## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 23 LSU softball team wraps up its regular season home schedule and welcomes No. 12 Georgia to Tiger Park for a three-game SEC weekend series.
- ▶ One game separates LSU and Georgia as the two teams will battle for sole possession of fourth place in the overall SEC standings. Last weekend, the Bulldogs took a 7-4 decision from Alabama and handed UA's Jackie Traina her first loss of the season.
- ▶ LSU holds a 28-18 series advantage over Georgia, but the Bulldogs have won six of the last eight meetings going back to the 2009 season. The Tigers took two of three outings at Tiger Park during the 2010 campaign highlighted by Cody Trahan's pitching gem in the series opener and Kirsten Shortridge's steal of home in game two.
- ▶ Going back to the 2006 season, LSU has been ranked in 92 of the last 100 editions of the NFCA/USA Softball Top 25 polls. The Tigers have been ranked in both polls in four straight weeks. This week, LSU checks in at No. 23 and No. 25 in the polls.

**STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS**

- LSU has reeled off a 23-9 mark going back to March 7 highlighted by season's best 12-game winning streak [March 16-April 4]. The Tigers also posted a six-game run [March 7-14] during the stretch but have dropped eight of their last 13 since April 6.
- LSU will carry a 33-16 overall record and 14-8 SEC mark into its weekend series versus No. 12 Georgia. A series history and player career stats against the Bulldogs can be seen at the bottom of the page.
- LSU is currently five games behind SEC Western Division leader Alabama and hold sole possession of fourth place, one game ahead of Georgia, in the overall SEC race.
- Last time out, LSU battled to a doubleheader split at No. 2 Florida. Brittany Mack fired a four-hit shutout and racked up eight strikeouts as the Tigers won in Gainesville for the first time since the 2005 season. Lauren Houston platted the game's only run with a two-out, RBI single during the second inning.
- On April 21, LSU wore teal jerseys to celebrate survivors and spread awareness during the program's inaugural "Strikeout Ovarian Cancer" event, a 2-1 victory over Ole Miss.
- Betty Dieter, mother of head coach Beth Torina and two-year ovarian cancer survivor, threw out the ceremonial first pitch.
- Three weekends ago, LSU became only the second team during the 2012 season to defeat No. 2 Alabama. The victory halted a 13-game winning streak by the home team in the LSU-Alabama rivalry and marked the Tigers first win in Tuscaloosa since 2006.
- The Tigers used a solid effort in all three phases of the game during a 3-2 triumph in-front of a then Rhoads Stadium record crowd of 3,521 fans.
- Ashley Langoni provided a two-run home run in the first inning, Rachele Fico notched nine strikeouts for a complete game in the circle and Tammy Wray recorded the game's final out firing a strike to Allison Falcon on a chopping bunt attempt to get the speedy Kayla Braud by a step.
- Four weekends ago when LSU notched a sweep of South Carolina [March 23-25], it marked the fourth straight season that the Tigers have posted a weekend shutout of an SEC opponent: South Carolina [2009, 2010, 2012] and Ole Miss [2011].
- 13 of LSU's 16 losses have come against ranked opponents which include No. 15 Michigan [Feb. 11], No. 3 California [Feb. 19], No. 8 Oklahoma [March 2 & 3], No. 23 Oklahoma State [March 4, No. 20 Auburn [March 14], No. 2 Alabama [April 6 & 8], No. 10 Tennessee [April 13, 14 & 15], No. 22 Florida State [April 18] and No. 2 Florida [April 24]. DePaul [Feb. 18] has been receiving votes for most of the season in both editions of the Top 25 polls.
- As a team, LSU is hitting .288 during its 33 wins compared to a .142 ratio in its 16 losses.
- In those 33 wins, LSU has outscored their opponents by a 168-31 margin sparked by 19 shutouts. The Tigers have come away with wins in 23 of their last 32 outings with 10 shutouts since the Nicholls State game [March 7].

- A.J. Andrews and Jacee Blades have batted 1-2 in the lineup during 17 of LSU's last 21 games [March 23-April 24].
- Andrews, an All-SEC Freshman candidate, has collected hits in 16 of her last 27 outings [March 9-April 24] highlighted by six multi-hit performances, which are tied for second on the team.
- Andrews has racked up 22 of her 26 hits, scored 12 of her 15 runs and recorded 10 of her team-leading 11 stolen bases during the 27-game run.
- Andrews has tallied a .306 hitting clip [17-for-56] and has produced seven of her eight RBIs during SEC action. She has garnered hits in 13 of her 19 SEC appearances. The Oldsmar, Fla., product missed the Mississippi State series [March 16-18] due to injury.
- Jacee Blades has registered hits in 12 of her last 23 outings since being inserted into the starting lineup for the Mississippi State opener [March 16]. She has garnered 17 of those 23 starts at the designated player position [March 20-April 23].
- Blades has pieced together a pair of three-game hitting streaks [March 20-24 and March 28-31]. She registered hits in two of three games in four of LSU's six SEC weekend series.

