THE GAME: Alabama plays its final road game of the 2012 season on Saturday at Tiger Stadium against No. 5/5 LSU. It will be the 77th meeting between the Crimson Tide and Tigers. Overall, Alabama leads the series 46-25-5 and has claimed three of the last five meetings, including a 21-0 shutout in the 2012 Allstate BCS National Championship Game in New Orleans. UA's last win in Baton Rouge was a 27-21 overtime victory in 2008. The game will be televised by CBS with kickoff set for 7 p.m. CT. Verne Lundquist will serve as the play-by-play announcer, with Gary Danielson at his side as the color analyst. The two will be joined by sideline reporter Tracy Wolfson. Eli Gold and Phil Savage will handle the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart serving as sideline reporter.

HEAD COACH NICK SABAN: Alabama head coach Nick Saban (Kent State, 1973) is in his sixth season with the Crimson Tide. Named the school's 27th head coach on January 3, 2007, Saban has compiled a 58-12 record (63-12 before five vacated wins in 2007) at Alabama while leading the Tide to two SEC Western Division championships, one conference title and two national championships. Saban holds a career record of 149-54-1 (154-54-1) as a collegiate head coach, while also serving at Toledo, Michigan State and LSU. Saban won his first national championship as head coach of the LSU Tigers in 2003, guiding the Tigers to a 13-1 record that season. Overall, Saban has coached four conference championship teams (1990 Mid-American, 2001 SEC, 2003 SEC and 2009 SEC) and 13 of his 16 teams have played in postseason bowl games with the Tide appearing in a bowl game each year under Saban's direction. Saban is the only active coach to win three BCS national championships and the first to accomplish the feat at two different schools.

RANKINGS: Alabama remains at No. 1 in the Associated Press and *USA Today* Coaches' polls entering the 10th week of the 2012 season. The Tide is a unanimous No. 1 in both the polls. LSU stands at No. 5 in the AP poll and the coaches' poll.

LSU: LSU, coming off its bye week, enters Saturday's game at 7-1 overall and 3-1 against SEC opponents. The Tigers lone loss of the 2012 season came against the 10th-ranked Florida Gators on October 6, by a score of 14-6. LSU is ranked fifth in both the AP and USA Today Coaches' poll and stands at No. 5 in the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) Standings. In addition to holding the advantage in the overall series, the Crimson Tide also sports a 24-9-3 lead in games played on the road against the Tigers.

NEXT GAME: Alabama welcomes SEC newcomer Texas A&M to Bryant-Denny Stadium on Saturday, November 10, for the Crimson Tide's first of three straight home games. The two will be meeting for the fifth time but first since December 1, 1988. Alabama leads the series 3-1 and has won the last two contests against the Aggies.

TIDE REMAINS NO. 1 IN BCS STANDINGS: Alabama remains No. 1 in the third Bowl Championship Series (BCS) Standings release of the 2012 season. The BCS percentage is calculated by averaging the percent totals of the Harris Interactive, *USA Today* Coaches and six computer rankings. The Crimson Tide garnered a .9759 average, which is over .350 higher than Kansas State, who came in at No. 2 (.9400). Notre Dame is third with an average of .9147 while Oregon follows at No. 4 with .9136. Rounding out the top 10 is LSU (.8165), Georgia (.7753), Florida (.7604), South Carolina (.5968), Florida State (.5743) and Louisville (.5661).

JONES EARNS NFF NATIONAL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE HONORS: Senior center Barrett Jones was one of 15 National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athletes, which was announced by the NFF and College Hall of Fame on Oct. 24. The honorees also comprise the list for the 2012 William V. Campbell Trophy, recognizing the top scholar-athlete in the nation. Jones is the sixth Alabama football player to be named a NFF National Scholar-Athlete. He joins Johnny Musso (1971), Randy Hall (1974), Steadman Shealy (1979), DeMeco Ryans (2005) and Greg McElroy (2010).

MCCARRON NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR MAXWELL AWARD: Junior quarterback AJ McCarron was selected as one of the 16 finalists for the 76th Maxwell Award for the collegiate player of the year, the Maxwell Football Club announced on Oct. 29. McCarron has thrown for 1,684 yards and 18 touchdowns this season, completing 122 of 177 attempts. His streak of 262 passes without an interception is the longest in Alabama history and ranks second in Southeastern Conference history. The winner will be announced at the Home Depot College Football Awards Show on ESPN on Dec. 6, 2012. The formal presentation will be made at the Maxwell Football Club's Awards Gala, which will be held on Friday, March 1, 2013, at the Harrah's Entertainment Complex in Atlantic City, N.J.

MILLINER AND MOSLEY SELECTED AS SEMIFINALISTS FOR BEDNARIK AWARD: Junior defensive back Dee Milliner and junior linebacker C.J. Mosley were both named semifinalists for the 18th Chuck Bednarik Award, presented by Cracker Barrel for the most outstanding defensive player of the year, the Maxwell Football Club announced on Oct. 29. Milliner has 26 total tackles on the season, including 1.5 for loss. He has also hauled in two interceptions, broken up 13 passes, forced a fumble and blocked a kick. Mosley leads the Crimson Tide in total tackles with 65 this season. He has recorded 2.5 sacks, two interceptions, a pass breakup, forced fumble and fumble recovery. The winner will be announced at the Home Depot College Football Awards Show on ESPN on Dec. 6, 2012. The formal presentation will be made at the Maxwell Football Club's Awards Gala, which will be held on Friday, March 1, 2013, at the Harrah's Entertainment Complex in Atlantic City, N.J.

