SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU continues its challenging April schedule and visits No. 10 Texas A&M. Games time are slated for Friday at 7 p.m., Saturday at 4 p.m. and Sunday at 12:30 p.m. from the Aggie Softball Complex.
- ▶ LSU (33-8, 9-3 SEC) has won 15 of its last 18 games since March 10 which includes a pair of 5-4 comeback victories over Florida State (April 3) and Arkansas (April 7) last week.
- ▶ The Tigers have won their first four SEC series over Kentucky, Mississippi State, South Carolina nad Arkansas.
- ▶ Texas A&M (33-7, 5-6 SEC) has tallied a .317 team batting average fueled by 68 home runs. Mel Dumezich has collected 22 of the team's 33 wins from the pitching circle.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has collected a 33-8 record and a 9-3 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak (Feb. 13-23) in addition to a nine-game winning streak (March 10-23).
- The Tigers enter this weekend's series at Texas A&M winners of 15 of their last 18 games (March 10-April 7) and 19 of their last 24 outings since March 1.
- LSU has picked up six wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23), No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2) and No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; 3-2 • March 17).
- The Tigers have won all four of their SEC series to start the season. The last time LSU accomplished that feat was when the 2007 team won its first nine series en route to the program's last SEC Western Division title.
- LSU's offense has turned in a .292 team batting average compared to a .247 hitting clip through 41 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.1 runs per game compared to a 4.1 runs per game through 41 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 33 home runs through 41 games which has more than doubled the team's total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have six players with three or more longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on 11 occasions most recently an 11-hit effort in game one of the Arkansas series (April 5). LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a trio of slams this season. The first two came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2) followed by one at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- LSU also went 135 games without having a player connect for two home runs during the same game. Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray have accomplished this feat three games apart versus Georgia Southern (March 19) and South Carolina (March 23).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 15 shutouts and recorded 293 strikeouts over 283.1 innings pitched. The 293 Ks enter the Texas A&M series ranked 2nd in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 41 games and has batted leadoff in every game for the Tigers. She has posted a team-leading .364 batting average.
- Andrews has registered a team-high 51 hits, good enough for seventh place on the SEC leaderboard. She also has tallied a team-leading 14 multi-hit efforts which includes a 3-for-3 effort and a career-high three RBIs at Florida State (April 3).
- Andrews has collected a multi-hit performances in four of her last six outings (March 30-April 7). During that run, she has produced a .600 hitting clip (12-for-20) with eight runs scored and six RBIs.

- Andrews has garnered a pair of career-long nine-game hitting streaks (Feb. 21-March 2, March 8-19) during the season. She has registered a hit during 25 of her last 30 games (Feb. 21-April 7) which includes nine of her 12 SEC contests.
- Andrews has scored a team-high 32 runs and tallied multiple runs on 11 occasions which includes a career-high three runs at Arkansas (April 5). LSU is 20-0 on the season when Andrews scores a run.
- Andrews has gone 16-for-16 in the stolen base department. Her 14 steals are tied for seventh in the SEC rankings. Dating back to last season, Andrews has converted on 21 straight steal attempts since game two of the Ole Miss series (April 21, 2012).
- Andrews played a major role as LSU erased a four-run deficit at Arkansas (April 7). She knocked an infield single and scored a run during the team's three-run fifth followed by the game-tying RBI triple with two outs in the sixth inning. Andrews scampered home with the game-winning run after an Arkansas wild pitch.
- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the team's SEC opener at Mississippi State (March 8).
- Jacee Blades has started LSU's last 38 games, mostly between left and right field. She also has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 38 times.
- Blades has compiled a .362 batting average and 46 hits are second on the squad. Her 46 hits also are tied for 12th place among the SEC leaders.
- The 46 hits for Blades has more than doubled her career total entering her junior season. She has garnered 12 multi-hit efforts to rank second on the team, four of those performances have come over LSU's last 11 games (March 22-April 7).
- Blades had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close in game two versus Georgia Southern (March 8-19). She has hit safely in 24 of her last 31 games (Feb. 21-April 7) which includes 10 of 12 SEC outings.
- Blades has collected a quartet of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1) and South Carolina (March 23).
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16). She also added a RBI single to spark the Tigers to erase a four-run deficit in the series finale at Arkansas (April 7).
- Blades is fifth on the squad with 18 runs scored. LSU has won 13 of 15 games this season when she has crossed the plate.
- Bianka Bell has started 38 of 41 games between shortstop (34) and second base (5). She has tallied a .328 batting average to go along with a team-leading nine home runs and 36 RBIs.

