THE STORYLINE

- The Florida Gators (4-0, 3-0 SEC) welcome the LSU Tigers (4-0, 1-0 SEC) to The Swamp for a matchup of undefeated teams. This will mark the ninth-straight year the Gators-Tigers game will be a top-25 matchup.
- The Gators enter the game ranked 11th in the latest AP Poll, the highest ranking under head coach Will Muschamp. It is the highest UF has been ranked since Week 5 of the 2010 season (ranked 7th).
- Each of the past 12 Florida-LSU matchups have been broadcast nationally on CBS or ESPN. Seven out of the last eight games between these two teams have been picked by CBS.
- The Gators are coming off a 38-0 victory over Kentucky, marking UF's first shutout of an SEC opponent since beating Mississippi State, 52-0, on Sept. 29, 2001.
- The Tigers face Towson in Week 5 after beating Auburn, 12-10, to open conference play in Week 4.
- For the second straight year, Florida opens the month of October at home against a top-three opponent. The game against LSU marks the beginning of a stretch that will see the Gators play three teams in the top six of the rankings in the next four games (10/20 vs. No. 6 South Carolina, 10/27 vs. No. 5 Georgia).
- In addition, Florida faces No. 4 Florida State on Nov. 24. The

Gators are the only team with four current top 10 teams on their schedule.

- Since 1990, the Gators are 28-9 after a bye week and 8-2 at the Swamp after a bye week.
- Florida became the first team in the nation to win three conference games with its 38-0 win over Kentucky on Sept. 22.
- For the fourth year in a row the Gators started the season 4-0. In each of the past eight years, Florida has started the season 3-0, the longest streak in the nation according to ESPN research.
- Florida leads the all-time series against LSU, 30-25-3. The Gators hold a 14-11-3 edge against the Tigers when playing in Gainesville. In LSU's last trip to The Swamp, the Tigers pulled off a 33-29 victory after converting a fake field goal in the fourth quarter to extend the game-winning drive. Last year in Baton Rouge, No. 1 LSU beat UF, 41-11.
- Muschamp holds a 1-2 record in three career meetings against LSU, including a 1-1 record as Auburn's defensive coordinator.
- In four years as an assistant coach at LSU, Florida head coach Will Muschamp helped lead the Tigers to a 40-12 record.

LAST TIME OUT

Back at home for the first time in three weeks, Florida (4-0, 3-0 SEC) shook off some early rust to run away from Kentucky (1-3, 0-1 SEC), 38-0, giving the Gators their 26th-straight win in the series. For UF, it was its first shutout since defeating UAB, 39-0, in week two last year, and its first shutout of an SEC opponent since defeating Mississippi State, 52-0, on Sept. 29, 2001.

Florida got its scoring from a 27-yard field goal from Caleb Sturgis, 1-yard touchdown runs from Mike Gillislee, Jeff Driskel and Jacoby Brissett, a 26-yard interception return by Jaylen Watkins and a 19-yard reception by Quinton Dunbar.

The Gators had a 27-yard field goal from Sturgis to grab the game's first points with 5:18 left in the first quarter, covering 49 yards on five plays.

After Craig McIntosh's 54-yard field-goal attempt went wide left, the Gators took advantage of the miss, marching 63 yards on 10 plays and taking 5:02 off the clock. Driskel connected with Frankie Hammond on a 24-yard pass over the middle to move the Gators into Kentucky territory. After a 5-yard completion to Hunter Joyer on third down gave the Gators a first-and-goal at the Kentucky 1-yard line, Gillislee carried it in for a score on the next play for his fifth rushing touchdown of the season, giving the Gators a 10-0 lead with 12:04 left in the half.

The Wildcats got the ball back, but facing a 3rd-and-7, Morgan Newton's pass was intercepted by De'Ante Saunders and returned 29 yards to the Kentucky 23. The Gators were unable

to take advantage, however, as Driskel took a shot at the end zone and the result was his first interception of the year.

Capping a stretch of three-straight possessions with a pick, Watkins stepped in front of the Wildcat receiver and read Newton's pass perfectly, grabbing the interception and returning it 26 yards to give the Gators a 17-0 lead with 8:24 left in the half.

Getting the ball back late in the half, Driskel engineered an impressive drive, marching the Gators 76 yards in seven plays and using just 1:18 off the clock. Driskel hit Jordan Reed with a 34-yard pass over the middle and then a personal foul tacked on 15 more yards to the Kentucky 19-yard line. Moments later, Driskel hit Dunbar with a 19-yard strike to close out the first-half scoring.

As the second half began, it was more of the same, as Driskel led the Gators on another long drive that ate up a large chunk of the third quarter. UF marched 72 yards on 15 plays and took 9:03 off the clock on the drive, capped by a 1-yard touchdown run by Driskel.

As the fourth quarter arrived and with the game in hand, head coach Will Muschamp called on Brissett at quarterback, as the sophomore saw his first action since the week one win over Bowling Green. Brissett capped a 9-play, 47-yard drive with a 1-yard keeper with 6:47 left to make it 38-0.

Florida had near perfect balance offensively, getting 403 yards of total offense with 203 yards passing and 200 yards rushing.

COACH MUSCHAMP INTERVIEWS

Please coordinate all requests for telephone and personal interviews with Coach Muschamp through Steve McClain in the Communications Office. Coach Muschamp is available on Monday (weekly press conference at noon) and Wednesday (SEC Teleconference at 11:20 a.m. ET). Contact the SEC Office at (205) 458-3010 for phone number and passcode). Coach Muschamp will also host the *Gator Hotline with Will Muschamp* show on 8/30, 9/13, 10/4, 10/18, 10/25, 11/8, 11/19 (Monday) from 7-8 p.m. ET. Additionally, *Florida Football with Will Muschamp* airs on Sundays at noon on Sun Sports throughout the regular season.

PLAYER/ASSISTANT COACH INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be coordinated with Dan Apple in the Communications Office. Players will be available on Monday (at weekly press conference), Tuesday and Wednesday (in Visiting Team Locker Room, approx. 1 p.m.). The starting quarterback will only be available on Mondays at the weekly press conference. Freshmen will not be available for interviews. All player interviews will conclude on Wednesdays during game weeks. Telephone interviews should be booked at least one day in advance and are normally limited to those times reserved for the general interview sessions. The Communications Office will not give out home or cell phone numbers for any players and players may not be contacted directly by phone, text, e-mail or social media. Members of the media are not permitted in team areas. Team locker room, training room and strength complex are considered private work areas. These areas, as well as players' housing (campus and off campus), are off-limits to media representatives.

Offensive Coordinator Brent Pease will be available to the media on Tuesday and Defensive Coordinator Dan Quinn will be available on Wednesday. Interviews with Coach Pease and Coach Quinn are scheduled to take place at noon in the Gator Room to the right of Gate 1 in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. There is currently no media access for interviews with other assistant coaches.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Florida's weekly press conference will begin Monday, August 27, and will be held each Monday during the season except on the bye week (Monday, Sept. 24). Select players will address media representatives in the South End Zone Meeting Room from 11 a.m. – noon, with Coach Muschamp scheduled as early as 11:45 a.m. When entering the South End Zone Meeting Room and during the availability, members of the media are to use the entrance and exit located inside the South End Zone tunnel and are not to be in any of the team areas at any time. For those who cannot attend weekly press conferences, video of the press conference will be posted online via GatorZone.com. Quotes from Coach Muschamp will be available on the media-only website.

RULE CHANGES FOR 2012

Several rule changes for the 2012 season were approved by the Playing Rules Oversight Panel (PROP) and went into effect this season, including the following:

- Teams will kick off at the 35-yard line instead of the 30. Players on the kicking team can't line up for the play behind the 30-yard line, which is intended to limit the running start kicking teams used to have during the play.
- Touchbacks on free kicks will be moved to the 25-yard line instead of the 20. Touchbacks on other plays (ex: punts/fumbles that go into the end zone) will remain at the 20-yard line.
- If a player loses his helmet (other than as the result of a foul by the opponent, such as a facemask), it will be treated like an injury. The player must leave the game and is not allowed to participate for the next play. Additionally, if a player loses his helmet, he must not continue to participate in the play, in order to protect him from injury.
- Offensive players in the tackle box at the snap who are not in motion are allowed to block below the waist legally without restriction. All other players are restricted from blocking below the waist with a few exceptions (ex: straight-ahead blocks).
- Players will be prohibited from leaping over blockers in an attempt to block a punt.
- On onside kicks, any player on the receiving team is given the same kick-catch and fair-catch protection whether the ball is kicked directly off the tee or is immediately driven into the ground and bounces into the air.

The early storyline surrounded the Gators entering the game with a true freshman at quarterback, with Jacoby Brissett making his first career start despite not having taken a snap prior to this game. As the game started, however, the Gators never got into a rhythm offensively, nor could they stop the LSU offense, as the Tigers pounced on Florida early and never looked back. Brissett finished 8-of-14 for 94 yards, the touchdown to Debose and a pair of interceptions. Michael Gillislee led Florida in rushing with 56 yards on nine carries, while Rainey had 52 yards on 13 rushes. The Gators surrendered 453 yards of total offense to LSU: 215 through the air on just 14 passing attempts and 238 yards on the ground.

2010 | No. 14/12 FLORIDA 29, No. 12/9 LSU 33 (Gainesville) The No. 14/12 Florida Gators fell to No. 12/9 Louisiana State University Tigers, 33-29 in a down-to-the-wire finish. Redshirt junior quarterback John Brantley threw for 154 yards and went 16-for-24 with one interception. Brantley connected with six different receivers. Leading Florida's receiving corps was redshirt senior wide receiver Carl Moore, who caught four receptions for 95 yards. It was redshirt freshman wide receiver Andre Debose who stepped up for Florida with five returns for 154 yards. Debose returned one 88-yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to start the Gator comeback. The Gators came up big on special teams when Debose took it home for Florida with an 88-yard kick return for a touchdown, the second freshman ever in Florida history to return a kick for a touchdown.

2009 | No. 1 FLORIDA 13, No. 4 LSU 3 (Baton Rouge) No. 1 Florida Gators took down the No. 4 LSU Tigers, 13-3, extending the nation's longest active 15-game win streak on the road. The Gators held the Tigers to just 162 yards total offense. Senior quarterback Tim Tebow completed 11-of-16 passes and threw one touchdown in the victory. Junior tight end Aaron Hernandez led the UF receiving corps, reeling in six receptions for 70 yards, while sophomore athlete Jeff Demps amassed 86 yards on 16 carries to lead Florida on the ground. Gator sophomore kicker Caleb Sturgis put the Florida on the board first on the Gators' first drive of the game, giving UF a 3-0 advantage in the first quarter. In the second quarter, a failed fourth-down conversion for the Gators and a series of Florida penalties allowed the Tigers to advance 77 yards downfield for a field goal, knotting the score at three-all. Florida responded with an 80-yard touchdown drive from Tebow to senior Riley Cooper, that brought the Gators ahead, 10-3. Sturgis put the only points of the second half on the board with a fourth quarter field goal that extended the lead, 13-3.

