SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 12 LSU concludes its 13-game road trip and travels to Mississippi State for a three-game weekend series to open SEC action.
- ▶ Game times are set for Friday at 6 p.m., Saturday at 1 p.m. and Sunday at 1 p.m.
- ▶ After this weekend's action, LSU will have played 13 of its 24 games against Top 25 opponents or teams receiving votes.
- ▶ LSU is coming off a 3-2 weekend at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic. The Tigers defeated No. 14 Michigan, Penn State and Syracuse, while dropping decisions to No. 10 Oregon and No. 15 Louisville.
- ▶ LSU holds a 45-5 edge over Mississippi State in the all-time series and has won the last 20 meetings going back to 2005. A complete series history is available on page 4.
- ▶ LSU picked up 10-7, 3-1 and 4-0 victories over the Bulldogs last season at Tiger Park. Recaps and box scores from the 2012 meetings are available on pages 6-8 of this packet.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has fired out to a 17-4 record highlighted by a 10-game winning streak which ran from Feb. 13-23.
- The Tigers have picked up a trio of wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23), No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2).
- LSU's offense has turned in a .311 team batting average compared to a .245 hitting clip through 21 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.3 runs per game compared to a 4.0 runs per game through 21 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 17 home runs through 21 games and surpassed its total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have five players with multiple longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on seven occasions. LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a pair of slams eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed eight shutouts and recorded 152 strikeouts over 141.2 innings pitched.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 21 games and has batted leadoff in all 21 games for the Tigers.
- Andrews has ripped 26 hits, second-most on the team. Her .377 batting average also is tied for second on the team.
- Andrews put together a nine-game hitting streak (Feb. 21-March 2) which was a career-long. She has compiled eight multi-hit efforts, tied with Allison Falcon for the team lead. Andrews produced a career-high four hits versus No. 14 Michigan (March 2).
- Andrews has crossed the plate a team-leading 17 times. The Tigers have won all 10 games when Andrews scores this season.

- Jacee Blades has started LSU's last 18 games, mostly between left and right field. She has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 18 times and cranked 23 hits, third on the team.
- Blades has compiled six multi-hit efforts highlighted by a trio of three-hit efforts versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22) and Syracuse (March 1).
- Blades has scored 13 runs, and LSU has won all 10 decisions when Blades has crossed the plate.
- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 21 games. She has split her starts between second base (12), shortstop (7) and designated player (2).
- Falcon, the reigning LSWA Hitter of the Week (March 6), has compiled a team-leading 27 hits en route to a .409 batting average. She has added three home runs and a team-high 16 RBIs.
- Falcon provided hits in her first eight outings (Feb. 8-15) and 14 of her first 15 games (Feb. 8-23). She also has tied with A.J. Andrews with eight multi-hit performances and strung together four consecutive four multi-hit efforts (March 1-3).
- Falcon has ripped a team-best eight doubles on the season, including three of her last four outings (March 1-3).
- Falcon's two-run home run during the first inning fueled LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).
- Bianka Bell has started 19 of LSU's 21 games and shared time between shortstop (14) and second base (5). She has tallied a .328 batting average to go along with two home runs and 12 RBIs. The 12 RBIs are tied for second on the team.
- Bell has totaled six multi-hit efforts, tied for third on the team. She has scored a run, added a hit and drove home a RBI in three of her last four outings (March 1-3).
- Rikki Alcaraz has started LSU's last seven games (Feb. 22-March 3) and emerged as the primary option at designated player.
- Alcaraz recently had a eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 15-March 2) which was a career-long come to close. She added four multi-RBI efforts.

BATON ROUGE – Dylan Supak provided a 2-for-4 performance, and the go-ahead two-run single during an eight-run third inning as the LSU softball team turned the tables to pick up a 10-7 victory over Mississippi State to open a three-game SEC weekend series at Tiger Park.

LSU (17-8, 2-1 SEC) extended its winning streak to 18 games over Mississippi State (17-10, 3-5 SEC) dating back to the 2005 season.

"It was nice to see us continue to score and keep putting the pressure on [after the third inning]," head coach Beth Torina said. "I thought Jacee Blades really stepped up for us tonight filling in at centerfield. Heidi Pizer earned that start tonight [at first base]. She's been doing a lot of things really well in practice - she's been working really hard. So I thought she deserved that opportunity tonight, and she proved me right. All of her work definitely paid off."

Rachele Fico grinded out six-plus innings of work and surrendered just two earned runs on eight hits. She notched four strikeouts against four walks and improved to 8-4 on the season.

Kylie Vry was touched up for seven runs on seven hits in her two-plus frames of action and fell to 5-4.

