SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU will play its 13th contest versus a Top 25 opponent since April 6 when it meets No. 7 Florida in a Thursday morning tilt to open the SEC Tournament.
- ▶ First pitch is on-tap for 11 a.m. with Cara Capuano and Michele Smith serving as the ESPNU announcing team.
- ▶ LSU and Florida split its mid-week doubleheader during the regular season. The Tigers notched a 1-0 victory in the second game behind Brittany Mack's four-hit shutout. A complete recap and box scores are available on page 8.
- ▶ LSU holds a 29-19 series advantage and has won six of the seven meetings at the SEC Tournament. Most recently, the Tigers notched a 9-1 victory in the 2010 SEC Semifinals.
- ▶ Going back to the 2006 season, LSU has been ranked in 93 of the last 102 editions of the NFCA/USA Softball Top 25 polls. The Tigers are receiving votes in both polls and had a run of five straight weeks being ranked come to close on May 8.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has reeled off a 24-14 mark going back to March 7 highlighted by season's best 12-game winning streak [March 16-April 4]. The Tigers also posted a six-game run [March 7-14] during the stretch but have dropped 13 of their last 18 since April 6.
- LSU will carry a 34-21 overall record and 15-13 SEC mark into its SEC Tournament opener versus No. 7 Florida.
- A series history and career player stats against the Gators can be seen at the bottom of this page.
- Complete recaps and box scores from this season's Florida doubleheader along with LSU-Florida's last two meetings in the SEC Tournament can be found on pages 11-14.
- If the Tigers are able to advance, they will face either No. 5 Tennessee or Auburn during Friday's first semifinal at 2 p.m.
- LSU has won 30 of 34 games this season when scoring first. The four exceptions came against Penn State [Feb. 10], No. 10 Tennessee [April 10], game one of the doubleheader versus No. 2 Florida [April 24] and Kentucky [May 4].
- LSU also has tallied an impressive 15-0 mark when scoring during the first inning. However, the Tigers haven't been able to score a first inning run since a 3-2 win at No. 2 Alabama [April 7], a span of 18 games.
- As a team, LSU is hitting .285 during its 34 wins compared to a .135 ratio in its 21 losses.

- In those 34 wins, LSU has outscored their opponents by a 169-31 margin sparked by 20 shutouts. The Tigers have come away with wins in 24 of their last 38 outings with 11 shutouts since the Nicholls State game [March 7].
- LSU dropped a trio of one-run decisions at Kentucky to conclude the regular season. The sweep enabled the Wildcats to jump over LSU in the SEC standings.
- On April 29, LSU posted a 1-0 victory over No. 12 Georgia during the program's Senior Day after dropping the first two games of the series. Brittany Mack produced her first career hit and first career RBI with a two-out, double in the fifth inning, while Rachele Fico limited the powerful UGA offense to four hits.
- On April 24, LSU battled to a doubleheader split at No. 2 Florida. Brittany Mack fired a four-hit shutout and racked up eight strikeouts as the Tigers won in Gainesville for the first time since the 2005 season. Lauren Houston platted the game's only run with a two-out, RBI single following Ashley Applegate's triple during the second inning.
- On April 21, LSU wore teal jerseys to celebrate survivors and spread awareness during the program's inaugural "Strikeout Ovarian Cancer" event, a 2-1 victory over Ole Miss.
- Betty Dieter, mother of head coach Beth Torina and two-year ovarian cancer survivor, threw out the ceremonial first pitch. Ashleigh

