## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 11 LSU continues its challenging April slate and squares off with its third straight SEC ranked opponent as No. 4 Alabama visits Tiger Park for a three-game weekend series.
- ▶ The Tigers have won five of their six SEC series and enter this weekend's action tied for first place with Alabama in the SEC Western Division standings.
- ▶ Last time out, LSU dropped two of three games to No. 12 Missouri in a rematch of the 2012 NCAA Columbia Super Regional. LSU won the middle game by an 8-0 margin before dropping a 3-2 decision in the series finale. Alabama took the final two games of its series versus Mississippi State.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has collected a 37-11 record and a 12-6 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak (Feb. 13-23) in addition to a nine-game winning streak (March 10-23).
- The Tigers enter this weekend's action versus Alabama winners of nine of their last 13 outings (March 30-April 21) and 19 of their last 25 games (March 10-April 21).
- LSU has picked up nine wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23) and No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2).
- In SEC action, the Tigers swept No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; 3-2 • March 17) followed by two wins at No. 10 Texas A&M (9-6 • April 13; 10-2 • April 14). LSU also became the first team to shutout No. 12 Missouri (8-0 • April 20).
- The Tigers have won all five of their six SEC series to start the season. The 2007 team won its first nine series en route to the program's seventh SEC Western Division title.
- LSU's offense has turned in a .289 team batting average compared to a .240 hitting clip through 48 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.2 runs per game compared to a 3.8 runs per game through 48 games last season.

- LSU has already cranked 36 home runs through 48 games which has more than doubled the team's total from the entire 2012 season. The Tigers have six players with three or more longballs.
- The Tigers have come away with double digit hits on 12 occasions most recently an 13-hit effort at McNeese State (April 17).
- LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan. The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a trio of slams this season. The first two came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2) followed by one at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- LSU also went 135 games between having a player connect for two home runs during the same game. Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray accomplished this feat three games apart versus Georgia Southern (March 19) and South Carolina (March 23).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 16 shutouts and recorded 325 strikeouts over 328.1 innings pitched. The 325 Ks enter the Alabama series ranked 5th in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 48 games and has batted leadoff in every game for the Tigers. She has posted a .347 batting average, second on the squad.
- Andrews has registered a team-high 58 hits, good enough for ninth place on the SEC leaderboard. She also has tallied a team-leading 15 multi-hit efforts which includes a 3-for-3 effort and a career-high three RBIs at Florida State (April 3).
- Andrews has collected hits in 10 of her last 13 outings (March 30-April 21). During that run, she has produced a .404 hitting clip (19-for-47) with 14 runs scored and 11 RBIs.
- Andrews has garnered a pair of career-long nine-game hitting streaks (Feb. 21-March 2, March 8-19) during the season. She has registered a hit during 30 of her last 37 games (Feb. 21-April 21) which includes 13 of her 18 SEC contests.
- Andrews has scored a team-high 38 runs and tallied multiple runs on 12 occasions which includes a career-high three runs at Arkansas (April 5) and at McNeese State (April 17). LSU is 23-1 on the season when Andrews scores a run.
- Andrews has gone 19-for-20 in the stolen base department. Her 19 steals are tied for seventh in the SEC rankings. She had a streak of 22 straight steal attempts come to a close at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 14).
- With the score tied at 6-6, Andrews provided the go-ahead RBI single on a bunt down the first base line during LSU's three-run eighth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Andrews played a major role as LSU erased a four-run deficit at Arkansas (April 7). She knocked an infield single and scored a run during the team's three-run fifth followed by the game-tying RBI triple with two outs in the sixth inning. Andrews scampered home with the game-winning run after an Arkansas wild pitch.
- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the team's SEC opener at Mississippi State (March 8).
- Jacee Blades has started in 44 of LSU's last 45 games, mostly between left and right field. The only game she missed was the Missouri finale (April 21) due to a foot injury. She also has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 44 times.
- Blades has compiled a team-leading .368 batting average, while her 53 hits are second on the squad. Her 53 hits also are tied for 14th place among the SEC leaders.
- The 53 hits for Blades has more than doubled her career total entering her junior season. She has garnered 14 multi-hit efforts to rank second on the team, six of those performances have come over her last 17 appearances (March 22-April 20).

