BULLDOGS HEAD TO BATON ROUGE FOR ANOTHER RANKED BATTLE

Mississippi State travels to Baton Rouge this weekend to face LSU, the Bulldogs' third-consecutive top-15 foe. The game will be broadcast on ESPN with Brad Nessler, Todd Blackledge and Holly Rowe on the call. Saturday's game is the first time since 2007 the Bulldogs will face a third-straight ranked foe.

MISSISSIPPI STATE LOOKING TO CONTINUE 1999 COMPARISONS

The 2012 edition of Mississippi State football became only the second team in school history to win its first seven games of the season, joining the 1999 team. The '99 team was the last Bulldog squad to defeat LSU, posting a 17-16 victory in late October.

MULLEN CONTINUES TO CLIMB SCHOOL WIN CHARTS

Head Coach Dan Mullen has led the Bulldogs to 28 wins in three-plus seasons, good for fifth most in school history. A win vs. LSU would tie him with W.D. Chadwick (1909-13) for fourth-most all-time. Mullen's .596 winning percentage ranks ninth all-time and third among any coach who amassed more than three years of experience in Starkville.

OFFENSE STILL SCORING AT NEAR RECORD PACE

The Mississippi State offense has scored 277 points through its first nine games, its most through the first nine contests since the 2000 squad scored 307 points. The scoring an average of 30.1 points per game is approaching the modern-era record of 31.7 set in 1994. The Bulldogs have scored 27 or more points in seven games, only the third time in school history the team has eclipsed 27 in seven games in a single season (1998 and 2000).

BALANCED ATTACK HAS PRODUCED RESULTS

Of 589 offensive plays, offensive coordinator Les Koenning's group has run 306 times (51.9 percent) and passed 283 times (48.1 percent). The Bulldog offense has gained 3,484 total yards, with 2,076 yards (59.6 percent) through the air. The Bulldogs rushed more times than passed in each of the first seven games of the season.

RUSSELL, PASSING GAME HAVE EXCELLED

The Tyler Russell-led Mississippi State passing attack has compiled more than 2,000 yards just three-quarters of the way through the season. The 2012 team is only 234 yards from entering the all-time top 10 with 2,076 yards and only 16 completions away from the top 10 in that category. The 230 yards-per-game would be the second-highest average ever and the 59.4 completion percentage would be a new school record. The total of 18 touchdown passes is one away from the school mark of 19, set last season.

TURNOVERS HAVE GENERALLY TOLD STORY

In recent seasons, no stat has been a better harbinger of success for the Bulldogs than turnover margin. Over the last three-plus seasons, State has won 22 of 23 games when victorious in the turnover column. Conversely, the Bulldogs have won just five times out of 14 when losing the turnover battle.

Through nine games, State ranks sixth in the nation with a plus-13 turnover margin. The Bulldogs are tied for 19th nationally with 21 forced turnovers.

MSU LOOKING TO FOR ONE OF BEST MARKS THROUGH 10 GAMES

Should the Bulldogs win Saturday, their 8-2 mark through 10 games will tie the 1999 squad for the second best start through nine games in school history (9-0-1 in 1940). In fact, Mississippi State has won eight games in a season only 14 times in its previous 112 years of football.

NEARLY DONE AT HALF, CERTAINTY AFTER THREE

Since Dan Mullen took over the Mississippi State program in 2009, the Bulldogs have won 24 of 26 games led at halftime. Even more impressively, State has won all 27 games in which it had a lead entering the fourth quarter. Overall, the Bulldogs have a 37-game winning streak when up to begin the fourth.

BANKS AMONG BEST DEFENDERS IN THE COUNTRY

On Oct. 29, senior defensive back Johnthan Banks became the first player in school history to be named a semifinalist for the Chuck Bednarik Award, given annually to the outstanding defensive player of the year. The All-American was also named a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, which goes to the best defensive back in college football. Banks is the third player in program history named a semifinalist, and the first in back-to-back seasons.

RUSSELL HAS BEEN ELITE

Tyler Russell is one of seven quarterbacks nationally with 15-plus passing touchdowns and three or fewer interceptions this season:

QUARTERBACK SET TO BREAK MANY SCHOOL MARKS

Russell, with 13 career starts, has already tossed 29 touchdown passes, good for fifth on the school's all-time list. The Manning Award Watch List QB has already entered the school's top 10 in passing yardage (3,623, ranks seventh). This past Saturday vs. Texas A&M, Russell tied the single-season school record with his 16th touchdown pass of the season.

He needs two completions and one attempt to reach the school's top 10 in each of those categories. Russell is on pace to pass the school single-season records for completions, attempts, and passing yardage.

BUMPHIS REACHES ONE MILESTONE, ON PACE FOR OTHERS

Senior wide receiver Chad Bumphis is the university's record holder in touchdown receptions and hauled in his 19th against Texas A&M. The All-SEC candidate now has 131 career receptions, good for fourth on the school's all-time list. He needs 27 receptions to tie the school record of 162 set by David Smith in 1970. His 1,884 career yards rank fifth all time and his 2,988 all-purpose yards rank ninth on the school's all-time chart.

Bumphis is tied for the SEC lead among wideouts in 2012 with seven touchdowns, which is tied for third most in a single season in school history.

