SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 11 LSU continues its challenging April slate and returns home to meet another ranked SEC opponent as No. 12 Missouri visits Tiger Park for a three-game weekend series.
- ▶ The Tigers have won all five of their SEC series and enter this weekend's action in sole possession of first place in the SEC Western Division standings.
- ▶ LSU (36-9, 11-4 SEC) and Missouri (24-6, 9-5 SEC) will meet as conference rivals for the first time.
- ▶ Last time out, LSU won a 7-1 decision over McNeese State as A.J. Andrews, Jacee Blades and Bianka Bell combined to go 6-for-10 with six RBIs. Mizzou dropped two of three games versus Arkansas.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has collected a 36-9 record and a 11-4 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak (Feb. 13-23) in addition to a nine-game winning streak (March 10-23).
- The Tigers enter this weekend's action versus Missouri winners of eight of their last 10 outings (March 30-April 17) and 18 of their last 22 games (March 10-April 17).
- LSU has picked up eight wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23) and No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2).
- In SEC action, the Tigers swept No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; 3-2 • March 17) and won two games at No. 10 Texas A&M (9-6 • April 13; 10-2 • April 14).
- The Tigers have won all five of their SEC series to start the season. The last time LSU accomplished that feat was when the 2007 team won its first nine series en route to the program's seventh SEC Western Division title.
- LSU's offense has turned in a .294 team batting average compared to a .246 hitting clip through 45 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.3 runs per game compared to a 4.0 runs per game through 45 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 36 home runs through 45 games which has more than doubled the team's total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have six players with three or more longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on 12 occasions most recently an 13-hit effort at McNeese State (April 17).
- LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a trio of slams this season. The first two came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2) followed by one at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- LSU also went 135 games between having a player connect for two home runs during the same game. Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray accomplished this feat three games apart versus Georgia Southern (March 19) and South Carolina (March 23).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 15 shutouts and recorded 314 strikeouts over 309.1 innings pitched. The 314 Ks enter the Missouri series ranked 2nd in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 45 games and has batted leadoff in every game for the Tigers. She has posted a .363 batting average, second on the squad.
- Andrews has registered a team-high 57 hits, good enough for ninth place on the SEC leaderboard. She also has tallied a team-leading 15 multi-hit efforts which includes a 3-for-3 effort and a career-high three RBIs at Florida State (April 3).

- Andrews has collected hits in nine of her last 10 outings (March 30-April 17). During that run, she has produced a .486 hitting clip (18-for-37) with 13 runs scored and 11 RBIs.
- Andrews has garnered a pair of career-long nine-game hitting streaks (Feb. 21-March 2, March 8-19) during the season. She has registered a hit during 29 of her last 34 games (Feb. 21-April 17) which includes 12 of her 15 SEC contests.
- Andrews has scored a team-high 37 runs and tallied multiple runs on 12 occasions which includes a career-high three runs at Arkansas (April 5) and at McNeese State (April 17). LSU is 23-0 on the season when Andrews scores a run.
- Andrews has gone 19-for-20 in the stolen base department. Her 19 steals are tied for sixth in the SEC rankings. She had a streak of 22 straight steal attempts broken at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 14).
- With the score tied at 6-6, Andrews provided the go-ahead RBI single on a bunt down the first base line during LSU's three-run eighth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Andrews played a major role as LSU erased a four-run deficit at Arkansas (April 7). She knocked an infield single and scored a run during the team's three-run fifth followed by the game-tying RBI triple with two outs in the sixth inning. Andrews scampered home with the game-winning run after an Arkansas wild pitch.
- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the team's SEC opener at Mississippi State (March 8).
- Jacee Blades has started LSU's last 42 games, mostly between left and right field. She also has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 42 times.
- Blades has compiled a team-leading .367 batting average, while her 51 hits are second on the squad. Her 51 hits also are tied for 13th place among the SEC leaders.
- The 51 hits for Blades has more than doubled her career total entering her junior season. She has garnered 14 multi-hit efforts to rank second on the team, six of those performances have come over LSU's last 15 games (March 22-April 17).
- Blades heads into the Missouri series four hits shy from becoming the 32nd player in program history to collect 100 career hits.
- Blades had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close in game two versus Georgia Southern (March 8-19). She has hit safely in 27 of her last 35 games (Feb. 21-April 17) which includes 12 of 15 SEC outings.
- Blades has collected a quartet of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1) and South Carolina (March 23).

