## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU heads back into SEC action with a three-game weekend series at Arkansas. Game times are scheduled for Friday at 6 p.m., Saturday at 1 p.m. and Sunday at 1 p.m. from Bogle Park.
- ▶ LSU (31-7, 7-2 SEC) has won 13 of its last 15 games since March 10 which includes a 5-4 comeback win over Florida State on Wednesday.
- ▶ The Tigers have won their first three SEC series over Kentucky, Mississippi State and South Carolina.
- ▶ Arkansas (25-13, 3-6 SEC) is coming off a weekend sweep of then No. 22 Georgia and being fueled by Devon Wallace, the reigning SEC Player of the Week.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has collected a 31-7 record and a 7-2 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak (Feb. 13-23) in addition to a nine-game winning streak (March 10-23).
- The Tigers enter this weekend's series at Arkansas winners of 13 of their last 15 games (March 10-April 3) and 17 of their last 21 outings since March 1.
- LSU has picked up six wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23), No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2) and No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; 3-2 • March 17).
- LSU's offense has turned in a .296 team batting average compared to a .259 hitting clip through 38 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.1 runs per game compared to a 4.4 runs per game through 38 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 32 home runs through 38 games which has more than doubled the team's total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have six players with three or more longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on 10 occasions most recently an 10-hit effort during game two versus Samford (March 30). LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to

the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a trio of slams this season. The first two came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2) followed by one at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).

- LSU also went 135 games between having a player connect for two home runs during the same game. Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray accomplished this feat three games apart versus Georgia Southern (March 19) and South Carolina (March 23).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 15 shutouts and recorded 277 strikeouts over 262.2 innings pitched. The 277 Ks enter the Arkansas series ranked 2nd in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 38 games and has batted leadoff in every game for the Tigers. She is second on the team with a .352 batting average.
- Andrews has registered a team-leading 45 hits, good enough for eighth place on the SEC leaderboard. She also has tallied a team-leading 12 multi-hit efforts which includes a 3-for-3 effort and a career-high three RBIs at Florida State (April 3).
- Andrews has garnered a pair of career-long nine-game hitting streaks (Feb. 21-March 2, March 8-19) during the season. She has registered a hit during 23 of her last 27 games (Feb. 21-April 3)

which includes seven of her nine SEC contests.

- Andrews has scored a team-high 27 runs and tallied multiple runs on nine occasions. LSU is 18-0 on the season when Andrews scores a run.
- Andrews has gone 14-for-14 in the stolen base department. Her 14 steals are tied for eighth in the SEC rankings.
- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the team's SEC opener at Mississippi State (March 8).
- Jacee Blades has started LSU's last 35 games, mostly between left and right field. She also has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 33 times.
- Blades has compiled a team-leading .371 batting average, while her 43 hits are second on the squad. Her 43 hits also are tied for 10th place among the SEC leaders.
- Blades is fifth on the squad with 17 runs scored. LSU has won 13 of 14 games this season when she has crossed the plate.
- Blades recently had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close (March 8-19) in game two versus Georgia Southern. She has hit safely in 22 of her last 28 games (Feb. 21-April 3) which includes eight of nine SEC outings.
- Blades has collected a quartet of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1) and South Carolina (March 23). She has garnered 11 multi-hit efforts to rank second on the team, three of those performances have come over LSU's last eight games (March 22-April 3).
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16).
- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 38 games. She has split her starts between second base (29), shortstop (7) and designated player (2).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fourth on the team with a .289 batting average and 33 total hits.
- Falcon's four home runs also are tied for third on the team. She has driven home 21 RBIs but has been limited to five RBIs over her last 18 appearances (March 3-April 3).
- Falcon has hit safely in four of her last seven outings (March 23-April 3) after she compiled a 2-for-27 run during a 10-game stretch (March 8-22).
- Falcon is fourth on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and second on the squad with six multi-RBI performances.
- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).