- Four weekends ago, LSU became only the second team during the 2012 season to defeat No. 2 Alabama. The victory halted a 13-game winning streak by the home team in the LSU-Alabama rivalry and marked the Tigers first win in Tuscaloosa since 2006.
- The Tigers used a solid effort in all three phases of the game during a 3-2 triumph in-front of a then Rhoads Stadium record crowd of 3,521 fans.
- Ashley Langoni provided a two-run home run in the first inning, Rachele Fico notched nine strikeouts for a complete game in the circle and Tammy Wray recorded the game's final out firing a strike to Allison Falcon on a chopping bunt attempt to get the speedy Kayla Braud by a step.
- Six weekends ago when LSU notched a sweep of South Carolina [March 23-25], it marked the fourth straight season that the Tigers have posted a weekend shutout of an SEC opponent: South Carolina [2009, 2010, 2012] and Ole Miss [2011].
- 15 of LSU's 21 losses have come against ranked opponents which include No. 15 Michigan [Feb. 11], No. 3 California [Feb. 19], No. 8 Oklahoma [March 2 & 3], No. 23 Oklahoma State [March 4, No. 20 Auburn [March 14], No. 2 Alabama [April 6 & 8], No. 10 Tennessee [April 13, 14 & 15], No. 22 Florida State [April 18], No. 2 Florida [April 24] and No. 12 Georgia [April 27 & 28]. Kentucky [May 4, 5 & 6] is currently receiving votes in both editions of the Top 25 polls.
- A.J. Andrews has batted leadoff during 29 of LSU's last 30 games [March 23-May 6]. The line exception came during the middle game of the Kentucky series [May 5] when Langoni batted first.
- Andrews, an All-SEC Freshman candidate, has collected hits in 18 of her last 33 outings [March 9-May 6] highlighted by six multi-hit performances, which are tied for second on the team.
- Andrews has racked up 24 of her 28 hits, scored 13 of her 16 runs and recorded 12 of her team-leading 13 stolen bases during the 33-game run.
- Andrews has tallied a .257 hitting clip [19-for-74] and has produced seven of her eight RBIs during SEC action. She has garnered hits in 15 of her 25 SEC appearances. The Oldsmar, Fla., product missed the Mississippi State series [March 16-18] due to injury.
- Cassie Trosclair has started LSU's last four games [April 29-May 6] and batted in the No. 2 hole behind Andrews.
- Trosclair has notched hits in four of her six outings where she has recorded an at-bat [April 17-May 6]. She picked up RBIs during the first two games of the Kentucky series [May 4 & 5] with a sacrifice fly and RBI single, respectively.
- Trosclair opened the run and deposited a two-out, RBI single to provide a critical insurance run during the 5th inning of a 2-1 win over McNeese State [April 17].
- Ashley Langoni has contributed six of LSU's 13 home runs, banged home a team-leading 29 RBIs on the season and won LSWA Hitter of the Week [March 15].

- Two batters later, Tammy Wray battled back from a 0-2 count. She worked the count full and knocked a chopper over the pitcher's circle which allowed Langoni to score the game's only run.

TROY - MARCH 10 - W, 1-0

- Dylan Supak ignited the Tigers with a leadoff single to open the seventh inning. Pinch runner Alex Boulet was called out at second base on a bang-bang play after a Kailey McCasland bunt attempt.
- Two batters later, Morgan Russell cranked a double down the left field which enabled McCasland to scamper into third base.
- With two outs and two runners in scoring position, pinch hitter Ashleigh Kuhn smoked the game-winning single to left field to allow LSU to notch a 1-0 walkoff victory.

ARKANSAS - MARCH 30 - W, 1-0

- Pinch hitter Simone Heyward drew a leadoff walk to open the seventh inning, while A.J. Andrews and Jacee Blades followed with bunt singles.
- A throwing error by Arkansas third baseman Chloe Oprzedek on Blades' hit allowed Heyward to scoot home for the win.

- Langoni, an All-SEC candidate, has vaulted her way up the LSU record book in multiple categories. After blasting a two-run homer in game two at No. 2 Alabama [April 7], Langoni sits alone in fifth place on the program's all-time homers list with 29 career dingers.
- Langoni also worked her way into the No. 7 position on the career RBIs rankings. She picked up a pair of RBIs, career No. 128 and No. 129, during the first two games of the Ole Miss series [April 20-21] to pass Quinlan Duhon [2005-08].
- Langoni is looking to break out of a 3-for-31 run which started during the Ole Miss series finale [April 22]. For the season, she has produced a team-leading .281 batting average, including a team-high .261 clip [18-for-69] in conference play.
- Langoni has drawn a team-leading 42 walks, including 28 free passes in her last 32 outings [March 14-May 6]. Her 24 walks are third in league games.
- Langoni became the third player in program history to surpass 100 career walks during the Alabama opener [April 6]. She eclipsed former All-American Ashlee Ducote's single season mark set in

2000 during the Ole Miss opener [April 20] and enters the week-end six walks away from matching Julie Wiese [2001-04] for second place on LSU's all-time list.