PERKINS HAS TAKEN OVER EVERY DOWN RB ROLE

Junior tailback LaDarius Perkins entered the 2012 as a do-everything scat back, but has emerged as a solid, every-down player for the Bulldogs. Perkins is second in the conference in all-purpose yards per game (135.2) and third in rushing (89.3). Perkins' 179 rushing yards at Troy Sept. 15 is still the single-game high for an SEC running back this season and he has eclipsed the 100-yard mark four times. Perkins is fifth in the country with 193 all-purpose yards per game on the road.

BANKS PLAYING THE PART OF ALL-AMERICAN

Senior defensive back Johnthan Banks has been named a midseason All-American by ESPN, Sports Illustrated, CBS Sports and Phil Steele. For the season, the team captain has intercepted four passes, forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and has broken up five passes. Banks is tied for second among all active players with 16 career interceptions, tied with Walt Harris for the school mark, and needs only four picks to tie the SEC career record of 20 (set twice).

DAK ATTACK

Redshirt freshman quarterback Dak Prescott has accounted for five touchdowns so far in 2012 (3 rushing, 2 passing). Prescott became the first MSU freshman to account for a touchdown in three-straight games since Matt Wyatt did it in four-straight games in 1996.

MCKINNEY LEADING ALL SEC FRESHMEN DEFENDERS

Redshirt freshman Benardrick McKinney, posted 14 tackles last weekend and now has a team-leading 73 on the season, which is third among freshmen nationally. His 8.1 tackle-per-game average ranks seventh in the SEC, and he is the only freshman among the top 20 SEC tackle leaders. McKinney would become the first freshman to lead the team in tackles since at least 1975.

OFFENSIVE LINE HAS BEEN SOLID IN RUN, PASS GAMES

Led by All-American candidates Gabe Jackson and Dillon Day on the offensive line, Mississippi State quarterbacks have been sacked only eight times this season, tied for 15th-lowest nationally. State is one of three SEC schools (Alabama, LSU) with four running backs averaging over 5.0 yards per carry.

DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD LOADED WITH PLAYMAKERS

Johnthan Banks is far from the lone star in the Mississippi State defensive backfield this season. Seniors Corey Broomfield and Darius Slay along with junior Nickoe Whitley have played substantial amounts of football for the Bulldogs. Combined, the starting four have played in 147 games and earned 114 starts. They've also intercepted 39 career passes, with eight returned for touchdowns.

SWEDENBERG HAS BEEN SOLID, CONSISTENT

Junior punter Baker Swedenberg has been a constant comfort on special teams. The Ray Guy Award candidate has punted 38 times this season, forcing 22 fair catches with an additional 14 being downed inside the 20.

On eight attempted returns, opponents have totaled zero yards with a long return of four yards. As a team, Mississippi State ranks first nationally in return yards allowed and 13th in net punting.

FRESHMAN KICKER BELL HAS HAD MOMENTS

True freshman place kicker Devon Bell is 9-of-15 on field goal attempts, with a pair of blocked kicks hurting his average. Bell has also handled kickoffs this season and has 12 touchbacks on 42 kicks. Opponents average starting field position after a kickoff is their own 25.

Bell is sixth in the nation and leads the SEC in scoring among true freshmen kickers.

AN EXPLOSION IN EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

Through nine games this season, the Bulldogs already have 67 plays of 20+ yards. Last year Mississippi State averaged 3.5 plays per game of 20+ yards (46 total). Last season Mississippi State had 12 total touchdowns that came on plays of 20-plus yards. The Bulldogs have 13 such scoring plays in 2012.

GREEN AMONG NATION'S BEST TIGHT ENDS

Senior tight end Marcus Green was one of 25 players nationally to be named to the John Mackey Award Midseason Watch List, given annually to the nation's best tight end. The All-SEC candidate was named the National Tight End of the Week for the second time this season on Oct. 17. He has caught 17 passes with five touchdowns on the year, which is tied for third most by a tight end nationally.

LAWRENCE RETURNING TO TACKLING FORM

Senior Cameron Lawrence saw limited playing time early in the season as younger players got valuable experience, but the team captain has picked up production as playing time has increased in conference play.

The Coldwater, Miss., native has posted double-digit tackles in four of five conference games, including 5.5 tackles for loss in his last three contests. Lawrence has posted double-digit tackles each of the last two weeks and ranks ninth in the SEC with an eight tackle-per-game average. He is the only player in the Southeastern Conference ranked in the top 10 in both tackles and sacks.

SMITH ENJOYING SENIOR CAMPAIGN

Wide receiver Chris Smith hauled in four passes for 60 yards last week against Texas A&M. Smith, a high-school teammate of Tyler Russell at Meridian, is the team's second leading receiver with 33 catches for 426 yards and a pair of scores. Smith is the first Mississippi State player with three or more catches in seven-straight games since Chad Bumphis did it in seven straight from Nov. 2009-Oct. 2010.

PROTECTING THE BALL

Mississippi State is tied for sixth nationally with only eight turnovers. Of those eight, six have been committed by the offense. The Bulldogs lost fumbles on both a punt and kickoff return in the loss to Alabama.