- Falcon notched LSWA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Bianka Bell has started 36 of 38 games between shortstop (31) and second base (5). She has tallied a .318 batting average to go along with a team-leading eight home runs and 31 RBIs.
- Over her last 11 games (March 17-April 3), Bell has produced five home runs and 16 RBIs. She cranked her first career grand slam at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- Bell is the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week (April 1) after she tallied hits and collected RBIs in all four outings last week. Her four RBIs at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27) were a career-high.
- Bell has collected nine multi-hit games and 34 total hits, both third on the team. She produced a six-game hitting streak (Feb. 15-22) fueled by five of her multi-hit efforts.
- Bell came away with another six-game hitting streak (March 2-13) and knocked a three-run home run during the first inning of the Mississippi State finale (March 10).
- Bell cranked a leadoff double to spark LSU's three-run sixth inning against No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which lead to a series sweep.
- Bell added her first career two homer game to open the Georgia Southern doubleheader (March 19) and provided the game-winning RBI double during the third inning of game two. She is the first LSU player since Anissa Young versus Fordham on Feb. 26, 2011 to hit a pair of dingers in the same game.
- Tammy Wray is one of three players to see action in all 38 games, starting 37 contests at third base. She has notched a .234 batting average to go along with a seven homers and 21 RBIs. The seven dingers second, while the 21 RBIs are tied for third on the team.
- Wray has split her time between No. 5 and No. 7 slots in the lineup and notched a season's best six-game hitting streak (Feb. 16-22).
- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21), at Mississippi State (March 10) and South Carolina (March 23). She added a solo longball versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Wray's two-homer performance during the South Carolina game was LSU's first against a SEC opponent since Rachel Mitchell versus Arkansas (April 27, 2008) at the original Tiger Park.
- 12 of Wray's 22 hits have gone for extra bases and produced a RBI. She also has drawn a team-leading 19 walks which includes 10 free passes over her last 13 outings (March 13-April 3).
- Sandra Simmons has started 37 of 38 games at first base and has primarily batted in the No. 6 spot in the lineup. She has garnered a .277 batting average, three home runs and 17 RBIs. Her 17 RBIs are tied for fifth on the squad.
- Simmons has hit safely in 13 of her last 17 games (March 8-April 3) and her career-long seven-game run (March 19-27) came to a close during game one of the Samford DH.
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series open-

ing win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over Mississippi State (March 8) during the series finale.

- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). It marked LSU's first grand slam since Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young accomplished the feat at No. 9 Arizona State (May 16, 2009) during the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, a span of 197 games.
- Kellsie Kloss has made the most of her 20 starts on the season with a .268 batting average, four home runs and 17 RBIs. Her four home runs are tied for third on the team.
- Nine of Kloss' 15 hits on the season have tallied RBIs. She knocked a solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBIs sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2). The six RBIs were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a two-out, two-run single to even the score at 2-2 during the first inning of game two versus Georgia Southern.
- Rikki Alcaraz has started 18 of LSU's last 23 games (Feb. 22-April 3) and emerged as the primary option at designated player spot. She has racked up an impressive .368 batting average, three home runs and 15 RBIs.
- All 21 of Alcaraz's hits have come during a stretch where she has hit safely in 14 of her last 21 outings (Feb. 15-April 3). Her three-hit efforts versus UNLV (Feb. 23) and Georgia Southern (March 19) are career-highs.
- Alcaraz belted her first career home run, a two-run shot, in a 14-6

win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She added a RBI single to ignite LSU's three-run sixth inning versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep of the Wildcats.

