LSU Welcomes Washington To Tiger Stadium For ESPN Prime Time Tilt

Third-ranked LSU will put the nation's longest home field winning streak (18) on the line Saturday when the Tigers welcome Washington to Tiger Stadium. Kickoff between the Tigers (1-0) and the Huskies (1-0) is scheduled for 6:05 p.m. CT and the game will be televised nationally on ESPN. LSU, winners of a nation's best 38 consecutive regular season non-conference games, opened the year with 41-14 win over North Texas last week. Washington beat San Diego State, 21-12, to open its season. Saturday's game will be just the third between the teams, and the first since a 31-23 LSU win in Seattle to open the 2009 season. The teams first met in 1983 when the Tigers posted a 40-14 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18-game home field winning streak is one shy of tying the school record of 19 set from Oct. 15, 2005 through Nov. 10, 2007. With its 41-14 win over North Texas, 14 of LSU's last 15 wins have come by double-digits and the Tigers have scored 40 or more points in 11 of its last 15 contests. Junior QB **Zach Mettenberger** connected on 19-of-26 passes for 192 yards and a TD in his first career start last week as the Tigers rolled up 508 yards of total offense in the win. Sophomore **Kenny Hilliard** rushed for a career-best 141 yards and 2 TDs in the victory, while junior **Alfred Blue** accounted for 123 yards on the ground. It marked the first time that LSU had two backs go over the 100-yard mark in a season-opener since the 1982 against Oregon State (Dalton Hilliard, 133 yards; Garry James, 128 yards). Sophomore WR **Jarvis Landry** hauled in a career-best 8 passes for 82 yards in the opener, while sophomore WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** returned a punt 70 yards for a TD and caught 3 passes for 30 yards. Defensively, junior FS **Eric Reid** the Tigers with 7 tackles as LSU limited North Texas to 219 total yards (143 passing, 76 rushing).

STORYLINES

- LSU is now 28-0 under **Les Miles** is non-conference regular season games.
- LSU is one win away from tying the Tiger Stadium record for consecutive victories at 19. LSU hasn't lost a home game since a 13-3 setback to No. 1 Florida on Oct. 10, 2009.
- LSU has returned a punt for a touchdown in 3 of its last 4 games dating back to last year.
- LSU has scored 18 special teams touchdowns under **Les Miles** (10 punt returns, 3 kickoff returns, 2 returns of a blocked field goal, 1 return of a fumbled punt, 1 return of a blocked punt, and 1 fake field goal).
- LSU has won 22 straight games during the month of September, a streak that dates back to a 7-3 loss at Auburn in 2006.
- LSU is 37-4 under **Les Miles**, including 21 straight victories, when having fewer turnovers than its opponent.
- LSU stands one victory shy of the FBS all-time record for consecutive victories over non-conference opponents in the regular season. Kansas State owns the record of 39 straight wins from 1993-2003. LSU has won 38 consecutive non-conference regular season contests.
- LSU has held an opponent under 100 yards rushing 15 times under defensive coordinator **John "Chief" Chavis**. The Tigers have held opponents under 100 yards rushing in 10 out of the last 15 contests dating back to last season.
- 61 players on the LSU roster have never lost a game in which they have played at least one snap in Tiger Stadium (21 saw their first snap at home last week against North Texas)
- * LSU is 21-4 all-time against current members of the Pac-12, which includes a 4-0 record under **Les Miles**.

Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • EIGHTH SEASON

Now entering his eighth year into his reign as head coach at LSU, Les Miles has guided the Tiger football program to its most successful stretch - both on and off the field - in the history of the sport at the school. With 76 victories, two SEC titles and two appearances in the BCS National Championship Game, LSU's success since the start of the 2005 season is unmatched in college football. In the classroom, LSU ranks second in the SEC to only Vanderbilt in the most recent release of graduation rates as 152 Tigers have earned their degree under Miles' watch.

While LSU came up a game short of claiming its second BCS title under Miles in 2011, it was still a record-setting season for Miles and the Tigers. LSU went 13-0 during the regular season for the first time in school history, beat a school-record eight Top 25 teams, registered 12 of its 13 wins by double-figures and spent 11 straight weeks as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Throw in five first-team All-Americans, two national award winners, and a Heisman Trophy finalist and the 2011 regular season ranked as the most successful in school history.