30-POINT STREAK: With its win against Mississippi State on Oct. 27, Alabama recorded its eighth straight game with 30 or more points which is the longest streak to start a season in school history. Prior to this season, Alabama had started three seasons (1920, 1979 & 2009) with five games in a row of scoring 30 or more points.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: With T.J. Yeldon's 11-yard touchdown run in the first quarter against Mississippi State on Oct. 27, Alabama raised its current total of consecutive games in which it scored to 150 – the longest streak in program history.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY: Alabama enters the LSU contest 34-for-35 in its red zone trips, tied for first in the nation in that category at 97 percent. The Crimson Tide has scored 26 touchdowns in the red zone in 2012 and kicked eight field goals. On the year, UA has scored 16 rushing touchdowns and passed for 10 inside the 20-yard line.

PROTECTING THE FOOTBALL: Alabama and Louisiana Tech are the only two remaining teams that have not thrown an interception this season. It has been 11 1/2 games since a Crimson Tide quarterback threw an interception, which is the longest streak in the nation by three games. Louisiana Tech threw an interception in its final game of the 2011 season. The Tide's last interception came in the 10th game of the 2011 campaign against Mississippi State at the end of the second quarter.

TOUGH TO SCORE ON: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama has traditionally been one of the most difficult teams to score touchdowns against. In 2012, the Tide has allowed its opponents to come away with points on only 53 percent of opportunities in the red zone (8 of 15). Alabama has the most efficient red-zone defense in the nation. The Tide's defense has surrendered six touchdowns and two field goals this season from inside the red zone while allowing opposing offenses to enter the red zone only 15 times in eight games. Overall, UA has surrendered seven touchdowns and three field goals on defense this season. UA only allowed nine touchdowns by opposing offenses all of last season and just six touchdowns and two field goals inside the red zone. UA also led the nation in red zone defense last season, allowing scores just 59 percent of the time (10-of-17). Alabama ranked tied for fourth in 2010 and tied for second in 2009 with both teams allowing a score on 67 percent of opponents' red zone opportunities.

INTERCEPTION MARGIN: Over the last four seasons Alabama's starting quarterbacks have taken care of the football and the Crimson Tide defense has done its part by intercepting opposing quarterbacks. Dating back to the start of the 2009 season, Alabama's starting quarterbacks have thrown 14 interceptions in 1,144 pass attempts (one interception every 81.7 pass attempts), while the defense has recorded 73 interceptions in 48 games. The Tide's current starting quarterback, AJ McCarron, has thrown five interceptions in 553 career attempts, which marks a school and SEC record for quarterbacks with at least 400 pass attempts. McCarron is averaging one interception every 110.6 attempts, which is better than any SEC quarterback (Peyton Manning; 1 every 95 attempts in 1995) has done in any single season (minimum 200 attempts).

20 OR MORE IN THE FIRST HALF: Alabama has scored 20 or more points in every first half this season. The Crimson Tide scored 24 points in the opening half against Mississippi State on Oct. 27. Alabama's highest scoring first half so far this season was a 31-point outburst in the season opener against Michigan. Western Kentucky held the Tide to its lowest first-half output of 2012 to this point as Alabama scored 21 points in the opening half against the Hilltoppers. Alabama has outscored opponents by a margin of 208-31 in the first half this season, including a 104-3 margin in the first quarter and a 104-28 edge in the second quarter, an average halftime score of 26.0 points while allowing just 3.875 points.

FIRST QUARTER POINTS: With T.J. Yeldon's 11-yard run to start the scoring and a 57-yard pass by AJ McCarron to Kenny Bell in the first quarter of last week's game against Mississippi State, Alabama has scored in every first quarter this season, outscoring its opponents 104-3 in the opening quarter this season. Alabama's highest scoring first quarters this year have been 21-point outbursts against Michigan and Missouri. The Tide's lowest first-quarter output was six points against Mississippi.

YARDS HARD TO COME BY: Since the 2011 Capital One Bowl against Michigan State, the Alabama defense has not surrendered yards easily. Over that 22-game span the Tide defense has allowed just one opposing team to reach 300 total yards (341 by Georgia Southern in 2011). Teams have been held under 200 total yards 12 times, and less than 100 total yards twice. Rushing against the Tide has been even more difficult over that span as teams have been held to under 100 yards 19 times, under 50 yards 11 times and in negative yardage twice.

SHELLEY ONE OF TWO PERFECT KICKERS IN 2012: Senior Jeremy Shelley is one of two kickers across the nation yet to miss an extra point or a field goal in 2012. Thus far, Shelley has hit all 40 of his extra point attempts and all nine of his field goals. Four of his field goals have come from the 20-29 yard range, while the other five have come from 30-39 yards. His long on the year is 38. The Tide did have one unsuccessful PAT conversion, but was credited as a team miss after a mishandled snap.

WINNING BIG: When Alabama wins, it usually does so in impressive fashion. Over its last 21 wins, dating back to the 49-7 victory over Michigan State at the 2011 Capital One Bowl, the Crimson Tide has defeated its opponent by 21 points or more in 18 of those contests. Over that span the Tide has downed 12 of those opponents by more than 30 points and posted more than a 40-point margin of victory five times. In the 21 wins, Alabama has an average margin of victory of 31.0 points (652-point margin over 21 games). In addition, the Tide has won its last 11 games by at least 19 points.

