SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 13 LSU will continue its 10-game homestand and welcomes South Carolina to Tiger Park for a three-game SEC weekend series.
- ▶ LSU (25-5, 5-1 SEC) has strung together seven consecutive victories and has won 11 of its last 13 outings.
- ▶ South Carolina (17-9, 0-3 SEC) opened its renovated ballpark and was swept by No. 4 Alabama over the weekend.
- ▶ The Gamecocks have tallied an impressive .348 team batting average, second-best in the SEC. Sami Garcia has racked up a team-leading 42 hits, while Chelsea Hawkins has connected for a team-high six home runs.
- ▶ LSU has compiled a 37-12 all-time record versus South Carolina which includes 13 straight wins going back to the 2008 season.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has fired out to a 25-5 record and a 5-1 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak which ran from Feb. 13-23.
- The Tigers enter this weekend's South Carolina series winners of their last seven games (March 10-17) and 11 of their last 13 outings (March 1-19).
- LSU has picked up six wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23), No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2) and No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; • 3-2 • March 17).
- LSU's offense has turned in a .302 team batting average compared to a .252 hitting clip through 30 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.2 runs per game compared to a 4.4 runs per game through 30 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 25 home runs through 30 games and nearly doubled its total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have five players with three or more longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on nine occasions most recently an 11-hit effort in game one versus Georgia Southern (March 19). LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a pair of slams which came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2).

- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 11 shutouts and recorded 222 strikeouts over 196.2 innings pitched. The 222 Ks enter this weekend's action ranked 2nd in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 30 games and has batted leadoff in all 30 games for the Tigers. She is second on the team with a .356 batting average.
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the Mississippi State opener (March 8).
- Andrews has registered a team-leading 37 hits which includes a team-high 10 multi-hit efforts. She is currently on a nine-game hitting streak (March 8-19) which has equaled a career-long and has hit safely in 18 of her last 19 outings (Feb. 21-March 19) which includes all six SEC contests. Nine of her 17 RBIs have come during her nine-game hitting streak.
- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Andrews has scored a team-high 23 runs and tallied multiple runs on eight occasions. LSU is 15-0 on the season when Andrews scores a run.

- Andrews has gone 10-for-10 in the stolen base department, her 10 steals are not only a team-high but are tied for 14th place in the SEC rankings.
- Jacee Blades has started LSU's last 27 games, mostly between left and right field. She has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 27 times.
- Blades has compiled a team-leading .363 batting average. She is second on the team with 33 hits and tied for fourth on the squad with 14 runs scored. LSU has won all 11 games this season when Blades has crossed the plate.
- Blades recently had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close (March 8-19) in game two versus Georgia Southern. She has hit safely in 16 of her last 20 games (Feb. 21-March 19) which included all six SEC games.
- Blades has collected a trio of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22) and Syracuse (March 1). She has garnered eight multi-hit efforts, tied for second on the team.
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16).
- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 30 games. She has split her starts between second base (21), shortstop (7) and designated player (2).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fourth on the team with a .322 batting average, while her 28 hits are third on the squad.
- 12 of Falcon's 28 hits have gone for extra bases which includes a team-leading eight doubles.
- Falcon is tied for second on the team with four home runs and has driven home a team-high 19 RBIs. She also is tied for second on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and tops on the squad with six multi-RBI performances.
- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).
- Falcon notched LSWA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Falcon scored two runs which included the game-winner in game two of the Georgia Southern doubleheader (March 19).
- Bianka Bell has started 28 of 30 games between shortstop (23) and second base (5). She has tallied a .325 batting average to go along with a team-leading five home runs and 18 RBIs. Her 18 RBIs rank second on the squad.
- Bell has collected seven multi-hit games and 27 total hits, both fourth on the team. She produced a six-game hitting streak (Feb. 15-22) fueled by five of her multi-hit efforts.
- Bell came away with another six-game hitting streak (March 2-13) and knocked a three-run home run during the first inning of the Mississippi State finale (March 10).