2008 | No. 11 FLORIDA 51, No. 4 LSU 21 (Gainesville) Led by a stellar defense and an electrifying offensive charge, the Gators racked up 475 yards of offense, including 265 yards rushing against the Tigers. Junior Percy Harvin sparked the offensive charge for Florida, leading all receivers with 102 yards receiving after just the first quarter on his way to 112 total receiving yards, complimenting 13 yards rushing on the evening. Freshman Jeff Demps led all Florida rushers with 129 rushing yards. Junior linebacker Brandon Spikes led a defensive force that only allowed 88 yards rushing from the LSU offense, while tacking on two interceptions for 55 yards, the first two of his career, one good for a touchdown. Tim Tebow finished the game with 210 passing yards, going 14-of-21 with two touchdowns.

2007 | No. 9 FLORIDA 24, No. 1 LSU 28 (Baton Rouge) It came down to the final moments but the 9th-ranked Florida football team was downed by No. 1 LSU on the road, 28-24. Florida retained the lead throughout most of the game until a 2-yard touchdown run by LSU's Jacob Hester with 1:09 remaining sealed UF's second loss of the year. The Gators responded to the daunting task of facing the nation's No. 1 run defense and moved the ball effectively on the ground for 158 yards against a unit that had allowed just 39 yards per game this season. Kestahn Moore totaled a season-high 79 yards, averaging 6.6 yards on 12 carries. Tim Tebow finished the game with three total touchdowns, 158 yards passing and another 68 rushing. Defensive end Jermaine Cunningham garnered a career-high and team-best 17 tackles while defending two passes. True freshman safety Major Wright and sophomore linebacker Brandon Spikes recorded double digits in tackles with 11 each. True freshman cornerback Joe Haden recorded a career-high 10 tackles and registered his first career interception. Wide receiver Percy Harvin added four more receptions to his team-leading total of 32.

ABOUT THE OPPONENT

Louisiana State University, located in Baton Rouge, is in its eighth season of football under head coach Les Miles. Miles has guided the Tigers to a 79-18 record and claimed a BCS National Championship and two SEC Championships.

The Tigers return 14 starters from last season, six on offense, five on defense and three on special teams. The offense is led by a formidable rushing attack, as running backs Kenny Hilliard and Alfred Blue each have over 40 carries and are averaging 7.3 and 6.8 yards per rush, respectively.

LSU's defense is as strong as ever, spearheaded by a stout defensive line. Returning starters Sam Montgomery, Bennie Logan and Barkevious Mingo form one of the best units in the country. Junior safety Eric Reid leads a young but talented secondary.

- With the 38-0 victory, Florida extended its winning streak over Kentucky to 26-straight games, marking the longest active win-streak in the nation in a current series against a major conference
 - 43 – Notre Dame over Navy, 1964-2006
 - 36 – Nebraska over Kansas, 1969-2004
 - 26 – Tennessee over Kentucky, 1985-2011
 - 26 – Florida over Kentucky, 1987-present
- The 38-0 shutout against Kentucky marked the Gators' first SEC shutout since a 52-0 win over Mississippi State on Sept. 29, 2001 in Gainesville. The shutout is head coach Will Muschamp's second as head coach of the Gators (first was 39-0 on Sept. 10 vs. UAB at home as he became quickest UF head coach to record a shutout)
- It marked the first time UK had been shut out since Oct. 14, 2006 (vs. LSU; 49-0). The Gators last shut out the Wildcats Sept. 28, 1996 (65-0 in Gainesville)
- Florida has outscored its opponents, 64-13, in the second half this season, including 34-0 in the fourth quarter
- Florida held UK to just 60 yards passing, the lowest for an opponent since Oct. 16, 2010 versus Mississippi State (33 yards)
- The Florida defense has had two or more interceptions in three of its four games so far this season, with a season-best three against UK
- Three Gator defenders (De'Ante Saunders, Jaylen Watkins, Mike Taylor) came up with INTs Saturday against Kentucky, the most since the Jan. 1, 2011 Outback Bowl versus Penn State when Ahmad Black, Moses Jenkins, Brandon Hicks and Cody Riggs all tallied at least one interception (Black with two), for a total of five INTs that day
- Florida's three interceptions in the second quarter marked the most in a quarter since UF had three against FSU in the third quarter on Nov. 15, 2006 (Reggie Nelson, Tremaine McCollum and Ryan Smith)
- Watkins' 26-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter made it five-consecutive years that the Gators have scored a non-offensive touchdown against the Wildcats

- Florida put together a 15-play, 72-yard scoring drive in the third quarter that took 9:03. It was the longest scoring (by TOP) for UF since 1993 vs. Georgia (10:57, 21 plays, 80 yards).
- Kentucky had six first downs in the first quarter, and only had six first downs the remainder of the game
- Saturday marked sophomore quarterback Jeff Driskel's first career start at quarterback in The Swamp. Driskel started UF's season-opener against Bowling Green, but lined up at wide receiver
- Driskel kicked off UF's first scoring drive with a career-long 38-yard rush, followed by a seven-yard advance by senior Mike Gillislee. The Gators capped the drive off with a 27-yard field-goal from kicker Caleb Sturgis to put Florida up, 3-0, with 5:18 remaining in the first quarter. For Sturgis, the FG was his sixth-consecutive make before a 39-yard attempt was blocked in the second quarter
- Florida had nine explosive plays (10+ yard run/20+ yard pass) on offense against UK:
 - 1st – Driskel 38-yard rush
 - 1st – Driskel to Hammond 24-yard reception
 - 2nd – Gillislee 11-yard rush
 - 2nd – Driskel to Hines 52-yard reception
 - 2nd – Driskel to Reed 25-yard reception

- In the last five meetings between UF and UK, Florida holds a 97-3 scoring advantage over Kentucky in the first quarter (28-0 in 2008, 31-0 in 2009, 14-0 in 2010, 21-3 in 2011 and 3-0 in 2012)
- The scoreless first quarter for the Wildcats marked the 17th-straight game for UK with no offensive touchdowns in the first quarter
- Kentucky turned the ball over on downs twice in the first quarter, and the Gators capitalized on a missed 53-yard UK field goal late in the first quarter with a one-yard touchdown run from Gillislee to kick off the second quarter and go up, 10-0
- For Gillislee, the touchdown marked his fifth rushing score of the season, his 15th career rushing TD and his 18th overall career touchdown. Gillislee has had at least one touchdown in three of UF's four games so far this season
- De'Ante 'Pop' Saunders picked off UK quarterback Morgan Newton at the 10:09 mark in the second quarter for his first interception of the season – the third of his career – and returned the ball 29 yards
- Junior defensive back Jaylen Watkins then snagged his first career interception as a Gator for Florida's second INT in the second quarter, returning it 26 yards for a defensive score to put UF up 17-0 with 8:24 remaining in the first half
- Driskel connected with senior tight end Omarius Hines with just over three minutes remaining in the first half for a career-long 52-yard reception for Hines, while Driskel then hooked up with junior tight end Jordan Reed for a 25-yard pass with just over a minute remaining in the first half
- Driskel found Quinton Dunbar in the end zone for a 19-yard touchdown catch to put the Gators ahead, 23-0, entering the locker room. It was Dunbar's first touchdown of the season and third of his career
- Before time expired in the half, sophomore linebacker Mike Taylor recorded his second career interception - both against Kentucky - and first of the season, and returned it 10-yards, marking UF's third interception on the day & in the quarter, and the third by a different defender
- Driskel punched in a one-yard score – the first rushing TD of his career – with 2:50 remaining in the third quarter to put Florida up, 31-0
- Sophomore quarterback Jacoby Brissett added a one-yard rushing score for the Gators with 6:47 remaining in the fourth quarter, his first rushing score of the season and the third of his career, as UF took a 38-0 lead

FLORIDA'S OFFENSE

- 12 of the 16 players who started in the first four games have had previous starting experience. QB Jeff Driskel started the first game lined up as a WR and got his first career start at QB at Texas A&M in week two. TE Clay Burton earned his first career start at Texas A&M. True freshman RB Matt Jones earned his first career start at Tennessee. True Freshman WR Raphael Andrades started against Kentucky.
- Florida totaled 555 yards of offense (8.8 per play) at Tennessee in Week 3, the most yards UF has amassed in a conference game since Nov. 3, 2001 against Vanderbilt (571 yards). The 555 total yards were the third-most ever allowed by the Vols at Neyland Stadium and the most since Washington State had 618 yards in 1988. (Vanderbilt had 587 yards in 1981)
- At Tennessee, Florida totaled 227 yards of offense in the third quarter on just 15 plays, averaging 15.1 yards per play in the quarter.
- Florida scored 37+ points in back-to-back conference games (38 vs. Kentucky, 37 at Tennessee) for the first time since 2008 (42 vs. Vanderbilt, 56 vs. South Carolina).
- The Gators put up 37 points at Tennessee and 20 points at Texas A&M. In 2011, the Gators scored 20 points only one time on the road (48 at Kentucky, Sept. 24).
- The 37 points at Tennessee were the most scored by UF in Knoxville since a 43-30 win on Oct. 13, 1984.
- The Gators have scored points in 15 of 16 (93.8%) quarters this season. UF scored a TD in 10 of 16 (62.5%) quarters.
- In the second half of games this season, the Gators have outscored the opposition, 64-13, in the second half.

