Top-Ranked LSU Opens 2012 Season Against North Texas In Tiger Stadium

LSU will look to extend three of the nation's longest winning streaks – regular season non-conference (37), Tiger Stadium (17) and regular season (13) – when the top-ranked Tigers host North Texas to open the 2012 season. Kickoff for the Tigers and Mean Green is scheduled for 6:02 p.m. CT and the game will be televised nationally on ESPNU. LSU goes into the season-opener ranked No. 1 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 3 in the Associated Press poll. LSU is ranked No. 1 in the nation going into its first game of the season for just the second time in school history, and first since 1959. LSU will also be playing its 12th consecutive game as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. LSU returns 13 starters (6 offense, 5 defense, 2 special teams) from last year's squad that posted a 13-1 record, claimed the SEC title and reached the BCS National Championship Game. LSU spent 11 straight weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation in 2011 in going 13-0 during the regular season. North Texas, members of the Sun Belt Conference, is coming off a 5-7 record a year ago. LSU leads the overall series with North Texas, 4-0, and the Tigers have outscored the Mean Green, 198-13, in those four games. The teams most recently met in 2008 with the Tigers winning, 41-3. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 2-0 vs. North Texas (56-3 in '05; 41-3 in '08). Now in his eighth season at LSU, Miles is 75-18 with the Tigers with an overall head coaching record of 103-39. In 2012, Miles joins Charles McClendon (18 seasons) and Bernie Moore (13), as the only coaches in school history to coach into an eighth season at LSU. Offensively, LSU returns its top four rushers – **Michael Ford** (756 yards, 7 TDs), **Spencer Ware** (707, 8), **Alfred Blue** (539, 7) and **Kenny Hilliard** (336, 8) – from a year ago. **Odell Beckham Jr.** is LSU's top returning receiver (41 rec., 475 yards, 2 TDs). QB **Zach Mettenberger** will be making his first start for the Tigers on Saturday night after playing in five games as a backup last year. Defensively, ends **Sam Montgomery** (49 tackles, 13.5 TFL, 9.0 sacks) and **Barkevious Mingo** (46, 15.0, 8.0) along with tackle **Bennie Logan** (57, 6.5, 3.0) and safety **Eric Reid** (76, 2 interceptions) are back to lead the Tigers.

STORYLINES

- LSU's won a school-record nine straight season-openers heading into the North Texas contest. LSU hasn't lost a season-opener since a 26-8 setback to Virginia Tech in 2002. The Virginia Tech loss is also the last time the Tigers dropped a non-conference regular-season game. **Les Miles** is 7-0 in season-openers at LSU.

- LSU is 27-0 under **Les Miles** in non-conference regular-season games.

- The North Texas game marks the first time since 2008 that the Tigers are playing a home game to open the season. LSU hasn't played a night

- home game to open a season since a 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in 2006.

- **Zach Mettenberger** will be the first LSU QB to have his first start come in a season-opener in Tiger Stadium since Andrew Hatch in 2008. Dating back to 1986, only two other LSU quarterbacks have had their first start come in a season-opener in Tiger Stadium (Tommy Hodson, 1986 vs. Texas A&M; Sol Graves, 1990 vs. Georgia).

- 40 players, including 21 juniors, on the LSU roster have never lost a game

- in which they played at least one snap in Tiger Stadium.

- LSU has won 10 straight season-opening games in Tiger Stadium dating back to a 1996 win over Houston. The last time LSU lost a season-opener at home came in 1994 vs. Texas A&M, 18-13.

- LSU owns the nation's longest home winning streak at 17 games. The Tigers have not lost a home game since Oct. 10, 2009 to No. 1 Florida. LSU put together back-to-back perfect home seasons in 2010 (7-0) and 2011 (6-0).

Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • EIGHTH SEASON

Now entering his eight year into his reign as head coach at LSU, Les Miles has guided the Tiger football program to its most successful stretch - both on and off the field - in the history of the sport at the school. With 75 victories, two SEC titles and two appearances in the BCS National Championship Game, LSU's success since the start of the 2005 season is unmatched in college football. In the classroom, LSU ranks second in the SEC to only Vanderbilt in the most recent release of graduation rates as 152 Tigers have earned their degree under Miles' watch.