Miles' accomplishments haven't come without hard work and a steadfast approach that expects excellence and dedication from his players, coaching staff and all of those who contribute to the success of LSU football. The Miles Method - a system that puts players in position to have success in the classroom, contribute and give back to the community, and compete for championships - is the foundation for which his program is built.

The results in his seven years with the program have been staggering as 157 players have graduated, 120 have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll distinction and countless hours have been spent in the community. Since the 2007

season, LSU has seen 90 of its 109 seniors get their diplomas, including 21 of 25 seniors from the 2007 national championship team, all 19 from the 2008 squad, 20 of 24 from the 2009 team, 13 of 16 from 2010 and 16 of 25 from last year's club. Twelve players during that stretch who haven't completed their requirements for graduation are currently playing in the NFL.

In the community, the Tigers played instrumental roles during the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, which were two of the worst natural disasters to hit Louisiana. A week doesn't go by where members of the football team are visiting hospitals, reading at schools or serving as motivational speakers to area youth groups. It's become the LSU way and it's a spirit that has spread through the team.

On the field, the Tigers have won more games (76) than any other program in the SEC, finished in the nation's top 10 five times and delivered a league-best 42 NFL Draft picks, including 10 first round selections. LSU's also produced 16 first team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards, while Patrick Peterson followed that in 2010 by claiming two national awards - the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back and the Bednarik Award as the nation's top defender.

Under Miles, the Tigers have posted at least 11 victories in a season five times and finished ranked among the top five in the nation three straight years (2005, '06, and '07), a first at LSU.

Series Record: LSU leads 2-0

Series Notes:

LSU and Washington meet for just the third time on Saturday when the Tigers host the Huskies in Tiger Stadium. LSU leads the overall series, 2-0. The teams first met in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 24, 1983 with the unranked Tigers pulling a 40-14 upset of the ninth-ranked Huskies. At the time, the crowd of 82,390 was the largest crowd in the history of Tiger Stadium, a mark that stood until the 2000 season when the capacity of Death Valley increased to over 91,000. The only other meeting between the teams came in 2009 when the Tigers posted a 31-23 win over the Huskies in Seattle. LSU is facing a Pac-12 member for the fifth time in eight years under **Les Miles**. Miles is 4-0 vs. current members of the Pac-12 at LSU and 6-2 overall as a head coach.

LAST TIME OUT: #3/1 LSU 41, NORTH TEXAS 14 • BATON ROUGE

Running backs **Kenny Hilliard** and **Alfred Blue** combined for 264 of LSU's 316 rushing yards as the Tigers used a dominant running game to beat North Texas, 41-14, in the season-opener for both teams. The win extended three LSU winning streaks – all the longest in the nation - non-conference regular season (38), Tiger Stadium (18), and overall regular season (14). Hilliard led all rushers with a career-best 141 yards and 2 TDs, while Blue added 123 yards in what was just his third career start. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers took control early needing just four plays to go 66 yards for a 7-0 lead on a 38-yard run by Hilliard. LSU stretched the lead to 14-0 on a 70-yard punt return by **Odell Beckham Jr.**, and then to 21-0 just seconds into the second quarter on another TD run (5 yards) by Hilliard. A 44-yard field goal by **Drew Alleman** extended the lead to 24-0 with 6:26 left in the first half. North Texas scored on an 80-yard pass with just under 2 minutes to go in the first half to cut the deficit to 24-7 at halftime. An Alleman field goal and a 34-yard TD pass from **Zach Mettenberger** to **Kadron Boone** extended the LSU lead to 34-7 early in the fourth quarter. Fullback **J.C. Copeland** scored on a 5-yard run with just over 2 minutes left for the final margin of 41-14. Mettenberger connected on a 19-of-26 passes for 192 yards and 1 TD in his first career start, while **Jarvis Landry** hauled in 8 passes for 82 yards to lead the Tigers. **Eric Reid** (7 tackles, 1 interception), **Lamin Barrow** (7 tackles) and **Barkevious Mingo** (6 tackle, 1.0 TFL, 1 QB hurry) led a Tiger defense that limited the Mean Green to 219 total yards (76 rushing, 143 passing).