OFFENSE HAS SPREAD WEALTH

Through the first eight games of the season, Tyler Russell hasn't been shy to give the ball to a multitude of playmakers. Russell has completed passes to 15 different receivers.

The Bulldogs have also shared the ball in the running game, with 10 different players earning at least one carry through the first eight weeks.

Thirteen players have scored touchdowns for MSU, which is tied for 13th nationally.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

With 19 true (4) or redshirt (15) freshmen having already played a game for the Bulldogs this season, MSU is tied for 26th in the country in freshmen played.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

In the SEC, only Tyler Bray of Tennessee has more passing touchdowns inside the red zone (14) than Tyler Russell (10). Russell has nine less attempts. Running back Derrick Milton leads the SEC in yards per carry in the red zone (7.75), while Josh Robinson is fourth (5.57).

FOURTH QUARTER TOUGHNESS

In the fourth quarter, Mississippi State is sixth in the country with 5.79 yards per carry. Sophomore running back Nick Griffin is seventh nationally with 11.4 yards per carry in the final quarter.

GAME RECAP...

STARKVILLE, Miss. – For three-plus quarters, Mississippi State did an excellent job of keeping LSU's potent offense out of the end zone. Unfortunately for the No. 25 Bulldogs, the Tigers' D was just a tad bit more masterful.

In front of a raucous crowd of 56,925 on Thursday night, the third largest in Scott Field history, No. 3 LSU continued its winning ways against MSU with a 19-6 slugfest victory to claim its 12th-consecutive win in this storied series that dates back to 1913.

However, it wasn't until the fourth quarter that this nationally-televised ESPN showdown was decided.

With the Tigers leading 9-6 following a 41-yard field goal by Drew Alleman with 1:46 to play in the third quarter, LSU scored the game's lone touchdown three minutes into the fourth when Jarrett Lee connected with Rueben Randle from 19 yards out for a 16-6 lead.

It was a hole that proved too deep for the Bulldogs (1-2, 0-2) to climb out.

"Our guys played tough, played physical," third-year MSU coach Dan Mullen said. "We just needed to make a few more plays."

As for the rest of the scoring, all credit goes to both place-kickers.

LSU, which travels to West Virginia next week, initiated all scoring on an Alleman 21-yard field goal with 5:42 left in the first quarter. However, the Bulldogs answered on their following possession when Derek DePasquale cleared the uprights to even the game at 3-apiece with 4 seconds left in the opening frame.

Then in the second quarter, Alleman struck again, this time from 42 yards to give LSU a 6-3 advantage, a score that stood at intermission.

In the third quarter, though, Mississippi State tied the game again when DePasquale drained his 42-yard attempt, the 25th of his career.

And of course, it's only fitting the game's scoring would end with a field goal, a 29-yarder by Alleman with 2:53 remaining.

Again, credit both defenses.

MSU, which returns home at 6 p.m. on Sept. 24 against Louisiana Tech, entered the game leading the SEC in total offense at 588.0, while LSU's average stood at 336.5.

On Thursday, though, the Bulldogs didn't come close to reaching that total as they accumulated just 193 yards, their lowest in the Dan Mullen era.

"We just never got into a rhythm," Mullen said. "We had our opportunities, but our playmakers just have to make plays."

DAN MULLEN

HEAD COACH • THIRD SEASON

In just three full seasons, Dan Mullen has revitalized and re-energized the Mississippi State fan base. From the moment of his introduction on Dec. 10, 2008 as the 32nd head coach in school history, supporters have turned out in record numbers and capacity crowds to support the Bulldogs.

Mississippi State fans have sold out a school-record 16 consecutive home games at Davis Wade Stadium. Each of the last two years have seen the school's attendance record broken. In fact, 13 of the school's top 15 crowds have occurred in the last three years, with all six crowds last season ranking in the top 15 all-time. The Bulldog faithful have gone on to watch the head coach lead the Maroon and White's football program to back-to-back postseason bowl wins for the first time in over a decade.

Just three years into his tenure, Mullen (.553) is already the winningest coach at State since Darrell Royal in 1954-55 (.600), and is already tied for sixth in school history for wins by a MSU head coach (21). On top of that, Mullen has dominated the Egg Bowl rivalry, becoming just the second MSU coach and the first since Sid Robinson from 1917-19 to start off 3-0 against Ole Miss in the Battle for the Golden Egg.

Mullen was widely regarded as one of the top young minds in college football when he arrived at Mississippi State, and he brought not only an impressive offensive resume and a list of NFL-developed quarterbacks, but also an energy and passion for the college game.

Improvement wasn't limited to fan enthusiasm, as Mullen ignited the Bulldogs to a nine-win season in just his second year, and then another successful season in 2011. With Mullen's masterful offensive mind this past year, the Maroon and White broke the school record for passing touchdowns in a season (19) and finished second all-time in school history in total offense and first downs. Additionally, the offense finished in the top 10 in passing yards, completions and completion percentage.

In 2010, State won six games in a row in the middle of the season and finished among the top 10 in school history in the following categories - passing yardage, completion percentage, passing touchdowns, rushing attempts, rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total plays, total offensive yards, per-game offense and first downs. The defense also amassed the 10th-highest sack total in school annals.