- Over her last 14 games (March 17-April 7), Bell has secured a .372 batting average (16-for-43) to go along with six home runs and 21 RBIs. She cranked her first career grand slam at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- Bell has secured consecutive SEC Freshman of the Week selections (April 1 & April 8). The last time a LSU player won back-to-back SEC weekly awards was Rachele Fico during the 2010 campaign.
- Bell has recorded RBIs in her last eight games (March 26-April 7). The last time a LSU player accomplished that feat was Vanessa Soto (Feb. 18-25, 2005). Sara Fitzgerald (Feb. 15-28, 2003) and Stephanie Hill (Feb. 20-28, 2004) hold the program's all-time mark with nine consecutive RBI efforts.
- Bell has collected 11 multi-hit games and 39 total hits, both third on the team. She has hit safely in seven of her last eight games (March 26-April 7) which includes four multi-hit performances.
- Earlier this season, Bell produced a pair of six-game hitting streaks (Feb. 15-22 & March 2-13). Her six-game run during February was sparked by five multi-hit efforts.
- Bell cranked a leadoff double to spark LSU's three-run sixth inning against No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep.
- Bell added her first career two homer game to open the Georgia Southern doubleheader (March 19) and provided the game-winning RBI double during the third inning of game two. She is the first LSU player since Anissa Young versus Fordham on Feb. 26, 2011 to hit a pair of dingers in the same game.

- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 41 games. She has split her starts between second base (32), shortstop (7) and designated player (2).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fourth on the team with a .281 batting average and 34 total hits.
- Falcon's four home runs are tied for third on the team. She has driven home 23 RBIs, already matching her season total from 2012. The 23 RBIs also are tied for second on the squad.
- Falcon has hit safely in three of her last six appearances (March 30-April 7). She is fourth on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and tied for second on the team with six multi-RBI performances.
- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).
- Falcon notched LSWA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Sandra Simmons has started 40 of 41 games at first base and has moved into the No. 5 spot during LSU's last six games (March 30-April 7) after primarily batting in the No. 6 hole.
- Simmons has garnered a .277 batting average, three home runs and 20 RBIs. Her 20 RBIs are fifth on the squad.

- Simmons has hit safely in 15 of her last 20 games (March 8-April 7) and her career-long seven-game run (March 19-27) came to a close during game one of the Samford twinbill.
- Simmons has racked up six multi-RBI performances, tied with Allison Falcon for second on the squad. She collected three RBIs during the series opener at Arkansas (April 5).
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series opening win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over Mississippi State (March 8) during the series finale.
- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). It marked LSU's first grand slam since Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young accomplished the feat at No. 9 Arizona State (May 16, 2009) during the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, a span of 197 games.
- Rikki Alcaraz has started 20 of LSU's last 26 games (Feb. 22-April 7) and emerged as the primary option at designated player spot. She has racked up an impressive .349 batting average, three home runs and 16 RBIs.
- All 22 of Alcaraz's hits have come during a stretch where she has hit safely in 15 of her last 23 outings (Feb. 15-April 7). Her three-hit efforts versus UNLV (Feb. 23) and in game one against Georgia Southern (March 19) are career-highs.
- Alcaraz belted her first career home run, a two-run shot, in a 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She added a RBI single to ignite LSU's three-run sixth inning versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep of the Wildcats.
- Alcaraz has added RBIs in six of her last 12 appearances (March 16-April 7). Her two-run home run put the Tigers on the scoreboard during LSU's 4-0 series opening win over South Carolina (March 22).
- Tammy Wray is one of three players to see action in all 41 games, starting 40 contests at third base. She has notched a .218 batting average to go along with a seven homers and 21 RBIs. The seven dingers second, while the 21 RBIs are fourth on the team.
- Wray has split her time between No. 5 and No. 7 slots in the lineup and notched a season's best six-game hitting streak (Feb. 16-22).
- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21), at Mississippi State (March 10) and South Carolina (March 23). She added a solo longball versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Wray's two-homer performance during the South Carolina game was LSU's first against a SEC opponent since Rachel Mitchell versus Arkansas (April 27, 2008) at the original Tiger Park.
- 12 of Wray's 22 hits have gone for extra bases and produced a RBI. She also has drawn a team-leading 21 walks which includes 12 free passes over her last 15 outings (March 13-April 7).
- Lauren Houston has checked in with 22 starts at catcher. She is batting .245 with one homer and 7 RBIs on the season. Her lone