While LSU came up a game short of claiming its second BCS title under Miles in 2011, it was still a record-setting season for Miles and the Tigers. LSU went 13-0 during the regular season for the first time in school history, beat a school-record eight Top 25 teams, registered 12 of its 13 wins by double-figures and spent 11 straight weeks as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Throw in five first-team All-Americans, two national award winners, and a Heisman Trophy finalist and the 2011 regular season ranked as the most successful in school history.

Miles' accomplishments haven't come without hard work and a steadfast approach that expects excellence and dedication from his players, coaching staff and all of those who contribute to the success of LSU football. The Miles Method - a system that puts players in position to have success in the classroom, contribute and give back to the community, and compete for championships - is the foundation for which his program is built.

The results in his seven years with the program have been staggering as 157 players have graduated, 120 have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll distinction and countless hours have been spent in the community. Since

the 2007 season, LSU has seen 90 of its 109 seniors get their diplomas, including 21 of 25 seniors from the 2007 national championship team, all 19 from the 2008 squad, 20 of 24 from the 2009 team, 13 of 16 from 2010 and 16 of 25 from last year's club. Twelve players during that stretch who haven't completed their requirements for graduation are currently playing in the NFL.

In the community, the Tigers played instrumental roles during the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, which were two of the worst natural disasters to hit Louisiana. A week doesn't go by where members of the football team are visiting hospitals, reading at schools or serving as motivational speakers to area youth groups. It's become the LSU way and it's a spirit that has spread through the team.

On the field, the Tigers have won more games (75) than any other program in the SEC, finished in the nation's top 10 five times and delivered a league-best 42 NFL Draft picks, including 10 first round selections. LSU's also produced 16 first team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards, while Patrick Peterson followed that in 2010 by claiming two national awards - the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back and the Bednarik Award as the nation's top defender.

Under Miles, the Tigers have posted at least 11 victories in a season five times and finished ranked among the top five in the nation three straight years (2005, '06, and '07), a first at LSU.

Series Notes:

LSU and North Texas meet for the fifth time on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. LSU leads the series 4-0 with all four games coming in Tiger Stadium. LSU has outscored the Mean Green, 198-13, in the four games. LSU coach Les Miles is 2-0 vs. North Texas, winning 56-3 in 2005 and 41-3 in 2008. LSU was scheduled to open the 2005 season against North Texas in Baton Rouge; however, Hurricane Katrina forced the game to be postponed to later in the season (Oct. 29). The teams first met in 1995 with the Tigers winning 49-7. North Texas served as LSU's Homecoming game in 1999 as the Tigers won that game 52-0 in what was the final victory for head coach Gerry DiNardo.

NOTEBOOK

LSU Opens 2012 Against North Texas In Tiger Stadium

For the first time since 2008, LSU will open its season at home in Tiger Stadium as the top-ranked Tigers host North Texas at 6:02 p.m. on Saturday. The game, the first of three straight at home for the Tigers, will be televised on ESPNU. LSU opened the 2009 season at Washington and then face North Carolina (Atlanta) and Oregon (Arlington) at neutral sites in 2010 and 2011. The North Texas game will also be the first night season-opener in Tiger Stadium for the Tigers since a 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in 2006.

Recapping 2011: LSU Goes 13-0 During Regular Season To Claim 2011 SEC Title

LSU posted the first 13-0 regular season record in school history in 2011 as the Tigers claimed the league crown last year with 8-0 SEC record followed by a 42-10 win over Georgia in the SEC Championship Game. LSU advanced to the BCS National Championship Game for the third time in school history, dropping a 21-0 decision to Alabama in New Orleans. Still the 13-1 mark ties the 2003 squad for the best record in school history and the Tigers finished the year ranked No. 2 in the nation in both major polls – AP and USA Today Coaches. The following is a look at some of the highlights achieved during LSU's historic run to a 13-0 regular season in 2011:

