Hickey was Mr. Basketball in Kentucky last season ... Was the first freshman to start at point in opener since 2000 season .... All-Tournament in Charleston ... 20 against Georgia Tech (11/20) ... One of six in SEC averaging over 4 apg ... 2nd in steals per game at 2.2 ... 41 ast, 23 TO to date. 1.8 ast/to ratio ... 6 games scoring in double figures.

#### F 13 Eddie Ludwig (Jr., 6-9, Metairie, La.) 2.9 ppg, 2.7 rpg

Started last two games after Andre Stringer situation and responded with career high 9 rebs vs. Boise (12/10) and then equaling scoring best at LSU of 12 vs. UCI (12/15) ... In two games, 14 pts, 14 rbs, 2 ast.

#### G 22 Ralston Turner (So., 6-6, Muscle Shoals, Ala.) 9.8 ppg, 2.5 rpg, 1.5 apg

Turner started every game he has dressed at LSU (42) ... Leading scorer a year ago ... Coaches All-SEC Freshman team a year ago ... 18 treys ... 84.2 percent at line (16-of-19) ... Just 4-22 FG last two games.

#### F 2 Johnny O'Bryant III (Fr., 6-9, Cleveland, Miss.) 8.6 ppg, 6.5 rpg

Started at forward all four games in the current LSU win streak ... 11 points at Rutgers & 10 vs. Boise (5-6 FG shooting) ... In both Houston (11/29) and UCI games (12/10) would have 7 rebounds, 5 of them offensive.

#### C 41 Justin Hamilton (Jr., 7-0, Alpine, Utah) 11.5 ppg, 6.5 rpg, 1.4 apg, 1.4 bpg

Iowa State transfer ... First LSU double-double with 14 points, 11 boards vs. UCI (12/15) ... Made 5-of-10 field goals vs. UCI ... Six of 11 boards were offensive ... Shooting 51.3% from the field (41-80) and 78.6% (33-42) at the free throw line ... 7 games in double figures ... team high 14 blocks ... 36 of 69 rebounds, offensive.

### STORYLINES

- LSU has won 4 consecutive games holding opponents under 60 points in each for the first time since LSU held five straight in late Dec. 2006-early Jan. 2007 ... The fifth game in that streak was a 66-49 win over No. 18 UConn.

- \* This is the final game of a three-game homestand before LSU travels to North Texas on Thursday ... LSU then starts another three-game home stand against Grambling (Dec. 29), Virginia (Jan. 2) and the SEC opener vs. Ole Miss (Jan. 7).

- Justin Hamilton recorded his first LSU double double against UCI (12/15) and for the second time in this four-game win streak, both Hamilton and Johnny O'Bryant III had more offensive rebounds than defensive in their totals.

- LSU had 14 offensive rebounds in the second half, matching their season high of 20 against UCI (12/15) ... LSU has had 20 offensive boards twice and 19 twice ... LSU has a 154-118 lead on the offensive boards over opponents and their 15.4 per game average is second in the SEC ... The Boise game

(12/10) is the only game in which LSU failed to pull down a double figure offensive rebound total.

- LSU got its free throws going after a slow start, hitting 18-of-24 and are at an SEC best 74.4% (149-199).

- LSU has drawn 31 charges in the three games, an average of 3.1 a game ... The season high was six at Rutgers.

- Entering the weekend, LSU's four-game winning streak was the third longest in the league, with Mississippi State at 9 and Ole Miss at 6.

# Trent Johnson

Head Coach • 4th year at LSU (13th year as head coach)

Trent Johnson, with two strong back-to-back recruiting classes on board, enters his fourth season as the head coach of the LSU Tigers in 2011-12.

Johnson's passion and vision for the LSU basketball program has the Tigers headed in the right direction.

As Johnson and his staff continue to develop players both on the court and off the court, they expected continued improvement athletically, academically and socially from the team.

Johnson, the 20th men's basketball coach at LSU, seeks to build on more than a decade of excellence at LSU, Stanford and Nevada. Having earned Conference Coach of the Year in all three leagues (Western Athletic Conference, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conference), Johnson knows the route to success to getting LSU back in the national spotlight.