longball came on a two-run shot at Ole Miss (Feb. 13).

- Houston collected a two-run single to finish off an 8-0 five-inning win versus Georgia Southern (March 19). She has notched a hit in three of her last four starts (March 30-April 7).
- Houston also has scored a run in four of her last seven starts (March 19-April 7) which includes a career-best three runs during LSU's 5-4 win at Florida State (April 3).
- Kellsy Kloss has made the most of her 21 starts on the season with a .250 batting average, four home runs and 17 RBIs. Her four home runs are tied for third on the team.
- Nine of Kloss' 15 hits on the season have tallied RBIs. She knocked a solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBIs sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2). The six RBIs were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a two-out, two-run single to even the score at 2-2 during the first inning of game two versus Georgia Southern.
- Simone Heyward has started 23 of LSU's last 26 games in the outfield (Feb. 24-April 7). She has picked up all 17 of her hits on the season during that stretch en route to a .293 batting average.
- Eight of Heyward's 11 stolen bases have come during SEC play. The eight steals are second-most in league play.
- Heyward played a key role in LSU's 5-4 comeback win at Arkansas (April 7). She battled back from a pair of 0-2 counts to draw walks during the fifth and sixth innings. The California native crossed the plate both times which included the game-tying run on A.J. Andrews RBI triple with two outs.
- Heyward has notched hits in 11 of those 23 starts (Feb. 24-April

7) highlighted by her first career three-hit performance to open the Kentucky series (March 15). She also turned in a 2-for-3 effort versus No. 16 UCLA (Feb. 24) and a 2-for-2 performance with two runs scored at Florida State (April 3).

- Heyward reached base in all four of her plate appearances and scored two runs during LSU's 14-6 win over Michigan (March 2).

OFF THE BENCH

- Alex Boulet has made 18 appearances which includes five starts in the outfield. She has provided a hit during three of her last five outings with a plate appearance (Feb. 22-March 30).

- Dylan Supak has secured 13 appearances and made five of her six starts at the DP position.
- Supak has tallied a hit and scored a run during four of her six starts. Her last start came during the Arkansas finale (April 7).
- For the season, Supak has a .263 batting average and four RBIs. She picked up a two-run single versus No. 10 Oregon (March 1) and a bases loaded walk at Arkansas (April 5).

