SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 8 LSU continues its challenging April slate and squares off with its third straight SEC ranked opponent as No. 4 Alabama visits Tiger Park for a three-game weekend series.
- ▶ The Tigers have won six of their seven SEC series and enter this weekend's action with a three-game lead along with a share of the program's first SEC Western Division title since 2007.
- ▶ Last time out, LSU swept a three-game series from No. 4 Alabama. All three games were decided by one run (3-2 • 2-1 • 4-3). The Tigers became the first team to sweep Alabama in a three-game series since the 2011 team. Georgia lost the final two games of its series after winning the opener by a 3-2 margin at No. 2 Florida.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has collected a 40-11 record and a 15-6 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak (Feb. 13-23) in addition to a nine-game winning streak (March 10-23).
- The Tigers enter this weekend's action versus Georgia winners of 12 of their last 16 outings (March 30-April 27) and 22 of their last 28 games (March 10-April 27).
- The No. 8 and No. 7 national rankings in both the NFCA and USA Softball Top 25 polls are the program's highest marks during the regular season since being ranked No. 8 in both polls back on March 25, 2008.
- The 40 wins for LSU marks the 12th time in program history that the Tigers have accomplished the feat during the regular season. The last time LSU reached 40 regular season victories was during the 2010 season.
- LSU has won six of their seven SEC series and clinched a share of the program's first SEC Western Division title going back to the 2007 season. The 2007 team also won its first nine series en route to the program's eighth SEC Western Division title.
- LSU has picked up 12 wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23) and No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2) in non-conference play.
- In SEC action, the Tigers swept No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; 3-2 • March 17) and No. 4 Alabama (3-2 • April 25; 2-1 • April 26; 4-3 • April 27). LSU also garnered two wins at No. 10 Texas A&M (9-6 • April 13; 10-2 • April 14) and became the first team in 2013 to shutout No. 12 Missouri (8-0 • April 20).

- The 12 wins for LSU over NFCA Top 25 opponents is the program's best output since the Tigers notched 17 victories over ranked foes during the 2006 campaign.
- LSU's sweep of Alabama marked the first time that the Crimson Tide have lost all three games of a SEC weekend series since the Tigers accomplished the same feat in 2011. Anissa Young was named SEC and USA Softball Player of the Week for her two walkoff extra-inning home runs, while Brittany Mack garnered SEC Pitcher of the Week honors for her two victories.
- As a team, LSU has already passed its 2012 season totals in runs (258 vs. 208), hits (381 vs. 342), home runs (38 vs. 13) and stolen bases (84 vs. 74).
- LSU's offense has turned in a .288 team batting average compared to a .231 hitting clip through 51 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.1 runs per game compared to a 3.6 runs per game through 51 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 38 home runs through 51 games which is close to triple the amount of the team's total from 2012.
- LSU's freshmen trio of Bianka Bell, Kelsi Kloss and Sandra Simmons have accounted for 20 of the team's 38 homers. As a team, the Tigers have six players with three or more longballs.
- LSU has come away with double digit hits on 12 occasions most recently an 13-hit effort at McNeese State (April 17).
- LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.

- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a trio of slams this season. The first two came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2) followed by one at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- LSU also went 135 games between having a player connect for two home runs during the same game. Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray accomplished this feat three games apart versus Georgia Southern (March 19) and South Carolina (March 23).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 16 shutouts and recorded 332 strikeouts over 350.1 innings pitched. The 332 Ks enter the Georgia series ranked tied for third in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews is one of only two players to start in all 51 games and has batted leadoff in every game for the Tigers. She has posted a .354 batting average, second on the squad.
- Andrews has registered a team-high 62 hits, good enough for a seventh-place tie on the SEC leaderboard. She also has tallied a team-leading 17 multi-hit efforts which includes a pair of two-hit efforts to conclude the Alabama series (April 26 & 27).
- Andrews has collected hits in 12 of her last 16 outings (March 30-April 27). During that run, she has produced a .411 hitting clip (23-for-56) with 17 runs scored and 12 RBIs.
- Andrews has garnered a pair of career-long nine-game hitting streaks (Feb. 21-March 2, March 8-19) during the season. She has registered a hit during 32 of her last 40 games (Feb. 21-April 27) which includes 15 of her 21 SEC contests.
- Andrews has scored a team-high 41 runs and tallied multiple runs on 13 occasions which includes a career-high three runs at Arkansas (April 5) and at McNeese State (April 17). LSU is 25-1 on the season when Andrews scores a run.
- Andrews has gone 19-for-21 in the stolen base department. Her 19 steals are tied for 10th in the SEC rankings. She had a streak of 22 straight steal attempts come to a close earlier this season at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 14).
- Andrews delivered the game-tying RBI single with two outs during the fifth inning of LSU's series finale with Alabama (April 27).
- With the score tied at 6-6, Andrews provided the go-ahead RBI single on a bunt down the first base line during LSU's three-run eighth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Andrews played a major role as LSU erased a four-run deficit at Arkansas (April 7). She knocked an infield single and scored a run during the team's three-run fifth followed by the game-tying RBI triple with two outs in the sixth inning. Andrews scampered home with the game-winning run after an Arkansas wild pitch.
- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).

- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the team's SEC opener at Mississippi State (March 8).
- Jacee Blades has started in 47 of LSU's last 48 games, mostly between left and right field. The only game she missed was the Missouri finale (April 21) due to an injury. She also has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 47 times.
- Blades has compiled a team-leading .366 batting average, while her 56 hits are second on the squad. Her 56 hits also are 14th, while her .366 hitting clip is 15th among the SEC leaders.
- The 56 hits for Blades has more than doubled her career total entering her junior season. She has garnered 15 multi-hit efforts to rank second on the team, seven of those performances have come over her last 20 appearances (March 22-April 27).
- Blades had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close in game two versus Georgia Southern (March 8-19). She has hit safely in 31 of her last 40 games (Feb. 21-April 27) which includes 16 of 20 SEC outings.
- Blades has collected a quartet of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1) and South Carolina (March 23).
- Blades became the 32nd player in program history to collect 100 career hits after a 2-for-3 effort during game two of the Alabama series (April 26). She also added the go-ahead, RBI single on a chopper to shortstop with two outs in the fifth inning of the Alabama finale (April 27).
- Blades batted on a RBI single as part of LSU's three-run eighth inning during a 9-6 win at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16). She also added a RBI single to spark the Tigers to erase a four-run deficit in the series finale at Arkansas (April 7).
- Bianka Bell has started 49 of 51 games between shortstop (44) and second base (5). She has tallied a .340 hitting clip to go along with a team-leading 11 home runs and 45 RBIs. The 11 homers and 43 RBIs are tied for 15th, while the 45 RBIs are 10th in the SEC rankings.
- Over her last 24 games (March 17-April 27), Bell has secured a .378 batting average (28-for-74) to go along with eight home runs and 30 RBIs. She cranked her first career grand slam at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- Bell secured two SEC Freshman of the Week selections (April 1 & April 8). The last time a LSU player won back-to-back SEC weekly awards was Rachele Fico during the 2010 campaign.
- Bell has recorded RBIs in her last 15 of her last 18 games (March 26-April 27) highlighted by a program record run of 12 straight games (March 26-April 17). The previous mark was held by Sara Fitzgerald (Feb. 15-28, 2003) and Stephanie Hill (Feb. 20-28, 2004) with nine consecutive RBI efforts.

