#### LSU Hosts South Carolina In Second Straight Top 10 Matchup For Tigers

For the second straight week, LSU will face a Top 10 opponent from the Southeastern Conference Eastern Division as third-ranked South Carolina makes a rare appearance in Tiger Stadium on Saturday night. Kickoff between the No. 8/9 Tigers and the Gamecocks is scheduled for 7 p.m. in a sold out Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN. LSU enters the game coming off its first regular season loss since November of 2010 with the 14-6 setback to Florida last week in Gainesville. LSU is 5-1 overall and 1-1 in league play. South Carolina, which thrashed Georgia, 35-7, last week, is 6-0 overall and 4-0 in SEC action. It will be the first meeting between the Tigers and Gamecocks since 2008 when LSU rallied for a 24-17 win in Columbia. LSU brings the nation's longest home field winning streak into the South Carolina game as the Tigers have won a school-record 21 straight in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss in Tiger Stadium came on Oct. 10, 2009 to top-ranked Florida, 13-3. Since that loss to Florida, the Tigers have reeled off the 21 consecutive home wins with 15 of those coming by double-figures. LSU got another outstanding defensive performance last week vs. Florida, holding the Gators scoreless and to just 81 total yards in the first half. For the game, LSU limited Florida to 14 points and 237 total yards (176 rushing, 61 passing) as the Tigers come up with five sacks and forced a pair of turnovers. LSU is ranked in the top 10 in the nation in three defensive categories – total defense (No. 3 at 221.0 yards per game), pass defense (No. 2 at 122.5 yards per game) and scoring defense (No. 8 at 12.8 points per game). Offensively, LSU is averaging 33.5 points and 394.0 total yards (198.3 rushing, 195.7 passing) a contest. RB **Kenny Hilliard** leads the Tigers with 382 yards and 6 TDs. QB **Zach Mettenberger** has connected on 89-of-144 passes for 1,174 yards, 6 TDs and 3 interceptions with his top targets being **Odell Beckham Jr.** (20 rec., 364 yards, 2 TDs) and **Jarvis Landry** (18 rec., 164 yards, 1 TD). Defensively, LB **Kevin Minter** leads team with 54 tackles and 8.5 tackles for loss. Other defensive leaders include: LB **Lamin Barrow** (39 tackles), DT **Anthony Johnson** (22 tackles, 6.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks), DE **Sam Montgomery** (18 tackles, 6.5 TFL, 2.0 sacks) and DE **Lavar Edwards** (13 tackles, 6.0 TFL, 3.5 sacks). P **Brad Wing** is averaging 45.3 yards a punt and PK **Drew Alleman** has connected on 8-of-11 field goals and 25-of-25 point-after-touchdowns.

### STORYLINES

- LSU coach **Les Miles** is 17-1 in games following a loss, which includes a 6-0 record when a road loss in followed by a game in Tiger Stadium.

- The combined record of LSU's next four opponents is 20-1 (South Carolina 6-0, Texas A&M 4-1, Alabama 5-0, Mississippi State 5-0). All four are ranked in the Top 25, including two in the top 3.

- **Kevin Minter's** 20 tackles vs. Florida was one shy of tying the

- school record of 21 held by Albert Richardson vs. South Carolina in 1982.

- LSU's last 10 wins at home have all been by double-figures and have come by an average of 32.6 points.

- In its last 12 games vs. SEC teams, LSU's defense has allowed only 10 TDs and 16 field goals. Florida is the only SEC team during that span to score more than one TD against the LSU defense.

- 20 players on the LSU defense have been responsible for either a sack, tackle for loss, interception or forced/recovered fumble.

- LSU has scored 18 special teams touchdowns under **Les Miles** (10 punt returns, 3 kickoff returns, 2 returns of a blocked field goal, 1 return of a fumbled punt, 1 return of a blocked punt, and 1 fake field goal).

- LSU is ranked in the Top 10 in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Polls for the 24th consecutive week.

