SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ After finishing off its season's long 10-game homestand with a 9-1 mark, LSU returns to the road to face its first SEC Eastern Division foe of the season with a trip to South Carolina.
- ▶ LSU is coming off a 2-1 win over Georgia Tech and is receiving votes in the latest edition of both the NFCA/USA Today Top 25 polls. The Tigers have won 17 of their last 21 outings dating back to Feb. 19.
- ▶ South Carolina has dropped nine of its last 12 decisions. The Gamecocks have won 11 of their 16 home contests, including taking two of three from Arkansas on SEC opening weekend.
- ▶ LSU holds a 34-12 edge in the all-time series and have won the last 10 meetings versus the Gamecocks dating back to the 2008 season. Complete recaps and box scores from the 2011 season series are available on pages
- ▶ Going back to the 2006 season, LSU has been ranked in 87 of the last 95 editions of the NFCA/USA Today Top 25 polls. The Tigers are receiving votes in this week's editions of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has won 17 of its last 21 games highlighted by a pair of six-game winning streaks [Feb. 19-26 and March 7-14] dating back to Feb. 19.
- LSU will carry a 20-8 overall record and 4-1 SEC mark into its three-game weekend series at South Carolina.
- Six of LSU's eight losses have come against ranked opponents which include No. 15 Michigan [Feb. 11], No. 3 California [Feb. 19], No. 8 Oklahoma [March 2 & 3], No. 23 Oklahoma State [March 4] and No. 20 Auburn [March 14].
- As a team, LSU is hitting .295 during its 20 wins compared to a .140 ratio in its eight losses. In those 20 wins, the Tigers also have outscored their opponents by a 115-23 margin sparked by 12 shutouts.
- After battling an injury and appearing in only three games in 2011, Ashley Applegate has started 27 of 28 games this season.
- As LSU's leadoff hitter, Applegate has recorded hits in her six of her last nine games [March 9-20]. She has scored six runs and collected her first three RBIs of the season during the run.
- Allison Falcon has hit in the No. 2 hole during her last 10 of her last 14 appearances [Feb. 12-March 18] after starting the season at the bottom of the lineup. She missed an eight-game stretch [Feb. 25-March 4] due to injury.
- Falcon has garnered a .333 batting average. Her 13 RBIs are second on the team. She broke a 1-1 tie with a two-out, two-run double in game two of the Mississippi State series [March 17].

- Falcon belted her first home run of the season, a two-run shot, during LSU's 6-3 victory over Troy [March 9].
- Simone Heyward has already found herself in four different positions in the lineup on the young season.
- Heyward had been filling in for Falcon in the No. 2 slot at the Tiger Invitational [Feb. 25-26], but has missed LSU's last 15 games due to injury.
- Heyward has scored seven times, including her four of her last seven games [Feb. 19-26]. During her career, LSU is 29-4 when she crosses the plate.
- Ashley Langoni has contributed three of LSU's seven home runs, banged home a team-leading 18 RBIs on the season and won LSWA Hitter of the Week [March 15].
- Langoni has collected 26 career dingers. She is tied with former All-American Stephanie Hill [2003-06] and Anissa Young [2009-11] for seventh place on LSU's all-time list.
- Langoni has produced hits in seven of her last 13 outings [March 3-20] fueled by five multi-hit efforts. She contributed a two-out, RBI double during LSU's three-run fifth inning in game one versus Auburn [March 14].
- Langoni has drawn a team-leading 19 walks, including eight free passes in her last 11 outings [March 9-20].
- Juliana Santos has notched hits in 15 of her 21 appearances, including seven of her last eight outings [March 3-14]. She has missed LSU's last four games [March 16-18] due to injury.

NO. 21 LSU 7, MISSISSIPPI STATE 6 - 04/30

BATON ROUGE - With the tying run on second base and no outs during the seventh inning, Rachele Fico slammed the door to record the final three outs in order as the No. 21 LSU softball team secured a 3-2 victory over South Carolina in-front of 1,429 fans at Tiger Park.

In the process, LSU (36-15, 17-9 SEC) claimed its 10th consecutive victory and has emerged with wins in 21 of its last 24 games dating back to March 19. The Tigers also vaulted into sole possession of fourth place in the overall SEC race after Georgia and Kentucky both lost Friday.