- Bell tallied a career-best three hits highlighted by her 10th dinger to open the Texas A&M series (April 12). She also ripped a two-out, RBI single during LSU's four-run comeback win to wrap up the Arkansas series (April 7).
- Bell added her first career two homer game to open the Georgia Southern doubleheader (March 19) and provided the game-winning RBI double during the third inning of game two. She is the first LSU player since Anissa Young versus Fordham on Feb. 26, 2011 to hit a pair of dingers in the same game.
- Bell cranked a leadoff double to spark LSU's three-run sixth inning against No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which lead to a series sweep.
- Allison Falcon is one of only two players to start in all 51 games. She has split her starts between second base (41), shortstop (7) and designated player (3).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fifth on the team with a .262

- batting average and 39 total hits.
- Falcon's five home runs are tied for third on the team. She has driven home 27 RBIs, already passing her season total from 2012. The 27 RBIs also are fourth on the squad.
- Falcon has hit safely in five of her last 10 outings (April 12-27). She is tied for fourth on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and tied for second on the team with seven multi-RBI performances.
- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).
- Falcon notched LSUA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Falcon ripped a two-run homer during the first inning of the Texas A&M finale (April 14). For Falcon, it was her first dinger since the Mississippi State game (March 10).
- Falcon smacked a RBI single with two outs during the first inning of the Missouri finale (April 21).
- Sandra Simmons has started 50 of 51 games at first base and has moved into the No. 5 spot during 15 of LSU's last 16 games (March 30-April 27) after primarily batting in the No. 6 hole.
- Simmons has garnered a .266 batting average, four home runs and 28 RBIs. Her 28 RBIs are third, while her 14 RBIs in SEC play are second on the squad.
- Simmons has hit safely in 20 of her last 30 games (March 8-April 27) which includes eight of her 14 outings during April. Her career-long seven-game run (March 19-27) came to a close during game one of the Samford twinbill.
- Simmons has racked up seven multi-RBI performances, tied with A.J. Andrews and Allison Falcon for second on the squad. She

collected three RBI's at Arkansas (April 5), drove home a team-leading four RBI's during the Texas A&M series (April 12-14) and added two critical RBI's versus Alabama (April 25-27).

- Simmons ripped a walkoff RBI single with two outs during the eighth inning to vault LSU to a 3-2 win over No. 4 Alabama in the series opener (April 25). She added a solo homer to right field, also with two outs, to knot the score at 2-2 during the fourth inning of the Alabama series finale (April 27).
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series opening win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over Mississippi State (March 8) during the series finale.
- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). It marked LSU's first grand slam since Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young accomplished the feat at No. 9 Arizona State (May 16, 2009) during the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, a span of 197 games.
- Rikki Alcaraz has started 26 of LSU's last 36 games (Feb. 22-April 27) and emerged as the primary option at designated player spot. She has racked up an impressive .342 batting average, three home runs and 18 RBI's.
- All 27 of Alcaraz's hits have come during a stretch where she has hit safely in 19 of her last 29 outings (Feb. 15-April 26). Her three-hit efforts versus UNLV (Feb. 23) and in game one against Georgia Southern (March 19) are career-highs.
- Alcaraz belted her first career home run, a two-run shot, in a 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She added a RBI single to ignite LSU's three-run sixth inning versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep of the Wildcats.
- Alcaraz has added RBI's in eight of her last 18 appearances (March 16-April 27). She put together a 2-for-3 performance and capped LSU's 8-0 victory over Missouri (April 20) with a RBI single.
- Kelli Kloss has made 29 starts between catcher (24) and designated player (5). She has a .262 batting average, five home runs and 22 RBI's. Her five home runs are tied for third on the team.
- Kloss has found her way to the No. 6 position in eight of LSU's last nine games (April 13-27). 12 of Kloss' 22 hits for the season have tallied RBI's.
- Kloss knocked a solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBI's sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2). The six RBI's were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a RBI single with two outs in the third inning that gave LSU a 3-2 lead during the middle game of the Texas A&M series (April 13).
- Kloss came away with a 2-for-2 effort and added a two-run single during LSU's 8-0 victory over No. 12 Missouri (April 20).
- Kloss cranked a two-run homer to straight-away centerfield versus No. 4 Alabama (April 25) during the series opener. The dinger came with two outs in the fourth inning.
- Tammy Wray is one of three players to see action in all 51 games, starting 50 contests at third base. She has notched a .194 batting average to go along with a seven homers and 23 RBI's. The seven dingers are second, while the 23 RBI's are fifth on the team.
- Wray has batted in the No. 7 position during LSU's last 29 games (March 9-April 27) and notched a season's best six-game hitting streak (Feb. 16-22) while spending time in the No. 5 slot.
- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21), at Mississippi State (March 10) and South Carolina (March 23). She added a solo longball versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Wray's two-homer performance during the South Carolina game was LSU's first against a SEC opponent since Rachel Mitchell versus Arkansas (April 27, 2008) at the original Tiger Park.
- 13 of Wray's 24 hits have produced a RBI which includes a RBI single as part of LSU's seven-run fourth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 14).