- Blades tacked on a RBI single as part of LSU's three-run eighth inning during a 9-6 win at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16). She also added a RBI single to spark the Tigers to erase a four-run deficit in the series finale at Arkansas (April 7).
- Bianka Bell has started 42 of 45 games between shortstop (38) and second base (5). She has tallied a .331 batting average to go along with a team-leading 11 home runs and 42 RBIs. The 11 homers and 42 RBIs are both tied for 10th in the SEC rankings.
- Over her last 18 games (March 17-April 17), Bell has secured a .368 batting average (21-for-57) to go along with eight home runs and 27 RBIs. She cranked her first career grand slam at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- Bell secured two SEC Freshman of the Week selections (April 1 & April 8). The last time a LSU player won back-to-back SEC weekly awards was Rachele Fico during the 2010 campaign.
- Bell has recorded RBIs in her last 12 games (March 26-April 17), a program record. The previous mark was held by Sara Fitzgerald (Feb. 15-28, 2003) and Stephanie Hill (Feb. 20-28, 2004) with nine consecutive RBI efforts.
- Bell has collected 12 multi-hit games and 44 total hits, both third on the team. She has hit safely in 10 of her last 12 games (March 26-April 17) which includes five multi-hit performances.
- Earlier this season, Bell produced a pair of six-game hitting streaks (Feb. 15-22 & March 2-13). Her six-game run during February was sparked by five multi-hit efforts.
- Bell tallied a career-best three hits highlighted by her 10th dinger to open the Texas A&M series (April 12). She also ripped a two-out, RBI single during LSU's four-run comeback win to wrap up the Arkansas series (April 7).

- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 45 games. She has split her starts between second base (35), shortstop (7) and designated player (3).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fourth on the team with a .280 batting average and 35 total hits.
- Falcon's five home runs are third on the team. She has driven home 25 RBIs, already passing her season total from 2012. The 25 RBIs also are tied for third on the squad.
- Falcon has hit safely in six of her last 10 outings (March 30-April 17). She is fourth on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and tied for second on the team with seven multi-RBI performances.

- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).
- Falcon notched LSUA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Falcon ripped a two-run homer during the first inning of the Texas A&M finale (April 14). For Falcon, it was her first dinger since the Mississippi State game (March 10).
- Sandra Simmons has started 44 of 45 games at first base and has moved into the No. 5 spot during LSU's last 10 games (March 30-April 17) after primarily batting in the No. 6 hole.
- Simmons has garnered a .274 batting average, three home runs and 25 RBIs. Her 25 RBIs are tied for third on the squad.
- Simmons has hit safely in 17 of her last 24 games (March 8-April 17) and her career-long seven-game run (March 19-27) came to a close during game one of the Samford twinbill.
- Simmons has racked up seven multi-RBI performances, tied with Allison Falcon for second on the squad. She collected three RBIs at Arkansas (April 5) and drove home a team-leading four RBIs during the Texas A&M series (April 12-14).
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series opening win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over Mississippi State (March 8) during the series finale.
- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). It marked LSU's first grand slam since Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young accomplished the feat at No. 9 Arizona State (May 16, 2009) during the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, a span of 197 games.
- Rikki Alcaraz has started 23 of LSU's last 30 games (Feb. 22-April 17) and emerged as the primary option at designated player spot. She has racked up an impressive .347 batting average, three home runs and 17 RBIs.
- All 25 of Alcaraz's hits have come during a stretch where she has hit safely in 18 of her last 26 outings (Feb. 15-April 17). Her three-hit efforts versus UNLV (Feb. 23) and in game one against Georgia Southern (March 19) are career-highs.
- Alcaraz belted her first career home run, a two-run shot, in a 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She added a RBI single to ignite LSU's three-run sixth inning versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep of the Wildcats.
- Alcaraz has added RBIs in seven of her last 15 appearances (March 16-April 17). Her two-run home run put the Tigers on the scoreboard during LSU's 4-0 series opening win over South Carolina (March 22).
- Tammy Wray is one of three players to see action in all 45 games, starting 44 contests at third base. She has notched a .216 batting average to go along with a seven homers and 23 RBIs. The seven dingers are second, while the 23 RBIs are fifth on the team.

- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21), at Mississippi State (March 10) and South Carolina (March 23). She added a solo longball versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Wray's two-homer performance during the South Carolina game was LSU's first against a SEC opponent since Rachel Mitchell versus Arkansas (April 27, 2008) at the original Tiger Park.
- 13 of Wray's 24 hits have produced a RBI which includes a RBI single as part of LSU's seven-run fourth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 14).
- Wray has drawn a team-leading 25 walks which includes 16 free passes over her last 19 outings (March 13-April 17). Her 25 walks are tied for 14th place among the SEC leaders.
- Lauren Houston has checked in with 23 starts at catcher. She is batting .236 with one homer and 8 RBIs on the season. Her lone longball came on a two-run shot at Ole Miss (Feb. 13).
- Houston collected a two-run single to finish off an 8-0 five-inning win versus Georgia Southern (March 19). She has notched a hit in three of her last six starts (March 30-April 14).
- Houston also has scored a run in five of her last nine starts (March 19-April 14) which includes a career-best three runs during LSU's 5-4 win at Florida State (April 3).
- Kelsi Kloss has made 24 starts between catcher (21) and designated player (3). She has a .254 batting average, four home runs and 18 RBIs. Her four home runs are fourth on the team.
- 10 of Kloss' 18 hits on the season have tallied RBIs. She knocked a

- solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBIs sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2). The six RBIs were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a RBI single with two outs in the third inning that gave LSU a 3-2 lead during the middle game of the Texas A&M series (April 13).
- Kloss is coming off a 2-for-4 performance, her second career multi-hit effort, at McNeese State (April 17). She has found her way to the No. 6 position in LSU's last three games (April 13-17).
- Simone Heyward has started 27 of LSU's last 30 games in the outfield (Feb. 24-April 17). She has picked up all 22 of her hits on the season during that stretch en route to a .310 batting average.
- Nine of Heyward's 12 stolen bases have come during SEC play. The nine steals are second-most in league play.

- Fico was the No. 1 overall pick by the Akron Racers during the 2013 NPF College Draft (April 1). It marked the second straight season that LSU has had the league's No. 1 pick - Brittany Mack (2012).
- Fico has already tossed 10 shutouts - No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8), Tulsa (Feb. 9), North Dakota State (Feb. 15), Virginia (Feb. 16), Ohio State (Feb. 22), No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23), Mississippi State (March 10), Georgia Southern (March 19), South Carolina (March 22) and Samford (March 30).
- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed, Kristin Schmidt and Emily Turner.
- Fico currently has totaled 763 Ks and has already passed former All-American Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season.
- Fico enters the Texas A&M series action 15 strikeouts away from tying Turner (2004-07) for third place.

COLUMBIA, Mo. – Allison Falcon delivered a 2-for-3 performance and matched a career-high three RBIs as the LSU softball team knocked off No. 9 national seed Missouri by a 6-1 margin Saturday during the opening game of the NCAA Columbia Super Regional in front of 2,253 fans at University Field.

LSU (38-22) won its fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament game and moved within one victory of making the program's third appearance at the Women's College World Series. It also marked LSU's first NCAA Super Regional victory since the 2006 season.

LSU's offense racked up six runs and nine hits, the most runs for the Tigers since a 6-1 victory over Nicholls State back on April 4.

A.J. Andrews also matched a career-high with two hits from the leadoff spot, while Morgan Russell matched a season-high with two RBIs.

Rachele Fico went the distance for LSU in the circle and improved to 19-11 on the season. The junior right-hander sprayed eight hits and surrendered only one run to the high-octane Missouri offense. She recorded five strikeouts versus two walks to garner her third postseason win for the season.

"I feel like our team was very prepared tonight," head coach Beth Torina said. "We worked really hard this week, a lot of things with our offense. I feel really good about the preparation we did, and I feel really good about the offense. It showed up today. I liked how aggressive our team was. I like our defensive performance and our performance on the mound. I was really happy with how we played today."

LSU grabbed a 2-0 advantage during the third inning. Dylan Supak coaxed a leadoff walk, and pinch runner Jacee Blades advanced to second base on Andrews single up-the-middle. Two batters later, Ashley Langoni drew another free pass to fill the bases. Falcon ripped a timely two-run, two-out single to put LSU on the scoreboard.

Missouri (46-13) cut the LSU advantage down to 2-1 in the fourth inning. Nicole Hudson smacked a leadoff double into the left center-field gap. She crossed the plate on Kayla Kingsley two-out, RBI infield single in front of Fico in the pitcher's circle.

LSU responded with three runs during the fifth inning to bust the contest open. Simone Heyward along with Langoni and Juliana Santos set the table with a walk and two singles, respectively, to load the bases.

