Stringer, the team's starting point guard a year ago, had his third best college game vs. S. Ala. (11/23) with 20 points on 6-of-10 shooting, including 3 treys ... Now the wing guard, started 37 consecutive games. 14-34 from arc.

G 22 Ralston Turner (So., 6-6, Muscle Shoals, Ala.) 11.1 ppg, 2.9 rpg, 1.4 apg

Turner started every game he has dressed at LSU (34) ... Leading scorer a year ago ... Coaches All-SEC Freshman team a year ago ... Team best 16 treys (16-42, 38.1%).

F 2 Johnny O'Bryant III (Fr., 6-9, Cleveland, Miss.) 8.7 ppg, 6.4 rpg

Made his first start of his LSU career in the win at Houston ... Did not make a field goal, but had seven boards, including five offensive ... Leads the team in rebounds at 6.4 a game.

C 41 Justin Hamilton (Jr., 7-0, Alpine, Utah) 11.1 ppg, 6.3 rpg

Transferred from Iowa State after his sophomore season ... Hit 5-of-6 from field offr 11 points in S. Ala. game (11/23) ... 5 more field goals in the Houston win ... 5 offensive boards ... 28-of-59 from the field (47.5%) and 22-of-26 from FT line (84.6%) ... Double figures five of the seven games

STORYLINES

- Storm Warren made two clutch free throws with 1.2 seconds left first to tie and then to get the lead for the Tigers at Houston The Cougars scored with 9.1 seconds left to take a one-point lead ... After the Warren free throws, Houston missed a half-court shot and LSU was a 59-58 winner.

- Anthony Hickey earned All-Tournament honors at Charleston averaging 16.0 points per game in the three games (making 19-of-37 FG) and 6-of-14 from the arc ... Justin Hamilton averaged 12.0 in the three games and Andre Stringer 10.3.

- The Tigers and Rutgers will be the 11th of 12 games in the Big East/SEC Challenge with only West Virginia at Mississippi State remaining afterwards ... It will be LSU's first meeting with Rutgers and LSU's first game in the state of New Jersey since playing North Carolina (L, 47-43) in East Rutherford in 1982 ... LSU has played two other New Jersey schools -- Farleigh Dickinson ('75) and St. Peters ('74, '81), but all three games were in BR.

- LSU has done well from the free throw line this season, hitting 108-

- of-138 or 78.3 percent (Best in the SEC) ... LSU was 11-of-14 in the win at Houston, including the two most important with 1.2 to play ... Stringer leads the team at 87.0% (20-23), while Warren is at 86.7% (13-15) ... Hamilton goes at 84.6% (22-26) and Turner is 80 percent (12-15).

- In all seven games, the Tigers had double figures on the offensive boards, including 19 against Western Kentucky and this past Wednesday at Houston ... LSU held a 14-1 advantage in the second half as they rallied from eight down at the half.

Trent Johnson

Head Coach • 4th year at LSU (13th year as head coach)

Trent Johnson, with two strong back-to-back recruiting classes on board, enters his fourth season as the head coach of the LSU Tigers in 2011-12.

Johnson's passion and vision for the LSU basketball program has the Tigers headed in the right direction.

As Johnson and his staff continue to develop players both on the court and off the court, they expected continued improvement athletically, academically and socially from the team.

Johnson, the 20th men's basketball coach at LSU, seeks to build on more than a decade of excellence at LSU, Stanford and Nevada. Having earned Conference Coach of the Year in all three leagues (Western Athletic Conference, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conference), Johnson knows the route to success to getting LSU back in the national spotlight.

In his first season at LSU, Johnson led the Tigers to 27 wins, tied for the third most wins in a season in LSU history. The Tigers won the SEC regular season championship with a record of 13-3. LSU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006, advancing to the second round before falling, 84-70, to North Carolina in the closest game the eventual national champions would have to play. LSU had a second half lead on the Tar Heels and the game was still in the balance entering the final eight minutes.