- LSU picked up its first comeback win of the season and overcame a 2-1 deficit courtesy of three-run frames during the fourth and fifth innings.
- Bianka Bell started the rally with a leadoff single to open the fourth inning. Two batters later, she crossed the plate with the equalizer on a Sandra Simmons RBI double.
- After Tammy Wray walked and Kelsi Kloss added an infield single to load the bases, Katie Guillory lifted a bloop RBI single to right centerfield to push the Tigers ahead by a 3-2 margin. LSU tacked on another run on Lauren Houston bases loaded walk to give the Tigers a two-run cushion.
- Bell added her first career home run, and the Tigers scored two more runs via wild pitches for the 7-2 victory.

MEMPHIS • FEB. 16 • W, 5-4 WALK-OFF WIN

- Trailing 4-3 during the seventh inning, LSU put together a rally. The top of the order, A.J. Andrews and Jacee Blades set the table with back-to-back singles with one out.
- After an Allison Falcon popup and with LSU down to its final out, Bianka Bell came up with a clutch RBI single through the right side to even the tally at 4-4. On the throw to the plate, Bell and Blades advanced to second and third base.
- Four pitches later, Blades scampered home with the winning run on a wild pitch which gave LSU a 5-4 walkoff victory.

- With LSU behind 1-0 in the third inning, Rikki Alcaraz laced a one-out single through the left side. Simone Heyward and Jacee Blades added singles of their own to fill the bases. Alcaraz scooted home with the equalizer on a wild pitch.
- In the next inning, Alcaraz ripped a RBI single with two outs to drive home Tammy Wray to give the Tigers a 2-1 edge.
- LSU tacked on four more runs during the sixth inning after another RBI single from Alcaraz followed RBI hits from Blades and Allison Falcon.

- LSU had to execute three different comebacks (1-0, 4-2, 6-5) to snatch a 7-6 victory.
- Down 6-5 heading into the bottom of the 6th inning, the Tigers started their final rally as Simone Heyward smacked a one-out double down the right field line followed by an A.J. Andrews walk.
- After Blades reached via a fielder's choice, Falcon lifted a 0-2 offering that fell in for a two-run double in-front of a diving SU right fielder Shirley Daniels.

VS. MICHIGAN • MARCH 2 • W, 14-6

- LSU erased an early 2-0 deficit and exploded for six runs while sending 12 batters to the plate.
- Simone Heyward was hit-by-pitch, and Andrews cranked a double into the left centerfield gap to put the tying runs into scoring position.
- Jacee Blades chopped a RBI single that stayed on the infield followed by Falcon's execution of a squeeze bunt to even the tally at 2-2.
- The Tigers surged ahead 4-2 after Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray pieced together consecutive RBI singles.
- Three batters later, Kloss smashed a two-run single through the middle to complete the 6-run outburst and make it 6-2.
- LSU completed the 14-6 triumph as Kloss completed a six RBI game with a grand slam during the 7th inning.