- In back-to-back SEC road games, the Gators overcame second-half deficits to win and outscored Texas A&M and Tennessee 37-6 after the break.
- The Gators trailed 20-13 at Tennessee early in the third quarter, but reeled off 24 unanswered points in the second half to take the victory. UF was outscored 17-7 in the first half at Texas A&M, but shut the Aggies out in the second half and scored 13 unanswered after the break. Florida outscored BGSU, 27-7, over the final three quarters in the season opener.
- Florida has had 49 offensive drives this season and scored points on 21 drives (43% - 13 TD, 8 FG). This includes three drives that the UF sustained drives to run out the clock at the end of games (A&M, UT, UK).
- At Tennessee in Week 3, all four of the Gators' touchdown drives were three plays or less.
- On the season, Florida has averaged 34:47 time of possession, compared to 25:13 for its opponents. UF's TOP ranks 8th nationally.
- The Gators' average TOP on scoring drives is 2:47, the highest in the SEC.
- Against Kentucky, UF's TOP of 37:41 was the best since the 2006 BCS National Championship Game (40:48, 1/8/07 vs. Ohio State).
- Florida had a touchdown drive that lasted 15 plays and covered 72 yards while running 9:03 off the clock against Kentucky, capped by a Driskel 1-yard TD run. It was the longest scoring (by TOP) for UF since 1993 vs. Georgia (10:57, 21 plays, 80 yards).
- In the two road wins, UF has dominated the time of possession in the second half. At Tennessee, UF had the ball 18:23 after the break, including 11:41 in the fourth quarter. At TAMU, the Gators controlled the clock for 20:05 in the second half, 11:09 in the third quarter and 8:56 in the fourth quarter.
- At Tennessee, the Gators got the ball back with 5:46 remaining in the game and managed to run the remaining time off the clock to secure the win.
- On the final offensive drive at Texas A&M, Florida got the ball with 3:13 on the clock and a 20-17 lead, while the Aggies still had all three timeouts. UF was able to end the game with an 8-play, 50-yard drive that ran the clock out.
- The Gators have scored on 13-of-14 (93%) red zone chances and scored touchdowns on 8-of-14 (57%) red zone chances. In 2011, UF converted 32 of 37 (86%) red zone opportunities into points, including 18 of 37 (49%) TD in the red zone.
- UF has completed 69.4 percent of its pass attempts this season. The Florida QBs had a 56.9 completion percentage last season.
- Florida has averaged 12.4 yards per completion in its first four games. UF averaged 13.26 yards per pass completion in 2011, second-best in the SEC and 18th in the nation in 2011.
- In its first four games, UF rushed for 898 yards and averaged 5.0 yards per carry. In 2011, the Gators rushed for 1,859 yards and averaged 4.0 yards per carry as a team.
- Against Tennessee, the Gators rushed for 336 yards and averaged 7.8 yards per carry, the fourth-best average nationally in a conference match up this year.
- Also against the Vols, UF became the first team in the nation this season to have three players rush for 80 or more yards in a conference game (Gillislee-115, Burton-91, Driskel-81). Marshall is the only other team to do so (against Rice, 9/22) in a league game.
- The Gators have converted 23-of-58 (40%) third-down attempts this season. Florida converted 51 of 159 (32%) third downs last season.
- Against Kentucky, UF converted 12-of-17 third downs. 12 conversions are the second-most in a game nationally this year. It is the most by UF since the 2008 BCS National Championship Game against Oklahoma (12-for-17).
- Florida has converted 3-of-5 (60%) fourth-down attempts. In 2011, UF attempted 11 fourth-downs and converted six times (55%).
- The Gators have run 263 plays (65.8 per game) and averaged 6.2 yards per play this season. Last season, the Gators ran 789 plays (60.7 per game) and totaled 4,273 yards of offense (5.4 yards per play). UF's 60.7 plays per game in 2011 were the fewest in the nation.
- The Gators have 42 explosive plays (10.5 per game) and have had at least eight in each game. Florida had nine explosives against Kentucky, 15 at Tennessee, 10 explosive plays at Texas A&M and eight explosive plays against Bowling Green. UF had 101 explosive plays (7.8 per game) last season.
- Coach Muschamp has indicated that turnover ratio and big plays are keys to success.

- UF is tied for sixth nationally with three pass plays of 50+ yards. Last year, the Gators totaled six such plays for the entire season.
- Florida has lost just one fumble on the season, second-best in the SEC.
- Opponents have not scored any points off of UF turnovers this season.
- At Tennessee, the Gators exploded for 15 big plays (10 runs, 5 passes), including nine plays of 20 or more yards. Seven different players had an explosive play: Driskel (4), Burton (3), Gillislee (2), Patton (2), Reed (2), Dunbar (1) and Hammond (1).
- Against Texas A&M, five different players had a reception of more than 10 yards. Four players had multiple receptions in the game.
- New offensive coordinator **BRENT PEASE** took the reins after leading the Boise State offense in 2011. Last season, the Boise offense averaged 44.2 points and 481.3 yards per game en route to a 12-1 record and a 56-24 victory in the Las Vegas Bowl over Arizona State. Pease also coached quarterbacks last season at Boise.
- Under Pease's guidance, the 2011 BSU offense ranked in the top 10 nationally in the following categories:

- The Gators will strive to have a balanced attack on offense. Last year, Coach Pease guided a Boise State offense that ran 51 percent rushing plays and 49 percent passing plays. In comparison, UF ran 59 percent of the time in 2011 and passed 41 percent of the time.

RUNNING BACKS

- On the season, the running backs have 674 yards on 121 carries (5.6 avg) with 7 touchdowns.
- Florida has rushed for 566 yards in the second half of games this season, the seventh-best total in the nation.
- The Gators rushed for 200 yards and 3 touchdowns against Kentucky, marking the fifth time under Muschamp that UF has rushed for 200 or more yards and the third time this season. Against Bowling Green, Florida rushed for 220 yards.
- Florida rushed for 336 yards at Tennessee, averaging 7.8 yards per carry, the fourth-best average nationally in a conference game this season. The Gator running back group rushed for 218 yards on 27 carries at Tennessee, averaging 8.1 yards per carry.
- Taking out yards lost for sacks and kneeldowns, Florida rushed 38 times for 199 yards at Texas A&M, averaging 5.2 yards per carry.
- In the first four games, UF has had 31 runs of 10-plus yards (7.8 per game). Last season, Florida had 64 runs of 10-plus yards on the season (4.9 per game).
- Junior **MIKE GILLISLEE** has been the workhorse for the Florida offense, totaling 69 carries and for 402 yards with 5 touchdowns, both second-best in the SEC.
- Gillislee's 56 carries through the first three games equaled the total number of carries that he had all of 2011. He now has 214 carries for 1,322 yards and 15 touchdowns in his career.
- Gillislee recorded his second career 100-yard game and second of the season with 18 carries for 115 yards (6.4 avg) at Tennessee.
- With two touchdowns in each of the first two games, Gillislee was the first Gator to rush for at least two touchdowns in two-straight games since Tim Tebow rushed for three scores against Georgia on Nov. 1, 2008 and two touchdowns against Vanderbilt a week later. Tebow actually did it in three games in a row in 2008 — Kentucky, Georgia and Vanderbilt (10/25, 11/1, 11/8) and in 2007 — Troy, Tennessee and Ole Miss (9/8, 9/15, 9/22).
- Gillislee surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for his career with his first career 100-yard rushing game in the season opener against Bowling Green. He rushed for 148 yards on 24 carries with two scores. He scored UF's first touchdown of the season on a 15-yard run and then added a 38-yard TD less than five minutes later.
- Gillislee is just the sixth Gator RB since 1996 to run for 148 yards or more in a game (Fred Taylor 3 times, Ciattrick Fason 3 times, Earnest Graham 3 times; Jeff Demps twice; Bo Carroll 1 time)
- Against BGSU, Gillislee averaged at least 6.0 yards per carry for the 15th time in 27 games in which he carried the ball. His 24 carries and 148 yards both set career highs.
- Sophomore **TREY BURTON** is listed as a running back, but will see action all over the field on offense and special teams. Burton has seen time at quarterback, fullback, wide receiver, tight end, h-back and on kickoff and punt coverage.
- At Tennessee, Burton exploded for a career-long 80-yard touchdown run and totaled 91 rushing yards on three carries with two scores. He also had two receptions for 38 yards, including a

career-long 32-yarder. Burton is the only player in the country to have an 80-yard rush and 30-yard reception in the same game this season.

- Burton has 566 rushing yards with 16 rushing TD and 425 receiving yards and 2 receiving TD in his career. He has scored a TD every 7.3 rushes in his career. His 16 rushing touchdowns is sixth among active SEC players.
- In 2010, Burton set a UF record and an SEC freshman record, by scoring six TD in a single game against Kentucky (5 rushing, 1 receiving). Six TD in a single game were the most for any player in the nation since Middle Tennessee's Phillip Tanner scored six against North Texas in 2008.
- Burton scored 12 of UF's 40 TD (30 percent) in 2010 and earned his place in the UF record books along the way.

- True freshman **MATT JONES**, a 6-2, 226-lb back from Tampa, earned the first start of his career at Tennessee and has rushed for 81 yards on 23 carries. Jones is the biggest running back at Florida since DeShawn Wynn in 2005 (Wynn was listed at 5-11, 228 lbs as a senior).
- Redshirt freshman **MACK BROWN** has 15 carries for 63 yards on the season. He played a key role in helping the Gators run the clock on the final drive at Texas A&M, rushing four times for 11 yards while UF ran 3:13 off the clock.
- Against Kentucky, Brown rushed 4 times for 31 yards, averaging 7.8 yards per carry with a long of 11 yards.
- Brown has 30 carries for 128 yards in his career.
- With 2:09 remaining in the first quarter against UAB in 2011, freshman **HUNTER JOYER** scored a three-yard TD on his first career carry, becoming the fourth Gator since 2008 to score a TD on his first career carry (Javier Estopinan, 2008; Trey Burton, 2010; Jordan Reed, 2010).
- Joyer has 20 carries for 83 yards with two TD in his career. He has not had a rush for lost yardage in his career. Against Florida State in 2011, Joyer set three career-highs: 3 rushes for 30 yards with a long of 23 yards.
- Sophomore **CHRIS JOHNSON** transitioned from linebacker to running back during the spring of 2012. Johnson played running back in high school, signed to play at UF as a safety, moved to linebacker in 2011 and finally has settled at running back for this season.
- Johnson got his first carries of the season against Kentucky, rushing 5 times for 35 yards (7.0 average) with a long of 17 yards.

QUARTERBACKS

- On the season, Florida has completed 69.4 percent of its passes and averaged 12.4 yards per completion. The Florida QB Rating is 154.93 (59-of-85, 732 yards, 4 TD, 1 INT).
- Sophomore **JEFF DRISKEL** ranks seventh in the SEC in pass efficiency (158.02). On the season, Driskel is 55-of-79 (69.6%) passing for 698 yards with 4 touchdowns and one interception. In his career, he is 71-of-113 for 846 yards with 4 touchdowns and 3 interceptions.
- Against Kentucky, Driskel completed passes to 10 different receivers and totaled 203 yards with 1 touchdown and his first interception of the season. He also rushed for 35 yards on 8 attempts.
- Driskel led his second come-from-behind road win in as many weeks, completing 14-of-20 passes for 219 yards and 2 touchdowns without an interception at Tennessee. He connected on 25- and 75-yard touchdown passes and had a passer rating of 195.0, the highest for a Florida quarterback on the road in a conference game since Tim Tebow had a 202.7 rating at Kentucky in 2007.
- Driskel also rushed for a career-high 81 yards on 8 carries. He has 25 rushes for 113 yards on the season.
- Driskel made his first career start at quarterback on the road at Texas A&M and led the team to a road win in its SEC opener. Driskel completed 13-of-16 passes for 162 yards and did not turn the ball over.
- Against Bowling Green, Driskel completed 10-of-16 passes for 114 yards, including a 50-yard touchdown pass to Frankie Hammond.
- Driskel made his first career start against BGSU, lining up at wide receiver, and proceeded to play the rest of the first quarter at quarterback.
- Driskel made his Gator debut in the 2011 season opener against FAU, completing 4-of-6 passes for 42 yards. On the season, Driskel was 16-of-34 for 148 yards with 2 interceptions. Against

Alabama, Driskel scrambled for 31 yards, the third-longest run given up by the Tide last season.