# Les Miles

## 2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • EIGHTH SEASON

Now entering his eighth year into his reign as head coach at LSU, Les Miles has guided the Tiger football program to its most successful stretch - both on and off the field - in the history of the sport at the school. With 80 victories, two SEC titles and two appearances in the BCS National Championship Game, LSU's success since the start of the 2005 season is unmatched in college football. In the classroom, LSU ranks second in the SEC to only Vanderbilt in the most recent release of graduation rates as 152 Tigers have earned their degree under Miles' watch.

While LSU came up a game short of claiming its second BCS title under Miles in 2011, it was still a record-setting season for Miles and the Tigers. LSU went 13-0 during the regular season for the first time in school history, beat a school-record eight Top 25 teams, registered 12 of its 13 wins by double-figures and spent 11 straight weeks as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Throw in five first-team All-Americans, two national award winners, and a Heisman Trophy finalist and the 2011 regular season ranked as the most successful in school history.

Miles' accomplishments haven't come without hard work and a steadfast approach that expects excellence and dedication from his players, coaching staff and all of those who contribute to the success of LSU football. The Miles Method - a system that puts players in position to have success in the classroom, contribute and give back to the community, and compete for championships - is the foundation for which his program is built.

The results in his seven years with the program have been staggering as 157 players have graduated, 120 have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll distinction and countless hours have been spent in the community. Since the 2007

season, LSU has seen 90 of its 109 seniors get their diplomas, including 21 of 25 seniors from the 2007 national championship team, all 19 from the 2008 squad, 20 of 24 from the 2009 team, 13 of 16 from 2010 and 16 of 25 from last year's club. Twelve players during that stretch who haven't completed their requirements for graduation are currently playing in the NFL.

In the community, the Tigers played instrumental roles during the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, which were two of the worst natural disasters to hit Louisiana. A week doesn't go by where members of the football team are visiting hospitals, reading at schools or serving as motivational speakers to area youth groups. It's become the LSU way and it's a spirit that has spread through the team.

On the field, the Tigers have won more games (80) than any other program in the SEC, finished in the nation's top 10 five times and delivered a league-best 42 NFL Draft picks, including 10 first round selections. LSU's also produced 16 first team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards, while Patrick Peterson followed that in 2010 by claiming two national awards - the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back and the Bednarik Award as the nation's top defender.

Under Miles, the Tigers have posted at least 11 victories in a season five times and finished ranked among the top five in the nation three straight years (2005, '06, and '07), a first at LSU.

**Series Notes:**

LSU and South Carolina meet for the 20th time on Saturday with the Tigers holding a 16-2-1 advantage in the series ... Saturday's game marks just the seventh meeting between the teams since South Carolina joined the SEC in 1992 ... LSU has a 4-1-1 advantage in the previous six games played as SEC contests ... LSU is 10-1 vs. South Carolina in Tiger Stadium, which includes a 28-16 victory in the Gamecocks' last visit to Death Valley in 2007 ... South Carolina's only win in Tiger Stadium came in 1994 when the Gamecocks posted an 18-17 victory ... The win was also the last time that South Carolina has beaten LSU ... South Carolina's only other win against LSU came in the first-ever meeting between the teams, 7-6, in Columbia in 1930 ... The teams tied, 20-20, in Columbia in 1995 ... Since then, LSU has won four straight over the Gamecocks ... LSU coach **Les Miles** is 2-0 vs. South Carolina.

