SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 13 LSU will open the home portion of its SEC schedule and play host to No. 17 Kentucky for a three-game weekend series.
- ▶ LSU (20-5, 2-1 SEC) has won six of its last eight outings, including an 8-0 five-inning victory over Nicholls State on Wednesday.
- ▶ The Tigers had five players pick up RBIs during their eight-run first inning coupled with an Ashley Czechner one-hit shutout.
- ▶ Kentucky (19-4, 2-1 SEC) is coming off an impressive 18-0 mid-week win over No. 24 North Carolina which marked the largest margin of victory for a single game in program history.
- ▶ LSU has a 35-6 edge in the all-time series, but the Wildcats picked up a three-game sweep with all games being decided by one run to conclude the 2012 regular season.
- ▶ A complete series history along with LSU career stats versus Kentucky is listed on page 4, while recaps and box scores from last year's meetings can be found on pages 7-9 on this packet.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has fired out to a 20-5 record and a 2-1 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak which ran from Feb. 13-23.
- The Tigers have picked up a trio of wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23) and No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2).
- LSU's offense has turned in a .299 team batting average compared to a .256 hitting clip through 25 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.2 runs per game compared to a 4.5 runs per game through 24 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 22 home runs through 25 games and surpassed its total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have five players with three or more longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on seven occasions. LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a pair of slams eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 11 shutouts and recorded 192 strikeouts over 173.2 innings pitched.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 25 games and has batted leadoff in all 25 games for the Tigers. She is second on the team with a .360 batting average.
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home

run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the Mississippi State opener (March 8).

- Andrews has registered a team-leading 31 hits which includes a team-high nine multi-hit efforts. She has hit safely in 13 of her last 14 outings (Feb. 21-March 13) which includes a career-long nine-game run and all three games of the Mississippi State series.
- Andrews has scored a team-high 21 runs and tallied multiple runs on eight occasions. LSU is 13-0 when Andrews scores a run this season.
- Andrews has gone 8-for-8 in the stolen base department, her eight steals are a team-high.
- Jacee Blades has started LSU's last 22 games, mostly between left and right field. She has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 22 times.
- Blades has a team-leading .378 batting average. She is tied for second on the team with 28 hits and third on the squad with 14 runs scored. LSU has won all 11 games this season when Blades has crossed the plate.
- Blades has hit safely in 12 of her 15 games (Feb. 21-March 13) which included all three games of the Mississippi State series. She also has collected a trio of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22) and Syracuse (March 1).
- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 24 games. She has split her starts between second base (16), shortstop (7) and designated player (2).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is third on the team with a .359 batting average and 28 hits. She has hit safely in five of her last eight outings (March 1-13), while 12 of her 28 hits have gone for

- Fico turned in a memorable performance for the ages and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.

LEXINGTON, Ky. – The No. 22 LSU softball team was unable to hold a 3-0 advantage as Kentucky turned the tables to pick up a 4-3 comeback victory Friday to open a SEC weekend series at the UK Softball Complex.

Due to forecasted rain in the Lexington area, the contest was delayed at the start by two hours.

LSU (34-19, 15-11 SEC) had its 13-game winning streak in the Commonwealth come to a close. The Wildcats (27-27, 13-13 SEC) have now won four of their five games.

The Tigers struck for single runs during the third, fourth and fifth inning. Allison Falcon put LSU on the scoreboard and cranked a solo home run to start the third inning.

Juliana Santos ripped a leadoff double during the fourth inning. Two batters later, Santos crossed the plate on Ashley Applegate's single down the right field line. She was able to score and made it 2-0 aided by a UK fielding error.

After a Dylan Supak opening walk to open the fifth inning, A.J. Andrews cranked a triple off the centerfield wall. Pinch runner Heidi Pizer was thrown out at the plate as Kentucky executed a textbook relay play.

The next batter, Cassie Troclair, connected for a sacrifice fly to push the Tigers to a 3-0 advantage.

"I thought this was one of the better offensive performances that we've had in a while," head coach Beth Torina said. "I liked our approach and our effort. We swung big and hit the ball hard. Allison did a fantastic job all and had three quality at-bats. I was happy to see her get back on-track."