Falcon and Russell were hit-by-pitch sandwiched between an Ashley Applegate walk to push the LSU advantage to 5-1 and chase Missouri's All-American hurler Chelsea Thomas from the game.

Thomas dropped to 26-8 for the season and was touched up for five runs on five hits. She issued a season's best six walks to go along with seven Ks.

"Thomas is a talented pitcher," Falcon said. "I think what really helped us was we stayed within our plan, really executed well and kind of threw her off a little bit."

Missouri put the first two batters on-base in the sixth inning, but LSU escaped the jam as third baseman Tammy Wray turned a 5-3 double play to keep the score at 5-1.

LSU added an insurance run during the seventh inning. Pinch hitter Cassie Troclair cranked a leadoff triple and scored on Russell's RBI double off the left field wall to make it 6-1.

Fico worked around a bases loaded situation in the seventh inning and received a fielder's choice play from her middle infield to secure the 6-1 victory.

"We kept a good mix of things," Fico said. "I still expect more from myself. I would have liked to be a little bit sharper, but the great thing about this sport is I have a team behind me. They played great defense, and they got it done for me."

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Brittany Mack racked up a career-best 17 strikeouts, but LSU's defense committed four errors which led Missouri to a 5-1 win in 12 innings and forced a rubber third game of the 2012 NCAA Columbia Super Regional.

With the score knotted at 1-1 during the 12th inning, Missouri took advantage of a passed ball off a Mack strikeout to start the inning. An Ashley Fleming single coupled with an international walk to Nicole Hudson loaded the bases.

Mack induced a ground ball off of Kelsea Roth's bat, but third baseman Tammy Wray committed a throwing error which allowed all three base runners to cross the plate. Missouri tacked on another run as Kayla Kingsley added a RBI on a fielder's choice for the final margin of 5-1.

Mack's 17 Ks was tied for third-most in a single game in program history, but she dropped to 15-12 with the hard-luck loss.

Missouri rode Chelsea Thomas' right-arm to eight strikeouts over her 11 innings of work. She picked up her 27th victory of the season.

"I thought Brittany would be really difficult for them to hit, and I knew it was going to be hard to prepare for both pitchers," Torina said. "I really thought Brittany was going to be successful today. She sure kept us in it long enough, but Chelsea was just so strong in that first game. She was really tough to deal with. I do not think it was Brittany as much as it was Chelsea against our offense."

The two teams traded unearned runs during the third inning. Missouri picked up a RBI on a fielder's choice as Ashtin Stephens executed a textbook slide around catcher Lauren Houston's tag attempt at the plate. Stephens got aboard on a leadoff walk and used alert baserunning to advance to third base on Mackenzie Sykes sacrifice bunt.

LSU countered with a Dylan Supak leadoff walk. Pinch runner Jacee Blades scooted over to second base on A.J. Andrews' sacrifice bunt. A passed ball enabled Blades to move to third base. She scored the equalizer on Ashley Langoni's sacrifice fly.