In his first season at LSU, Johnson led the Tigers to 27 wins, tied for the third most wins in a season in LSU history. The Tigers won the SEC regular season championship with a record of 13-3. LSU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006, advancing to the second round before falling, 84-70, to North Carolina in the closest game the eventual national champions would have to play. LSU had a second half lead on the Tar Heels and the game was still in the balance entering the final eight minutes.

Coach Johnson has a blueprint for success for himself and his players. As his players grasp the vision for success, they have the opportunity to embrace playing in a fast-paced system where executing in the half court and defending and rebounding are at a high level.

Johnson has a record of success and his team will have the opportunity to blend together and learn from a coach that is a fierce competitor who exudes and demands toughness.

His devotion to the team, his protective beliefs toward his players and his loyalty to his former players is evidenced by the fact that three of his former players are now members of the LSU basketball staff. Johnson is a program builder and he has re-established the base of the LSU program by visiting with former players and coaches to bring together the past, the present and the future of the program.

Johnson also is charged with the development of athletes both on and off the court. Off the court, he has worked hard since day one to make sure student-athletes understand the "student" part of their days at LSU. At all three stops in his head coaching career, he has developed not just successful athletes and winning basketball teams, but young men who are having success in life.

In his 13 years combined as a Division I head coach at LSU, Stanford and Nevada, he has won 208 games and taken teams in seven-of-the-last-nine seasons to post-season play, including five NCAA appearances.

Johnson was named the 2009 consensus SEC Coach of the Year and was a finalist for four national coach of the year honors as he became the first LSU men's basketball coach to win the league title and take the team to post-season play in his first year at the school.

Johnson has always been a big believer in special causes and joined former LSU basketball coach Dale Brown and star center Shaquille O'Neal in cutting a series of commercials that aired nationally for the "Be A Match" organization of bone marrow donors.

In June 2010, Johnson was part of a 10-day trip to Africa as part of the Nkomazi Sports Club Organization program that was established to stop the transmission of HIV through culturally relevant, locally sustainable health and life skills education-based programs in communities affected by HIV/AIDS.

He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and has served on the NABC Special Committee on Recruiting and Access. He also gives his time freely to such organizations as the Boy Scouts of America, the Louisiana Health and Rehab Center, Inc., the American Diabestes Association, Samaritan's Feet, Troops First and the Jimmy V Foundation for cancer research.

Johnson, was born in Berkeley, Calif., and is married to Jackie and they have two children: a daughter, Tinishia, 28, and a son, Terry, 25.

Johnson's vision and passion is what drives him to make LSU basketball a success. With a coaching staff and a group of players that believe in the same vision and passion, that success has to be very much in sight.

As of Saturday PM, Andre Stringer remains out and is expected to remain out until after Christmas at the earliest ... Stringer fainted in practice prior to the Boise game (12/10) ... He is expected to be involved in tests all this coming week ... John isaac, who tweaked his left knee prior in shootaround for Boise game (12/10), returned for UCI game (12/15), played 12 minutes and scored six points.

### Last Time Out - LSU 66, UC Irvine 59 (Dec. 15, Baton Rouge)

LSU held an opponent for the fourth consecutive game under 60 points and needed to do it to get their fourth consecutive win as the LSU offense sputtered in the second half, allowing UC Irvine to hang around until almost the very end of the game after the Tigers had built a 12-point halftime advantage, 28-16.

LSU shot just 28.6 percent in the second half and 31.3 percent for the game (21-67) in running its record to 7-3 ... UCI had shot 21.9 percent in the opening 20 minutes but was able to make 15-of-34 shots in the second half (44.1 percent), closing the game to four with 6 minutes to play.

Playing for the second straight game without Andre Stringer, Justin Hamilton led the way with 14 points and 11 rebounds, his first double double of his LSU career, while Eddie Ludwig, subbing for Stringer, equaled his career high for points with 12. The pair com-

bined to make 9-of-17 field goals, while the remaining players for LSU made just 12-of-50 field goal attempts.

LSU out rebounded UC Irvine, 50-45, and equaled its season high of 20 offensive rebounds, making it nine of 10 games with double figure offensive rebounds.