Following the game, LSU honored Ashley Applegate, Jessica Mouse and Tiffany Shaw with a Senior Night presentation. The trio has accounted for 159 wins during their Tiger careers.

"It was about the seniors tonight. I'm glad people waited after," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We've done this now because it's way too emotional at the beginning of the game. I thought we looked great for about three or four innings, and then I did not like the tempo of the game. All of sudden everything just slowed to a snail's pace, and we stopped capitalizing."

Fico opened her second save of the season with an 11-pitch strike-out of Hannah Milks. She followed with a popout and a ground ball on the infield to secure the 3-2 triumph. It was Fico's seventh career save and ties her with former All-American Kristin Schmidt for second place in program history.

Brittany Mack went the first six frames and was touched up for two runs, one earned, on five hits. She notched six strikeouts against three walks and improved to 17-5 on the season. The junior right-hander has won 12 of her last 14 decisions going back to March 19.

"I have to be ready to go in the game at any given moment," Fico said. "Brittany threw a great game, and that's what I'm here for; I'm here to have her back. She'll come in and do the same thing for me. We work very well together. We offset each other very well."

The Tigers jumped out to a 2-0 advantage during the first inning. Simone Heyward coaxed a leadoff walk and advanced to second base on a Juliana Santos sacrifice bunt.

On the first pitch of the at-bat, Anissa Young cranked her 10th home run of the season. It's the second straight game that Young put LSU ahead 2-0 with a first inning dinger. The long ball was the 26th of her career and tied Young with Stephanie Hill for seventh place on the program's all-time list.

LSU added another run in the second inning after another Heyward walk. She stole second base and moved to third base on a wild pitch. Two batters later, Ashley Langoni ripped a RBI single to left field to extend the lead to 3-0.

South Carolina (26-28, 6-20 SEC) tallied a pair of single runs during the fifth and sixth innings, respectively. After a Laura Mendes RBI single in the fifth, the Tigers alertly cut down Lauren Lackey at second base for the final out of the frame.

The Gamecocks used a Lauren Houston passed ball and throwing error to set up a Dana Hathorn sacrifice fly to draw back to 3-2.

"We always look for the next play on defense, so that's what we did," Young said. "I know towards the end of the game we kind of fell off and got away from our [offensive] plan we had at the beginning. We're going to come back work hard and try to execute tomorrow like we did in the first two innings."

BATON ROUGE - BATON ROUGE - Morgan Russell and Anissa Young matched career-highs with three hits apiece to fuel an 11-hit attack as the No. 21 LSU softball team cruised to a 6-1 victory over South Carolina during the middle game of an SEC series in-front of 1,515 fans at Tiger Park.

LSU (37-15, 18-9 SEC) collected its 11th straight victory and has emerged with wins in 22 of its last 25 games dating back to March 19. The Tigers also remained in sole possession of fourth place in overall SEC race with one game remaining during the regular season.

"Once again, we played good defense and received some timely hitting," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "Morgan's been a hard luck batter. She hits the ball very well, but it's right at people. Today, she got a little bit of luck. The softball God's gave her one, but she hit the ball very hard the other two times. Anissa [Young] had quite a day too."

Rachele Fico went the distance in the circle and picked up 10 strikeouts. She was touched up for one run on eight hits and improved to 14-9 on the season.

"Rachele did a great job and hit her spots," Russell said. "She did exactly what she needed to do. It's very easy to catch a pitcher that rarely misses her spots, and we have a really good connection. We work well together. I'm really proud of her, she did a great job."

LSU batted around the lineup en route to a three-run third inning. Young laced a leadoff single up the middle and moved to second base on a South Carolina fielding error.

Two batters later, Lauren Houston platted pinch runner Katie Guillory for the game's first run with a RBI single. Russell and Tiffany Shaw tacked on RBI singles of their own to make it 3-0.

The Tigers notched three more runs during the fifth inning. Russell and Jacee Blades set the table with a pair of singles and advanced into scoring position on a Shaw sacrifice bunt.

Simone Heyward cranked a RBI single to left field to extend the LSU lead to 4-0. Young capped the frame with a two-run single to move her RBI total to 40 for the season and push the advantage to 6-0.