- **JACOBY BRISSETT** started the opener at quarterback and completed 3-of-5 passes for 31 yards. In his career, he is 21-of-44 passing for 237 yards with 2 touchdowns and 4 interceptions.
- Brissett scored his third career rushing touchdown on a one-yard keeper against Kentucky.
- Brissett became the first true freshman in school history to take his first career snap as the starter, getting the nod at LSU in 2011. He became just the fifth true freshman quarterback to start in UF history, joining Wayne Peace (1980), Donald Douglas (1989), Jesse Palmer (1997) and Chris Leak (2003).
- Brissett completed 8-of-14 passes for 94 yards with 1 TD and 2 INT against LSU in his first career start. His scoring pass was a 65-yard completion to Andre Debose, the longest TD pass by a true freshman in his first start. For the season, he was 18-of-39 for 206 yards with 2 TDs and 4 interceptions (86.93 rating).
- Brissett entered the FSU game after Brantley suffered an injury and completed 4-of-13 passes for 27 yards, including a 9-yard TD strike to Quinton Dunbar.
- Brissett completed his only pass attempt against Vanderbilt for 40 yards to Omarius Hines, and also scored his first career rushing TD on his only carry.
- Redshirt sophomore **TYLER MURPHY** made his collegiate debut against UAB last season but did not record any statistics.
- True freshman **SKYLER MORNHINWEG** arrived in June after a stellar career at St. Joseph's Prep in Philadelphia. He is the son of Philadelphia Eagles' Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator Marty Mornhinweg.

WIDE RECEIVERS/TIGHT ENDS

- On the season, five different players have caught at least six passes. The team has averaged 12.4 yards per reception.
- 10 different players caught a pass against Kentucky and four players caught at least three passes.
- At Tennessee, Florida averaged 15.6 yards per completion, the third-highest by an SEC team in a conference game this season.
- Senior **FRANKIE HAMMOND, JR.** leads all wide receivers with 205 yards on 9 catches and has 2 touchdowns on the season. 6 of his 9 catches have resulted in first downs, with 5 catches converting third downs. He has 50 catches for 719 yards and 5 touchdowns in his career.
- Hammond's two 50+ yard catches on the season ranks tied for fourth in the nation.
- At Tennessee, Hammond made a huge play on third down in the fourth quarter. UT blitzed and Driskel hit Hammond on a stop route about 5 yards downfield. Hammond turned up the middle of the field and broke free for a 75-yard score.
- Hammond reeled in a 50-yard touchdown pass from Driskel in the season opener against Bowling Green. He caught the ball on a simple 10-yard stop route, escaped a tackle and took it the distance for his fourth-career touchdown.
- He had 15 catches for 181 yards last season, with 10 catches resulting in first downs and 6 catches converting on third downs.
- Sophomore **QUINTON DUNBAR** has 10 receptions for 109 yards this season, with 4 catches for 10+ yards. In his career, he has 24 catches for 325 yards and 3 touchdowns.
- Dunbar caught his first touchdown pass of the season on a 19-yard strike against Kentucky in the second quarter.
- Dunbar had 3 catches for 30 yards at Tennessee and has 10 catches on 14 targets this season.
- Junior **SOLOMON PATTON** has appeared in 26 games and recorded eight catches for 79 yards in his career. This season, he has rushed 7 times for 71 yards, averaging 10.1 yards per carry.
- At Tennessee, Patton made a critical 17-yard catch for a first down that led to a Florida field goal. He also had 3 carries for 34 yards on the night.
- Patton totaled 31 yards on 3 carries at Texas A&M, including a key 12-yard rush that gained a first down and helped UF ice the game in the fourth quarter.
- Junior **ANDRE DEBOSE** has yet to record a catch this season. He has been a factor on special teams though, averaging 24.2 yards per kick return and 9.6 yards per punt return, ranking sixth in the SEC.
- True freshman **LATROY PITTMAN** has 2 catches for 6 yards this season.
- Junior tight end **JORDAN REED** leads the team with 16 catches for 193 yards this season. He tied his career-high with 5 catches at Tennessee (60 yards) and at Texas A&M (59 yards). Reed scored his first touchdown of the season at Tennessee on a 23-yard reception from Driskel.
- His 16 catches on the season ranks fifth nationally among tight ends and second in the SEC. 152 receiving yards ranks ninth nationally among tight ends and second in the SEC.
- Reed has 50 catches for 579 yards in his career, with 4 receiving touchdowns.
- Reed has been targeted 20 times on the season and caught 16 passes. 8 of his receptions have resulted in first downs, and he has 9 receptions of 10+ yards (4 of 20+).
- Senior **OMARIUS HINES** has 47 catches for 651 yards in his career and two TD. He has proven to be a viable running threat as well, averaging 10.0 yards on 18 carries and scoring two TD.
- Against Kentucky, Hines caught a career-long 52-yard pass from Driskel.
- Hines, a native of Corsicana, Texas, provided the game-changing moment in his return to Texas at A&M. Trailing 17-13, Hines reeled in a 39-yard pass from Driskel and the Gators scored a touchdown two plays later to take the lead for good.
- In the opener, Hines did not catch a pass but rushed four times for 14 yards.
- Sophomore **CLAY BURTON** made his first career start at Texas A&M and recorded his first career catch against Kentucky. He appeared in one game as a true freshman last season while making the transition to tight end.
- Sophomore **TEVIN WESTBROOK** switched from defensive end to tight end in the summer after seeing action in three games and recording two tackles as a freshman.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- The Gators used the starting offensive line of LT Xavier Nixon, LG James Wilson, C Jon Harrison, RG Jon Halapio and RT Chaz Green in each of the first two games. Kyle Koehne started at RT at Tennessee and against Kentucky in place of Green.
- UF did not allow a sack at Tennessee in Week 3.
- Florida used eight offensive linemen in the opener against BGSU with only two seniors. Against the Falcons, Xavier Nixon graded out the highest among offensive linemen at 93. Jon Halapio was second at 88.
- Left tackle **XAVIER NIXON** is the most experienced Gator on the offensive line with 26 starts for UF. In 2009, he became the first true freshman to start at left tackle for UF since Reggie Green did so in 1992. The last true freshman to start at either tackle position was Mo Collins at right tackle in 1995.
- Senior **JAMES WILSON** earned the start at left guard in the first four games. He has appeared in 42 games with 10 starts in his career. Named the team's Offensive Player of the Game against Kentucky.
- Junior **JON HARRISON** transitioned to center in the spring of 2011 and has started 18 games in his career, including all 13 games in 2011. He played guard his first two years on campus (redshirted in 2009). He made his debut in 2010 in the opener and played all 13 games, starting once at left guard in the Outback Bowl.
- Junior guard **JON HALAPIO** has started every game this season and graded out a team-best 86 percent at Texas A&M. He started seven games in 2010 at right guard and started all 13 games in 2011 at the same spot. He played in three games in 2009 before redshirting. He was named to the 2010 Sporting News All-Freshman Team.
- Sophomore **CHAZ GREEN** earned his first career start against FAU in 2011, lining up at right tackle. He has 10 starts at right tackle and one at left tackle in his career.
- Junior tackle **MATT PATCHAN** has yet to play this season due to injury. He has eight starts in 27 career games.
- Junior **KYLE KOEHNE** will be a regular in the rotation this season, seeing time at multiple positions along the line. He earned his first start of the season at Tennessee and also started against Kentucky, both times at right tackle. Graded out the highest among offensive linemen against Tennessee at 88 percent.
- True freshman **D.J. HUMPHRIES**, an early enrollee last spring, has seen time at tackle in each of the first four games.
- The offensive line has paved the way for an average of 5.0 yards per carry since the start of the 2008 season. UF's yard per carry ranks 12th in the nation during the same time span.

FLORIDA'S DEFENSE

- The Gator defense has not allowed any points in the fourth quarter this season and has outscored its opponents by a 34-0 count in the final period. UF is the only team in the SEC to not allow any fourth quarter points.
- UF's defense of 4.82 yards per passing attempt ranks 5th nationally and the squad has surrendered just two passing scores to tie for 11th in the country. In addition, UF's pass efficiency defense ranks 4th in the nation.
- In the second half of games this season, the Gators have essentially shut down their opponents. Through four games, UF has outscored the opposition, 64-13, in the second half.

- In the first four games, UF has limited opponents to a combined 5-for-28 (.179) on third downs in the second half and 1-for-16 (.063) in the fourth quarter. Tennessee was 0-for-4 in the final quarter and totaled five yards of offense. In fact, the Vols' final four possessions all ended in punts, including three-straight three-and-outs. Kentucky's four possessions in the second half each ended with a punt.

- Through four games, Florida's opponent third-down efficiency of .290 (18-for-62) ranks 21st.
- Florida's defense has notched 2 or more interceptions in three of its four games this year and has totaled 5 picks in the last two outings. UF has 6 interceptions through four games in 2012, while the team totaled just 8 interceptions in 13 games in 2011.
- A total of three Gator defenders (De'Ante Saunders, Jaylen Watkins, Mike Taylor) came up with INTs against Kentucky, the most since the 2011 Outback Bowl versus Penn State, when Ahmad Black, Moses Jenkins, Brandon Hicks and Cody Riggs all tallied at least one interception (Black with two), for a total of 5 INTs that day.
- Florida's 3 interceptions in the second quarter versus the Wildcats marked the team's most in a quarter since 3 against Florida State in the third quarter on Nov. 25, 2006 (Reggie Nelson, Tremaine McCollum and Ryan Smith).
- Florida is +5 in turnover margin after three interceptions in the shutout of Kentucky and converted a pair of picks into touchdowns at Tennessee.
- The 38-0 shutout of Kentucky marked the Gators' first SEC shutout since Sept. 29, 2001, a 52-0 win over Mississippi State in Gainesville.
- The Gators held Kentucky to 60 yards passing on 27 attempts (2.2 avg.) and allowed one completion over 12 yards. The 60-yard total was the lowest for an opponent since Oct. 16, 2010, against Mississippi State (33 yards).
- Florida did not allow Kentucky to enter the red zone all game, the first time since 2008 (vs. South Carolina) that UF kept an SEC opponent out of the red zone.
- UT entered the game against Florida averaging 43 points per game. The Gators surrendered just 20 points to the Vols, including six in the second half.
- Although Tennessee's offense entered the game ranked 2nd in the SEC and 15th nationally with 541.0 yards per game, the Gators held them to 201 yards below their average. UF held UT to 37 total yards over the final 20 minutes of the game.
- UT led the league and was tied for 9th in the country in passing offense (353.5 avg.) and was held to 257 yards for the game and 104 yards in the second half by UF.
- Florida totaled 7 quarterback hurries at Tennessee and ended Tyler Bray's streak of 65 consecutive passes without an interception when Lereatee McCray picked off Bray in the first quarter.
- UF limited Tennessee to 83 yards rushing on 28 attempts (3.0 avg.) and just three of the Vols' 19 first downs came on the ground. During the Gators' eight-game winning streak in the series, UT has averaged just 2.0 yards per carry and has been out-gained, 1,419-408.
- After scoring a field goal and two touchdowns to begin the game, Texas A&M did not score on its final seven possessions of the game. UF forced six-straight punts in the second half, including four three-and-outs.

