SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU carries a season's long eight-game winning streak into a weekend series against Arkansas. Game times are set for 6 p.m. [Friday], 4 p.m. [Saturday] and 1 p.m. [Sunday].
- ▶ Last time out, LSU notched a 4-0 victory at McNeese State behind Brittany Mack's four-hit shutout. The Tigers have won 21 of their last 25 outings dating back to Feb. 19.
- ▶ Arkansas has dropped 11 of its last 13 games, but the Razorbacks picked up a 4-1 victory over then-No. 11 Tennessee on March 17.
- ▶ LSU holds a 45-8 series advantage over the Razorbacks, including winning 13 of the last 14 meetings dating back to the 2007 season. Complete recaps and box scores of the 2011 season series are available on pages 7-9 of the packet.
- ▶ Going back to the 2006 season, LSU has been ranked in 88 of the last 96 editions of the NFCA/USA Softball Top 25 polls. The Tigers returned to the USA Softball poll with a No. 23 national ranking and are the top receiving votes squad in the NFCA poll.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has won 21 of its last 25 games dating back to Feb. 19 highlighted by a current season's long eight-game run [March 16-28]. The Tigers also have posted a pair of six-game winning streaks [Feb. 19-26 and March 7-14] during the run.
- LSU will carry a 24-8 overall record and 7-1 SEC mark into its weekend series versus Arkansas. The Tigers currently hold second place in the SEC Western Division, one-game behind No. 2 Alabama.
- Last time out, LSU picked up a 4-0 victory over McNeese State where Brittany Mack tossed a four-hit shutout. Allison Falcon fueled the offense with a 2-for-3 effort and scored a run.
- Last time out in SEC play, LSU posted a weekend shutout of South Carolina. The Tigers are the first SEC team to complete that impressive feat during a three-game series in 2012.
- It also marked the fourth straight season that LSU has posted a weekend shutout of an SEC opponent: South Carolina [2009, 2010] and Ole Miss [2011].
- Six of LSU's eight losses have come against ranked opponents which include No. 15 Michigan [Feb. 11], No. 3 California [Feb. 19], No. 8 Oklahoma [March 2 & 3], No. 23 Oklahoma State [March 4] and No. 20 Auburn [March 14].
- As a team, LSU is hitting .290 during its 24 wins compared to a .140 ratio in its eight losses.
- In those 24 wins, LSU has outscored their opponents by a 138-23 margin sparked by 16 shutouts. The Tigers have garnered five shutouts and been touched up for two unearned runs in their last seven games [March 17-28].
- After battling an injury and appearing in only three games in 2011, Ashley Applegate has started 31 of 32 games this season.
- Primarily as LSU's leadoff hitter, Applegate has recorded hits in her eight of her last 13 games [March 9-28]. She has scored seven runs and collected her first three RBIs of the season during the run.
- Simone Heyward has already found herself in four different positions in the batting order on the young season.
- After missing a 15-game stretch due to injury [March 2-21], Heyward has made two appearances as a pinch hitter at South Carolina [March 23] and at McNeese State [March 28].
- Heyward has scored seven times in 2012, and LSU is 29-4 over the last two seasons when she crosses the plate.
- A.J. Andrews and Jacee Blades combined to score seven of LSU's 21 runs last week [March 20-24] from the top two spots of the lineup.

- Fico also has limited opponents to a .185 hitting clip and notched 91 strikeouts to rank sixth and eighth, respectively, in the SEC.
- Fico's 435 career strikeouts places her eighth on LSU's all-time list. The junior right-hander is nine Ks away from passing Ashley Lewis [1999-2001] for the No. 7 position.
- Brittany Mack is 11-4 with a 1.92 ERA and has won her last eight decisions [March 3-28]. She carried a no-hitter one out into the seventh inning at South Carolina [March 24]. In the process, Mack became the fifth pitcher in LSU history to eclipse 500 career strikeouts and reach the 50-win plateau.
- Mack was selected as the No. 1 pick during the National Pro Fast-pitch's Collegiate Draft [March 7] and has trimmed 1.70 points off her ERA since March 3.
- Against Mississippi State [March 16-17], Mack recorded two strikeouts in a relief appearance during the series opener to earn her first save of the season. The senior right-hander followed that up with a 10-strikeout performance in game two.

LSU 8, ARKANSAS 0 - 04/01

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. - Ashley Langoni turned in a 3-for-4 performance and racked up a career-best five RBIs to fuel the LSU softball team to its fourth consecutive victory and an 8-0 victory over Arkansas to open a SEC series at Bogle Park.

The Tigers (19-12, 3-6 SEC) also received a four-hit shutout from Rachele Fico in the circle. She notched five strikeouts and sat down 10 of the final 11 batters she faced to improve to 6-8 on the season.

LSU's offense pounded out a balanced 10-hit attack as the top six batters in the lineup each recorded a hit. Tammy Wray came away with a 2-for-3 effort and added three RBIs.