The 2010 Bulldogs closed out the season with nine victories including posting the largest margin of victory in a bowl game in school history. The resounding 52-14 Gator Bowl win against Michigan capped a truly remarkable year.

With the nation's toughest schedule in 2009, State's rushing attack, led by first-team all-Southeastern Conference selection and current NFL running back Anthony Dixon, finished ninth nationally with a 227.6 rushing yard average per game. State averaged 371.9 yards of total offense per game, the ninth-highest total in school history and the most since 2000 at the time.

Mullen's first season concluded with a rousing 41-27 victory over MSU's in-state rival, which brought the Golden Egg back to Starkville. He became the only third Mississippi State coach to win his Egg Bowl debut since 1939, joining Allyn McKeen and Jackie Sherrill. The Bulldogs posted a 5-7 overall record in 2009, including three road victories.

During the previous four seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at the University of Florida, Mullen molded a Heisman Trophy, Davey O'Brien and Maxwell Award-winning quarterback, along with a Rimington Trophy finalist and a Biletnikoff Award semifinalist.

In 2008 alone, Mullen's offensive attack ranked third nationally in scoring - averaging better than 45 points per game as the Gators scored at least 30 points in 12-of-13 games. The 587 points scored eclipsed the previous University of Florida mark, set in 1996.

Florida rushed for a school-record 41 touchdowns that season and UF's 80 rushing touchdowns over the two seasons ranked second nationally. Overall, Florida's rushing yardage of 2,987 ranked ninth nationally in 2008 and was the third-highest total in school history.

Seven offensive players were recognized as All-Southeastern Conference selections following the season in which Mullen helped UF claim its second SEC Championship and a chance to play for its second national championship in three seasons.

The Gator offense ranked first in the SEC in scoring offense and total offense for a second-straight season in 2008, averaging

45.2 points and 442.4 yards per game. Under Mullen's tutelage in 2007, UF averaged 42.5 points and 457.2 yards.

In 2007, Mullen directed the Gator offense to the third-highest point total ever by a UF unit and the top single-season marks for rushing touchdowns and third-down conversion percentage. Florida's offense scored 75 touchdowns, second most in the SEC.

Mullen orchestrated a UF attack that was the only one in the nation to have rushed for a touchdown and passed for a touchdown in every game during the season. He also helped UF score on 83-of-152 drives in 2007 for a league-best 54.6 percent, marking the best number since the stat was tracked by the SEC in 2000. Florida additionally averaged 7.0 yards per play that year, the fourth-best total in the nation. Lastly, the Gators averaged 5.3 yards per rush, the second-best number in school history.

In 2007, Mullen helped coach sophomore quarterback and current NFL star Tim Tebow into a Heisman Trophy, Maxwell and Davey O'Brien award winner, 78th Sullivan Award winner and AP first-team All-American among other honors.

He also tutored six offensive players to the All-SEC team: Tebow, NFL Pro Bowler Percy Harvin, Cornelius Ingram, Brandon James, Jim Tartt and Drew Miller.

Mullen played an integral role in Florida's 2006 national championship, overseeing an offense that averaged 29.7 points and 396.1 yards per game. In the BCS National Championship Game, he engineered an attack that produced 41 points against a top-ranked Ohio State squad that was limiting opponents to less than 11 points per game on the year. Under Mullen's tutelage, quarterback Chris Leak opened the contest by going 9-for-9 for 99 yards and a touchdown en route to earning Offensive MVP honors.

The 2006 Gator offense posted 76 plays of 20 yards or more, 19 of which went for touchdowns. Florida passed for 29 touchdowns in 2006, while Leak ranked among the national leaders with 23 scoring tosses. Tebow matched UF's then single-season record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with eight scores, and his 5.3 yards per carry average placed second nationally among signal callers. Six different players averaged at least 5.0 yards per carry.

In 2005, Chad Jackson played his way to Biletnikoff Award semifinalist status after matching the UF single-season record with 88 receptions, a figure that led the SEC and finished sixth nationally. Center Mike Degory was also named a finalist for the Rimington Trophy, given annually to the nation's top center, during that campaign. Both earned first-team All-SEC honors under Mullen's tutelage.

Mullen went to Florida from Utah with Head Coach Urban Meyer, with whom he had spent 10 seasons. While the quarterbacks coach at Utah, Mullen developed current NFL star Alex Smith - the first overall selection in the 2005 NFL Draft - from a pocket passer into an efficient executor of the spread, making him one of the most versatile threats in college football. Smith took over the starting job three games into Mullen's tenure, passing for 2,247 yards and running for 452 to finish second in the Mountain West in total offense in 2003.

The 2004 campaign saw Smith earn National Player of the Year honors from The Sporting News and Sports Illustrated, while also becoming Utah's first-ever Heisman Trophy finalist. Smith also garnered final consideration for the Davey O'Brien and Walter Camp National Player of the Year Awards. Smith passed for 2,952 yards and 32 touchdowns and ran for 631 yards and 10 scores on the year, ranking second in the nation with a 176.5 efficiency rating and leading the Utes to a perfect 12-0 season and a Fiesta Bowl championship. As a team, Utah finished the 2004 season third in the nation in scoring offense (45.3) and total offense (499.8).