- Langoni has crossed the plate a team-high 32 times and matched her own program single-game record with four runs scored during the South Carolina finale [March 25].
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon not only returned to the heart of the lineup but the middle of the infield during the South Carolina series [March 23-25].
- LSU's defense has registered an errorless game in 15 of its last 26 outings starting with the South Carolina opener [March 23].
- Santos, an All-SEC candidate, has notched hits in 28 of her 48 appearances, including 20 of her last 34 outings [March 3-14, March 23-May 6]. She missed a four-game stretch which included the Mississippi State series [March 16-20] due to injury.
- Santos has recorded 35 hits to rank second on the team. She has chipped in a .257 hitting ratio [19-of-74] to go along with four of five multi-hit efforts and 11 of her 21 RBIs in conference play.
- Santos has garnered three, four-game hitting streaks [Feb. 11-18], [March 9-14] & [March 30-April 4] and a pair of three-game runs [Feb. 19-25] & [March 3-4].
- Falcon has found herself in six different spots in the batting order after starting the season at the bottom of the lineup. Her 22-game run in the No. 5 position [March 23-April 28] came to close during the Kentucky opener [May 4]. She did not play versus Nicholls State [April 4] and Georgia [April 29].
- Falcon broke out of an 0-for-15 run with a solo home run in the Kentucky opener [May 4]. She reached base in all three games of the series [May 4-6].
- Falcon missed an eight-game stretch [Feb. 25-March 4] due to injury. She has tallied a .252 batting average and notched 18 RBIs to rank third on the team.

- Applegate equaled a career-long six-game hitting streak [March 25-April 4] being used in the lineup's No. 6 spot. She cranked a two-run single during the sixth inning to vault LSU to a 3-2 comeback win in the Arkansas finale [April 1].
- Applegate registered a 2-for-3 effort with a triple and scored the game's only run during LSU's 1-0 victory at No. 2 Florida [April 24]. She is looking to break out of a 1-for-15 stretch over her last six games [April 27-May 6].
- Tammy Wray has provided a hit during nine of her last 15 games [April 14-May 6]. She secured LSU's first run on a two-out, RBI single versus Ole Miss [April 20].
- During the streak, Wray has seen her average climb 38 points. Her leadoff single led to LSU's lone run during a 1-0 victory over No. 12 Georgia [April 29].
- Morgan Russell has tallied a 2-for-16 run over her last seven starts at catcher [April 20-May 6]. She chipped in a RBI single to cap LSU's 4-0 victory over Ole Miss [April 20].
- Russell's 18 career sacrifice hits are tied for ninth in program history. Her last sacrifice came during the Ole Miss finale [April 22].
- Defensively, Russell has put a close to a pair of impressive stolen base streaks in SEC play. She ended Alabama's Jennifer Fenton NCAA-record 74-base run [April 7] and stopped Tennessee's Raven Chavanne streak of 40 consecutive steals [April 15].
- Dylan Supak has produced hits in 13 of her 34 starts on the season, but has tallied a 6-for-44 clip during her last 22 games since SEC action began [March 14-May 6].
- Supak has reached base in six of her last nine plate appearances over her last four outings [April 28-May 6] which include three walks, two hit batters and a single.