## LAST TIME OUT: #10/11 FLORIDA 14, #4/3 LSU 6 • GAINESVILLE, FLA.

Florida overcame a 6-0 halftime deficit with a pair of second half touchdowns as the 10th-ranked Gators handed No. 3 LSU its first regular season loss since November of 2010 with a 14-6 win in Gainesville. The loss snapped LSU's 18-game regular season winning streak, the longest in the nation, as the Tigers fell to 5-1 overall and 1-1 in league play. Despite a spectacular first half defensive effort that saw LSU hold Florida scoreless and to just 81 total yards, the Tigers wore down in the second half as the Gators used their running game to take control of the contest. Trailing 6-0, Florida took the lead for good, 7-6, on a 12-yard TD run by Mike Gillislee late in the third quarter. The Tigers had a chance to regain the lead however, **Odell Beckham Jr.** fumbled after catching a 56-yard pass from **Zach Mettenberger** that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 23-yard line. Florida responded with an 11-play drive, all rushes, to extend the lead to 14-6 early in the fourth quarter. LSU managed just two first downs on its following two possessions as the Gators held on for the victory. LSU's only points in the game came courtesy of a pair of **Drew Alleman** field goals. Alleman kicked 31-yard field goal to cap a 10-play, 64-yard drive on LSU's first possession of the game. Alleman added a 21-yard field goal just before halftime after the Tigers managed just three yards following a fumble recovery at the Florida 7-yard line. For the game, LSU was limited to just 8 first downs, 200 total yards (42 rushing, 158 passing) and just 1-of-13 on third down conversion attempts. Mettenberger completed 11-of-25 passes for 158 yards and one interception. He was sacked four times. **Kevin Minter** led the LSU defense with 20 tackles, just one shy of tying the school-record, two sacks and a forced fumble.

## NOTEBOOK

### LSU Continues Tough October Stretch Against South Carolina

LSU will continue its tough October stretch on Saturday against third-ranked South Carolina in Tiger Stadium. South Carolina comes into Tiger Stadium with a 6-0 overall mark and a 4-0 league record. The Gamecocks are averaging 36.3 points per game and 406.2 total yards (181.5 rushing, 224.7 passing) a contest. Defensively, South Carolina is limiting opponents to 10.5 points (2nd in SEC) and 278.0 total yards (3rd in SEC). South Carolina is allowing just 83.8 yards rushing a game (2nd in the SEC) and DE Jadeveon Clowney leading the way with 6.5 sacks and 11.5 tackles for loss. The combined record for LSU's October opponents is 15-1 (Florida 5-0, South Carolina 6-0 and Texas A&M 4-1). Going a step further, LSU's next four opponents are a combined 20-1 and all are ranked in the Top 25 (South Carolina 6-0, Texas A&M 4-1, Alabama 5-0, Mississippi State 5-0).

### More On LSU Heading Into South Carolina Game

- The South Carolina game will be the 100th for **Les Miles** as head coach of the Tigers. Miles is 80-19 in his eight years with the program.
- LSU and South Carolina meet as Top 10 opponents for just the second time in the series. The only other time both teams were ranked in the Top 10 came in 1987 Gator Bowl when No. 7 LSU beat the No. 8 Gamecocks, 30-13.
- The only other time in the previous 19 meetings between the teams that both teams were ranked in Top 25 came in 2007 when No. 2 LSU beat No. 12 South Carolina, 28-16, in Tiger Stadium.
- This will be the sixth straight game that LSU goes into the South Carolina contest ranked in the Top 25.
- LSU goes into a game ranked lower than its opponent for the first time since the 2011 season opener vs. Oregon when the Ducks were No. 3 and the Tigers were No. 4. The last time LSU played a home game as the lower ranked of the two teams came in 2010 when the 12th-ranked Tigers upset No. 5 Alabama, 24-21.
- LSU hasn't lost back-to-back games during the month of October since 1999 when the Tigers dropped all five games that month.
- The last time LSU lost two games during the month of October came in 2008 when the Tigers dropped a 51-21 decision to Florida on Oct. 11 and then fell to Georgia, 52-38, on Oct. 25.
- The last time LSU faced two teams from the SEC Eastern Division during the regular season that were ranked in the Top 25 came in 2009 (def. No. 20 Georgia, 20-13; lost No. 1 Florida, 13-3).
- LSU is ranked in the Top 10 in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Polls for the 24th consecutive week. The streak dates back to the final polls of the 2010 season.
- LSU has played 96 of its 99 games under **Les Miles** ranked in the Top 25. LSU is 79-18 as Top 25 team under Miles.

