LSU Hosts Idaho With A Pair of Record-Setting Winning Streaks On The Line

Second-ranked LSU (2-0 overall) will try to become the first team in NCAA history to win 40 straight non-conference regular season games when the Tigers host Idaho at 7 p.m. on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on LSU's pay-per-view network – TigerVision. Last week, LSU tied Kansas State for the longest non-conference regular season winning streak in NCAA history at 39 with its 41-3 win over Washington. The victory over Washington also tied the LSU record for consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium at 19 in a row. LSU is currently riding the nation's longest overall regular season winning streak at 15 consecutive victories, which dates back to the start of the 2011 season. Idaho (0-2) dropped its second straight contest, falling to Bowling Green, 21-13. The Vandals, who are making their second trip to Tiger Stadium, are members of the Western Athletic Conference and are coached by Robb Akey. In the only meeting between the teams, LSU posted a 53-20 win over Idaho in 1998. With its 41-3 win over Washington, 15 of LSU's last 16 wins have come by double-digits and the Tigers have scored 40 or more points in 12 of their last 16 contests. LSU's offense, which is averaging 41.0 points and 472.5 yards per game, features the Nos. 2 and 3 rated rushers in the SEC in **Alfred Blue** (112.0 ypg) and **Kenny Hilliard** (93.5 ypg). Blue had his second straight 100-yard game last week with 101 yards and a TD vs. Washington. Hilliard leads the SEC in scoring with 24 points (4 TDs) in two games. Junior QB **Zach Mettenberger** has thrown for 387 yards and a pair of TDs in LSU's two wins as he's completed 70.5 percent (31-of-44) of his passes with just one interception. **Jarvis Landry** leads the Tigers in receiving with nine catches for 102 yards, while **Kadron Boone** has caught both of LSU's receiving TDs. Defensively, LSU is first in the SEC in total defense (201.0) and rushing defense (51.0) and second in scoring defense (8.5). LBs **Kevin Minter** (15 tackles) and **Lamin Barrow** (13) lead the Tigers in tackles.

STORYLINES

- LSU is 29-0 under **Les Miles** in non-conference regular season games.

- LSU is 46-4 vs. unranked teams under **Les Miles**, which includes a current streak of 14 straight wins.

- LSU is one victory shy of becoming the only team in NCAA FBS history to win 40 straight non-conference regular season games. LSU tied the record of 39 straight non-conference regular season wins held by Kansas State with the win over Washington. LSU's hasn't lost a non-conference regular season game since a 26-8 loss to Virginia Tech to open the 2002 season.

- LSU is one win away from breaking the Tiger Stadium record for consecutive victories. LSU is currently riding a 19-game home winning streak, which ties the mark set from 2007-09. LSU hasn't lost a home game since a 13-3 setback to No. 1 Florida on Oct. 10, 2009.

- LSU has won 35 straight non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, a streak that dates back to 2001. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference home game since a 13-10 loss to UAB in 2000.

- LSU has scored 18 special teams touchdowns under **Les Miles** (10 punt returns, 3 kickoff returns, 2

- returns of a blocked field goal, 1 return of a fumbled punt, 1 return of a blocked punt, and 1 fake field goal).

- LSU has won 23 straight games during the month of September, a streak that dates back to a 7-3 loss at Auburn in 2006.

- LSU is 37-4 under **Les Miles**, including 21 straight victories, when having fewer turnovers than its opponent.

- LSU is ranked in the Top 10 in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Polls for the 20th consecutive week. The streak dates back to the final polls of the 2010 season.

Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • EIGHTH SEASON

Now entering his eighth year into his reign as head coach at LSU, Les Miles has guided the Tiger football program to its most successful stretch - both on and off the field - in the history of the sport at the school. With 77 victories, two SEC titles and two appearances in the BCS National Championship Game, LSU's success since the start of the 2005 season is unmatched in college football. In the classroom, LSU ranks second in the SEC to only Vanderbilt in the most recent release of graduation rates as 152 Tigers have earned their degree under Miles' watch.