Kentucky charged back with two runs in the home half of the fifth inning. With runners on the first and second base, Brittany Cervantes belted a 2-2 change-up into the right centerfield gap to clear the bases. She extended the game with two outs in the seventh inning and tacked on a solo homer to straight-away centerfield to even the tally at 3-3.

"Give a lot of credit to Cervantes, she's a great hitter," Torina said. "She is one of the best players in the league. She showed it tonight and provided two timely hits in clutch situations for them."

The Wildcats took advantage of an Ashley Langoni error on a dropped fly ball to place the finishing touches on the 4-3 comeback win.

Rachele Fico, the nation's ERA leader, was tagged with the setback and fell to 16-10 on the season. She was touched up for four runs, three earned, on four hits. The junior right-hander recorded eight strikeouts versus four walks.

Reigning SEC Pitcher of the Week, Chanda Bell, won her third straight decision over a ranked opponent. She surrendered three runs off four hits. The senior right-hander tallied 10 strikeouts against three walks.

"Entering the weekend, our goal was get our offensive mentality better," Torina said. "We did a great job of that in this game. If we add that to our quality pitching and quality defense, I think we'll be fine."

LEXINGTON, Ky. - The No. 22 LSU softball team put the go-ahead runner into scoring position in the seventh inning, but the Tigers were unable to complete the comeback effort as Kentucky held on to claim a 2-1 win Saturday during the middle game of a SEC weekend series.

In the process, the Wildcats (28-27, 14-13 SEC) secured their first series win over LSU (34-20, 15-12 SEC). The Tigers were able to outthit Kentucky by a 6-4 margin, but stranded five of their seven runners in scoring situations.

Pinch hitter Simone Heyward ignited the seventh-inning rally and chopped a leadoff single through the middle. She scooted over to second base on pinch hitter Kailey McCasland's sacrifice bunt.

After Dylan Supak coaxed a walk, Kentucky turned its bullpen. Chanda Bell entered the game and forced Ashley Langoni to foul out for the second out of the frame.

The Tigers executed a double steal with Heyward and pinch runner Heidi Pizer to place the go-ahead runners into scoring position. Cassie Trosclair knocked a ground out to second base, but was thrown out by a half-step to end the game.

"Our offense swung well and was able to outthit them," head coach Beth Torina said. "Unfortunately, we were unable to get that timely hit. We made some moves in the lineup, maybe that wasn't the right combination. I felt like we needed to shake things up a bit. We'll do something different tomorrow, and do whatever it takes to find the winning combination."

Kentucky jumped ahead by a 1-0 margin on Brittany Cervantes' leadoff home run during the first inning.

The Tigers used two-out magic to draw even in the third inning. Supak was hit-by-pitch, and Langoni smacked a single though the left side. On a 0-1 offering, Trosclair delivered a RBI single down the left field line to score Supak and knot the tally at 1-1.

Ginny Carroll vaulted Kentucky back in-front with a solo dinger over the left centerfield wall to regain a 2-1 advantage.

With the loss, Brittany Mack fell to 14-10 on the season. The senior right-hander notched nine strikeouts versus three walks. She held UK to a pair of runs on a quartet of hits.

Rachel Riley scattered six hits and surrendered one run in 6.1 innings of work before giving way to Bell for the final two outs. The win enabled Riley to improve to 8-7, while Bell picked up her third save.

"It's a pride thing at this point about not getting swept," Torina said. "We need a win to hold onto our seeding in next week's SEC Tournament. The bottom line is we have to swing better, pitch better and play better overall softball game."

LEXINGTON, Ky. – Chanda Bell tossed her fifth career no-hitter and Alice O'Brien provided a two-out RBI single during the sixth inning to lift Kentucky to a 1-0 victory and series sweep over the No. 22 LSU softball team Sunday as 1,554 fans gathered at the UK Softball Complex.

With the result, LSU (34-21, 15-13 SEC) will be the No. 6 seed and will meet Florida on Thursday at 11 a.m. CT on ESPN2 during the SEC Tournament at Rhoads Stadium hosted by Alabama. The Wildcats (29-27, 15-13 SEC) will face off against Georgia the quarterfinal round.

Bell retired the first 12 batters she faced and finished with six strikeouts versus two walks to improve to 16-10 on the season.