• LSU's last win vs. a top 5 ranked team at night in Tiger Stadium came in 1997 when the 14th-ranked Tigers upset No. 1 ranked Florida, 28-21, who was coached by Steve Spurrier.

### Minter Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week

LSU junior LB **Kevin Minter** earned SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week honors on Monday after his record-setting performance in the loss to Florida. Minter set the school record with 17 solo tackles and came one tackle away from tying the school record in total tackles with 20 against the Gators. Minter accounted for 17-yards in losses for the Gators with a pair of sacks and another tackle behind the line of scrimmage. He also forced a fumble in the road loss to Florida. Minter's 20 tackles were the most by an LSU player since 1988 and one shy of tying the school mark of 21 set by Albert Richardson vs. South Carolina in 1982. The honor is the first of Minter's career and fourth SEC honor for an LSU player this year.

### LSU's Won School-Record 21 Straight In Tiger Stadium – Longest Current Streak In Nation

LSU extended its Tiger Stadium winning streak to 21 in a row with the win over Towson. The 21-game streak is now two better than the previous mark of 19, which was set from 2005-07. LSU's 21-game streak currently leads the nation. Prior to LSU's current streak, the previous Tiger Stadium record of 19 ran from Oct. 15, 2005 (win over Florida) thru Nov. 10, 2007 (win over Louisiana Tech). The 19-game streak was snapped on Nov. 23, 2007 with a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas.

### Miles Is 47-6 Overall In Tiger Stadium

LSU is 47-6 in Tiger Stadium under **Les Miles** dating back to the 2005 season. Miles has led LSU to three undefeated seasons in Tiger Stadium (8-0 in '06, 7-0 in '10, and 6-0 in '11). Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama in 2008. LSU also has a loss to No. 1 ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 35-1 in Saturday night home games under Miles with the only loss coming to Florida in 2009.

### LSU Runs Top 25 Streak To 55 Straight

With its No. 8 national ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 9 placement in the AP poll, LSU has now been ranked in the Top 25 for 55 consecutive weeks. The 55 straight weeks trails only Alabama, who has been ranked for 71 straight weeks. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 113 of the 117 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 132 of 136 games ranked in the top 25, including 97 of 99 games under Miles. LSU has a 79-18 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 vs. Arkansas and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU was ranked in the preseason Top 25 for the

### Miles In Elite SEC Company

By picking up his 80th win at LSU vs. Towson, LSU coach **Les Miles** became the fastest coach in school history to reach 80 victories as he needed just 98 games to do it. In addition, the 98 games to reach 80 wins makes Miles the third-fastest in SEC history to reach that milestone as he trails only Steve Spurrier (80 wins in 89 games) and Philip Fulmer (80 wins in 97 games). Some notable SEC coaches who needed more games than Miles to reach 80 wins include: Bear Bryant (80 wins in 120 games), Nick Saban (80 wins in 104 games), Mark Richt (80 wins in 101 games), and Vince Dooley (80 wins in 123 games).

### Miles vs. The SEC

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 43-19 against SEC teams (all games) since taking over for the Tigers in 2005. The 43 wins include two victories in the SEC Championship Game, while the two of the 18 losses include a defeat to Georgia in the SEC title game and the loss to Alabama in the BCS National Championship. In games that count towards the SEC standings, Miles is 41-17.

### LSU's Win Streak vs. SEC East Snapped At 7; Miles Is 17-8 vs. SEC East

LSU had its 7-game winning streak against teams from the SEC Eastern Division snapped with the 14-6 loss to Florida. It was the first loss for the Tigers against a team from the opposition division in the SEC since a 13-3 setback to No. 1 Florida on Oct. 10, 2009. The 7-game streak was the longest of its kind in school history. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 17-8 in all games against teams from the SEC Eastern Division, which includes a 2-1 mark in the SEC title game.