- Blades heads into the Alabama series two hits shy from becoming the 32nd player in program history to collect 100 career hits.
- Blades had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close in game two versus Georgia Southern (March 8-19). She has hit safely in 29 of her last 37 games (Feb. 21-April 20) which includes 14 of 17 SEC outings.
- Blades has collected a quartet of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1) and South Carolina (March 23).
- Blades tacked on a RBI single as part of LSU's three-run eighth inning during a 9-6 win at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16). She also added a RBI single to spark the Tigers to erase a four-run deficit in the series finale at Arkansas (April 7).
- Bianka Bell has started 46 of 48 games between shortstop (41) and second base (5). She has tallied a .338 hitting clip to go along with a team-leading 11 home runs and 43 RBIs. The 11 homers and 43 RBIs are tied for 14 and tied for 11th in the SEC rankings.
- Over her last 21 games (March 17-April 21), Bell has secured a .379 batting average (25-for-66) to go along with eight home runs and 28 RBIs. She cranked her first career grand slam at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- Bell secured two SEC Freshman of the Week selections (April 1 & April 8). The last time a LSU player won back-to-back SEC weekly awards was Rachele Fico during the 2010 campaign.
- Bell has recorded RBIs in her last 13 of her last 15 games (March 26-April 21) highlighted by a program record run of 12 straight games (March 26-April 17). The previous mark was held by Sara Fitzgerald (Feb. 15-28, 2003) and Stephanie Hill (Feb. 20-28, 2004) with nine consecutive RBI efforts.
- Bell has collected 13 multi-hit games and 48 total hits, both third on the team. She has hit safely in 13 of her last 15 games (March 26-April 21) which includes six multi-hit performances.
- Earlier this season, Bell produced a pair of six-game hitting streaks (Feb. 15-22 & March 2-13). Her six-game run during February was sparked by five multi-hit efforts.
- Bell tallied a career-best three hits highlighted by her 10th dinger to open the Texas A&M series (April 12). She also ripped a two-out, RBI single during LSU's four-run comeback win to wrap up the Arkansas series (April 7).
- Bell added her first career two homer game to open the Georgia Southern doubleheader (March 19) and provided the game-winning RBI double during the third inning of game two. She is the first LSU player since Anissa Young versus Fordham on Feb. 26, 2011 to hit a pair of dingers in the same game.
- Bell cranked a leadoff double to spark LSU's three-run sixth inning against No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which lead to a series sweep.
- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 48 games. She has split her starts between second base (38), shortstop (7)

- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fourth on the team with a .277 batting average and 39 total hits.
- Falcon's five home runs are third on the team. She has driven home 26 RBIs, already passing her season total from 2012. The 26 RBIs also are tied for third on the squad.
- Falcon has hit safely in eight of her last 13 outings (March 30-April 21). She is fourth on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and tied for second on the team with seven multi-RBI performances.
- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).
- Falcon notched LSWA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Falcon ripped a two-run homer during the first inning of the Texas A&M finale (April 14). For Falcon, it was her first dinger since the Mississippi State game (March 10).
- Falcon smacked a RBI single with two outs during the first inning of the Missouri finale (April 21).
- Sandra Simmons has started 47 of 48 games at first base and has moved into the No. 5 spot during 12 of LSU's last 13 games (March 30-April 21) after primarily batting in the No. 6 hole.
- Simmons has garnered a .269 batting average, three home runs and 26 RBIs. Her 26 RBIs are tied for third, while her 12 RBIs in SEC play are second on the squad.
- Simmons has hit safely in 18 of her last 27 games (March 8-April 21) and her career-long seven-game run (March 19-27) came to a close during game one of the Samford twinbill.

- Simmons has racked up seven multi-RBI performances, tied with Allison Falcon for second on the squad. She collected three RBIs at Arkansas (April 5) and drove home a team-leading four RBIs during the Texas A&M series (April 12-14).
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series opening win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over Mississippi State (March 8) during the series finale.
- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). It marked LSU's first grand slam since Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young accomplished the feat at No. 9 Arizona State (May 16, 2009) during the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, a span of 197 games.
- Rikki Alcaraz has started 25 of LSU's last 33 games (Feb. 22-April 21) and emerged as the primary option at designated player spot. She has racked up an impressive .351 batting average, three home runs and 18 RBIs.
- All 27 of Alcaraz's hits have come during a stretch where she has hit safely in 19 of her last 28 outings (Feb. 15-April 20). Her three-hit efforts versus UNLV (Feb. 23) and in game one against Georgia Southern (March 19) are career-highs.
- Alcaraz belted her first career home run, a two-run shot, in a 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She added a RBI single to ignite LSU's three-run sixth inning versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep of the Wildcats.
- Alcaraz has added RBIs in eight of her last 17 appearances (March 16-April 20). She put together a 2-for-3 performance and capped LSU's 8-0 victory over Missouri (April 20) with a RBI single.
- Tammy Wray is one of three players to see action in all 48 games, starting 47 contests at third base. She has notched a .202 batting