TURNOVERS = POINTS: Alabama has converted the 23 turnovers it has forced in eight games this season into 125 points. At the same time, the Crimson Tide has surrendered six turnovers that have resulted in just three points for a 125-3 advantage. Alabama forced three turnovers against Michigan and turned those into 14 points. Against Western Kentucky, Alabama produced 21 points off four Hilltoppers miscues. Alabama capitalized on five Arkansas turnovers for 35 points, followed by another 14 off three interceptions against Mississippi. At Missouri, the Tide scored 14 points off a pair of interceptions and then tallied 13 points on two turnovers at Tennessee, while the Vols got three points off of one Alabama turnover. Most recently, the Tide collected 14 points off two turnovers against Mississippi State. Alabama has a 132-3 edge in points off turnovers if you count the 2012 BCS National Championship Game against LSU.

TURNOVER MARGIN: Alabama enters the 10th week of the season tied for second nationally in turnover margin at plus-2.13. The Crimson Tide has forced 23 turnovers (14 interceptions and nine fumbles) while only giving up six possessions. Over the last 10 games, dating back to the 2011 Auburn game and the 2012 BCS National Championship Game, Alabama holds a 27-7 edge in turnover margin. UA forced a total of 10 fumbles in 2011, recovering seven. In 2012 the Tide has forced 14 and recovered seven in seven games.

ALABAMA UNDER SABAN IN NOVEMBER: In his sixth season at Alabama, head coach Nick Saban has led the Crimson Tide to a 13-7 record in November, with four of those losses coming in 2007. In games played in November, Alabama has outscored its opponents 584-283.

THREE-AND-OUTS: The Alabama defense has been one of the leaders again this season in forcing three-and-outs. The Crimson Tide has forced a three-and-out on 49.5 percent (47-of-95) of opponents drives this season, averaging 5.88 per contest. Alabama had a season-high of nine three-and-outs against Florida Atlantic, had seven against Arkansas to open SEC play, six at Missouri and Tennessee and five against Mississippi State. (Any drive that was stopped in three plays or less or was four plays and a turnover on downs was used to compile this note).

BEATING THE BEST: Alabama is 20-6 against the Associated Press Top 25 over the past four seasons and 11-4 against AP top 10 teams. The Crimson Tide won its 2012 season opener against No. 8 Michigan to start the season 1-0 against the AP Top 25 the posted a 38-7 victory over No. 13 Mississippi State. Alabama went 4-1 vs. top 25 teams in 2011 and 5-3 against the AP Top 25 in 2010. Six of the last seven matchups have gone in favor of the Tide, with the only loss coming in a 9-6 overtime defeat to LSU on November 5, 2011.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 686 of the 1,049 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 413-121-8 (.766) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 55-9 mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 75th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid 1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. UA was ranked No. 1 in the AP preseason poll in 2010 for the first time since 1978 and just the third time in school history.

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES' POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the last half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY took over the poll in 1991 and has run the poll for the last 20 seasons. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide has five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and three USA TODAY (1992, 2009 and 2011) coaches poll national titles.

ALABAMA NO. 2 FOR MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Alabama has won 56 games dating back to the start of the 2008 season, which is the second-most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed that with a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama is 8-0 this season. During that span, the Tide has the most victories of any team that plays in a BCS conference.

10-WIN SEASONS: Alabama reached the 10-win milestone for its fourth consecutive season in 2011, finishing the campaign with a 12-1 record. The Tide has 31 10-win seasons in 117 seasons, two back of Oklahoma (33) for the most 10-win seasons in college football. Alabama has had six 10-win seasons since the 2002 season (2002, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011). Tide head coach Nick Saban is the 11th coach in school history to lead his team to a 10-win season. In addition, Saban is the fifth coach in school history to have more than one 10-win season.

WILLIAMS ONE OF FOUR NON-PUNTERS FROM DOWN UNDER: Senior defensive lineman Jesse Williams is one of just four Australians playing in the Football Bowl Subdivision in a position other than punter. There are currently 13 punters on FBS rosters from Australia.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as a NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

defense (203.13 ypg), scoring defense (8.13 ppg) and pass defense (145.88 ypg), but the Tide leads the nation in red-zone defense (allowing scores on 8-of-15 trips inside the Tide's 20-yard line) and fewest first downs allowed per game (12.25). The Crimson Tide also ranks second in turnover margin (+2.13), fourth in turnovers gained (23) and third-down defense efficiency (25.69% or 28 of 109).

LESTER GETS 13TH CAREER INTERCEPTION: In Alabama's win over Mississippi State last Saturday night, senior safety Robert Lester picked off his 13th career pass, which ranks eighth in Alabama history. The Mississippi State game marked the second consecutive game in which Lester has intercepted a pass.

MILLINER EXPERIENCE BOLSTERS TIDE DEFENSE: Junior cornerback Dee Milliner may not be listed as a returning starter, but it is hard to ignore his experience. Milliner, who is turning in an All-America-caliber season, boasts 23-career starts in just two and a half years of action at the Capstone. He started 11 games as a freshman in 2010 and then served as the Crimson Tide's third cornerback in 2011. He made six starts last season and was on the field more than several starters due to the high percentage of nickel and dime defense UA played in 2011. He has played in 33 career games and has six interceptions to go along with 29 pass breakups and 108 career tackles. Milliner is No. 2 in the nation in passes defended at 2.14 per game (13 PBU, 2 INT).