She is the first LSU player since Anissa Young versus Fordham on Feb. 26, 2011 to hit a pair of dingers in the same game.
- Tammy Wray is one of three players to see action in all 30 games, starting 29 contests at third base. She has notched a .228 batting average, four homers and 16 RBIs.
- Wray has split her time between No. 5 and No. 7 slots in the lineup and put together a six-game hitting streak (Feb. 16-22). She also has hit safely in four of her last seven outings (March 10-19).
- Wray's four dingers are tied for second on the team lead after hitting just one homer all of last season, while her 16 RBIs are fifth on the team.
- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21) and on the road at Mississippi State (March 10).
- Nine of Wray's 18 hits on the season have produced a RBI. She also has drawn a team-leading 14 walks which includes five free passes over her last six outings (March 13-19).
- Sandra Simmons has started 29 of 30 games at first base and has primarily batted in the No. 6 spot in the lineup. She has garnered a .276 batting average, three home runs and 17 RBIs. Her 17 RBIs are tied for third on the squad.
- Simmons has hit safely in seven of her last nine games (March 8-19). She also has registered three of her five multi-RBI performances during that stretch.
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series opening win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over the Bulldogs in the series finale.
- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). It marked LSU's first grand slam since Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young accomplished the feat at No. 9 Arizona State (May 16, 2009) during the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, a span of 197 games.
- Kelsi Kloss has made the most of her 16 starts on the season with a .250 batting average, four home runs and 15 RBIs. Her four home runs are tied for second on the team.
- Seven of Kloss' 11 hits on the season have tallied RBIs. She knocked a solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBIs sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2). The six RBIs were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a two-out, two-run single to even the score at 2-2 during the first inning of game two versus Georgia Southern.

- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed, Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner.

- Fico currently has totaled 711 Ks and has already passed former All-American Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season.
- Fico enters this weekend's action 67 strikeouts away from tying Turner (2004-07) for third place.
- Fico turned in a memorable performance for the ages and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.
- Fico claimed her 69th career victory, a two-hit shutout of Georgia Southern (March 19), to move past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for fourth place on LSU's all-time list.
- Meghan Patterson has posted a 4-2 mark with a 1.70 ERA. She tossed a pair of complete game shutouts, a three-hitter versus Purdue (Feb. 8) along with a four-hitter against Nicholls State (Feb. 17).
- Patterson recorded a season's best eight Ks versus Nicholls State (Feb. 17) and Georgia Southern (March 19). She has been LSU's Saturday starter during the first two SEC weekends.
- Patterson was the tough-luck loser in a 2-1 decision at Mississippi State (March 9). In her second career SEC start, she was handed a no-decision after she allowed two runs on three hits and totaled five Ks over her 5.2 frames of action.
- Ashley Czechner has won all six of her decisions and been used both as a starter (6x) and in relief (3x). She has collected wins over Hampton (Feb. 9), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1), Penn State (March 2), Nicholls State (March 13) and No. 17 Kentucky (March 17).
- Czechner's best performance of the season came in a one-hit shutout of Nicholls State (March 13). She got out of a first-inning jam and retired the next 10 batters she faced.
- Czechner followed that up with a solid start to wrap up the series versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17). She went the distance and held the Wildcats to two runs on two hits.
- In her first career road start, Czechner was touched up for one run on four hits and added a season's best eight strikeouts versus UNLV (Feb. 24). She retired 12 of the last 14 batters she faced.

COLUMBIA, S.C. – The LSU softball team endured a three-hour rain delay, and used a four-hit shutout from Rachele Fico's powerful right arm to claim a 5-0 victory over South Carolina to open a SEC series at Beckham Field.

Fico equaled a season's best 10 strikeouts to claim her 10th win of the season. The junior right-hander also secured her eighth shutout during the 2012 campaign.

In the process, LSU (21-8, 5-1 SEC) won its 11th straight decision over South Carolina (19-14, 2-7 SEC).

Offensively, the Tigers received multi-hit performances from A.J. Andrews, Jacee Blades, Allison Falcon and Dylan Supak. Blades also tallied a career-high two RBIs.

"I thought we did a great job of staying focused through the rain delay," head coach Beth Torina said. "I was proud of the players of being prepared to play when the game started. Fico threw hard and had fantastic stuff tonight."

LSU raced out to a 2-0 edge in the first inning. Andrews drew a walk and advanced to third base on a Blades single on a textbook hit-and-run play. An illegal pitch allowed Andrews to cross the plate with the game's first run, and an Ashley Langoni sacrifice fly scored Blades.

The Tigers tacked on three more runs during the second inning. With one out, Morgan Russell coaxed a free pass and scooted over to third base on a Supak double into the left centerfield gap. Andrews blasted a RBI single through the left side, while Blades placed a two-run double down the right field line to make it 5-0.

"A.J. and Jacee did a fantastic job of working together at the top of the lineup," Torina said. "That put some much pressure on the opposing defense. They are both extremely fast, really difficult to defend and doing an excellent job of sparking the offense."

That would be more than enough run support for Fico, who sat down 13 of her final 15 batters she faced to secure the final margin of 5-0.

South Carolina's Kierstyn White dropped to 6-7 on the season and surrendered on five runs over 1.1 innings of work.

LSU's defense snapped a stretch of seven consecutive games and had its first errorless game since a 1-0 win over Troy on March 10.