Coach Johnson has a blueprint for success for himself and his layers. As his players grasp the vision for success, they have the opportunity to embrace playing in a fast-paced system where executing in the half court and defending and rebounding are at a high level.

Johnson has a record of success and his team will have the opportunity to blend together and learn from a coach that is a fierce competitor who exudes and demands toughness.

His devotion to the team, his protective beliefs toward his players and his loyalty to his former players is evidenced the fact that three of his former players are now members of the LSU basketball staff. Johnson is a program builder and he has re-established the base of the LSU program by visiting with former players and coaches to bring together the past, the present and the future of the program.

Johnson also is charged with the development of athletes both on and off the court. Off the court, he has worked hard since day one to make sure student-athletes understand the "student" part of their days at LSU. At all three spots in his head coaching career, he has developed not just successful athletes and winning basketball teams, but young men who are having success in life.

In his 12 years combined as a Division I head coach at LSU, Stanford and Nevada, he has won 208 games and taken teams in seven-of-the-last-nine seasons to post-season play, including five NCAA appearances.

Johnson was named the 2009 consensus SEC Coach of the Year and was a finalist for four national coach of the year honors as he became the first LSU men's basketball coach to win the league title and take the team to post-season play in his first year at the school.

Johnson has always been a big believer in special causes and joined former LSU basketball coach Dale Brown and star center Shaquille O'Neal in cutting a series of commercials that aired nationally for the "Be A Match" organization of bone marrow donors.

In June 2010, Johnson was part of a 10-day trip to Africa as part of the Nkomazi Sports Club Organization program that was established to stop the transmission of HIV through culturally relevant, locally sustainable health and life skills education-based programs in communities affected by HIV/AIDS.

He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and has served on the NABC Special Committee on Recruiting and Access. He also gives his time freely to such organizations as the Boy Scouts of America, the Louisiana Health and Rehab Center, Inc., the American Diabestes Association, Samaritan's Feet, Troops First and the Jummy V Foundation for cancer research.

Johnson, was born in Berkeley, Calif., and is married to Jackie and they have two children: a daughter, Tinishia, 28, and a son, Terry, 25.

Johnson's vision and passion is what drives him to make LSU basketball a success. With a coaching staff and a group of players that believe in the same vision and passion, that success has to be very much in site.

Senior forward Storm Warren made two free throws with 1.2 seconds left to give LSU a come-from-behind victory at Houston Tuesday night ... The Tigers had trailed by eight, 38-30, at the half before LSU was able to get the game back even at the 13:34 mark and the game went back-and-forth the rest of the way ... LSU's ability to gather rebounds on the offensive boards was never more evident than in the second half of the game as LSU out rebounded the Cougars offensively 14-1 to end up with an 8-2 advantage in the half in second chance points ... LSU also got control of the points off turnovers in the second half, getting a 7-3 advantage in the final 20 minutes after Houston had 14 points off mistakes in the first half.

Andre Stringer led LSU with 13 points, while Ralston Turner added 12 points as the two sophomores shot 9-of-19 from the field (including 4-of-8 outside the arc) ... Storm Warren had 12 points and Justin Hamilton added 11 ... LSU shot just 34.4 percent from

the field (22-64), but out rebounded the Cougars, 41-34.

It marked LSU's second win this year when scoring under 60 points, having also won with 59 points against Georgia Tech at the Charleston Classic.

This will be the first meeting between the two teams Saturday night in the Challenge ... Rutgers comes into the game with the same record as LSU at 4-3 ... All four of Rutgers wins have come at The RAC ... Rutgers was a 94-56 winner over the University of Maryland-Baltimore Country on Monday night ... Rutgers had 27 assists, their most since 1992 ... Point guard Myles Mack hit 7-of-9 field goals with three treys to finish with 20 points and four assists in just 20 minutes, while Gilvydas Biruta and Mike Poole had 13 points each and Eli Carter scored 12 ... Rutgers had a 46-24 advantage at the half, getting 42 points for the game in the paint and 31 points off turnovers ... Only three players played more than 19 minutes in the contest.