- Supak's five-RBI performances are third on the team only behind Langoni and Santos. She is fifth on the squad with 11 total RBIs.
- Simone Heyward missed a 15-game stretch due to injury [March 2-21] and has returned to action by making 13 appearances as a pinch hitter and five appearances which include two starts at centerfield [March 23-April 29]. She is 2-for-15 at the plate since returning to action.
- Heyward drew a leadoff walk and scored the game-winning run in LSU's 1-0 walk-off win over Arkansas [March 30]. She has scored nine times in 2012, and LSU is 31-4 over the last two seasons when she crosses the plate.
- Jacee Blades has collected hits in 12 of her last 24 outings since the Mississippi State opener [March 16-April 27]. She registered 18 of those appearances as LSU's starting designated player.
- However, Blades has pieced together a 0-for-14 stretch over her last four games [April 22-27]. She notched a pair of three-game hitting streaks [March 20-24 and March 28-31] and registered hits in two of three games in four of LSU's eight SEC weekend series.
- In her 25 starts at catcher, Lauren Houston has reached base in 15 of those games. She has compiled a .418 on-base percentage being hit-by-a-pitch on 13 occasions, which is tied for fourth in the SEC rankings.
- Houston ended a 0-for-12 stretch at the plate [March 31-April 21] with a timely two-out, RBI single to score Applegate in LSU's 1-0 victory over No. 2 Florida [April 24].
- Off the bench, Alex Boulet has scored during eight of her last 18 pinch running appearances [March 18-May 6]. She has notched eight of her 11 steals since April 4 highlighted by a run of four straight outings [April 18-22].

- Rikki Alcaraz has scored runs and drawn a quartet of walks in her last three outings as the starting second baseman [March 18-20, April 4]. She ignited LSU's five-run fifth inning versus Nicholls State [April 4] with a leadoff double.
- Earlier this season, Alcaraz put together a five-game hitting streak [Feb. 21-26] and claimed Tiger Invitational All-Tournament honors.
- Jacee Blades, Ashleigh Kuhn and Heidi Pizer have registered a combined 8-for-10 clip as pinch hitters. The rest of the LSU team has garnered a 5-for-34 mark.
- Kuhn has driven home 11 of her 13 RBIs during her last 15 outings [March 7-28, April 4-May 4] but has tallied a 2-for-25 clip at the plate in SEC action.
- Kailey McCasland has made 11 starts at third base and eight starts at designated player on the season.
- McCasland has produced two seventh inning, pinch-hit singles at No. 10 Tennessee [April 14] and in game one, a RBI shot to right field, at No. 2 Florida [April 24].
- In the circle, Rachele Fico [7] and Brittany Mack [12] have received only 19 total runs of support during their combined 20 losses on the season.
- Fico is 16-9 with a blistering 0.99 ERA, the third-lowest clip in the nation. The six-time Louisiana Pitcher of the Week has been touched up for just 27 earned runs in 191.1 innings of work. She tossed four straight SEC shutouts [March 18-30] sparked by 11 Ks during a three-hit shutout of Arkansas [March 30].
- Seven of Fico's 11 losses have been decided by either a 1-0, 2-0 or 2-1 margin.
- Fico added a four-hit gem versus Georgia [April 29] to claim her 50th career victory. She became the seventh hurler in program history to reach that impressive feat.

- During the UGA opener [April 27], Fico gutted out 15 frames without allowed an earned run. She picked up a season's best 13 strikeouts which enabled her to become the sixth pitcher in LSU history to surpass 500 career Ks.
- Fico has tossed 11 overall shutouts to rank in an eighth-place tie nationally. She has fired a quartet of one-hitters against Louisiana Tech [Feb. 12], Utah State [Feb. 19], McNeese State [Feb. 25] and Troy [March 10].
- For her career, Fico has totaled 20 shutouts to rank in a fourth-place tie on the program's all-time list. Her next shutout would allow her to pass Dani Hofer [2006-09].
- Fico became only the second pitcher during the 2012 season to defeat No. 2 Alabama [April 7]. She accomplished the impressive feat on the biggest of stages in-front of a then Rhoads Stadium record crowd of 3,521 spectators.
- Fico finished the game in-style by recording six of her nine strikeouts and retiring nine of the final 11 batters she faced over the final three innings.
- Fico also provided a sparkling performance during game one of a doubleheader at No. 2 Florida [April 24]. She had the Gators down to their final strike and garnered 11 Ks.
- Fico reeled off an impressive run of seven straight victories [March 16-April 8], which came to a close at No. 10 Tennessee [April 14].
- Fico has limited opponents to a .182 hitting clip and notched 190 strikeouts to rank fourth and fifth, respectively, in those categories among the SEC leaders.
- Brittany Mack is 14-10 with a 2.48 ERA. She has dropped six of her last eight decisions [April 6-May 6], five of them coming against Top 25 opponents. The senior right-hander ended a four-game skid with an 11-strikeout performance versus Ole Miss [April 21].