- Florida held Texas A&M to 334 yards of total offense, including just 65 yards in the second half. The last time that a team coached by Kevin Sumlin was held to less than 335 yards was against Air Force on Dec. 31, 2009. Houston was held to 331 yards against the Falcons.
- UF totaled three sacks for 16 yards lost in College Station, matching the highest total allowed by Texas A&M the last two years. The Aggies permitted nine sacks during the entire 2011 season.
- No SEC defense has forced more turnovers than the Gators since the 2000 season. Florida's 325 turnovers in that span are 9 more than the next closest SEC team.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Gators look to get more pressure from the defensive line this season under the direction of defensive coordinator Dan Quinn and defensive line coach Bryant Young. In 2010, UF had just 21 sacks, the fewest for a Florida team since 2002 (20 sacks). In 2011, Florida totaled 28 sacks and set a season high with six sacks against Ohio State in the Gator Bowl. UF has had 15 sacks in the past six games, including five this season.
- Quinn came to UF after serving as the defensive line coach for the Seattle Seahawks for two seasons. Florida looked to bring a lot of pressure from the defensive line, as the Seahawks ranked sixth in the NFC in total sacks (37.0), with 24.0 of them coming from the defensive line. Seattle had 13 different players record at least one sack in 2010, led by end Chris Clemons, who ranked seventh in the NFC with 11.0 sacks.
- The 2012 defensive line is led by a veteran group of players. Senior **OMAR HUNTER** and junior **SHARRIF FLOYD** have combined for 38 career starts and anchor the interior of the line. Junior **DOMINIQUE EASLEY** has 15 starts in his career and plays both inside and outside on the line. Junior **RONALD POWELL** has 13 career starts but tore his ACL in the spring game and is sidelined.
- Floyd is second on the Gators with 3.5 TFL and had 1.5 TFL and four tackles at Tennessee. He has 16 tackles on the season, the second-most among defensive linemen.
- Easley came through with the Gators' first sack of the year against Bowling Green, had six tackles in the win at Texas A&M and two quarterback hurries in Knoxville.
- Hunter has 22 career starts (11 in 2009, 6 in 2010, 1 in 2011, 4 in 2012), the third-most among Florida defenders. Following his career-high 8 tackles against Kentucky, he was named the SEC's Defensive Lineman of the Week. Hunter has 88 total tackles in his career and 7 TFL.
- Senior **LERENTEE McCRAY** has nine career starts at linebacker but has moved to the BUCK position. McCray came through with a key third-down sack in the fourth quarter at Texas A&M and also forced a fumble, then notched his first career interception and had a 25-yard return to set up the Gators' first TD at Tennessee. McCray also pressured Tyler Bray into throwing his second interception of the game in the third quarter.
- Redshirt junior **EARL OKINE**, who saw action in all 13 games last year, has collected four tackles on the season.
- Sophomore **LEON ORR** set a career high with four tackles in the shutout of UK, two of which went for losses.
- Junior college transfer **DAMIEN JACOBS** enrolled at Florida last January and participated in spring practices. He will bolster the interior of the line by providing added depth in 2012.

LINEBACKERS

- The linebacker group is led by **JON BOSTIC** and **JELANI JENKINS** who provide solid, veteran leadership for the defense. Bostic has started 23 games in his career at middle linebacker, while Jenkins has 25 career starts at weakside linebacker.
- Bostic began the season with a game-high eight tackles against Bowling Green before adding five tackles and team-best two TFL with one sack at Texas A&M and five tackles at Tennessee. He has 191 tackles, 16.5 tackles-for-loss, 5.5 sacks and three picks in his career.
- Jenkins totaled 5 tackles and 1.0 TFL through the first two games before suffering an injury early against Texas A&M. He will miss 2-3 weeks while recovering.
- Sophomore **MICHAEL TAYLOR** had a season-best six tackles at Texas A&M, none bigger than nine-yard sack late in the second quarter which knocked the Aggies out of field-goal range. He added four tackles at Tennessee and had his second career interception against Kentucky.
- True freshman **ANTONIO MORRISON** enrolled in January of 2012 and participated in spring practice. He contributed right away with three tackles in the season opener. In his SEC debut, Morrison tied for second on the Gators with six tackles (five solo). He made his first career start at Tennessee and responded with five tackles, including one for a loss, before adding two more tackles against Kentucky.
- Junior **DARRIN KITCHENS** and sophomore **NEIRON BALL** split time at the SAM linebacker spot when the defense is in its regular package. Ball has 5 tackles and Kitchens has 2 on the season.
- Ball returned to the team after sitting out the 2011 season with a medical hardship.

SECONDARY

- Junior **MATT ELAM** is third on the Gators with 19 tackles, including a game-high 10 at Tennessee, with his first INT and sack of the campaign. He as 2 TFL and 2 PBU.
- **MARCUS ROBERSON** was first in the SEC after four games with 7 passes defended (6 PBU, 1 INT), while junior **JAYLEN WATKINS** is tied for fourth in the SEC with five passes defended (4 PBU, 1 INT).
- Watkins' 26-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter made it five-consecutive years that the Gators have scored a non-offensive touchdown against Kentucky. He has appeared in 27 games with 10 career starts, totaling 49 tackles, and he is second on the team with four pass breakups this year.
- In addition, Watkins' INT return marked the eighth-straight year that UF has returned a pick for an INT (dating back to 2004 season) and the Gators have returned one for six in 13 of the last 14 seasons.
- Junior **CODY RIGGS** forced a Bowling Green fumble on a punt return in the fourth quarter and had three tackles at Texas A&M. Riggs is sidelined for 2-3 weeks with a foot injury.
- Senior **JOSH EVANS**, who has 15 career starts, leads the squad 26 tackles (15 solo). Evans had a team-best 8 tackles at Texas A&M, 5 of which were solo, and had 7 at Tennessee. He has at least 5 tackles in every Gator contest this season.
- Sophomore **LOUCHEIZ PURIFOY** has moved into the defensive backfield rotation in 2012 after starring at special teams in 2011. Last season, Purifoy had a team-leading 22 special teams tackles as a true freshman and he made his first career start in the opener against BG.
- **DE'ANTE SAUNDERS** returned to action against Tennessee after missing the first two games. He had one tackle against the Vols and had his first pick of the season against Kentucky, which he returned 29 yards.
- Florida had 22 interceptions in 2010, tied for 4th in the nation, 9 of which were returned for 30-plus yards, including 4 TD. Florida's 538 interception return yards were the most in the country in 2010.
- The Gators have 6 INTs this season, 5 in the past two games, totaling 121 return yards.
- The Gator defense has had 22 interception returns of 30 or more yards since 2008, including nine in 2010, with 15 total coming from the secondary:

FLORIDA'S SPECIAL TEAMS

- D.J. Durkin is in his third season as the Gators' special teams' coordinator. In 2010, he helped UF finish second in the nation in net punting (40.9 yds). Florida's punt coverage unit allowed just 109 return yards on 51 punts. In 2011, UF allowed 99 punt return yards on 57 punts, fifth in the SEC and 30th nationally. Through four games, the Gators have allowed four yards on punt returns, tied for 14th in the country.
- The Gators returned a punt for TD via block or return for a school-record seventh straight year in 2011.

PUNTING

- The Gators rank 2nd in the SEC and 5th in the country in net punting with a 43.4 average.
- Sophomore **KYLE CHRISTY** ranks fourth in the SEC and is tied for 13th in the country with a 45.4-yard average punting. Five of his 17 punts this season have been 50 yards or longer, six have been inside of the 20-yard line and seven have been fair caught.
- At Tennessee, he averaged a career-best 48.6 yards per kick, including three of 50 yards or longer, and tied his season high of 55 yards in the first quarter.
- Christy averaged 47.2 yards on his five punts at Texas A&M, highlighted by a season-best boot of 55 yards in the fourth quarter that pinned the Aggies deep.
- His second career punt of 67 yards at Auburn was the longest by a Gator last year and tied for the third-longest on the road in school history.

KICKING

- Senior **CALEB STURGIS** is 8-for-10 (.800) on field-goal attempts this season and made multiple attempts in the first three games. He is 4-for-5 between 20-29 yards, 1-for-2 between 30-39 yards, 1-for-1 between 40-49 yards and 2-for-2 from beyond 50 yards. One of his two misses was blocked.
- After missing a 27-yarder in the fourth quarter of the season opener against Bowling Green, he had been successful on six-straight attempts before having a 39-yarder blocked versus UK.
- Sturgis has converted 110 of 115 (.957) point-after attempts in his career and is 54-for-70 (.771) on field-goal attempts. He has 272 total points in his career to rank third all-time at UF and is second in field goals made (54).
- Sturgis was 22-for-26 (.846) on field-goal attempts and 31-for-31 on extra points to hold the team lead with 97 points in '11. The Groza Award finalist tied for fourth nationally in field goals made and tied for 28th in kicking points in 2011.
- With 51-yarders against Bowling Green and Texas A&M that extended his own school record for successful kicks beyond 50 yards to seven, Sturgis' career FG from beyond 50 yards is tied among active kickers with Chris Boswell of Rice.
- Before missing a 52-yard attempt in the second quarter against Alabama last October, Sturgis had made 14-straight field goals dating back to 2010 (a streak that was third in school history). The school record for consecutive field goals made is 17, set by Bobby Raymond in 1984.
- Florida had a stretch of 17 field goals made in a row dating back to 2010 end against the Crimson Tide, the second-longest streak in school history.

- Sturgis returned to full health for the 2011 season after missing eight games with a back injury in 2010. He was a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award in 2009 after converting 22 of 30 (.733) field-goal attempts with a long of 56 yards (vs. Georgia).
- He became the sixth kicker in UF history to make at least three 50-yard field goals in his career (Berj Yepremian, 4; Jeff Chandler, Matt Leach, Chris Perkins and David Posey each had 3). Sturgis tied Yepremian for the top spot with a 55-yarder in the second quarter against Vanderbilt and

passed him with a 55-yarder against Furman last season.

- Sturgis handles kickoffs for the Gators and had 58 kicks for 3,851 yards and a 66.4 average in 2011, with 10 touchbacks and one out of bounds. In his career, he has averaged 64.6 yards per kickoff with 49 touchbacks, including 13 this season and 6-of-7 in Knoxville.
- **BRAD PHILLIPS** stepped in for Sturgis against Georgia last year and was 2-for-3 on field goals, making kicks of 43 and 40 yards after missing from 38 yards on the Gators' opening drive.