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff is headed by Rachele Fico, who has compiled a 20-6 record, a 1.80 ERA and 185 strikeouts over 159.1 innings. Her 185 Ks are tops in the SEC, while her 20 wins check in at third place on the SEC leaderboard.
- In SEC action, Fico has turned in a 7-2 mark, 1.17 ERA and amassed 64 strikeouts over her 59.2 frames of action. Her 1.17 ERA headlines the league, while her seven wins and 64 Ks are second.
- Fico was the No. 1 overall pick by the Akron Racers during the 2013 NPF College Draft (April 1). It marked the second straight season that LSU has had the league's No. 1 pick - Brittany Mack (2012).
- Fico has already tossed 10 shutouts - No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8), Tulsa (Feb. 9), North Dakota State (Feb. 15), Virginia (Feb. 16), Ohio State (Feb. 22), No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23), Mississippi State (March 10), Georgia Southern (March 19), South Carolina (March 22) and Samford (March 30).
- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed, Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner.
- Fico currently has totaled 750 Ks and has already passed former All-American Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season.
- Fico enters the Texas A&M series action 28 strikeouts away from tying Turner (2004-07) for third place.
- Fico turned in a memorable performance and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.
- Fico claimed her 69th career victory, a two-hit shutout of Georgia Southern (March 19), to move past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for fourth place on LSU's all-time list.
- Fico rebounded from back-to-back losses to South Carolina (March 24) and at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27) with a two-hit shutout of Samford (March 30). The seven runs allowed by Fico during the South Alabama game was the second-most this season.
- Fico joined former All-American Britni Sneed along with Ashley Lewis as the only three pitchers in program history to notch a trio of 20-win seasons during their careers.
- Meghan Patterson has posted a 5-2 mark with a 1.69 ERA. She tossed a pair of complete game shutouts, a three-hitter versus Purdue (Feb. 8) along with a four-hitter against Nicholls State (Feb. 17).
- In her last start, Patterson came away with seven strikeouts and threw 6.2 frames of four-hit ball against Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Patterson recorded a season's best eight Ks versus Nicholls State (Feb. 17) and Georgia Southern (March 19). She has been LSU's Saturday starter during two of the first three SEC weekends.
- Patterson was the tough-luck loser in a 2-1 decision at Mississippi State (March 9). In her second career SEC start, she was handed a no-decision after she allowed two runs on three hits and totaled five Ks over her 5.2 frames of action.
- Ashley Czechner has won all eight of her decisions and been used both as a starter (9x) and in relief (4x). She has collected wins over Hampton (Feb. 9), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1), Penn State (March 2), Nicholls State (March 13), No. 17 Kentucky (March 17,

COLLEGE STATION, Texas – Rachele Fico fired her second straight two-hit shutout in as many days, and the LSU softball team claimed a 2-0 win over No. 8 national seed Texas A&M during the winner's bracket contest of the NCAA College Station Regional at the Aggie Softball Complex.

LSU (36-22) scored both of its runs in the first inning and received a few spectacular defensive plays from A.J. Andrews and Ashley Langoni from their right and left field posts, respectively. Offensively, Allison Falcon led the way with a 2-for-3 performance and a RBI.

The Tigers will again face the Aggies in the final, as Texas A&M emerged from the loser's bracket. Sunday's regional championship game is slated for 1 p.m. which will be carried live on ESPN3.com with Cara Capuano and Cheri Kempf serving as the announcing team.

"I'm so proud of our players for executing the game plan and following up on their momentum from yesterday's win," head coach Beth Torina said. "We came out attacking, we came out aggressive. I loved the way our offense swung the bats today. A lot of our players had quality at-bats throughout, and I think the credit goes to them for being that aggressive."

A.J. Andrews, Simone Heyward and Juliana Santos set the table for LSU in the first inning. Andrews slapped a single down the left field line, while Heyward and Santos reached on a walk and hit batter to fill the bases.

Allison Falcon followed up with a timely RBI single to left field on a 0-1 pitch to plate Andrews. A throwing error by Texas A&M left fielder Emily Albus allowed Heyward to cross the plate and push the LSU advantage to 2-0.

"We definitely carried over the momentum from the seventh inning against Texas State," Falcon said. "The transition was pretty smooth. Coach Torina told us to stick within our plans, to be confident and not be afraid. We had nothing to lose really."

Fico stranded a trio of Texas A&M runners in scoring position during the first three innings. The Aggies were unable to put a runner past first base the rest of the way as the junior right-hander completed her 13th shutout of the season.

Fico worked around a career-high six walks, but also added six pivotal strikeouts to improve to 18-11 on the season. It marked only the fourth time on the season that A&M (40-17) failed to score.

With a runner on first base and two outs during the fifth inning, Texas A&M's All-America catcher Meagan May lifted a shallow fly ball to left field. Langoni sprinted in and made a fully extended, diving snag to end the frame.