- Won 12 of 13 games by double-figures – most in school history in a season
- Won eight games vs. Top 25 teams – most in school history in a season
- Spent 11 straight weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation – longest streak in school history
- Was ranked No. 1 in the BCS Standings for all eight polls in 2011, the first time a team has gone from start to finish in the BCS since Ohio State in 2006.
- Five players earned First Team All-America honors – most in school history in a season
- Allowed only 67 points in eight regular season SEC games, the fewest by the Tigers in conference play since allowing 25 points in 1962.
- Scored 40 points in nine games – most in school history in a season

LSU's North Texas Ties

Three members of the North Texas athletic department have ties with LSU. UNT strength coach Chris Seroka served on the LSU staff under Curley Hallman during the early 1990s. North Texas AD Rick Villareal was a member of the LSU coaching staff under Curley Hallman, coaching the tight ends. Also, UNT Assoc. AD/SWA Cinnamon Sheffield was a 10-time All-American and a member of four outdoor national championship teams at LSU.

LSU Owns Nation's Longest Non-Conference Regular-Season Winning Streak At 37 Straight

LSU ran the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak to 37 in a row after beating Western Kentucky, 42-9, on Nov. 12 of last season. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular-season game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va. Wisconsin is second on the list with 31 straight non-conference regular-season wins. Les Miles has accounted for 27 of the 37 wins during the streak. The 37-game non-conference regular season win streak is the second-longest such winning streak in the FBS era (since 1978) and is just two wins shy of tying Kansas State from 1993-2003 for the longest streak (39). The West Virginia win marked the sixth ranked team LSU has defeated during the streak. Kansas State defeated just one ranked team during its run, and Miami defeated 12 teams ranked in the AP poll during its streak.

LSU In Season-Openers

LSU brings an 85-28-5 overall mark in season-openers into the North Texas game. The Tigers have won nine straight and 15 of their last 16 season-openers. LSU's only season-opening loss over the past 16 years came at Virginia Tech by a 26-8 count in 2002. Last year, the Tigers posted a 40-27 win over Oregon in the Cowboys Classic in Arlington, Texas to open the season.

Les Miles In Season Openers

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 8-3 in season openers during his 11 years as a head coach, which includes a 7-0 record with the Tigers. Miles is the only coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to a season-opening win in each of his first seven years.

Les Miles' List of Achievements

In seven years with LSU, head coach **Les Miles** has put together quite a list of achievements in his 92 games with the Tigers. The following is a look at some of Miles' highlights during his seven seasons with the Tigers:

- Fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), and 70 wins (87 games) in school history.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011
- Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it three times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year, doing it twice (2010, '11).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 13 wins over coaches who have won national titles, including two this year (Saban and Chizik)
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007)

LSU Also Has The Nation's Longest Home Winning Streak At 17 Straight

In addition to its 13-game regular season winning streak, LSU has the nation's longest home field winning streak at 17 straight following the win over Arkansas last year. Here's a look at the various winning streaks that LSU is currently riding heading into the season-opener game:

Miles Is 43-6 Overall In Tiger Stadium; Tigers Have Won 17 Straight At Home

LSU is 43-6 in Tiger Stadium under **Les Miles**. LSU was a perfect 7-0 at home in 2010 and the Tigers are currently riding a 17-game home winning streak. Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama in 2008. LSU also has a loss to No. 1 ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium.

Saturday Night Special – Tigers Are 52-5 In Night Games Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 52-5 in night games under Miles compared to a 22-13 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 13-1 in away night games under Miles with the only loss coming at Florida in 2008 by a 51-21 count. LSU is 31-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 45-3 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era no matter the location. The only two home losses at night for the Tigers under Miles have come in 2005 on a Monday night against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime and a 13-3 loss to No. 1-ranked Florida in 2009. The Tigers, who are 5-0 in road games when having a 100-yard rusher, have won 12 straight dating back to the Tulane game in 2008 when a running back reached the 100-yard mark. **Kenny Hilliard** with 102 yards against Arkansas in 2011 became the latest Tiger to reach the 100-yard mark for the Tigers.

LSU's Won 21 Straight Games In September

In addition to its 37-game non-conference regular season winning streak, LSU also brings a 21-game winning streak during the month of September into the North Texas game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 24-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count.