"It's funny how things work out," Torina said. "We just talked about how Rachele had great stuff on Wednesday against Auburn and doesn't get the win. Tonight, she maybe didn't have her best stuff but still found a way to win. And I think that's the sign of a good pitcher - even when you don't have your best stuff, you still find a way to win."

Down 4-1 in the third inning, the Tigers sent 12 batters to the dish and were ignited by Heidi Pizer, Ashley Applegate and Jacee Blades consecutive singles to fill the bases. A Vry illegal pitch made it 4-2 before an Ashley Langoni walk reloaded the bases.

Allison Falcon ripped a RBI single to left field to pull LSU back to within 4-3 before Dylan Supak deposited a 1-0 offering for a two-run single to vault the Tigers to a 5-4 edge.

The Bulldogs turned to Lindsey Dunlap out of the bull pen. She proceeded to plunk Kailey McCasland, Tammy Wray and Morgan Russell in succession to allow LSU to grab a 7-4 advantage.

Two batters later, MSU second baseman Heidi Shape committed a two-base error to cap the frame and extend the Tigers lead to 9-4.

LSU added another run during the fifth inning and went ahead 10-4 on a Langoni bases loaded free pass.

The Bulldogs received RBI singles from Jessica Offutt and Kaili Smith in the sixth inning to slice the LSU advantage down to 10-6. MSU tacked on another run during the seventh inning and had the tying run on deck.

Brittany Mack entered the game in relief and recorded consecutive strikeouts to secure the 10-7 victory. For Mack, it was her third career save. The two Ks also allowed the senior right-hander to surpass Cody Trahan for fifth place on the program's all-time strikeout list.

"Before I went out there, I went to [Rachele] Fico and told her that this one was going to be for her," Mack said. "She worked her butt off all game long, and she definitely deserved this win. I was going to make sure she got it."

Mississippi State struck for a quartet of unearned runs aided by three LSU errors during the first two innings to race out to a 4-1 spread. The Tigers scored their run in the home half of first inning as Applegate connected for a leadoff single, went to second base on a passed ball, moved to third base on a Blades ground out and crossed the plate on a wild pitch.

"Come out with a little bit better defense," Supak said. "We'd like to come out with an errorless ball game. I think that would be a really good goal to come out with. We just need to keep swinging like we have and keep pitching the way we are because our pitchers are doing something right."

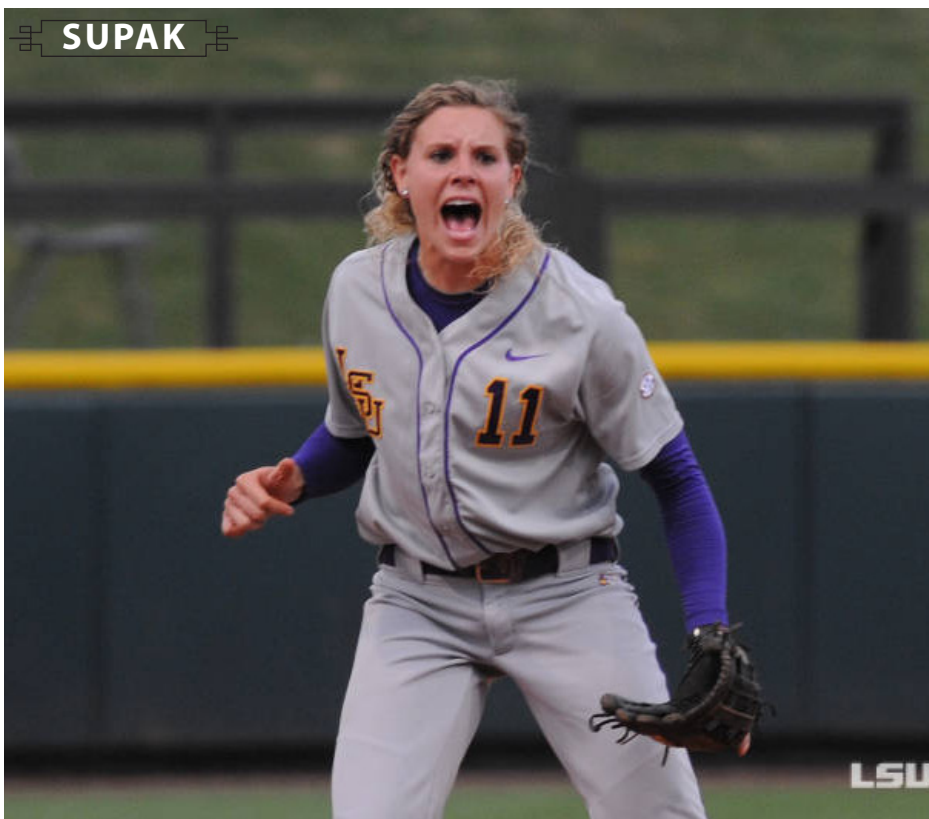

BATON ROUGE - Allison Falcon ripped a two-run double during the third inning to break a 1-1 tie, while Brittany Mack racked up 10 strikeouts in a complete game effort as the LSU softball team claimed a 3-1 win over Mississippi State in-front of a season-best 1,397 fans at Tiger Park.