- Alcaraz has added RBIs in five of her last 10 appearances (March 16-April 3). Her two-run home run put the Tigers on the scoreboard during LSU's 4-0 series opening win over South Carolina (March 22).
- Lauren Houston has checked in with 20 starts at catcher. She is batting .255 with one homer and 7 RBIs on the season. Her lone longball came on a two-run shot at Ole Miss (Feb. 13).
- Houston collected a two-run single to finish off an 8-0 five-inning win versus Georgia Southern (March 19). She has scored a run in four of her last five outings (March 19-April 3) which includes a career-best three runs during LSU's 5-4 win at Florida State (April 3).
- Simone Heyward has started 20 of LSU's last 23 games in the outfield (Feb. 24-April 3). She has picked up all 17 of her hits on the season during that stretch en route to a .315 batting average.
- Seven of Heyward's 10 stolen bases have come during SEC play. The seven steals are tied for the conference lead in league play.
- Heyward has notched hits in 11 of those 20 starts (Feb. 24-April 3) highlighted by her first career three-hit performance to open the Kentucky series (March 15). She also turned in a 2-for-3 effort versus No. 16 UCLA (Feb. 24) and a 2-for-2 performance with two runs scored at Florida State (April 3).
- Heyward reached base in all four of her plate appearances and scored two runs during LSU's 14-6 win over Michigan (March 2).

- Katie Guillory has started in 10 games at right field. She has totaled a .233 batting average, one home run and 4 RBIs.
- Guillory has already doubled her career hit total and connected for her first career longball versus North Dakota State (Feb. 15).
- Kailey McCasland has made 11 starts mostly at designated player spot. She has drawn 10 walks, tied for fourth on the team, en route to a .385 on-base percentage.
- McCasland collected hits during the No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 10) and BYU (Feb. 21) games.
- Hailey Smith has tallied four starts, three at designated player. She notched two hits and a RBI against Hampton (Feb. 9).
- Dylan Supak has secured five starts, four at designated player. She has tallied a hit and scored a run during four of her five starts. Her last start came during game two versus Samford (March 30).
- For the season, Supak has a .294 batting average and three RBIs. She picked up a two-run single versus No. 10 Oregon (March 1).

- LSU's pitching staff is headed by Rachele Fico, who has compiled a 18-5 record, a 1.83 ERA and 173 strikeouts over 145.0 innings. Her 173 Ks are tops in the SEC.
- In SEC action, Fico has turned in a 5-1 mark, 1.08 ERA and amassed 52 strikeouts over her 45.1 frames of action.
- Fico was the No. 1 overall pick by the Akron Racers during the 2013 NPF College Draft (April 1). It marked the second straight season that LSU has had the league's No. 1 pick - Brittany Mack (2012).
- Fico has already tossed 10 shutouts - No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8), Tulsa (Feb. 9), North Dakota State (Feb. 15), Virginia (Feb. 16), Ohio State (Feb. 22), No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23), Mississippi State (March 10), Georgia Southern (March 19), South Carolina (March 22) and Samford (March 30).
- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed, Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner.
- Fico currently has totaled 738 Ks and has already passed former All-American Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season.
- Fico enters the Arkansas series action 40 strikeouts away from tying Turner (2004-07) for third place.
- Fico turned in a memorable performance and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.
- Fico claimed her 69th career victory, a two-hit shutout of Georgia Southern (March 19), to move past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for fourth place on LSU's all-time list.
- Fico rebounded from back-to-back losses to South Carolina (March 24) and at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27) with a two-hit shutout of Samford (March 30). The seven runs allowed by Fico during the South Alabama game was the second-most this season.
- Meghan Patterson has posted a 5-2 mark with a 1.69 ERA. She tossed a pair of complete game shutouts, a three-hitter versus Purdue (Feb. 8) along with a four-hitter against Nicholls State (Feb. 17).
- In her last start, Patterson came away with seven strikeouts and threw 6.2 frames of four-hit ball against Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Patterson recorded a season's best eight Ks versus Nicholls State (Feb. 17) and Georgia Southern (March 19). She has been LSU's Saturday starter during two of the first three SEC weekends.

- After Tammy Wray walked and Kelsi Kloss added an infield single to load the bases, Katie Guillory lifted a bloop RBI single to right centerfield to push the Tigers ahead by a 3-2 margin. LSU tacked on another run on Lauren Houston bases loaded walk to give the Tigers a two-run cushion.