#### Four Games Holding Teams Under 60

In the current four-game win streak, LSU has twice on the road at Houston (59-58) and at Rutgers (55-50) and twice at home against Boise 64-45 and UC Irvine (66-59), held teams under 60 points ... In the two road wins, LSU rallied in the second half to get the wins ... The Tigers defeated Houston after the Cougars scored with 9.1 seconds left to take a 58-57 lead ... Anthony Hickey drove the lane, missed a contested layup, and then senior Storm Warren grabbed the rebound with 1.2 seconds left. Warren hit both free throws for the LSU win.

Against Rutgers, LSU was down five with 7:01 to play and allowed just two Rutgers points the rest of the way ... Those points came after LSU had taken a 49-48 lead on a Hickey jumper with 1:20 to play ... Rutgers made two free throws to take a 50-49 lead 15 seconds later, but Hickey got inside and one game after having his layup knocked away, drove back inside and scored to give LSU the lead for good, 51-50. Rutgers would turn the ball over on a charge and on the inbounds, Hickey found Johnny O'Bryant for a dunk with 12 seconds left to make it a three-point game.

The road wins marked the first time LSU has won consecutive road games since February of the 2008-09 season when LSU beat Arkansas and Kentucky. LSU would win six consecutive road games during SEC play, but there was at least one home game between each of the road wins.

The last time LSU won two road games in the same week period and back-to-back on the schedule came in Feb. 2006 when LSU defeated Auburn on Feb. 18, 2006 and then Vanderbilt on Feb. 22, 2006.

The last time LSU held four consecutive opponents to under 60 points came in the December-January portion of the 2006-07 season when LSU beat Mississippi Valley State, 92-58, Samford 60-45 and then No. 18 Connecticut, 66-49 ... That was the final three games of what was a five-game run in which LSU held teams under 60 points ... LSU is 27-4 in the Trent Johnson era when holding teams under 60 points.

#### First Time This Season Against Nationally-Ranked

While the new Associated Press poll will come out in the hours prior to tipoff, after their win on Saturday, Marquette is ranked 11th in the country and will be the first ranked team LSU has faced this season ... LSU's record against team ranked in the top 25 since the poll started for the 1948-49 season is 59-227 (20.6 percent) ... In case Marquette cracks the top 10 in the new poll, LSU is 30-125 against Top 10 teams ... At its present rank of 11, LSU is 1-9 all-time against 11th-ranked teams.

In the Trent Johnson era, LSU is 1-12 against ranked teams with that one win coming on a neutral court against Butler in the opening round of the 2009 NCAA Tournament ... LSU is 0-6 in Coach Johnson's first three seasons against ranked teams in the Maravich Center - losses to Xavier (15) in 2009; Ole Miss (22), Tennessee (14) and Kentucky (4) in 2010; and, losses to Florida (14) and Vanderbilt (18) in 2011.

#### Marquette Information

The Golden Eagles are undefeated at 10-0 after a 93-72 win at home over the Northern Colorado Bears on Saturday ... Five Golden Eagles were in double figures -- Todd Mayo 22 points, Jae Crowder 19 points (11 rebounds), Vander Blue 18 points, Davante Gardner 14 and Jamil Wilson 11 ... Marquette shot 47.5 percent from the field and out rebounded Northern Colorado, 43-26 .. Junior Cadougan had nine points and nine assists with just two turnovers in 24 minutes.

As of the middle of last week, the Golden Eagles remained one of nine undefeated programs in the nation ... Marquette has started 10-0 on six prior occasions as they try for their seventh straight 20-win season. This is the first of two games against SEC schools although Marquette did not participate in the BIG EAST-SEC Challenge because of the size of the BIG EAST ... The Golden Eagles will host Vanderbilt on Dec. 29 ... Marquette was picked sixth in the BIG East Coaches Poll.

be the second time the teams will meet ... The last came in the National Invitation Tournament in Madison Square Garden in New York City, in 1970 as the entire tournament was conducted at the Garden in those days ... LSU and Marquette met in the semifinals with Marquette, a 101-79 winner and Marquette would beat St. John's in the final to win the title ... The coaches at the time – Al McGuire and Press Maravich ... The star players – Dean Meminger and “Pistol” Pete Maravich.