"It was a great effort by the Tigers," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We hit the ball hard tonight, and Ashley Langoni is really seeing everything well right now. It's fantastic to see that confident stroke back for her in a big way. I thought Tammy Wray was excellent all the way around, and made some tremendous plays at third base. Rachele is still on her way back. It's a work in progress, but she's taking the necessary steps right now to be successful."

With one out in the third inning, Simone Heyward reached base on a fielding error by Arkansas second baseman Jennifer Rambo. Juliana Santos followed with a double off the left centerfield fence to put runners on second and third base.

Langoni platted both runs on a single past a diving Rambo into right centerfield to extend her hitting streak to a career-long seven games.

LSU used some two-out lightning to break the game open during the fourth inning. Heyward and Santos pieced together a single and a walk before Langoni connected for a three-run homer to make it 5-0.

"We came out with a few jitters after being off for so long, but we did what we need to do," Langoni said. "I've been seeing the ball really well, it feels good. I'm just going to continue to do what I've been doing at the plate."

Wray ripped a three-run long ball of her own in the seventh inning for the final margin of 8-0. During the frame, Katie Guillory also made her season-debut as a pinch runner.

"This is a huge series for us, and we need to be successful for the entire weekend," Girouard said. "We dug a big hole early in SEC play and have to climb out of it. This was a good start to the weekend."

LSU 10, ARKANSAS 1 - 04/02

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. - Juliana Santos equaled a program single-game record and provided a memorable 5-for-5 performance with three RBIs to lift the LSU softball team to a dominant 10-1 victory over Arkansas during the middle game of the series at Bogle Park.

Santos joined Lauren Castle as the only players in program history to reach the impressive feat. Castle tallied her 5-for-5 effort during a 15-9 triumph over Mississippi State on March 31, 2005.

"It's awfully good to see Juliana swing the bat with a lot of confidence," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We always talk with the players about being a positive during an inning and doing anything you can to help your team be successful. She was the epitome of that today and got on-base a variety of different ways."

"It was important for us as a team to stay focused, come out here and get the job done," Santos said. "We've been working hard on offense and put our struggles from March behind us. The key for me has been swinging at my pitch."

The Tigers (20-12, 4-6 SEC) also received a gem from Brittany Mack in the circle. The junior right-hander matched her season-high with 11 strikeouts and moved to 8-3 on the season. She fired in a magnificent 26-of-31 in the first-pitch strikes department and was touched up for one run on five hits.

"Brittany did a phenomenal job of locating her pitches and staying in control," Girouard said. "Any pitcher that can work ahead like she did today controls the power in the circle. We never want to give that power to the hitter by falling behind."

LSU plated single runs during the first, second and fourth innings on a trio of two-out RBI singles to grab a 3-0 advantage.

In the first inning, Simone Heyward coaxed a leadoff walk. She advanced to second base on a Santos infield single and crossed the plate an Anissa Young bloop single to left field to give LSU a 1-0 edge.

Santos garnered consecutive RBI singles during the second and fourth innings before the Tigers broke the game open with a five-run sixth inning.

Alex Boulet ripped a leadoff single through the middle to start the barrage. Two batters later, Santos dropped a perfect bunt back to the circle. A throwing error by Arkansas pitcher Kim Jones allowed both Boulet and Santos to motor around the bases to extend the LSU lead to 5-0.

The Tigers reset the table on back-to-back Ashley Langoni and Young walks. On a 3-1 offering, Tammy Wray belted a three-run blast over the left field fence to make it 8-0. It marked the third straight game that Wray has connected for a long ball.

Arkansas (10-27, 1-14 SEC) capitalized on a Jayme Gee leadoff double and scored its lone run on a Macy Burr infield single in the home half of the frame.

LSU fired back with two more runs in the seventh as Santos completed the historic day with another RBI single to centerfield. Even though her career-long seven-game hitting streak came to a close, Langoni added a RBI on a fielder's choice for the final margin of 10-1.

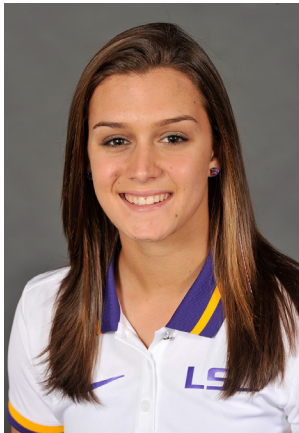

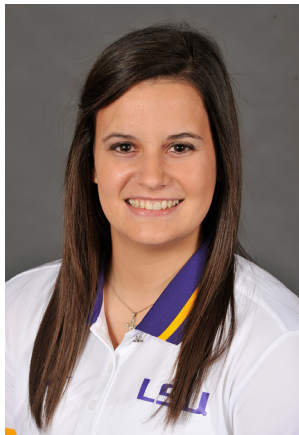