While LSU came up a game short of claiming its second BCS title under Miles in 2011, it was still a record-setting season for Miles and the Tigers. LSU went 13-0 during the regular season for the first time in school history, beat a school-record eight Top 25 teams, registered 12 of its 13 wins by double-figures and spent 11 straight weeks as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Throw in five first-team All-Americans, two national award winners, and a Heisman Trophy finalist and the 2011 regular season ranked as the most successful in school history.

Miles' accomplishments haven't come without hard work and a steadfast approach that expects excellence and dedication from his players, coaching staff and all of those who contribute to the success of LSU football. The Miles Method - a system that puts players in position to have success in the classroom, contribute and give back to the community, and compete for championships - is the foundation for which his program is built.

The results in his seven years with the program have been staggering as 157 players have graduated, 120 have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll distinction and countless hours have been spent in the community. Since the 2007

season, LSU has seen 90 of its 109 seniors get their diplomas, including 21 of 25 seniors from the 2007 national championship team, all 19 from the 2008 squad, 20 of 24 from the 2009 team, 13 of 16 from 2010 and 16 of 25 from last year's club. Twelve players during that stretch who haven't completed their requirements for graduation are currently playing in the NFL.

In the community, the Tigers played instrumental roles during the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, which were two of the worst natural disasters to hit Louisiana. A week doesn't go by where members of the football team are visiting hospitals, reading at schools or serving as motivational speakers to area youth groups. It's become the LSU way and it's a spirit that has spread through the team.

On the field, the Tigers have won more games (77) than any other program in the SEC, finished in the nation's top 10 five times and delivered a league-best 42 NFL Draft picks, including 10 first round selections. LSU's also produced 16 first team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards, while Patrick Peterson followed that in 2010 by claiming two national awards - the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back and the Bednarik Award as the nation's top defender.

Under Miles, the Tigers have posted at least 11 victories in a season five times and finished ranked among the top five in the nation three straight years (2005, '06, and '07), a first at LSU.

Series Record: LSU leads 1-0

Series Notes:

For the second straight week, LSU will face a team from the northwest part of the country as Idaho comes to Tiger Stadium. LSU leads the series with Idaho, 1-0. The only other meeting between LSU and Idaho came in 1998 when the Tigers posted a 53-20 win over the Vandals.

LAST TIME OUT: #3 LSU 41, WASHINGTON 3 • BATON ROUGE

LSU put together a dominating performance on both sides of the ball as the third-ranked Tigers rolled up 437 yards of offense (242 rushing, 195 passing), while holding Washington to only 183 total yards (26 rushing, 157 passing) in a 41-3 win in Tiger Stadium. Had it not been for LSU fumbling the opening kickoff at its own 16-yardline, LSU could have very easily pitched a shutout as outside of that first possession, Washington didn't get inside the Tiger 30-yard line all night. After spotting the Huskies a 3-0 lead, LSU took over, scoring (5 TDs, 2 FGs) on seven of its next nine possessions. LSU took the lead for good when **Alfred Blue** scampered 21-yards for a 7-3 Tiger lead at the 11:18 mark in the first quarter. LSU extended the advantage to 14-3 two possessions later when **J.C. Copeland** plunged 1-yard for a TD. A pair of second quarter **Drew Alleman** field goals (18 and 32 yards) gave the Tigers a 20-3 lead at halftime. After a 3-and-out by UW on its first possession of the second half, the Tigers went 61 yards on seven plays capped on a 3-yard run by **Kenny Hilliard** to extend the lead to 27-3 at the 10:35 mark in the third quarter. **Zach Mettenberger** connected with **Kadron Boone** on a 32-yard scoring strike late in the third quarter to stretch the lead to 34-3. Blue led the Tigers in rushing with 101 yards for his second straight 100-yard game, while Mettenberger completed 12-of-18 passes for 195 yards and a score. Defensively, LB **Kevin Minter** led the Tigers with 9 tackles, while DE **Sam Montgomery** added 4 tackles and had one of LSU's four sacks. Other sacks came from **Micah Eugene** (-8 yards), **Chancey Aghayere** (-11 yards) and **Lavar Edwards** (-6 yards). **Jalen Mills** had LSU's only interception to go with 7 tackles.