average to go along with a seven homers and 23 RBIs. The seven dingers are second, while the 23 RBIs are fifth on the team.

- Wray has batted in the No. 7 position during LSU's last 26 games (March 9-April 21) and notched a season's best six-game hitting streak (Feb. 16-22) while spending time in the No. 5 slot.
- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21), at Mississippi State (March 10) and South Carolina (March 23). She added a solo longball versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Wray's two-homer performance during the South Carolina game was LSU's first against a SEC opponent since Rachel Mitchell versus Arkansas (April 27, 2008) at the original Tiger Park.
- 13 of Wray's 24 hits have produced a RBI which includes a RBI single as part of LSU's seven-run fourth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 14).
- Wray has drawn a team-leading 25 walks which includes 16 free passes over her last 22 outings (March 13-April 21).
- Lauren Houston has checked in with 25 starts at catcher. She is batting .228 with one homer and 8 RBIs on the season. Her lone longball came on a two-run shot at Ole Miss (Feb. 13).
- Houston collected a two-run single to finish off an 8-0 five-inning win versus Georgia Southern (March 19). She has notched a hit in three of her last six starts (March 30-April 14).
- Houston also has scored a run in five of her last 10 starts (March 19-April 19) which includes a career-best three runs during LSU's 5-4 comeback win at Florida State (April 3).
- Kelsi Kloss has made 26 starts between catcher (23) and designated player (3). She has a .263 batting average, four home runs and 20 RBIs. Her four home runs are fourth on the team.
- 11 of Kloss' 20 hits on the season have tallied RBIs. She knocked a solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBIs sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2). The six RBIs were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a RBI single with two outs in the third inning that gave LSU a 3-2 lead during the middle game of the Texas A&M series (April 13).
- Kloss came away with a 2-for-2 effort and added a two-run single during LSU's 8-0 victory over No. 12 Missouri (April 20). She has found her way to the No. 6 position in five of LSU's last six games (April 13-21).
- Simone Heyward has started 30 of LSU's last 33 games in the outfield (Feb. 24-April 21). She has picked up all 23 of her hits on the season during that stretch en route to a .299 batting average.
- 11 of Heyward's 14 stolen bases have come during SEC play. The 11 steals are second-most in league play.
- Heyward has notched hits in 15 of those 30 starts (Feb. 24-April 21) highlighted by her first career three-hit performance to open the Kentucky series (March 15). She also turned a 2-for-2 performance with two runs scored at Florida State (April 3).
- Heyward played a key role in LSU's 5-4 comeback win at Arkansas (April 7). She battled back from a pair of 0-2 counts to draw walks during the fifth and sixth innings. The California native crossed the plate both times which included the game-tying run on A.J. Andrews RBI triple with two outs.
- Heyward has secured hits in four of her last seven outings (April 12-21) and went 2-for-4 with two runs scored in the middle game at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13). She added her first RBI of the season on a bases loaded walk during the A&M finale (April 14).

- Bianka Bell started the rally with a leadoff single to open the fourth inning. Two batters later, she crossed the plate with the equalizer on a Sandra Simmons RBI double.
- After Tammy Wray walked and Kelsi Kloss added an infield single to load the bases, Katie Guillory lifted a bloop RBI single to right centerfield to push the Tigers ahead by a 3-2 margin. LSU tacked on another run on Lauren Houston bases loaded walk to give the Tigers a two-run cushion.
- Bell added her first career home run, and the Tigers scored two more runs via wild pitches for the 7-2 victory.

