Updated LSU Team Notes

- LSU meets No. 3 national seed Arizona State in the Tigers' second elimination contest on "Survival Saturday" at the Women's College World Series. The winner stays alive and advances to face No. 4 national seed Oklahoma Sunday at 12 p.m. CT.
- Arizona State enters the tilt with a 52-10 record and a powerful .327 team batting average. The Sun Devils have six players with double figure home runs. In the circle, Hillary Bach and Dallas Escobedo are pair of 20-game winners.
- LSU is making its third appearance at the Women's College World Series. The Tigers also qualified for the event during the 2001 and 2004 season.
- This marks the second time that LSU will make a WCWS trip under a first-year coach with the program. NFCA Hall of Fame inductee Yvette Girouard took the Tigers to the 2001 WCWS.
- LSU is 40-24 overall this season, 42-27 all time in the NCAA Tournament and 6-5 in WCWS games, including a 5-2 mark in WCWS elimination games.
- The June 2 game date is the latest for the LSU softball program. During LSU's previous two trips to the WCWS, there was no super regional round so the season ended a week earlier.
- LSU has won 35 of 40 games this season when scoring first. The five exceptions came against Penn State (Feb. 10), No. 10 Tennessee (April 10), game one of the Florida doubleheader (April 24), Kentucky (May 4) and California (May 31).
- As a team, LSU is hitting .272 during its 40 wins compared to a .141 ratio in its 23 losses. The Tigers also have outscored their opponents by a 184-34 margin sparked by 23 shutouts. 14 of those 23 shutouts have come starting with a 2-0 win over Mississippi Valley State on March 9.
- LSU's defense has registered an errorless game in 20 of its last 34 outings starting with the South Carolina opener on March 23.
- The Tigers have committed nine miscues during her last four outings starting with a four-error performance during game two versus Missouri at the NCAA Columbia Super Regional.
- Heidi Pizer started Saturday's elimination contest versus South Florida [June 2]. The Andrews, Heyward, Langoni, Santos, Falcon, Applegate, Wray, Russell and Pizer combo was the team's 47th different lineup on the season.

Updated LSU Player Notes – Hitters

- A.J. Andrews, a SEC All-Freshman selection, has batted leadoff for the Tigers in 37 of the last 39 games dating back to March 23. The lone exceptions came versus Kentucky (May 5) and Texas State (May 18).
- Andrews has racked up 27 of her 31 hits, scored 17 of her 20 runs and recorded 14 of her team-leading 15 stolen bases going back to March 9. She scored the game's only run using alert base running on a popup to shortstop during the sixth inning.
- Andrews picked up her seventh multi-hit effort in game one versus Missouri [May 26]. She is tied for third on the team behind Ashley Langoni and Allison Falcon in multi-hit performances this season.
- Simone Heyward has started all eight NCAA postseason games in centerfield for LSU. The Texas State game on May 18 marked Heyward's first start since April 17 against McNeese State.
- Heyward, a 2011 All-SEC Freshman pick, has hit safely in six of her last 12 outings. With LSU trailing 1-0 in the rubber game of the NCAA Columbia Super Regional, Heyward turned a double play on a sacrifice fly attempt during the top of the 3rd inning and provided a three-run double in the home half of the frame.
- During the last two seasons, LSU has compiled a 34-4 record when Heyward crosses the plate.