LSU Hosts Idaho In Final Test Before SEC Play Starts

LSU will play a rare third straight night game in Tiger Stadium on Saturday as the No. 2 ranked Tigers host Idaho at 7 p.m. The game will be televised on TigerVision, LSU's pay-per-view network. LSU is 2-0 overall following last week's 41-3 win over Washington. Idaho dropped to 0-2 after its 21-13 setback to Bowling Green.

LSU vs. the Western Athletic Conference (WAC)

LSU is 23-1 all-time against current members of the Western Athletic Conference. LSU is 18-1 vs. Louisiana Tech, 2-0 vs. Utah State, and 1-0 against Idaho, New Mexico State, and San Jose State. LSU has never played Texas State or Texas-San Antonio in football. LSU last faced a member of the WAC in 2009, beating Louisiana Tech, 24-16, in Tiger Stadium.

LSU Runs Nation's Longest Non-Conference Regular-Season Winning Streak To 39 Straight

LSU ran the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak to 39 in a row after beating Washington, 41-3, last week. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular-season game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va. **Les Miles** has accounted for 29 of the 39 wins during the streak. The 39-game non-conference regular season win streak is the longest such winning streak in the FBS era (since 1978), tying with Kansas State for the record. With a win over Idaho, LSU will become the first team in FBS history to win 40 straight non-conference regular season games. Here is a look at the top three in FBS all-time consecutive non-conference regular season wins:

LSU Goes After Tiger Stadium Win Streak Mark Saturday

LSU will look to set the Tiger Stadium record for longest winning streak on Saturday when the Tigers host Idaho. LSU brings a 19-game home winning streak into the contest, which ties the current mark set from 2007-09. LSU's 19-game streak currently leads the nation. Prior LSU's current streak, the previous Tiger Stadium record of 19 ran from Oct. 20, 2007 (win over Auburn) thru Sept. 19, 2009 (win over Louisiana-Lafayette). The 19-game streak was snapped on Oct. 10, 2009 when top-ranked Florida beat LSU, 13-3.

First Time Starters

LSU has used four first-time starters – 2 offense, 2 defense – in its two games this year. The first-time starters this year include: LG **La'el Collins**, QB **Zach Mettenberger**, LB **Luke Muncie**, and CB **Jalen Mills**. All four of those players have started both games this year.

You're My Boy Blue!

Junior RB **Alfred Blue** made the most of his second straight start vs. Washington, rushing for 101 yards and a TD in the 41-3 LSU victory. Blue, who ranks second in the SEC with 112 yards per game, became the first LSU running back to open a season with back-to-back 100-yard games since Charles Scott did it in 2008. Blue opened the year with 123 yards in the win over North Texas. Blue is also the first LSU back to have consecutive 100-yard games since Stevan Ridley did it against West Virginia (116 on Sept. 25, 2010) and Tennessee (123 on Oct. 2, 2010) two years ago.

Mettenberger-To-Boone Equals TD

Junior QB **Zach Mettenberger** has thrown three TD passes in his brief career with the Tigers and all three have gone to the same receiver – **Kadron Boone**. The Mettenberger-to-Boone combo has produced five receptions – 2 in 2011 and 3 in 2012 – for a total of 106 yards in receiving and three TDs. Mettenberger tossed a 19-yard TD pass to Boone last year in week 2 vs. Northwestern State and has followed that with a 34-yard scoring pass vs. North Texas in the season-opener and a 32-yarder against Washington.