**LSU 1, ARKANSAS 0 - 03/30**

**BATON ROUGE** – Rachele Fico racked up a season-high 11 strikeouts en route to her ninth shutout of the season as the LSU softball team secured a 1-0 walk-off victory over Arkansas in-front of a season's best 1,389 fans at Tiger Park.

LSU (25-8, 8-1 SEC) pushed its winning streak to season's long nine consecutive games and has won 14 of the last 15 meetings versus Arkansas (18-14, 2-10 SEC). The Tigers also set a new program record by posting their fifth consecutive SEC shutout. The previous mark was four straight SEC shutouts on five different occasions, the latest coming during the 2011 season.

"It was huge getting the win tonight against Arkansas," Fico said. "They've beaten some quality teams this year, so you just have to respect an opponent like that. We had to just keep fighting throughout the game. We had a couple of hits throughout the game. We just had to piece them together. We were finally able to do that in the seventh inning, and we came up really big."

The 11 strikeouts for Fico enabled her to vault past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for sole possession of seventh place on LSU's all-time list. The junior right-hander was touched up for trio of singles and didn't allow an Arkansas runner to reach third base. With the victory, Fico moved to 12-4 on the season.

LSU broke through for the game's only run during the seventh inning. Pinch hitter Simone Heyward drew a leadoff walk, while A.J. Andrews and Jacee Blades followed with bunt singles. A throwing error by Arkansas third baseman Chloe Oprzedek on Blades' hit allowed Heyward to scoot home for the win.

"That [the Heyward walk] was a key," head coach Beth Torina said. "It's so nice to have so many options like that on our bench. It's so nice that she's able to come in and have a quality at-bat like that. It shows how focused she was throughout the seven innings."

The top six hitters in the LSU lineup all produced hits highlighted by Andrews' 2-for-4 performance. It was her fifth multi-hit effort in her last 11 games. Ashley Langoni notched a double and coaxed a pair of walks, while Allison Falcon ripped her first triple of the season.

The Razorbacks' Chelsea Cohen was tagged with the tough-luck loss and fell to 11-10 on the season. She notched two strikeouts against three walks.

"We definitely need to have a better plan with [Chelsea] Cohen," Torina said. "We don't know what our adjustments will be, but we'll sit down and talk about it. We definitely need to do something to be able to put the ball into play a little bit more consistently."

**LSU 9, ARKANSAS 1 - 03/31**

**BATON ROUGE** - A.J. Andrews, Ashley Langoni and Juliana Santos each collected two hits and a pair of RBIs as the LSU softball team cruised to a 9-1 five-inning victory over Arkansas in-front of season's best 1,421 fans at Tiger Park.

LSU (26-8, 9-1 SEC) racked up 11 hits, and all nine players in the starting lineup reached base. The Tigers also extended their season-long winning streak to 10 consecutive games and have won 15 of the last 16 meetings versus Arkansas (18-15, 2-11 SEC)

"That was a great job for us," head coach Beth Torina said. "I thought all the way around it was a fantastic effort. Both on the mound and offensively – that was one of the best I've seen them. It was one of the best we've seen them offensively all season, and we can expect that from them because they are capable of putting up those numbers."

Brittany Mack posted seven strikeouts against one walk and won her ninth straight decision to improve to 12-4 on the season. The senior right-hander was touched up for one run on three hits. She pounded the strike zone early and often en route to 14-of-20 first pitch strikes.

LSU came out clicking on all cylinders out of the gate and posted three first-inning runs. Jacee Blades and Langoni strung together back-to-back singles, while Santos crushed a RBI double into the left centerfield gap to give LSU a 1-0 edge.

Allison Falcon smashed a RBI single to left field which plated Langoni. A throwing error by Arkansas left fielder Jennifer Falcon enabled Santos to scamper home to make it 3-0.