RETURN GAME

- Florida was the only school in nation to have two different players with a 99-yard kick return for touchdowns in 2011, as Jeff Demps had one against Georgia and **ANDRE DEBOSE** broke off a long scoring run versus Ohio State.
- Debose was one of four players nationally to have a punt return (career-long 32 yards) and a kick return (38 yards) longer than 30 yards on the opening weekend of the college football season.
- UF was one of six schools in the nation to have two different players with a KOR for TD during the 2011 season, joining Arkansas, Auburn, Minnesota, TCU and UNLV.
- After never having two kick returns for touchdowns in the same year in school history prior to 2010, Florida had multiple kickoff returns for TDs in 2010 and 2011. In fact, the Gators had just nine KOR for TD in school history prior to 2009 season and have five since.
- UF's five kick returns for scores since 2009 is tied for sixth-best total in the nation and the Gators' four KOR in the last three years is tied for third-best with Auburn, New Mexico, New Mexico State, Oklahoma State and Toledo behind Arizona State (6) and Kansas State (5).
- Florida returned five kickoffs for 200 yards against Georgia last October, the highest single-game average (40.0) in the SEC in the 2011 season and second-best nationally (Nebraska averaged 42.2 per return on Sept. 10, 2011, against Fresno State) when having five or more returns. UF's average versus the Bulldogs was its highest in records dating back to 1996 (more than two returns).
- In 2010, the Gators ranked sixth in the nation in kickoff return average (26.3 yds/return). Debose returned two kicks for TD, tied for second-most in the country, and averaged 28.0 yards per kick return, 15th-best in the nation and second-best in the SEC.
- Debose returned 19 kicks last season for 495 yards (26.1 avg.), including a 63-yarder against Georgia and a 99-yard touchdown return against Ohio State.
- Named the Most Valuable Player of the Gator Bowl, Debose's 99-yard TD in the second quarter was the longest play in the bowl's history and his third kickoff return for a score established a UF career mark.
- In 2010, Debose recorded an 88-yard kickoff return for a TD against LSU, marking the first for UF since Brandon James took one back in the 2009 season opener against Charleston Southern. Debose became the second freshman in UF history to have a kickoff return for a TD, joining Bo Carroll, who accomplished the feat in 1997.
- Debose then took the opening kickoff vs. South Carolina back for a 99-yard TD, setting a UF single-season record with his second kickoff return for a TD and tying the school's career record (Bo Carroll, Stacey Simmons).
- Debose tied the UF single-game record with 159 kickoff return yards vs. South Carolina (Tony Lomack, vs. Kentucky, Nov. 18, 1989) in 2010. Debose's 154 vs. LSU in 2010 marked the third-highest single-game total in UF history. Chris Rainey totaled 148 vs. Georgia in 2011, which is the fourth-highest in team history.
- **SOLOMON PATTON** had a season-high 33-yard kickoff return against Alabama last October and also had career highs in kick returns (5) and kick return yardage (132) versus the Crimson Tide. He had 10 returns for 241 yards last season (24.1 avg.).

BLOCKED KICKS

- Florida has blocked six kicks in Will Muschamp's first 17 games as a head coach. **SOLOMON PATTON** blocked an FAU punt in the 2011 season opener that was returned 22 yards for a touchdown. The score marked the school-record seventh-straight year that the Gators had returned a punt for a TD via a block or return. It marked the second-straight contest that Patton had blocked a punt (2011 Outback Bowl vs. Penn State).
- **SHARRIF FLOYD** collected his first career block by swatting a 32-yard FG attempt by Vanderbilt. It was the Gators' first field-goal block last year and first since versus Kentucky in 2010. **DOMINIQUE EASLEY** notched his first-ever block by getting his hand on a Furman punt last year.

FAMILY TRADITION

- **JOHN CROFOOT**, who serves as the holder on the field-goal unit, and younger brother, **KYLE CROFOOT**, are the fourth and fifth members of the Crofoot family to serve as special-teamers at SEC schools, following brothers Clayton (Auburn, 2008-09), Chas (Auburn, 2004-05) and Ike (South Carolina, 2003-06).

- The Gators opened the season ranked No. 23 in the AP Preseason Poll and No. 23 in the USA Today Preseason Coaches' Poll. Florida will play four teams ranked in the top 10 of the preseason polls.
- Florida was ranked in the USA Today Preseason Poll for the 22nd year in a row. During that 22-year span, Florida opened the season ranked in the top 10 19 times, including earning the top spot three times (1997, 2001, 2009).
- UF has been ranked in each of the past nine AP preseason polls, dating back to 2003. That streak ranks third in the SEC behind LSU (12-straight preseason polls) and UGA (11-straight preseason polls).

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored its opponents by a combined 5,685 to 2,186 at home, putting the average outcome at 40.0 to 15.3 in favor of the Gators and making the average outcome a 24.7-point win.
- The Gators had two significant winning streaks at The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23-game streak from 1990-93 and a 30-game streak from 1994-99. In 140 home games from 1990-2011, UF has scored 31 or more points 97 times and held its opponent to 14 or less points 77 times.

IN THE STANDS

- The Gators sold out all season tickets for the 33rd-consecutive season after averaging 89,061 fans during the 2011 season.
- Florida broke its single-game attendance record in 2009, drawing 90,907 to The Swamp for the Nov. 28 showdown against Florida State. It marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 14 Super Bowls, three BCS national title games and has featured 18 bowl games that included a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title.
- The crowd of 90,888 for the UF-Alabama game on Oct. 1, 2011, was the second-highest single-game total in school history and the most since 90,885 watched the Orange and Blue face South Carolina on Nov. 13, 2010.
- The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 30 years (1982-2011) and have ranked among the top nine in each of the last 21 years (1991-2011).
- In addition, UF set a school attendance record during the 2009 season, averaging 90,635 per game, which ranked ninth in the nation. That broke the previous standard, set in 2008 when the Gators averaged 90,544.
- The largest crowd for a home opener at The Swamp was 90,707 in UF's 2005 win over Wyoming in Urban Meyer's first game as head coach of the Gators. The 2009 opener (90,621) was the second-largest.

PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

The University of Florida is the only school in the Southeastern Conference to have two inductees into the NFL Hall of Fame since 2001.

Former Gator running back Emmitt Smith was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, on Aug. 7, 2010, following Gator great Jack Youngblood into the elite fraternity.

Smith was a three-time All-American at UF from 1987-89. He established 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. He finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing TD, both of which are NFL records. He was named the honorary captain for the 2011 UF vs. Tennessee game.

Youngblood, regarded as the best defensive end in UF history, became the first Gator enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2001. He was named to the All-SEC team of the decade for the 1970s and was the Most Outstanding Player at the 1971 Senior Bowl. He went on to be a five-time All-Pro player for the L.A. Rams. Youngblood appeared in a Rams' record 201 consecutive games and only missed one game in his 14 seasons, that one coming in his final season in 1984.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The University of Florida strives for excellence in the classroom as well as on the field. In 2011-12, the Gators had 22 players on the SEC Academic Honor Roll and five players named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

UF'S LEGENDARY STATUS

NATION'S ELITE

- No other school has captured a national title while facing the nation's toughest schedule. According to NCAA statistics, Florida has done so twice, in 1996 and 2006, and also won the 2008 title facing the second-toughest schedule in the country. UF was one of two schools (Arkansas) to face a top-10 strength of schedule four times from 2006-10.
- UF is the only school to claim three national championships in the past 13 years. The Gators have also played in the national championship game four times in the past 14 years.
- Florida is one of only two schools in the nation with three quarterbacks to win the Heisman Trophy and one of two schools nationally to have multiple Heisman winners since 1996.
- Florida is the only school in the nation to post 100 wins during each of the last two decades. UF won 102 games in the 1990s and 100 games in the 2000s. UF is one of only three schools in NCAA history to win 100 or more games in two different decades.
- The Gators won at least nine games for a period of 12-consecutive years (1990-2001), something only three schools in major college history have done and no other SEC school has done.
- Florida became one of six schools in major college history to win 100 games during a decade, producing a 102-22-1 record in the 1990s. UF again reached that benchmark in the 2000s, going 100-30.
- UF is the only school in modern major college history to score 500 or more points for a period of four-straight years (1993-96).
- Florida is one of two schools to have a player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft for nine-consecutive years, with a Gator being tabbed each year from 1983-91 (Miami, 14 years, 1995-2008).
- UF is one of only four schools in the nation to have multiple recipients of the William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly the Draddy Trophy), which is presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. (Brad Culpepper, '91; Danny Wuerffel, '96; Tim Tebow, '09)
- UF is the only school in the nation to have a Heisman Trophy recipient who also received the Campbell Trophy. Wuerffel accomplished both in 1996, while Tebow earned the Heisman in 2007 and the Campbell in 2009.

SEC ELITE

- Florida is one of two SEC schools to have three Heisman Trophy winners: Steve Spurrier (1966), Danny Wuerffel (1996) and Tim Tebow (2007).
- No other SEC school has won at least 10 games for a period of six-consecutive years (1993-98), something only three schools in major college history have done.
- The Gators are the only SEC team to rank in the top 15 of the final polls for 12-straight years, and only four have done it in major college football history.
- The Gators have the best league record over a 100-SEC-game span, going 87-13 in SEC play from the beginning of the 1990 season through the seventh conference game of 2001.
- Florida is only one of two schools in SEC history to claim four league championships in a row (1993-96). Florida has played in 10 of the 19 SEC Championship Games that have been held, winning seven.

GATORS IN THE PROS

- Since 1998, Florida has had at least 29 players on opening day NFL rosters each year.
- During the 2011 NFL season, UF had 35 players appear on active rosters, totaling 271 starts and 429 games played. In addition, former Gators accounted for the following numbers during the 2011 NFL season:

- Florida has seen 20 former players go on to appear in the NFL's Pro Bowl. Of those, 12 made multiple appearances in the all-star showcase. Last season, Steelers center Maurkice Pouncey was the lone offensive rookie to earn the honor.
- A Gator has earned a Pro Bowl berth in 32 of the past 36 NFL seasons, including 12 of the past 13 and a streak of 11-consecutive Pro Bowls from 1986-96.
- At least one former UF player has appeared in the Super Bowl 27 times. Four Gators have appeared in the big game on two occasions (Super Bowls XXX and XLI).
- Thirteen former Gators have combined to win 20 Super Bowl rings. Don Chandler, Wilber Marshall and Max Starks have each won two, and Emmitt Smith and Godfrey Miles each claimed three.
- Florida is one of two schools (Pitt) that has two players, Emmitt Smith and Fred Taylor, on the top-15 list of the NFL's all-time top rushers.
- Percy Harvin earned Offensive Rookie of the Year for his performance with the Minnesota Vikings in 2009. He then led the team in all major receiving and kickoff return categories in 2010.