- Applegate equaled a career-long six-game hitting streak [March 25-April 4] being used in the lineup's No. 6 spot. She cranked a two-run single during the sixth inning to vault LSU to a 3-2 comeback win in the Arkansas finale [April 1].
- Applegate registered a 2-for-3 effort with a triple and scored the game's only run during LSU's 1-0 victory at No. 2 Florida [April 24].
- In her 23 starts at catcher, Lauren Houston has reached base in 15 of those games. She has compiled a .438 on-base percentage being hit-by-a-pitch on 13 occasions, which is tied for third-best in the SEC rankings.
- Houston ended a 0-for-12 stretch at the plate [March 31-April 21] with a timely two-out, RBI single to score Applegate in LSU's 1-0 victory over No. 2 Florida [April 24].
- Tammy Wray has provided a hit during six of her last nine games [April 14-24]. She secured LSU's first run on a two-out, RBI single versus Ole Miss [April 20].
- During the streak, Wray has seen her average climb 37 points and reach its highest point since the South Alabama game [Feb. 26].
- Dylan Supak has produced hits in 12 of her 29 starts on the season, but has tallied a 5-for-38 clip during her last 17 games since SEC action began [March 14-April 24].
- Supak delivered a two-run single which stood up to be the game-winner during LSU's eight-run third inning versus Mississippi State [March 16].

- Heyward drew a leadoff walk and scored the game-winning run in LSU's 1-0 walk-off win over Arkansas [March 30]. She has scored nine times in 2012, and LSU is 31-4 over the last two seasons when she crosses the plate.
- Off the bench, Alex Boulet has scored during seven of her last 13 pinch running appearances [March 18-April 24]. She has notched seven of her 10 steals since April 4, including a run of four straight outings [April 18-22].
- Rikki Alcaraz has scored runs and drawn a quartet of walks in her last three outings as the starting second baseman [March 18-20, April 4]. She ignited LSU's five-run fifth inning versus Nicholls State [April 4] with a leadoff double.
- Earlier this season, Alcaraz put together a five-game hitting streak [Feb. 21-26] and claimed Tiger Invitational All-Tournament honors.

- Fico became only the second pitcher during the 2012 season to defeat No. 2 Alabama [April 7]. She accomplished the impressive feat on the biggest of stages in-front of a then Rhoads Stadium record crowd of 3,521 spectators.
- Fico finished the game in-style by recording six of her nine strikeouts and retiring nine of the final 11 batters she faced over the final three innings.
- Fico also provided a sparkling performance during game one of a doubleheader at No. 2 Florida [April 24]. She had the Gators down to their final strike and equaled a season's best 11 Ks.
- Fico reeled off an impressive run of seven straight victories [March 16-April 8], which came to a close at No. 10 Tennessee [April 14].
- Fico has limited opponents to a .187 hitting clip and notched 155 strikeouts to rank fifth and seventh, respectively, in those categories among the SEC leaders.
- Fico's 499 career strikeouts places her sixth on LSU's all-time list. The junior right-hander recently moved past Cody Trahan [2008-

- 2011] with three Ks in relief versus No. 22 Florida State [April 18].
- Brittany Mack is 14-8 with a 2.40 ERA. She ended her four-game losing skid, all coming against Top 25 opponents [April 6-18], with an 11-strikeout performance versus Ole Miss [April 21].
- Mack turned in her most impressive performance of the season with a four-hit shutout at No. 2 Florida [April 24]. She escaped a bases loaded jam with one out during the sixth inning and garnered eight strikeouts, including one of Sami Fagan with two on during the seventh inning.
- Earlier in the season, Mack produced nine consecutive wins [March 3-April 1] which came to a close during the series opener at No. 2 Alabama [April 6].
- During the nine-game run, Mack carried a no-hitter one out into the seventh inning at South Carolina [March 24]. In the process, she became the fifth pitcher in LSU history to eclipse 500 career strikeouts and the sixth hurler to reach the 50-win plateau. The senior right-hander picked up SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week [March 26] for her efforts.
- Mack was selected as the No. 1 pick during the National Pro Fast-pitch's Collegiate Draft [March 7]. It marks the third straight year the SEC has had the No. 1 pick in the NPF Draft.
- Meghan Patterson is 4-0 and has racked up 40 strikeouts in her 38.1 innings of work, including a career-best 13 Ks against Alcorn State [Feb. 26].
- Patterson has been touched up for two runs on 18 hits in her last 32 frames of action [Feb. 26-April 17]. She made her SEC season debut at South Carolina [March 25].
- Patterson garnered consecutive complete game victories versus Nicholls State [April 4] and McNeese State [April 17].