MOSLEY TIES SCHOOL MARK FOR INTERCEPTIONS FOR A TD: Junior C.J. Mosley intercepted a pass and returned it 16 yards for a touchdown against Michigan in the Cowboys Classic. The touchdown was the third interception return for a score for Mosley in his Alabama career, tying Antonio Langham's (1990-93) school record. Mosley had two touchdown returns in 2010 (vs. Florida and Georgia State). He also has five career interceptions with picks against LSU in the 2011 BCS Allstate National Championship Game and one at Tennessee in 2012.

10 POINTS OR LESS: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide has held opponents to 10 points or less 38 times since the start of the 2007 season with the most recent occurrence coming on Oct. 27, against Mississippi State, which was the fifth this year. Alabama was successful in holding opponents under 10 points in nine games in 2011. In 2010, the Tide held opponents to 10 points or less eight times and limited opponents to that mark seven times in 2008 and 2009. In 2007, Alabama posted two games in which it held opponents to that mark. Alabama has shutout opponents eight times during the Saban tenure.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: In head coach Nick Saban's 75-game tenure at Alabama, the Crimson Tide has limited opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense 50 times, or 66.7 percent of the time.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: During head coach Nick Saban's last 62 games at the Capstone, the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposing offense to less than 200 yards of total offense 24 times, including three times in 2012. Alabama accomplished the feat eight times in 2011. The Tide held Kent State to 90 yards and LSU to just 92 yards BCS Championship Game, which marked the second and third times a Saban defense has limited its opponent to less than 100 yards of total offense. Alabama's best came in 2009 when they held Chattanooga to 84 yards of total offense. The Tide held opponents under 200 yards three times in 2010, four times in 2009 and six times in 2008.

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama leads the nation in giving up the fewest rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season, surrendering only 54. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 36 rushing touchdowns, while Ohio State is second, allowing 50. Alabama has surrendered four rushing touchdowns in 2012.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Limiting opposing running backs to less than 100 yards is nothing new for the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 10 individual 100-yard rushing games dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that leads the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival, the Tide has allowed just five players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 yards), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 yards), Mississippi's BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 yards), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 yards) and Arkansas' Darren McFadden (195 yards).

PICKING UP SACKS: Alabama has been getting to the quarterback regularly as of late, bringing down the signal caller three or more times in seven of its last 10 games. Over that span, the Crimson Tide has tallied 27 sacks and recorded at least one sack in eight straight contests prior to the Tennessee game.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS: Explosive plays have become a staple of one of the nation's most balanced and proficient offenses. The Crimson Tide coaching staff defines explosive plays as passes over 15 yards and runs over 12 yards. Alabama has 44 pass plays in eight games this season of 15 yards or longer, including 25 of over 20 yards by quarterback AJ McCarron. Freshman Amari Cooper leads the receivers with 15 explosive receptions. On the ground, the Tide has 39 rushes of 12 yards or more, with T.J. Yeldon boasting a team-high 16 while Eddie Lacy is just behind with 10.

McCARRON PASSING TOUCHDOWNS: Over the last 11 games, junior quarterback AJ McCarron has been finding the end zone at a frequent rate, totaling 24 scoring tosses over that span. In eight of the last 11 games, McCarron has also thrown two or more touchdowns, including four at Tennessee. The signal caller has thrown two or more in six of the eight games this season, setting a new career high in multi-passing touchdown games. He has equaled his career high of four touchdowns twice during the span, against Western Kentucky and at Tennessee.

McCARRON MOVING UP ON CAREER TD PASSES LIST: With two touchdown passes against Mississippi State on Oct. 27, AJ McCarron now has 37 career touchdown passes. That total ranks 4th in Alabama history behind John Parker Wilson (47 - 2005-08), Brodie Croyle (41 - 2002-05) and Greg McElroy (39 - 2007-10).

McCARRON ON SINGLE-SEASON TD PASSES LIST: AJ McCarron's 18 touchdown passes this season ranks tied for second on the Alabama single-season passing touchdowns list with John Parker Wilson, who also threw for 18 touchdowns in 2007. Greg McElroy holds the single-season passing touchdowns mark with 20, set in 2010.

McCARRON STARTS FAST: Quarterback AJ McCarron has tossed 18 touchdowns in the first eight games this season. No other Alabama quarterback has thrown for that many to start a season. The school record for touchdowns in the first eight games was Mike Shula with 14. Ten of McCarron's touchdown passes occurred within the first four games making him the first Alabama quarterback to throw for 10 touchdowns in a four-game stretch. The previous record was nine by Gary Hollingsworth (1989) and John Parker Wilson in 2007. McCarron has also thrown for 11 touchdowns in his last five games (FAU, Mississippi, Missouri, Tennessee and Mississippi State) this season.

McCARRON PASSES WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION: AJ McCarron continues to build his school record of passes without an interception. After passing Brodie Croyle's record of 190, McCarron enters the LSU game with an active streak of 262 passing attempts without an interception. His streak of 262 consecutive passes without an interception is the second longest in SEC history, but still well back of Kentucky's Andre Woodson, who went 325 attempts between interceptions. The NCAA record is held by Russell Wilson of North Carolina State over the 2008-09 seasons.

EFFICIENT IN PASSING GAME: Quarterback AJ McCarron leads the nation in passing efficiency with a 182.40 mark. McCarron has tossed 18 touchdowns without an interception this season (177 pass attempts). He is completing 68.9 percent of his passes for 1,684 yards.

RUSHING TO SUCCESS: Alabama rushed for 179 against Mississippi State on Oct. 27. Alabama is 45-0 since the start of the 2008 season when the Tide rushes for at least 150 yards.