SEC IN THE NFL DRAFT

- The SEC had 42 selections in the 2012 NFL Draft. The number led the nation for the sixth-straight year. (SEC – 42; Big Ten – 41; ACC – 31; Pac 12 – 28; Big 12 – 25; Big East – 12; Mountain West – 12; WAC – 11; Conference USA – 10)
- All 12 SEC teams had a player selected in the Draft. The SEC is the only conference to have had a player selected from every one of its teams. (SEC by team total: Alabama 8, Georgia 7, South Carolina 6, LSU 5, Arkansas 4, Miss. State 3, Florida 2, Kentucky 2, Vanderbilt 2, Auburn 1, Ole Miss 1, Tennessee 1)
- The 42 selections bring the SEC's total to 279 during the last seven NFL Drafts, an average of 39.8 per year. The SEC by year since 2006: 37 picks (2006); 41 (2007); 35 (2008); 37 (2009); 49 (2010); 38 (2011); 42 (2012).
- Alabama led the nation in total draft selections with 8, followed by Georgia and Oklahoma with 7 each. Seven teams had 6 selections each, including South Carolina, California, Miami (Fla.), Michigan State, Iowa, Wisconsin and Boise State.

- Arkansas tied an NFL Draft record with three wide receivers taken this year. It ties 1978 Florida and 1983 Tennessee and 11 other teams.
- Since 2006, the SEC has had 55 first-round selections, an average of 7.86 per year.
- The 42 total during that span for the SEC is second to the 2010 total of 49.

HEAD COACH WILL MUSCHAMP



When athletic director Jeremy Foley began his search for the University of Florida's next head football coach, he knew exactly what he was looking for in a coach: someone familiar with the Southeastern Conference, a coach who had competed on the big stage, a relentless recruiter who was familiar with the state of Florida and the SEC and someone with energy and passion. From the very beginning, the search honed in on one person and on December 11, 2010, former Gainesville native Will Muschamp was introduced by Foley as the 23rd head coach in Florida football history.

Muschamp, 41, came to UF after being the coach-in-waiting and defensive coordinator at the University of Texas since November 2008. He brings 16 years of coaching experience with him, including 12 years in the SEC, eight as a coach and four as a player at the University of Georgia. Muschamp has also served as defensive coordinator at Auburn University (2006-07) and LSU (2002-04; he was LSU's linebackers coach in 2001) and was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. The son of a football coach, he turned down appointments at West Point and Annapolis to become a four-year letterman as a safety at the University of Georgia from 1991-94, where he was voted defensive co-captain as a senior.

Not only does Muschamp, a highly-respected coach among both his peers and his players, bring collegiate and National Football League experience back to Gainesville, he also brings a wealth of big-game experience. He has coached in two national championship games, winning the ultimate prize in 2003 while defensive coordinator at LSU, and coached in a third BCS bowl game following the 2008 season, when Texas won the Fiesta Bowl. In addition to his national championship past, Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and in the Big 12 Championship Game once, coming out on the winning side in each of those three contests.

Muschamp's first season in Gainesville produced the school's 24th consecutive winning season and its 32nd consecutive season of .500 football or better, the longest streaks in the nation. With the victory over Ohio State in the TaxSaver.com Gator Bowl, UF established a school record with its fourth straight bowl win. Muschamp's first squad will go down as one of the youngest in school history; 15 true freshmen and 52 underclassmen saw action – the second most in school history.

UF finished the year with 72 scholarship players, including four walk-ons who were awarded scholarships in August prior to start of the season. The Gators opened fall camp with just nine scholarship seniors.

Despite returning 37 combined starts on the defensive side of the ball, the fewest in the SEC, Muschamp's defense ranked second in the nation in third down conversion defense (.273) – the best national ranking in school history. Florida allowed just 166.8 yards per game passing to rank seventh nationally and permitted just 299.5 yards per game to rank eighth nationally.

In his five seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defenses ranked among the nation's top 10 in total defense every single year, while always maintaining a top-15 rating in scoring defense, including three times inside the top 10.

In four of his eight seasons overall as a Division I defensive coordinator, the high-energy coach's team has allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and has twice led the nation in rushing defense while yielding less than 75 rushing yards per game. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to pace the nation.

From 2008-10 under Muschamp's guidance, the Texas defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks for 949 yards lost. His unit

also ranked in the top 10 nationally during the same time frame in several other major categories, allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth), 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all of which are Big 12 bests during that span. He also helped the Longhorns' defense to top-20 rankings during his tenure at Texas, with 650 first downs allowed (18th) and a 114.3 pass efficiency defense (20th).

In 2009, the Texas Longhorns advanced to the BCS National Championship Game as Muschamp's charges gave up just 73.1 rushing yards per game, the best figure by any BCS school from 2008-10. The Longhorns also led the nation in 2009 in third-down defense (26.5 percent), turnovers created (37, tied with Ohio University) and interceptions (25) as Texas claimed the Big 12 championship in 2009.

Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo claimed the 2008 Rotary Lombardi Award (lineman of the year), Bronko Nagurski Trophy (most outstanding defensive player) and Ted Hendricks Award (top defensive end), while the Longhorns' defense saw Sergio Kindle become the first player in college football history to be named a finalist for both the Butkus Award (nation's top linebacker) and the Hendricks Award. Earl Thomas also earned finalist honors for the Jim Thorpe Award in 2009.

In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined eight players drafted, including seven in the first four rounds and two first-rounders in Orakpo and Thomas.

In a two-year stint as the defensive coordinator at Auburn from 2006-07, Muschamp's defense ranked third in the nation in scoring defense (15.4 points per game) and fourth in the nation pass defense (170.7 pass yards per game). During the same time frame, Auburn ranked third in the SEC in total defense by holding opponents to 295.1 yards per game.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU as the linebackers coach for one season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game). The Tigers allowed just 19 touchdowns all season in 2003, three less than the next closest competitor nationally.

Between his positions at LSU and Auburn, Muschamp spent a season with the NFL's Miami Dolphins in 2005 as Assistant Head Coach for Defense. He helped the Dolphins finish second in the league with 49 sacks, while leading Miami to top-10 finishes with 4.7 yards per play (seventh), 3.7 yards per rush (seventh) and 6.0 yards per pass (ninth).

The 1994 graduate of the University of Georgia moved immediately into coaching following his collegiate playing career, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, earning his master's degree in 1996. He became a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving on to his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season, where he helped the Blazers to a 10-2 record and the Gulf South Conference championship with an 8-1 league mark.

In his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain for his senior season. He also earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

Muschamp and his wife, Carol, have two sons, Jackson and Whit.



BRENT PEASE

Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks/Wide Receivers

- A 21-year coaching veteran and a former NFL quarterback.
- Has served 11 seasons as an offensive coordinator and has coached at his alma mater, Montana (1991-98), as well as Northern Arizona (1999-2000), Kentucky (2001-02), Baylor (2003-05) and Boise State (2006-11).
- Was Boise State's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks' coach in 2011 after spending the previous five seasons as the team's wide receivers coach and four as BSU's assistant head coach.
- Has reached the postseason 13 times in his career, highlighted by a national championship in 1995 at Montana.



TIM DAVIS

Offensive Line

- Owns 29 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL levels, including stops at Utah, Minnesota, USC, Wisconsin, Idaho State, Walla Walla CC, Arizona and two seasons with the Miami Dolphins.
- Apart from one season spent as the Dir. of Player Personnel at Alabama, Davis has spent his entire career coaching offensive lines or tight ends.
- Davis has coached in 15 FBS bowl games, including three Rose Bowls and two Orange Bowls.
- At USC, the Trojans won a pair of national championships and three BCS bowl games. His o-lines protected two Heisman Trophy winners at USC.



BUSH HAMDAN

Wide Receivers

- Hamdan served as the Tight Ends coach at Sacramento State before joining the Gator football staff in January of 2012.
- He also interned for the Maryland Coaching staff during the 2010 season.
- Hamdan was a back-up quarterback at Boise State from 2005-08 and was awarded the 2008 Bronco Excellence Award as a senior.
- A highly-decorated high school quarterback, Hamdan was a member of the Super 44 Prep Team and All-Metro in Washington, D.C. During his prep career, he passed for more than 4,000 yards and 40 touchdowns.



DEREK LEWIS

Tight Ends

- Last season, led a tight end group that totaled 47 catches for 584 yards (12.4 ypc) and three touchdowns. Jordan Reed finished second on the team with 28 catches and third on the team with 307 receiving yards.
- Tutored Minnesota's Nick Tow-Arnett to an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention selection following the 2009 season after Tow-Arnett finished second on the team with 37 receptions for 505 yards and three touchdowns.
- From 2005-06, Lewis worked at Texas as a graduate assistant and won the 2005 BCS National Title. Coached TE David Thomas who owns UT career records for receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns by a tight end.



BRIAN WHITE

Running Backs

- A 26-year coaching veteran and 2004 winner of the AFCA Division I Assistant Coach of the Year. Has coached in 15 bowl games and served on coaching staffs that have won a national title and two conference championships.
- In 2011, led a running back group that totaled 2,040 rushing yards on 392 carries (5.2 yards per carry) and 15 rushing touchdowns while transitioning to a pro-style offense.
- Following the 2010 season, shifted from tight ends coach to running backs coach.



DAN QUINN

Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Line

- Has 18 years of coaching experience, including 10 seasons in the NFL and eight as an NFL defensive line coach.
- In 2011, led a Gator defense that ranked eighth nationally in total defense (299.5 yards per game), seventh in passing defense (166.8 yards per game) and second in third-down defense (27.12 percent).
- Helped four different players reach double-digits in sacks in a single season.
- Seven of his 10 seasons in the NFL saw opponents average less than one rushing touchdown per game, including three seasons of 10 or less total.



D.J. DURKIN

Linebackers/Special Teams Coordinator

- A 12-year coaching veteran with stops at Stanford, Bowling Green and Notre Dame.
- Florida's 2011 special teams unit blocked six kicks, which ranked sixth in the nation and marked the fifth time in six seasons, including both of Durkin's seasons, that the Gators led the SEC in blocks.
- Last season, the kickoff return unit tied for fourth nationally with four returns of 50+ yards, including two 99-yard TD returns.
- As the Florida linebackers coach, he tutored Jon Bostic, who led the team with 94 tackles, and Jelani Jenkins, who was third with 75 total tackles.

Defensive Backs

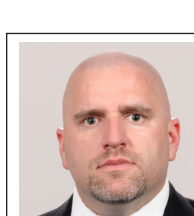
- Coaching stops include Auburn (2006-07), Western Kentucky (2008), Southern Miss (2009) and Texas Tech (2010).