Buzz Williams is in his fourth season as the head coach at Marquette and he may be familiar to Louisiana basketball fans as he served as the head coach at the University of New Orleans during the 2006-07 season (14-17) and he also served as assistant coach at Northwestern State in 1999-00 ... After leaving UNO he was an assistant for one year (2007-08) before getting the head coach position at the school ... He has led the team to three-straight NCAA appearances.

### The Students Said It

It started as a chant and now it's a hash tag on Twitter but as Coach Johnson was being interviewed on CST after the Boise game (12/10), the Maravich Maniacs began chanting, “Fear The Vest!” ... So far the Tigers have won three times with the coaches wearing purple, twice with white and twice with black ... It's not a fashion statement or a trend that Coach Johnson and his staff are trying to make, just a comfort statement and who can argue with that.

### Season 41 At The PMAC

It was the 1971-72 season that the first game was played in the then LSU Assembly Center, opening the building on Jan. 3, 1972 against Vanderbilt, an 80-73 loss. The Tigers got their first win in the building on Jan. 6, 1972 against Georgetown, 90-71.

LSU will be trying to get its home court advantage back this season at the Maravich Center after winning just 8-of-18 games a year ago. The Tigers still have a good percentage in the building's history of 464-165 (73.8%) overall, including 250-37 (87.1%) in non-conference contests ... Trent Johnson is 31-6 in his four years as head coach at LSU in home non-conference contests.

The Tigers are 3-1 this season at home entering the Marquette game.

### Road Mark

LSU is 2-1 on the road court this year, with the one loss at Coastal Carolina ... LSU had three road wins all last year on opponent's courts – at South Alabama, at Auburn and at Mississippi State ... Trent Johnson is now 11-21 on opponent's home courts ... Overall, LSU is 405-578 (41.2%) on the road in its history.

With the three neutral court games in Charleston, LSU is 4-2 this year away from the Maravich Center in the first part of the season.

### Depth Returns to LSU Basketball

The LSU program has something it hasn't had to this magnitude in several years – depth. Each class has three players on the present 12-man roster ... Another difference for this year's team is that it has allowed players to play their natural position.

Plus, the importance of depth may have shown more than ever in the Boise game (12/10) when one starter at off-guard and another top reserve guard did not dress for the contest. But LSU was able to attack the game from a bit of a different direction and was able to sustain its defense in the process.

The other main benefit of having depth this year is that LSU has been able to sustain most of the games through the entire 40 minutes, something that LSU was unable to do a year ago.

In the 10 games, the freshmen have scored 30.9 percent of the points, while the sophomores have scored at a 30.2 percent clip ... The juniors have posted 21 percent of the points and the three seniors, some 17.5 percent of the points.

Freshmen have led LSU in scoring three times (Hickey 2, O'Bryant III 1), sophomores four times (Stringer 3, Turner 1) and a junior three times (Hamilton). On the rebounding end, a freshman led five times (O'Bryant III), a junior five times (Hamilton4, Ludwig 1) and a senior once (Warren).

## Ludwig Shows Ability To Step In

Speaking of that depth, it was Eddie Ludwig, the junior from Metairie, who had to step into the Andre Stringer position in the starting five the last two games ... For the game against Boise State (12/10) he responded with a big time effort of 33 minutes ... While he only scored two points, he did have a career high of nine rebounds, an assist and a block and was part of the defensive effort against leading Boise scorer Anthony Drmic, who came in averaging 15 points a game and was held scoreless.

Against UCI (12/15), Ludwig came through as a scorer, equaling his career high of 12 points in 24 minutes ... In the two games, Ludwig has played 57 minutes, was 5-of-11 from the field, 2-of-7 from the arc, 2-2 FT, 14 reb, 2 assists, 2 blocks and 14 points ... For the season, Ludwig is averaging 2.9 points and 2.7 rebounds.

## Free Throw Shooting Goes Down; Then Goes Up

Storm Warren showed the team's success at the free throw line by making the two charity tosses with 1.2 seconds left to win the game at Houston (11/29) ... Warren was a 51.5 percent free throw shooter a year ago (17-33), but this year he has already made 17 free throws in 21 attempts (81.0 percent).

LSU was in the high 70 percent total in the first six games of the season, but after hitting just 52.6 percent (10-of-19) in the Boise win, LSU dropped below 75 percent for the first time this season ... Against UCI (12/15), the Tigers started out just 4-of-8 at the line, but finished 14-of-16 at the line to finish at 75 percent for the game, 18-of-24.