"Lauren has been swinging the bat very well, and I'm happy for Juliana because she continues to fight at the plate as well. Am I happy that we lost? Absolutely not, but I was encouraged that the team showed resolve and didn't give up."

Alisa Goler turned in a 2-for-3 performance and drove home a season-best five RBIs, while Alison Owen tossed six innings en route to five strikeouts for the Bulldogs. With the win, Owen improved to 7-0.

Georgia (19-1, 1-0 SEC) broke a scoreless tie with a quartet of runs in the third inning. Ashley Pauly connected for a leadoff single, while Taylor Schlopy and Megan Wiggins drew back-to-back walks to fill the bases.

On the first pitch of the sequence, Goler smacked a grand slam down the right field line to vault the Bulldogs to a 4-0 lead.

Rachele Fico went the distance in the circle for the Tigers. She tallied four Ks against three walks to fall to 5-6 on the season.

"Great teams like Georgia make you pay when you make a mistake," Girouard said. "You can't walk batters to face an All-American in her own ball park. Fico is fighting through some things right now, but she's going to be fine."

Ashley Langoni and Juliana Santos posted hits for LSU (15-10, 0-5 SEC), while Rachele Fico surrendered five runs in her lone inning of work to drop to 5-7.

Georgia loaded the bases right out of the gate in the opening inning as Taylor Schlopy and Goler drew walks sandwiched between a Megan Wiggins double.

After a wild pitch scored Schlopy, Razer connected for a two-run double to centerfield. Four batters later, Trout platted two runs on a single through the left side to make it 5-0.

The Bulldogs made the most out of two LSU errors and a passed ball during the third inning to add seven runs. Goler, Pauley and Wiggins supplied a quintet of RBIs for the final margin of 12-0.

**OXFORD, Miss.** - No. 8 Georgia used a seven-run fourth inning to claim a 9-0 five-inning win over the No. 21 LSU softball team in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament hosted by Ole Miss.

In the process, LSU (38-16) had its 12-game winning streak come to a close and were handed only its fourth setback since March 19.

The Tigers will await an at-large berth into the NCAA Field of 64 Sunday at 9 p.m. as ESPN U will air the NCAA Selection Show.

"I'm glad that we don't have to play Georgia again this year," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We didn't show up in any facet today. Georgia has made us look really bad four times this season. We've been in finals week and haven't been able to practice, not that I'm using that as an excuse. We just have to forget this and move on."

The Bulldogs (46-11) platted a pair of wins during the first inning. Megan Wiggins and Taylor Schlopy set the table with a single and a walk. On a 2-2 offering, Alisa Goler smacked a RBI single through the right side before Ashley Razey added a RBI on a ground out to make it 2-0.

Georgia raced its way to seven runs in the fourth inning highlighted by a two-run Ashley Pauley single and a two-run Wiggins triple. Schlopy and Razey tacked on RBIs, and the Bulldogs took advantage of a Juliana Santos throwing error for the final margin of 9-0.

Brittany Mack was dealt the loss and dropped to 18-6 on the season. She allowed six runs on six hits in addition to three walks and a pair of strikeouts.

The Bulldogs received a two-hit shutout from Morgan Montemayer. She went tallied four strikeouts and moved to 22-3.

"Mack wasn't sharp today and she has to be able to keep hitters off balance for her to be effective," Girouard said. "When she couldn't find the strike zone in the first inning, I thought we might be in trouble."

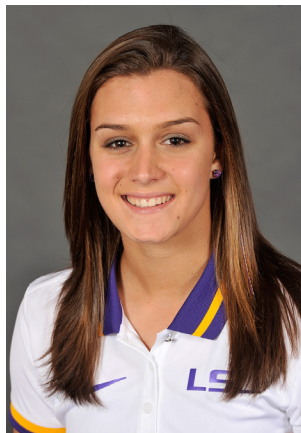

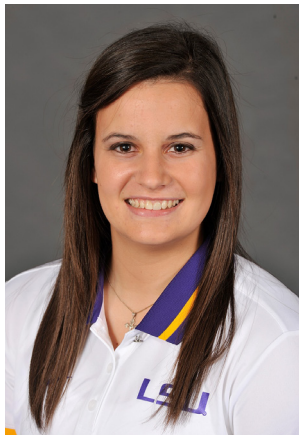