Florida scored the game's final 13 points en route to a 27-14 victory over Bowling Green. With the game tied at 14-14 in the third quarter, UF got a pair of field goals from Caleb Sturgis and a 50-yard touchdown reception from Frankie Hammond to pull away and extend the nation's second-longest streak of opening-day victories to 23. Following the Gators' opening possession of the game, Bowling Green took over at its own 11 and mounted the first sustained drive, marching 89 yards in 12 plays and taking 5:36 off the clock. Falcon quarterback Matt Schilz connected on 7-of-9 passes on the drive, including a 22-yarder to Alex Bayer and an 18-yarder to Chris Gallon that set Bowling Green up at the Gators' 2-yard line. Pettigrew scored from a yard out to give the Falcons a 7-0 lead with 1:17 left in the opening quarter. The Gators responded with a 13-play, 85-yard drive that took 6:48 and culminated with Gillislee's 15-yard touchdown. His score came a play after head coach Will Muschamp gambled on 4th-and-1 at the Bowling Green 17-yard line and got a 2-yard gain from Hunter Joyer. The Gators got 75 of the yards on the drive on the ground, including 44 from Gillislee. A defensive stand by the Gators forced another punt. Gillislee wasted little time taking advantage of good field position, bursting around the right end for a 38-yard score on the first offensive snap of the drive to give the Gators their first lead of the season. Bowling Green tried to cut into the lead before the end of the half, but Stephen Stein missed a 31-yard field goal and the score remained 14-7. The Falcons marched 55 yards in eight plays in the third quarter to tie the game on Samuel's 12-yard touchdown run. The drive was aided by a fake punt for a first down that moved the ball inside the 30-yard line and sustained the drive. Florida forced another punt, which was shanked out of bounds at the Falcons' 18-yard line. Sturgis hit a 34-yard field goal with 6:03 remaining in the third quarter and the Gators regained the lead, 17-14. Bowling Green marched deep into UF territory on the following drive, but Stein missed from 29 yards out. After nearly three quarters of turnover-free football for both teams, Omarius Hines fumbled and Bowling Green took over at the Gators' 30-yard line. Facing a 3rd and 3 at the Gators' 23-yard line on the opening play of the fourth quarter, however, Schilz's pass was tipped and intercepted by Marcus Roberson, who returned it 31 yards to the UF 47-yard line. Moments later, Hammond hauled in a short pass from Driskel on 3rd and 7 at midfield and did the rest himself, taking it 50 yards to extend the Gators' lead to 24-14 with 13:18 to go. Sturgis made it 27-14 with 8:28 remaining, booming a 51-yard field goal, extending his school record with his sixth career field goal of 50+ yards.

It was a tale of two halves, but it added up to Florida taking its SEC opener at Texas A&M, 20-17, in front of a boisterous crowd at Kyle Field in College Station. For the second-straight week, Florida scored the game's final 13 points, this time erasing a 17-7 second-quarter deficit. Mike Gillislee had a pair of touchdown runs, including a 12-yarder early in the fourth quarter to give the Gators the lead for good, while Caleb Sturgis helped Florida erase a 10-point deficit with a pair of field goals. The Aggies, in their first game as an SEC program, took the opening kick and marched 65 yards in 15 plays to grab the lead on a Taylor Bertolet field goal from 27 yards. Johnny Manziel, the first freshman to start the season opener at A&M since 1944, completed 6-of-8 passes for 33 yards and ran twice for 19 yards on the opening drive. Sophomore quarterback Jeff Driskel, making his first career start under center, led the Gators on a 13-play, 75-yard drive to take the lead. Facing a 3rd-and-11, Driskel hit Frankie Hammond for a 17-yard gain to the Texas A&M 46 that helped propel the drive. Facing a 4th-and-1 at the Aggies' 16-yard line, the Gators lined up for a field goal but faked it and Trey Burton got the first down and additional yardage was tacked on for a face mask. Two plays later, Gillislee gave the Gators a 7-3 lead. The Aggies came right back, however, as Manziel marched A&M 81 yards in 13 plays to grab a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter. Manziel raced in from 11 yards out to cap the drive as the Aggies regained the lead with 13:39 left in the first half. After forcing the first punt of the game by the Gators, the Aggies got the ball back and again kept the Gators off balance. Manziel used play-action to hit Mike Evans for a 27-yard gain down the right sideline to put the Aggies at the UF 13-yard line. Moments later, Christine Michael scored from 1-yard out to give the Aggies a 17-7 lead with 7:01 left in the half. Manziel was near-flawless in the first half, finishing 16-of-20 passing for 141 yards and rushing nine times for 41 yards. Needing a big response, the Gators got some momentum back with a nine-play, 37-yard drive that ended with a 51-yard field goal from Sturgis, the seventh career field goal of 50+ yards for the senior, extending his school record. The field goal was set up by a 30-yard pass play from Driskel to Jordan Reed. Florida received the kickoff in the second half and went 67 yards on 10 plays before Sturgis kicked a 25-yard field goal to cut the lead to 17-13. The UF defense held the Aggies to just 28 yards of offense in the third quarter, forcing three punts in the quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, Driskel hit Omarius Hines for a 39-yard pass down the right sideline, setting up the Gators at the A&M 18-yard line. Gillislee scored moments later, dancing along the sideline from 12 yards out to make it 20-17. After exchanging punts, the Gators got the ball with 3:13 remaining while Texas A&M had all three timeouts remaining. UF was able to pound the ball and run the clock out, preserving the victory. After piling up 269 yards of offense in the first half, A&M managed just 65 the remainder of the game.

Neyland Stadium | Knoxville, TN

Attendance: 102,435

Trey Burton, Jordan Reed and Frankie Hammond scored touchdowns as the Gators exploded for 24-straight points to take a 37-20 decision over Tennessee before an electric crowd at Neyland Stadium. With the win, the Gators rallied in the second half on the road for the second-consecutive week and sent the Vols to their first defeat of the year. It was Florida's eighth-straight win in the series. Burton took a direct snap from center, sprinted to his right and raced a career-long 80 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 20 late in the third quarter. The touchdown was Burton's second of the night and marked the longest run of his career. It keyed a night in which Florida exploded for a season-high 555 yards of total offense (336 rushing, 219 passing). Shortly after Matt Elam intercepted Tennessee quarterback Tyler Bray, Jeff Driskel hooked up with Reed on a beautiful 23-yard pass to the left corner of the end zone to give the Gators the lead. Mike Gillislee set up the touchdown with a 45-yard run into UT territory and went over the century mark again, finishing with 115 yards on 18 carries. Driskel then found Hammond for a short pass that he turned up-field and ran away from the Vols' defense en route to a 75-yard touchdown strike to give the Gators a two-touchdown lead. Caleb Sturgis added his third field goal of the night, a 49-yarder with 6:44 remaining, to give Florida a 37-20 lead, capping a run of 24-straight points after trailing much of the first three quarters. A.J. Johnson scored on a 1-yard touchdown run midway through the third quarter to give Tennessee a 20-13 lead, but UT kicker Derrick Brodus struck the upright on his point-after attempt to keep the Gators within a touchdown on the scoreboard. Burton evened it and the Reed-Driskel combo put UF in front. Sturgis ended the first half with a 20-yard field goal and started the second with a 25-yarder after the Gators stalled on two drives inside of the Tennessee 10-yard line. UT grabbed a 14-7 lead when Bray found tight end Michael Rivera in the back of the end zone for a 6-yard touchdown strike that marked his second TD pass of the game. On that drive, the Vols converted three third downs - all on Bray passes - during a 16-play, 76-yard march, capped when Bray found Rivera in the end zone. Earlier, Bray hit Cordarrelle Patterson for a 2-yard touchdown pass late in the first period to tie the game at 7. The drive was sparked by a 42-yard reception from Justin Hunter, then followed by a 15-yard pass interference call. That UT touchdown evened things after Lerentee McCray's first career interception, plus his 25-yard return. Burton lined up behind center, took a direct snap and sprinted around left end for a 14-yard TD run to give UF a 7-0 lead midway through the opening period. On the previous play, Driskel hit Reed for 20 yards to move the Gators into scoring position. Driskel looked by far the most comfortable of his young career, finishing 14-of-20 passing for 219 yards and a pair of touchdown passes. He added eight carries for 81 yards. Just as noteworthy, the Gators' signal-caller was not sacked once on the day.

Back at home for the first time in three weeks, Florida (4-0, 3-0 SEC) shook off some early rust to run away from Kentucky (1-3, 0-1 SEC), 38-0, giving the Gators their 26th-straight win in the series. For UF, it was its first shutout since defeating UAB, 39-0, in week two last year, and its first shutout of an SEC opponent since defeating Mississippi State, 52-0, on Sept. 29, 2001. Florida got its scoring from a 27-yard field goal from Caleb Sturgis, 1-yard touchdown runs from Mike Gillislee, Jeff Driskel and Jacoby Brissett, a 26-yard interception return by Jaylen Watkins and a 19-yard reception by Quinton Dunbar. The Gators had a 27-yard field goal from Sturgis to grab the game's first points with 5:18 left in the first quarter, covering 49 yards on five plays. After Craig McIntosh's 54-yard field-goal attempt went wide left, the Gators took advantage of the miss, marching 63 yards on 10 plays and taking 5:02 off the clock. Driskel connected with Frankie Hammond on a 24-yard pass over the middle to move the Gators into Kentucky territory. After a 5-yard completion to Hunter Joyer on third down gave the Gators a first-and-goal at the Kentucky 1-yard line, Gillislee carried it in for a score on the next play for his fifth rushing touchdown of the season, giving the Gators a 10-0 lead with 12:04 left in the half. The Wildcats got the ball back but facing a 3rd-and-7, Morgan Newton's pass was intercepted by De'Ante Saunders and returned 29 yards to the Kentucky 23. The Gators were unable to take advantage, however, as Driskel took a shot at the end zone and the result was his first interception of the year. Capping a stretch of three-straight possessions with a pick, Watkins stepped in front of the Wildcat receiver and read Newton's pass perfectly, grabbing the interception and returning it 26 yards to give the Gators a 17-0 lead with 8:24 left in the half. Getting the ball back late in the half, Driskel engineered an impressive drive, marching the Gators 76 yards in seven plays and using just 1:18 off the clock. Driskel hit Jordan Reed with a 34-yard pass over the middle and then a personal foul tacked on 15 more yards to the Kentucky 19-yard line. Moments later, Driskel hit Dunbar with a 19-yard strike to close out the first-half scoring. As the second half began, it was more of the same, as Driskel led the Gators on another long drive that ate up a large chunk of the third quarter. UF marched 72 yards on 15 plays and took 9:03 off the clock on the drive, capped by a 1-yard touchdown run by Driskel. As the fourth quarter arrived and with the game in hand, head coach Will Muschamp called on Brissett at quarterback, as the sophomore saw his first action since the week one win over Bowling Green. Brissett capped a 9-play, 47-yard drive with a 1-yard keeper with 6:47 left to make it 38-0. Florida had near perfect balance offensively, getting 403 yards of total offense with 203 yards passing and 200 yards rushing.