Prior to his stint at Utah, Mullen served as quarterbacks' coach at Bowling Green for two seasons, putting up 6,627 yards of total offense and scoring 81 touchdowns during that span. In 2002, quarterback Josh Harris threw for 2,425 yards, ran for 737 yards and completed the campaign as the nation's third-leading scorer.

Mullen spent the two years before his Bowling Green stint as a graduate assistant at Notre Dame, and before that assisted with Syracuse's 1998 BIG EAST championship and Orange Bowl run.

A two-year starter at tight end for Ursinus College in Collegeville, Pa., Mullen earned first-team All-Centennial Conference honors as a senior. He is married to the former Megan West, and the couple has two children, one son and one daughter.

- For the season, has been thrown at 47 times in man coverage, allowing just 31 catches for 319 yards (34.4 yards per game), intercepting four passes, forcing a fumble, recovering a fumble and breaking up five passes.

- Was thrown at just twice in the first 47 minutes of the Auburn win, with both passes being picked off by Banks. Helped limit the Tigers' passing game to -2 yards at halftime.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - As far as season openers go, Mississippi State couldn't have been much happier.

On a muggy evening that saw intermittent rain showers prior to kickoff, the Bulldogs scored early and often en route to an overwhelming 56-9 victory against Jackson State in front of 55,082 fans at Scott Field.

It was the second-consecutive year MSU opened the season by scoring 50-plus points, as a year ago it took care of Memphis at the Liberty Bowl, 59-14.

But on this night, it wasn't just the offense, which didn't have to punt until the 1:19 mark of the third quarter, flexing muscles. The defense was just as dominant.

MSU, which improved to 80-31-2 all-time in season openers and 4-0 under coach Dan Mullen, had two interceptions returned for touchdowns while limiting the Tigers to 265 yards. Of that total, 94 came on their final possession of the first half that ended with a 9-yard scoring pass from Detric McDonald to E.J. Drewery.

Outside of that play, JSU's only other points were the result of a 25-yard field goal.

"At times, I thought the defense played great," said MSU coach Dan Mullen, "There are still some areas we need to improve on, but we were able to shuffle a lot of people in and out."

As for the Bulldogs, who have now won 12-straight non-conference games, they scored on their opening drive when Chad Bumphis hauled in a 9-yard pass from Tyler Russell less than 4 minutes in. From there, the rout ensued.

LaDarius Perkins made sure of that as he accounted for Mississippi State's next two scores on runs of 8 and 1 yards, respectively.

Then it was Russell again, as he found tight end Marcus Green open for a 13-yard scoring strike and a 28-0 advantage.

But the Bulldogs' first-half scoring wouldn't be done until Darius Slay returned an interception 52 yards for a touchdown.

In the final half, Dak Prescott got in on the scoring with a 2-yard plunge to extend the lead to 42-6. A minute later, it was again the defense doing its part, as Matthew Wells returned an interception 22 yards for a touchdown. He also led the Bulldogs with 5 tackles, including one sack.

The final score of the night was an impressive 19-yard scamper by Derrick Milton, the first of his young career. He also led MSU with 65 rushing yards, while Perkins grounded out 50.

In all, the Bulldogs manufactured 377 total yards of offense.. Russell, the junior signal caller from Meridian, was 15-of-23 passing for 175 yards.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - In front of another sellout crowd of 56,111 at Scott Field, the ninth largest in stadium history, Mississippi State erased four years of frustration against the Tigers with a solid 28-10 victory.

For Mullen, it was his first win against Auburn in six tries, dating back to his time as an assistant at Florida.

In a performance that was nothing short of dominating, MSU (2-0), which has now outscored its two opponents 84-19, held the Tigers (0-2) to just 216 yards of total offense while forcing five turnovers. Johnthan Banks accounted for two of the miscues with interceptions to give him 14 for his career, the most among active FBS players.

MSU defenders also recorded eight tackles behind the line of scrimmage, including four by Corey Broomfield. Cameron Lawrence paced the defensive attack with 10 tackles, six solo. He also had one of the Bulldogs' two sacks, while Preston Smith was credited with the other.

And no one felt the brunt of the staunch defensive effort more than Auburn sophomore quarterback Kiehl Frazier, who was 13-of-22 passing for 125 yards and three picks, with Darius Slay accounting for the other interception.

On the ground, Auburn managed just 91 yards after a 180-yard performance last week against Clemson.

Yes, the defense certainly set the tone. But at the same time, the offense was nearly as effective.

Behind the arm of junior signal caller Tyler Russell, the Bulldogs manufactured 388 total yards. Russell, playing with the poise of a veteran student-athlete, completed a career-best 20 of his 29 passes for 222 yards and three touchdowns.

"We need for him to play like that if we want to compete for a championship this season," said Mullen, whose team won an SEC opener for the first time since 1999.

Russell's first scoring strike went to Marcus Green, covering 30 yards to give MSU a 7-3 lead with 6:53 left in the first half. It was a score that remained unchanged until the start of the second half when Auburn's Onterio McCalebb returned the opening kickoff 100 yards to put the Tigers up, 10-7.