LSU Hosts Washington In Battle of BCS Leagues

LSU will play a night game for the second straight week in Tiger Stadium on Saturday as the third-ranked Tigers host Washington of the Pac-12 Conference at 6 p.m. The game, which will be televised by ESPN, is sold out. LSU enters the game with a 1-0 overall mark following its 41-14 win over North Texas last week. Washington is 1-0 after a 21-12 victory over San Diego State.

LSU vs. The Pac-12

LSU is 21-4 all-time against current members of the Pac-12, which includes a 4-0 record under **Les Miles**. The Tigers have won 11 straight games against Pac-12 teams with the last loss coming against top-ranked Southern Cal, 17-12, in 1979. LSU last faced a Pac-12 team in the 2011 season-opener when the Tigers beat Oregon, 40-27, in the Cowboys Classic in Arlington, Texas. Miles' first LSU victory came against a Pac-12 team as the Tigers rallied for a 35-31 win over Arizona State to open the 2005 season. Miles' other Pac-12 wins while at LSU came in 2006 (def. Arizona, 45-3), 2009 (def. Washington, 31-23). Here's a look at LSU's series record against current members of the Pac-12: Colorado 5-1, Oregon State 4-0, Arizona 3-0, Washington 2-0, Utah 2-0, Oregon 3-1, Arizona State 1-0, Southern Cal 1-1, and Stanford 0-1. LSU has never played California, UCLA, or Washington State in football.

LSU Runs Nation's Longest Non-Conference Regular-Season Winning Streak To 38 Straight

LSU ran the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak to 38 in a row after beating North Texas, 41-14, to open the 2012 season. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular-season game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va. Wisconsin is second on the list with 32 straight non-conference regular-season wins. Les Miles has accounted for 28 of the 38 wins during the streak. The 38-game non-conference regular season win streak is the second-longest such winning streak in the FBS era (since 1978) and is one win shy of tying Kansas State from 1993-2003 for the longest streak (39).

Mettenberger Delivers In First LSU Start

Junior **Zach Mettenberger** delivered a win in his first start at quarterback for the Tigers. Mettenberger connected on 19-of-26 passes for 192 yards and one touchdown in leading LSU to a 41-14 win over North Texas in the season-opener. The 19 completions were the most by an LSU quarterback in their first career start since Ryan Perrilloux completed 20 passes in a win over Middle Tennessee in 2007. Dating back to 1980, the 19 completions were the second-most by a Tiger quarterback tying with Herb Tyler (19 vs. North Texas in 1995), Josh Booty (19 vs. Georgia in 1998)

Blue (Shake) and Hilliard (Bake) Each Go Over 100-Yards In LSU Win Over North Texas

LSU RBs **Kenny Hilliard** and **Alfred Blue** each went over the 100-yard mark against North Texas as both players set career highs for rushing yards in the win. Hilliard rushed for 141 yards and 2 TDs, while Blue added 123 yards. After the game, when asked about Blue and Hilliard, head coach **Les Miles** named them Shake (Alfred Blue) and Bake (Kenny Hilliard) in reference to the Will Ferrell movie "Talladega Nights". Hilliard became the first LSU running back to rush for 100 or more yards in a season-opener since 2008 when Charles Scott had 160 yards against Appalachian State. Additionally, Hilliard and Blue became the first set of LSU backs to each rush for 100 or more yards in a season-opener since 1982 when Dalton Hilliard (Kenny's uncle) and Garry James had 133 and 128 yards respectively in a 45-7 win over Oregon State in Tiger Stadium.

LSU Running Backs Have Gone 112 Carries Without A Lost Fumble

LSU's stable of running backs have gone 112 carries without a lost fumble heading into the Washington game. The streak dates back to the second quarter of the Arkansas game last year when Michael Ford lost a fumble – the only one of his career. LSU Has Scored 18 Special Teams TDs In Miles Era

LSU registered its 18th special teams touchdown under **Les Miles** when **Odell Beckham Jr.** returned a punt 70 yards for a touchdown against North Texas. It marked the third time in four games dating back to last year that LSU has scored on a punt return. Under Miles, LSU has returned 10 punts for touchdowns, 3 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, and 1 on a fake field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all eight seasons under Miles. LSU is 16-1 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. Les Miles' List of Achievements