- Wray has drawn a team-leading 26 walks which includes 17 free passes over her last 25 outings (March 13-April 27).
- Lauren Houston has checked in with 27 starts at catcher. She is batting .226 with one homer and 8 RBIs on the season. Her lone longball came on a two-run shot at Ole Miss (Feb. 13).
- Houston collected a two-run single to finish off an 8-0 five-inning win versus Georgia Southern (March 19). She has notched a hit in four of her last nine starts (March 30-April 27).
- Houston scored a career-best three runs where she reached base on a hit, a walk and a hit batter during LSU's 5-4 comeback win at Florida State (April 3).
- Simone Heyward has started 32 of LSU's last 36 games in the outfield (Feb. 24-April 27). She has picked up all 26 of her hits on the season during that stretch en route to a .317 batting average.
- 11 of Heyward's 14 stolen bases have come during SEC play. The 11 steals are second-most in league play.
- Heyward has notched hits in 17 of those 32 starts (Feb. 24-April 26) highlighted by her first career three-hit performance to open the Kentucky series (March 15). She reached base in all four of her plate appearances and scored two runs during LSU's 14-6 win over Michigan (March 2).
- Heyward played a key role in LSU's 5-4 comeback win at Arkansas (April 7). She battled back from a pair of 0-2 counts to draw walks during the fifth and sixth innings. The California native crossed the plate both times which included the game-tying run on A.J. Andrews RBI triple with two outs.
- Heyward has secured hits in six of her last nine starts (April 12-26) and went 2-for-4 with two runs scored in the middle game at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13). She added her first RBI of the season on a bases loaded walk during the A&M finale (April 14).
- Heyward scored either the game-winning or game-tying run in all three games in the sweep of No. 4 Alabama (April 25-27) and contributed two key outfield assists.
- During the Alabama opener (April 25), Heyward went 2-for-3 at the plate and provided a leadoff single to start the eighth. She crossed the plate on Sandra Simmons' walkoff RBI single.
- In the Alabama series finale (April 27), Heyward pinch ran for Katie Guillory and crossed the plate with the game-tying run on A.J. Andrews' RBI single.
- Heyward replaced Guillory defensively and made her presence felt when she threw out the potential game-tying run at third base with a magnificent one-hop throw from the right field line.

- Alex Boulet has made 25 appearances which includes six starts in the outfield. She has provided a hit during three of her last seven outings with a plate appearance (Feb. 22-April 21) and started the Missouri finale (April 21) filling in for Jacee Blades.
- Boulet has crossed the plate in 10 of her last 17 pinch running efforts (Feb. 15-April 25). She represented the game's tying run and scored on A.J. Andrews' squeeze bunt in the ninth inning of the middle game versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Boulet crossed the plate with the game-winning run on another Andrews RBI bunt single during the eighth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Over her career, Boulet has scored 33 times as a pinch runners and has collected 37 stolen bases.
- Alayna Falcon has made five pinch hitting appearances on the season. She has provided hits in her last two efforts versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26) and Samford (March 30).
- Katie Guillory has collected 17 appearances and started in 11 games at right field. She has totaled a .242 batting average, one home run and 4 RBIs.
- Guillory has already doubled her career hit total and connected for her first career longball versus North Dakota State (Feb. 15).
- Guillory legged out an infield single with two outs to spark a two-run fifth inning rally versus No. 4 Alabama (April 27) on Senior Day.