Mills and Montgomery Tabbed By League As Players of the Week

CB **Jalen Mills** has been named the SEC Freshman of the Week and DE **Sam Montgomery** earned the league's co-defensive lineman of the week honors following LSU's 41-3 win over Washington. Mills, in just his second career game at LSU, had 7 tackles and an interception in helping the Tiger defense hold Washington to only 183 total yards and 12 first downs. Montgomery had 4 tackles, 1 sack for a 3-yard loss, a tackle for a 1-yard loss and 3 QB hurries in the win. In his 21 game career, the All-American Montgomery has recorded 21 career tackles for loss and 12 sacks, both of which are just outside the LSU career top 10.

Mettenberger Nearly Flawless Against Washington

Junior QB **Zach Mettenberger** was nearly flawless in his second start last week vs. Washington, completing 12-of-18 passes for 192 yards and a TD. Of Mettenberger's six incompletions, five were "drops", which would have resulted in an additional TD pass and another 50-plus yards in passing for the Tigers. Thru 2 games, Mettenberger has completed 70.5 percent of his passes as he connected on 31-of-44 attempts for 387 yards, 2 TDs and just one interception. In his first career start in week 1 vs. North Texas, Mettenberger completed 19 passes, which were the most by an LSU quarterback in their first career start since Ryan Perrilloux completed 20 passes in a win over Middle Tennessee in 2007. Dating back to 1980, the 19 completions were the second-most by a Tiger quarterback tying with Herb Tyler (19 vs. North Texas in 1995), Josh Booty (19 vs. Georgia in 1998)

LSU's Shake (Alfred Blue) and Bake (Kenny Hilliard) Rank 1-2 In SEC In Rushing

LSU RBs **Alfred Blue** and **Kenny Hilliard** ranks Nos. 2-3 in this week's SEC statistics after two games. Blue ranks second in the SEC with 112.0 yards per game, while Hilliard is third in the league with 93.5 yards a contest. Hilliard leads the SEC in scoring with a total of 24 points as he's rushed for four TDs in LSU's first two games. As far as the duos nickname is concerned, after the first game of the year when asked about Blue and Hilliard, head coach **Les Miles** named them Shake (Alfred Blue) and Bake (Kenny Hilliard) in reference to the Will Ferrell movie "Talladega Nights". Hilliard became the first LSU running back to rush for 100 or more yards in a season-opener since 2008 when Charles Scott had 160 yards against Appalachian State. Additionally, Hilliard and Blue became the first set of LSU backs to each rush for 100 or more yards in a season-opener since 1982 when Dalton Hilliard (Kenny's uncle) and Garry James had 133 and 128 yards respectively in a 45-7 win over Oregon State in Tiger Stadium.

LSU Running Backs Have Gone 153 Carries Without A Lost Fumble

LSU's stable of running backs have gone 153 carries without a lost fumble heading into the Idaho game. The streak dates back to the second quarter of the Arkansas game last year when Michael Ford lost a fumble – the only one of his career. LSU registered its 18th special teams touchdown under **Les Miles** when **Odell Beckham Jr.** returned a punt 70 yards for a touchdown against North Texas. It marked the third time in four games dating back to last year that LSU has scored on a punt return. Under Miles, LSU has returned 10 punts for touchdowns, 3 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, and 1 on a fake field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all eight seasons under Miles. LSU is 16-1 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. Wing Man

In less than two seasons, sophomore **Brad Wing** has arguably been the best punter in school history. Wing, who missed the season-opener against North Texas due to a leg injury, saw his first action of the season against Washington on Sept. 8. In his first punt of the year, the All-American and Ray Guy Award candidate launched a 62-yarder into a stiff north wind that landed at the Washington 4-yard line. It was the third-longest punt of his career. Wing finished with three punts for 163 yards, an average of 54.3 per punt. The Australian upped his school record career punting average to 44.9 yards per punt. Patrick Fisher (2004-07) is the next closest at 44.1 yards per punt.

