to the 2 on the game's fourth play helped the Rebels take a 7-0 lead on their opening drive. But after giving up 72 yards on that drive's five plays, the Crimson Tide held Ole Miss without a yard for the rest of the half, a total of 18 plays, on the way to a 17-7 lead.

Alabama turned up the offensive intensity in the second half, scoring on five of six offensive possessions. The sixth ended deep in Ole Miss territory as time expired.

Richardson and Fowler, who finished with 125 yards rushing, helped the Tide rush for 389 yards (9.3 yards per carry) and Alabama finished with 615 total. The Rebels didn't find much room in the second half either, and finished with 113 total yards and just 28 rushing.

The Crimson Tide forced two turnovers, sacked Mackey five times and stopped the Rebels' only real second-half threat with a goal-line stand.

The Rebels, already without four players due to suspension, lost two key defenders to injuries as well. Cornerback Marcus Temple fractured his right ankle in the first half and defensive end Wayne Dorsey was lost in the second half to an unspecified injury.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Junior Randall Mackey threw two touchdowns and rushed for another, but Ole Miss could not hold on to an early 17-0 lead as the Rebels fell to No. 9 Arkansas 29-24 on Saturday.

Tyler Wilson threw for 232 yards and rushed for two touchdowns. Dennis Johnson rushed for 160 yards on 15 carries, including a 52-yard touchdown. Joe Adams caught four passes for 124 yards.

Ole Miss took a 17-0 lead with 6:20 remaining in the second quarter after Mackey's 3-yard touchdown run, but the Razorbacks responded with 29 unanswered points to take the lead.

The Razorbacks' league-leading passing offense was never at its best, but Wilson was effective when it mattered. He completed 13 of 28 passes and didn't throw an interception.

Ole Miss took a 3-0 lead on Bryson Rose's 43-yard field goal late in the first quarter and then stretched it to 10-0 on Mackey's 31-yard touchdown pass to Donte Moncrief on the first play of the second quarter.

The Rebels stretched their lead on Mackey's 3-yard touchdown run to go up 17-0 before the Razorbacks finally showed some life with Johnson's 52-yard touchdown run that pulled the half-time score to 17-7.

Arkansas kept the momentum in the second half. The Razorbacks scored on two field goals by Zach Hocker, Wilson's two short TDs and a safety by linebacker Jerry Franklin to go up 29-17 early in the fourth quarter.

The Ole Miss offense, which was so impressive in the first half, struggled after halftime until a late surge.

Mackey found Moncrief in the corner of the end zone for a 4-yard touchdown - his second of the game - and the Rebels pulled within 29-24. The onside kick was recovered by Ole Miss tight end Jamal Mosley with 1:21 remaining and the Rebels briefly had life. But Eric Bennett intercepted an Mackey pass on the second play of the drive and the Razorbacks were able to run out the clock.

Mackey completed 18 of 30 passes for 219 yards, two touchdowns and one interception in this third career start. Brandon Bolden rushed for 68 yards on 14 carries, but was hobbled after a second-quarter ankle injury and never looked the same.

AUBURN, Ala. (AP) - Senior running back Brandon Bolden rushed for a season-high 114 yards on 13 carries and two touchdowns, but Ole Miss fell to No. 23 Auburn 41-23 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

After falling behind 14-0 early, the Rebels responded rushing for a season-high 172 yards in the first half, led by Bolden, who recorded his first 100-yard rushing performance of the year and eighth of his career.

The Rebels put together a nice drive late in the first quarter that resulted in a 1-yard TD run by Bolden to make it 14-7 Auburn.

Junior Bryson Rose connected on a 39-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter as the Rebels pulled to within 14-10. Rose has now made 15 consecutive field goal attempts dating back to last season and is now three field goals shy of the SEC record for consecutive field goals made.

After Auburn added a field goal to go up 17-10, the Rebels used a 9-play 60-yard drive culminating in another Bolden 1-yard TD run to even the score heading into the break.

The Tigers (6-3, 4-2 SEC) scored a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter to break the half-time deadlock and go up 31-17.

Rebel quarterback Randall Mackey finished the night 15-of-27 for 157 yards and a TD pass to freshman wide receiver Nickolas Brassell. He has now thrown a touchdown pass in three straight games.

Bolden moved into fourth all-time on the Ole Miss rushing list with 2,419 yards, passing Dou Innocent. He totaled 122 all-purpose yards to pass Mike Wallace for third on the Ole Miss career list with 3,405 all-purpose yards. Bolden's two rushing TDs gave him 27 career rushing scores and 32 total TDs, both of which rank second in Ole Miss history.

