## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 13 LSU concludes the March portion of its schedule and plays host to Samford for a Saturday doubleheader with first pitch slated for 1 p.m. at Tiger Park.
- ▶ LSU has secured wins in 10 of its last 12 outings since March 10, but the Tigers will look to bounce back from a 12-5 setback to No. 25 South Alabama last time out.
- ▶ The Bulldogs (10-18) have lost three straight and eight of their last 10 outings without starting pitcher Mollie Hanson. Samford dropped two of three games to Western Carolina last weekend.
- ▶ A complete series history is listed on page 4. The lone meeting between the two teams came during the 1997 season.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has collected a 28-7 record and a 7-2 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak (Feb. 13-23) in addition to a nine-game winning streak (March 10-23).
- The Tigers enter this weekend's doubleheader versus Samford winners of 10 of their last 12 games (March 10-27) and 14 of their last 18 outings since March 1.
- LSU has picked up six wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23), No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2) and No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; 3-2 • March 17).
- LSU's offense has turned in a .297 team batting average compared to a .260 hitting clip through 35 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.1 runs per game compared to a 4.5 runs per game through 35 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 32 home runs through 35 games which has doubled the team's total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have six players with three or more longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on nine occasions most recently an 11-hit effort in game one versus Georgia Southern (March 19). LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a trio of slams this season. The first two came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2) followed by one at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- LSU also went 135 games having a player connect for two home runs during the same game. Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray accomplished this feat three games apart versus Georgia Southern (March 19) and South Carolina (March 23).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 13 shutouts and recorded 254 strikeouts over 242.2 innings pitched. The 254 Ks enter this weekend's action ranked 2nd in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 35 games and has batted leadoff in every game for the Tigers. She is second on the team with a .325 batting average.
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the team's SEC opener at Mississippi State (March 8).
- Andrews has registered 39 hits and 10 multi-hit efforts, both feats are second on the team. Her 39 hits also are tied for 12th on the SEC leaderboard.
- Andrews has garnered a pair of career-long nine-game hitting streaks (Feb. 21-March 2, March 8-19) during the season. She has registered a hit during 20 of her last 24 games (Feb. 21-March 27) which includes seven of her nine SEC contests.
- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Andrews has scored a team-high 24 runs and tallied multiple

runs on eight occasions. LSU is 16-0 on the season when Andrews scores a run.

- Andrews has gone 11-for-11 in the stolen base department. Her 10 steals are not only a team-high but are just outside the SEC's Top 15.
- Jacee Blades has started LSU's last 32 games, mostly between left and right field. She also has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 30 times.
- Blades has compiled a team-leading .380 batting average on a team-high 41 hits. Her 41 hits are ranked ninth among the SEC leaders.
- Blades is fifth on the squad with 16 runs scored. LSU has won 12 of 13 games this season when she has crossed the plate.
- Blades recently had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close (March 8-19) in game two versus Georgia Southern. She has hit safely in 20 of her last 25 games (Feb. 21-March 27) which includes eight of nine SEC outings.
- Blades has collected a quartet of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1) and South Carolina (March 23). She has garnered a team-leading 11 multi-hit efforts, three of those performances have come over LSU's last five games (March 22-27).
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16).
- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 35 games. She has split her starts between second base (26), shortstop (7) and designated player (2).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fourth on the team with a .295 batting average, while her 31 hits are tied for third on the squad.
- Falcon's four home runs also are tied for third on the team. She has driven home 20 RBIs but has been limited to just four RBIs over her last 15 appearances (March 3-27).
- Falcon is third on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and second on the squad with six multi-RBI performances.
- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).
- Falcon notched LSWA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Falcon will be looking to bust out of a 4-for-39 stretch over her last 14 games since the start of SEC play (March 8-27).
- Bianka Bell has started 33 of 35 games between shortstop (28) and second base (5). She has tallied a .323 batting average to go along with a team-leading eight home runs and 26 RBIs.
- Over her last eight games (March 17-27), Bell has produced a .400 clip (8-for-20) with five home runs and 11 RBIs. She cranked her first career grand slam at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- Bell has collected eight multi-hit games and 31 total hits, both tied for third on the team. She produced a six-game hitting streak (Feb. 15-22) fueled by five of her multi-hit efforts.
- Bell came away with another six-game hitting streak (March 2-13) and knocked a three-run home run during the first inning of the Mississippi State finale (March 10).

