SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 13 LSU heads into the April portion of its schedule and opens a nine-game road swing with a Wednesday doubleheader against Florida State with first pitch scheduled for 4 p.m. CT.
- ▶ With its doubleheader sweep of Samford last weekend, LSU (30-7) became the third SEC team to reach the 30-win plateau on the season.
- ▶ Florida State (28-12) has won all three of its ACC series over Maryland, North Carolina and North Carolina State. Monica Perry and Lacey Waldrop have combined for 27 of the team's 28 wins in the pitching circle.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has collected a 30-7 record and a 7-2 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak (Feb. 13-23) in addition to a nine-game winning streak (March 10-23).
- The Tigers enter this week's doubleheader against Florida State winners of 12 of their last 14 games (March 10-30) and 16 of their last 20 outings since March 1.
- LSU has picked up six wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23), No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2) and No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; 3-2 • March 17).
- LSU's offense has turned in a .297 team batting average compared to a .260 hitting clip through 37 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.1 runs per game compared to a 4.4 runs per game through 37 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 32 home runs through 37 games which has doubled the team's total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have six players with three or more longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on 10 occasions most recently an 10-hit effort during game two versus Samford (March 30). LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a trio of slams this season. The first two came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2) followed by one at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- LSU also went 135 games having a player connect for two home runs during the same game. Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray accomplished this feat three games apart versus Georgia Southern (March 19) and South Carolina (March 23).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 15 shutouts and recorded 272 strikeouts over 255.2 innings pitched. The 272 Ks enter this week's action ranked 2nd in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 37 games and has batted leadoff in every game for the Tigers. She is second on the team with a .336 batting average.
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the team's SEC opener at Mississippi State (March 8).
- Andrews has registered 42 hits, second on the team and tied for 12th on the SEC leaderboard. She has tallied 11 multi-hit efforts which are tied for the team lead.
- Andrews has garnered a pair of career-long nine-game hitting streaks (Feb. 21-March 2, March 8-19) during the season. She has registered a hit during 22 of her last 26 games (Feb. 21-March 30) which includes seven of her nine SEC contests.

- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Andrews has scored a team-high 27 runs and tallied multiple runs on nine occasions. LSU is 18-0 on the season when Andrews scores a run.
- Andrews has gone 12-for-12 in the stolen base department. Her 12 steals are tied for 14th in the SEC rankings.
- Jacee Blades has started LSU's last 34 games, mostly between left and right field. She also has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 32 times.
- Blades has compiled a team-leading .381 batting average on a team-high 44 hits. Her 44 hits are ranked ninth among the SEC leaders.
- Blades is fifth on the squad with 17 runs scored. LSU has won 13 of 14 games this season when she has crossed the plate.
- Blades recently had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close (March 8-19) in game two versus Georgia Southern. She has hit safely in 22 of her last 27 games (Feb. 21-March 30) which includes eight of nine SEC outings.
- Blades has collected a quartet of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1) and South Carolina (March 23). She has garnered a team-leading 11 multi-hit efforts, three of those performances have come over LSU's last seven games (March 22-30).
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16).
- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 37 games. She has split her starts between second base (28), shortstop (7) and designated player (2).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fourth on the team with a .297 batting average and 33 total hits.
- Falcon's four home runs also are tied for third on the team. She has driven home 21 RBIs but has been limited to five RBIs over her last 17 appearances (March 3-30).
- Falcon has hit safely in four of her last six outings (March 23-30) after she compiled a 2-for-27 run during a 10-game stretch (March 8-22).
- Falcon is fourth on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and second on the squad with six multi-RBI performances.
- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).
- Falcon notched LSWA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Bianka Bell has started 35 of 37 games between shortstop (30) and second base (5). She has tallied a .327 batting average to go

- Over her last 10 games (March 17-30), Bell has produced a .393 clip (11-for-28) with five home runs and 15 RBIs. She cranked her first career grand slam at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- Bell is the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week (April 1) after she has tallied hits and collected RBIs in all four outings last week. Her four RBIs at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27) were a career-high.
- Bell has collected nine multi-hit games and 34 total hits, both third on the team. She produced a six-game hitting streak (Feb. 15-22) fueled by five of her multi-hit efforts.
- Bell came away with another six-game hitting streak (March 2-13) and knocked a three-run home run during the first inning of the Mississippi State finale (March 10).
- Bell cranked a leadoff double to spark LSU's three-run sixth inning against No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which lead to a series sweep.

- Tammy Wray is one of three players to see action in all 37 games, starting 36 contests at third base. She has notched a .244 batting average to go along with a seven homers and 21 RBIs. The seven dingers are 21 RBIs are both second on the team.
- Wray has split her time between No. 5 and No. 7 slots in the lineup and put together a six-game hitting streak (Feb. 16-22). She also has hit safely in seven of her last 14 outings (March 10-30).
- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21), at Mississippi State (March 10) and South Carolina (March 23). She added a solo longball versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Wray's two-homer performance during the South Carolina game was LSU's first against a SEC opponent since Rachel Mitchell versus Arkansas (April 27, 2008) at the original Tiger Park.
- 12 of Wray's 22 hits have gone for extra bases and produced a RBI. She also has drawn a team-leading 19 walks which includes 10 free passes over her last 12 outings (March 13-30).
- Sandra Simmons has started 36 of 37 games at first base and has primarily batted in the No. 6 spot in the lineup. She has garnered a .278 batting average, three home runs and 17 RBIs. Her 17 RBIs are tied for fifth on the squad.
- Simmons has hit safely in 12 of her last 16 games (March 8-30) and her career-long seven-game run (March 19-27) came to a close during game one of the Samford twinbill. She also has registered three of her five multi-RBI performances during that stretch.
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series opening win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over Mississippi State (March 8) during the series finale.

- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). It marked LSU's first grand slam since Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young accomplished the feat at No. 9 Arizona State (May 16, 2009) during the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, a span of 197 games.
- Kelsi Kloss has made the most of her 20 starts on the season with a .268 batting average, four home runs and 17 RBIs. Her four home runs are tied for third on the team.
- Nine of Kloss' 15 hits on the season have tallied RBIs. She knocked a solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBIs sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2). The six RBIs were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a two-out, two-run single to even the score at 2-2 during the first inning of game two versus Georgia Southern.
- Rikki Alcaraz has started 17 of LSU's last 22 games (Feb. 22-March 30) and emerged as the primary option at designated player spot. She has racked up an impressive .396 batting average, three home runs and 15 RBIs.
- All 21 of Alcaraz's hits have come during a stretch where she has hit safely in 14 of her last 20 outings (Feb. 15-March 30). Her three-hit effort versus UNLV (Feb. 23) and Georgia Southern (March 19) were career-highs.

- LSU's pitching staff is headed by Rachele Fico, who has compiled a 17-5 record, a 1.83 ERA and 168 strikeouts over 138.0 innings. Her 168 Ks are tops in the SEC.

- In SEC action, Fico has turned in a 5-1 mark, 1.08 ERA and amassed 52 strikeouts over her 45.1 frames of action.
- Fico was the No. 1 overall pick by the Akron Racers during the 2013 NPF College Draft (April 1). It marked the second straight season that LSU has had the league's No. 1 pick - Brittany Mack (2012).
- Fico has already tossed 10 shutouts - No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8), Tulsa (Feb. 9), North Dakota State (Feb. 15), Virginia (Feb. 16), Ohio State (Feb. 22), No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23), Mississippi State (March 10), Georgia Southern (March 19), South Carolina (March 22) and Samford (March 30).
- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed, Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner.
- Fico currently has totaled 733 Ks and has already passed former All-American Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season.
- Fico enters this week's action 45 strikeouts away from tying Turner (2004-07) for third place.
- Fico turned in a memorable performance and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.
- Fico claimed her 69th career victory, a two-hit shutout of Georgia Southern (March 19), to move past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for

- Fico rebounded from back-to-back losses to South Carolina (March 24) and at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27) with a two-hit shut-out of Samford (March 30). The seven runs allowed by Fico during the South Alabama game was the second-most this season.
- Meghan Patterson has posted a 5-2 mark with a 1.69 ERA. She tossed a pair of complete game shutouts, a three-hitter versus Purdue (Feb. 8) along with a four-hitter against Nicholls State (Feb. 17).
- In her last start, Patterson came away with seven strikeouts and threw 6.2 frames of four-hit ball against Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).

BATON ROUGE – The No. 23 LSU softball team was unable to connect back-to-back wins to open its five-game homestand as No. 22 Florida State emerged with an 8-1 victory at Tiger Park.

The Tigers (30-14) and Seminoles (39-10) met on the softball diamond for the first time since LSU's 2-1 victory in an elimination game at the 2004 Women's College World Series.

LSU scored its lone run of the contest during the seventh inning. Tammy Wray knocked a one-out single to right field before giving way to pinch runner Alex Boulet, who provided a spark off the bench with a steal of second base. She alertly scooted to third base following the stolen base after the Florida State defense was caught out of position on the play.

Two batters later, Ashleigh Kuhn cranked a RBI single to plate Boulet for the final margin of 8-1. Jacee Blades notched a 2-for-3 performance to claim her third multi-hit effort of the season, while Ashley Langoni drew her 38th walk of the season to match former All-American Ashlee Ducote's single season record set in 2000.

"I really don't have an answer for them," head coach Beth Torina said. "Honestly, they looked very unprepared tonight, and that's my fault. "We haven't played back-to-back mid-week games this year. We usually have a day to prepare for our opponents, and we didn't have time to prepare for either of them [McNeese State or Florida State] coming back from Tennessee on Monday. That's really the only thing that I can attribute this type of performance to."

Florida State dented the scoreboard with a pair of runs in the first and third innings to build a 4-0 advantage. Kirstin Austin and Courtney Senas provided the key hits and laced two-run singles to centerfield and left centerfield, respectively.

The Seminoles tacked on a Celeste Gomez solo home run with one out during the fourth inning to push their lead to 5-0 and chase LSU starter Brittany Mack from the game. Mack was dealt her fourth straight setback by a Top 25 opponent and fell to 12-8 for the season.

"Tennessee, Alabama and Florida State – I've got to give credit to them," Mack said. "They've got some good hitters. I could try and place the ball a little better, but they've got some really good hitters. I just had a bad day today."

Rachele Fico fired 3.2 frames of two-hit relief and notched three strikeouts. The three Ks allowed Fico to pass Cody Trahan (2007-10) for sole possession of sixth place on LSU's all-time list.

Florida State added three unearned runs in the seventh inning aided by a Wray fielding error and a Morgan Russell passed ball to make it 8-0. Monica Perry went the distance for the Seminoles in the circle to move to 18-5 on the season. She gave up one run on five hits and recorded four strikeouts versus two walks.

"I didn't think that Brittany was the reason we lost tonight," Torina said. "I think that we didn't play very well as a team. I thought that this was the worst game that we've played the entire season on all sides of the ball. I thought we played defense very poorly, I thought we pitched poorly, I thought we swung the bat poorly."