- Boulet has crossed the plate in 10 of her last 16 pinch running efforts (Feb. 15-April 20). She represented the game's tying run and scored on A.J. Andrews' squeeze bunt in the ninth inning of the middle game versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Boulet crossed the plate with the game-winning run on another Andrews RBI bunt single during the eighth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Over her career, Boulet has scored 33 times as a pinch runners and has collected 37 stolen bases.
- Alayna Falcon has made five pinch hitting appearances on the season. She has provided hits in her last two efforts versus South-eastern Louisiana (March 26) and Samford (March 30).
- Katie Guillory has collected 16 appearances and started in 10 games at right field. She has totaled a .226 batting average, one home run and 4 RBIs.
- Guillory has already doubled her career hit total and connected for her first career longball versus North Dakota State (Feb. 15).

**CIRCLE NOTES**

- LSU's pitching staff is headed by Rachele Fico, who has compiled a 22-9 record, a 1.99 ERA and 206 strikeouts over 186.1 innings. Her 206 Ks are tops in the SEC, while her 22 wins check in at third place on the SEC leaderboard.
- In SEC action, Fico has turned in a 9-5 mark, 1.78 ERA and amassed 85 strikeouts over her 86.2 frames of action. All three of those feats are either second or tied for second in the SEC rankings.
- Fico was the No. 1 overall pick by the Akron Racers during the 2013 NPF College Draft (April 1). It marked the second straight season that LSU has had the league's No. 1 pick - Brittany Mack (2012).
- Fico has already tossed 10 shutouts - No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8), Tulsa (Feb. 9), North Dakota State (Feb. 15), Virginia (Feb. 16), Ohio State (Feb. 22), No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23), Mississippi State (March 10), Georgia Southern (March 19), South Carolina (March 22) and Samford (March 30).
- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed (1999-2002), Kristin Schmidt (2002-04) and Emily Turner (2004-07).
- Fico currently has totaled 771 Ks and has already passed former All-American Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season.
- Fico enters the Alabama series seven strikeouts away from tying Turner for third place.
- Fico turned in a memorable performance and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.
- Fico claimed her 69th career victory, a two-hit shutout of Georgia Southern (March 19), to move past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for fourth place on LSU's all-time list.

- Fico rebounded from back-to-back losses to South Carolina (March 24) and at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27) with a two-hit shut-out of Samford (March 30). The seven runs allowed by Fico during the South Alabama game was the second-most this season only behind a career-high nine runs versus No. 10 Oregon (March 1).
- Fico joined former All-American Britni Sneed along with Ashley Lewis as the only three pitchers in program history to notch a trio of 20-win seasons during their careers.
- Fico added a pair of wins at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13 & 14). She retired six of the seven batters she faced fueled by four strikeouts in her two innings of relief during the middle game.
- Fico will look to bounce back from consecutive setbacks to No. 12 Missouri (April 19 & 21). She has won her last two starts versus Alabama during the 2011 and 2012 seasons.
- Meghan Patterson has posted a 6-2 mark with a staff-low 1.61 ERA. She tossed a pair of complete game shutouts, a three-hitter versus Purdue (Feb. 8) along with a four-hitter against Nicholls State (Feb. 17).
- In her last start, Patterson fired a complete game effort at Mc-Neese State (April 17). She sat down 11 of the last 13 batters she faced and limited the Cowgirls to one run on three hits.
- Patterson came away with seven strikeouts and threw 6.2 frames of four-hit ball against Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Patterson recorded a season's best eight Ks versus Nicholls State (Feb. 17) and Georgia Southern (March 19). She has been LSU's Saturday starter during two of the first three SEC weekends.
- Patterson was the tough-luck loser in a 2-1 decision at Mississippi State (March 9). In her second career SEC start, she was handed a no-decision after she allowed two runs on three hits and totaled five Ks over her 5.2 frames of action.
- Ashley Czechner has won all nine of her decisions and been used both as a starter (11x) and in relief (4x). She has collected wins over Hampton (Feb. 9), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1), Penn State (March 2), Nicholls State (March 13), No. 17 Kentucky (March 17), South Carolina (March 23), Samford (March 30) and No. 12 Missouri (April 19).
- Czechner tossed a pair of one-hit shutouts versus Nicholls State (March 13) and South Carolina (March 23). She retired 11 of her last 12 batters she faced during the South Carolina game.
- Czechner also recorded a solid start to wrap up the series versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17). She went the distance and held the Wildcats to two runs on two hits.
- Czechner matched a season's best eight strikeouts during game two of the Samford doubleheader (March 30).
- In her first SEC road start, Czechner provided 6.1 innings of four-hit ball during the middle game of the Arkansas series (April 6). She left the contest with a 3-2 lead before the Razorbacks rallied for two runs.
- Czechner once again went six-plus innings and registered a no decision at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 10). She came away with five strikeouts and allowed just two runs entering the 7th inning.
- Czechner logged a two-hit shutout of No. 12 Missouri (April 20). It was the first time on the season and a span of 54 games that Missouri had been held without a run.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — No. 2 Alabama halted the No. 24 LSU softball team season's best 12-game winning streak and emerged with a 6-0 decision in front of a season-high 3,266 fans at Rhoads Stadium.