- LSU's pitching staff is headed by Rachele Fico, who has compiled a 24-9 record, a 1.98 ERA and 212 strikeouts over 201.1 innings. Her 212 Ks are second in the SEC, while her 24 wins check in tied for second place on the SEC leaderboard.
- In SEC action, Fico has turned in a 11-5 mark, 1.79 ERA and amassed 91 strikeouts over her 101.2 frames of action. All three of those feats are among the SEC's Top 3.
- Fico was the No. 1 overall pick by the Akron Racers during the 2013 NPF College Draft (April 1). It marked the second straight season that LSU has had the league's No. 1 pick - Brittany Mack (2012).
- Fico has already tossed 10 shutouts which are tied for seventh nationally - No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8), Tulsa (Feb. 9), North Dakota State (Feb. 15), Virginia (Feb. 16), Ohio State (Feb. 22), No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23), Mississippi State (March 10), Georgia Southern (March 19), South Carolina (March 22) and Samford (March 30).
- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed (1999-2002), Kristin Schmidt (2002-04) and Emily Turner (2004-07).
- Fico currently has totaled 777 Ks and has already passed former All-American Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season.
- Fico enters the Georgia series one strikeout away from tying Turner for third place.
- Fico turned in a memorable performance and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.
- Fico claimed her 69th career victory, a two-hit shutout of Georgia Southern (March 19), to move past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for fourth place on LSU's all-time list.
- Fico rebounded from back-to-back losses to South Carolina (March 24) and at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27) with a two-hit shutout of Samford (March 30). The seven runs allowed by Fico during the South Alabama game was the second-most this season only behind a career-high nine runs versus No. 10 Oregon (March 1).
- Fico joined fellow All-American Britni Sneed along with Ashley Lewis as the only three pitchers in program history to notch a trio of 20-win seasons during their careers.
- Fico added a pair of wins at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13 & 14). She retired six of the seven batters she faced fueled by four strikeouts in her two innings of relief during the middle game.
- Fico returned to form after consecutive setbacks to No. 12 Missouri (April 19 & 21) and won both of her outings against No. 4 Alabama (April 25 & 27) to earn National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) National Pitcher of the Week.
- Fico became the fifth pitcher since 2008 to notch a pair of complete-game wins in a single series versus Alabama. The other four are fellow LSU All-American Brittany Mack in addition to Arizona State's Katie Burkhart, Missouri's Chelsea Thomas and Michigan's Jordan Taylor.

- Fico set the tone early and retired 18 of the first 21 Crimson Tide batters she faced in the series opener (April 25). She left the bases loaded in both the seventh and eighth innings which allowed Sandra Simmons to belt a walkoff RBI single with two outs.
- In her Senior Day start (April 27), Fico grinded out another complete game effort and retired the final four batters she faced sparked by two strikeouts to lock up a share of LSU's first SEC Western Division title since 2007.
- Two of the four Alabama hitters she retired were Kayla Braud and Haylie McCleney, a pair of USA Softball Top 25 Player of the Year award finalists, to secure the 4-3 triumph.
- Meghan Patterson has posted a 6-2 mark with a staff-low 1.61 ERA. She tossed a pair of complete game shutouts, a three-hitter versus Purdue (Feb. 8) along with a four-hitter against Nicholls State (Feb. 17).

BATON ROUGE – In a pitcher’s duel for the ages which featured 440 combined pitches and turned into the longest game in program history, the No. 23 LSU softball team lost a 1-0 decision to No. 12 Georgia during a 15-inning contest to open a SEC weekend series in-front of 1,489 fans at Tiger Park.

Rachele Fico turned in a masterful performance and registered a season’s best 13 strikeouts. The junior right-hander was touched up for eight hits and stranded 16 Georgia base runners. She was dealt another tough-luck loss and dropped to 15-9 on the season. In Fico’s nine setbacks, she has received only four total runs of support.

Erin Arevalo countered for Georgia with a career-high 15 strikeouts and improved to 20-5 for the season. She limited LSU’s offense to one hit, a Morgan Russell double in the 11th inning, to go along with four walks. The senior right-hander carried a no-hitter one out into the 11th inning and sat down 20 of the final 21 batters she faced.

With the result, LSU (33-17, 14-9 SEC) and Georgia (37-12, 14-9 SEC) are now tied for fourth place in the SEC overall race. It also allowed Alabama to secure the SEC Western Division title.

“Both pitchers were absolutely phenomenal tonight,” head coach Beth Torina said. “Absolutely the best pitching performances I’ve ever seen in my entire career. I think the two of them battling like that, it was absolutely unbelievable. It was an unbelievable game – unfortunately for us, we didn’t come up on the winning end. Both teams really played their hearts out tonight.”