"I thought we did an awesome job of jumping of them early and keeping our heads right throughout the entire game," Blades said. "We played a great defensive game too, but we'll need to come out here and do the same thing tomorrow."

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Brittany Mack carried a no-hit bid one into the seventh inning, and Ashley Langoni connected for a two-run home run as the LSU softball team doubled its pleasure with another 5-0 victory over South Carolina at Beckham Field during the middle game of a SEC weekend series.

LSU (22-8, 6-1 SEC) won its 12th consecutive game over South Carolina (19-15, 2-8 SEC) and moved within a half-game of Alabama for the top spot in the SEC Western Division.

Mack recorded seven strikeouts against four walks. With the victory, the senior right-hander joined running mate Rachele Fico with an identical 10-4 record for the season. Mack also became the fifth Tiger pitcher to surpass 500 career strikeouts.

Jacee Blades and Ashley Langoni secured multi-hit performances to fuel the offense. Langoni smacked a two-run home run, her team-leading fourth round tripper of the season. For Blades, it was second straight two-hit effort. Allison Falcon and Juliana Santos also added RBIs for the Tigers.

LSU jumped out to an early 1-0 lead during the first inning. A.J. Andrews made the most of a leadoff walk. She advanced to second base on a Blades sacrifice bunt and moved to third base on an illegal pitch. Andrews sprinted home for the game's first run via a Juliana Santos sacrifice fly.

"I liked the fact that the offense took control of the game early again, and Brittany Mack was extremely impressive on the mound," head coach Beth Torina said. "The defense was fantastic early, made some great plays and allowed Brittany to throw her game. As always, she did a great job of keeping other team off-balanced."

With one out in the third inning, Blades deposited a single to left field leading into the Langoni long ball to push the LSU advantage to 3-0. Langoni belted a 2-1 pitch to straight-away centerfield for her 27th career homer which enabled Langoni to move into a fifth-place tie with former All-American Tara Asbill (1997-2000) and Camile Harris (2003-06) on LSU's all-time list. The two RBIs also vaulted Langoni past Christy Conner (2001-03) for sole possession of 10th place on that career list.

"I was seeing the ball and hitting it well even going back to yesterday," Langoni said. "The problem was I was hitting it right at people. Today, I came out a lot more confident. She left one fat over the plate which allowed me to crush the ball over the fence. I'm very excited and honored to be in the company of that group of girls. They worked hard in building the tradition of our program."

After surrendering an opening walk in the first inning, Mack retired 11 straight South Carolina hitters. The Gamecocks best opportunity to score came during the sixth inning. A pair of walks and a dropped fly ball filled the bases with one out. Mack dug deep to get a pair of ground balls to keep the score at 3-0.

"Our team played amazing for the second straight day," Mack said. "The game plan was to throw a little more off-speed than usual because South Carolina is a very aggressive team that swings hard. In the sixth inning, I tried to stay relaxed when they loaded the bases. I took some deep breathes and knew I had to do my part after the two walks."

LSU tacked on two insurance runs during the seventh inning. Tammy Wray and Andrews were issued free passes sandwiched between a Blades bunt single. Santos battled her way to a nine-pitch walk, and Falcon was plunked for the final margin of 5-0.

South Carolina's Audrey Broyles was dealt the loss and dropped to 5-5 on the season. The Tigers struck for six hits, five earned runs and notched seven walks versus Broyles.

LSU 5, SOUTH CAROLINA 0 - 03/25

COLUMBIA, S.C. — A.J. Andrews and Juliana Santos provided three RBIs apiece as the LSU softball team scored in five of six innings en route to a 9-0 six-inning victory over South Carolina to secure a SEC series sweep at Beckham Field.

LSU (23-8, 7-1 SEC) extended its winning streak to a season-long seven straight games. With the victory, the Tigers also vaulted into a first-place tie with Alabama atop the SEC Western Division standings.

LSU won its 13th consecutive game over South Carolina (19-16, 2-9 SEC) and have outscored the Gamecocks by an 89-3 margin during the 13-game run dating back to the 2008 season.

"It was a great series all across the board," head coach Beth Torina said. "I thought we threw excellent on the mound, executed well offensively and played solid defense. The addition of Allison Falcon and Juliana Santos back to the lineup was huge. We swung the bat really well, did a fantastic job of hitting within our plan and were very aggressive. Scoring in the first inning of every ballgame this weekend definitely helped us out"

The Tigers raced out to a 1-0 advantage on an Ashley Langoni solo home run during the first inning. For Langoni, it was her second dinger in as many days. It also marked Langoni's 28th career homer, which allowed her to move past former All-American Tara Asbill (1997-2000) and Camille Harris (2003-06) into sole possession of fifth place on LSU's all-time list. The RBI for Langoni enabled her to draw even with Stephanie Hill (2003-06) for ninth place in that category.