The Gamecocks (26-29, 6-21 SEC) dented the scoreboard on a Chelsea Hawkins solo home run in the sixth inning for the final margin of 6-1.

The series finale is on-tap for Sunday at 1 p.m. with live video, live audio and live stats available in the Geaux Zone on LSUsports.net. The first 1,000 fans will receive a commemorative Yvette Girouard coin. Following the game, Girouard will be honored with a special ceremony celebrating her 35-year coaching career.

"We have a lot of respect for Coach Girouard," Russell said. "We want to win for her so tomorrow is going to be a very emotional, but we know we have to give a strong effort to win. We're going to do this, and we're going to do this for her."

BATON ROUGE - Ashley Langoni and Morgan Russell ripped a pair of two-run singles to fuel a six-run third inning as the No. 21 LSU softball team closed the final regular season of Yvette Girouard's coaching career in-style with an 8-0 triumph over South Carolina at Tiger Park.

"I tried to treat today like it was a normal day," Girouard said. "I was just trying to get the win. I'm always trying to get the game as it is the most important thing. So, I just tried to make it a normal day. As I have said before, this is a career that I did not even dream of having. LSU just went all out."

"The whole weekend was for Coach Girouard," first baseman Anissa Young said. "She is a great coach, and we are going to miss her. She is an inspiration to me, and we just wanted to get these three wins this weekend so that she can send her riding off into the sunset."

LSU (38-15, 19-9 SEC) won its 12th consecutive game and secured the No. 4 seed in next week's SEC Tournament hosted by Ole Miss. The Tigers square off with No. 7 Georgia in the quarterfinals Thursday at 4 p.m. on ESPN2 and have won 23 of their last 26 games dating back to March 19.

"We're going to be the No. 4 seed in a very good league," Girouard said. "I would like to be the No. 1 seed, but we scratched, clawed and never gave up. We always believed in ourselves. Some of these other teams have much more firepower than we do, but we pitch well and play outstanding defense. As long as you do those things then you have a chance in any game."

Brittany Mack fired a two-hit shutout and notched four strikeouts against one walk to improve to 18-5 on the season. Neither of South Carolina's (26-30, 6-22 SEC) hits left the infield.

The Tigers sent 10 batters to the plate during the third inning. Jacee Blades ignited the frame with a leadoff single. Two batters later, Simone Heyward drew a walk. Juliana Santos and Anissa Young reached on back-to-back fielder's choices without an out recorded for the game's first run.

On the 3-2 offering, Langoni platted Heyward and Santos with a single through the left side to extend the LSU advantage to 3-0. Tammy Wray added a RBI on a USC fielding error, while Morgan Russell smacked a two-run single to centerfield to make it 6-0.

LSU added the finishing touches and added two more runs in the fifth inning. With one out, Wray connected for a single through the middle. Pinch runner Alex Boulet stole second and third base before scoring on a Lauren Houston RBI double. A South Carolina throwing error allowed pinch runner Katie Guillory to cross the plate for the final margin of 8-0.

"We knew we had to do this for Coach Girouard and also for ourselves," Mack said. "We had to come out and show everyone who the real Tigers are. So, we had to make sure that we came together, put our heads together and we fought through everything. We were going to crawl if we had to in order to get wins."

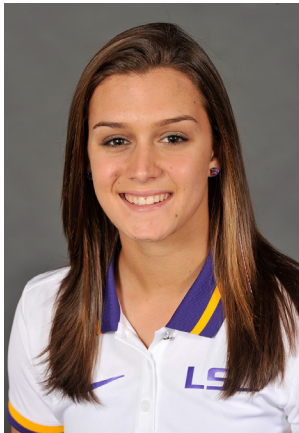

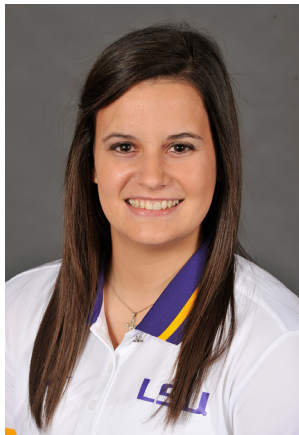