- Earlier in the season, Mack produced nine consecutive wins [March 3-April 1] which came to a close during the series opener at No. 2 Alabama [April 6].
- During the nine-game run, Mack carried a no-hitter one out into the seventh inning at South Carolina [March 24]. - Meghan Patterson is 4-0 and has racked up 40 strikeouts in her 38.1 innings of work, including a career-best 13 Ks against Alcorn State [Feb. 26].
- Patterson has been touched up for two runs on 18 hits in her last 32 frames of action [Feb. 26-April 17]. She made her SEC season debut at South Carolina [March 25].
- Patterson garnered consecutive complete game victories versus Nicholls State [April 4] and McNeese State [April 17].

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - Brittany Mack fired a four-hit shutout as the No. 23 LSU softball team grinded out a 1-0 victory to earn a split of a SEC doubleheader versus No. 2 Florida at Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium.

It marked LSU's (33-16, 14-8 SEC) first win over Florida (42-6, 19-3 SEC) in Gainesville since the 2005 season. The Tigers also secured their second win over the No. 2 team in the nation under head coach Beth Torina. LSU knocked off then No. 2 Alabama by a 3-2 margin on April 7.

"It was a great day from top to bottom," head coach Beth Torina said. "I thought we played LSU softball. We manufactured runs on offense, played solid defensively and both pitchers were dominant. I didn't think we got one break in the first game. That one could have easily gone our way. If we continue to play with this type of effort and this level of intensity we played with today, I will be extremely happy, and we will be in a very good spot at the end of the season."

Mack notched eight strikeouts versus two walks to improve to 14-8 on the season. She escaped a bases loaded jam with one out during the sixth inning. The senior right-hander dug deep and forced Bailey Castro along with Ensley Gammel to pop out and ground out in succession.

"The key for Brittany was the sixth inning," Torina said. "We've been asking her all season to stop the bleeding when there are runners on-base. That is something Rachele has done a wonderful job with, and we've asked Brittany to do the same thing. Give credit to Brittany for stepping up, having a big performance and making the critical pitches when she needed them the most."

Florida also put a pair of base runners on in the seventh inning aided. Mack regrouped to record the final out of the game in-style. She fanned Sami Fagan to secure the 2-1 triumph.

"My goal was to try and establish strike one because I saw it worked so well for Fico in the first game," Mack said. "However, I wasn't able to do that consistently especially early in the game. I had to battle back more times than I wanted to. At the end of the day, it's a great feeling to pick up a win against a very talented Florida team."

The Tigers platted the contest's lone run during the second inning. With one out, Ashley Applegate worked her way back from a 1-2 count to a 3-2 situation. She proceeded to rip the payoff pitch into a triple to the right centerfield gap.

Two batters later, Applegate scored on Lauren Houston's RBI single with two outs. It was Houston's first RBI since the Oklahoma State game back on March 3.

"Ashley did a fantastic job and had strong at-bats all across the board," Torina said. "She was a lot more aggressive and had a better mentality at the plate. Lauren stepped up, and I tell the players all the time to be ready to hit when they step into the batter's box. There was no question that Lauren was ready and did that."

Game 1 - No. 2 Florida 2, No. 23 LSU 1 [8 Innings]

LSU carried a 1-0 advantage down the final strike in the seventh inning before Ensley Gammel connected for a solo home run on a 1-2 pitch.

The Gators used a Michelle Moultrie RBI double that bounced off the chalk down the left field line to plate Jess Damico, who reached on a hit-by-pitch for the 2-1 extra-inning victory.

Rachele Fico turned in a masterful performance and equaled a season's best with 11 strikeouts. She limited the potent Florida lineup to a pair of hits in the first six frames.

LSU appeared to grab a 1-0 advantage in the fifth inning. Tammy Wray cranked a leadoff single through the middle, and pinch runner Alex Boulet alertly scooted to third base on Morgan Russell's ground out to the catcher.