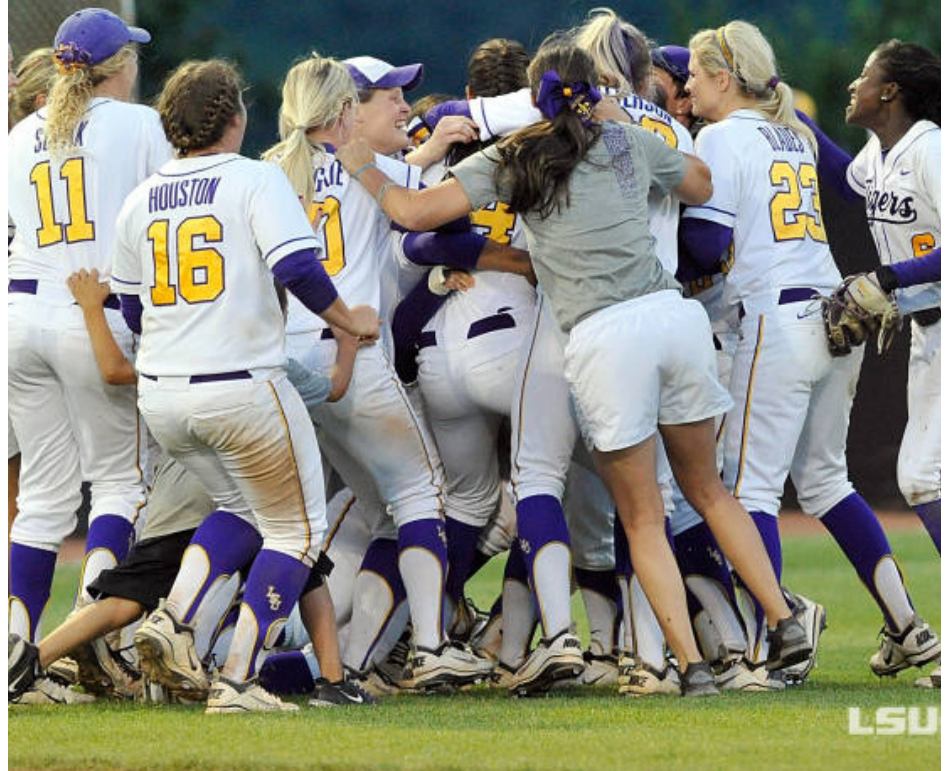

COLUMBIA, Mo. — Simone Heyward picked the most opportune time to notch her first extra-base hit of the season and cranked a three-run, third-inning double to vault the LSU softball team to a 3-1 victory over No. 9 national seed Missouri Sunday at University Field to punch the program's third ticket to the Women's College World Series.

"First, we have to congratulate Missouri on the season they had, and what a tough battle that was today," head coach Beth Torina said. "They fought so hard, a big congrats to them on the season that they had. I am so proud of our team. I thought it was a total team effort today. We had some timely hits, with Simone, we had some great pitching and some phenomenal defensive plays today. We are just really excited to be included in this final eight."

"These kids just have such a way of shaking things off and moving on," Torina continued. "That is really them. They are just really special. I think it just has to do with the eight seniors, their leadership and just being experienced in this game. They understand that you are just one pitch away from greatness."

In the top half of the third inning, Heyward turned a critical double play to keep LSU's deficit at 1-0. With the bases loaded and one out, Heyward made a running catch going towards left centerfield. She fired a one-hop bullet to catcher Morgan Russell to gun down Missouri's Corrin Genovese at the plate.

LSU turned that play into instant momentum in the home half of the frame. Tammy Wray sparked the three-run rally with a leadoff walk, while Russell followed by getting hit-by-pitch. Dylan Supak executed a sacrifice bunt to advance pinch runner Jacee Blades and Russell into scoring position. A.J. Andrews battled her way to seven-pitch free pass to fill the bases.

On a 2-1 offering, Heyward cleared the bases with a double into the left centerfield gap. She was called out on a bang-bang play attempting to get to third base. It not only was Heyward's first extra-base hit of the season but it doubled her season RBI total.

"I don't know where the ball was, somewhere outside," Heyward said. "I think I closed my eyes when I swung, I think I did, I am not going to lie. When I opened my eyes, I saw the ball going to the fence, and I just ran."

That would be more than enough run support for Rachele Fico, who won her fourth straight NCAA postseason decision. The junior right-hander surrendered one run on two hits and recorded four strikeouts versus zero walks en route to her 20th victory of the season.

Missouri's Chelsea Thomas was dealt the loss and concluded her junior campaign at 27-9. All three runs she allowed were earned. She issued three walks in her three innings of work.

"We were just trying to keep them off-balanced," Fico said. "We were trying to limit free passes. I think we definitely got stronger as the game went on. We had a little bit of a rough start, and they were definitely barreling up on the ball. They were putting some solid balls into play. As the game went on, we definitely got stronger and gained momentum."

Missouri (47-14) made the most of a pair of infield singles from Kayla Kingsley and Genovese to open the third inning. They moved up to scoring position on Ashtin Stephens sacrifice bunt, and Mackenzie Sykes platted Kingsley on a RBI bunt of her own down the first base line for the contest's first run.

Missouri continued to charge as Jenna Marston was hit-by-pitch to load the bases. However, the threat ended with Fleming's double play ball.

Fico retired 12 of the final 14 Missouri hitters she faced with the exception of a hit batter during the sixth inning and a two-base error in the seventh inning. Ashley Langoni made up for that error by catching a Genovese fly ball on the very next play for the game's final out.

"I think I just settled down," Fico said. "Coach Torina does an awesome job with me. She knows how I work, and how I operate. She always knows the right things to say. Whenever I run into trouble, it is because I get too uptight, and I am trying to do too much. She calmed me down, told me to trust my pitches, make them spin and make them move."