**LEXINGTON, Ky.** -- Freshman Nickolas Brassell totaled 96 all-purpose yards and a touchdown, but Ole Miss fell to Kentucky 30-13 here Saturday at Commonwealth Stadium.

Ole Miss used two field goals (31, 37) by junior Bryson Rose to take a 6-0 lead after the first quarter. Rose has now made 17 consecutive field goal attempts dating back to last season, which is one shy of the SEC record and the nation's longest active streak.

With both teams looking for their first SEC win, Kentucky used a 9-play drive--resulting in a 2-yard TD run by CoShik Williams at the beginning of the second quarter--to get on the board.

The Rebels had the ball at the Kentucky 49 with 2:07 remaining in the half, but two plays later, quarterback Randall Mackey was intercepted by Wildcat linebacker Danny Trevathan, setting up a 48-yard field goal by Greg McIntosh to give the Wildcats the 10-6 lead heading into the locker room.

Kentucky got the ball to start the second half, but the Rebel defense forced a three and out. Ole Miss, who had been outscored in the third quarter coming into the game, went 72 yards in 12 plays capped by a 21-yard pass from Mackey to Brassell to regain the lead 13-10 with 7:15 to go in the third quarter. It marked Brassell's second career touchdown and second TD in as many games.

Unfortunately, that would be it for the Rebels. Kentucky scored early in the fourth quarter on an eight-play 80-yard drive that resulted in a 38-yard touchdown pass from freshman quarterback Maxwell Smith to La'Rod King. The missed extra point made it 16-13 Wildcats.

The Wildcats added two late touchdowns for the final 30-13 score.

The Rebels started six true freshmen in the game, including Brassell, who got his first start on defense and Serderius Bryant, who finished with a career-high 10 tackles, including three solo. In addition to his 96 yards and one TD on offense, Brassell totaled three tackles, a pass break-up and a half a QB sack. Another freshman to start on defense, safety Cody Prewitt registered a career-best nine tackles and four solo stops.

Freshman Donte Moncrief hauled in four passes for 68 yards including a 19-yarder in the Rebels third quarter touchdown drive. He is now seven receptions and 59 yards shy of Mike Espy's Ole Miss freshmen records for catches and receiving yards.

**OXFORD, Miss. (AP)** - Senior Brandon Bolden scored his 33rd career touchdown and topped 100 all-purpose yards, but Ole Miss fell 27-7 to Louisiana Tech on homecoming in Oxford.

Chad Boyd and Javontay Crowe scored defensive touchdowns, and Matt Nelson added a pair of field goals for Louisiana Tech.

Boyd scooped up a mishandled backfield exchange and raced 33 yards for a third quarter touchdown while Crowe's 26-yard interception return in the fourth helped the Bulldogs erase a 7-0 deficit. Nelson added field goals of 43 and 35 yards.

The win was the fifth straight for Louisiana Tech (6-4), who defeated a Southeastern Conference team for the first time since beating Mississippi State 22-14 in 2008.

The Rebels (2-8), following Monday's announcement that fourth-year head coach Houston Nutt would not return next season, lost its fifth consecutive game.

Louisiana Tech led 10-7 at halftime, tying the game on a 21-yard touchdown pass from Colby Cameron to Taulib Ikharo and a 43-yard field goal by Nelson on the first half's final play.

After taking a 7-0 lead, the Ole Miss offense sputtered, finishing with 307 total yards.

Ole Miss scored on its second series, capping a 78-yard drive with a 34-yard touchdown catch by Bolden from Randall Mackey.

Bolden finished the game with 112 all-purpose yards, gaining 46 rushing yards and 66 receiving yards.

Louisiana Tech regained control by halftime and used opportunistic plays from its defense in the second half to seal it. Boyd scored with 3:49 left in the third period and three series later, Crowe finished the scoring with 11:08 remaining.

Hunter Lee rushed for 127 yards on 24 carries as the Bulldogs rolled up 350 total yards. Cameron finished 13 of 27 for 180 yards while Quinton Patton and Ikharo finished with three receptions apiece. Adrien Cole led the Louisiana Tech defense with 10 tackles, including two for loss.

Ole Miss kicker Bryson Rose, who had hit 17 consecutive field goals over a two-year period, missed from 36 and 52 yards. Rose was within one kick of tying the SEC record set by Tennessee's Fuad Reveziz in 1982.