Boulet scampered home on Dylan Supak's sacrifice fly, but home plate umpire Cindi Brunot ruled that Boulet left third base early after a highly-contested appeal by Florida head coach Tim Walton.

LSU broke through for the game's official first run during the sixth inning. Ashley Applegate coaxed a leadoff walk and advanced to second base on a Wray sacrifice bunt. That set the table for pinch hitter Kailey McCasland, who delivered a clutch RBI single to put the Tigers ahead by a 1-0 margin.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. - The No. 17 LSU softball team gave head coach Yvette Girouard the best birthday gift of all as Cody Trahan fired a complete game to push the Tigers to a 9-1 victory over No. 5 Florida in the SEC Tournament Semifinals at Bogle Park on the University of Arkansas campus.

In the process, the Tigers (44-13) snapped a nine-game losing skid to Florida (43-8) dating back to the 2007 SEC Tournament Championship game. It also ended the Gators seven-game SEC Tournament winning streak.

"This is a very proud program and there's no doubt we've taken our lumps against Florida during the last three seasons," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We've still won the most SEC championships and I challenged our players to remember that when they put the uniform on today. I'm happy that our team took that message to heart and proud that LSU will back on championship Saturday."

Trahan kept the high-octane Gators out of rhythm and was touched up for only one run on four hits. She also added four strikeouts against three walks to improve to 13-4 on the season. The Little Cypress, Texas native has now registered wins against every SEC team during her career.

Kirsten Shortridge racked up a 3-for-5 effort with two RBIs and provided a solo home run, her second dinger in as many days, after being held without a long ball during the regular season.

Morgan Russell also belted her first career home run during the third inning. Courtney Hollier, Jessica Mouse and Juliana Santos tacked on RBIs of their own as every LSU player in the starting lineup reached base and the Tigers erupted for eight runs during the first four frames.

"Our offense has been magnificent with two outs and Cody did a wonderful job of hitting her spots," Girouard said. "She was in the right zones and threw in the right plains, which made her extremely effective. It was a great day all-around for the Tigers."

The Tigers were clicking on all cylinders as Shortridge and Ashley Applegate registered back-to-back singles to start the first inning. A throwing error by UF shortstop Megan Bush allowed the runners to move into scoring position.

Ashley Langoni followed with a walk to load the bases. After an Anissa Young ground out forced Shortridge out at the plate, Juliana Santos coaxed another free pass to give LSU a 1-0 edge. An illegal pitch on Gator ace Stephanie Brombacher allowed Applegate to cross the plate for a 2-0 lead.

Florida put two runners on the first inning, but Trahan thwarted the rally by getting Bush to strike out looking. That opened a stretch of eight of nine batters retired by Trahan.

"The key was mixing pitches up and Morgan did a great job of getting into position to frame the pitches," Trahan said. "These are the types of games we're going to have to win going forward if we want to get where we want to go. The offense did an excellent job, they took a lot of weight off my shoulders. All I had to do was hit my spots. This win is big for my confidence to finish all seven innings."

Russell laced her first career homer to left centerfield to open the second inning before the Tigers batted around the lineup en route to a trio of runs in the third inning. Hollier was issued a bases loaded walk, while Mouse and Shortridge ripped RBI-singles to make it 6-0.

LSU added a pair of unearned runs in the fourth inning aided by two Gator errors. Russell picked up her fifth multi-RBI effort of the season with a RBI-single to extend the advantage to 8-0.

"It meant everything to jump on them early," Girouard said. "Two years ago, we couldn't touch the plate against Florida. They have been so dominant. I thought we pitch well, but we didn't get key hits with runners in scoring position when we played them earlier this season. Today, they made the uncharacteristic plays."

Bush knocked a solo home run for Florida's only in the bottom of the frame. Brombacher was tagged with the loss and surrendered four runs on three hits over 2.1 innings of work to drop to 29-6.

"Everybody got their money's worth today," said LSU head coach Yvette Girouard. "This never gets old, and we never take it for granted."

LSU placed four on the SEC All-Tournament team, including Most Valuable Player Dani Hofer. In addition, Leslie Klein, Rachel Mitchell and Shannon Stein earned All-Tournament honors for the Tigers.