"Of course, we wanted to come out and prove a point today," Santos said. "We had a lot of opportunities yesterday, and we just weren't able to capitalize on them. We hit fairly decent yesterday, we just didn't get the timely hits. The coaching staff just put emphasis on that today. We just came out swinging, and I think you would agree with me that everybody got it done today."

Arkansas scored its lone run during the third inning on an Amanda Guile two-out, RBI single to draw back to 3-1. The run ended LSU's program record streak of five consecutive SEC shutouts. It also was the first earned run allowed by the Tigers during a 56.1 innings stretch dating back to the Mississippi State series opener on March 16.

LSU fired back with three-run fourth and fifth innings for the final margin of 9-1.

Tammy Wray opened the fourth with a leadoff single. Pinch runner Alex Boulet used aggressive base running to scoot all the way into third base on an Ashleigh Kuhn sacrifice bunt. Andrews, Langoni and Santos tacked on RBI hits to vault the Tigers to a 6-1 advantage.

The Tigers loaded the bases to start the fifth inning after an Ashley Applegate single, a Lauren Houston hit batsman and a Kuhn walk. Andrews laced a RBI single to left field, while Houston scored via a wild pitch to push the LSU edge to 8-1. Consecutive walks to Blades and Langoni capped the 9-1 win.

Arkansas' Chelsea Cohen was tagged for six runs on nine hits in four-plus frames. She fell to 11-11 for the season.

"When they hit, they definitely hit in big bunches and big numbers – you can see that in our innings, we score a lot of runs at one time," Torina said. "It's definitely a mentality, and today we definitely had that confident mentality."