LSU (18-8, 3-1 SEC) pushed its winning streak to 19 straight games over Mississippi State (17-11, 3-6 SEC) dating back to the 2005 season. Prior to first pitch, the Tigers honored 18 Alumnae as part of Alumnae Weekend at the ballpark.

Mack won her fifth consecutive decision to improve to 8-4 on the season. She maneuvered around eight hits, two walks and stranded six of 10 Bulldog baserunners in scoring position. The senior right-hander also notched her third double-digit strikeout performance of the season.

Stephanie Becker was handed the loss and tagged for three runs on five hits. She came away with six strikeouts against one walk, but dropped to 9-4 for the season.

"This was a huge game for us today, just in this series and in this season," head coach Beth Torina said. "I think that Mississippi State is really improved, so I think that winning the series is key to our success in the SEC. They fought hard, and I knew we were going to get a tougher pitcher [Becker] on the mound today. I knew this game was going to be a little more of a challenge, and it was. I'm really happy that we came away with it."

Trailing 1-0, the third inning was kind to the Tigers for the second straight contest. Lauren Houston was hit-by-a-pitch to open the frame. Two batters later, Ashley Applegate cranked a single to centerfield. LSU loaded the bases when Jacee Blades dropped down a textbook bunt single down the first base line.

A passed ball by MSU catcher Ka'ili Smith enabled Houston to scamper home and knot the score at 1-1. Down 0-2 in the count, Falcon battled to extend her at-bat by fouling off a quartet of pitches and taking a ball. Falcon's hard work paid immediate dividends as she smoked a double past the diving attempt of Bulldog left fielder Jessica Cooley. The ball one-hopped off the left field wall which cleared the bases to give LSU a 3-1 advantage.

"She had been working me outside, and I was just waiting for that inside pitch," Falcon said. "She called time and her coach came and talked to her, so it was a lot of different things going on. I really just had to focus on seeing the pitch that I wanted, and thankfully I did."

Mississippi State's Jessica Offutt and Smith strung together a pair of two-out singles during the sixth inning to bring the go-ahead run to the plate. Mack thwarted the Bulldog rally and got Shelby Fisher to fly out to right field. She struck out two batters in a 1-2-3 seventh to secure the 3-1 win.

"She did a good job of making big pitches when she needed to," Torina said. "Even when she was behind on a few hitters, she was able to come all the way back and get a strikeout from a 3-0 count. She did a good job of making big pitches in the correct times."

BATON ROUGE – The LSU softball team rode the right-arm of Rachele Fico as the junior hurler compiled her seventh shutout of the season during a 4-0 win over Mississippi State at Tiger Park.

LSU (19-8, 4-1 SEC) swept the weekend series from the Bulldogs (17-12, 3-7 SEC) and moved its winning streak to 20 consecutive games in the all-time series dating back to the 2005 season.

Lauren Houston paced the LSU offense with a 2-for-3 effort at the plate, while Rikki Alcaraz scored two runs. Ashley Applegate and Heidi Pizer picked up the RBIs for the Tigers.

"I couldn't be happier about the entire weekend," head coach Beth Torina said. "To be able to do it all short-handed, I thought it was a really, really great team effort for us. I thought a lot of people stepped up, a lot of people filled in. I'm really proud of how they responded to that. They didn't let it affect them or get them down. They just came out and did the best we could with who we had."

Fico tossed a three-hitter and improved to 9-4 on the season. The Oxford, Conn., native equaled a season-high and issued six walks versus two strikeouts.

Stephanie Becker fell to 9-5 after she gave up three runs, one earned, on three hits in her 3.2 innings of work. She also allowed four walks against three Ks.

"This is huge for our team," Fico said. "We really needed the sweep this weekend, and we did just that. When we have the opportunity to come in and not only win a series but sweep a series, we really need to capitalize on that because if we're looking to win an SEC conference title, we need to sweep teams when we have that opportunity."