In 7-plus years with LSU, head coach **Les Miles** has put together quite a list of achievements in his 93 games with the Tigers. The following is a look at some of Miles' LSU highlights:

- Fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), and 70 wins (87 games) in school history.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011
- Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it three times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year, doing it twice (2010, '11).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 13 wins over coaches who have won national titles, including two this year (Saban and Chizik)
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007)

LSU One Victory Away From Tying Tiger Stadium Win Streak As Tigers Have Won 18 Straight At Home

LSU goes into the Washington game having won 18 consecutive games in Tiger Stadium, which leads the nation and ranks as the second-longest home winning streak in school history. The LSU record for consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium is 19, which was set from Oct. 20, 2007 (win over Auburn) thru Sept. 19, 2009 (win over Louisiana-Lafayette). The 19-game streak was snapped on Oct. 10, 2009 when top-ranked Florida beat LSU, 13-3.

Miles Is 44-6 Overall In Tiger Stadium

LSU is 44-6 in Tiger Stadium under **Les Miles** dating back to the 2005 season. Miles has led LSU to three undefeated seasons in Tiger Stadium (8-0 in '06, 7-0 in '10, and 6-0 in '11). Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama in 2008. LSU also has a loss to No. 1 ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 32-1 in Saturday night home games under Miles with the only loss coming to Florida in 2009.

Saturday Night Special - Tigers Are 53-5 In Night Games (No Matter Location) Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 53-5 in night games - no matter the day of week or location - under Miles compared to a 22-13 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 13-1 in away night games under Miles with the only loss coming at Florida in 2008 by a 51-21 count. LSU is 32-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 46-3 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era no matter the location. The only two home losses at night for the Tigers under Miles have come in 2005 on a Monday night against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime and a 13-3 loss to No. 1-ranked Florida in 2009. LSU is 27-2 Under Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 27-2 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. The Tigers, who are 5-0 in road games when having a 100-yard rusher, have won 13 straight dating back to the Tulane game in 2008 when a running back reached the 100-yard mark. **Kenny Hilliard** and **Alfred Blue** both went over the 100-yard mark against North Texas in the season-opener. LSU's only two losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came against Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

LSU's Won 22 Straight Games In September

In addition to its 38-game non-conference regular season winning streak, LSU also brings a 22-game winning streak during the month of September into the Washington game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 25-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count. LSU hasn't lost a game in Tiger Stadium in September since a 30-27 overtime loss to Tennessee in 2005.

LSU's 37-4 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 37-4 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle, which included a 10-0 record in 2011. Since the start of the 2005 season, LSU is plus-43 in the turnover margin category. The Tigers have also won 21 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent a streak that dates back to the Arkansas game in 2008. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 18-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. The only four losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Arkansas in 2008, Kentucky in 2007, Arkansas in 2007, and Auburn in 2006.

LSU Runs Top 25 Streak To 50 Straight (Does not include Week 2 polls, which are released Monday)

With its No. 1 national ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 3 placement in the AP poll, LSU has now been ranked in the national rankings for 49 consecutive weeks. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 109 of the 113 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 127 of 131 games ranked in the top 25, including 91 of 93 games under Miles. LSU has a 74-17 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU hasn't played as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 vs. Arkansas and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU was ranked in the preseason Top 25 for the 12th straight year heading into 2012. The following is a look at the longest current streaks for teams in the AP Top 25:

LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 70 of the 86 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team since the 2000 season. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis during the early 2000s, LSU has recorded a 70-16 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU was 6-3 in 2009 as a top 10 team, 4-2 in 2010 and 13-1 in 2011.

The Chief Back To Run LSU Defense

John "Chief" Chavis returns for a fourth season as LSU's defensive coordinator in 2012. Last year, Chavis led the Tiger defense top 5 national ranking in four defensive categories. The following is a look at how LSU's defense ranked to end the year:

With its win over North Texas, LSU is now 24-4 in games played as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. LSU was 5-0 as the No. 1-ranked team in 1958, followed by a 7-1 record at the top spot in 1959. LSU was 2-2 as the No. 1-ranked team in 2007 and 9-1 in 2011. LSU is 12-3 under **Les Miles** in games as the nation's top-ranked team.