LACY BREAKS AWAY: Junior running back Eddie Lacy eclipsed the 100-yard mark on just his sixth carry of the game at Missouri on Oct. 13. The 100-yard performance was the second on the season for the Geismar, La., native and the fourth of his career. A significant chunk of his yards came on a career-high 73-yard score, the longest run for the Crimson Tide since Trent Richardson found the end zone against Mississippi on Oct. 15, 2011. Lacy finished with a career-high 177 yards and tied a career high with three rushing touchdowns. He has 596 yards rushing on 109 attempts in 2012 for a 5.5 yards per carry average.

LACY AND YELDON: Running backs Eddie Lacy (177) and T.J. Yeldon (144) combined to rush for 321 yards and five touchdowns against Missouri on Oct. 13. The two became the first rushing duo to score two or more rushing touchdowns in the same game since Trent Richardson (4) and Jalston Fowler (2) combined for six against Mississippi on Oct. 15, 2011. That was also the last time a duo rushed for more than 100 yards apiece.

A BALANCED ATTACK: Alabama has had one of the most balanced offenses in the nation over the past four years. That trend is continuing again in 2012 as the Crimson Tide has collected 1,715 yards rushing in addition to 1,776 yards passing, a difference of just 61 yards. Since the 2009 season, Alabama has passed for 10,599 while rushing for 9,892, a difference of just 707 yards.

YELDON FIRST TRUE FRESHMAN TO GO OVER 100 IN DEBUT: Running back T.J. Yeldon became the first Alabama true freshman to rush for more than 100 yards in his debut in the win over Michigan, finishing the game with 111 yards on 11 carries and one rushing touchdown. Yeldon is the seventh Alabama running back to crack the century mark since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007. Mark Ingram was the last true freshman to gain at least 95 yards in his debut, running for 96 yards against Clemson in the 2008 opener at the Georgia Dome. Yeldon gained 144 yards at Missouri for his second 100-yard rushing effort and followed that with 129 yards at Tennessee for his third.

FINISHING STRONG: Over the last 22 games, dating back to the 2011 Capital One Bowl against Michigan State on January 1, 2011, the Crimson Tide has outscored its opponents 617-118 in the final three quarters of games after holding a 210-40 edge in the first quarter. The disparity is even wider over the last 18 games where Alabama owned a 180-44 scoring edge in the first quarter and a 570-123 edge in the final three quarters. Alabama outscored its opposition in the second half of its last 19 games by a score of 330-68.

BALL PROTECTION: The Alabama offense has protected the football better than any team in the country over the last five years. In 62 games, the Crimson Tide has turned the ball over just 63 times (36 fumbles, 27 interceptions) for an average of 1.02 turnovers per game, better than Ohio State's second best average of 1.23 per game (75 turnovers, 61 games). Since 2009, that mark is even better as the Tide has turned the ball over just 44 times in 48 games (0.92 per game). Individually since 2009, UA starting quarterbacks have thrown an impressively-low 14 interceptions in 1,144 attempts (1 INT for every 81.7 attempts). The top two running backs in the rotation dating back to the 2009 season have only lost a fumble five times. Over the 62-game span, the Tide's top two running backs have recorded 1,266 touches, losing the ball just once in every 253.2 carries.

BARRETT JONES: VERSATILITY ON THE OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior All-American Barrett Jones started at right guard in 2009 and 2010, but added a few responsibilities to his résumé in the 2011 season. He started at left tackle and also saw snaps at left guard, right tackle and center last year. The winner of the Outland Trophy, Jones has started 44 games at the Capstone, including 25 at right guard, 11 at left tackle and eight this season at center. Jones is listed among the top centers in the nation and a candidate for the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy. In addition to being named the 2011 Outland Trophy winner, Jones also received the ARA Sportsmanship Award and the Wuerffel Trophy for his commitment to the community and academics.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE A KEY: The Alabama offensive line has been one of the most recognized and skilled groups in the country. Preseason magazines, including Athlon Sports and Phil Steele, rank Alabama's offensive line as the No. 1 unit in the country. Eight games into the 2012 season, the line represents 135 starts, with senior center Barrett Jones claiming 44 of those starts. Chance

Warmack has made 34 starts at left guard, while D.J. Fluker has 30 starts at right guard. Junior Anthony Steen has 19 at right guard while the newest addition, Cyrus Kouandjio at left tackle, now has eight starts to his credit.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

KICKOFF RETURN FOR A TOUCHDOWN: Christian Jones answered a Mississippi touchdown on Sept. 29, with a 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, the first by a Crimson Tide player since Trent Richardson found the end zone at Duke on Sept. 18, 2010. The 99-yard return for a score tied for the eighth longest in school history.

FOSTER DIALS IN FROM DEEP: With his career-long 52-yard field goal against Florida Atlantic on Sept. 22, Cade Foster became the first Alabama kicker since Neal Thomas in 2000 to connect on three 50-plus yard field goals in the same season. His 52-yard strike was the longest by a Tide kicker since Leigh Tiffin hit from 52 yards against Utah in the Sugar Bowl on January 2, 2009.