The Tigers used a two-out rally to dent the scoreboard first during the second inning. Alcaraz coaxed a four-pitch walk, and Houston kept the frame alive with her hustle on an infield single deep in the hole at shortstop. That set up Tammy Wray, who reached on a fielding error by Becker. The ball squirted away from Becker towards the first base line. Becker and Wray collided which allowed Alcaraz to sprint across home plate from second base to place LSU ahead 1-0.

LSU struck for two additional runs in the fourth inning. Pinch hitter Ashleigh Kuhn ripped a leadoff single to right field and advanced to second base after a one-out Alcaraz walk. Once again, Houston legged out an infield single to fill the bases. Two batters later, Heidi Pizer notched a RBI walk followed by a fielding error by MSU shortstop Erin Nesbit to make it 3-0.

"When you have the opportunity, you have to jump on it, especially in SEC play when those opportunities get pretty rare," Pizer said. "So to capitalize on those mistakes, base runners, errors, and passed balls – like we did this weekend – was really, really important for us."

LSU manufactured another run during the sixth inning. Wray worked her way to a one-out free pass. Pinch runner Alex Boulet raced her way into second base on a bang-bang fielder's choice play and stole third base before coming around to score on an Ashley Applegate ground ball for the 4-0 final margin.

Mississippi State placed runners on-base during six of the seven innings, but the Bulldogs stranded all nine runners. Fico was extremely tough and limited MSU to a 0-for-12 clip with runners on.

"When we started this season, we knew that our pitching staff was going to be the deal breaker – they were going to be who carried us throughout the year," Torina said. "I like some of the things that the offense is doing – they're showing some sparks. I think that we're getting some big defensive plays in key moments from people. So the whole team is a factor for sure."

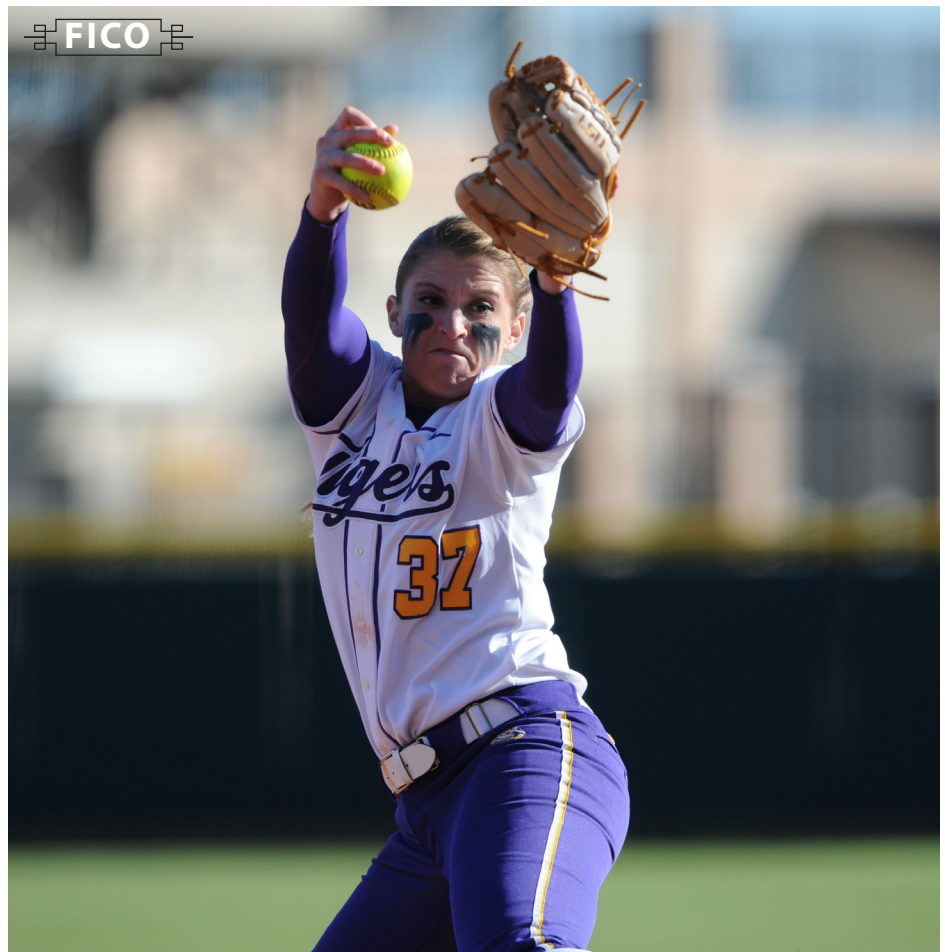