The Tigers (28-9, 10-2 SEC) committed two critical errors that opened the door to a quartet of Crimson Tide (36-1, 13-1 SEC) runs.

Brittany Mack was handed her first loss since March 3, which ended a run of nine straight wins for the senior right-hander. She was touched up for six runs, four earned, on five hits. Mack notched five strikeouts against four walks and dropped to 12-5 on the season.

Jackie Traina went the distance for Alabama and tallied eight strikeouts against three free passes en route to her eighth shutout. The sophomore right-hander has won all 22 of her decisions in 2012.

LSU's offense had eight of its nine starters reach base and eight base runners in the first four innings. A.J. Andrews, Jacee Blades, Allison Falcon and Tammy Wray all ripped singles.

The Tigers best opportunity to score came in the third inning after Falcon's hit loaded the bases with two outs. However, Ashley Applegate grounded out to first base. She had her career-long six-game hitting streak come to a close.

"We didn't play very good defense and made some mistakes," head coach Beth Torina said. "The errors and leadoff walks made the score a lot worse than it was. Obviously, Alabama is a very quality opponent and a team that will take advantage of extra opportunities. There were some things that we couldn't have done to make it a better ball game."

The Crimson Tide was aided by a Kayla Braud leadoff walk followed by two infield singles to fill the bases during the first inning. A check-swing groundout off the bat of Kaila Hunt allowed the first run to score.

Two batters later with runners on second and third base, Jazlyn Lunceford coaxed a free pass. Jennifer Fenton started to move towards the plate. LSU catcher Lauren Houston scooted down the third base line to attempt to tag Fenton for the frame's third out, but she threw the ball past third baseman Tammy Wray's head on the failed pickoff attempt. That allowed Fenton to cross the plate to make it 2-0.

Alabama used a Fenton opening walk, two stolen bases and another Hunt RBI ground out to push its lead to 3-0 after three innings.

Traina tacked on a three-run homer in the sixth inning. It was one of only two balls to leave the infield versus Mack. Earlier in the frame, the Crimson Tide was the beneficiary of an Ashleigh Kuhn throwing error on a force play at second base. Traina sat down the last 10 batters she faced in the circle to secure the 6-0 win.

"Timely hitting was the key, and we've been getting that timely hit lately," Torina said. "Give credit to Traina because she made big pitches when she needed to. We have to make sure that we do a better job tomorrow when the same opportunities present themselves."

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** - The No. 24 LSU softball used a solid effort in all three phases of the game to even the series and pick up a hard-fought 3-2 victory over No. 2 Alabama in-front of a Rhoads Stadium record crowd of 3,521 spectators.

The Tigers (29-9, 11-2 SEC) ended a 13-game regular season winning streak by the home team in the series dating back to the 2007 season and drew even with Alabama (36-2, 13-2 SEC) in the loss column at the top of the SEC Western Division standings.

LSU has won four of the last five meetings with the Crimson Tide. It also marked the Tigers first win in Tuscaloosa since a 3-2 decision on April 15, 2006. Alabama was dealt just their second loss of the season joining a 5-2 setback against then-No. 11 Tennessee on March 21.

"This was definitely one of our best games from start to finish that we've played all season," head coach Beth Torina said. "Of course to beat a great team like Alabama, that's the type of effort you have to play with for seven innings. It was huge for us to play ahead in such a hostile environment. When we've been able to jump on the scoreboard early, it puts us in a great mindset for the rest of the game."

In the circle, Rachele Fico grinded her way to the complete game victory. The junior right-hander was just touched up for a quartet of hits and both of Alabama's runs came via solo home runs. She notched nine strikeouts versus three walks and improved to 14-4 on the season.

"Rachele definitely got better as the game wore on," Torina said. "She made the necessary adjustments according to things Alabama was hitting early in the game. I believe the ability to continue to give them different looks was the key to her magnificent pitching performance."