That puts LSU at 148-of-199 (74.4 percent) at the charity stripe, first in the Southeastern Conference.

One of the things LSU is missing from Andre Stringer is his free throw shooting (20-of-23, 87.0 percent) ... Ralston Turner is at 84.2 percent (16-19), Storm Warren 81.0 percent (81.0 percent) and Justin Hamilton 78.6 percent (33-42).

Opponents are at 72.6 percent (127-175) ... Last season LSU made 66.5 percent of its free throws (432-650), the second consecutive season LSU was below 70 percent.

## Looking to Find the Touch Again

For the third time in the four-game winning streak, LSU shot in the 30s as a team from the field, most notably just 31.3 percent (21-67) against UCI (12/15) ... However, the LSU defense has been more than enough to push LSU through while some shots that the coaches are happy with and in the flow of the offense refuse to fall.

LSU shot 50 percent in the Boise win (26-of-52) but in the last two games, LSU is 8-of-31 from the arc ... LSU is 11th in the SEC in field goal percentage (39.2 percent) and sixth in field goal percentage defense (40.0 percent) ... The Tigers are eighth in three-point percentage (33.1 percent) and fourth in three-point field goal percentage defense (29.9 percent).

## Reviewing the Charleston Classic; Hickey All-Tournament

LSU finished the Nov. 17-20 Charleston Classic with a 2-1 record as LSU defeated Western Kentucky, 76-57, and Georgia Tech, 59-50, after an 88-82 first-round loss versus Northwestern. In the process, point guard Anthony Hickey was named to the five-member all-tournament team after averaging 16 points for the three games, hitting over 51 percent of his field goal attempts (19-of-37), making six treys and averaging 4.3 rebounds and 4.0 assists.

Justin Hamilton also averaged 12 points and 7.7 rebounds and Andre Stringer 10.3 points per game.

Against Northwestern, Johnny O'Bryant III led the team with 21 points in 22 minutes, with Stringer getting 15, Hickey 11 and Hamilton 10. LSU had a 41-32 lead at the half, but Northwestern's 1-3-1 zone in the second half caused LSU problems turning the game to a nine-point Northwestern lead with 5:07 left. LSU cut the lead down gradually to one on a Ralston Turner trey with 48 seconds left, but Northwestern came down and hit a three of its own to put the game out of reach.

The LSU-Western Kentucky affair was a trip to the free throw line in the first half as the teams combined for 53 first half free throws. LSU was 13-of-17 in the half, WKU 14-of-14. In the second half, LSU was 5-of-7 while WKU was 4-of-13. LSU made some key shots and got 22 points off turnovers to win going away. Justin Hamilton had 18 points and Anthony Hickey 17.

In the fifth place game versus Georgia Tech, freshman point guard Anthony Hickey clinched his spot on the All-Tournament team with 20 points, including four treys. LSU led by four at the half and the game remained close until LSU went on a 9-4 run in which Hickey, Ralston Turner and Andre Stringer all hit threes to put LSU up for good. LSU made 8-of-18 from the arc and 9-of-10 free throws. LSU's Stringer was also in double figures at 11 points.

### Good Start For Mr. Basketball, McDonald's All-American

High school honors are one thing, but having high school stars that are able to make the transition to a game where the pace is faster and more is required more often is key.

Kentucky's Mr. Basketball, Anthony Hickey, and McDonald's All-American Johnny O'Bryant III have certainly made a good overall impression in their first 10 games at LSU.

Hickey's All-Tournament performance in the Charleston Classic has been documented earlier, but since the tournament he has been distributing the ball well to his teammates - South Alabama - 6 assists; Houston - 3 assists; Rutgers - 5 assists; Boise State - 5 assists, UCI - 3 assists ... Against Rutgers (12/3), he only scored seven points but had two buckets and an assist in the final 1:20 that helped LSU win the game ... He also had just one turnover in 34 minutes ... Hickey is sixth in the league in assists average (4.1) and second in steals at 2.2 a game ... He is sixth in the SEC in assist-turnover ratio at 1.8 a game (41 assists-23 turnovers) ... Hickey is third on the team in scoring at 10.3 points per game.