But on the Bulldogs' ensuing possession, they methodically marched 75 yards in eight plays and regained the lead for good when Chad Bumphis hauled in a Russell pass from 13 yards out for a 14-10 advantage.

In fact, it was a drive that jumpstarted an offense that rolled up 14 more points, ignited by Green's second touchdown, a 3-yard pass from Russell. The final score resulted in a 21-yard jaunt by LaDarius Perkins, who led all rushers with 83 yards on 14 carries.

2012 GAME RECAPS

TROY, Ala. - Thanks to career nights from LaDarius Perkins, Chad Bumphis and Darius Slay, the Mississippi State Bulldogs (3-0) avoided upset Saturday night, defeating the Troy Trojans (1-2) 30-24.

Perkins and Bumphis combined for over 440 all-purpose yards and four touchdowns to help the Bulldogs to victory. Perkins amassed a career-high 179 yards and a score on the ground, while Bumphis added 180 yards and three touchdowns through the air.

For the first time in MSU history, the Bulldogs had a running back and a receiver total 175-plus yards each in a game. Bumphis also tied school records for touchdown receptions in a game (3) and career (17) with his three Saturday night.

On the defensive side, Slay tacked on two interceptions and a fumble recovery, leading the Bulldog defense to four forced turnovers.

After a field goal on MSU's second possession, Troy drove down the field for a touchdown and the early lead. A Perkins' 30-yard touchdown scamper following a muffed punt by the Trojans put the Bulldogs on top again, a lead State would not relinquish.

Early in the second quarter, Bumphis took a screen pass 72 yards for his first touchdown of the night. Nearing the end of the first half, Tyler Russell again connected with Bumphis on a 58-yard play-action pass that gave State a 23-7 lead at halftime.

Troy struck back in the second half, posting a 4-yard TD rush for the lone score in the third quarter. With the fourth quarter looming, Troy was only nine points back and looking to strike.

Trojan Justin Albert then reeled off a 31-yard touchdown run to start the fourth, cutting the MSU lead to just two at 23-21 with 12:40 left on the clock, and Troy was right back in the contest.

With the Bulldogs needing an answer on offense, MSU assembled a 12-play, 74-yard drive. On the second fourth-down conversion of the drive, Russell connected with Bumphis for the third time on the evening as he just got a foot inside the back boundary of the end zone, widening State's lead back to nine at 30-21.

Troy's offense then put together another solid drive, but stalled in MSU territory, coming away with a 40-yard field goal to trim the lead back to within a score at 30-24.

But MSU took over and was able to run out the clock thanks to the pounding running game led by Perkins.

Russell led the Bulldogs in passing, throwing for 244 yards and three touchdowns, continuing his impressive junior campaign.

Defensively, Cameron Lawrence had 13 tackles to lead all Bulldogs.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - In a theme that's become quite familiar at home this season, Mississippi State's offense continue to put up the points while the defense remained stingy. This time, the victim was South Alabama.

In front of a Scott Field crowd of 55,186 and the 19th-straight sellout on Saturday, the 23rd-ranked Bulldogs overcame a sluggish first-quarter to roll past the Jaguars, 30-10.

As a result, MSU (4-0), has now outscored its three opponents at home by a convincing 114-29 margin.

But on this first official day of fall, points would be elusive until the second quarter. Thanks to LaDarius Perkins, though, the Bulldogs struck first on his 44-yard scoring scamper for the 7-0 advantage.

Two possessions later, the lead swelled to 14-0 on a 2-yard plunge by Dak Prescott with 5:38 left.

After Devon Bell made it a 17-0 affair on a 42-yard field goal, the defense set up the final points of the half when Nickoe Whitley intercepted a Ross Methany pass and returned it 66 yards to the South Alabama 26 with 30 seconds to play.

Four plays later, Bell struck again from 42 yards as MSU went into the half up 20-0.

In the third quarter, quarterback Tyler Russell got in on the scoring when he scored on a keeper from 1-yard out.

Bell accounted for Mississippi State's final points when he drilled his third field goal of the evening, this time from 31 yards, for a 30-3 lead.

With the game decided, the Jaguars (1-3) finally scored a touchdown when C.J. Bennett connected with Greg Hollinger on an 18-yard scoring strike.

On the night, the Bulldogs, now 4-0 for the first time since 1999, manufactured 356 yards while holding USA to 347 yards. On the ground, Perkins accounted for 69 yards, while Russell completed 13 of his 27 passes for 171 yards. His top receivers were Brandon Heavens and Chris Smith, who both had three receptions for 55 and 45 yards, respectively.

Defensively, MSU forced three turnovers, with one coming on a Johnthan Banks interception, the 15th of his career and one shy of the school record held by Walt Harris. The final miscue was the result of a Chris Hughes fumble recovery. Overall, Whitley led the Bulldogs with seven tackles, five solo.

Mississippi State doesn't play again until it travels to Kentucky on Oct. 6 before returning home to face Tennessee on Oct. 13.

2012 GAME RECAPS

LEXINGTON, Ky. - A record-setting day from senior receiver Chad Bumphis helped lead the Mississippi State Bulldogs (5-0, 2-0 SEC) to victory in Lexington, as they defeated the Kentucky Wildcats (1-4, 0-2 SEC) 27-14. The win gives MSU its first 5-0 start since 1999, when the Bulldogs started 8-0 en route to a 10-2 record and a Peach Bowl victory.