KICKOFF PROWESS: Alabama kicker Cade Foster recorded five touchbacks in the first half against Arkansas and six against Florida Atlantic on September 22. On Sept. 29, against Mississippi, Foster collected a career-high seven touchbacks while recording three at Missouri and four at Tennessee. Eight games into the 2012 season the Crimson Tide has already exceeded the entire amount tallied from last season, totaling 31 thus far. *Kickoffs have been moved up to the 35 yard line this season.*

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-LSU SERIES: Alabama leads the series with LSU 46-25-5, which dates back to the 1895 season. The 2012 game will be the 77th meeting between these two long-time Southern football rivals. The Tigers won the inaugural meeting in Baton Rouge, 12-6, on Nov. 18, 1895. The two teams did not meet again until the 1902 season, with LSU prevailing once again. Alabama's first series win came on Nov. 9, 1903, in Baton Rouge as the Crimson Tide scored a 10-0 victory. From 1919-45, Alabama posted a 12-game unbeaten streak (9-0-3) against LSU. The series was resumed during the 1944 season with the Tigers gaining a slight advantage over the next nine meetings, posting a 5-3-1 record from 1946-58. Alabama went 16-2 (.889) against LSU from 1964-81, including a series-long 11-game winning streak from 1971-81. LSU also ended UA's school record 31-game (30-0-1) unbeaten streak with a 17-13 win at Bryant-Denny Stadium in 1993. The Tigers snapped a 15-game winless streak to the Crimson Tide in Tiger Stadium with a 30-28 win in Baton Rouge on Nov. 4, 2000. LSU has won nine of the last 16 meetings, dating back to 1997. Alabama snapped a five-game series skid with the 27-21 overtime win in Baton Rouge in 2008 and followed that with a 24-15 win in Tuscaloosa in 2009. In 2011, the Tide fell to the Tigers 9-6 in overtime in the regular-season contest before meeting for the BCS National Championship, where Alabama came out on top, 21-0.

LSU CONNECTIONS: The Alabama football team has many connections back to LSU and the State of Louisiana with seven coaches that worked in the state and six players from Louisiana. Tide head coach Nick Saban spent five seasons (2000-04) running the Tigers' program, leading them to the 2003 National Championship and two SEC Championships. Running backs coach Burton Burns grew up in New Orleans and had assistant coaching stints at Tulane, Southern and St. Augustine High School. Defensive coordinator Kirby Smart coached the Tigers' defensive backs in 2004 while Bobby Williams tutored the wide receivers. Lance Thompson coached at LSU in 2002-03. Offensive coordinator Doug Nussmeier played for the New Orleans Saints in 1994-97. The Tide's Director of Strength and Conditioning Scott Cochran is an LSU graduate and an assistant strength coach in 2003-04. UA equipment manager Jeff Springer is also an LSU graduate and was an assistant equipment manager for the Tigers from 2003-05. The six players from Louisiana include: WR Kenny Bell, DB Landon Collins, LB Denzel Devall, RB Eddie Lacy, punter Cody Mandell and DB Bradley Sylve.



NATIONAL CHAMPIONS: Nick Saban, Gene Chizik, Les Miles and Steve Spurrier are the four active SEC coaches to win a national championship. Saban led Alabama to the 2009 and 2011 BCS National Championships and LSU to a 13-1 record and the BCS National Championship in 2003, while Chizik led Auburn to the 2010 title. Miles guided the Tigers to the BCS National Championship in 2007 while Spurrier led Florida to a 12-1 ledger and the school's first national title in 1996.

ALABAMA-LSU AT VARIOUS SITES: The Alabama-LSU series has been played at six different sites since the initial meeting in 1895. The city of Baton Rouge has hosted the most games in the series (35), with Alabama posting a 24-9-2 record on the LSU campus. Only one other Louisiana city has hosted this series, with Alabama and LSU playing to a 7-7 tie in New Orleans in 1921. Four Alabama cities have played host to this rivalry, including Tuscaloosa, Mobile, Montgomery and Birmingham.

ALABAMA-LSU SERIES IS A LONG ONE: The LSU series is the fifth-longest series in school history. The two teams began playing in 1895, the 15th game in Crimson Tide history, and the 2012 game marks the 77th meeting between the two teams. Only Mississippi State (97), Tennessee (95), Vanderbilt (83) and Auburn (76) have played Alabama more than LSU.

SABAN VS. LSU: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 3-4 in his career against LSU, following last year's 21-0 win in New Orleans. Prior to that, Alabama had lost two in a row with a 9-6 overtime defeat in Tuscaloosa on Nov. 5, 2012, and a 24-21 loss in Baton Rouge in 2011. Alabama won the two previous meetings with a 27-21 overtime victory in 2008 and a 24-15 win in 2009. Before his arrival in Tuscaloosa, Saban-coached teams were 0-2 against LSU, losing 46-25 to the Tigers while at Michigan State in the 1995 Independence Bowl in Shreveport and 41-34 in 2007 Tuscaloosa. Saban was the head coach at LSU from 2000-04 and compiled a 48-16 (.750) record, leading the Tigers to the 2003 BCS National Championship and two SEC Championships during his tenure. In 2003, Saban led the Tigers to a 13-1 record and a 21-14 win over Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship Game played at the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans, La.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

LAST TIME ALABAMA TRAILED: Despite only trailing for one play when Mississippi scored 1:20 into the second quarter on Sept. 29, it was the first time Alabama had done so in regulation since Tennessee opened the scoring with a field goal with 3:58 left in the first quarter last season (October 22, 2011). That streak spanned over nine complete games or 40 quarters. After trailing to Mississippi, Alabama scored 21 unanswered points to end the half and trailed the Rebels for only 15 seconds.