Mike Rice is in his second season as the head coach at Rutgers after three seasons as head coach at Robert Morris ... His Robert Morris teams went to one NIT and two NCAA Tournaments.

The Challenge

The Big East-SEC Challenge goes to a full-blown three-night 12-game event after the Big East-SEC invitational was in its four year run (2007-10) a two-night four-game set of games at semi-neutral sites ... Now the event features all 12 SEC teams and 12 of the Big East teams playing on six SEC and six Big East home courts.

For the four years of the Invitational, the Big East won in 2007, the SEC in 2010 and the 2008 and 2009 events were tied at 2-2. Here is the schedule of games for this year that started on Thursday:

Dec. 1 - Providence at South Carolina; St. John's at Kentucky; Ole Miss at DePaul; Georgetown at Alabama.

Dec. 2 - Florida at Syracuse; Cincinnati at Georgia; Vanderbilt at Louisville; Auburn at Seton Hall.

Dec. 3 - Arkansas at UConn; Pittsburgh at Tennessee; LSU at Rutgers; West Virginia at Mississippi State.

With LSU and Rutgers playing in the 11th game of the Challenge, there is the chance that the game could possibly be one that could swing the event one way or another, unless one league gets an early advantage.

The Tigers are 18-29 all-time against the present members of the Big East with the last meeting a loss to UConn in the preseason NIT semifinals in November 2009 ... Here's how LSU stacks up against the Big East teams it has played (remember results are all-time, not necessarily just when the team was in the Big East:

Cincinnati 0-1; UConn 1-3; DePaul 3-3; Georgetown 4-2; Louisville 1-8; Marquette 0-1; Notre Dame 1-0; Pittsburgh 2-2; St. John's 1-2; Syracuse 0-1; Villanova 2-2; West Virginia 3-3.

LSU will play Marquette in Baton Rouge on Dec. 19 in the first-half of a home-and-home series that will see LSU travel to Milwaukee next year. LSU's previous appearance in the Invitational was in the 2007 event when Villanova rallied to beat LSU, 68-67. Rutgers beat Auburn, 63-54, in their Invitational appearance last year.

LSU In New Jersey

It's been 19 years since LSU played a game in the state of New Jersey, having lost 47-43 to North Carolina in a game played in 1982 at East Rutherford, N.J. ... LSU has played New Jersey schools Farleigh-Dickinson and St. Peter's in three games, but all were in Baton Rouge.

LSU finished the Nov. 17-20 Charleston Classic with a 2-1 record as LSU defeated Western Kentucky, 76-57, and Georgia Tech, 59-50, after an 88-82 first-round loss ver-

sus Northwestern. In the process, point guard Anthony Hickey was named to the five-member all-tournament team after averaging 16 points for the three games, hitting over 51 percent of his field goal attempts (19-of-37), making six treys and averaging 4.3 rebounds and 4.0 assists.

Justin Hamilton also averaged 12 points and 7.7 rebounds and Andre Stringer 10.3 points per game.

Against Northwestern, Johnny O'Bryant III led the team with 21 points in 22 minutes, with Stringer getting 15, Hickey 11 and Hamilton 10. LSU had a 41-32 lead at the half, but Northwestern's 1-3-1 zone in the second half caused LSU problems turning the game to a nine-point Northwestern lead with 5:07 left. LSU cut the lead down gradually to one on a Ralston Turner Trey with 48 seconds left, but Northwestern came down and hit a three of its own to put the game out of reach.

The LSU-Western Kentucky affair was a trip to the free throw line in the first half as the teams combined for 53 first half free throws. LSU was 13-of-17 in the half, WKU 14-of-14. In the second half, LSU was 5-of-7 while WKU was 4-of-13. LSU made some key shots and got 22 points off turnovers to win going away. Justin Hamilton had 18 points and Anthony Hickey 17.