O'Bryant III came up big in the Northwestern game (11/17) when he hit 6-of-8 field goal attempts in 22 minutes and made 9-of-11 at the free throw line in a 21 point effort. O'Bryant III also had a team high eight boards.

Against South Alabama (11/23), O'Bryant III led the team in rebounds for the second time this season with eight ... He started his first college game against Houston and tied for team rebound lead with seven, five of which were offensive ... He posted 11 points at Rutgers (12/3) and 10 points in the Boise State game (12/10) ... Just like the Houston game, O'Bryant had seven boards against UCI (12/15), but five were offensive ... He is averaging 8.6 points per game and 6.5 rebounds.

### Hamilton Showing Ability

The transfer from Iowa State had double figures in two of his three games in the Charleston Classic, highlighted by 18 against Western Kentucky ... Hamilton had 18 points on 5-of-10 shooting and 8-of-8 at the free throw line and nine rebounds ... For the three games, Hamilton averaged 11.2 points and 6.6 boards ... Hamilton comes into the Marquette game off his first double double of the season against UCI (12/15) with 14 points and 11 rebounds ... For the season, he is averaging 11.5 points and 6.5 rebounds ...

Hamilton earned LSWA POW honors after scoring a team high 14 against Boise (12/10) ... Hamilton is shooting 51.3 percent from the field (41-80) ... Hamilton is 14th in rebounding in the league, but first in the league in offensive rebounds, averaging 3.6 a game.

### Countdown to Warren Milestones - Once to 100

LSU senior Storm Warren is on the verge of several milestones and he reached one against Boise State (12/10) when he blocked the 100th shot of his career ... He is tied with Jose Vargas for seventh in career blocks as he becomes the eighth player and first since Garrett Temple in 2009 to reach triple figures.

Now he is looking for another 100, this time in career steals ... Only 21 players have reached 100 steals, the last being Tasmin Mitchell in 2010 ... Warren enters the game with 96 steals.

Finally, Warren now enters the stretch drive to become the 37th player in school history to grab 500 career rebounds ... Warren, who is averaging a strong 7.9 points and 4.8 rebounds in 18.3 minutes per game, is at 489 rebounds, just nine short of the magic 500 number.

Oh by the way, the UCI game (12/15) was the 100th game of Warren's career.

## The Standings Will Look Different This Year In The SEC

For the first time since the 1991-92 season, the Southeastern Conference men's basketball standings will not be divided into Eastern and Western Divisions. It is expected the men's basketball teams will play some sort of 18-game conference schedule next year.

The tournament was previously held in 1996 and 2003 in New Orleans at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, but this year's event will be held at the home of the New Orleans Hornets, the New Orleans Arena ... The winner of the event receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

This past year Morgan averaged 28.9 points a game, including a career-high 52 points in one game against Riverside. He also averaged nine rebounds, two steals and two assists a game.

"We are very excited about the addition of Malik Morgan to the LSU Basketball family," said LSU Coach Trent Johnson. "Besides coming from a great family, Malik is a very, very good basketball player. He is very skilled -- not a good scorer, but a great scorer. One of the most impressive things about Malik besides his offensive skills and his ability to make players better, is his overall competitiveness. He is very competitive and he is going to have a huge impact on our team next year. Without question, I didn't see a better guard in the state of Louisiana, let alone his rankings as one of the best guards in the country."

Morgan's mother, the former Detra Brown, was a four-year letter-winner in volleyball while at LSU where she was twice an All-SEC selection. She still ranks fourth at LSU in career kills (1,504) and is one of only five players in the program's history to ever record 1,000 digs and 1,000 kills in a career.

Morgan chose LSU over Boston College, Georgia Tech, Missouri, Oklahoma and UTEP.

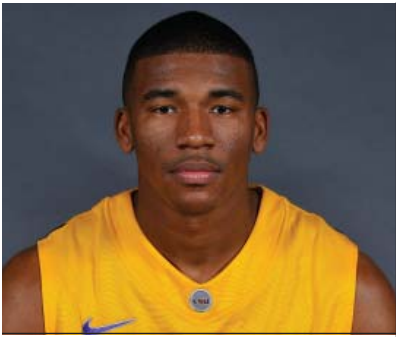