48 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 63 GAMES: Alabama's appearance on CBS this weekend will mark the 48th nationally-televised game since the start of the 2008 season for the Crimson Tide. The Tide will play its seventh nationally televised game in 2012, with one game on ABC, three on CBS and three on ESPN. In 2011, Alabama played on CBS four times, while having one game on ABC, two games on ESPN and ESPN2 with one game on ESPNU. In 2010, Alabama had five games on CBS, three games on ESPN, two games on ESPN2, one on ABC and one on ESPNU. In 2009, UA played two games on ABC, including the BCS National Championship Game, and six games on CBS while ESPN broadcasted two more Crimson Tide games. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games broadcasted nationally, including five games on CBS, three games on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama has compiled a 198-126-4 (.610) all-time record in 326 televised games. This does not include pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts.

TIDE 57-3 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: The Crimson Tide is 57-3 when leading at halftime under head coach Nick Saban. Alabama had a 28-game winning streak snapped in 2010 against LSU. The first

two losses came against LSU with the last loss to Auburn in 2010. In 2007, UA held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing, 41-34, on Nov. 3, 2007, at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In 2010, UA led 10-3 at the half before the Tigers rallied for a 24-20 win at Tiger Stadium. The Tide lost 28-27 to Auburn to close out the 2010 season after leading 24-7 at the half. The Crimson Tide is 3-5 under Saban when trailing at halftime and 3-3 when tied at halftime. The three wins when trailing at the half came in a 34-24 win over No. 7 Virginia Tech on Sept. 5, 2009, in Atlanta; a 24-15 victory over No. 9 LSU on Nov. 7, 2009; and a 24-20 win at Arkansas on Sept. 25, 2010. Alabama's three wins when tied at halftime came at LSU on Nov. 8, 2008, (a 27-21 victory), at Auburn with a 26-21 win on Nov. 27, 2009 and against Tennessee on Oct. 22, 2011 (a 37-6 victory).

TRUE FRESHMEN IN ACTION: Alabama has had 11 true freshmen make their debuts so far this season, including defensive back Landon Collins, wide receiver Amari Cooper, linebacker Denzel Devall, running back Kenyan Drake, linebacker Tyler Hayes, wide receiver Cyrus Jones, defensive lineman Darren Lake, linebacker Dillon Lee, linebacker Reggie Ragland, defensive back Geno Smith and running back T.J. Yeldon. Alabama has also had 11 redshirt freshmen – tight end Brent Calloway, quarterback Phillip Ely, tight end Malcolm Faciane, running back Dee Hart, center Ryan Kelly, defensive lineman LaMichael Fanning, defensive end D.J. Pettway, wide receivers Marvin Shinn, defensive back Bradley Sylve, defensive back Jabriel Washington and receiver Danny Woodson Jr. Junior college transfer Deion Belue also started and played his first seven games with the Crimson Tide.

CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE: Alabama returned 43 lettermen from the 2011 National Championship team, but the Crimson Tide also boasts 21 players who played on both 2009 and 2011 championship teams. Looking a little deeper you find the Tide had eight players that saw action for both 2009 and 2011 teams. There were also three players that started at least two games in both 2009 and 2011, including Barrett Jones, Michael Williams and Nico Johnson. Below is a list of the 21 current players that were on both of Coach Saban's national championship teams at Alabama.

CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICANS: Since head coach Nick Saban became the Alabama head coach in 2007, he has had a knack for developing young recruits into All-Americans. In his five years at UA, Saban has produced the most consensus All-Americans in the nation with 11. Saban's consensus All-Americans include Antoine Caldwell (center, 2008), Andre Smith (offensive line, 2008), Terrence Cody (defensive line, 2008 and 2009), Rolando McClain (linebacker, 2009), Mark Ingram (running back, 2009), Mike Johnson (offensive line, 2009), Javier Arenas (cornerback, 2009), Mark Barron (safety, 2011), Dont'a Hightower (linebacker, 2011), Barrett Jones (offensive line, 2011) and Trent Richardson (running back, 2011). Second in the same time period is Oklahoma with nine, while Florida has registered seven in that five-year period.

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past five seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has also coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. The 2012 squad features six players that already have degrees in hand, including Barrett Jones (August, 2011), Robert Lester (December,

2011), William Ming (May, 2012), Damion Square (May, 2012), Carson Tinker (August, 2012) and Michael Williams (May, 2012). Over the past five seasons (2008-12) Alabama has seen 58 players compete for the Crimson Tide after having already graduated.

NICK'S KIDS: At Michigan State, head coach Nick Saban and his wife, Terry, started the Nick's Kids Foundation, which the Sabans have continued in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise more than \$2.5 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 150 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama.

GAMEDAY COACHING DUTIES FOR CRIMSON TIDE IN 2012: The Crimson Tide's assistants will be split between the coaches' booth and the sideline in 2012. Nussmeier, Burton Burns, Jeremy Pruitt and Thompson will be in the booth, while Kirby Smart, Chris Rumph, Jeff Stoutland, Bobby Williams and Mike Groh are on the sideline.

SCHOLARSHIP SENIORS: Alabama is tied for fourth in the nation with the fewest number of scholarship seniors as the Crimson Tide features nine heading into the 2012 campaign. The Crimson Tide was one of four teams in the No. 1 spot until long snapper Carson Tinker was awarded a scholarship by head coach Nick Saban on August 20.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw eight former UA players selected in the 2012 NFL Draft, including first-round picks Trent Richardson (third overall to the Cleveland Browns), Mark Barron (seventh overall to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers), Dre Kirkpatrick (17th overall to the Cincinnati Bengals) and Dont'a Hightower (25th overall to the New England Patriots). Courtney Upshaw was next to go in the second round, and 35th overall pick, to the Baltimore Ravens. The Tide had two drafted in the fifth round with Josh Chapman going to the Indianapolis Colts as the 136th overall pick and DeQuan Menzie to the Kansas City Chiefs as the 146th overall pick. Rounding out the 2012 NFL draft for Alabama was Brad Smelley, who went in the seventh round as the 247th overall pick to the Cleveland Browns. Over the past two seasons, the Tide has had a combined eight first round draft picks, ranking Alabama fourth in most players selected over a two-year span. In the common draft era The Tide also came in a No. 4 on the most defensive players selected in the first round over a three-year

span with six.