- Ashley Langoni is the only player to start in all 64 games, all coming in left field. She leads LSU's current roster with 20 NCAA postseason hits sparked by four home runs and 14 RBIs.
- Langoni has hit safely in five of LSU's eight NCAA postseason games. She knocked a RBI double in the seventh inning and compiled her team-leading 12th multi-hit performance versus No. 1 California [May 31] to open the WCWS.
- For the season, Langoni is LSU's triple-crown leader with a .266 batting average, six home runs and 31 RBIs. Her 29 career home runs and 132 career RBIs also rank fifth and seventh on LSU's all-time list.
- Juliana Santos has provided a hit in 24 of her last 42 appearances going back to March 3. She missed a four-game stretch due to injury from March 16-20 which included the entire Mississippi State series.
- Santos' 40 hits rank second on the team. She garnered a 2-for-4 outing with a run scored during game one versus Missouri [May 26]. With two runners on and one out in the seventh inning of a scoreless game, Santos delivered a RBI single through the middle to vault the Tigers to a 1-0 triumph over Texas State [May 18].
- Allison Falcon is second on the team with a .273 batting average [6-for-22] during the 2012 NCAA postseason. Her five RBIs pace the Tigers which include the game-winner on her sacrifice popup during LSU's 1-0 elimination win over South Florida.
- Falcon has reached base in 10 of her last 14 appearances [April 27-June 2]. Her leadoff single in the second inning versus No. 1 California [May 31] led to LSU's two-run frame.
- For the season, Falcon is second, one RBI ahead of Santos, and has produced 22 RBIs. She knocked a two-out, two-run single to put LSU on the scoreboard during the third inning of a 6-1 triumph over Missouri.
- Falcon tacked on another RBI to match a career-best three RBIs on a hit batter during LSU's three-run fifth inning. She garnered three RBIs during a 6-2 win over Purdue on Feb. 13, 2011.
- In the NCAA College Station Regional, Falcon notched a RBI single with bases loaded to put LSU on the scoreboard versus Texas A&M (May 19) during Saturday's winner's bracket contest. She also scored the game's first run on Kailey McCasland's sacrifice fly against Texas A&M (May 20) in Sunday's regional final.
- Ashley Applegate has started 62 of 64 games this season with 51 of those starts coming in right field. She started as the designated player during LSU's last seven games [May 19-June 2].
- Applegate has garnered a team-best .318 hitting clip [7-for-22] with three of her seven multi-hit games on the 2012 campaign coming during the NCAA postseason. Her seven multi-hit efforts are tied with Andrews for third place on the team.
- Applegate reached base in 10 of her last 13 games [April 29-June 2] highlighted by a season's best three hits in a 3-for-3 effort with a run scored versus No. 1 California [May 31]. The three hits allowed Applegate to move into the No. 25 position in LSU history with 140 career hits, passing Sara Fitzgerald [2001-04].
- Tammy Wray has found a way on-base during 20 of her last 28 appearances dating back to April 6. During that stretch, she has drawn 13 of her 23 walks and notched 10 of her 19 hits.
- Morgan Russell matched a season-high with two RBIs versus Missouri (May 26) and two RBIs against No. 1 California [May 31]. Her two-run single with the bases loaded during the second inning gave LSU a 2-0 advantage on the Golden Bears.
- Russell's four RBIs during the NCAA Tournament action are right behind Falcon for the team lead. She also became the sixth player to reach double-digit RBIs for the season with those RBIs versus California.

- Russell's 18 career sacrifice hits are tied for ninth among LSU's all-time list. Her last successful sacrifice came during the Ole Miss finale (April 22).
- Dylan Supak has tallied a 7-for-56 clip during her last 30 games since SEC action began (March 14-May 31).
- However, Supak has reached base in 11 of her last 25 plate appearances over her last 10 outings (April 28-May 31) which includes seven walks, two singles and two hit-batters.
- Heidi Pizer has appeared as a defensive replacement in six of LSU's eight NCAA postseason games in the late innings. However, Pizer was LSU's starting first baseman during the South Florida game [June 2].

Updated LSU Player Notes – Pitchers

- Rachele Fico, a NFCA All-American First-Team recipient, has opened the NCAA postseason with a 4-1 mark and an impressive 0.84 ERA. The junior right-hander has allowed four earned runs on 19 hits and recorded 27 strikeouts in her 33.1 frames of action.
- Fico opened the NCAA College Station Regional with back-to-back two-hit shutouts of Texas State and Texas A&M.
- For the season, Fico is 20-12 with a 0.96 ERA. Her 0.96 ERA is second behind Hofstra's Olivia Galati, who finished the season with a 0.95 clip.
- For her career, Fico has tallied 54 career wins and 22 shutouts. Her two-hitter versus Texas State allowed her to move past Dani Hofer (2006-09) for sole possession of fourth place on LSU's all-time list.
- Fico became the fourth pitcher to shutout Texas A&M's potent offense during the 2012 season. The junior right-hander didn't allow a runner past first base after she stranded three Aggies in scoring position during the first three innings of the contest.
- Brittany Mack is 2-1 and tallied a 0.53 ERA during the 2012 NCAA Postseason. She has racked up 32 Ks and been touched up for just two earned runs on 14 hits in her 26.2 innings of work.
- Last time out, Mack fired a two-hit shutout versus South Florida [June 2]. She moved to 16-12 on the season. The senior right-hander also secured her 15th career shutout which vaulted into a seventh-place tie on LSU's all-time list with Brandi Landry (1997-98) and Cody Trahan (2007-10).
- The Mack-Fico combo has accounted for 110 career victories between them. Mack was 2011 NFCA All-America Third-Team pick, while Fico garnered 2012 NFCA All-America First-Team accolades.