In the fifth place game versus Georgia Tech, freshman point guard Anthony Hickey cinched his spot on the All-Tournament team with 20 points, including four treys ... LSU led by four at the half and the game remained close until LSU went on a 9-4 run in which Hickey, Ralston Turner and Andre Stringer all hit threes to put LSU up for good ... LSU made 8-of-18 from the arc and 9-of-10 free throws ... LSU's Stringer was also in double figures at 11 points.

Season 41 At The PMAC

It was the 1971-72 season that the first game was played in the then LSU Assembly Center, opening the building on Jan. 3, 1972 against Vanderbilt, an 80-73 loss. The Tigers got their first win in the building on Jan. 6, 1972 against Georgetown, 90-71.

LSU will be trying to get its home field advantage back this season at the Maravich Center after winning just 8-of-18 games a year ago. The Tigers still have a good percentage in the building's history of 462-165 (73.8%) overall, including 248-37 (87.3 percent) in non-conference contests ... Trent Johnson is 29-6 in his three years as head coach at LSU in home non-conference contests.

The Tigers are 1-1 this season at home ... LSU returns home on Dec. 10 to take on Boise State and plays UC-Irvine on Dec. 15.

On The Road

The Tigers had three road wins last year on opponent's courts - at South Alabama, at Auburn and at Mississippi State, finishing 3-8 on opponents home courts last year ... The win over Houston Tuesday marked the first win on an opponent's home court this season ... Trent Johnson is now 10-21 on opponent's home courts ... Overall, LSU is 404-578 (41.1%) on the road in its history ... LSU's is 1-1 on the road court this year, losing earlier in the month at Coastal Carolina.

Neutral Court

LSU's two wins on a neutral court in the Charleston Classic stopped a couple of years of non-winning seasons on neutral courts ... LSU is now 4-11 since the start of the 2008-09 season on a neutral court, but 124-127 in the history of the program, 2-1 this year.

Depth Returns To LSU Basketball

The LSU program has something it hasn't had to this magnitude in several years - depth. Each class has three players on the present 12-man roster ... The main difference for this year's team is that it has allowed players to play their natural position, for example, Eddie Ludwig can now play on the wing facing the basket and last year's point guard, Andre Stringer, is now playing on the wing, although he can play the point if needed.

In the first six games, the freshmen had scored 34.8 percent of the points, the sophomores 32 percent, the juniors 17 and seniors 16 percent. But things changed a bit after sophomores Stringer and Turner carried the Tigers in the scoring against Houston

... Now the sophomores have totaled 33.1 percent of the points, compared to 31.8 percent for the freshman ... The juniors are at 17.6 percent and the seniors at 17.4.

So far in seven games, freshmen have led LSU in scoring three times (Hickey 2, O'Bryant III 1), a sophomore three times (Stringer 2, Turner 1) and a junior once (Hamilton). On the rebounding end, a freshman led four times (O'Bryant III), a junior three times (Hamilton) and a senior once (Warren).

Holding The Lead

Twice in LSU's three losses, the Tigers found themselves with double digit leads that they were unable to keep as the game moved through the second half.

Vs. Northwestern (11/17) - The Tigers were able to get a 41-32 halftime advantage, but the Wildcats came back with a 1-3-1 matchup zone that gave the Tigers trouble, allowing Northwestern to even the game and get a nine-point lead heading to the final five minutes. To LSU's credit, the Tigers were able to work the game back down and cut the lead to just one on a Ralston Turner three with 48 seconds left. But Northwestern was able to clinch the game with a three-of-its-own at the 28-second mark en route to the 88-82 win.

Vs. South Alabama (11/23) - LSU was up 41-31 at intermission in the game at the Maravich Center and led by 11, 61-50, at the 8:04 mark before South Alabama made their move as LSU began to get away from its offense ... USA eventually tied the game at 63-63 with 3:31 to play, eventually forcing the game to overtime at 69-69 ... In the overtime, a jumper by the Jaguars followed by a blocked LSU layup and another bucket by USA gave South Alabama a 75-71 lead with 2:22 to play that LSU couldn't overcome.