The Bulldogs started off on the right foot, as junior quarterback Tyler Russell led his offense down the field and scoring on a 10-yard touchdown pass to fullback Adrian Marcus, his first career score.

MSU's defense started off in superb fashion as well, forcing a three-and-out on Kentucky's first two drives. The Bulldogs capitalized off the second stop, scoring on a 31-yard touchdown scamper by junior LaDarius Perkins.

Kentucky answered MSU's second score with one of their own, a 32-yard TD pass from freshman Patrick Towles to La'Rod King. The Bulldogs retaliated with two Devon Bell field goals to close out the half with a 20-7 lead.

MSU wasted no time during their first drive of the second half, as Russell connected with senior Chad Bumphis for a 27-yard score across the middle. The touchdown reception was Bumphis' record-setting 18th of his career, passing Eric Moulds and Justin Jenkins.

Kentucky tried to put together a comeback after a three-yard touchdown run by freshman quarterback Jalen Whitlow, but failed to do any more damage in the final quarter.

MSU dominated the stat book all day long, finishing with 427 total yards to Kentucky's 228. State finished with 158 yards on the ground and 269 yards passing, while the Wildcats only tallied 84 rushing yards and 144 passing yards.

Russell finished the game throwing 23-for-39 for 269 yards and two touchdowns, tying Rocky Felker for 8th all-time in career touchdown passes with 23. Perkins eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the second time this season, rushing for 110 yards and a score on 25 attempts. Bumphis led all receivers with 104 yards and a touchdown on nine receptions.

The Bulldogs return to action next week at Davis Wade, as they face SEC East foe Tennessee. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. CT on ESPN 2 and the Mississippi State Radio Network.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - Fourth down. Nine yard line. Conventional wisdom says field goal. On this unseasonably-muggy night at Scott Field, however, conventional wisdom remained silent.

Instead, with his team leading just 34-31, Dan Mullen called one of the more memorable plays of his MSU tenure as Tyler Russell put an exclamation point on his career night with a 9-yard scoring strike to Malcolm Johnson in the back of the end zone.

The raucous crowd of 57,831 erupted with just 9 ticks left on the clock as the 19th-ranked Bulldogs held on to post an emotional and electrifying 41-31 victory against Tennessee to keep their unblemished record intact at 6-0. The win snapped a six-game losing streak to the Volunteers, dating back to 1994.

As for Russell, his final line read 23-of-27 passing for 291 yards. All career highs.

But if there were game balls to be handed out, Russell would have to share the spotlight with running back LaDarius Perkins, who rushed for 101 yards on 23 carries.

However, none were bigger than his 1-yard dive with 7:58 remaining to give MSU a 34-24 lead to slow Tennessee's momentum that led to 10-straight points to close a 27-14 deficit to just 27-24 with an 11-yard Tyler Bray touchdown pass to Cordarrelle Patterson.

Yet, Perkins' score was magnified even more as Bray hit Ben Bartholomew for a 10-yard scoring strike moments later to make it 34-31.

Still, it was a game the Bulldogs, who now stand at 3-0 in SEC play, led most of the way.

MSU took the early lead on a 31-yard Devon Bell field goal. The Vols, though, answered on their ensuing possession with a 6-yard Rajion Neal touchdown run for a 7-3 advantage.

Back came MSU, however, which took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 10-yard scoring scamper by Josh Robinson. The lead then swelled to 17-7 when Marcus Green hauled in a 13-yard pass from Dak Prescott. But Tennessee (3-3, 0-3) wouldn't fold.

Instead, the Vols battled right back and cut the lead to 17-14 on Patterson's 98-yard kickoff return. The final points of the half belonged to MSU, though, thanks to Bell's 24-yard field goal and Russell hooking up with Green from 7 yards out.

On the night, MSU finished with 450 total yards of offense, while Tennessee manufactured 361. Defensively, Benardrick McKinney paced the Bulldogs with 14 tackles. MSU also forced two turnovers, a fumble recovery by All-American candidate Johnthan Banks and an interception by Corey Broomfield.

Bank's fumble recovery set up Perkins' touchdown run with 7:58 to play.

2012 GAME RECAPS

STARKVILLE, Miss. - When Mississippi State desperately needed a spark against a scrappy Middle Tennessee State squad on Saturday, no one should have been surprised as to who provided one.

Yep. The All-American candidate himself, Johnthan Banks. With his team leading 17-3 midway through the third quarter following a LaDarius Perkins 64-yard scoring run, Banks picked off Blue Raiders quarterback Logan Kilgore and returned it 46 yards to the MTSU 23.

From there, the Bulldogs scored 28 unanswered points en route to a convincing 45-3 homecoming win in front of 55,108 fans at Scott Field to mark the 21st-consecutive sellout.

For Banks, the interception was the 16th of his heralded career, which ties Walt Harris for the most in school history. "Obviously that was a huge play for us," MSU coach Dan Mullen said. "It really turned things around."

More importantly, MSU improved to 7-0 overall as it now turns its focus toward top-ranked and undefeated Alabama next Saturday in Tuscaloosa.