"Bell was really tough and did a great job of keeping our offense off-balanced," head coach Beth Torina said. "All the credit and hats off to her for being able to turn in that type of performance on her Senior Day."

LSU's best opportunity to score came during the sixth inning. A.J. Andrews drew a two-out walk and stole second base. After a seven-pitch battle, Bell was able to fan Cassie Troscclair on a full count offering to end the threat.

Kentucky's Griffin Joiner worked her way to a 12-pitch free pass with one out in the home half of the frame. Ginny Carroll's check swing ground out allowed Joiner to move into scoring position. She came around to score on O'Brien's chop single over the circle that was stopped by a diving Allison Falcon. However, Joiner crossed the plate standing up as Falcon's throw home was off-line.

Rachele Fico recorded eight strikeouts against three walks, but fell to 16-11 after being dealt another tough-luck loss. It marked the seventh time this season that the junior right-hander received zero runs of support.

Fico worked her way out of a bases loaded jam with no outs during the first inning. She got Joiner and Carroll on consecutive strikeouts followed by an O'Brien fly ball to keep the game scoreless.

"I think it's good for us right now at this point to go back to being 0-0 with the start of the postseason and to have a fresh mentality," Torina said. "We need to understand that all of the things that we've worked hard for start right now. This group wants to win a championship, and the opportunity is right in-front of them with the SEC Tournament."

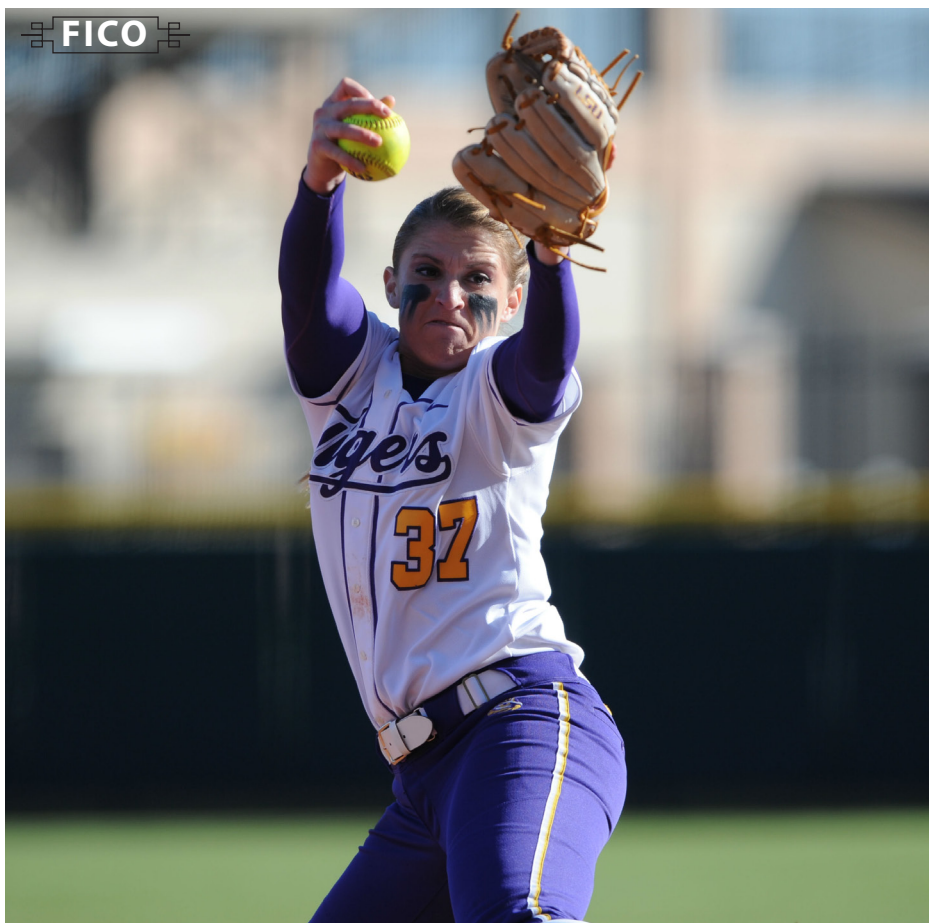