### Finally An SEC Home Game

For the first time since 1988, LSU played its first two SEC games away from home as the Tigers traveled to face Auburn (won 12-10) and Florida (lost 14-6). The South Carolina game represents the latest LSU has played its first SEC home game since 1984 when the Tigers beat Vanderbilt, 34-27, on Oct. 13.

### LSU Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 In Five Defensive Categories

LSU brings one of the nation's top defenses into the South Carolina game as the Tigers are ranked among the top 10 in the nation in four categories. ## LSU Has Scored 18 Special Teams TDs In Miles Era

LSU registered its 18th special teams touchdown under **Les Miles** when **Odell Beckham Jr.** returned a punt 70 yards for a touchdown against North Texas. It marked the third time in four games dating back to last year that LSU has scored on a punt return. Under Miles, LSU has returned 10 punts for touchdowns, 3 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, and 1 on a fake field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all eight seasons under Miles. LSU is 16-1 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. ## Les Miles' List of Achievements

In 7-plus years with LSU, head coach **Les Miles** has put together quite a list of achievements in his 98 games with the Tigers. The following is a look at some of Miles' LSU highlights:

- Fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), 70 wins (87 games), and 80 wins (98 games) in school history.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011
- Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it three times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year, doing it twice (2010, '11).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 14 wins over coaches who have won national titles, including one this year (Chizik)
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007)

## Saturday Night Special - Tigers Are 57-5 In Night Games (No Matter Location) Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under Les Miles, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 57-5 in night games - no matter the day of week or location - under Miles compared to a 23-14 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 14-1 in away night games under Miles with the only loss coming at Florida in 2008 by a 51-21 count. LSU is 35-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 49-3 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era no matter the location. The only two home losses at night for the Tigers under Miles have come in 2005 on a Monday night against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime and a 13-3 loss to No. 1-ranked Florida in 2009. ### LSU is 29-2 Under Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 29-2 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. The Tigers, who are 5-0 in road games when having a 100-yard rusher, have won 15 straight dating back to the Tulane game in 2008 when a running back reached the 100-yard mark. LSU has had a 100-yard rusher in three of its first four games this year - Kenny Hilliard and Alfred Blue both went over the 100-yard mark against North Texas in the season-opener; Blue had 101 yards vs. Washington and Hilliard had 116 yards vs. Idaho. LSU's only two losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came against Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

### LSU's 39-4 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 39-4 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle, which included a 10-0 record in 2011. Since the start of the 2005 season, LSU is plus-47 in the turnover margin category. The Tigers have also won 23 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent a streak that dates back to the Arkansas game in 2008. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 18-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. The only four losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Arkansas in 2008, Kentucky in 2007, Arkansas in 2007, and Auburn in 2006.

### LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 74 of the 91 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team since the 2000 season. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis during the early 2000s, LSU has recorded a 74-17 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU was 6-3 in 2009 as a top 10 team, 4-2 in 2010, 13-1 in 2011, and 5-1 this year.

### LSU Is 47-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100-Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 98 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 75-7 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 47-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 46-0, including a 3-0 record in 2012. ### This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 225-60-4 (.783) at night under the lights compared to a 28-25-3 (.518) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 77-11 overall at home, which includes a 59-5 (.922) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 18-6 (.750) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. ## LSU Defense Comes Up Big in Second Half in 24-17 Win Over South Carolina