- Saban has a 149-54-1 (.733) record as a college head coach to date. He has four conference championships and 13 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship following the 2003, 2009 and 2011 seasons.

- Saban is the only coach to win three BCS National Championships. He was also the first to win BCS titles at two different schools. Saban is one of just two (Bob Stoops, Oklahoma) current Football Bowl Subdivision coach to coach for at least 10 years and not suffer a losing season. In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC Championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship. He then followed that up with his second BCS Championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.V., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise more than \$2.5 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 150 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 14 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Project Team Up and Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that struck Tuscaloosa.

- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The Alabama defense forced four turnovers, including two that led to ensuing touchdowns, as the top-ranked Crimson Tide (2-0) cruised to a 35-0 victory over Western Kentucky (1-1) Saturday afternoon at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama's offense overcame a Hilltoppers defense that was stacked to stifle the Crimson Tide rushing game as quarterback AJ McCarron threw four touchdown passes in an efficient performance.

Two of Alabama's scoring drives needed to cover just 33 and 12 yards after the Tide defense forced WKU turnovers. While Western Kentucky limited the Alabama offense to 103 rushing yards, the Crimson Tide defense produced another dominant performance by holding the explosive Hilltoppers to 224 total yards while garnering Alabama's fourth shutout over the last two seasons. McCarron passed for 219 yards to lead the Tide offense, completing 14 of 19 passes, including three for 92 yards to Kevin Norwood.

Norwood and Christian Jones became the first Alabama tandem since 1950 to post at least two touchdown catches in the same game. Linebacker C.J. Mosley led the Tide defense with 11 tackles, including one quarterback sack, while linebackers Nico Johnson and Adrian Hubbard forced fumbles.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — The top-ranked Crimson Tide (3-0 overall; 1-0 in the Southeastern Conference) was physically dominant on the line of scrimmage both offensively and defensively, and took advantage of five Arkansas turnovers in a 52-0 rout of the Razorbacks (1-2 overall; 0-1 in the SEC) on Saturday afternoon before a crowd of 74,617 at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

The margin of victory represents the largest Alabama victory margin in an SEC game since a 55-0 win over Auburn in 1948 and is the fourth-largest margin in an SEC game ranking behind a 65-0 win over Sewanee in 1937, a 66-3 win at Vanderbilt in 1979, and the 55-0 win vs. Auburn in 1948. In addition, the shutout marked the first time Arkansas has failed to score in Fayetteville since 1966.

Alabama had four scoring drives of 30 yards or less, including two of less than 10 yards, as the Tide's defense and special teams forced turnovers leading to scores. AJ McCarron completed 11 of 16 passes for 188 yards and one touchdown, while receiver Christian Jones caught three passes for 73 yards and running back Eddie Lacy had 55 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Alabama offense. Safety HaHa Clinton-Dix set up one score by returning an interception 46 yards to the Arkansas 3-yard line, Vinnie Sunseri ended an Arkansas threat with an interception. Alabama limited the injury-plagued Razorbacks offense to 137 total yards on the day.

Cooper scored on passes of 16 and 12 yards from quarterback AJ McCarron, who set a new Alabama mark for consecutive pass attempts without an interception, breaking the mark of 190 previously set by Brodie Croyle in 2005. McCarron ended the game with an active streak of 206 pass attempts without an interception while completing 22 of 30 for 180 yards and two scores without an interception.

Running back Eddie Lacy led all rushers with 82 yards on 19 carries and Christian Jones returned a second quarter kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown for the Crimson Tide. Linebacker C.J. Mosley led the Alabama defense with 10 tackles while cornerback Dee Milliner intercepted a pass, broke up four passes and assisted on a quarterback sack.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Alabama quarterback AJ McCarron passed for a career-high 306 yards and four touchdowns, connecting with freshman wide receiver Amari Cooper seven times for 162 yards and two scores as the top-ranked Crimson Tide (7-0 overall; 4-0 in the Southeastern Conference) dominated Tennessee (3-4 overall; 0-4 SEC) in a 44-13 victory before a capacity crowd of 102,455 at Neyland Stadium on Saturday night. Freshman running back T.J. Yeldon rushed for 129 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Alabama ground game.

The latest renewal of the storied "Third Saturday in October" rivalry was marked by an explosive night by the Alabama offense, which rolled to 539 yards of total offense behind a potent passing game. The Alabama defense bottled up what had been an exciting Tennessee offense, limiting the Volunteers to 282 total yards on the night while forcing two turnovers. Alabama repelled Tennessee drives inside Crimson Tide territory several times, including a fourth-down stop at the Tide 33 and an interception by safety Robert Lester in the end zone that snuffed another Volunteers' threat.

Cooper had six catches for 120 yards and a touchdown in the first half alone as the Tide raced to a 23-10 lead at intermission before putting away the game in the second half. The victory was Alabama's sixth straight in the series. McCarron enjoyed an efficient night passing as he completed 17 of 22 attempts just one week after suffering a minor knee injury in the second half against Missouri.