Georgia broke through for the game’s only run as Kristyn Sandberg drew a leadoff walk and moved to second base on Ashley Razez’s groundout. On a chopped ball back to the pitcher’s circle, Fico fielded and threw to first baseman Ashleigh Kuhn. However, Kuhn couldn’t hold the throw as a speedy Nijaa Griffin knocked the ball out her glove which allowed Sandberg to cross the plate from second base.

LSU’s best opportunity to score came during the ninth inning when Heidi Pizer and A.J. Andrews connected for consecutive walks to open the frame. Pinch runner Alex Boulet and Andrews executed a double steal. Sandberg’s throw from the catcher position went into left field, but Griffin back up the play to keep the runners at second and third base.

Two batters later, Ashley Langoni’s squeeze bunt attempt was thwarted by a diving Sandberg catch in foul territory. On the throw back to the pitcher, Boulet scampered home but was ruled out for leaving the bag as Arevalo had already returned to the pitcher’s circle.

“I think if we get the bunt down, we’re in a totally different scenario there – I think we possibly could’ve scored,” Torina said. “But the squeeze is a tough play, and there’s always a lot of pressure. I don’t know if the pitch was a strike, but still it’s such a tough play to execute.”

Georgia had a chance to break through in the seventh inning after placing runners on second and third base with no outs. Christine Olney’s ground ball was scooped up by LSU shortstop Juliana Santos on one bounce. She alertly fired home for the first out of the frame. Fico dug deep and recorded strikeouts sandwiched between a walk to leave the bases loaded.

“I was just taking it one pitch at a time,” Fico said. “I wanted to make my next pitch my best pitch. I was just working to keep batters off balance, change planes and change up the side of the plate I was working. It was just a hard-fought game today – we gave it all we could.”

BATON ROUGE - No. 12 Georgia ripped off three first-inning runs and never looked back to claim a 6-1 victory over the No. 23 LSU softball team as 1,750 fans gathered at Tiger Park.

The 1,750 fans was the seventh-largest crowd in program history. With the win, Georgia (38-12, 15-9 SEC) moves into sole possession of fourth place and inches one game ahead of LSU (33-18, 14-10 SEC) in the overall SEC standings.

Tess Sito went 5.1 innings and surrendered one run on two hits to improve to 9-1 on the season. She recorded three strikeouts and notched a 2-for-4 effort at the plate with a run scored.

Brittany Mack was dealt the loss and yielded six runs, four earned, on eight hits. She garnered seven strikeouts and fell to 14-9 for the season.

"Georgia has such a tough offense," head coach Beth Torina said. "They really find a way to make things happen. I thought today was just a case that they hit some balls in the right spot where we couldn't defend them. I didn't think anything was just crushed off of Brittany Mack. I didn't think there were any mistake pitches she threw. They just put balls in the right spot, and that's what a good offense will do."

LSU scored its lone run during the third inning. Dylan Supak and Lauren Houston set the table for the Tigers after getting hit by a pitch and reaching on a fielder's choice, respectively. After an A.J. Andrews sacrifice bunt moved both runners into scoring position, Ashley Langoni delivered a two-out RBI single to bring LSU within 5-1.

Heidi Pizer, Juliana Santos, Cassie Troclair and Tammy Wray also chipped in hits for the Tigers.

"I challenged Ashley to step up for us, and she responds well to that," Torina said. "She did a great job, and I think she has to be the one to lead this offense. She's trying to do that with that performance today."

Sito opened the game with a leadoff single and stole second base. A fielding error by Mack followed to place runners on the corners. Paige Wilson chopped a ground ball to her counterpart at shortstop Juliana Santos, who fired home in an attempt to get Sito at the plate. However, Sito slide underneath the tag of catcher Lauren Houston which enabled Georgia to take a 1-0 edge.