LSU's defense held South Carolina scoreless and to just 42 total yards in the second half as the Tigers overcame a 17-10 halftime deficit to beat the Gamecocks, 24-17, in Columbia. **Keiland Williams** (72 yards) and **Charles Scott** (61 yards, 2 TDs) led a balanced LSU offensive attack as the Tigers racked up 363 yards against the nation's No. 3 rated defense. LSU took an early 3-0 lead in the game with a 48-yard field goal by **Colt David** before Carolina tied the contest with a field goal of its own early in the second quarter. South Carolina scored 14 points in the final four minutes of the first half, the second coming with just 22 seconds left after a **Jarrett Lee** interception was returned to the LSU 8-yard line. After a back-and-forth third quarter, the Tigers finally managed to tie the score at 17-17 when backup QB **Andrew Hatch** connected with **Richard Dickson** on a 7-yard TD pass. The Tigers dominated the fourth quarter, holding the ball for over 11 minutes in the final quarter, which included an 11-play, 83-yard scoring drive that ate up over six minutes. That scoring drive was capped when Scott plunged across the goal line from two yards out at the 4:16 mark to give the Tigers a 24-17 lead. The Tigers sealed the victory when **Curtis Taylor** intercepted a South Carolina pass on its next possession as the Tigers burned the final four minutes of the contest and the Gamecocks never got the ball back. For the game, LSU sacked South Carolina's quarterback six times and held the Gamecocks to just 254 yards.

## No. 1 Tigers Run Past North Texas In Season-Opener, 41-14

Running backs **Kenny Hilliard** and **Alfred Blue** combined for 264 of LSU's 316 rushing yards as the Tigers used a dominant running game to beat North Texas, 41-14, in the season-opener for both teams. The win extended three LSU winning streaks – all the longest in the nation - non-conference regular season (38), Tiger Stadium (18), and overall regular season (14). Hilliard led all rushers with a career-best 141 yards and 2 TDs, while Blue added 123 yards in what was just his third career start. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers took control early needing just four plays to go 66 yards for a 7-0 lead on a 38-yard run by Hilliard. LSU stretched the lead to 14-0 on a 70-yard punt return by **Odell Beckham Jr.**, and then to 21-0 just seconds into the second quarter on another TD run (5 yards) by Hilliard. A 44-yard field goal by **Drew Alleman** extended the lead to 24-0 with 6:26 left in the first half. North Texas scored on an 80-yard pass with just under 2 minutes to go in the first half to cut the deficit to 24-7 at halftime. An Alleman field goal and a 34-yard TD pass from **Zach Mettenberger** to **Kadron Boone** extended the LSU lead to 34-7 early in the fourth quarter. Fullback **J.C. Copeland** scored on a 5-yard run with just over 2 minutes left for the final margin of 41-14. Mettenberger connected on a 19-of-26 passes for 192 yards and 1 TD in his first career start, while **Jarvis Landry** hauled in 8 passes for 82 yards to lead the Tigers. **Eric Reid** (7 tackles, 1 interception), **Lamin Barrow** (7 tackles) and **Barkevious Mingo** (6 tackle, 1.0 TFL, 1 QB hurry) led a Tiger defense that limited the Mean Green to 219 total yards (76 rushing, 143 passing).

## LSU Uses Dominating Effort On Both Sides Of Ball In 41-3 Win Over Washington

LSU put together a dominating performance on both sides of the ball as the third-ranked Tigers rolled up 437 yards of offense (242 rushing, 195 passing), while holding Washington to only 183 total yards (26 rushing, 157 passing) in a 41-3 win in Tiger Stadium. Had it not been for LSU fumbling the opening kickoff at its own 16-yardline, LSU could have very easily pitched a shutout as outside of that first possession, Washington didn't get inside the Tiger 30-yard line all night. After spotting the Huskies a 3-0 lead, LSU took over, scoring (5 TDs, 2 FGs) on seven of its next nine possessions. LSU took the lead for good when **Alfred Blue** scampered 21-yards for a 7-3 Tiger lead at the 11:18 mark in the first quarter. LSU extended the advantage to 14-3 two possessions later when **J.C. Copeland** plunged 1-yard for a TD. A pair of second quarter **Drew Alleman** field goals (18 and 32 yards) gave the Tigers a 20-3 lead at halftime. After a 3-and-out by UW on its first possession of the second half, the Tigers went 61 yards on seven plays capped on a 3-yard run by **Kenny Hilliard** to extend the lead to 27-3 at the 10:35 mark in the third quarter. **Zach Mettenberger** connected with **Kadron Boone** on a 32-yard scoring strike late in the third quarter to stretch the lead to 34-3. Blue led the Tigers in rushing with 101 yards for his second straight 100-yard game, while Mettenberger completed 12-of-18 passes for 195 yards and a score. Defensively, LB **Kevin Minter** led the Tigers with 9 tackles, while DE **Sam Montgomery** added 4 tackles and had one of LSU's four sacks. Other sacks came from **Micha Eugene** (-8 yards), **Chancey Aghayere** (-11 yards) and **Lavar Edwards** (-6 yards). **Jalen Mills** had LSU's only interception to go with 7 tackles.