Ashley Langoni vaulted the Tigers ahead by a 2-0 margin during the first inning and cranked a two-run shot that sailed over the fence down the left field line. It was Langoni's team-leading sixth dinger of the season and 29th career homer which puts her one away from tying Quinlan Duhon (2005-08) for fourth place on LSU's all-time list.

The Tigers held Alabama without a run in the home half of the frame aided by catcher Morgan Russell, who threw out Jennifer Fenton attempting to steal second base. It marked the first time Fenton was mowed down on the base paths since March 13, 2010, a span of a NCAA-record 74 consecutive steals.

The Crimson Tide was able to cut the advantage down to 2-1 after an Amanda Locke first-pitch, solo home run with one out in the second inning.

LSU responded right back with a two-out rally during the third inning. Langoni and Juliana Santos worked their way to consecutive walks to set the table for Allison Falcon. On a 2-2 offering, Falcon smoked a RBI single into left centerfield to put the Tigers up 3-1.

Alabama answered with a Fenton solo shot to straight-away centerfield with two outs in the third inning to make it 3-2.

"After allowing the two home runs, I knew I had to bear down," Fico said. "My teammates were working so hard for me. I needed to make my pitches sharper and start generating some swings-and-misses. Coach Torina talked me threw it and really helped me get my mindset back on-track."

Fico worked her way out of trouble and stranded runners during the fourth, fifth and sixth stanzas. She recorded six of her nine Ks over the final three inning highlighted by striking out the side in the fifth.

Alabama's bid to even the score during the seventh inning came up empty. On a 0-1 pitch, Jackie Traina hit a towering shot that went foul down the left field line. Four pitches later, Fico registered a strikeout of Traina for the second out of the inning.

Kaila Braud's chopping bunt attempt was fielded by third baseman Tammy Wray, who fired a strike to Falcon covering the first base to get the speedy Braud by a step for the final out of the game.

"This was a huge win for us," Fico said. "We did everything that we had to do and played Tiger softball. As soon as I saw the ball hit to Tammy, I knew we were going to get the out. I'm so confident in her ability to play defensively at third base. She has such great, quick hands and possesses one of the best arms on the team so I knew that if she fielded the ball cleanly, she was going to throw Braud out."

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** – No. 2 Alabama garnered a five-run first inning en route to a 6-0 win over the No. 24 LSU softball team Sunday during the rubber game of a SEC series in-front of 2,684 fans at Rhoads Stadium.

The Tigers (29-10, 11-3 SEC) fell one game behind Alabama (37-2, 14-2 SEC) in the loss column at the top of SEC Western Division standings.

“It was great to come in here and get one win,” head coach Beth Torina said. “There are a lot of teams who have played Alabama and haven’t been able to do that. Of course, we would have liked to win the series. There’s a lot of softball that has to be played over the next four weeks. I feel we’re right where we need to be and still in the hunt for the SEC championship.”

With two outs in the first inning, Alabama’s Cassie Reilly-Boccia was hit-by-a-pitch. Kaila Hunt started a run of three straight singles, while Amanda Locke knocked a RBI single down the left field line for the game’s first run.

Jazlyn Lunceford connected for a two-run single through the middle just past the diving attempt of LSU second baseman Allison Falcon to push the Crimson Tide advantage to 3-0. Two batters later, Kendall Dawson deposited a two-run single to cap the frame and make it 5-0.

“We need to step up the next time we’re in that situation and stop the bleeding,” Torina said. “Somebody needs to step up and be a leader. We had two outs, and it’s a completely different ball game if we get one more play to get out of the inning.”

Brittany Mack retired nine of the next 10 batters she faced and posted three consecutive zeroes on the scoreboard before giving way to Rachele Fico. Mack dropped to 12-6 on the season.

The Crimson Tide also received a one-hit shutout from Jackie Traina’s right-arm. She retired the first 11 batters she faced before issuing a walk to Ashley Langoni. LSU’s lone hit came on an A.J. Andrews infield single during the fifth inning.

“I’m sure she felt the pressure to step up with a big performance after we got the win yesterday,” Torina said. “She was very tough today and a lot of credit goes to her. My biggest lesson for our players today was their response after we gave up the five runs. I didn’t think we had a very good response. That’s something we can change, it’s a mentality thing.”