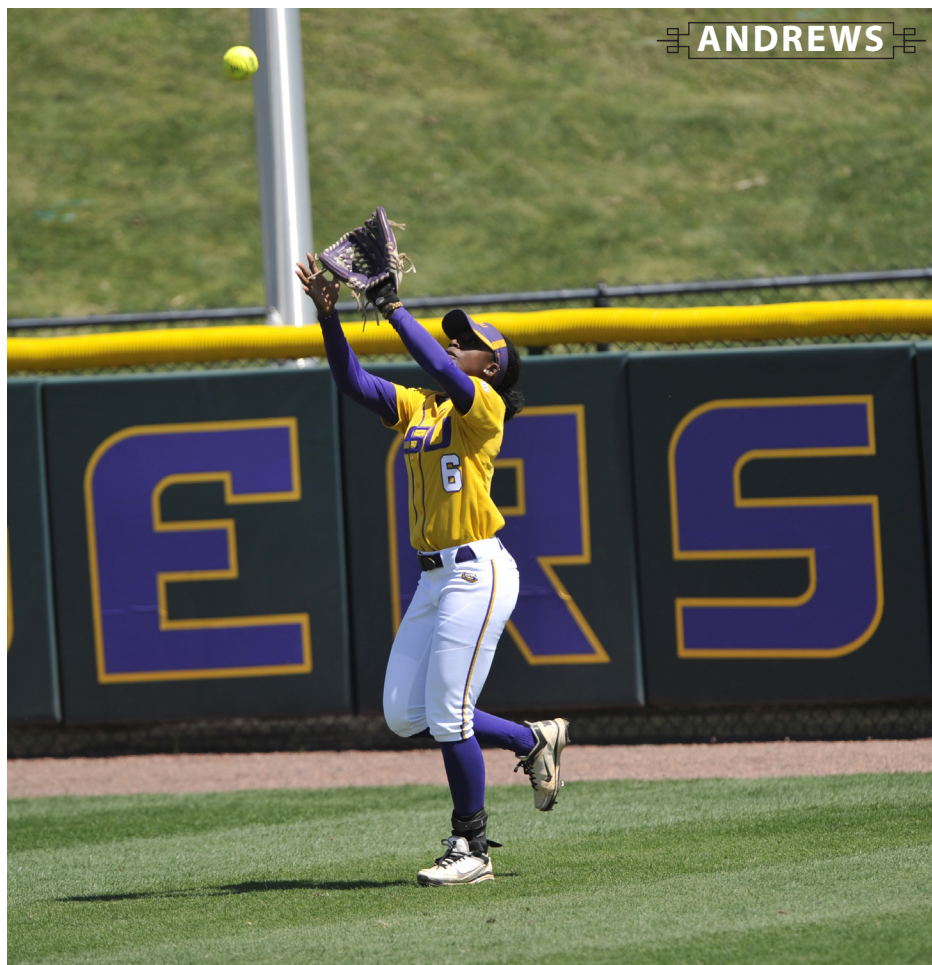

**LSU 3, ARKANSAS 2 - 04/01**

**BATON ROUGE** – Ashley Applegate delivered a clutch two-run single with the bases loaded during the bottom of the 6th inning to propel the LSU softball team to a 3-2 comeback victory over Arkansas to complete a SEC series sweep playing in-front of a season's best 1,426 fans at Tiger Park.

In the process, LSU (27-8, 10-1 SEC) pushed its season-high winning streak to 11 consecutive games. The Tigers also have emerged with victories in 16 of the last 17 meetings with Arkansas (18-16, 2-12 SEC). The 10-1 SEC start for LSU is the best since the 2000 season when the Tigers opened conference play with a 13-1 mark.

"They definitely fought hard for the win and fought hard to come back," head coach Beth Torina said. "I think that's a great thing to have in a team – just the ability to come back and the ability to fight. I think that will definitely help us down the road – way more than hits, errors, runs, all those things. The ability to have that fight and drive, I think that's the key."

Trailing 2-1 with one out in the sixth inning, LSU pieced together a trio of singles from Ashley Langoni, Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon to fill the bases. That set up Applegate, who crushed a 0-1 offering past the glove of Arkansas pitcher Kimmy Beasley. Langoni crossed the plate with the tying run, while Santos scooted home from second base and slid underneath the tag at home for the go-ahead run.

"Honestly, I couldn't have wanted a different hitter up at that moment," Torina said. "I just felt like she was seeing the ball so well today, and I just felt like she was going to get it done for us in that spot."

"It feels great to be able to pull through for my teammates," Applegate said. "I always want to go up there, do my best and to help the team any way that I can. It's great because usually it's the other way around. I'm used to being on the bases and them knocking me in. To be able to pull through for my teammates felt really great."

Rachele Fico worked a routine 1-2-3 seventh inning to secure the 3-2 win for the Tigers. She moved to 13-4 on the season and garnered seven strikeouts versus two walks. Outside of the two solo home runs, the junior right-hander sat down 21 of the 24 batters she faced and didn't allow Arkansas to reach scoring position.

"I think that throwing 14 innings for the weekend against Arkansas with the offense that they possess, for her to only give up six hits, that's a pretty good performance," Torina said. "We would've liked for two of them to not be home runs, of course two mistakes that she made. Ultimately, just six hits in 14 innings against an offense in the SEC – pretty solid pitching performances."

LSU struck first with a run during the first inning. The Tigers capitalized on a fielding error by Razorback third baseman Chloe Oprezdek. Jacee Blades sprinted from first base to third base on a Langoni single through the right side. Santos followed with a RBI single up the middle to give LSU a 1-0 edge.

Arkansas responded with Andrea Sullivan and Clarisa Navarro solo home runs in the second and sixth innings, respectively, to grab a 2-1 advantage.

LSU's offense received multi-hit efforts from Applegate, Langoni and Santos. Beasley was tagged for three runs, two earned, on seven hits to drop to 7-3 for the season.

"Obviously, we were struggling a little bit offensively," Santos said. "But personally, I think that it was a little bit more for [Rachele] Fico. She's had amazing outings for weeks upon weeks. Today she let them score just two runs. She missed two pitches so we just needed to come back and win it for Rachele because she's just been doing so great, just like Brittany Mack and Meghan Patterson."