## LSU Uses Big Second-Half To Blowout Idaho, 63-14

Zach Mettenberger had his best game in an LSU uniform and the Tigers scored a pair of defensive touchdowns in rolling to a 63-14 win over Idaho in Tiger Stadium. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 14-0 with touchdowns on its first two possessions. Mettenberger connected with **Kadron Boone** on a 17-yard TD to open the scoring for the Tigers at the 9:46 mark in the first quarter and **Alfred Blue** followed with a 3-yard TD run just three minutes later. Idaho got to within 14-7 early in the second quarter, but **Ronald Martin** extended the lead to 21-7 on a 45-yard interception return for a score. LSU led 28-14 at halftime. In the second half, LSU scored 35 unanswered points as the Tigers registered the most points in a game during the **Les Miles** era. DE **Lavar Edwards** returned an interception 23 yards for a TD four minutes in to the third quarter to extend the Tiger advantage to 35-14. **Kenny Hilliard**, who led LSU with 116 yards, scored two TDs in the third quarter, giving the Tigers a 49-14 advantage. True freshman RB **Jeremy Hill**, in his first collegiate action, had a pair of fourth quarter TD runs for the final margin of 63-14. For the game, the Tigers piled up 472 total yards (250 rushing, 222 passing), while limiting the Vandals to just 213 yards (39 rushing, 174 passing). Mettenberger finished 17-of-22 for 222 yards, two TDs and one interception. WR **Jarvis Landry** led the Tigers in receiving with five catches for 35 yards and a score. CB **Jalen Collins**, DT **Bennie Logan** and LB **Kevin Minter** each recorded 6 tackles to lead the Tigers, while S **Ronald Martin** had 5 tackles and a pair of interceptions in his first career start.

## LSU Defense Stifles Auburn In SEC-Opening 12-10 Win

LSU's defense scored points for the second straight game while limiting Auburn to just nine first downs and 183 total yards in the 12-10 win over the Auburn Tigers in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The victory was just the second for LSU at Auburn since 2000 and sent the LSU Tigers to a 4-0 overall mark and a 1-0 league record. LSU appeared to have taken control of the game early, taking its first drive and moving the ball with little resistance to the Auburn 2-yard line. However, LSU came away with no points as QB **Zach Mettenberger** fumbled the snap on 3rd-and-1 and Auburn recovered ending the LSU drive. A play later, LSU took a 2-0 lead in the contest when DE **Sam Montgomery** tackled Auburn RB Tre Mason in the endzone for a safety. LSU's offense again move the ball with ease on its next possession, capped with a 2-yard TD run by **Michael Ford** to increase the lead to 9-0 midway through the first quarter. After its third possession without a first down, Auburn punted the ball back to LSU. Three plays later, Mettenberger fumbled for the second time in the first quarter when he was sacked for a 6-yard loss at the 26. Auburn needed only three plays to go 26 yards to pull to within, 9-7, as the first quarter came to an end. Auburn took its first lead of the game, 10-9, on a 40-yard field goal just before halftime. LSU got its first break of the second half when the Tigers recovered a fumbled Auburn punt at the 48-yard line. LSU marched to the Auburn 13-yard line where senior PK **Drew Alleman** kicked what proved to be the game-winning points with a 30-yard field goal late in the third quarter, giving LSU a 12-10 advantage. LSU's defense held Auburn to just two first downs in the fourth quarter as the LSU Tigers escaped with the 12-10 victory. **Spencer Ware** led LSU with 90 rushing yards to go along with 2 catches for 44 yards, including a 33-yarder on a 3-and-4 late in the fourth quarter that extended an LSU drive. Mettenberger completed 15-of-27 passes for 169 yards. **Eric Reid** (7 tackles) and **Sam Montgomery** (4 tackles, 3.5 TFL) led the Tiger defense.