Kristyn Sandberg and Christine Olney tacked on RBI singles to complete UGA's three-run first inning.

Sandberg provided a leadoff double down the left field line to open the third inning. Four batters later, pinch runner Macie Couey would score on a Houston passed ball. Gracie Goulder added a RBI single to left field to make it 5-0. She drove home Niaja Griffin, who reached on a hit batsman.

After LSU scored in the home half of the frame, Sito retired the final seven batters she faced before giving way to Morgan Montemayor for the final five outs of the contest. Goulder tacked on a second RBI single in the fifth inning for the final margin of 6-1.

"I know that we can play with Georgia," Torina said. "I know that it will be a great day for these seniors in honoring those who have meant so much to this program. We need to go out and win this ball game. It's definitely something we're capable of doing. Give a lot of credit to Georgia. They're a talented team, but we have a talented team ourselves."

BATON ROUGE – Brittany Mack provided the Senior Day heroics, but not in the way that the decorated All-American has been accustomed to during her LSU career – she ripped a two-out, RBI double for her first career hit and first career RBI as the No. 23 LSU softball team claimed a 1-0 victory over No. 12 Georgia during its regular season home finale at Tiger Park.

Prior to the game, Mack gave the ball on Senior Day to her cohort Rachele Fico. The junior right-hander tossed a four-hit shutout and fanned six batters versus two walks to improve to 16-9 on the season. She pounded the strike zone early and often with 17-of-27 first-pitch strikes.

The Tigers (34-18, 15-10 SEC) snapped a seven-game losing streak to Georgia (38-13, 15-10 SEC) and moved back into a fourth-place tie with the Bulldogs in the overall SEC standings.

Seven of the eight members of the senior class started in the game. Katie Guillery has missed the season due to injury will return to the Tigers for the 2013 season. The octet threw out the ceremonial first pitches leading into the game and were honored in a special post-game tribute afterwards.

"I don't think you could have scripted a much better day for Senior Day at Tiger Park," head coach Beth Torina said. "All the seniors contributed. They've had such great careers, and they deserve this day. I really don't know if it gets a lot better than this."

Tammy Wray knocked a leadoff single to open the fifth inning. Pinch runner Alex Boulet advanced to second base on Ashley Applegate's sacrifice bunt and scooted over to third base on Morgan Russell's ground out.

On the first pitch of the at-bat, Mack crushed the offering towards right centerfield where the ball landed in-front UGA centerfielder Brittany Hubbard's diving attempt. Boulet crossed the plate for the game's only run.

"All I could think was 'Are you kidding me?' It was unbelievable for her to get her first career hit and her first career RBI in that moment," Torina said. "I know Brittney's a good hitter, and I have all the confidence in her abilities. The fact that she's the one that scored that run today – she's the one that was selfless, and she gave up the ball before the game to allow to Rachele Fico to pitch. You really just couldn't have scripted a better ending to their Senior Day."

"It was a solid hit," Mack said. "I thought that with my luck, the centerfielder was going to make a miraculous dive and catch it. I looked up and saw that it kept going, so I had to fist pump. I kept going to second. It was just unbelievable not only to get the hit but also to score Alex Boulet. I told her when she was going out to pinch run, I told her, 'You're scoring this time.'"

"Brittany Mack is awesome," Fico said. "I'm so glad that she's my teammate, and she's one of my best friends – on and off the field. She works so hard and sets such a good example for everyone else. I'm just so happy that she's my teammate. I couldn't be prouder of her today coming up to bat and getting the job done."

Georgia placed the tying run on second base during the seventh inning. Fico closed out the game in-style and mowed down Gracie Goulder to secure the 1-0 win.

"This win was huge today for us," Fico said. "We got swept against Tennessee earlier in the year, and we vowed that we wouldn't let it happen again. We knew that we really had to come out fighting today and do whatever it took to win. We really got it done. We've got to keep playing this way – practicing hard and executing in games."