As for the spark Banks provided, it was immediate. On the ensuing play, Tyler Russell connected with Chris Smith for an 11-yard scoring strike. Two minutes later, the lead swelled to 31-3 when Russell threw his third touchdown of night, this time to Robert Johnson covering 11 yards.

The Bulldogs, who led just 10-3 at intermission thanks to a Smith's first touchdown and Devon Bell's 32-yard field goal, wouldn't be done with the scoring.

In the fourth quarter, Dak Prescott found the end zone on a 5-yard run, while Derrick Milton closed out all scoring with a 6-yard run of his own.

On the night, MSU totaled 446 yards of offense while limiting the Blue Raiders to just 305. The Bulldogs, who improved their winning streak to nine straight dating back to last season (third, longest in school history) punted just once, while converting 9 of its 12 third-down opportunities.

Through the air, Russell was on fire, completing 17 of his 21 passes for 191 yards and three touchdowns. Smith was his top target, and he responded with a career high seven receptions for 66 yards.

On the ground, Perkins again was a beast, accumulating 125 yards on 20 carries. He has now scored a touchdown in all seven games this year. The only other running back to do that is Adam Muema of San Diego State

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Simply put, it just wasn't Mississippi State's night.

For No. 1-ranked Alabama, however, little went wrong, and as a result the Crimson Tide rolled to a 38-7 win against No. 11 Mississippi State on homecoming night at Bryant-Denny Stadium in a battle of the unbeaten.

The loss snapped the Bulldogs' nine-game winning streak, the third-longest in the nation, while Bama upped its streak to 12 straight to remain perfect on the season at 8-0 overall and 5-0 in SEC play.

And it didn't take the Tide long to establish its dominance. The defending national champions scored on their first three possessions and went into the half up 24-0.

By the time the Bulldogs (7-1, 3-1) found the end zone, the Tide was comfortably ahead, 38-0.

Still, MSU showed fight throughout and got on the scoreboard late when backup quarterback Dak Prescott connected with Robert Johnson for a 2-yard scoring strike.

On the night, Johnson finished with four catches for 23 yards, both career highs.

Offensively, the Tide's heralded defense limited the Bulldogs to just 256 yards. On the ground, LaDarius Perkins paced MSU with 38 yards on 15 carries, while Tyler Russell completed 15 of his 30 passes for 169 yards and one pick, just his second of the year.

Alabama manufactured 414 total yards. A.J. McCarron continued his consistency in the air, completing 16-of-23 passes for 208 yards and two touchdowns.

His two scoring passes came in the first half, covering 57 yards to Kenny Bell and 9 yards to Michael Williams. Then there was running back T.J. Yeldon, who grounded out a game high 84 yards on 10 carries. He also recorded the night's first touchdown on an 11-yard run.

The Bulldogs look to get back into the win column next Saturday at Scott Field when SEC newcomer Texas A&M pays a visit. Official game time will be announced Sunday.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - Texas A&M came in known for their high-powered offensive attack and showed it Saturday at Davis Wade Stadium, as the Aggies defeated the Mississippi State Bulldogs 38-13.

The Aggies jumped out to a quick lead, scoring touchdowns on their first three drives of the contest, two in the first quarter off of runs by Ben Malena and Christine Michael.

A&M freshman quarterback Johnny Manziel added a 37-yard touchdown run in the second to add to the Aggie lead and, by the end, of the first half, A&M held a surprising 24-0 lead against the Bulldogs.

Michael punched in another score, with a 1-yard TD run to start off the third quarter.

The Bulldogs then answered back on an impressive drive that was capped off by a 14-yard touchdown strike from junior quarterback Tyler Russell to senior receiver Chad Bumphis. With that touchdown reception, Bumphis extended his school record of career TD receptions to 18. Russell's 16th touchdown pass also tied the single-season school record, set by Derrick Taite in 1995.

State's defense, known for forcing turnovers throughout the 2012 season came up big by forcing a Manziel fumble at the goal line on A&M's next drive. The Maroon and White then marched down the field impressively, but were unsuccessful in capping the drive as a Russell pass sailed into the hands of an Aggie defender.

The Bulldogs added another score in the fourth quarter when Russell punched one in from four yards out, but were unable to convert the two-point conversion.

A&M answered back with an impressive drive of their own, scoring on a 7-yard run from Manziel for a the final tally of 38-13.

State gained 310 total yards on the day, with 212 through the air and 98 on the ground. The seemingly unstoppable Aggies, however, gained a total of 693 yards, with 361 coming on the ground and 332 passing.

Leading the Bulldogs in passing was Russell, who threw 30 passes, completing 19 for 212 yards, a touchdown and an interception. On the rushing attack, LaDarius Perkins gained 42 yards on 13 carries. Bumphis caught four passes for 60 yards and a score, while senior Arceto Clark led the Bulldogs with five catches for 64 yards.

Manziel led the way for the Aggies, throwing 30-for-36 for 311 yards. On the ground, the freshman amassed 129 yards on the ground and two scores.

Three Bulldogs were double digits in tackles, led by Bernardrick McKinney's 14. Cameron Lawrence had 13, a sack, and a forced fumble.