Look At The Free Throw Shooting

Storm Warren showed the team's success at the free throw line by making the two charity tosses with 1.2 seconds left to win the game on Tuesday night ... Warren was a 51.5 percent free throw shooter a year ago (17-33), but this year he is 13-of-15 at the line (86.7 percent) ... LSU was 11-of-14 at the line against Houston ... LSU is 108-of-138 at the line of 78.3 percent, way ahead of the second best team in the league, Tennessee, at 74.5 percent ... Only Alabama (115) and Mississippi State (109) have made more free throws than LSU ... Andre Stringer leads LSU at the line at 87.0 percent (20-23), while Warren is at 86.7 percent (13-15) ... Justin Hamilton comes in at 84.6 percent (22-26) and Ralston Turner at 80 percent (12-15).

Opponents are at 73.3 percent (96-131) ... Last season LSU made 66.5 percent of its free throws (432-650), the second consecutive season LSU was below 70 percent.

Stringer is sixth in the league in free throw percentage with Hamilton eighth.

The Arc Is Better

LSU last season shot 31.2 percent from the three-point arc, making 175 -of-561 attempts (5.4 a game) ... In the first seven games this season, LSU's percentage is up to 36.9 percent (48-of-130), averaging 6.9 a contest ... Ralston Turner has 16, Andre Stringer 14 and Anthony Hickey 12 ... Stringer is at 41.2 percent (14-34), while Turner is at 38.1 percent (16-42) and Hickey is at 37.5 percent (12-32) ... LSU is fifth in the league in three-point shooting.

Good Start For Mr. Basketball, McDonald's All-American

High school honors are one thing, but will high school stars be able to make the transition to a game where the game is faster and more is required more often.

Kentucky's Mr. Basketball, Anthony Hickey, and McDonald's All-American Johnny O'Bryant III made the most of their time on the court in the opener.

Hickey's All-Tournament performance in the Charleston Classic has been documented earlier, but he had one of his best games distributing the ball against South Alabama last week, playing 37 minutes with six assists and no turnovers ... Hickey is fourth in the league in assist average at 4.0 a game and ninth in assist-to-turnover ratio with 28 assists and 18 turnovers, a 1.6 ratio ... Hickey is second on the team in scoring at 11.6 points per game ... Hickey also leads the league in steals average at 2.6 a game.

O'Bryant III came up big in the Northwestern game (11/17) when he hit 6-of-8 field goal attempts in 22 minutes and made 9-of-11 at the free throw line in a 21 point effort.

Both players will be looking to rebound after bad shooting nights at Hofheinz Pavilion in Houston as the two were 1-of 18 from the field.

Hamilton Showing Ability

The transfer from Iowa State had double figures in two of his three games in the Charleston Classic, highlighted by 18 against Western Kentucky ... Hamilton had 18 points on 5-of-10 shooting and 8-of-8 at the free throw line and just missed his first double double with nine rebounds ... For the three games, Hamilton averaged 11.2 points and 6.6 boards ... Hamilton had 11 points in each of the last two games, with seven rebounds versus Houston, including five offensive boards.

Countdown to Warren Milestone

LSU senior Storm Warren is at the point where the countdown has begun to his 500 career rebound when he would become the 37th player in school history to grab 500 boards ... Warren just missed a double double against Coastal Carolina (11/15) with nine boards and he now has 478 rebounds, 22 shy of 500.

LSU In Early SEC Team Stats

Entering the game, LSU was eighth in the league in scoring offense at 72.9 points per game, as documented the leader in free throw percentage (78.2%), but ninth in field goal percentage at 39.5 percent. The Tigers are ninth in rebounds at 38.0 percent, but tied for first in offensive rebounds at 16.0 a game ... The Tigers are seventh in the league in assists (12.9), second in steals at 10.0 a game.