Bennie Logan To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to junior defensive tackle **Bennie Logan** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. Richard Murphy wore No. 18 in 2010 and Brandon Taylor held the honor last year. This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 222-60-4 (.783) at night under the lights compared to a 28-25-3 (.518) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 74-11 overall at home, which includes a 56-5 (.918) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 18-6 (.750) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. In 94 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 72-7 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 45-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 44-0, including a 9-0 record in 2011. Chris Faulk took over as LSU's starting left tackle in 2011 as he became only the fourth player to start at that position since 2002. Since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has used just five starters at left tackle – Andrew Whitworth (52 straight starts from 2002-05), Ciron Black (53 straight starts from 2006-09), Joseph Barksdale (13 starts in 2010, and Faulk (14 starts in 2011-12).

LSU Won Its 11th League Title In 2011

LSU captured its 11th league title with the 42-10 win over Georgia on Dec. 3 in the Georgia Dome. It's the second SEC title under **Les Miles** and the fourth for the Tigers since the league adopted a championship game between Eastern and Western Division winners in 1992. Tigers Open 2009 Season With 31-23 Win Over Washington

Jordan Jefferson threw for 172 yards and 3 touchdowns as he helped lead the No. 9/11 Tigers to a hardfought 31-23 non-conference win over Washington in Seattle to open the 2009 campaign. LSU spotted the Huskies an early first quarter TD when UW went 85 yards on 10 plays to take a 7-0 advantage over the Tigers. LSU responded with a 24-yard field goal at the 6:03 mark. The Tigers took their first lead 14 seconds later when Jacob Cutrera returned an interception 29 yards for a score giving LSU a 10-7 advantage. The Huskies tied the game at 10-10 early in the second quarter before the Tigers took the lead for good on a 45-yard pass from Jefferson to Terrence Toliver at the 1:15 mark. UW added a field goal as time expired in the first half. Jefferson and Toliver hooked up for another score in the third quarter, this time a 39-yarder, as LSU stretched the lead to 24-13. The Tigers increased their margin to 31-16 on a 6-yard TD pass from Jefferson to Brandon LaFell. The Huskies added a touchdown as time expired for the final margin. Washington outgained LSU on offense, 478-321, as the Huskies ran 83 plays compared to just 48 for the Tigers. LSU rushed for 149 yards and added 172 through the air. Toliver had his best game in an LSU uniform with four receptions for 117 yards and two scores. Charles Scott rushed for 51 yards, while Keiland Williams added 51 and Jefferson 42 to pace the Tigers offense.

No. 1 Tigers Run Past North Texas In Season-Opener, 41-14

Running backs **Kenny Hilliard** and **Alfred Blue** combined for 264 of LSU's 316 rushing yards as the Tigers used a dominant running game to beat North Texas, 41-14, in the season-opener for both teams. The win extended three LSU winning streaks – all the longest in the nation - non-conference regular season (38), Tiger Stadium (18), and overall regular season (14). Hilliard led all rushers with a career-best 141 yards and 2 TDs, while Blue added 123 yards in what was just his third career start. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers took control early needing just four plays to go 66 yards for a 7-0 lead on a 38-yard run by Hilliard. LSU stretched the lead to 14-0 on a 70-yard punt return by **Odell Beckham Jr.**, and then to 21-0 just seconds into the second quarter on another TD run (5 yards) by Hilliard. A 44-yard field goal by **Drew Alleman** extended the lead to 24-0 with 6:26 left in the first half. North Texas scored on an 80-yard pass with just under 2 minutes to go in the first half to cut the deficit to 24-7 at halftime. An Alleman field goal and a 34-yard TD pass from **Zach Mettenberger** to **Kadron Boone** extended the LSU lead to 34-7 early in the fourth quarter. Fullback **J.C. Copeland** scored on a 5-yard run with just over 2 minutes left for the final margin of 41-14. Mettenberger connected on a 19-of-26 passes for 192 yards and 1 TD in his first career start, while **Jarvis Landry** hauled in 8 passes for 82 yards to lead the Tigers. **Eric Reid** (7 tackles, 1 interception), **Lamin Barrow** (7 tackles) and **Barkevious Mingo** (6 tackle, 1.0 TFL, 1 QB hurry) led a Tiger defense that limited the Mean Green to 219 total yards (76 rushing, 143 passing).