- Bell cranked a leadoff double to spark LSU's three-run sixth inning against No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep.
- Bell added her first career two homer game to open the Georgia Southern doubleheader (March 19) and provided the game-winning RBI double during the third inning of game two. She is the first LSU player since Anissa Young versus Fordham on Feb. 26, 2011 to hit a pair of dingers in the same game.
- Tammy Wray is one of three players to see action in all 35 games, starting 34 contests at third base. She has notched a .250 batting average to go along with a seven homers and 21 RBIs. The seven dingers are 21 RBIs are both second on the team.
- Wray has split her time between No. 5 and No. 7 slots in the lineup and put together a six-game hitting streak (Feb. 16-22). She also has hit safely in seven of her last 12 outings (March 10-27).
- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21), at Mississippi State (March 10) and South Carolina (March 23). She added a solo longball versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Wray's two-homer performance during the South Carolina game was LSU's first against a SEC opponent since Rachel Mitchell versus Arkansas (April 27, 2008) at the original Tiger Park.
- 12 of Wray's 22 hits have gone for extra bases and produced a RBI. She also has drawn a team-leading 17 walks which includes eight free passes over her last 10 outings (March 13-27).
- Sandra Simmons has started 34 of 35 games at first base and has primarily batted in the No. 6 spot in the lineup. She has garnered a .293 batting average, three home runs and 17 RBIs. Her 17 RBIs are tied for fourth on the squad.
- Simmons has hit safely in 12 of her last 14 games (March 8-27) which includes a current career-long seven-game run (March 19-27). She also has registered three of her five multi-RBI performances during that stretch.
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series opening win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over Mississippi State (March 8) during the series finale.
- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). - Kelli Kloss has made the most of her 19 starts on the season with a .264 batting average, four home runs and 16 RBIs. Her four home runs are tied for third on the team.
- Eight of Kloss' 14 hits on the season have tallied RBIs. She knocked a solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBIs sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2).

- The six RBIs were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a two-out, two-run single to even the score at 2-2 during the first inning of game two versus Georgia Southern.
- Rikki Alcaraz has started 16 of LSU's last 20 games (Feb. 22-March 27) and emerged as the primary option at designated player spot. She has racked up an impressive .404 batting average, three home runs and 15 RBIs.
- All 21 of Alcaraz's hits have come during a stretch where she has hit safely in 14 of her last 19 outings (Feb. 15-March 27). Her three-hit effort versus UNLV (Feb. 23) and Georgia Southern (March 19) were career-highs.
- Alcaraz belted her first career home run, a two-run shot, in a 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She added a RBI single to ignite LSU's three-run sixth inning versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep of the Wildcats.

- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed, Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner.
- Fico currently has totaled 726 Ks and has already passed former

All-American Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season.

- Fico enters this weekend's action 52 strikeouts away from tying Turner (2004-07) for third place.
- Fico turned in a memorable performance for the ages and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.
- Fico claimed her 69th career victory, a two-hit shutout of Georgia Southern (March 19), to move past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for fourth place on LSU's all-time list.
- Fico has been handed back-to-back losses in her last two starts versus South Carolina (March 24) and at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27). The seven runs allowed by Fico during the South Alabama game was the second-most on the season.
- Meghan Patterson has posted a 5-2 mark with a 1.72 ERA. She tossed a pair of complete game shutouts, a three-hitter versus Purdue (Feb. 8) along with a four-hitter against Nicholls State (Feb. 17).
- In her last start, Patterson came away with seven strikeouts and threw 6.2 frames of four-hit ball against Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Patterson recorded a season's best eight Ks versus Nicholls State (Feb. 17) and Georgia Southern (March 19). She has been LSU's Saturday starter during two of the first three SEC weekends.
- Patterson was the tough-luck loser in a 2-1 decision at Mississippi State (March 9). In her second career SEC start, she was handed a