Well, NBA Settles And Now What For Former Players

The NBA has now settled and now the real game begins for a couple of players regarding their NBA futures, most notably Glen Davis (entering fifth season) and Marcus Thornton (entering third year) who are free agents for the first time in their careers ... Will Garrett Temple return from Italy is another question that will have to be answered ... What is known is that Shaquille O'Neal has retired and that means that Brandon Bass, entering his seventh season in the league, is LSU's new senior member in the NBA. Here is the way things will stand when the Dec. 9 training camp/free agent work begins:

Brandon Bass, Orlando Magic - entering his 3rd season with Orlando, 7th in NBA

Glen Davis, Boston Celtics - free agent after four seasons in Boston

Chris Johnson, Portland Trailblazers - finished with Portland (10-day contracts)

Anthony Randolph, Minnesota - entering his fourth season in the NBA

Tyrus Thomas, Charlotte - entering 2nd full season with Charlotte, 6th in NBA

Marcus Thornton, Sacramento - free agent, traded in mid-season from New Orleans

Garrett Temple, Charlotte Bobcats - Has signed 1-year deal with Casale in Italy.

The Standings Will Look Different This Year In The SEC

For the first time since the 1991-92 season, the Southeastern Conference men's basketball standings will not be divided into Eastern and Western Divisions. The coaches voted and the athletic directors approved the move back to a league standing sheet that goes 1-12, top to bottom with the top four teams in the standings getting byes on the first night of the SEC Tournament. In the past, the top two teams in each division received the byes.

The 16-game schedule for this year is still based on divisional play of past years, home and home against the west teams and one game against the east, but the schedule for next year is still in a state of flux with new teams entering the league next year. It is expected the men's basketball teams will play some sort of 18-game conference schedule next year.

Tournament Goes Back To New Orleans

For the third time, the Southeastern Conference Tournament will be held in New Orleans, March 8-11, 2012 ... The tournament was previously held in 1996 and 2003 in New Orleans at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, but this year's event will be held at the home of the New Orleans Hornets, the New Orleans Arena ... The winner of the event receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

Tigers Sign Malik Morgan In Early Signing Period

The LSU Athletics Department and men's basketball Coach Trent Johnson announced that the school received the signed national letter of intent papers from highly-ranked guard Malik Morgan from River Ridge, La. Morgan, who is 6-3, is entering his senior season at John Curtis High School.

Morgan has garnered national recognition from the recruiting sites, ranking No. 75 overall in The Rivals 150 for the class of 2012. The four-star prospect is also ranked 11th in the country at the shooting guard position.

This past year Morgan averaged 28.9 points a game, including a career-high 52 points in one game against Riverside. He also averaged nine rebounds, two steals and two assists a game.

"We are very excited about the addition of Malik Morgan to the LSU Basketball family," said LSU Coach Trent Johnson. "Besides coming from a great family, Malik is a very, very good basketball player. He is very skilled -- not a good scorer, but a great scorer. One of the most impressive things about Malik besides his offensive skills and his ability to make players better, is his overall competitiveness. He is very competitive and he is going to have a huge impact on our team next year. Without question, I didn't see a better guard in the state of Louisiana, let alone his rankings as one of the best guards in the country."

Morgan's mother, the former Detra Brown, was a four-year letter-winner in volleyball while at LSU where she was twice an All-SEC selection. She still ranks fourth at LSU in career kills (1,504) and is one of only five players in the program's history to ever record 1,000 digs and 1,000 kills in a career.

Morgan chose LSU over Boston College, Georgia Tech, Missouri, Oklahoma and UTEP.

The Tigers will go right back to Baton Rouge after the contest to begin a week of final exams on Monday morning that will continue until Saturday afternoon.

LSU, which has only played two home games in the first month of the season, will begin an actual home stand of three games starting at the conclusion of exams. LSU will host Boise State on Dec. 10 at 7 p.m. in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in the first of a home-and-home series of the school that is Coach Trent Johnson's alma mater.