"Dani was tremendous to come in and shut them down," said Girouard. "I know it means something to her being a Florida girl, so I am happy for her."

Back-to-back doubles in the top of the ninth inning gave LSU the one-run win. Rachel Mitchell, who led the Tigers at the plate for the week at .545 with three doubles, a home run and an RBI, hit a ball off the wall in left field and just got to second on what was a close play. Leslie Klein broke the LSU single-season doubles record to drive in Mitchell for the only run of the game. Klein now has 21 doubles for the season, topping the 20 hit by Ashlee Ducote in 1999.

"We keep talking about living in the present, and that's what Klein and Mitchell did," said Girouard. "That's what you want to see in your hitters."

Dani Hofer earned the win in relief to improve to 23-2 on the season. The MVP came on with two on in the bottom of the fifth and allowed only one hit and one walk with nine strikeouts over the final four and two-thirds. Emily Turner started and went four and a third innings, scattering four hits with four walks and five strikeouts.

Florida had at least one base runner on in each of the first five innings, but could not push a runner all the way to third. The Gators stranded eight, including three in scoring position. In the bottom of the seventh, Hofer retired Florida in order, all three by strikeout, for the first 1-2-3 inning for the Gators.

After a leadoff single by Jazz Jackson to start the game, LSU did not have hit until the eighth inning. The Tigers had one reach on a fielder's choice in the top of the first and one reach after being hit by a pitch in the top of the second, as Stacey Nelson faced the minimum through six and retired 16 straight from the second through the seventh.

With two outs in the seventh, Leslie Klein drew a full-count walk. Killian Roessner was then hit by a pitch to put the first runner in scoring position for LSU in the game. Unfortunately, Shannon Stein struck out to end the inning.

Florida got a leadoff bloop single by Kristina Hilberth to start the bottom half of the inning. Hilberth was sacrificed to second before Ashley Harris came in to pinch run for her. Hofer then got a strikeout swinging by Lauren Roussell and a ground out by Ali Gardiner to end the inning.

Vanessa Soto was hit by a pitch to lead off the top of the eighth. With two outs, it looked as though the Tigers would get on the scoreboard. Andrea Smith drove a 2-2 pitch deep into left field, but it was caught on the wall by Gator left fielder Brooke Johnson. After an infield single deep in the hole at shortstop by Quinlan Duhon, the first hit for the Tigers since the first inning, Jackson grounded out to third to end the inning.

Hofer pitched around a leadoff walk in the bottom of the eighth. After issuing the free pass to Melissa Zick, the hero of Florida's 1-0 win over No. 1 Tennessee on Friday, Hofer retired the next three by strikeout to get out of the inning.

In the top of the ninth, Rachel Mitchell doubled off the wall in left field, about two feet shy of a home run on the 10-foot fence. Klein then came through with the school record for doubles in a single season as she nailed a ball to right center that easily scored Mitchell. The run allowed by Nelson ended a 29-inning scoreless streak for the Gator pitcher.

In the bottom half of the ninth, Hofer threw three-straight balls to Corrie Brooks, before coming back to strike her out looking. After a fly ball to shallow left field was caught by Jackson for the second out, Kim Waleszonia grounded out to second to end the game.

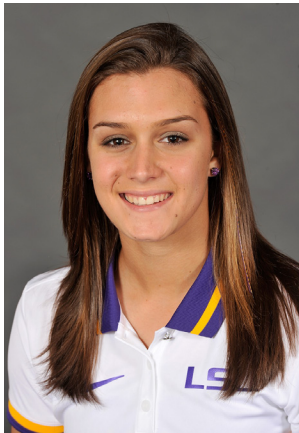

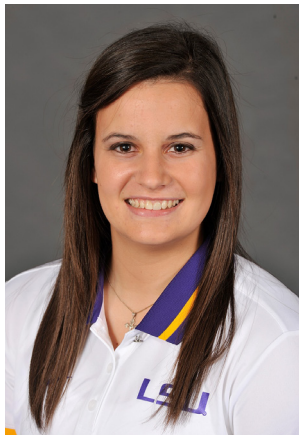