LSU's 36-4 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 36-4 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle, which includes a 10-0 record in 2011. Since the start of the 2005 season, LSU is plus-42 in the turnover margin category. The Tigers have also won 20 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 18-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent.

LSU Runs Top 25 Streak To 49 Straight

With its No. 1 national ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 3 placement in the AP poll, LSU has now been ranked in the national rankings for 49 consecutive weeks. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 109 of the 113 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 127 of 131 games ranked in the top 25, including 91 of 93 games under Miles. LSU has a 74-17 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU hasn't played as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 vs. Arkansas and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU was ranked in the pre-season Top 25 for the 12th straight year heading into 2012. The following is a look at the longest current streaks for teams in the AP Top 25:

LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 69 of the 85 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team since the 2000 season. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis during the early 2000s, LSU has recorded a 69-16 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU was 6-3 in 2009 as a top 10 team, 4-2 in 2010 and 13-1 in 2011.

The Chief Back To Run LSU Defense

John "Chief" Chavis returns for a fourth season as LSU's defensive coordinator in 2012. Last year, Chavis led the Tiger defense top 5 national ranking in four defensive categories. The following is a look at how LSU's defense ranked to end the year:

LSU Is 23-4 In Games Played As No. 1 Ranked Team

LSU goes into the North Texas game with a 23-4 record in games played as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. LSU was 5-0 as the No. 1-ranked team in 1958, followed by a 7-1 record at the top spot in 1959. LSU was 2-2 as the No. 1-ranked team in 2007 and 9-1 in 2011. LSU is 11-3 under **Les Miles** in games as the nation's top-ranked team.

LSU Is 43-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 93 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 71-7 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 44-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 43-0, including a 9-0 record in 2011. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 221-60-4 (.780) at night under the lights compared to a 28-25-3 (.518) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 73-11 overall at home, which includes a 55-5 (.915) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 18-6 (.750) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Bennie Logan To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to junior defensive tackle **Bennie Logan** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. Richard Murphy wore No. 18 in 2010 and Brandon Taylor held the honor last year.

LSU Won Its 11th League Title In 2011

LSU captured its 11th league title with the 42-10 win over Georgia on Dec. 3 in the Georgia Dome. It was the second SEC title under **Les Miles** and the fourth for the Tigers since the league adopted a championship game between Eastern and Western Division winners in 1992. LSU's other SEC titles came in 1935, '36, '58, '61, '62, '70, '86, '88, 2001, '03, '07 and this year.

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 89th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 82nd year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU owns a nation-best 17-game home winning streak. Head coach **Les Miles** is 30-1 in Saturday Night home games. The Tigers' last home loss was to No. 1 Florida on Oct. 10, 2009 and the last non-conference loss was to UAB on Sept. 23, 2000.

- LSU has won 30 consecutive home games over non-conference opponents. **Les Miles** is 21-0 in non-conference home games.

Charles Scott, Trindon Holliday Lead LSU Past North Texas, 41-3

Charles Scott rushed for 102 yards and a pair of TDs and Trindon Holliday returned a punt 92 yards for another score as LSU had little trouble with North Texas, winning 41-3 in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers showed no signs of having not played a game in two weeks as LSU scored on four of its first five possessions in the first half in building a 27-3 lead at halftime. Scott opened the scoring with a 39-yard run minutes into the contest. Colt David followed with a 41-yard field goal four minutes later to give the Tigers a 10-0 lead. The Mean Green pulled to within 10-3 early in the second quarter, before Scott busted loose on a 43-yard TD run to stretch the margin to 17-3. Another stop by the LSU defense setup the Tigers next score as Holliday fielded a punt on his own 8-yard line and raced 92 yards, untouched, for the score and a 24-3 advantage. Andrew Hatch and Quinn Johnson each added rushing TDs for the Tigers in the third quarter as Les Miles substituted freely in the fourth quarter. For the game, the Tigers racked up 425 yards of offense (216 rushing, 209 passing), while holding the Mean Green to only 199 yards (44 rushing, 155 passing). Hatch connected on 10 of 17 passes for 125 yards, while Lee hit on 10 of 18 attempts of 84 yards. Brandon LaFell led all receivers with seven catches for 69 yards.