## No. 3 LSU Overcomes Sluggish Effort To Beat Towson, 38-22

Despite committing a season-high 10 penalties and losing three fumbles, third-ranked LSU managed enough offense to post a 38-22 non-conference win over Towson in Tiger Stadium. The victory improved LSU to 5-0 overall, while extending the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak to 41 straight (also an NCAA record) as well as running LSU's Tiger Stadium winning streak to 21 in a row (also a school record). **Zach Mettenberger** threw for 238 yards and a pair of touchdowns - both to **Odell Beckham Jr.** After **Russell Shepard's** 78-yard TD run on the first play of LSU's second possession of the game gave the Tigers a 7-0 lead, Towson scored nine straight points to take a 9-7 advantage with just over five minutes left in the first half. LSU closed out the half with a 27-yard TD pass from Mettenberger to Beckham Jr. and then a 23-yard **Drew Alleman** field goal to take a 17-9 lead into the locker room. LSU extended the lead to 24-9 on a 1-yard TD run by **J.C. Copeland** and then to 31-9 on a 53-yard TD pass from Mettenberger to Beckham Jr. **Michael Ford** closed out the scoring for the Tigers with a 4-yard run late in the game for a 38-16 advantage. Towson added a touchdown with just over a minute left for the final margin. For the game, LSU's offense produced 396 total yards (158 rushing, 238 passing), while Towson managed to score more points (22), rush for more yards (188) and accumulate more total yards (291) than any team that LSU has faced this year. Shepard led LSU with 78 yards rushing on just one carry, while Ford added 76 yards on 11 attempts. Beckham Jr. had five catches for 128 yards and a pair of TDs for what statistically was the best game of his career. **Kevin Minter** led the Tiger defense with 9 tackles, including 1.5 for losses, while **Lavar Edwards** had seven tackles and 1.5 sacks.

## Florida Uses Second-Half Surge To Beat LSU, 14-6

Florida overcame a 6-0 halftime deficit with a pair of second half touchdowns as the 10th-ranked Gators handed No. 3 LSU its first regular season loss since November of 2010 with a 14-6 win in Gainesville. The loss snapped LSU's 18-game regular season winning streak, the longest in the nation, as the Tigers fell to 5-1 overall and 1-1 in league play. Despite a spectacular first half defensive effort that saw LSU hold Florida scoreless and to just 81 total yards, the Tigers wore down in the second half as the Gators used their running game to take control of the contest. Trailing 6-0, Florida took the lead for good, 7-6, on a 12-yard TD run by Mike Gillislee late in the third quarter. The Tigers had a chance to regain the lead however, **Odell Beckham Jr.** fumbled after catching a 56-yard pass from **Zach Mettenberger** that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 23-yard line. Florida responded with an 11-play drive, all rushes, to extend the lead to 14-6 early in the fourth quarter. LSU managed just two first downs on its following two possessions as the Gators held on for the victory. LSU's only points in the game came courtesy of a pair of **Drew Alleman** field goals. Alleman kicked 31-yard field goal to cap a 10-play, 64-yard drive on LSU's first possession of the game. Alleman added a 21-yard field goal just before halftime after the Tigers managed just three yards following a fumble recovery at the Florida 7-yard line. For the game, LSU was limited to just 8 first downs, 200 total yards (42 rushing, 158 passing) and just 1-of-13 on third down conversion attempts. Mettenberger completed 11-of-25 passes for 158 yards and one interception. He was sacked four times. **Kevin Minter** led the LSU defense with 20 tackles, just one shy of tying the school-record, two sacks and a forced fumble.