Fico navigated past leadoff walks in the sixth and seventh inning with six fly ball outs highlighted by a running catch by Andrews on the right field warning track during the sixth to wrap up the 2-0 triumph.

"We had a good mix of pitches today," Fico said. "We were working all four quadrants of the strike zone. I walked too many batters, but we were able to work around it. My defense came up big making plays when we needed to. Other than that, we had better break points on the ball today. That is what made us really effective."

Texas A&M's All-America hurler Mel Dumezich was tagged with the loss and dropped to 28-12 for the season. She surrendered two runs on five hits and tallied six strikeouts versus three walks.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Brittany Mack put together a masterful pitching performance and the LSU softball team manufactured two runs in the fourth inning en route to a 2-1 victory over No. 8 national seed Texas A&M to claim the 2012 NCAA College Station Regional championship.

In the process, LSU (37-22) punched its first ticket to the NCAA Super Regional round since the 2007 season. The Tigers will travel to future SEC rival and No. 9 national seed Missouri.

Mack limited the potent A&M offense (41-18) to one run on three hits. In its other two NCAA College Station Regional contests, the Aggies knocked 10 home runs along with an average of nine runs and 10 hits per game.

"We couldn't be more excited about the game today and going to the super regionals," head coach Beth Torina said. "Our team played LSU softball by pitching well, playing solid defense and capitalizing on our timely runs sparked by Kailey McCasland's sacrifice fly. Texas A&M is a great team. We watched them have huge offensive numbers in the other two games. A lot of credit goes to them, and we appreciate them hosting us this weekend. It's a really excited day for our program."

Mack registered seven strikeouts versus three walks and improved to 15-11 for the season. The senior right-hander navigated her way through six scoreless innings before A&M rallied for a run during the seventh inning.

Amber Garza drew a leadoff walk and advanced to second base on pinch hitter Lindsey Sisk's ground out to third baseman Tammy Wray. She scooted over to third base on a wild pitch. Down to its final strike, Natalie Villarreal laced a RBI single through the middle to draw Texas A&M back to within 2-1.

Mack regrouped and got Kelsea Orsak to ground out five pitches later to secure the final out. The chopped two-hopper was fielded by second baseman Allison Falcon, who flipped the ball over to Heidi Pizer to send the Tigers into a regional championship dog pile right in-front of the pitcher's circle.

"I knew it was a huge deal for Brittany to avenge her loss from last season to Texas A&M," Torina said. "I was 100 percent confident and I didn't have a doubt about the type of performance I was going to get from her."

"I kept focusing on this pitch, this batter," Mack said. "I might have thrown more change-ups last year than I did this year. We definitely had a plan to throw more hard stuff to keep them off balance. We got them with a lot of drops and screws today."

Offensively, LSU pounded out six hits sparked by Ashley Applegate's 2-for-3 effort with a run scored. The Tigers scored both of their runs during a drama-filled fourth inning.

With one out, Falcon reached on a fielding error by Garza at third base. In between an ejection of assistant coach Howard Dobson, Applegate ripped a single up the middle followed by a Tammy Wray walk to load the bases.

Torina turned to her bench and pinch hitter Kailey McCasland provided the game's first run with sacrifice fly into the left centerfield gap to allow Falcon to sprint home.

"I have confidence in Kailey McCasland," Falcon said. "I knew she would step up and do her job. All I was looking for was anything deep enough that I could tag on. I know I am not the fastest, but I can score on anything that is deep enough. Kailey came through huge for us."

Dylan Supak legged out an infield single on deep ground ball in the 5-6 hole. A throwing error by A&M shortstop Brittany Walker enabled Applegate to cross the plate and push the LSU advantage to 2-0.

"Our kids scratched and clawed for these three regional wins," Torina said. "That's what we've done all season long. We know teams are going to have a hard time scoring runs against us with our pitching staff. We're going to find a way to score runs however we can."

Texas A&M's All-America pitcher Mel Dumezich was dealt the setback and completed her junior campaign with a 28-13 record. She was touched up for a pair of unearned runs on six hits and notched five Ks against a pair of free passes.