Les Miles' List of Achievements

In 7-plus years with LSU, head coach **Les Miles** has put together quite a list of achievements in his 94 games with the Tigers. The following is a look at some of Miles' LSU highlights:

- Fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), and 70 wins (87 games) in school history.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011
- Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it three times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year, doing it twice (2010, '11).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 13 wins over coaches who have won national titles, including two this year (Saban and Chizik)
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007)

Miles Is 45-6 Overall In Tiger Stadium

LSU is 45-6 in Tiger Stadium under **Les Miles** dating back to the 2005 season. Miles has led LSU to three undefeated seasons in Tiger Stadium (8-0 in '06, 7-0 in '10, and 6-0 in '11). Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama in 2008. LSU also has a loss to No. 1 ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 32-1 in Saturday night home games under Miles with the only loss coming to Florida in 2009.

Saturday Night Special – Tigers Are 54-5 In Night Games (No Matter Location) Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 54-5 in night games – no matter the day of week or location - under Miles compared to a 22-13 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 13-1 in away night games under Miles with the only loss coming at Florida in 2008 by a 51-21 count. LSU is 33-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 47-3 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era no matter the location. The only two home losses at night for the Tigers under Miles have come in 2005 on a Monday night against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime and a 13-3 loss to No. 1-ranked Florida in 2009. LSU is 28-2 Under Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 28-2 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. The Tigers, who are 5-0 in road games when having a 100-yard rusher, have won 14 straight dating back to the Tulane game in 2008 when a running back reached the 100-yard mark. **Kenny Hilliard** and **Alfred Blue** both went over the 100-yard mark against North Texas in the season-opener and Blue followed with 101 yards in week 2 vs. Washington. LSU's only two losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came against Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

LSU's Won 23 Straight Games In September

In addition to its 39-game non-conference regular season winning streak, LSU also brings a 23-game winning streak during the month of September into the Idaho game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 26-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count. LSU hasn't lost a game in Tiger Stadium in September since a 30-27 overtime loss to Tennessee in 2005.

LSU's 37-4 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 37-4 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle, which included a 10-0 record in 2011. Since the start of the 2005 season, LSU is plus-43 in the turnover margin category. The Tigers have also won 21 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent a streak that dates back to the Arkansas game in 2008. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 18-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. The only four losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Arkansas in 2008, Kentucky in 2007, Arkansas in 2007, and Auburn in 2006.

LSU Runs Top 25 Streak To 51 Straight

With its No. 2 national ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 3 placement in the AP poll, LSU has now been ranked in the national rankings for 51 consecutive weeks. The 51 straight weeks trails only Alabama, who has been ranked for 68 straight weeks. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 110 of the 114 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 128 of 132 games ranked in the top 25, including 92 of 94 games under Miles. LSU has a 75-17 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU hasn't played as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 vs. Arkansas and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU was ranked in the preseason Top 25 for the 12th straight year heading into 2012. The following is a look at the longest current streaks for teams in the AP Top 25:

LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 71 of the 87 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team since the 2000 season. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis during the early 2000s, LSU has recorded a 71-16 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU was 6-3 in 2009 as a top 10 team, 4-2 in 2010 and 13-1 in 2011.

LSU Is 24-4 In Games Played As No. 1 Ranked Team

With its win over North Texas, LSU is now 24-4 in games played as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. LSU was 5-0 as the No. 1-ranked team in 1958, followed by a 7-1 record at the top spot in 1959. LSU was 2-2 as the No. 1-ranked team in 2007 and 9-1 in 2011. LSU is 12-3 under Les Miles in games as the nation's top-ranked team.

LSU Is 45-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100-Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach Les Miles is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 94 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 73-7 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 46-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 45-0, including a 9-0 record in 2011. This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 223-60-4 (.783) at night under the lights compared to a 28-25-3 (.518) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 75-11 overall at home, which includes a 57-5 (.918) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 18-6 (.750) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. First, Faulk caught a 50-yard touchdown pass from Herb Tyler, then Johnny Mitchell caught a deflected pass and returned it 36 yards for a touchdown, followed by a 26-yard Tyler-to-Abram Booty out in the second quarter, then Faulk crashed in from 11 yards out to make it 40-7 early in the third quarter. Larry Foster's 50-yard punt return in the fourth quarter capped the scoring.