LSU took advantage of a South Carolina fielding error on the infield with two outs in the second inning. The play afforded the Tigers an extra out and filled the bases. On a 0-1 offering, Andrews cashed in and cranked a three-run triple into the right centerfield gap to push the LSU lead to 4-0. The three RBIs for Andrews were a career-high.

The Tigers added a run on a Tammy Wray bases loaded walk during the third inning, and Santos followed with a two-run dinger to left field in the fourth inning to make it 7-0.

Santos and Cassie Trosclair tacked on RBI singles during the sixth inning for the final margin of 9-0. Santos matched a season-high with three hits and set a new season-mark with three RBIs, while Langoni crossed the plate four times to equal a LSU single-game record.

"It's definitely a wonderful feeling to get three big SEC road wins under our belt," Santos said. "A.J. and Jacee were great at the top of the lineup all weekend long. Everyone stepped up, and there's no doubt it was a complete team effort. Everybody contributed, which is great for us going forward."

Rachele Fico sat down the first 12 South Carolina batters she faced before being touched up for a pair of singles in the fifth inning. The junior right-hander garnered two Ks and improved to 11-4 on the season. She gave way to Meghan Patterson, who worked a scoreless sixth stanza to wrap up LSU's 15th shutout for the 2012 campaign.

"All three pitchers looked great and were dominant at different points during the weekend," Torina said. "They made big pitches when we needed them to. They also kept a much-improved and aggressive South Carolina offense off-balanced."

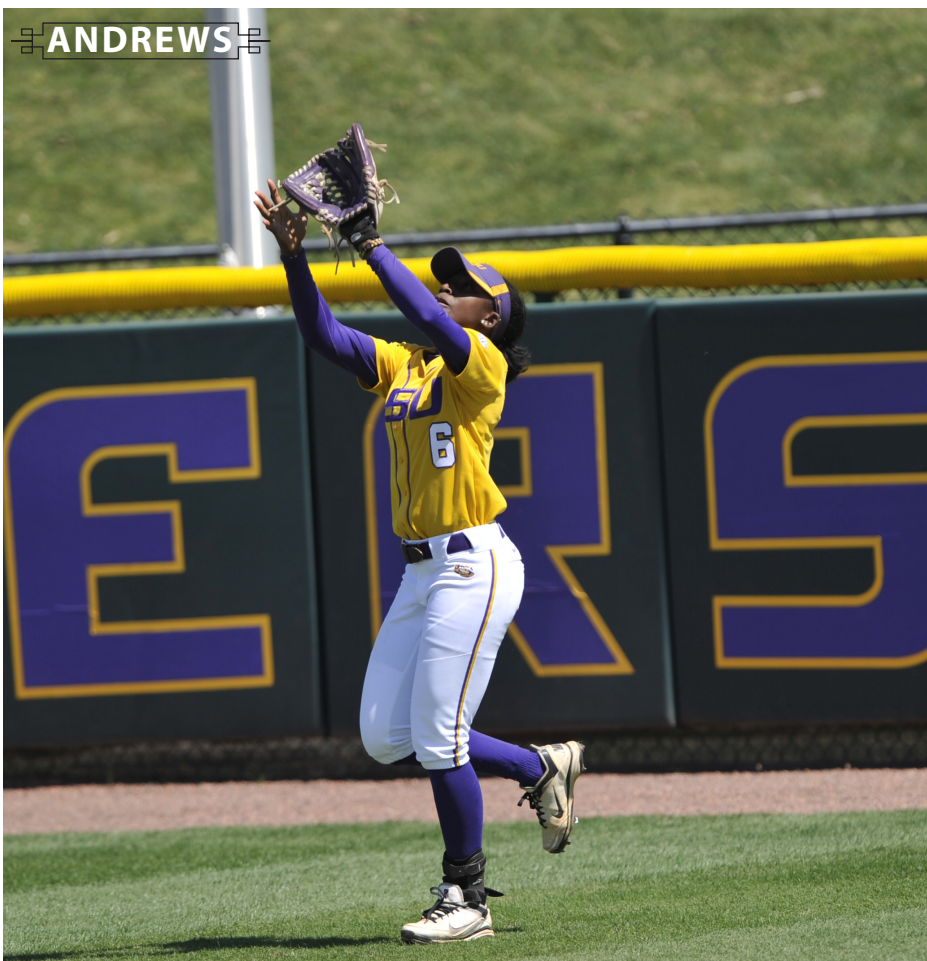