No. 1 Tigers Run Past North Texas In Season-Opener, 41-14

Running backs **Kenny Hilliard** and **Alfred Blue** combined for 264 of LSU's 316 rushing yards as the Tigers used a dominant running game to beat North Texas, 41-14, in the season-opener for both teams. The win extended three LSU winning streaks – all the longest in the nation - non-conference regular season (38), Tiger Stadium (18), and overall regular season (14). Hilliard led all rushers with a career-best 141 yards and 2 TDs, while Blue added 123 yards in what was just his third career start. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers took control early needing just four plays to go 66 yards for a 7-0 lead on a 38-yard run by Hilliard. LSU stretched the lead to 14-0 on a 70-yard punt return by **Odell Beckham Jr.**, and then to 21-0 just seconds into the second quarter on another TD run (5 yards) by Hilliard. A 44-yard field goal by **Drew Alleman** extended the lead to 24-0 with 6:26 left in the first half. North Texas scored on an 80-yard pass with just under 2 minutes to go in the first half to cut the deficit to 24-7 at halftime. An Alleman field goal and a 34-yard TD pass from **Zach Mettenberger** to **Kadron Boone** extended the LSU lead to 34-7 early in the fourth quarter. Fullback **J.C. Copeland** scored on a 5-yard run with just over 2 minutes left for the final margin of 41-14. Mettenberger connected on a 19-of-26 passes for 192 yards and 1 TD in his first career start, while **Jarvis Landry** hauled in 8 passes for 82 yards to lead the Tigers. **Eric Reid** (7 tackles, 1 interception), **Lamin Barrow** (7 tackles) and **Barkevious Mingo** (6 tackle, 1.0 TFL, 1 QB hurry) led a Tiger defense that limited the Mean Green to 219 total yards (76 rushing, 143 passing).

LSU Uses Dominating Effort On Both Sides Of Ball In 41-3 Win Over Washington

LSU put together a dominating performance on both sides of the ball as the third-ranked Tigers rolled up 437 yards of offense (242 rushing, 195 passing), while holding Washington to only 183 total yards (26 rushing, 157 passing) in a 41-3 win in Tiger Stadium. Had it not been for LSU fumbling the opening kickoff at its own 16-yardline, LSU could have very easily pitched a shutout as outside of that first possession, Washington didn't get inside the Tiger 30-yard line all night. After spotting the Huskies a 3-0 lead, LSU took over, scoring (5 TDs, 2 FGs) on seven of its next nine possessions. LSU took the lead for good when **Alfred Blue** scampered 21-yards for a 7-3 Tiger lead at the 11:18 mark in the first quarter. LSU extended the advantage to 14-3 two possessions later when **J.C. Copeland** plunged 1-yard for a TD. A pair of second quarter **Drew Alleman** field goals (18 and 32 yards) gave the Tigers a 20-3 lead at halftime. After a 3-and-out by UW on its first possession of the second half, the Tigers went 61 yards on seven plays capped on a 3-yard run by **Kenny Hilliard** to extend the lead to 27-3 at the 10:35 mark in the third quarter. **Zach Mettenberger** connected with **Kadron Boone** on a 32-yard scoring strike late in the third quarter to stretch the lead to 34-3. Blue led the Tigers in rushing with 101 yards for his second straight 100-yard game, while Mettenberger completed 12-of-18 passes for 195 yards and a score. Defensively, LB **Kevin Minter** led the Tigers with 9 tackles, while DE **Sam Montgomery** added 4 tackles and had one of LSU's four sacks. Other sacks came from **Micha Eugene** (-8 yards), **Chancey Aghayere** (-11 yards) and **Lavar Edwards** (-6 yards). **Jalen Mills** had LSU's only interception to go with 7 tackles.
